Assembling Your Phone

Insert the SIM card and attach the battery to use your phone.

SIM card

When you register as a subscriber with a service provider, you get a SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card. The SIM card contains a computer chip that keeps track of your phone number, the services included in your subscription, and your contacts information, among other things.



Save contacts on your SIM card before you remove it from another phone. Contacts may have been saved in the phone memory \Rightarrow 20 Contacts.

To insert the SIM card and charge the battery



- Slide the cover open and lift it off.
- 2 Insert the SIM card. Make sure the SIM card is placed under the silvery holders.
- **3** Place the battery in the phone with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.

- 4 Place the cover on the phone and slide it into place.
- **5** Connect the charger to the phone. The symbol on the charger plug must face upwards.
- 6 It may take 30 minutes for the battery icon to appear.
- 7 Wait approximately 2.5 hours or until the battery icon indicates that the battery is fully charged. For an indication of charging, press to activate the screen.
- 8 Remove the charger by pulling it out.

Some functions use more battery power than others and may cause a need for more frequent re-charging. However, talk-time or standby time may become noticeably shorter due to wear and you may have to replace your battery. Only use approved batteries from Sony Ericsson 67 Battery.

PIN

You may need a PIN (Personal Identification Number) from your service provider to activate the services in your phone. Each PIN digit appears as *, unless it starts with emergency number digits, for example, 112 or 911. This is so that you can see and call an emergency number without entering a PIN 19 *Emergency calls.* Press © to correct mistakes.



To turn the phone on and off



- 1 Press and hold () to turn on or off.
- 23 Enter your SIM card PIN, if you have one.
- At first startup, select the language for phone menus.
- 4 Select Yes if you want the setup wizard to help you
- 5 with instructions and tips or No. The setup wizard is also available in the menu system ► Settings ► General ► Setup Wizard.

To make and receive calls

Enter an area code and phone number \triangleright Call to make the call. ► End Call to end the call. When the phone rings ► Answer to answer the call.

Navigating the Menus

The main menus are shown as icons. Some submenus include tabs that appear on the screen.



- Press (avigation key) to go to the main menu or to select items.
- Press ⁽¹⁾, ⁽¹⁾, ⁽¹⁾) or ⁽¹⁾) to move through menus and tabs.
- Press (1) to go back one level in the menus or to end a function or application.
- Press and hold (5) to return to standby.
- Press
 to select the options shown immediately above these keys on the screen.
- Press to delete items.
- More to enter a list of options.
- Info to get help on selected features.

Shortcuts

From standby, you can use O, O, O, O to go directly to a function.

To create a standby shortcut

- 2 Scroll to a function to create a shortcut to ► Shortcut.

To edit a standby shortcut

- 1 ► Settings ► General ► Shortcuts and select an existing shortcut you want to edit ► Edit.
- 2 Scroll to and select a function ► Shortcut.

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Activity Menu

Open the activity menu to view and handle new events, access bookmarks and shortcuts.

To open and close the activity menu

Press (2). Use (2) or (2) to scroll between tabs.

Activity menu tabs

- New Events missed calls and messages.
- My Shortcuts applications that are running in the background and your shortcuts. You can add, delete and change the order of shortcuts.
- Bookmarks your Internet bookmarks.
- If you want new events to appear as pop-up text instead of in the activity menu ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ New Events ▶ Popup.

Shut Down Menu

Shut down the phone, lock keys, turn on silent mode or activate a profile. For more information about profiles \Rightarrow 51 Profiles.

To open and close the shut down menu

Press (1) and select an option from the list.

File Manager

Files such as pictures, videos, sounds, themes, games and applications are saved in folders in the phone memory.

To manage files and folders

- 1 ► Organizer ► File Manager and select a folder.
- 2 Scroll to a file ► More ► Manage Files and choose an option.
- 3 Select a folder or ► New Folder and name the folder ► OK.

To select several files

- 1 ► Organizer ► File Manager and select a file ► More ► Mark, select Mark Several or Mark All.
- 2 Scroll and select more files by pressing Mark or Unmark.

To check memory status

► Organizer ► File Manager ► More ► Memory Status.

File information

View file information by highlighting a file ► More ► Information. Copyright-protected files cannot be copied or sent.

Synchronizing items

Languages

Select the language for menus and when writing text.

