INSTALLATION OF MICROWAVE OVEN

- Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged.
- Do not remove the light brown Mica cover that is screwed to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

Installation

Select a level surface that provides enough open space for the intake and/or Outlet vents.



A minimum clearance of 4.0 inch (10 cm) is required between the oven and any adjacent wall. One side must be open.

- (1) Leave a minimum clearance of 12 inch (30cm) above the oven.
- (2) Do not remove the legs from the bottom of the oven.




- (4) Place the oven as far away from radios and TV as possible. Operation of microwave oven may cause interference to your radio or TV reception.
- II. Plug your oven into a standard household outlet. Be sure the voltage and the frequency is the same as the voltage and the frequency on the rating label.

TURNTABLE INSTALLATION

- a. Never place the glass tray upside down. The glass tray should never be restricted.
- b. Both glass tray and turntable ring assembly must always be used during cooking.
- c. All food and containers of food should be always placed on the glass tray for cooking.
- d. The glass tray rotates clockwise; this is normal.

e. If glass tray or turntable ring assembly cracks or Turntable ring assembly breaks, contact your nearest authorized service Centre.



IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using electrical appliance basic safety precautions should be followed, including the following:

WARNING:

To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, injury to persons, or exposure to excessive microwave oven energy when using your appliance, follow these basic precautions:

- Read all instructions before using the appliance
- Use this appliance only for its intended uses as described in the manual. Do not use corrosive chemicals or vapors in this oven. This type oven is specifically designed to heat cook or dry food. It is not designed for industrial or laboratory use.
- Do not operate the oven when empty.
- Do not operate this appliance if it has a damaged cord or plug, if it is not working properly or if it has been damaged or dropped. If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or its service agent or a similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.
- WARNING: Only allow children to use the oven without supervision when adequate instructions have been given so that the child is able to use the oven in a safe way and understands the hazards of improper use.
- WARNING: When the microwave oven is operated in the combination mode, children should only use the oven under adult supervision due to the temperatures generated.
- 7. To reduce the risk of fire in the oven cavity:
 - A. When heating food in plastic or paper container, keep an eye on the oven due to the possibility of ignition
 - B. Remove wire twist ties from paper or plastic bags before placing bag in oven.
 - C. If smoke is observed, switch of or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.
 - D. Do not use the cavity for storage purposes. Do not leave paper products, cooking utensils or food in the cavity when not in use.
- WARNING: Liquids and other foods must not be heated in sealed containers since they are liable to explode.
- Microwave heating of beverages can result in delayed eruptive boiling, therefore care must be taken when handling the container.
- 10. Do not fry food in the oven. Hot oil can damage oven parts & utensils & even result in skin burns.
- Eggs in their shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they may explode, even after microwave heating has ended.
- 12. Pierce foods with heavy skin such as potatoes, whole squashes, apple and chestnuts before cooking.
- 13. The contents of feeding bottles and baby food jars shall be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before consumption, in order to avoid burns.
- 14. Cooking utensils may become hot because of heat transferred from the heated food. Potholders may be needed to handle the utensils.
- 15. Utensils should be checked to ensure that are suitable for use in microwave ovens.
- WARNING: it is hazardous for anyone other than a trained person to carry out any service or repair operation that involves the removal of a cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.
- 17. This product is a Group 2 Class B ISM equipment. The definition of Group 2 which contains all ISM (Industrial, Scientific & Medical) equipment in which radio - frequency energy is intentionally generated and/or used in the the form of electromagnetic radiation for the treatment of material, & spark erosion equipment. For Class B equipment is equipment suitable for use in domestic establishments & in establishments directly connected to a low voltage power supply network which supplies buildings used for domestic purpose.

PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY

- Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open since open door operation
 can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy. It is important not to defeat
 or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- 2. Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaner residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.
- 3. Do not operate the oven if it is damaged. It is particularly important that the oven door close properly and that there is no damage to the :
 - 1. DOOR (dent)
 - 2. HINGES AND LATCHES (broken or loosened)
 - 3. DOOR SEALS AND SEALING SURFACE
- 4. The oven should not be adjusted or repaired by anyone except properly qualified service personnel.

Door glass surface is hot during extended period of use .

Note:

- 1. The ideal material for a microwave utensil is transparent to microwave, it allows energy to pass through the container and heat the food.
- Round /oval dishes rather than square/oblong ones are recommend, as food in corners tends to overcook.

MATERIALS TO BE AVOIDED IN MICROWAVE OVEN

UTENSILS REMARKS

Aluminum tray: May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.

Food carton with

metal handle : May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.

Metal or metal-

trimmed Utensils : Metal shields the food from microwave energy. Metal trim may cause

arcing.

