



- Clock display on the front panel indicates that the mains supply is on.

- Do not attempt to open the cabinet. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.






HOW TO USE THE REMOTE CONTROL

- 1. Any object between the remote control and VCR will block the path of the beam when it is being used. Dark walls, direct sunshine or very bright (incandescent) light will reduce the remote sensitivity.
- 2. Hold the remote control within an angle range of about 30° from either side of the remote sensor as shown below.
- 3. When the remote control is vertical to the remote sensor, it will work within about 7m from the VCR.
- 4. Point the front of the remote control directly at the front of the VCR.
 - * Function buttons do not work when pressing several buttons at the same time.



HOW TO INSTALL BATTERIES




- Carefully install batteries to match the polarity diagrams.
- It is recommended to take batteries out of the remote control when not in use for a long time.
- Do not mix old and new batteries or different types.

INSTALLATION

CONNECTION

- After you have connected the antenna to the VCR, you must connect the VCR to the TV.
 This VCR has a single 75 ohm output for connection to a TV.
- 2. If your TV has A/V INPUT TERMINALS, connect them to the VCR's A/V OUTPUT TERMINALS With an A/V cable for better sound and picture quality.



SETTING VIDEO CHANNEL

The RF CHANNEL select switch selects the channel for TV signals to be transmitted from the RF OUT connector on the VCR.

Set the RF CH. select switch to a vacant channel (0 or 1).

TV SELECTION AND CONTROL

CAUTION 1) This remote control can operate only some NEC TVs.

- 2) With the cover of remote control closed, this remote control can control the TV.
- 3) You can control the TV with the remote control only when performing below procedure.

Point the remote control towards the TV set. Make sure the main power of the TV set is ON.

Press and hold the TV OPERATE button on the remote control.

At the same time press the TV CHANNEL "A" button. Each time this button is pressed, the "remote code" will be changed. Once the TV set turns on, release the OPERATE and TV CHANNEL "A" button.



You can control the TV set by pressing the buttons (OPERATE, CHANNEL ∇/Δ , VOLUME $\sqrt{\Delta}$) of the remote control when the power of the TV set is ON.







1 TO VISUALLY SEARCH FORWARD (CUE)


 Press the FF button once in the PLAYBACK mode.
 Then, the tape will forward rapidly with the picture and the CUE indicator appears on the display panel.






2 TO VISUALLY SEARCH BACKWARD (REVIEW)

 Press the REW button once in the PLAYBACK mode.
 Then, the tape will rewind rapidly with picture and the REVIEW indicator appears on the display panel.





(3) TO WATCH STILL PICTURE

 Press the PAUSE/STILL button during playback. If this button is pressed repeatedly, the picture will advance frame by frame. The STILL indicator appears on the display panel.





NOTE:

- No sound will be heard in the SEARCH or STILL mode.
- The picture may appear distorted briefly when switching between SEARCH mode and PLAYBACK mode. This is NOT a sign of malfunction.
- 3. The VCR automatically start to play when STILL mode is operated for more than 5 minutes.

• Press the PLAY button to resume PLAYBACK mode.

HOW TO OPERATE TRACKING

TRACKING

Press the CH/TRK ▼/▲ buttons to minimize picture noise during playback.



• This VCR has a function of adjustment to minimise the picture noise automatically (Auto Tracking Adjustment). The PLAY indicator blinks () during auto tracking adjustment. When the tracking adjustment is completed, the indicator is will stop blinking.

To reduce the picture noise manually, use the CH/TRK ▼/▲ buttons.


HOW TO ADJUST PICTURE SHARPNESS AND V-HOLD

SHARPNESS	V-HOLD
Images on the screen can be adjusted to a preferred softer or sharper definition by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button on the menu select situated of the remote control (inside the door), while in the PLAY mode. Each time you press these buttons it will operate.	Press the ◀ or ▶ button on menu select to eliminate picture sharpness in the STILL mode.

VIDEO CASSETTE

LOADING

Push the cassttte into the cassette compartment gently with window side up.



- * Upon inserting the cassette, the power is turned on even if the power is off as long as the AC power cord is plugged in.
- 2 The TAPE IN indicator will be lit up.



