- Before operating your LCD Monitor system, please read these instructions carefully.

- 4. When the power to the unit is shut off, the next time the unit is turned on the speakers will not operate. The Transmit feature must be reset to OFF (IR head-phones off) in the setup features.

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### Installation

#### PRELIMINARY PREPARATIONS

**NOTE:** The unit should be installed by a qualified service technician. This unit is designed to operate with a 12 VDC, negative ground battery system.


**NOTE:** Use only proper sized fasteners and cables during installation. Use of improper fasteners or cables can lead to mechanical failure of the unit or create a fire hazard.


1. Disconnect the ground wire from the battery terminal prior to connecting the unit to the electrical system.

**NOTE:** Some vehicle radios have an anti-theft code system that will disable the radio if the battery is disconnected. If this vehicle has such a radio, ensure you have the access code to restore the radio to normal operation.

- 2. Pick a location to install the monitor where it will not obstruct the rear view mirror or the air conditioning vents.
- 3. Do not install this unit at an angle exceeding 30 degrees.

MOUNTING VIDEO SYSTEM






- 1. Determine the mounting location and drill four mounting holes (see the figure above).
- 2. Attach the mounting bracket to the holes with the self-tapping screws (Ø4x10).
- 3. Let the two levers aim at the slots on the DVD bracket to fix the display unit.
- 4. Open the monitor to display the five screw holes.
- 5. Attach the unit to the bracket with the mounting bolts (M 3.5x10).
- 6. Insert five rubber caps into the screw holes.
- 7. When the installation has completed, you can turn the display upward or downward, left or right to adjust the viewing angle. (See the arrowhead symbol in the figure above).

#### BATTERY REPLACEMENT

Use the following procedure to inserting/replacing the batteries

- 1. Open the battery compartment cover.
- 2. Remove the old batteries and insert the new batteries (two AAA size). Make sure that the positive and negative terminals of the batteries are oriented as indicated.
- 3. Close the cover.

#### USING THE REMOTE CONTROL

Point the remote control towards the player front face IR mark (remote control signal receiver).


Operation angle: The remote will function in about up to a  $\pm 30$  degree angle from the front of the IR receiver.

### Operation

#### LOADING/EJECTING A DISC

When you have installed the unit and all connections have completed, you can load a disc as follows:

- 1. Turn the ignition on to the accessory position.
- 2. Press the POWER button (item 1on the figure below).
- 3. Insert the disc with printed side facing up into the disc slot (item 2 on the figure below).
- 4. The player will start playback automatically.



To eject a disc, press the EJECT 🔺 button (item 3 on the figure above).

#### STOPPING PLAY

Briefly press the ■ STOP button to stop the unit playback, when the ► PLAY button is pressed, normal playback will continue.

Press ■ STOP button twice to stop the playback and go back to the initial Track/Chapter on the disc.

#### RAPID FORWARD/REVERSE

Press ◀◀ or ▶▶ during play.

Each time the button is pressed, the speed of rapid forward /reverse changes according to the disc as follow:

DVD: Normal playback 2X 4X 6X 8X

VCD/CD:

#### Normal playback 1X 2X 3X 4X

MP3:

Normal playback 2X 4X 6X 8X

On the next press of the button after reaching the maximum speed, the disc resumes normal playback speed.

#### **SKIPPING TRACK**

Press the  $\rightarrow \rightarrow$  or  $\bowtie$  buttons on the remote control during playback. Press  $\rightarrow \rightarrow$  to skip to next track, and  $\bowtie$  to skip back one track.

**NOTE:** For some VCD2.0 discs (PBC-playback control), the  $\bowtie$  /  $\bowtie$  buttons may be unavailable.

#### SLOW MOTION PLAY

Press |
ightarrow or |
ightarrow during playback of a DVD. Each time the button is pressed, the speed of slow forward /reverse changes according to the disc as follows:

DVD:

Normal Playback 2X 4X 8X

On the next press of the button after reaching the minimum speed, the disc resumes normal playback speed.

#### PAUSE

Pressing **||** on the remote control during playback will stop play temporary. Press ► PLAY on the remote control to resume normal playback.

#### MUTE

Will mute the audio, but the disc continues playing. When you unmute the audio (press MUTE again), audio will resume.

#### REPEAT

FOR DVD:

Press the REPEAT button to cycle through the select repeat mode as follows:

CHAPTER REPEAT ON-TITLE REPEAT ON-REPEAT OFF

FOR VCD/CD:

Press the REPEAT button to cycle through the select repeat mode as follows.

