Power:

- Press and hold for 5 seconds to turn the phone on or off.
- To save battery, quick press to temporarily turn the screen on or off.

Memory card slot / Micro USB port:

- Connect USB cable to PC as a modem /USB mass storage.
- Connect USB cable and the AC adapter to charge the battery.
- Insert a memory card in the card slot to store your pictures and other data.

NOTE: The battery can also be charged when connected to a computer.

Stylus: Use the stylus to tap the screen to select items, or write on the screen.

1.3 Installing the SIM Card, Battery and Memory Card

To remove the back cover

- 1. Turn the phone off.
- 2. Push and slide downwards to remove the back cover.



SIM card

The SIM card contains your phone number, memory storage, and network service details.

To install the SIM card

Insert the SIM card as shown. Make sure the gold contacts are facing down and the cut-off corner facing towards the battery slot.

To remove the SIM card

- 1. Remove battery.
- 2. Use your finger to slide the SIM card from the card slot.



Battery

Your phone comes with a rechargeable Li-Ion battery. Battery life varies depending on the network and applications used and the type of connections attached to your phone.

To install the battery

Insert the battery. Make sure the contacts of the battery are aligned with the connectors on the battery slot.

To remove the battery

Use your fingertip to lift the battery tab and remove the battery.

To replace the back cover

Push and slide upwards to close the back cover.



NOTE: To ensure battery performance and avoid the risk of fire:

- Use only original batteries designated for the phone.
- Do not store the battery in temperatures below -10°C or higher than 45°C.

Memory card

You will need a microSD[®] card to store photos, music, videos and other data.

To install the memory card

- 1. Open the memory card cover.
- 2. Insert the memory card with the gold contacts facing down.
- 3. Push the memory card until it clicks into place.

To remove the memory card

- For safety removal, go to Settings > SD card & phone storage > unmount SD card.
- 2. Now you can push the memory card down to eject it from the slot.
- **NOTE:** microSD[®] card is not included in the package. Contact your retailer to purchase one. To check for memory card compatibility, please refer to the memory card documentation.

1.4 Charging the Battery

The battery out of the box is only partially charged. To fully charge the battery, charge it for 2 hours.

- 1. Open the Micro USB port cover.
- 2. Plug the battery charger as shown in the diagram.



3. Plug the AC adapter to the wall outlet to start charging.

When the battery is charging, the red LED is activated; the **less** icon is also displayed on the status bar. When the battery is fully charged, the red LED disappears and the green LED is activated; if the phone is turned on, the **less** icon is also displayed on the status bar.

- **NOTE:** The battery can also be charged when you connect your phone to the computer.
- **NOTE:** To ensure safety, do not remove the battery from the phone while the AC adapter is connected or while it is being charged.



1.5 Using Headset

For hands-free conversation or listening to music, plug a headset to headset jack. **NOTE:**

- When using a headset, your ability to hear outside sounds may be limited. Do not use headset if it will endanger you.
- Do not set the volume to its maximum with a headset as it may damage your hearing.

1.6 Turning the Phone On or Off

After installing the SIM card and charging the battery, you are now ready to turn on your phone.

To turn on your phone

Press and hold the power button until the phone vibrates.

To turn off your phone

- 1. Press and hold the power button for 5 seconds.
- 2. A pop-up window appears, tap **Yes** to confirm.

To set your phone to Sleep mode

To set your phone to sleep mode, press the power button briefly. This will turn the display off.

To turn the display on, press again the power button briefly.

Touch calibration

The Touch calibration appears when the phone is turned on for the first time or after Clean Boot is executed, see "11.5 Resetting the Phone" on page 65.

The touch calibration helps you to calibrate the screen to ensure stylus accuracy and change the screen orientation, and text size before you start using the phone. Follow the on-screen instructions for screen calibration.



1.7 Navigating Your Phone

To navigate your phone, use your finger or the stylus that comes with the phone.

Stylus

To remove the stylus

- 1. Place your fingertip on the stylus tab, then gently pull it out from the compartment.
- 2. Hold both ends of the stylus then gently pull it outwards to extend.