 Inserting a cassette with its safety tab in place turns the recorder on automatically.




- Be sure that insert the cassette firmly into the slot, otherwise, it will be automatically ejected.
- The automatic loading mechanism will operate only when the cassette is inserted correctly.
- When the unit is unplugged from a power outlet, do not insert cassette.

UNLOADING


Press the EJECT button on the VCR.
The TAPE IN indicator will no longer be displayed.



2 Pull the cassette out gently.




- * When you press the EJECT button even if the power is off, the cassette will be ejected.
- When a cassette with its safety tab removed is inserted, the VCR turns on and begins to play back automatically.



CAUTION

- Once the automatic loading has started, please do not attempt to pull out the cassette.
- Do not insert fingers or any foreign object beyond the door flaps of the cassette loading slot as this could lead to injury or damage to the mechanism.
 Show special caution to the children.



- Avoid exposing the cassettes to direct sunlight. Keep them away from heaters.
- · Avoid extreme humidity, violent vibrations or shocks, strong magnetic fields (near a motor, transformer or magnet) and dusty places.
- Place the cassettes in cassette cases and position vertically.

ERASE PROTECTION

Video cassettes are equipped with a safety tab to prevent accidental erasure. When the tab is removed, recording can not be performed. If you wish to record on a cassette whose tab has already been removed, use adhesive tape to cover the hole.

• To prevent accidental erasure



· After recording, break off the safety tab with a screwdriver if you don't want to record over the tape.

• To record again



· Cover the hole with adhesive tape.

SELECTING THE ON-SCREEN PROGRAM LANGUAGE

English, German or Italian can be selected by the user.


Turn on the TV and VCR.





SETTING THE PRESENT TIME

This clock is based on a 24 hour digital display. The clock not only serves as a digital display of your current local time, but is essential to the successful operation of the VCR Programmable Timer Recording used for unattended recording. Therefore it is of utmost importance that set the clock accurately.

When the VCR and TV are turned on for the first time, --:-- will appear on the display panel.


 Set the VCR to VCR mode by pressing the VCR/TV button on the remote control if the VCR indication does not appear on the display panel.





- Press the MENU button then the MENU screen will appear.
 - Press "3"
 - CHANNEL PRESET screen will appear.






TO SET TV CHANNELS AUTOMATICALLY

This is a quick method of automatically searching and programming TV stations into the VCR memory.

Press "1" in the CHANNEL PRE-SET screen to select AUTO SEARCH mode.



2 The AUTO SEARCHING indicator appears on the TV screen.



Broadcasting channels are automatically memorized while the band mark is changed from VHF to UHF in order (VL → VH → UHF) displaying the broadcasting channel numbers (01 → 02 → 40) on the display panel.

- 4 After finishing the channel search process, AUTO SEARCH menu will disappear.




- Auto memory of channels by the AUTO SEARCH function is possible only during broadcast.
- When all the 40 channels are memorized, AUTO SEARCH mode is automatically released.

TO SET A CHANNEL MANUALLY

This is convenient to memorize additionally a channel which is not set by the AUTO SEARCH function.



MFT (MANUAL FINE TUNING) MEMORY

This VCR has a function to tune the selected channel automatically for the best picture.

If the picture or sound is poor quality, the VCR may require $\ensuremath{\mathsf{FINE}}$ TUNING.


- Press the ◀ or ▶ button on the remote control until the best picture is obtained.
- You can memorize the channel as the state of MFT by pressing the selected channel number with number buttons.




RECORDING TV PROGRAMS

RECORDING AND VIEWING THE SAME TV PROGRAM

PREPARATION Turn on the TV and set it to your VCR channel 0 or 1. Load a cassette tape with the safety tab intact. The power will be on automatically and the TAPE IN indicator will light.






TO STOP RECORDING TEMPORARILY Press the PAUSE/STILL button to avoid recording the unwanted material (The PAUSE indicator is displayed). Press the REC/OTR button to continue recording. PAUSE STILL STILL STOP button to stop recording. Press the STOP button to stop recording. Press the STOP button to stop recording.