To change the phone language

- ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Language ▶ Phone Language, select a language.
- From standby, press:

 Ø 0000 @ for English or
 Ø 8888 @ for Automatic Janguage (SIM Janandam)
 - 8888 for Automatic language (SIM-dependant).

To select writing languages

- **1** ► Settings ► General ► Language ► Writing Language.
- Scroll and select languages by pressing Mark or Unmark.
 Save to exit the menu.

Entering Letters and Characters

To enter letters using multitap text input

- Press 2 9 until the desired character appears.
- To shift between capitals and lower-case letters, press (*****).
- To enter numbers, press and hold □+) □.
- To add a space, press ∉→.
- For the most common punctuation marks, press 1
- To enter the + sign, press •.
- To change input method, press and hold ****.

T9™ Text Input

The T9[™] Text Input method uses a built-in dictionary to recognize the most commonly used word for each sequence of key presses. This way, you press each key only once, even if the letter you want is not the first letter on the key.

To enter letters using T9™ Text Input

- 1 ► Messaging ► Write New ► Text Message.
- 2 For example, if you want to write the word "Jane", press (5), (2), (6), (3).
- 3 If the word shown is the one you want, press (#-...) to accept and add a space. To accept a word without adding a space, press (...). If the word shown is not the one you want, press (...) or (...) preatedly to view alternative words. Accept a word and add a space by pressing (#-...).

To add words to the T9™ Text Input dictionary

- While entering letters ► More ► Spell Word.
- 2 Edit the word by using multitap input. Press (and to navigate between letters. To delete a character, press (C). To delete an entire word, press and hold (C).
- 3 When you have edited the word ► Insert. The word is added to the T9TM Text Input dictionary. Next time you enter this word using T9TM Text Input, it will appear as one of the alternative words.

Changing Style-Up[™] Covers

Some kits may include additional Style-Up[™] covers. Follow these instructions to change covers.

To change the front cover



- 1 Insert your thumbnail into the groove on the bottom of the phone.
- 2 3 Gently lift the front cover away from the phone.
- Align the cover with the top of the phone as shown.
- 4 Snap the cover into place by gently pushing down until it is lying flat.

To change the battery cover

Calling

Making and receiving calls

Turn on the phone and make sure that you are within range of a network to make and receive calls $\rightarrow 11$ To turn the phone on and off. If your subscription includes the Caller ID service and the caller's number is identified, the number is displayed. If the number is saved in Contacts, the name, number, and picture (if defined) are displayed. If the number is a restricted number, Withheld is displayed.

To make a call

Enter a phone number (with international country code and area code, if applicable) \triangleright Call to make the call. \triangleright End Call to end the call

To redial a number

If the connection failed, Retry? is displayed > Yes.



 \bigcirc Do not hold the phone to your ear while waiting. When a call connects, the phone gives a loud signal.

To answer or reject a call

► Answer to answer a call. ► Busy to reject a call.

To change the ear speaker volume

During a call, press (6) or (6) to increase or decrease the volume

To select more options during a call

Press (i) and select an option.

To turn off the microphone

Press and hold (C). To resume, press and hold (C) again.

To use the loudspeaker during a voice call

▶ More ▶ Turn On Speaker or ▶ Turn Off Speaker.

Missed calls

When you have missed a call, it appears in the activity menu if New Events is set to Activity Menu. ► Call to call the missed number.

If New Events is set to Popup, Missed calls; appears, ► Yes to view the missed calls in the call list or \triangleright No to do it later. To change the Activity Menu settings
13 Activity Menu.

To call a number from the call list

- 1 Calls from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Scroll to the name or number you want to call \triangleright Call.

To add a call list number to contacts

- 1 Calls from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Scroll to the number you want to add ► More Save Number
- 3 Select New Contact to create a new contact. or an existing contact to add the number to.

Emergency calls

Your phone supports international emergency numbers, for example, 112 and 911. This means that these numbers can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country, with or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is in range.



In some countries, other emergency numbers may also be promoted. Your service provider may have saved additional local emergency numbers on the SIM card.

To make an emergency call

Enter, for example, 112 ► Call.

To view your local emergency numbers

Contacts ► Options ► Special Numbers ► Emergency Nos.

Contacts

Choose Phone Contacts for detailed information saved in the phone memory or SIM Contacts for names and numbers on the SIM card

To select default contacts

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Default Contacts. 1
- Select Phone Contacts or SIM Contacts. 2

To check the memory status

► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Memory Status.