To replace the stylus

- 1. Hold both ends of the stylus then gently push it inwards.
- 2. Insert the stylus in the compartment. Make sure the stylus tab is aligned with the compartment.



Chapter 2: The Basics

2.1 The Home Screen

From Home screen, you can quickly access common features and view notifications of missed calls, received messages, battery and connection status.



Status Bar Icons

The Status bar icons indicate different types of information. Tap the status bar and scroll down to view notifications or view system information easily. To close the

window, tap 🔄 .

Shortcut Menu

Customizing the Shortcut menu

To add shortcut:

- 1. Tap Menu > Add > Shortcuts.
- 2. Tap **Applications** to display the list of applications.
- 3. Tap to add the items that you want to appear on the Home screen.



- 1. Tap on the application to remove and the shortcut icon will enlarge.
- 2. will appear at the bottom of the Home screen.
- 3. Drag the shortcut menu to the **main** to delete.
- 4. The application is then removed from the Home screen.





Application Drawer

The Application Drawer contains all programs and settings. Tap **_____** to display the menu.

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The Basics

Using Widgets

Save time with live updates right on Home screen and get all of your personalized updates in one place.

You may add and customize the Widgets on the Home screen as you like.

- From Home Screen, tap the Menu > Add > Widgets.
- 2. A list of all available widgets are displayed. Tap to select the widget you want to appear on the Home screen.

To remove widgets:

- 1. On the Home screen, tap and hold the widget you want to remove and the widget will enlarge.
- 2. will appear at the bottom of the Home screen.
- 3. Drag the widget to **mathematic** to delete. The widget is then removed from the Home screen.

Setting the wallpaper

You can customize the wallpaper of your Home Screen with default wallpaper or with pictures taken with your phone.

Set wallpaper from Pictures

- 1. From the Home Screen, tap the **Menu > Add**.
- 2. Add to Home Screen appears, tap Wallpapers
- 3. Tap Pictures.
- 4. You will see thumbnail images of all pictures. Tap to select the picture you want to use as wallpaper.
- 5. Drag your finger to select the crop area and tap inside the box to crop the image.
- 6. Tap **Save** and the cropped image will appear as wallpaper on the Home screen.

Set wallpaper from Wallpaper gallery

- 1. From the Home Screen, tap the **Menu > Add**.
- 2. Add to Home Screen appears, tap Wallpapers
- 3. All system wallpapers are displayed. Tap to preview the wallpaper on screen.
- 4. Tap Set wallpaper to confirm.





2.2 LED Indicators

Your phone has 3 LED indicators: green, white, and red. Whether your phone is turned on or off, the LED indicators provide useful information.

LED	Location	Phone State	Indication
Green (solid)	Send button	Phone On / Off	Battery is fully charged.
White (blinking)	Home button	Phone On	Phone is in suspend mode. Wi-Fi / GPS / Bluetooth is active. Missed call or new message notification. Low battery indication.
Red (solid)	End button	Phone On / Off	Battery is charging.

NOTE: When the phone is on, pressing the **Send**, **Enter**, or **End** key, will light all the LED indicators.

2.3 Adjusting the Volume

Your phone features three types of volume which can be adjusted separately:

- Media volume: Set volume for music and videos.
- **Ringer volume**: Set volume for incoming calls and notifications.
- In-call volume: Set volume during a call.

To adjust ringer volume

- 1. Tap Menu > Settings> Sound & display.
- 2. Tap **Ringer volume** or slide the volume button on the right panel of your phone to activate the volume window.
- 3. Tap the slider of the volume you want to adjust.
- 4. Do either of the following:
 - a. Drag the slider up to increase or drag the slider down to decrease volume.
 - b. Tap **Silent mode** to set the phone to silent mode, or drag down the slider until it clicks in place to switch to silent mode.



NOTE: When the phone is set to silent mode, all sounds are turned off except media and alarm.

3. Tap 5 to exit the menu.

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The Basics

To adjust in-call volume

- 1. During a phone call, slide the volume button on the right.
- 2. Increase or decrease the volume by:
 - Sliding the volume button up or down
 - Use your finger to drag the slider up or down on the screen.

