

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Read these operating instructions carefully before using the unit. Follow the safety instructions on the unit and the safety precautions listed below. Keep these operating instructions handy for future reference.

Safety

- Power source—Connect the unit to a power source of the type described in 1 these instructions or as marked on the unit.
- 2 Polarization—The unit is equipped with a polarized power plug where one blade is wider than the other. This safety feature ensures that the plug fits into your household AC outlet only one way. If the plug doesn't fit one way, try reversing it. If the plug still doesn't fit, contact an electrician to replace the obsolete outlet. Do not attempt to defeat the safety purpose of the plug.
- **Power cord protection**—Route the AC power supply cord so that it will not be walked on or pinched by items placed on or against it. Never take hold of the plug or cord with wet hands. Always grasp the plug body firmly when connecting and disconnecting it.
- **Overloading**—When connecting the AC power supply cord, be careful not to overload the household AC outlet, extension cord, or outlet from any other
- device as this can result in fire or electric shock. **Nonuse periods**—Turn the unit off when it is not in use. Unplug the unit from the household AC outlet if it is not to be used for a long time. Unplug the unit 5. during lightning storms. Leaving the unit connected to a household AC outlet for extended periods can cause battery fluid leakage.
- Attachments and accessories—Use only the attachments and accessories 6 recommended in these operating instructions

Installation

■Placement

- Foreign material—Ensure objects and liquids do not get into the unit. Avoid exposing the unit to excessive smoke, dust, mechanical vibration, and shock.
- 2. Magnetism—Situate the unit away from equipment and devices that generate strong magnetic fields.
- Stacking—Do not place anything on top of this unit.
- Wall and ceiling mounting-Do not mount the unit on walls or ceilings unless specified in the instructions.

Environment

- 1. Water and moisture—Do not use the unit near water, such as near a bathtub or swimming pool. Avoid damp basements.
- 2. Heat—Situate the unit away from heat sources, such as radiators. Do not leave it in an automobile exposed to direct sunlight with the doors and windows closed as this may deform the cabinet.

Do not situate where temperatures fall below 5 °C (41 °F) or rise above 35 °C (95 °F).

Using jogger soft case (SL-MP73J only) Insert so buttons Fasten the belt are facing away securely. from your body.

- Before jogging with this unit, allow sufficient time for the memory buffer to fill up completely (CD-DA: 45seconds, WMA: 130 seconds, MP3: 100seconds)
- This unit is designed for light jogging, but not for serious running. It may occasionally skip if used by an aggressive runner, or by someone with a heavy, jarring stride.
- Do not machine wash. Fading and loss of shape can occur.
- Do not drop the unit as the soft case cannot protect the unit and CD from damage.

Maintenance

Unplug the unit from the household AC outlet before cleaning. Clean with a damp cloth.

Do not use abrasive pads, scouring powders, or solvents

Service

- Damage requiring service—The unit should be serviced by qualified service 1. personnel if: (a) The AC

Caution

Batteries

CDs

Listening



Do not play your headphones or earphones at a high volume. Hearing experts advise against continuous extended play.

If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce volume or discontinue use.






Auto power off function



Anti-Skip System

This system reduces the skipping caused by vibration to a minimum. You can change the anti-skip memory time for CD-DA to improve sound quality



■You cannot change the memory time for WMA/MP3. It is a maximum of 130 seconds for WMA recorded at 96 kbps and 100 seconds for MP3 recorded at 128 kbps.