The number of entries you can save depends on the amount of memory available in the phone or on the SIM card

Managing contacts

Save numbers, add pictures, ringtones and personal information.

To add a contact

- 1 ► Contacts ► New Contact ► Add
- 2 Enter the name \triangleright OK
- 3 New Number: Add
- 4 Enter the number \blacktriangleright OK
- 5 For phone contacts only, select a number.
- 6 Scroll between tabs and select fields to enter more information
- 7 When you have entered the information > Save.

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It is recommended to enter the + sign and country code for all numbers.

To add a picture or a ringtone to a contact

- Contacts and select the contact. ► More ► Edit Contact.
- 2 Select the relevant tab and then select a Picture or Ringtone
 ▶ Add. Select a picture or sound and ▶ Save.

To add your own business card

▶ Contacts \triangleright Options \triangleright My Business Card and enter the information for your business card \triangleright Save.

To send your business card

► Contacts ► Options ► My Business Card ► Send My Card.

To call a phone contact

▶ Contacts scroll to, or enter the first letter of the contact. Use ③ or ④ to select a number ▶ Call.

To call a SIM contact

- If SIM Contacts is default ► Contacts and select a name and number from the list ► Call.
- If Phone Contacts is default ► Contacts ► Options
 ► SIM Contacts and select a name and number ► Call.

To copy names and numbers to the SIM card

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Copy to SIM.
- Select Copy All or Copy a Number.

When copying all contacts from the phone to the SIM card, all existing SIM card information is replaced.

To copy SIM contacts to phone contacts

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Copy from SIM.
- Select Copy All or Copy a Number.

To always save to the SIM card

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Auto Save on SIM.
- 2 Select On.

To send contacts

- To send a selected contact ► More ► Send Contact and select a transfer method.
- To send all contacts ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced
 ► Send All Contacts.

To edit a phone contact

- 1 ► Contacts and select a contact ► More ► Edit Contact.
- 2 Scroll to the relevant tab and edit the information ► Save.

To edit a SIM contact

- If SIM Contacts is default ► Contacts. If Phone Contacts is default ► Contacts ► Options ► SIM Contacts.
- 2 Select the name and number you want to edit.
- 3 ► More ► Edit Contact and edit the name and number.

To delete contacts

- ► Contacts select a contact, press <a>C.
- ▶ Contacts ▶ Options ▶ Advanced ▶ Delete All Contacts
 ▶ Yes and ▶ Yes. Names and numbers on the SIM card are not deleted.

To set the default number for a contact

Select the first phone number to be displayed for a contact ► Contacts and scroll to a contact ► More ► Default Number.

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Speed dialing

Save numbers in positions 1-9 in your phone to access them easily.

To set or replace speed dialing numbers

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Speed Dial.
- 2 Scroll to the position ► Add or ► Replace and select a phone number.

To speed dial

From standby, enter a speed dial number 1-9 ► Call.

Voicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voicemail message when you cannot answer a call.

To save your voicemail number

Press and hold \bigcirc > Yes enter the number > OK. You can get the number from your service provider.

To call your voicemail service

If you have saved your voicemail number, press and hold 1.

To check your voicemail number

▶ Messaging ▶ Settings ▶ Voicemail Number.

Forwarding Calls

Forward calls, for example, to an answering service.

To activate a call forward

- **1** ► Settings ► Calls ► Forward Calls.
- Select a call type and forward option ► Activate.
- 3 Enter a phone number to forward your calls to, or ► Lookup to find a contact ► OK.

To deactivate a call forward

Scroll to the forward option ► Deactivate.

To check all forward options

Settings ► Calls ► Forward Calls ► Check All.

More Than One Call

Handle more than one call simultaneously.

Call waiting service

You hear a beep if you receive a second call.

To activate the call waiting service

Settings ► Calls ► Manage Calls ► Call Waiting ► Activate
 Select.

To make a second call

- 1 ► More ► Hold to hold the ongoing call.
- Enter the number to call ► Call.

Receiving a second call

When you receive a second call, select one of the following options:

- To answer and put the ongoing call on hold ► Answer.
- To reject and continue the ongoing call ► Busy.

Handling two calls

If you have calls ongoing and on hold, select one of the following options:

- To switch between the two calls ► More ► Switch.
- To join the two calls ► More ► Join Calls.
- To connect the two calls ► More ► Transfer Call. You are disconnected from both calls.

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- To retrieve the call on hold ▶ End Call ▶ Yes
- To end both calls ► End Call ► No.