To adjust media volume

- 1. Tap Menu > Settings> Sound & display.
- 2. Tap Media volume to activate the volume window.
- 3. Tap the slider of the volume you want to adjust.
- 4. Increase or decrease the volume by:
 - Sliding the volume button up or down
 - Use your stylus to drag the slider up or down on the screen.
- 5. Tap **OK** to confirm.

2.4 Contacts

Contacts is your phonebook that lets you store names, phone numbers, e-mail and other information. Contacts are stored in the phone memory. You can save information such as name, picture, phone number, e-mail address, etc. You can also add the frequently used contacts to the favorites list. See "Favorite Contacts" on page 18.

Adding a Contact

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contact**.
- Tap Menu > New to display the New contact window.
- 3. Tap each field to enter the contact information with on-screen keypad.

TIPS:

- To add picture, tap Add Icon, then select a picture file or select Camera to take a photo of the contact.
- To assign a ring tone, tap **Ring tone**, then select a tone from the list.
- 4. When finished, tap **Done** to save.



Searching for Contacts

On the Contacts screen, do any of the following to easily search for Contacts:

- Type the first few letters of the contact to search. The list is filtered as you type.
- Tap an alphabetical index to view contacts that start with the letter. For example, to view names that start with "k", tap "k" and the list of contacts will be displayed.
- Filter Contacts list by categories. Tap Menu > By Group, then select an option. Options may be: All contacts, Contacts with phone numbers, or My Contacts.

Importing Contacts

Copy SIM contacts to the phone

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Import.

NOTE:

- To copy a single contact, simply tap the contact, then edit contact information as in "Adding a contact".
- To copy all contacts, tap **Menu** > **Import All**. All contacts on the SIM card are imported.

Backing Up Contacts

You can copy the contacts to SD card to back up the contact information or import contacts from SD card to your phone.

Export contacts to SD card

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contact** > **Menu** > **Copy**.
- 2. Tap Export to SD card.

NOTE:

- Copying contacts to SD card will overwrite the old backup file.
- 3. A warning message pops up, tap **Ok** to proceed. All contact are copied to SD card.

Import contacts from SD card

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contact > Menu > Copy**.
- 2. Tap **Import from SD card**. The backup contacts from SD card are copied to the phone contacts.





Favorite Contacts

You can add the most frequently called contacts to the Favorite contact list which helps you to access the contacts quickly and easily.

Add to Favorites

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 1. From the contact list, tap and hold a contact you wish to add.
- 2. The contact submenu appears, tap **Add to favorites**.
- 3. A golden star will appear next to the contact name.
- 4. The contact is now displayed in the Favorites list.
- 5. The contact will be added to your favorite contact list.

Remove from Favorites

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap **Favorites** tab, the favorites list is displayed.
- 3. Tap and hold on a contact to display the submenu.
- 4. Tap Remove from favorites.
- 5. The contact will be removed from the favorites list.

Chapter 3: Using the Phone

To open the phone screen, do any of the following:

- On the Home screen, tap Dialer.
- From any application screen, press the Send key.

3.1 Voice Calls

Making a call

To make a call from the Phone screen

- 1. Open the Phone screen.
- 2. Tap the phone number on the keypad.

NOTE: Tap **I** to erase a wrong number. Tap and

hold **I** to erase the entire number.

- 3. Tap phone umber or press the Send key to dial.
- 4. To end the call, press the **End** key.

To make a call from Contacts

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap the contact to call.
- 3. Tap Call mobile or press the Send key.

If the contact has more than one number, tap Call Work, Call Home, or Call Mobile.







To make emergency calls

Emergency calls without a SIM card:

- 1. Open the Phone screen.
- 2. Tap the emergency number on the keypad.
- 3. Tap the phone number and press the Send key.

To make international calls

- 1. Open the Phone screen.
- Tap and hold + o until the international prefix code "+" is displayed.
- 3. Enter the country code, area code, and the phone number you wish to call.
- 4. Tap the phone number or press the **Send** key.

Answering a call

When you receive incoming call:

- The phone will ring if the ring volume is turned on.
- Display a message.