RECORDING ONE PROGRAM WHILE VIEWING ANOTHER

You can record one program while viewing another.



NOTE: Since the VCR has its own TV tuner, it is not necessary to turn on the TV in order to make a recording. Turning on the TV merely allows confirmation of proper channel settings on your VCR.

NORMAL TIMER PROGRAMMING

The Programmable Timer Recording function allows you to record up to 8 different programs as long as 1 year in advance. Once you have set the time for timer programming, the timer will turn on and off the VCR automatically at the time you have preset.

PROGRAM MODE

SINGLE: Record a program on any day you choose within 1 year (One Time Recording of a single program)

DAILY : Record a program every day at the same time as you have preset (Daily Recording)

WEEKLY: Record a program on one certain day of every week (Weekly Recording)


MAKE SURE THAT

Set the VCR to the VCR mode by pressing the VCR/TV button when the VCR indication does not appear on the Multi-function display

The clock is adjusted to the current time.

The safety tab is not missing on the cassette tape.

The tape is long enough to record the desired program.





NOTE:

- You can correct the preset contents by ◀ or ▶ button on the remote control. When you press ◀ or ▶ button, "□" will move to the left and right, or to previous or next step.
- If you select the PROGRAMMING mode when the current time is not adjusted, "PLEASE SET THE CLOCK." appears on the screen.
- If any program is not input perfectly, "NONE OF THESE!!" appears on the screen.

ONE TOUCH TIMER RECORDING (OTR)

OTR is simple and convenient way to make a timer recording without using the Programmable Timer. When the OTR is completed, the POWER of VCR is automatically off.

INSTANT OTR

Recording starts immediately. You can record programs by 30 minutes up to four hours

You can record programs by 30 minutes up to four hole maximum, or to the end of the tape.

OTR PREPARATION

Before setting OTR, MAKE SURE THAT.....






SUPER SIMPLE SYSTEM (3S) FOR TIMER PROGRAMMING

"SUPER SIMPLE SYSTEM (3S)" is the simplest and most convenient programming method which requires only "once pressing" for basic 2 hour recording. Moreover, extra steps as changing channel number and tape speed as well as starting and ending times can be easily done by simple key operation.

This is similar to Normal Timer Programming on pages 25~26, but this is differentiated from it in the simplicity of programming operation.


PREPARATION

- Turn on the TV and VCR.
- Set the TV to your VCR channel.
- Set the VCR to the VCR mode by pressing the VCR/TV button when the VCR indicator does not appear on the Multi-function display.
- Make sure that the clock is adjusted to the current time.




OPERATION 1

When you want to program the timer to record a program of the same channel which you are viewing for basic 2 hours.



OPERATION 2

When you want to decrease or increase the recording time by 5 minutes up to 8 hours maximum.



Recording channel is automatically set to the current channel which you are viewing.But, if necessary, the change of the current channel can be done by simple button operation as follows.

• To change the channel, adjust with $CH \oplus or \ominus$ button.

NOTE:

1. The 3S Timer Programming function allows you to record programs as long as 3 days in advance.

2. To change the START time, adjust with 'START +/-' buttons (short pressing: 5 minutes, Long pressing: 10 minutes).


3. There is no need to set END time because it is automatically set to stop recording after 2 hours from the START time. When you want to decrease or increase the recording time, you can adjust the END time by 5 minutes up to 6 hours maximum by pressing th 'END + or -' button.

 The programs by the 3S Timer Recording are recorded only at 'SINGLE' Program mode. (See page 24 for more detailed information of PROGRAM MODE)

5. To check or cancel timer programs, please see pages 31.

WHEN RECORD TIME OVERLAPS

When setting the Programmable Timer, be careful not to overlap the preset times. If the next one starts while a program is being recorded, the rest of the first program is not recorded.




Indication

When the timer program has been entered improperly or the loaded cassette does not have the safety tab in place,

without the safety tab will be ejected automatically.

CHECKING AND CANCELLING TIMER PROGRAM

TO CHECK TIMER PROGRAMS



Using the VCR during Timer Stand-by for Normal Playback and Recording.
 You can use the VCR for playback and recording even when it is in the Timer Stand-by mode. (The TIMER REC indicator will appear on the Multi-function display)


Press the OPERATE button to turn on the VCR. (The TIMER REC indicator will disappear.)