You cannot answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls or joining them into a conference call.

Conference calls

Start a conference call by joining an ongoing call and a call on hold.

To join the two calls into a conference call

More ► Join Calls

To add a new participant

- More ► Hold to put the joined calls on hold. 1
- 2 More ► Add Call and call the next person.
- 3 ▶ More ▶ Join Calls
- 4 Repeat the procedure to include up to five participants.

To release a participant

More ► Release Party and select the participant.

To have a private conversation

- More ► Talk to and select a participant. 1
- 2 More ► Join Calls to resume the conference call

Two voice lines

Make separate calls with different phone numbers if your subscription supports alternate line service.

To select a line

Settings ► Calls and select line 1 or 2.

To change the name of a line

Settings ➤ Display ➤ Edit Line Names and select the line to edit.

Additional Calling Functions

Tone signals

Use telephone banking services or control an answering machine by sending tone signals during a call.

- To send the tones, press (+ 9, **** or ***).
- To clear the screen after a call has ended, press C.
- To turn the tones on or off during a call, press

 in standby and select Disable Tones or Enable Tones.

Notepad

Write down a phone number during a call. When you end the call, the number remains on the screen to call or save in your contacts.

Showing or hiding your phone number

If your subscription supports the Calling Line Identification Restriction, you can hide your number when making a call.

To always show or hide your phone number

- 1 ► Settings ► Calls ► Show/Hide My No.
- Select Show Number, Hide Number or Network Default.

Call time

During a call, the duration of the call is shown. You can check the duration of your last call, outgoing calls and the total time of your calls.

To check the call time

Settings ► Calls ► Time & Cost ► Call Timers. To reset ► More and select Reset Total or Reset Outgoing.

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Messaging

Your phone supports various messaging services. Contact your service provider about the services you can use or visit *www.sonyericsson.com/support*.

Text Messaging (SMS)

Text messages can contain pictures, animations, melodies and sound effects.

Before you start

A service center number is provided by your service provider for you to send and receive text messages. It may be on the SIM card or you can add the number yourself.

To set a service center number

- 1 ► Messaging ► Settings ► Text Message ► Service Center. The number is shown if it is saved on the SIM card.
- 2 If there is no number ► New Service Ctr. and enter the number, including the international "+" sign and country code ► Save.

To write and send a text message or save a draft

- 1 ► Messaging ► Write New ► Text Message.
- 2 Write your message. To insert an item in your message ► More ► Add Item.
- Continue. (To save the message for later, press () and
 Yes to save in Drafts.)
- 4 Select Enter Phone No. and enter the recipient's number, or Contacts Lookup to find a number or a group, or select from the last used recipients list.

- 5 To change the default options for your message, for example, to request a read report
 More
 Advanced select an option ► Edit and select a setting ► Done.
- 6 ► Send

You can convert your text message to a picture message. While writing ► More ► To Picture Msg.

To copy and paste text in a message

- 1 While writing your message ► More ► Edit.
- 2 Select Copy All to copy all of the text in your message, or Copy Text > Start and use the navigation key to mark text ► End.
- 3 More ► Edit ► Paste.

Receiving messages

When you receive a text message or an automatically downloaded picture message, it appears in the activity menu if New Events is set to Activity Menu. > View to read the message.

If New Events is set to Popup, you are asked if you want to read the message. ► Yes to view the message or ► No to do it later. Press (5) to close the message. To change the activity menu settings # 13 Activity Menu.



⟨j⟩ If the phone memory is full, you must delete messages or emails before you can receive new ones.

To call a number in a message

Select the phone number displayed in the message ► Call.

To save an item in a text message

- 1 While reading a message, select the item ► More.
- 2 Select Use (the phone number you have selected appears) to save a phone number, or Save Picture to save a picture, or Save Bookmark to save a Web address.

To save a selected message

More ► Save Message select Saved Messages (SIM card) or Templates (phone).

To save several messages in a folder

- Select a message ► More ► Mark Several.
- 2 Scroll and ► Mark to select messages ► More ► Save Messages.

To delete a message

Select a message and press C.

To delete several messages in a folder

- Select a message ► More ► Delete All Msgs. or ► Mark Several.
- 2 ► Mark to select messages ► More ► Delete Messages.

Long messages

The number of characters allowed in a text message depends on the language used for writing. You can send a long message by linking two or more messages. You are charged for each of the messages linked in a long message. The recipient may not receive all parts of a long message at the same time.