To accept or reject incoming call

- To accept the call, press the Send key.
- To reject the call, press the **End** key.

To put a call on hold

If you are having a call conversation and there is another incoming call, tap **Hold** to put the first call on hold.

To unhold a call, tap Hold again.

To switch between calls

If you are having a call conversation and there is another incoming call, tap **Hold** to put the first call on

hold. Tap **Swap calls** 気 to switch between calls.

To set up conference calls

- 1. If you are already having a call conversation, tap **Hold** to put the call on hold.
- 2. Tap **Add (**) to display the dialpad and then enter the second number you wish to call.
- 3. Tap Merge calls \uparrow to set up the conference call.





NOTE: Conference call is a network service. Check with your network provider for the availability of this function.

To manage other voice call features

- Tap **Speaker** to activate or deactivate the Speakerphone.
- Tap **Mute** to mute or unmute the microphone.
- To view the call history, tap **Menu > Contact > Call log**.

Ending a call

To end a call, tap **End call r** or press the **End** key.



Chapter 4: Entering Information

Regardless of the application, you can enter information using the QWERTY keyboard or the on-screen keyboard.

4.1 QWERTY Keyboard

The QWERTY keyboard looks and functions like a standard computer keyboard. The screen automatically rotates for a landscape view.

Using QWERTY keyboard

- To type lower case letters, press the corresponding keys.
- To type a single upper case letter, press 🔤 + the corresponding key.
- To type all in upper case letters, press 🔤 twice, then press the corresponding keys.
- To switch back to lower case, press again.
- To type a single symbol or number, press [and then press the corresponding key.
- To type all in symbols or numbers, press at twice, then press the corresponding keys.
- Press 🖃 to go to the next line.
- Press 🔜 to backspace.

4.2 On-Screen Keyboard

On-screen keyboard appears in portrait mode when an application requires text input, such as messaging, and writing e-mails. The keyboard input method is activated by default.

Using on-screen keyboard

Tap the screen to display the on-screen keyboard.



- Use the keys on the on-screen keyboard as you would a computer keyboard.
- Tap the keys to enter the characters.
- To toggle between upper and lower case letter display, tap
- To display the numeric and symbols keyboard, tap ____. Tap ____ to toggle back.

Setting the Input Method

Your phone supports several text input methods, select your preferred method.

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Locale & Text**.
- 2. In Text settings, you will see a list of the input methods. Select and check the options you prefer.

Changing the Input Method

1. Long-press on any text-field in program. For instance, in **Messaging**, tap and hold the field "**To:**".

- 2. The Input Method Screen pops up.
- 3. You may select one of the candidate Input Methods to use

4.3 Configuring phone keyboard settings

You can make use of the keyboard aids to help you when input text with the phone keyboard.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Locale & Text.
- 2. Tap Text settings > Device keyboard.
- 3. You can check all applicable options.
 - Vibrate on keypress: phone vibrates when user presses any key on the on-screen keyboard
 - Sound on keypress: phone makes key-sound when user presses any key on the on-screen keyboard



Chapter 5: Email & Messaging

Use **Messaging** *is* to access text messages, and MMS messages. Use **Email** *is* to send and receive email messages via your internet e-mail accounts.

To open Messaging

- On the Home screen, tap
- From the Application Drawer, tap Messaging.

5.1 Text Message

A text message can only contain letters, numbers and symbols.

Creating and sending a text message

Your phone offers several ways to create and send a new text message.



From the Messaging screen

- 1. Tap New Message.
- 2. Tap Menu > Compose.
- 3. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number.
 - **TIP:** To add recipients from Contacts, tap **To** and enter at least two numbers of a contact number or two characters of a contact name. Then the corresponding contact will be listed for you to select from.
- 4. Compose your message.
- 5. Tap Send.



From Contacts

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap a contact to display the contact information.
- 3. Tap Text mobile.
- 4. Compose your message.
- 5. Tap Send.

From the Call log

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contact**.
- 2. Tap the Call log tab to view all call history.
- 3. Tap a call from the Call log.
- 4. Tap Send SMS message.
- 5. Compose your message.
- 6. Tap **Send**.