REP-ONE—REP-ALL—REPEAT OFF

- 1. REP ONE—Continuously repeat at the current chapter/track.
- 2. REP-ALL—Continuously repeat all chapter/track on the current disc.
- 3. When the player finishes playback of the current disc last chapter/track, it will stop and display the elapsed time. When REPEAT OFF mode is selected, REP-ONE &REP-ALL disappears from screen display.
- 4. REPEAT feature does not support VCD2.0 (with PBC ON).

#### A-B

A-B repeat allows a passage to be repeated continuously. Press A-B button at the start of the required passage, then press A-B button again at the end of the passage. To revert to normal playing, press A-B button again. Each time the button is pressed, the screen will display as follows:

A TO B SET A A TO B SET B A TO B CANCELLED

**DISC SEARCH (GOTO)** 

FOR DVD:

Press GOTO button twice, the screen will display the following message:

TITLE 01/01 TIME ::	
00:00:25	

You can select the item you want to watch through the TIME setting by using numeric buttons and then the ENTER key.

FOR CD/VCD (WITH PBC OFF):

Press GOTO button once, the screen will display the following message:

GO TO :	
00:00:25	

Use numeric buttons to input the time directly.

#### ZOOM

Allows the picture to be increased in size. Press ZOOM to toggle among 1.5 scale, 2.0 scale and 3.0 scale.

#### RANDOM

Press RANDOM button, track selection will be made in random order. The display screen will show "SHUFFLE ON" on the screen. Press RANDOM button again, "SHUF-FLE OFF" appears and the mode is released.

#### PROGRAM

In stop mode, press PROGRAM button, the screen will display "PROGRAM PO0:00". For example: press numeric button 4 and ▶ PLAY button, "PROGRAM PO1:04" appears. It means track 4 will be played first.

#### MODE SELECTION

Press MOD button on the front panel of the unit or MODE button on the remote control to select among DVD, or AV mode. When the mode is selected, the corresponding mode indicator on the front panel will be illuminated.

#### VOLUME LEVEL ADJUSTMENT

Press VOL +/VOL- on the front panel or VOLUME +/- on the remote control to increase or decrease the volume level.

#### LIGHT SWITCH

The two car dome lamps on the unit will be illuminated depending on the lamp operation setting. There are three settings for the car dome lamp operation: OFF, AUTO, and ON.

A. OFF: To turn off the lamp.

B. AUTO: To make the lamp turn on only when car doors are opened.

C. ON: To turn on the lamp.

#### JACK FOR EARPHONE

There are two jacks for earphones, one on each side of the DVD unit. You can connect an earphone to anyone of the jacks to receive audio.

#### EARPHONE VOLUME ADJUSTMENT

Slide the control on the side of the DVD unit to increase or decrease the volume level of the earphone.

#### **REMOTE SENSOR (IR)**

This IR sensor receives it's signal from the remote control.

#### TURNING THE UNIT ON/OFF

Press the  $\bigcirc$  POWER button on the front panel or on the remote control to turn the unit on or off.

#### MONITOR RELEASE

Press the button on the unit to deploy the screen display from the base of the uni.. Then the display can easily be adjusted for the best viewing.

#### INFRARED TRANSMITTING WINDOW

There are six infrared transmitting lights inside the window on the unit, the user can put on the infrared wireless headphones supplied with the unit and hear the audio signal without the use of wires or cables from the unit to the headphones.

### LCD Menu Operations

#### MENU

Press the MENU button on the unit or on the remote control during DVD or AV mode to display a menu of the adjustment items on the screen.

Press MENU button repeatedly to select among BRIGHT, CONTRAST, COLOR and TINT (For the unit with NTSC system) items and etc. Press VOL +/- buttons on the unit or VOLUME +/- buttons on the remote control to adjust the corresponding item.

**Note:** When you set the TV TYPE item to "PAL" in "PREFERENCES SETUP", there is no "TINT" item to display.

#### TRANSMIT

The TRANSMIT item, can be set ON or OFF. When set it to ON, the sound signal is transmitted from the infrared window on the unit for use with infrared wireless headphones.

#### SCREEN

In SCREEN item, you can select appropriate TV aspect ratio (4:3 or 16:9) using the VOL +/VOL- buttons on the unit or VOLUME +/- buttons on the remote control.