Check with your service provider for the maximum number of messages that can be linked.

To activate long messages

► Messaging ► Settings ► Text Message ► Max. Msg. Length Max. Available.

To check the delivery status of a sent message

► Messaging ► Sent Messages and select a text message ► View More ► Details.

Picture Messaging (MMS)

Picture messages can contain text, pictures, video clips, camera pictures, sound recordings, and signatures.



Sending and receiving phones must have subscriptions that support picture messaging.

Before you start

If required settings are not already in your phone \Rightarrow 43 Settings.

Creating and sending picture messages

Select to write text and add pictures, sound, video, your signature, and other attachments.

To create and send a picture message

► Messaging ► Write New ► Picture Msg. 1 2 Add text and \blacktriangleright More to add an item to the message. When you are ready to send it, continue as you would with a text message > 27 Text Messaging (SMS).

- For picture messages, you have the same options as for text messages, such as copy and paste, save, and delete messages 🌩 27 Text Messaging (SMS).

To create your own signature for picture messages

- 1 ► Messaging ► Settings ► Picture Message.
- 2 ► Signature ► New Signature.

To save an item found in a picture message

➡ 29 To save an item in a text message

Automatic download

Select how to download your picture messages:

► Messaging ► Settings ► Picture Message ► Auto Download to view options:

- Always automatically download messages.
- Ask in Roaming ask to download other network messages.
- Not in Roaming do not download other network messages.
- Always Ask ask to download messages.
- Off new messages appear in the inbox as icons. Select the message ► View to download.

Voice Messages

Send and receive a sound recording as a voice message.



Sending and receiving phones must have subscriptions that support picture messaging.

To record and send a voice message

- ► Messaging ► Write New ► Voice Message. 1
- 2 Record vour message ► Stop.
- 3 ▶ Send to send the message.
- 4 Select Enter Email Addr. to enter an email address, or Enter Phone No. to enter the recipient's number, or Contacts Lookup to retrieve a number or group from Contacts, or select from the last used recipients list > Send.

Receiving voice messages

When you receive an automatically downloaded voice message it appears in the activity menu if New Events is set to Activity Menu. ▶ Play to listen to the message.

If New Events is set to Popup, you are asked if you want to listen to the voice message. ► Yes to play the message or ► No to play it later. Press () to close the message.

Email

Connect to a POP3 or IMAP4 mail server to send and receive email messages with your phone. You can use the same email settings in your phone as in your computer email program.

Before you start

If required settings are not already in your phone + 43 Settings.

To write and send an email message

- 1 ► Messaging ► Email ► Write New.
- 2 Select Add to enter an email address, or Contacts Lookup to find an address in Contacts, or an email address from the last used recipients list.
- 3 To add more recipients select To, Cc: or Bcc:.
- 4 When you have selected recipients ► Done.
- 5 Write the subject \triangleright OK. Write the text \triangleright OK.
- 6 To add an attachment ► Add and select the attachment ► Done ► Continue.
- 7 ► Send or ► More to view options.

To receive and read email messages

- Select a message ► View to read it.

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To reply to an email message

- Open the email message ► Reply.
- Write your message ► More to view options.
- 3 ► OK ► Continue ► Send to send the message.

To save an item or attachment in an email message

- To save an email address, a phone number or a Web address
 ▶ More and select to save the item.
- To save an attachment, select the message ▶ More. Select the attachment ▶ Save.

To delete email messages

- To delete a selected message, press
- To delete several messages in a folder
 More
 Mark Several. Scroll and
 Mark to select messages.
 More
 Mark for Deletion. The marked messages are deleted the next time you connect to your email server.

Imaging

Camera and Video Recorder

Your phone has a digital camera which also works as a digital video recorder. Take pictures and record video clips to save. send or use. Use a picture as a screen saver, wallpaper or a contact item = 21 To add a picture or a ringtone to a contact.

To take pictures and video clips



- 1 Press and hold (a) to start the camera, press (3) or (3) to switch between video and photo.
- 23 Press (a) again to take a picture or start the video.
- To end the video recording, press (a).

Alternatively, you can select Camera to start the camera, and then Capture to take the picture or Record to start the video

If you try to record with a strong light source such as direct sunlight or a lamp in the background, the screen may black out or the picture may be distorted.

To use the zoom

Use (b) and (c) to zoom in and zoom out.

