

Register. Your cash register lets you be the cashier! With realistic sounds and action, the cash register includes a credit card reader and a cash drawer that holds play money. You can even use the microphone to call for a price check or request product information.

CAUTION

- Do not mix old and new batteries or different types of batteries. Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- Use only fresh batteries of the required size and recommended type.
- Dispose of old batteries promptly and properly. Do not burn or bury them.
- If you do not plan to use your talking cash register for several weeks, remove the batteries. Batteries can leak chemicals that can harm electronic parts.

INSTALLING BATTERIES

Your cash register requires four AA batteries (not supplied) for power. For the best performance and longest life, we recommend RadioShack alkaline batteries.

- Use a Phillips screwdriver to loosen the screw on the battery compartment cover at the back of the register, then lift up the cover.
- 2. Place the batteries in the compartment as indicated by the polarity (+ and -) marked inside.
- 3. Replace the cover and tighten the screw.

USING YOUR CASH REGISTER


You can use your cash register to ring up sales for your customers, or as a calculator.

TURNING THE CASH REGISTER ON AND OFF

- Press ON/OFF to turn on the cash register. You hear 'Welcome' and the screen turns on.
- 2. If no button is pressed for 2 minutes, your register automatically turns off. The cash register says, "Thank you. Goodbye", and the screen turns off. To turn the cash register off sooner, press ON/OFF.

SCANNING BAR CODES

- 1. Select one of the bar codes stickers from the supplied sticker sheet and place it on an item.
- 2. Point the scanner at the bar code, align the arrows on the scanner with the arrows on the bar code, and press the trigger. The cash register announces the price and it appears on the screen. \mathcal{Y}




- 3. Press TOTAL (=) to add up all the items scanned. The cash register announces the total and it appears on the screen. [Y
- 4. Press CLEAR to start over.

- If the total amount exceeds \$999.99 the cash register does not recognize the amount and **E** appears.
- Be sure the scanner is as close to the bar code label as possible and make sure that the arrows on the hand scanner align with those on the bar code label to avoid errors.

USING YOUR CREDIT CARD

Slide the supplied card in the Credit Card slot. The cash register says "Credit approved" and Cards Accepted lights briefly.



USING THE MICROPHONE

- To announce store specials or to page employees, hold down MIC and talk into the microphone. You hear your voice over the speaker.
- 2. Release MIC when you finish talking.

OPENING THE CASH DRAWER

Your cash register comes with Play Bills and plastic coins so you can make change for your customers, just like cashiers at the store.

Press **OPEN**, the cash drawer opens and the cash register makes a "Cha-Ching" sound.

Push the drawer back in to close it.

- When you press a key, the cash register announces the corresponding number or function.
- When you press *, the cash register beeps.
- When you press TOTAL (=), the cash register announces the total in dollars and cents.

MAKING CALCULATIONS

You can use the cash register keypad to perform calculations.

Press the number keys to enter numbers and the function keys [ENTER (+), -, \times , \div , and TOTAL (=)] to solve equations.

CARE

Keep the cash register dry; if it gets wet, wipe it dry immediately. Use and store the cash register only in normal temperature environments. Handle the cash register carefully; do not drop it. Keep the cash register away from dust and dirt, and wipe it with a damp cloth occasionally to keep it looking new.

If your cash register is not performing as it should, take it to your local RadioShack store for assistance. Modifying or tampering with the cash register's internal components can cause a malfunction and might invalidate its warranty.

Limited Ninety-Day Warranty

EXCEPT AS PROVIDED HEREIN, RadioShack SHALL HAVE NO LIABILITY OR RESPONSIBILITY TO CUSTOMER OR ANY OTHER PERSON OR ENTITY WITH RESPECT TO ANY LIABILITY, LOSS OR DAMAGE CAUSED DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY BY USE OR PERFORMANCE OF THE PRODUCT OR ARISING OUT OF ANY BREACH OF THIS WARRANTY, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ANY DAMAGES RESULTING FROM INCONVENIENCE, LOSS OF TIME, DATA, PROPERTY, REVENUE, OR PROFIT OR ANY INDIRECT, SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES, EVEN IF RADIOShack HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.

Repaired or replaced parts and products are warranted for the remainder of the original warranty period. You will be charged for repair or replacement of the product made after the expiration of the warranty period.