2 Follow the normal procedures for recording and playback.

When you have finished using the VCR for normal purposes, press the OPERATE button again and the VCR will return to the Timer Stand-by mode.

VISS (VHS INDEX SEARCH SYSTEM)

The VHS Index Search function gives you automatically access to locations on the tape where index marks are recorded. It can perform index searching and skip searching when using the recorded tape containing index marks. The index marks are automatically recorded on the tape at the time of recording start in the normal recording and timer recording.






NOTE) You can controls the index \oplus , \ominus function directly by INDEX \oplus , \ominus button of remote control unit. (Door outside).

CLOCK/COUNT, COUNT RESET, COUNT GO TO ZERO

Press 5 in MENU screen to select FUNCTION mode. The FUNCTION screen will appear.



1. CLOCK/COUNT

Counter indicates tape running time in hours, minutes and seconds. If the clock is displayed on the display panel, press 5 to enter into COUNTER mode.

2. COUNT RESET

When you want to locate the tape at certain position, press 3 at the desired position to locate during playback or recording.

3. COUNT GO TO ZERO


Use the count go to zero function to locate the beginning of a program immediately after you have recorded it. Press 4 then the tape is rewound and stopped at the 0:00:00 position.

NOTE:

- In the playback, stop, cue, review, fast forward, rewind or still mode, the count go to zero function can be operated directly without pressing the STOP button.
- When you insert a cassette, the counter resets to 0:00:00.
- The counter does not operate when a blank tape or a blank portion of a tape is played.
- If the tape is rewound beyond the 0:00:00 counter reading, a negative indicator (-) appears.

COUNTER DISPLAY

When the counter reaches to 8:59:59, it will start counting backwards (-8:59:59 \rightarrow -8:59:58...).



TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem

Check

POWER

The Multi-function display is blank. Although the power is on, the VCR does not operate. Is the unit plugged into a power outlet?

Is there a cassette in the VCR?

If there is excessive humidity inside of the VCR,

it will not operate.

VCR OPERATION (RECORD MODE)

Tape is not recorded.

Is the safety tab on the cassette intact?

Timer recording has failed.

Did you set the time correctly?

Did you insert a blank cassette in the VCR? Is the safety tab on the cassette intact?

Is the timer indicator on?

Picture quality during on-air recording

is poor.

Use MFT (Manual Fine Tuning) key. If additional adjustment is necessary, use ◀ and ▶ buttons.

VCR OPERATION (PLAYBACK MODE)

Picture quality during playback is poor.

Adjust the picture quality by pressing the CH/TRK button. The head may be dirty. Use a head-cleaning tape.

Picture does not appear in the PLAYBACK mode.

Are the TV and VCR both adjusted to the same channel?

Are the connectors between the TV and the VCR con-

nected correctly?

Problem

Check

REMOTE CONTROL

Remote control doesn't work.

Do the batteries need replacing?

Make sure that you are using the rem

Make sure that you are using the remote control within the operational range no more than 30° either side of the remote sensor and no more than 7m from the VCR. Make sure there is no obstruction between the remote control and the VCR.

TIMER

Clock does not work.

Is the unit receiving power?

If the unit has been left for some period of time without power, it will need to be adjusted again.

GENERAL

Tape won't go in the cassette

compartment.

Is there another tape already in the VCR?

Are you loading the tape correctly, i.e., with the window

side up?

Operation buttons don't work.

The REW/REV button does not work at the very beginning of a tape and the FF/CUE, PLAY or REC/OTR

button does not work at the end of a tape.

Emergency indicator is blinking.

Unplug and replug the power cord to remove

the signal.

If the emergency indicator continues to blink, contact a

service technician.

Some buzz is heard when the VCR

stops operating.

When the VCR is turned on and a cassette is

loaded, some buzz can be heard in the STOP mode because motor is operating for stand-by to another mode. This is not a sign of malfunction. If you turn off the VCR or if you eject a cassette in the VCR, motor will stop

operating and no sound will be heard.
