# **POWER SUPPLY**



### BATTERIES

Whenever convenient, use the AC power supply if you want to conserve battery life. Make sure you remove the power plug from the set and wall outlet before inserting batteries.


#### Batteries (optional)

- Open the battery compartment and insert as shown six batteries, type R20, UM1 or D-cells (preferably alkaline) with the correct polarity as indicated by the (+) and (-) symbols inside the compartment.
- Remote control batteries (included) Open the battery compartment and insert as shown two batteries, type R03, UM4 or AAA (preferably alkaline).
- Replace the compartment door, making sure the batteries are firmly and correctly in place. The set is now ready to operate.
- 3. Remove the batteries if exhausted or if they will not be used again for a long period.

The incorrect use of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage and will corrode the compartment or cause the batteries to burst. Therefore:

- Do not mix battery types, e.g. alkaline with zinc carbonate.
- When inserting new batteries, replace all batteries at the same time.

### All kinds of batteries contain chemical substances therefore they should be disposed of properly.






## POWER

- Check if the power voltage as shown on the type plate (on the base of the set) corresponds to your local power voltage. If it does not, consult your dealer or service organisation.
- Connect the power cord (packed inside the battery compartment) to the MAINS ~ outlet and the wall outlet.
   → The set is now ready to use.
- 3. To switch off the power supply completely, pull the power plug out of the wall outlet.
- **Note:** If the set is connected to the power and in the POWER off position, a very small amount of power, 2 Watts, will be drawn from the power supply.

#### **POWER SAVING BACKLIGHT DISPLAY**

 The lighting of the display only functions if the set is connected to the power supply.

### **REMOVABLE SPEAKERS**

#### Attaching the speakers

 Slide the speakers down into the sleeves on the sides of the set cabinet. The speakers will click into position.

#### Taking off the speakers


 Keep the lever (found on the back corner of the speaker) pressed and slide the speaker upwards.


#### **Connecting the speakers**

- 1. Connect the right speaker to the terminal R, with the red marked wire to (+) and the black wire to (-).
- Clip the exposed portion of wire into the corresponding color terminal.
- 3. Repeat the wiring procedure for the left speaker to terminal L, making sure that you connect the red marked wire to + and the black wire to -.
- Note: Speakers with an impedance of 4 ohms or higher other than as supplied may be used instead. Do not, however, use speakers with a lower impedance as this will result in damage to your set.

#### Switching POWER on/off: Save energy

Whether you are using power or battery supply, to avoid unnecessary energy consumption *always push the POWER button* to the off position after using the set.





#### **Environmental information**

All redundant packaging material has been omitted. We have done our utmost to make the packaging easily separable into three mono materials: cardboard (box), expandable polystyrene (buffer) and polyethylene (bags, protective foam sheet).

Your set consists of materials which can be recycled if disassembled by a specialized company. Please observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of packaging materials, exhausted batteries and old equipment.

## **GENERAL OPERATION**

- 1. To switch on the set, press the POWER button.
- 2. To select your sound source press the CD TAPE TUNER button until the desired mode is shown in the display.
- Adjust the volume using the VOLUME ▲, ▼ buttons.
   → Display indication shows the level, 0-32 and VOL.
- Adjust the sound effect by pressing the DSC button once or more.
  - → DBB, JAZZ or POP lights up when activated.
- Create an enhanced surround sound by pressing the INCREDIBLE SURROUND button.
  - → The INCREDIBLE SURROUND button lights up when activated.
- To switch off the set, press the POWER button to the off position.

## Note:

When the set is switched off:

- The last source selected and tuner presets will be retained in the set's memory
- the volume will automatically adjust to level 12.

## TUNING TO RADIO STATIONS


- 1. Press the CD TAPE TUNER button repeatedly until the TUNER mode is displayed.
  - $\rightarrow$  *E U* appears briefly on the display to indicate that you have entered the tuner mode.
- 2. Press BAND to select your wave band.


To tune to radio stations, press the TUNING control i or i or i on the set until the frequency on the display starts running, before releasing your finger from the control.


- → The radio automatically tunes to a station of sufficient reception and 5rch appears on the display.
- 3. Repeat if necessary until you find the desired station.
- To tune to a weak transmitter, briefly press TUNING i or private or private or the correct of the correct frequency is shown on the display.
- When STEREO appears on the display, you are receiving a FMstereo transmitter.

