#### 1. READ INSTRUCTIONS

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

#### 2. RETAIN INSTRUCTIONS

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

#### 3. HEED WARNINGS

All warnings on the product and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

#### 4. FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS

All operating and use instructions should he followed

#### 5. CLEANING

Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a dry cloth for cleaning.

#### 6. ATTACHMENTS

Do not use attachments not recommended by the product's manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

#### 7. WATER AND MOISTURE

#### VENTII ATION

Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the

back or bottom are provided for ventilation, to ensure reliable operation of the product and to protect it from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the product on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface. This product should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat source. #### 10. POWER SOURCES

This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company. For products intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.

#### 11. GROUNDING OR POLARIZATION

This product is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.

#### 12. POWER-CORD PROTECTION

Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.

#### 13. LIGHTNING

To protect your product from a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

#### 14. POWER LINES

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or

where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

#### 15. OVERLOADING


Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

#### 16. OBJECT AND LIQUID ENTRY

Never push objects of any kind into this product through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in fire or electric shock. Never spill or spray any type of liquid on the product.

#### 17. OUTDOOR ANTENNA GROUNDING

If an outside antenna is connected to the product, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electric Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge product, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge product, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for grounding electrodes.

#### 18. SERVICING


# NOTES:

## PROTECT YOUR FURNITURE

This model is equipped with non-skid rubber "feet" to prevent the product from moving when you operate the controls. These "feet" are made from non-migrating rubber material specially formulated to avoid leaving any marks or stains on your furniture. However certain types of oil based furniture polishes, wood preservatives or cleaning sprays may cause the rubber "feet" to soften and leave marks or a rubber residue on your furniture. To prevent any damage to your furniture, we strongly recommend that you purchase small self-adhesive felt pads, available at hardware stores and home improvement centers everywhere, and apply these pads to the bottom of the rubber "feet" before you place the product on fine wooden furniture.



# **POWER SOURCE**

#### **AC CONNECTION**

Use the AC polarized line cord for operation on AC power. Insert the AC plug into any convenient 120V 60Hz household outlet.


NOTE: The AC plug supplied with the unit is polarized to help minimize the possibility of electric shock. If the AC plug does not fit into a nonpolarized AC outlet, do not file or cut the wide blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.



#### **BATTERY INSTALLATION**

Two (2) "AAA" size batteries can also be used to power and/or to provide a backup for the clock and alarm time for this unit as follows:

- Open the battery door by removing the screw and then sliding the battery door off in the direction of the "OPEN" arrow.
- Insert two (2) "AAA" batteries as shown. Alkaline batteries are recommended for the longest playing time.
- Replace the battery door and screw back on the compartment.



#### NOTE:

 The batteries are used to back-up the clock and alarm times when the AC adapter is disconnected or there is a power failure.



#### BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

- \* Replacement of batteries must be done by an adult.
- \* Do not mix old and new batteries.
- \* Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- \* The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- \* Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- \* Exhausted batteries are to be removed.
- \* Only batteries of the equivalent type are to be used.
- \* Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.
- \* Dispose of batteries properly.
- \* Do not dispose of batteries in fire; batteries may explode or leak.

# **OPTIONAL CONNECTIONS**

# PHONE (Headphones) JACK

For private listening, plug headphones into this jack. The speakers will be disconnected when a plug is inserted into this jack.

#### **AUX IN JACK**

Insert one end of the audio cable (included) into the LINE OUT jack on your external audio unit and the other end into the AUX IN jack on the rear of this unit.


To listen to the external audio unit, turn this unit on using the STANDBY ON button. Turn on the external unit as well. Then, select "AUX" by repeatedly pressing the iPod/AUX/AM/FM button; "AUX" will appear in the display. The external audio unit's output sound will be heard through this unit's speakers. If you wish to listen to the iPod in the iPod compartment, select "iPod" by repeatedly pressing the iPod/AUX/AM/FM button; "iPod" will appear in the display.

#### VIDEO OUT JACK


If you are using an iPod with video (5th generation) or iPod photo, you can connect this unit to an external TV with the video cable (included). You will then be able to view the photos (in Slideshow mode)/videos from the iPod on your external TV.

- Set the TV's TV/VIDEO button or switch to the VIDEO setting.
- When connecting this unit, refer to the owner's manual of the TV, as well as this manual.
- When connecting this unit to the TV, make sure the power is off and both units are unplugged before making any connections.
- Make sure to go into the Settings menu of your iPod and set the TV Out setting to ON and set the TV signal to NTSC; otherwise, you may not be able to view the photos (in Slideshow mode)/videos on your external TV.


# INSERTING AN iPod



Locate the correct Universal Dock to use as shown on page 21. Insert the Universal Dock (A) into the iPod compartment (B) (as shown), making sure the tabs are facing front, and slip the tabs into place. Press the rear side of the Universal Dock until it is positioned inside the iPod compartment.



Insert the iPod Support Bracket (A) into the two holes behind the iPod Compartment (B) (as shown).



Slide the iPod (A) into the Universal Dock (B) (as shown). Gently push down so the connector on the iPod slides onto the connector on this unit.



The iPod will charge as long as this unit is connected via the AC cord.

Please see the next page for instructions on using an iPod with this unit.

- For better AM radio reception, the iPod will not charge while in AM radio mode.
- To remove the Universal Dock, insert your finger (or other object) into the gap in the Universal Dock, then gently pull the Universal Dock out to remove it.

## **OPERATION**


### USING AN iPod WITH THIS UNIT



With an iPod connected (see previous page), if this unit is not already on, turn this unit on by pressing the STANDBY ON button ①. If you are not already in iPod mode, select "iPod" by repeatedly pressing the iPod/AUX/AM/FM button ②; "iPod" will appear in the display.