#### SEARCH

This menu selection is not used with this model.

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
### On Screen Displays

#### DISPLAY

Press the DISPLAY button during playback to display the contents of the current disc on the screen. The following examples depict the display by disc type.

#### DVD

(1) Press DISPLAY for the first time:



The present title number, total number of titles, the present chapter number, the total number of chapters of the disc currently being played will be shown on the screen, along with the elapsed time.

(2) Press DISPLAY a second time:

TITLE REMAIN 01:46:58

The remaining playing time for the title presently playing is displayed.

(3) Press DISPLAY a third time:

CHAPTER ELAPSED	
00:00:24	

The elapsed playing time for the chapter presently playing is displayed.

(4) Press DISPLAY a fourth time:

CHAPTER REMAIN 00:01:39

The remaining playing time for the chapter presently playing is displayed.

(5) Press DISPLAY a fifth time:

The message is cleared off the screen.

(1) Press DISPLAY for the first time:

VCD

SINGLE ELAPSED 00:00:25

The remaining playing time for the single presently playing is displayed.

(2) Press DISPLAY a second time:

SINGLE REMAIN 00:03:15

The remaining time for the single presently playing is displayed.

(3) Press DISPLAY a third time:

TOTAL ELAPSED 00:00:25

The elapsed playing time for the disc presently playing is displayed.

(4) Press DISPLAY a fourth time:

TOTAL REMAIN 00:40:35


The remaining playing time for the disc presently playing is displayed.

(5) Press DISPLAY a fifth time:

The message is cleared off the screen.


#### CD

(1) Press DISPLAY for the first time:



The elapsed playing time for the track presently playing is displayed.

(2) Press DISPLAY a second time:




The remaining time for the track presently playing is displayed.

(3) Press DISPLAY a third time:



The elapsed playing time for the disc presently playing is displayed.

(4) Press DISPLAY a fourth time:



The remaining playing time for the disc presently playing is displayed.


(5) Press DISPLAY a fifth time:

The message is cleared off the screen.

#### MP3

The following applies when the system is set for NO MENU in SMARTNAV, this feature is discussed later in this guide.

(1) Press DISPLAY for the first time:



The elapsed playing time for the chapter presently playing is displayed.

(2) Press DISPLAY a second time:

CHAPTER REMAIN 00:04:25
TRACK: 01/123

The remaining time for the chapter presently playing is displayed.

(3) Press DISPLAY a third time:

The message is cleared off the screen.

#### MULTI-AUDIO LANGUAGE FUNCTION

#### DVD

Press the AUDIO button on the remote control during playback. Each time the button is pressed, the audio soundtrack language changes in sequential order.

Note:

- O The number of languages on a disc varies according to the disc.
- O Some discs only contain one language soundtrack.
- When no different language soundtrack are recorded, the *will* be displayed at the screen's left top corner.

#### VCD/CD

Press AUDIO on the remote control during playback. It is possible to switch the sound between monaural (left/right) and stereo sound, as given below.

MONO LEFT MONO RIGHT STEREO

#### TITLE MENU FUNCTION

This function applies only to DVDs. If the DVD has multiple titles recorded on the disc. It can select preferred title from the title menu to start playback.

- 1. Press the TITLE button during playback. The title menu is display.
- 2. Press the cursor button shown in screen display, select preferred title by the cursor button and by pressing the ENTER button.

#### MULTI-SUBTITLE LANGUAGE FUNCTION

This function applies only to DVDs. Press the SUBTITLE button during playback. Each time the button is pressed, the subtitle language changes in sequential order.

Note:

- O The number of languages on a disc varies according to the disc.
- O Some discs only contain one language soundtrack.
- O When no different language soundtrack are recorded, the  $\square$  will be displayed at the screen's left top corner.


#### MULTI-ANGLE FUNCTION

This function applies only to DVDs. Press the ANGLE button during playback. Each time the button is pressed, the viewing angle changes in sequential order.

#### Note:

- O The angle number is different according to the disc.
- O The function only works for discs having scenes recorded at different angles.
- When no different angle is recorded, the *will* be displayed at the screen's left top corner.

MP3 DISC PLAY



When a MP3 disc is playing an example of the format of the FOLDER is as follows:

Use the  $\triangleleft/\triangleright/\blacktriangle/\lor$  buttons on the remote control to select the item or folder, then press the ENTER button.

Each press of the REPEAT button selects one of three repeat play modes, these are:

REP-ONE: Repeats play of the same song.