## To improve radio reception:

- For *FM*, pull out the telescopic aerial. Incline and turn the aerial. Reduce its length if the signal is too strong (very close to a transmitter).
- For AM, the set is provided with a built-in aerial so the telescopic aerial is not needed. Direct the aerial by turning the 10<sup>whole</sup> set.









# **DIGITAL TUNER**

## **PROGRAMMING RADIO STATIONS**


You can store up to 29 radio stations in the memory. When tuning to the preset station, the preset number (1 to 29) is indicated in the display.


- 1. Tune to your desired station, following the three steps given under TUNING TO RADIO STATIONS.
  - → If the frequency is already stored in the memory, the preset number will be displayed.
- 2. Press PROGRAM to activate programming. → PROGRAM will start flashing on the display.
- 3. Press the PRESET control (up or down) to allocate a preset station number from 1 to 29.
- 4. Press PROGRAM again to confirm the setting.
- 5. Repeat the above four steps to store other frequencies and presets in the memory.
- You can clear a preset number by storing another frequency in its place.

#### **Tuning to preset stations**

There are two ways possible in which you can tune to preset stations:

- Press the PRESET ▼, ▲ control (down, up) on the set.
- By remote control, press PRESET ▼, ▲ (down, up), until the desired preset number appears on the display.

## **CD DISPLAY INDICATION**

OPEN: When you open the CD compartment.

- rEAd: When the CD player scans the contents of a CD
- Total track number and playing time: in stop mode
- no diSc: when no disc inserted, or error in CD operation or with the CD (see Troubleshooting)
- Current track number and elapsed playing time: during CD playback. In PAUSE position, the display freezes and the elapsed playing time flashes.
- SHUFFLE/REPEAT (ALL) modes: when the respective mode is activated
- SHUF: appears briefly before playing a random track when you select SHUFFLE mode / skip to the next or previous track(s) in SHUFFLE mode

PROGRAM: flashes when you program tracks

**ProG:** and the number (1-20) indicating the position of a selected track within a program

FULL: no further tracks can be programmed

CLr: when you cancel a CD program


 Playing time and total number of programmed tracks: in stop position or at the end of a CD program.

## PLAYING A CD

- Press the CD TAPE TUNER button repeatedly until the CD mode is displayed.
- 2. Press OPEN CLOSE to open the CD player compartment
- 3. Insert the CD, printed side facing up and press OPEN•CLOSE to close the CD door.
- 4. Start playback by pressing PLAY PAUSE ► II.
- 5. To interrupt playback, press PLAY PAUSE ► II. Press PLAY PAUSE ► II again to continue playback.
- 6. Press STOP II to stop CD playback.
- 7. To switch off the set press the POWER button.

Note: CD playback will also stop when:

- the CD door is opened;
- the CD has reached the end;
- you press the CD TAPE TUNER button to TAPE or TUNER mode;
- you press the POWER button





# **CD PLAYER**

### SEARCH IC or Del

#### Selecting a different track

- On the set, press SEARCH 
   idea or 
   in once or repeatedly until the required track number appears in the display.
   Alternatively, on the remote control press 
   idea or 
   in once or more to skip tracks.
- If you have selected a track number shortly after loading a CD or in the PAUSE position, you will need to press PLAY●PAUSE ▶II to start playback.

#### Searching for a passage within a track

- With your finger on the control, press SEARCH i or → → The CD is played at high speed and low volume.
- 2. When you recognize the passage you want, release the SEARCH K≪ or ►► button.
  - → Normal CD playback will resume at this point.

#### **Different play modes: SHUFFLE/REPEAT**

You can select and change the different play modes before or during playback.

- → The play modes can also be combined with PROGRAM
- Press SHUFFLE/REPEAT until the desired function appears on the display.


**SHUFFLE** - Tracks of the entire CD or the program are played in random order.

SHUFFLE REPEAT ALL - To repeat the entire CD or program continuously in random order.


**REPEAT ALL** - Repeats the entire CD.

**REPEAT (SHUFFLE REPEAT)** - Plays the current (random) track continuously.

- → Except for REPEAT, it is also possible to skip tracks by holding down the SEARCH I or >> control continuously until you reach your desired track.
- 2. To leave the REPEAT/SHUFFLE mode, press the respective SHUFFLE or REPEAT button repeatedly until the various REPEAT/SHUFFLE modes are no longer shown on the display.
  - → You can also press STOP 
    to quit playback.