Metal twist ties: May cause arcing and could cause a fire in the oven.

Paper bags : May cause a fire in the oven.

Plastic Foam : Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid inside when exposed

to high temperature.

Wood : Wood will dry out when used in the microwave oven and may spilt or

crack.

Utensil Test:

You can test the utensil in question following the procedure below:


- 1. Fill a microwave-safe container with 1 cup of cold water (250ml) along with the utensil in question.
- 2. Cook on maximum power for 1 minute.
- 3. Carefully feel the utensil. If the empty utensil is warm, do not use it for microwave cooking.
- 4. Do not exceed 1 minute cooking time.

CAUTION

Personal Injury Hazard: Tightly-closed utensils could explode. Closed containers are opened and plastic pouches pierced before cooking.

* Combination: applicable for both "microwave+grill", and "microwave+connection" cooking.

Control Panel



Display Screen

Cooking time, Power, Indicators and present time are displayed.

Power / Deodorize

Press to select Microwave Power Level, or to enter into Deodorize Mode

Conv. / Keep warm

Press to Program Baking temperature or to enter Keep warm Mode.

Grill

Press to Set a Grill Cooking Program

Press to select one of four Convection combination-cooking settings

Micro + Grill

Press to select one of two combination settings

Wt. Adj. / Clock

Press to select the amount of food: Press and hold to set time.

Stop / Reset

Press to stop cooking program or clear all previous settings before cooking starts.

Start / Quick Start

Press to confirm the cooking program Press to start express cooking.

How to Set Oven Controls

SETTING THE CLOCK

- 1. Press WT. ADJ. /CLOCK button once.
- 2. Rotate the TIME/MENU dial until the correct hour is displayed.
- Press WT..ADJ. /CLOCK button.
- 4. Rotate the TIME/MENU dial until the correct minute is displayed.
- 5. Press WT..ADJ./CLOCK button to confirm.

Note: Press the WT. ADJ. /CLOCK button during the cooking, the current time will display.

QUICK START

Use this feature to program the oven to start at 100% power conveniently.

Press START/QUICK START button in quick succession to set the cooking time. The oven will auto-start immediately.

Press START/QUICK START button once, the cooking time will increase 30seconds, and the max time can be set is 10minutes.

MICROWAVE COOKING

Microwave cooking allows you to customize cooking power and time. First, you select a power level by pressing the POWER button a number of times (see the table below). Then you set the cooking time (maximum 95min.) using the numeric pads, before pushing the START/QUICK START button.

Suppose you want to cook for 5 minute at 60% power level.

- Press POWER button a number of times till the screen show the intended power.
- Use the TIME/MENU dial to enter cooking time until the correct cooking time (5:00) is displayed.
- Press START/QUICK START button to start.

NOTE:

- If you want to temporarily stop a cooking session, press the STOP/RESET pad once and then you can start the cooking again by pressing START/QUICK START press STOP/RESET twice will cancel the cooking program altogether.
- After the cooking time ends, the system will beep once and END is displayed. Before starting another cooking session, press STOP/RESET pad to clear the display and reset the system.

GRILL

Grill cooking is particularly useful for thin slices of meat, steaks, chops, kebabs, sausages and pieces of chicken. It is also suitable for hot sandwiches and au gratin dishes.

Suppose you want to program grill cooking for 12 minutes.

- Make sure the system is reset, which means no current cooking program is running, and the system is waiting for instructions.
- 2. Press GRILL button.
- 3. Turn the TIME/MENU to 12:00.
- 4. Press START/QUICK START button to start.

NOTE: Grill cooking power is set at full power level by the system. Maximum cooking time for grill is 95 minutes.

MICRO +GRILL

This feature allows you to combine grill and microwave cooking on two different settings. First, press this button once or twice to choose an appropriate combination setting, then, at the screen prompt, enter the desired cooking time by turning the TIME/MENU dial. After you have pushed the START/QUICK START button, the system begins to count down.

NOTE:

- The maximum cooking time here is 95 minutes.
- During cooking, you can see the programmed setting by pressing this button.

COMBINATION 1

30% time for microwave cooking, 70% for grill cooking. Use for fish, potatoes or au gratin.

Suppose you want to set combination 1 cooking for 25 minutes.

- 1. Press STOP/RESET button.
- 2. Press MICRO +GRILL button once.
- Turn TIME/MENU to 25:00.
- 4. Press START/QUICK START to start.

COMBINATION 2

55% time for microwave cooking, 45% for grill cooking. Use for pudding, omelets, baked potatoes and poultry.

Suppose you want to set combination 2 cooking for 12 minutes.