Note: If you exit Messaging before sending, unsent message will be automatically saved as a draft.

To request message delivery notification

- 1. In **Messaging**, tap **Menu > Settings** to access SMS setting and MMS settings.
- 2. Tap to check **Delivery Reports** check box.
- 3. Tap Back.

Receiving and Managing Messages

When you send and receive messages from a contact, these messages are grouped as a message thread. A message thread looks like an exchanged conversation.

To reply to a text message

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap a message thread to open it.
- 3. Compose your message.
- 4. Tap Send.



To forward a text message

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
- 2. Tap to view a message thread.
- 3. Tap and hold a message to display the message options.
- 4. Tap Forward.
- 5. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number.
- 6. Tap **Send**.



To delete all text messages

You can delete all text threads in the Messaging.

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Del. threads.
- 3. Tap **OK** to confirm.

To delete one message thread

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap and hold the message thread you want to delete.
- 3. Tap Del. thread.

To delete a message within a thread

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 1. Tap the message thread to open it.
- 2. Highlight the message to delete by flicking your finger downward across the sender the message.
- 3. Tap and hold the highlighted message.
- 4. Tap Del. message.



To copy message text

You can use this function to copy the text from a message to a new message you are composing.

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Messaging**.
- 2. Tap a message thread to open it.
- 3. Tap and hold the message to display the submenu options.
- 4. Tap Copy message text.
- 5. Go to New Message.
- 6. Tap and hold **Type to compose**.
- 7. Tap **Paste** to paste the copied texts to your new message.

5.2 Multimedia Message

A Multimedia message or MMS can contain letters, an image, an audio or video file.

Creating and sending an MMS message

Your phone offers several ways to create and send an MMS message.

From the Messaging screen

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap New Message> Menu > Add sbj.
- 3. The message automatically converts to a MMS message.
- 4. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number or email address.
 - **TIP:** To add recipients from Contacts, tap **To** and enter at least two numbers of a contact number or two characters of a contact name. Then the corresponding contact will be listed for you to select.
- 5. Enter the Subject.
- 6. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu > Attach**.
- 7. To insert text, tap **Type to Compose**, then enter your message.
- 8. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu > Attach > Audio**.
- 9. Tap Send.

From Contacts

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap a contact.
- 3. Tap **Menu > Text Mobile**. The message window is displayed
- Tap Menu > Add sbj to convert to MMS message. Tap subject to enter the Subject.
- 5. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu > Attach**.
- 6. To insert text, tap **Type to Compose**, then enter your message with on-screen keypad.
- 7. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu > Attach > Audio**.
- 8. Tap Send.

From the Call log

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contacts > Call log**.
- 2. Tap a call from the Call log.
- 3. Tap Send SMS Message.





- Tap Menu > Add sbj to convert to MMS message. Tap Subject to enter the Subject.
- 5. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu > Attach**.
- 6. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu > Attach > Audio**.
- 7. To insert text, tap **Type to Compose**, then enter your message with on-screen keypad.
- 8. Tap Send.

5.3 Voice Message

Your phone supports sending of Voice message.

To create a voice message

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- Tap New Message > Menu > Attach > Record audio.
- 3. Tap **e** to record your message.

5.4 E-mail Accounts

Setting up an Internet e-mail account

To manually receive e-mails

Reading and replying to e-mails

The Inbox displays the email headers. When you open the e-mail, it shows only a part of the message, unless it is a very short message. Download the e-mail to view the complete content.

To reply or forward an e-mail

Bluetooth modes

- Off: Bluetooth is turned off.

To turn Bluetooth on or off

- 4. Tap the device to connect.
- 5. To start pairing, enter the **Passcode**, then tap **OK**.

- 7. If you connect with audio device which supports HSP/HFP/A2DP, "Connected to phone and media audio" will be displayed on screen.
 - **NOTE:** Tap and hold the selected device to enter device options menu.

Taking a photo

Reviewing a photo

After taking a shot, a thumbnail image is displayed at the lower left corner of the screen.

