POWER SOURCES

This CD player requires either two (2) "AA" batteries (not included) or an AC adapter (not included).

BATTERY INSTALLATION

The Battery indicator (${\hfill (\Box)}$) will appear in the CD display when the batteries need replacing.

- Open the Battery Compartment door by pressing in on the tab and then lifting it. To prevent the possibility of losing the cover, it cannot be removed.
- Insert two (2) "AA" batteries (not included) according to the polarity diagram inside the battery compartment. Alkaline batteries are recommended for the longest playing time.



BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

- * Replacement of batteries must be done by an adult.
- * Do not mix old and new batteries.
- * Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
- * The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
- * Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
- * Exhausted batteries are to be removed.
- * Only batteries of the equivalent type are to be used.
- * Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.
- * Dispose of batteries properly.

AC OPERATION

To operate the unit using AC power, connect an AC adapter (not included) to an AC outlet having 120V, 60Hz AC only. Plug the small end into the DC4.5V $\odot \odot \odot$ jack on the side of the unit and connect the other end into the AC outlet. The batteries are automatically disconnected when the AC adapter is used.

CAUTION: When not using AC power, disconnect the AC adapter from the wall outlet by pulling the plug (not the cord). Do not touch the AC adapter with wet hands. Fully insert the plug without exposing any part of the blade.

OPERATION

TO INSERT AND PLAY A CD

When the disc is through playing, it will stop. Press the POWER OFF/STOP button to stop the disc before it is finished.

Press the POWER OFF/STOP ■ button again while in the Stop mode to turn the unit off or wait approx. 60 seconds and the unit will automatically turn off (Auto Power Off).

TO PAUSE PLAYBACK



Press the POWER ON/PLAY/ PAUSE ►II button to pause playback; the display will blink. Press the POWER ON/PLAY/PAUSE ►II button to continue playback; the display will stop blinking and playback will continue.

HOLD SWITCH



To prevent accidentally pressing a button while walking, etc., slide the HOLD switch to the ON position; the Hold indicator () will appear in the display. When you want to use these buttons again, slide the HOLD switch back to the OFF position.

CD PLAYBACK NOTES:

- This unit is capable of playing standard CDs or 3" singles; no adapter is required.
- If a disc is inserted incorrectly, dirty, damaged or not present at all, "disc" will appear in the display.
- As each track is played, the track number and elapsed time are shown in the display.
- To remove the disc, open the CD compartment, hold the edge of the CD and gently press the center spindle and lift the CD.
- "OPEN" will appear in the display when the CD Compartment door is open.
- Although this unit can read CD-R and CD-RW discs, in addition to normal CDs, the playability of those discs may be affected by the type of software that was used to create the discs, as well as the blank media you are using. 100% playability cannot be guaranteed. This is not an indication of a problem with this unit.

ANTI-SHOCK SYSTEM

This CD player has a built-in anti-shock system that cuts down on CD skipping, which is useful when using the CD player in the car or while jogging/walking.

When the unit is turned on, the anti-shock system will start automatically, the sound will mute for just a moment and the display will show the blinking ANTI-SHOCK indicator. Within a few seconds, the ANTI-SHOCK indicator will fill to indicate music signals are stored memory.

To turn the anti-shock system off, press the ASP button. To turn the anti-shock system on again, press the ASP button again.

NOTES:

- When the CD player is used in a stable location, turn the anti-shock system off by pressing the ASP button. When the anti-shock system is OFF, battery consumption is less.
- The anti-shock system provides for continuous sound output when the unit is subject to vibration, but it will not correct errors, such as a defective or dirty CD.

TO REPEATEDLY PLAY BACK ONE TRACK





While in CD Stop mode, press the MODE button once; the Repeat One indicator "[]1" will appear in the display.

Press the SKIP/SEARCH ₩ ● or ₩ ● button to select a track and press the POWER ON/PLAY/PAUSE ►II button ● to start playback. The unit will play the selected track over and over until the POWER OFF/STOP ■ button ● is pressed.

TO REPEATEDLY PLAY BACK ALL TRACKS





While in CD Stop mode, press the MODE button twice; the Repeat All indicator " (]ALL" will appear in the display.

Press the POWER ON/PLAY/ PAUSE ►II button ① to start playback and the unit will then play all the tracks on the CD over and over until the POWER OFF/STOP ■ button ❷ is pressed.

TO CANCEL OR STOP REPEAT PLAYBACK:

- TO STOP REPEAT PLAYBACK, press the POWER OFF/STOP
 button once.
- TO CANCEL REPEAT PLAYBACK, press the MODE button until no indicators appear in the display; normal playback will continue.

INTRO PLAY





While in CD Stop mode, press the MODE button three times; the INTRO indicator will appear in the display.

Press the POWER ON/PLAY/ PAUSE ►II button ① to start playback and the unit will then play the first 10 seconds of each track until the POWER OFF/STOP ■ button ❷ is pressed.

TO RANDOMLY PLAY BACK A CD





While in CD Stop mode, press the MODE button four times; the SHUFF indicator will appear in the display.

Press the POWER ON/PLAY/ PAUSE ►II button ① to start playback and the unit will then play all the tracks on the CD in random order until the POWER OFF/STOP ■ button ② is pressed.

TO CANCEL OR STOP INTRO OR RANDOM PLAYBACK:

- TO STOP INTRO OR RANDOM PLAYBACK, press the POWER OFF/STOP button once.
- TO CANCEL INTRO OR RANDOM PLAYBACK, press the MODE button until no indicators appear in the display; normal playback will continue.

TO PROGRAM THE MEMORY (UP TO 20 TRACKS)





While in CD Stop mode, press the PROG. button; the track number and PRG indicator will blink in the display.

Select the first track to be played back using the SKIP/SEARCH ₩ or ₩ ❷ button, then press the PROG. button ❸ again. Repeat this step to program additional tracks (up to 20 tracks).

- To clear the memorized program, press the POWER OFF/STOP button again while in the Stop mode, wait approx. 60 seconds and the unit will turn off or open the CD compartment.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Caring for Compact Discs

- Treat the compact disc carefully. Handle the compact disc only by its edges. Never allow your fingers to come in contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the compact disc.
- Do not attach adhesive tape, stickers, etc. to the compact disc label.
- Clean the compact disc periodically with a soft, lintfree, dry cloth. Never use detergents or abrasive cleaners to clean the compact disc. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.
- If a disc skips or gets stuck on a section of the compact disc, it is probably dirty or damaged (scratched).
- When cleaning the compact disc, wipe in straight lines from the center of the compact disc to the outer edge of the compact disc. Never wipe in circular motions.