FOLDER REP: Repeats play of all songs in the current directory in sequence.

FOLDER: Plays all the songs in the current directory once.

When PLAY MODE is selected, press the  $\blacktriangle/\nabla$  buttons to change between the following modes:

SINGLE, REP-ONE, FOLDER, FOLDER REP, DISC SCAN, DISC, DISC REP, SHUFFLE ON, PROGRAM PXXX

During the playback, use the  $\blacktriangle/\nabla$  buttons to skip an item ahead or back.

## Appendix A – Cleaning

#### CLEANING THE LCD SCREEN

**CAUTION:** To avoid possible shock hazard and equipment damage, be sure the LCD system is turned off and unplugged from the main electrical outlet before cleaning.

**CAUTION:** Do not use any form of solvents on the LCD screen or enclosure.

- 1. Use a soft, clean & dry cloth to gently wipe off the dust on the LCD screen.
- 2. Use a clean cloth dampened with water to wipe off the dirt.
- 3. Do not exert excessive force when cleaning the LCD screen.

#### CLEANING THE ENCLOSURE

- 1. Use a soft, clean & dry cloth to gently wipe off the dust on the enclosure.
- 2. Use a clean cloth dampened with water to wipe off the dirt.
- 3. Do not exert excessive force when cleaning the enclosure.

#### CLEANING AND HANDLING DISCS

#### HANDLING

- O Dirt, dust, scratches and warping discs will cause misoperation.
- O Do not place stickers or make scratches on discs.
- O Do not warp discs.
- O A disc should always be kept in its case when not in use to prevent from damaging.

Do not place discs in the following places:


- 1. Direct sunlight.
- 2. Dirty, dusty and damp areas.
- 3. Near car heaters.
- 4. On the seats or dashboard.

#### DISC CLEANING

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Use a dry soft cloth to wipe the surface. If the disc is quite dirty, use a soft cloth slightly moistured with isopropyl (rubbing) alcohol. Never use solvents such as benzine, thinner or conventional record cleaners as they may mar the surface of the disc.

**Note:** A disc may become somewhat scratched (although not enough to make it unusable) depending on you handle it and conditions in the usage environment. These scratches are not an indication of any problem with the player.



## Appendix B – Troubleshooting

If the unit fails to operate normally, try solving the problems using the procedures below. If the problem persists, switch off the unit and ask the dealer or technical services for assistance. Do not attempt to repair or open the defective unit as high voltage is present inside the unit.

- 1. No Power
  - a. Check to ensure that the On/Off button on the front of the unit is On.
  - b. Check power wiring to the unit.
- 2. No Picture
  - a. Check that all cables are connected and the LED is illuminated on the control panel above the LCD screen.
  - b. Be sure you have selected the correct source mode (AV, DVD).
- 3. Distorted Picture
  - a. Check disc for contamination and clean with soft cloth, wiping from center to edge.
  - b. Sometimes a small amount of picture distortion may appear, this is not a malfunction of the player.
- 4. Severely Distorted Picture or No Color in Picture
  - a. The disc format is not compatible with the player (PAL/NTSC).
- 5. DVD Player Not Working Properly
  - a. Ensure disc is correctly inserted into the unit.
  - b. Inspect the disc is not damaged (no scratches on the recorded side of the disc) and is of correct format to play in the unit.
  - c. Please wait as some disc requires longer time to read-in prior to playing.
  - d. Eject and re-insert disc.
- 6. Picture flickers
  - a. Check that the power coming from the main socket is sufficient.
  - b. Check that unit is not placed too near speakers or magnetic objects.
  - c. Check to see that the unit settings are correct.
- 7. Start-Up Screen doesn't display when disc is removed
  - a. Press the Power button to turn the unit off, then press it again to turn the power back on.
- 8. No sound
  - a. Check audio connections.
  - b. Volume set too low, increase the volume setting.
- 9. No audio at digital output

- a. Check digital connections.
- b. Check the Digital Audio menu setup to ensure that the digital output is correctly set.
- c. Check if the audio format of the selected audio language matches your systems capabilities.
- 10. Remote control not working.
  - a. Check to verify that the batteries are installed correctly (polarities aligned with case markings), replace if necessary (2-AAAs).
  - b. Make sure that the remote control is pointed towards the remote sensor located on the system.
- 11. Buttons do not work.
  - a. Turn the unit off and then back on with the power On/Off button at the front of the unit.