- 1. Press STOP/RESET button.
- 2. Press MICRO +GRILL button twice.
- 3. Turn TIME/MENU to 12:00.
- 4. Press START/QUICK START button to start.

CONVECTION

During convection cooking, hot air is circulated throughout the oven cavity to brown and make crisp foods quickly and evenly. This oven can be programmed for ten different cooking temperatures Maximum cooking time for convection is 9 hours 30 minutes (9H:30).

To Cook with Convection

To cook with convection, press CONVECTION button repeatedly to enter the desired

convection temperature.

Press	Temperature(°C)
Once	200
Twice	190
3 times	180
10 times	110

Suppose you want to cook at 180°C for 40 minutes.

- Press CONVECTION button repeatedly, in this case 3 times, to select cooking temperature as shown on screen.
- Use the TIME/MENU dial to enter cooking time.
- 3. Press START/QUICK START button.to start.

NOTE:

- After time has elapsed four beeps sound and END appears in display. Press STOP/RESET button or open door to clear END before starting another cooking function.
- You can check the convection temperature while cooking is in progress by pressing the CONVECTION button.

To Preheat and Cook with Convection

Your oven can be programmed to combine preheating and convection cooking operations. Suppose you want to preheat to 170°C and then cook 30 minutes.

- Press CONVECTION button repeatedly, in this case 4 times, to select cooking temperature as shown on screen.
- Press TIME/MENU buttonto start. Beeps will sound when the designated temperature is reached.
- 3. Open the door and place container of food at the center of the turntable.
- Use the TIME/MENU dial to enter cooking time.
- Press START/QUICK START button to start.

MICROWAVE +CONVECTION

This oven has four pre-programmed settings that make it easy to cook with both convection heat and microwave automatically.

Press MICRO.+CONVECTION button repeatedly to program convection temperature:

	Touch	temperature(°C)
COMB1	Once	200
COMB2	Twice	170
COMB3	3 times	140
COMB4	4 times	110

Suppose you want to bake a cake for 24 minutes on COMB3.

- Press MICRO+CONVECTION button 3 times.
- Use the TIME/MENU dial to enter cooking time as desired
- 3. Press START/QUICK START button to start. NOTF:

After time has elapsed beeps sound and END appears in display. Press STOP/RESET button or open door to clear END before starting another cooking function. You can check the convection temperature while cooking is in progress by pressing the MICRO.+CONVECTION button.

INDIAN AUTO COOK MENU

For food or the following cooking mode, it is not necessary to program the duration and the cooking power. It is sufficient to indicate the type of food that you wish to cook as well as the weight of this food.

- 1. Rotate the digital knob TIME/MENU to select food code from 1~8, to specify the food to be cooked.
- Press WT. ADJ. /CLOCK to enter weight (also see note 2 in the following table for more information), check the screen for number of servings or preset weights, which should match weight of food you have placed in the oven.
- 3. Press START/QUICK START to start.

SPEED DEFROST

Suppose you want to defrost frozen food for five minutes.

- Rotate the TIME/MENU dial to select corresponding code.
- Press WT. ADJ. /CLOCK button to select Time shown on screen.
- Press START/QUICK START to start.

MULTI-STAGE COOKING

Your oven can be programmed for up to 3 automatic cooking sequences.

Suppose you want to set the following cooking program.

Microwave cooking



Convection cooking

- 1. Press POWER button to set power level.
- Rotate the TIME/MENU dial to program cooking time.
- 3. Press CONVECTION button to set convection temperature.
- 4. Rotate the TIME/MENU dial to program cooking time.
- 5. Press START/QUICK START button to start.

CHILD PROOF LOCK

The childproof lock prevents unsupervised operation by little children.

To set the child proof lock: Press STOP/RESET button for 3 seconds, then a beep will sound and the indicator light will come on. In the lock state, all buttons are disabled.

Keep Warm

Use this unique Feature for keeping the food Warm, inside the Oven .

- 1. Press "Conv. / Keep Warm "For 3 Sec.
- The oven will automatically enter in Keep Warm Mode & Display will be 50C & "Warm"
- 3. Set Time
- 4. Press "Start ".

To cancel the child proof lock: Press STOP/RESET button for three seconds, then a beep will sound and the indicator light will come off.

TO STOP THE OVEN WHILE THE OVEN IS OPERATING

Press STOP button.

You can restart the oven by pressing START/QUICK START pad.

Touch STOP/RESET to erase all instructions.

2. Open the door.

You can restart the oven by closing the door and pressing START/QUICK START pad.

NOTE:

Oven stops operating when door is opened.