You can operate the iPod using its own controls, as per its owner's manual, or you can use the controls on the main unit to operate the iPod.



## To play/pause the iPod:

Press the PLAY/PAUSE button to start playback on your iPod. Press again to pause playback and press yet again to resume playback.



To skip forward or backward on the iPod: Press the HOUR/Skip/Search № ① or MINUTE/Skip/Search № ② button to skip to the beginning of the current track/previous or next track.

To search forward or backward on the iPod: Press and hold the HOUR/Skip/Search № ① or MINUTE/Skip/Search № ② button to search within the currently-playing track.

- If an iPod is inserted while this unit is already on and in iPod mode, iPod playback mode will begin automatically.
- See the next page for how to adjust the volume.
- To turn this unit off, press the STANDBY ON button.

# ADJUSTING THE VOLUME



# To adjust the volume:

Rotate the VOLUME control as desired to increase and/or decrease the volume.

### **USING THE RADIO**



Turn this unit on by pressing the STANDBY ON button.



If you are not already in AM or FM mode, select "AM" or "FM" by repeatedly pressing the iPod/AUX/AM/FM button; "AM" or "FM" and the frequency will appear in the display.



Rotate the TUNING control to manually advance the frequency in the display up or down until the desired frequency appears.

NOTE: When a station is tuned, after approx. five seconds, the radio frequency will disappear and the actual time will reappear in the display. If you rotate the TUNING control, the radio frequency will appear in the display again.



- To turn this unit off, press the STANDBY ON button.

#### **ANTENNAS**

**FM:** The FM antenna is built into the AC cord. You may have to extend and vary the direction of the AC cord until you find the position that provides the best reception.

**AM:** The AM bar antenna is located inside the cabinet of the main unit. You may need to change the position of the main unit until you find the position that provides the best reception of your favorite AM stations.


### TO SET OR RESET THE ACTUAL TIME



With the power off, press the TIME SET button; the time will blink.



Within 10 seconds, press the MINUTE/Skip/Search № button ① to set the present minute and the HOUR/Skip/Search № button ② to set the present hour. Make sure to set the correct AM/PM setting.



Press the TIME SET button (or wait approx. 10 seconds) and the time will be set.

## TO SET OR RESET THE ALARM TIME



With the power off, press the ALARM SET button; the Alarm time will blink in the display.



Within 10 seconds, press the MINUTE/Skip/Search № button 10 to set the alarm minute and the HOUR/Skip/Search 14 button 12 to set the alarm hour. Make sure to set the correct AM/PM setting. Press the ALARM SET button 16 again.



Within 10 seconds, press the MINUTE/Skip/Search № button ① and/or HOUR/Skip/Search № button ② to set the alarm mode (iPod, Buzz[er] or Radio). Press the ALARM SET button ③ again.



If set to Radio, within 10 seconds, set the band (AM or FM) using the MINUTE/Skip/Search ⋈ button on and/or HOUR/Skip/Search ⋈ button followed by pressing the ALARM SET button again (or waiting approx. 5 seconds). (When the alarm time is reached, the unit will turn on the band (AM or FM) that you selected and the frequency that you had selected before turning the unit off.)

Repeatedly press the ALARM ON/OFF button **9** to turn the alarm on or off.

# **CONTINUED ON THE NEXT PAGE**



If set to iPod, insert the iPod as shown on page 11. Select your desired track and then make sure both your iPod and this unit are turned off. When the alarm time is reached, this unit will start playback on the track that you selected.

- If set to iPod but an iPod is not connected, the unit will automatically switch to wake to Buzzer.
- Make sure to set the desired volume as shown on page 13.
- TO SHUT OFF THE ALARM, see TO SHUT THE ALARM OFF section on the next page.

### TO SHUT THE ALARM OFF



To leave the alarm set for the next day, press the STANDBY ON button • or ALARM ON/OFF button • and the alarm will turn off but be set for the next day.



To NOT set the alarm for the next day, press the ALARM ON/OFF button again to select alarm off (no indicator in the display).


## **SNOOZE**



While the alarm is sounding, press the SNOOZE button. The alarm will turn back on automatically nine minutes later until the SNOOZE function is cancelled.

- You can repeat the SNOOZE function for up to 60 minutes.
- To cancel the SNOOZE function (the alarm will not turn back on), press the ALARM ON/OFF button.

#### SI FFP



While the unit is on, press the SLEEP button; "SLEEP" will appear and "120" will blink in the display which indicates the SLEEP feature is on and set for 120 minutes (the unit will turn off automatically after 120 minutes).

To set a shorter SLEEP time, press the SLEEP button again within five seconds to select 90 minutes; "90" will blink in the display. Repeat to select 60, 30, 20, 10 or 5 minutes. (If you press the SLEEP button again while "05" is blinking in the display, the unit will turn off immediately.) To view the remaining SLEEP time, press the SLEEP button once.





### NOTES:

- The Third Generation iPod 10-15GB uses the same dock as the Fourth Generation iPod 20GB. Also, the Third Generation iPod 30-40GB uses the same dock as the Fourth Generation iPod 40GB.
- For the iPod nano and for the iPod video (Fifth Generation), please use the universal docks included with your iPod.
- Also included with this unit is a dock for use with the Barbie<sup>TM</sup> Petal MP3 player<sup>TM</sup>; it is marked on the bottom as "MP3 Player, 6". There is also a "dust cover" (a dock with no opening for an iPod) included with this unit; it is marked on the bottom as "1" and on the front as "iPod cover". Please insert the "dust cover" into the iPod compartment if you will not be using an iPod with this unit for an extended amount of time.