# **CD PLAYER**



## **PROGRAMMING TRACK NUMBERS**

In the stop position, program your CD tracks in the desired sequence. You can store any track more than once. Up to 20 tracks can be stored in the memory.

- When the program memory is full, the display will show FULL and it will not be possible to add further tracks to your current program.
- 1. Press PROGRAM to enter the programming mode.
  - → The display will show PROGRAM and the track number '1'.
- 2. Select the desired track using SEARCH i↔ or i→ until the display shows the desired track number.
- 3. Store the desired track by pressing PROGRAM once.
  - → The display will briefly show the number of the track according to the program sequence and the playing time of the program, followed by confirmation of your selected track number and **ProG**.
- 4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to select and store all desired tracks in this way.
- 5. To start playback of your CD program, press PLAY • PAUSE ► II.

#### Reviewing your program

 To review your set program, keep PROGRAM pressed for a few seconds until the display changes to show your stored track numbers in sequence.

#### Erasing a program


You can erase a program by:

- pressing STOP twice;
- opening the CD door;
- pressing the POWER button.











# **CASSETTE RECORDER**


## **CASSETTE PLAYBACK**

- 1. Press STOP OPEN to open the cassette holder.
- 2. Insert a recorded cassette and shut the cassette holder.
- 3. Press PLAY ► and playback will start.
- 4. For brief interruptions, press PAUSE II. Press PAUSE II again to resume playback.
- 5. By pressing *◄* or *▶*, fast winding of the tape is possible in both directions.
- 6. To stop playback, press STOP OPEN ■.
  - → The keys are automatically released at the end of the tape, except if PAUSE II has been activated.
- 7. To switch off the set, press the POWER button.
- Note: During CD playback or TUNER mode, if the cassette holder is already loaded you can switch directly to the TAPE mode by pressing the PLAY ► key.


## **CASSETTE RECORDING**

#### General information on cassette recording

- Recording is permissible insofar as copyright or other rights of third parties are not infringed.
- This deck is not suited for recording on CHROME (IEC II) or METAL (IEC IV) type cassettes. For recording you should use NORMAL type cassettes (IEC I) on which the tabs have not been broken.
- The recording level is set automatically. Altering the VOLUME, INCREDIBLE SURROUND or DSC controls will not affect the recording in progress.
- No recording will take place during the first 7 seconds, when the leader tape passes the recorder heads.
- To prevent the accidental erasure of a recording, keep the cassette side to be safeguarded in front of you and break out the left tab. Recording on this side is no longer possible. To render this safeguard ineffective, cover the tabs with a piece of adhesive tape.
- As long as PLAY ▶ or RECORD keys are pressed on the set, it will not be possible to change to another source.



## SYNCHRO START CD RECORDING

- 1. Press the CD TAPE TUNER button repeatedly until the CD mode is displayed.
- 2. Insert a CD and if desired, program track numbers.
- 3. Press STOP OPEN to open the cassettte holder.
- 4. Insert a blank cassette into the cassette deck and shut the cassette holder.
- 5. Press RECORD to start recording.
  - → Playing of the CD program starts automatically from the beginning of the program. It is not necessary to start the CD player separately.
- → To select and record a particular passage within a track
  - a. press the SEARCH controls ↔ or >>> to find your passage
  - **b.** put the CD player on PAUSE at the selected passage.
  - c. recording will begin from this exact point in the track when you press RECORD ●.
- 6. For brief interruptions, press PAUSE II deck key. To resume recording, press PAUSE II again.
- 7. To stop recording press STOP OPEN ■.

## **RECORDING FROM THE RADIO**

- 1. Press the CD TAPE TUNER button repeatedly until the TUNER mode is displayed.
- 2. Tune to the desired radio station using the TUNING control (See TUNING TO RADIO STATIONS).
- 3. Press STOP  $\bullet$  OPEN  $\blacksquare$  to open the cassettte holder.
- 4. Insert a blank tape into the cassette deck and shut the cassette holder.
- 5. Press RECORD to start recording.
  - → If you hear a whistling sound during recording of an AM radio station, this can be suppressed by setting the BEAT switch to another position.
- 6. For brief interruptions, press PAUSE II. To resume recording, press PAUSE II again.
- 7. To stop recording, press STOP OPEN ■.