AUTOMATIC PROTECTION MECHANISM

- During convection cooking, when the oven cavity temperature reaches a phenomenon of 300°C, the screen displays error code E 01, and the oven automatically enters into self protection mode
- During convection cooking, when the temperature of oven cavity is lower than 40°C after cooking already takes place for 5 minutes, the screen displays error code E 02, and the oven will automatically enter into protection mode
- Error may also occur to the system sensor, open circuit or short circuit will make the oven enter into protection mode with the screen displaying E 03 or E 04,

Deodorize

Use This feature after cooking odorous food or to remove smoke from oven .

- Press " Power / Deodorize " For 3 sec
 & Display will be " Deo "
- 2. Set Time (Default time is 5 min & max. time is 60 Min)
- 3. Press Start .

Recipe Guide For 8 Indian Auto Cook Menus

1.TEA/ COFFEE/ SOUP

Auto setting for 1, 2,3 & 4 cups.

For Coffee/Tea

Ingredient :-

Water

Sugar

Coffee /Tea

Milk

Method

- 1) In a microwave safe Tea-Maker (Without Lid), add all ingredient & mix well.
- 2) Set the auto cook menu.

For Soup

This function is for reheating.

2. POPCORN

Ingredients:-

Dry corn 100 gms

Butter 1 tbsp

Salt To tasted

Method:

1 In a microwave safe Glass bowl {with lid}, add all mix ingredients and mix well.

2 Set the auto cook menu.

3. GAJAR HALWA

Ingredients:

250 gms	400 gms
1 cup	1 & 1/2 cup
5 tbsp or to taste	8tbsp or to taste
¼ tbsp	1/4 tbsp
2-3 tbsp	4-5tbsp
5-6 tbsp	6-8tbsp
1/4 tbsp	1/4 tbsp

For the garnish:

Sliced pistachions and cashew nuts 1 tbsp Varg Sliver 1

Method

- 1 In microwave safe bowl, add all mix ingredients and mix well.
- 2 Set the auto cook menu. Stir in between.
- 3 Garnish with the sliced pistachios, cashew nuts and varg.

4. Black Forest Cake

Ingredients:-

Flour (maida)	120 gms
Coco powder	20 gms
Butter	40 gm
Baking powder	1 tsp
Milk maid	130 gms
Milk	1/4 Cup
Soda	⅓ tsp

Method:-

- 1. Sieve the flour, coco-powder, baking powder and soda in a bowl.
- 2. Beat butter and milk maid mix well.
- 3.Add flour and beat well.
- 4. Add milk and beat well.
- 5. Grease the baking bowl and pour the cake batter into it.

And set the auto cook menu.

5. Custard Cookies / Nankhatai

Ingredients:

Flour (maida)	100 gms
Custard Vanilla powder	50 gms
Butter	50 gms
Sugar powder	50 gms
Baking powder	A pinch
Milk	As required

Method:-

- 1. Sieve flour, custard vanilla powder and baking powder in a bowl.
- 2. Beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
- 3. Mix all the ingredients together and knead a soft dough. Roll the dough and cut into cookies with the of biscuit cutter.
- 4.If you don"t have the cutter, Simply roll out small balls form the dough .Pierce them with help of a fork to make an impression, place biscuits at leasts 5 cms , apart giving enough spaces for expansion.
- 5. Grease the microwave safe dish and place cookies on it and set the auto cook menu.

6. Pizza

Ingredients:-

1 Medium Pizza base

For Topping :-

Onion (chopped) 1/4 cup
Tomatoes (chopped) 1/4 cup
Caspsicum (chopped) 2tbsp
Tomato s auce 3 tbsp
Pizza cheese (shredded) 1/2 cup
Salt To taste

Method:-

- 1. Spread tomato sauce on pizza base.
- 2. Now spread the veg topping on pizza base.
- 3. Sprinkle grated pizza cheese at the top of pizza.
- 4. Place pizza on Grill stand and set the auto cook menu.

7. Tandoori CHICKEN

Ingredients:

Method:

- 1 Wash the chicken and make diagonal-incisions all over it.
- 2 Mix all ingredients of the marinade. Add the chicken and Refrigerate for 1 hour.
- 3 Put the chicken into the microwave safe bowl (covered) "and set the autocook menu.
- stir in between.
- 4. Now brush with oil and Grill for 4-5mins on Grill Stand
 - Turn upside down in between.

8. Speed Defrost

- 1. Put the Frozen Food inside in Microwave safe bowl.
- 2. Set the Defrost Auto cook menu
- 3. select time
- 4. Press start.

CLEANING AND CARE

- 1. Turn off the oven and remove the power plug from the wall socket before cleaning.