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Camera options

- View All Clips (video).
- Shoot Mode (video) select For Picture Msg or High-Quality Video.
- Video Size select Large 176x144 or Small 128x96.
- Night Mode enhance picture or video quality in poor lighting conditions.
- Effects select different effects for your picture or video.
- View All Pictures (pictures).
- Shoot Mode (pictures) select Normal for no frame, Panorama to combine several pictures into one wide picture, Frames to add a frame to your picture and Burst to take several pictures in rapid succession.
- Picture Size select Large 640x480, Medium 320x240, Small 160x120 or Extended.
- Self-Timer (pictures) the picture is taken a few seconds after you press the camera button.
- · Picture Quality select Normal or Fine picture quality.
- Shutter Sound (pictures) select different shutter sounds.

Pictures and Video Clips

Your phone comes with pictures and video clips, which you can delete to free memory. All pictures and videos are saved in the file manager. When you have taken a picture, you can also view it by selecting Camera Pictures. The number of pictures or video clips that you can save depends on the size of the files. There is support for GIF, JPEG, WBMP, BMP, PNG, MP4 and 3GP.
To view your pictures

To view your video clips

To search camera pictures by time line

- Camera Pictures or Organizer ► File Manager ► Pictures
 Camera Pictures.
- 2 ► More ► Time Line Search and browse the camera pictures, sorted by date or month in a time line.

Exchanging pictures and video clips

Exchange pictures and video clips with friends using one of the available transfer methods. You may not be allowed to exchange copyright-protected material.

Using a USB cable, you can drag and drop pictures and video clips to a computer \Rightarrow 46 USB Cable.

To send a picture or video clip

- 1 ► Organizer ► File Manager ► Pictures or ► Videos.
- 2 Select a picture or video clip ► More ► Send. Select a transfer method.

To receive and save a picture or video clip

- Via another transfer method, make sure the transfer method is activated and follow the instructions that appear.

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Screen saver and wallpaper

The screen saver is activated when the phone has been in idle mode for a few seconds. After a few more seconds sleep mode is activated, to save power. If you have a picture as wallpaper, this picture is shown in standby mode.

To use a picture

Entertainment

Media Player

Play music and video clips that you download or receive in a picture message or transfer from your computer. The following file types are supported: MP3, MP4, 3GP, AMR, MIDI, IMY, EMY and WAV (16 kHz maximum sample rate). You can also use streamed files that are 3GPP compatible.

To play music or view a video clip

Ringtones, Melodies, Sounds and Alerts

Use standard and polyphonic melodies as ringtones. You can exchange melodies via a transfer method. A sound file that cannot be set as a ringtone is not supported. You may not be allowed to exchange copyright-protected material.

Sound recorder

Record your own voice memos or calls which can be set as ringtones. Recording stops automatically if you receive a call. Recordings are saved in the phone.



In some countries or states it is required by law that you inform the other person before recording the call.

Infrared Port

The infrared port in your phone can be used to exchange information with another device equipped with infrared.

Update Service

Keep your phone updated with the latest software. When a new software version is available, you can download and install it without affecting the user data in your phone.

Sleep mode clock

Show a clock in sleep mode.

Calendar

Add, save, edit and set reminders for your appointments. The calendar can be synchronized with a computer calendar or with a calendar on the Web \Rightarrow 45 Synchronizing.

To set reminders options

A reminder option set in tasks affects a reminder option set in the calendar.

Notes

Make notes and save them in a list. You can also show a note in standby.

Calculator

Use the calculator to add, subtract, divide and multiply.

► Organizer ► Calculator.

- To select ÷ x + . % =, press ③ or ③.
- To delete the figure, press C.

SIM card lock

The SIM card lock protects your subscription, but not the phone itself, from unauthorized use. If you change SIM cards, the phone still works with the new SIM card.

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Most SIM cards are locked at the time of purchase. If the SIM card lock is on, you have to enter a PIN (Personal Identity Number) every time you turn on your phone.

If you enter your PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked. This is indicated by the message PIN Blocked. To unblock it, you need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key). Your PIN and PUK are supplied by your service provider. You can edit your PIN and select a new four- to eight-digit PIN.

If the message Codes do not match. appears when you edit vour PIN, vou entered the new PIN incorrectly. If the message Wrong PIN. appears, followed by Old PIN:, vou entered vour old PIN incorrectly.

