Troubleshooting guide

Before requesting service, make the following checks. If you are in doubt about some of the check points, or if the remedies indicated in the chart do not solve the problem, see "Product information"(sright) for assistance.

No play.	 The HOLD function is on (+2 above). The disc isn't correctly set. The disc is scratched or dirty. (Tracks skipped.) There is moisture on the lens. Wait for about an hour and then try again. The lens is dirty: clean it with a blower (recommended product: SZZP1038C). If the lens gets marked with fingerprints, gently wipe them off with a cotton swab.
No sound or there is a lot of noise.	 Ensure the plugs are inserted firmly. Wipe the plugs clean with a clean cloth. The elapsed playing time disappears and sound is interrupted if bumps continue repeatedly. Separate this unit from mobile telephones.
Play doesn't resume from the track where play stopped at.	 This doesn't work if you open the lid while the unit is in stop mode. This doesn't work during random play. It may not work correctly under some conditions.
Play doesn't start from the first track.	 Random play modes may be on (+>page 4). Play resumes from the track where you last stopped play or power was cut off (play may start from a different track if you change discs after power is cut off). Use skip to return to the first track.
The unit stops working.	Disconnect then reconnect all power sources (batteries and AC adaptor).

Resume function
