The remote control

Batteries

- Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.

Do not:

- mix old and new batteries.
- use different types at the same time.
- heat or expose to flame.
- take apart or short circuit.
- · attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
- use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.

Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.

Use

Aim at the remote control sensor, avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m (23 feet) directly in front of the unit. Refer to page 7 for the remote control sensor position.

B Placement of speakers

Speakers are designed identically so that no left or right channel orientation is necessary.

Notes

- Keep your speakers at least 10 mm (¹³/₃₂) away from the system for proper ventilation.
- These speakers do not have magnetic shielding. Do not place them near televisions, personal computers or other devices easily influenced by magnetism.
- To avoid damage to the speakers, do not touch the speaker cones if you have taken the nets off.

Connections

- Plug the AC power supply cord into a household AC outlet only after all other connections have been made.
- To prepare the AM loop antenna wire and speaker cords, twist the vinyl cover tip and pull off.



1 Connect the FM indoor antenna.

Tape the antenna to a wall or column, in a position where radio signals are received with the least amount of interference.

For the best reception:

An FM outdoor antenna is recommended. (→ page 6)



Connections

2 Connect the AM loop antenna.

Stand the antenna up on its base. Keep loose antenna cord away from other wires and cords.

3 Connect the speaker cords.

a Confirm the colors of the tags on the ends of the cords.b For White tags:

Connect cords to gray terminals.

For Blue, Black and Red tags:

Connect cords so tag colors match the terminal colors. Cords with white and blue tags are for high frequency. Cords with red and black tags are for low frequency. Incorrect connection can damage the unit.

Disconnect the FM indoor antenna if an FM outdoor antenna is installed.

An outdoor antenna should be installed by a qualified technician only.

B AM outdoor antenna

Connect the outdoor antenna without removing the AM loop antenna. Run 5 to 12 m of vinyl-covered wire horizontally along a window or other convenient location.

Note

When the unit is not in use, disconnect the outdoor antenna to prevent possible damage that may be caused by lightning. Never use an outdoor antenna during a lightning storm.

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A Demo function

When the unit is first plugged in, a demonstration of its functions may be shown on the display.

If the demo setting is off, you can show a demonstration by selecting "DEMO ON".

Press and hold [STOP ■, –DEMO].

The display changes each time the button is held down.

B Setting the time

This is a 12-hour clock.

Displaying the clock:

C Convenient functions

To dim the display panel

Press [DIMMER].

The display brightness will be reduced except for [AC IN] indicator.

To cancel, press [DIMMER] again.

To mute the volume

Press [MUTING].

To cancel, press [MUTING] again.

Muting can also be cancelled by lowering the volume all the way to "--dB".

When the system is turned off, the muting operation will be automatically cancelled.



The radio: manual tuning

1 Press [TUNER/BAND] to select:

 \rightarrow FM \rightarrow AM -

2 Press [PLAY MODE] to select "MANUAL".

 \rightarrow PRESET \rightarrow MANUAL

3 Press [√/REW/I◄◀] or [∧/FF/►►I] to select the frequency of the required station.

"ST" is displayed when a stereo FM broadcast is being received.

4 Adjust the volume.

Auto tuning

Press and hold [V/REW/I◀◀] or [√/FF/►►] for a moment. The unit begins auto tuning when the frequency starts changing rapidly and stopping when it finds a station.

- To cancel, press [V/REW/I◄◄] or [∧/FF/►►I] again.
- Excessive interference may interrupt auto tuning.

A To improve FM sound quality

Press and hold [PLAY MODE] to display "MONO". To cancel, press and hold [PLAY MODE] again.

MONO is also cancelled if the frequency is changed. For normal listening, turn off "MONO".

B FM allocation setting

By main unit only

This system allows you to receive FM broadcasts allocated in 0.1 MHz steps.

- To change the step to 0.1 MHz
- ① Press and hold [TUNER/BAND].
- After a while the display flashes with the current minimum frequency.
- ② Continue to hold [TUNER/BAND] down. When the minimum frequency changes, release the button. To cancel, repeat the above steps.

- After changing the setting, previously preset frequency will be cleared.
- Sound is momentarily interrupted if you load/unload a cassette while listening to an AM broadcast.



The radio: preset tuning

There are two methods of pre-setting stations: Automatic presetting: Stations the tuner can receive are

preset automatically. Manual presetting: You can select the stations to preset

and the order they are preset in. Up to 15 stations can be preset for FM and AM bands.

Press [TUNER/BAND] to select "FM" or "AM".

Automatic presetting

Auto presetting for AM and FM each.

- **1** Tune to the frequency where presetting is to begin (\Rightarrow page 9).
- **2** Press and hold [PROGRAM]. Auto presetting starts and the last station memorized is tuned in.

B Manual presetting

Preset the stations one at a time.

- 1 Press [V/REW/| =] or $[\Lambda/FF/ =]$ to tune to the required station.
- 2 Press [PROGRAM].

3 Press numeric buttons to select a channel.

The station occupying a channel is erased if another station is preset in that channel.

Selecting channels С

This unit can play CD-DA (digital audio) format audio CD-R and CD-RW that have been finalized (a process performed after recording that enables this unit to play audio CD-R and CD-RW).

It may not be able to play some CD-R or CD-RW due to the condition of the recording.

The unit contains five CD trays.

You can simply listen to the CD on a single tray, or you can select and listen to the CD in a particular tray. See the section on All-Disc play (\Rightarrow page 13) for information on how to listen to all the CDs one after another.

Listening to CD on a single tray

- 1 Press [▲ OPEN/CLOSE] to insert the CD on the disc tray. Press again to close.
- 2 Press [CD ►/II] to start play from the first track. The player stops after playing the last track.

To prevent damage

2 (Within about 10 seconds) Press [CD 1] ~ [CD 5] and insert the CD on the tray.

Press [▲ CD CHANGE] again to close. Repeat steps 1 and 2 to insert up to 5 CDs.

Listening to the CD placed in a specific tray

3 Press [CD 1] ~ [CD 5] to start play. The player stops after playing the last track.

4 Adjust the volume.

To remove the CD

You can change the CDs in the other trays while one CD is playing (except in All-Disc Random play or program play).

- ① Press [▲ CD CHANGE].

Press [▲ CD CHANGE] again to close the tray.

To check which CDs are in the trays Α (CD CHECK)

Press [CD CHECK].

The tray with a CD being played will not open. If the player is stopped, all trays will open.

Marking a track