To unblock your SIM card

- When PIN Blocked is displayed, enter your PUK ► OK. 1
- 2 Enter a new four- to eight-digit PIN ► OK.
- 3 Re-enter the new PIN to confirm ► OK.

To edit your PIN

- 1 Settings ► General ► Locks ► SIM Lock ► Change PIN.
- 2 3 Enter vour PIN ► OK.
- Enter a new four- to eight-digit PIN ► OK.
- 4 Re-enter the new PIN to confirm ► OK

To turn the SIM card lock on or off

- 1 ► Settings ► General ► Locks ► SIM Lock ► Protection and select On or Off
- 2 Enter your PIN ► OK.

Keypad lock

Lock the keypad to avoid dialing a number by accident. You can still answer an incoming call and the keypad is locked after the call. The keypad remains locked until vou unlock it manually.



- Calls to international emergency numbers 112 or 911, can still be made, even when the keypad is locked.

To lock and unlock the keypad manually

- Press (*a/Arr) ► Lock Keys.
- To unlock the keypad, press ★ Unlock.

Automatic kev lock

Use automatic key lock in standby to lock the keypad soon after the last key was pressed.

To set the automatic key lock

Settings ► General ► Locks ► Automatic Keylock.

Phone lock

Protect your phone against unauthorized use if it stolen and the SIM card is replaced. You can change the phone lock code (0000) to any four- to eight-digit personal code.

Phone lock on

If the phone lock is on, enter your code ► OK.

Automatic phone lock

If the phone lock is set to automatic, you do not need to enter your phone lock code until a different SIM card is inserted in the phone.

It is important that you remember your new code. If you forget it, you have to take your phone to your local Sony Ericsson retailer.

To set the phone lock

- 1 ► Settings ► General ► Locks ► Phone Lock ► Protection and select an option.
- 2 Enter the phone lock code ► OK.

To edit your phone lock code

▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Locks ▶ Phone Lock ▶ Change Code.

Code Memo

Save security codes, such as for credit cards, in the code memo. Set a passcode to open the code memo.

Checkword and security

To confirm that you have entered the correct passcode for the code memo you must enter a checkword. When you enter your passcode to open the code memo, the checkword is shown for a short time. If the passcode is correct, the correct codes are shown. If you enter the incorrect passcode, the checkword and the codes that are shown are also incorrect.

To open code memo for the first time

- 1 ► Organizer ► Code Memo. Instructions appear ► Continue.
- 2 Enter a four-digit passcode ► Continue.
- 3 Re-enter the new passcode to confirm.
- 4 Enter a checkword (maximum 15 characters) ► Done. The checkword can consist of both letters and numbers.

To add a new code

- ► Organizer ► Code Memo and enter your passcode 1 ► Continue ► New Code ► Add
- Enter a name associated with the code ► Continue. 23
- Enter the code \triangleright Done

To change the passcode

- 1 ► Organizer ► Code Memo and enter your passcode ► Continue.
- 2 ► More ► Change Passcode.
- 3 Enter your new passcode ► Continue.
- 4 Re-enter the new passcode ► Continue.
- 5 Enter a checkword
 Done

To reset code memo

- ► Organizer ► Code Memo and enter your passcode 1 Continue ► More ► Reset
- 2 Reset code memo? appears ► Yes. The code memo is reset and all entries are cleared. The next time you enter the code memo **b** 58 To open code memo for the first time.

Troubleshooting

Some problems require you to call your service provider, but you can easily correct most of the problems yourself.

Before you take your phone in for repair, copy all saved items, messages and information to another device as content may be lost during repair. For more support, visit www.sonyericsson.com/support.

Menu options appear in gray

A service is not activated or your subscription does not support the function. Contact your service provider.

The phone is working slowly

Delete unwanted content and then restart the phone.

No indication of charging

The battery is empty or has not been used for a long time. It may take up to 30 minutes before the battery icon appears on the screen.

The phone cannot be turned on/Flashing red light (LED)

Recharge the battery \Rightarrow 9 To insert the SIM card and charge the battery.

Charging a non-Sony Ericsson battery

➡ 67 Battery.

The wrong menu language is shown

➡ 14 To change the phone language.

Master reset

Reset the phone by deleting changes you have made to settings, and content you have added or edited.

To reset the phone

- 1 ► Settings ► General ► Master Reset.
- 2 Select Reset Settings or Reset All. When instructions appear ► Continue.