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# MAINTENANCE

## **PRECAUTIONS & GENERAL MAINTENANCE**

- Place the set on a hard, flat surface so that it does not tilt.
- Do not expose the set. CDs. batteries or cassettes to humidity. rain, sand, direct sunlight or other places where high temperatures can occur, such as in the vicinity of heating apparatus or in motor cars parked in the sun.
- Do not cover the set. The amplifier produces heat which must dissipate freely, so make sure that there is sufficient ventilation around the set. A minimum gap of 15 cm is necessary.
- The mechanical parts of the CD player and the cassette deck contain self-lubricating bearings and must not be oiled or lubricated.
- A chamois leather slightly moistened with water is sufficient for cleaning the housing. Do not use cleaning agents containing alcohol, spirits, ammonia or abrasives as these may harm the housing.

## **CD MAINTENANCE**


- The lens of the CD player should never be touched.
- The lens may cloud over if the set is moved from cold to warm surroundings. The CD player will not start. Give the player some time to acclimatise.
- To take a CD out of its box, press the centre spindle while lifting the CD. Always pick up the CD by the edge and replace the CD back in its box after use to avoid scratching and dust.
- To clean the CD, wipe in a straight line from the centre towards the edge using a soft, lint-free cloth. Do not use cleaning agents as they may damage the disc.
- Never write on a CD or attach stickers to it.


## **RECORDER MAINTENANCE**

To ensure a good recording and playback quality, clean the indicated parts (A), (B) and (C) after every 50 hours of operation or, on average, once a month. Use a cotton bud slightly moistened with alcohol or a special head cleaning fluid.

- Open the cassette door by pressing STOP OPEN ■.
- Press PLAY ▶ and clean the rubber pressure rollers ⓒ. • Then press PAUSE II and clean the capstans (B) and the heads (A).
- After cleaning, press STOP OPEN ■.
- Note: Cleaning of the heads (A) can also be done by playing a cleaning cassette through once.
















# TROUBLESHOOTING



If a fault occurs, first check the points listed below before taking the set for repair.

If you are unable to remedy a problem by following these hints, consult your dealer or service center.

WARNING: Under no circumstances should you try to repair the set yourself, as this would invalidate the warranty.

#### PROBLEM

- POSSIBLE CAUSE
- REMEDY

#### No sound/power

- VOLUME is not adjusted.
- · Adjust the VOLUME.
- Headphones are connected.
- Disconnect headphones.
- Batteries are exhausted.
- Insert fresh batteries.
- Batteries are incorrectly inserted.
- · Insert the batteries correctly.
- Pwer cord is not securely connected.
- Connect the power cord properly.
- Batteries loaded but power cord still plugged in and connected.
- Pull out the power cord from the MAINS outlet and the set.

#### Reversed left and right sound/no sound from one speaker

- Speakers incorrectly connected
- · Connect properly: L to left, R to right

#### Poor bass sound

- Speakers not in phase.
- Connect speaker poles correctly, '+' pole (red marked wire) to '+'; '-'pole (black/unmarked wire) to '-'.

#### CD playback does not work

- CD is badly scratched or dirty.
- Replace or clean the CD, see Maintenance.
- Laser lens steamed up
- Wait until lens has acclimatized

#### The CD skips tracks

- CD is damaged or dirty.
- · Replace or clean the CD.
- PROGRAM/SHUFFLE is active.
- Switch off the PROGRAM/SHUFFLE function.

#### Poor cassette sound quality

- Dust and dirt on the heads, capstan or pressure roller.
- · Clean the heads etc., see Maintenance.
- Use of incompatible cassette types (METAL or CHROME).
- Only use NORMAL (IEC I) for recording.

#### Recording does not work

- Cassette tab(s) may be broken out.
- Apply a piece of adhesive tape over the missing tab space.

#### Remote control does not function properly

- Batteries are exhausted.
- · Insert new batteries.
- Batteries are incorrectly inserted.
- Insert batteries correctly.
- Distance or angle between the set is too large.
- Reduce the distance or angle.

The type plate is located on the base of the set.