Error messages

Insert SIM

● 9 To insert the SIM card and charge the battery.

Insert correct SIM card

Check that you are using the correct operator SIM card for your phone.

Emerg. calls only

You are within range of a network, but you are not allowed to use it. Contact your service provider and make sure you have the right subscription $\Rightarrow 19$ *Emergency calls*.

No network

There is no network within range or the received signal is too weak. You have to move to get a signal that is strong enough.

Wrong PIN/Wrong PIN2

You have entered your PIN or PIN2 incorrectly. Enter the correct PIN or PIN2 \triangleright Yes \Rightarrow 54 SIM card lock.

Codes do not match

When you want to change a security code you have to confirm the new code by entering exactly the same code again.

PIN blocked/PIN2 blocked

To unblock **b** 54 SIM card lock.

PUK blocked

Contact your service provider.

Phone locked

The phone is locked. To unlock the phone **b** 56 Phone lock.

Phone lock code

The phone lock code is required **b** 56 Phone lock.

These instructions are intended for your safety. Please follow these guidelines. If the product has been subject to any of the conditions listed below or you have any doubt



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of the proper function make sure to have the product checked by certified service partner before charging or using it. Failure to do so might lead to risk for product malfunction or even a potential hazard to your health.

Recommendations for safe use of product (mobile phone, battery, charger and other accessories)

 Always treat your product with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

- Warning! May explode if disposed of in fire.
- Do not expose your product to liquid or moisture or humidity.
- Do not expose your product to extreme high or low temperatures. Do not expose the battery to temperatures above +60°C (+140°F).

• Do not expose your product to open flames or lit tobacco products.

- · Do not drop, throw or try to bend your product.
- · Do not paint your product.
- Do not attempt to disassemble your product. Only Sony Ericsson authorized personnel should perform service.

Power supply (Charger)

Connect the AC power adapter only to designated power sources as marked on the product. Make sure the cord is positioned so that it will not be subjected to damage or stress. To reduce risk of electric shock, unplug the unit from any power source before attempting to clean it. The AC power adapter must not be used outdoors or in damp areas. Never alter the cord or plug. If the plug will not fit into the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

Use only Sony Ericsson branded original chargers intended for use with your mobile phone. Other chargers may not be designed to the same safety and performance standards.

Battery

We recommend that you fully charge the battery before you use your mobile phone for the first time. A new battery or one that has not been used for a long time could have reduced capacity the first few times it is used. The battery can only be charged in temperatures between $+5^{\circ}C$ ($+41^{\circ}F$) and $+45^{\circ}C$ ($+113^{\circ}F$).

Use only Sony Ericsson branded original batteries intended for use with your mobile phone. Using other batteries and chargers could be dangerous.

The talk and standby times depend on several different conditions such as signal strength, operating temperature, application usage patterns, features selected and voice or data transmissions when using the mobile phone.

Turn off your mobile phone before removing the battery. Do not allow the battery to be put into the mouth. Battery electrolytes may be toxic if swallowed. Do not let the metal contacts on the battery touch another metal object. This could short-circuit and damage the battery. Use the battery for the intended purpose only.

Personal medical devices

Mobile phones may affect the operation of cardiac pacemakers and other implanted equipment. Please avoid placing the mobile phone over the pacemaker, e.g. in your breast pocket. When using the mobile phone, place it at the ear opposite the pacemaker. If a minimum distance

Always give full attention to driving and pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.

Emergency calls

Mobile phones operate using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection under all conditions. Therefore you should never rely solely upon any mobile phone for essential communications (e.g. medical emergencies).

Emergency calls may not be possible in all areas, on all cellular networks, or when certain network services and/or mobile phone features are in use. Check with your local service provider.

Antenna

This phone contains a built in antenna. Use of antenna devices not marketed by Sony Ericsson specifically for this model could damage your mobile phone, reduce performance, and produce SAR levels above the established limits (see below).

Efficient use

Hold your mobile phone as you would any other phone. Do not cover the top of the phone when in use, as this affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than needed, thus shortening talk and standby times.

Radio frequency (RF) exposure and SAR

Your mobile phone is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is turned on, it emits low levels of radio frequency energy (also known as radio waves or radio frequency fields).

Governments around the world have adopted comprehensive international safety guidelines, developed by scientific organizations, e.g. ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection) and IEEE (The institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers Inc.) through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines establish permitted levels of radio wave exposure for the general population.