- 1. Tap the thumbnail to view the image in full screen size.
- Tap **Gallery** (to go to the photo gallery.
- Tap Set picture as is to set the image as Contact icon or Wallpaper.
- Tap Share V to share the picture via Email or Messaging.
- Tap **Delete** in to delete the picture and view the next picture.



Reviewing a video

After recording a video, the video thumbnail is displayed at the lower left corner of the screen.

- 1. Tap the video thumbnail to playback the video in full screen mode.
- Tap Gallery I to go to the video gallery.
- Tap Play Image to view the video clip.
- Tap Share V to share the video via Email or Messaging.
- Tap **Delete** in to delete the video clip and return to capture mode.

- 3. Enter your notes with phone keyboard or on-screen keypad.
- 4. Tap Menu > Edit title to add a title to the note.
- 5. When you are down, tap 5 to return to Note pad screen. The notes is automatically saved.

10.17 Rss reader

Use the Rss Reader to get live update of your favorite web sites.

Add a new Rss Feed

- 1. Tap Menu > Rss Reader.
- 2. Tap New feed to add a Feed URL.
- 3. Tap **OK** to confirm.

Update Rss Feed

- 1. Tap Menu > Rss Reader.
- 2. Tap **Update all** to update the RSS feeds.
- 3. New feeds will be displayed in RSS feed inbox.

In the Settings menu, you can view and make adjustments for Wireless Control, Call settings, phone general setting and security settings. See page 60.

10.19 Videos

You can playback the video clips captured with your phone. See "8.1 Photos and Videos" on page 44.

10.20 Voice Note

To record a voice note

- 1. Tap Menu > Voice Note.
- 2. Tap Menu > Record.
- 3. The recording screen is displayed.
- 4. Tap **e** to record your voice. To stop recording, tap **e**.

To play a voice note

- 1. Tap Menu > Voice Note.
- 1. A list of voice notes are displayed. Tap the voice note you want to listen.
- 2. The voice note is played with the Music player.

11.1 Phone Settings

Tap Application drawer > Settings to view and adjust the settings of your phone. The Settings menu is categorized into: Wireless Controls, Call Settings, Sound & Display, Security & Location, Applications, SD card & phone storage, Date & time, Locale & text, Touch Calibration, and About phone.

11.2 Changing Basic Settings

Date and Time

To set the date and time

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > Date & time.
- 2. Set date.
- 3. Select the time zone from the list.
- 4. To adjust the time, tap the hour, minute, second or AM/PM field, and use the up and down arrows to increase or decrease the value.
- 5. To adjust the date, tap the month, day, or year field, and tap + or to increase or decrease the value.
- 6. Tap Set when finished.



Setting Alarms

You can set up three alarms on your phone.

To set the alarm

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Alarm Clock.
- Tap to select from the existing alarm clock settings or tap Menu > Add alarm to set up a new alarm.
- 3. Tap **Time** open a clock and set the time for the alarm. To enter the time numerically, tap the hour, minute or AM/PM field and use the up and down arrows to change the values.
- 4. Tap **Ringtone** to set up the preferred ringtone when your alarm sounds.
- 5. Tap **Vibrate** to enable/disable vibration when the alarm sounds.
- 6. Tap **Repeat** to select a day to sound the alarm. Tap **OK** to confirm.
- 7. Tap Label, and enter an alarm description.
- 8. Tap **Time** open a clock and set the time for the alarm.
 - To enter the time numerically, tap the hour, minute or AM/PM field and use the up and down arrows to change the values.
- 9. To turn on the alarm, check Turn on alarm.
- TIP: To sound an alarm even when your phone set to silent or vibrate mode, tap the More tab, and check Sound alarms even when the phone is set to silent or vibrate.



Display Settings

The display settings of your phone affect the battery and external power level.

To turn off backlight when the phone is idle

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In the **Display settings**, tap **Screen timeout**.
- 3. Select from the screen timeout list. Your setting is automatically saved.

To adjust brightness

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In **Display settings**, tap **Brightness**.
- 3. Drag the **Brightness** slider to adjust brightness settings.
- 4. Tap **OK** when finished.

To change the screen orientation

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In **Display settings**, tap **Orientation**.
- 3. Check the box to automatically switch the screen orientation when rotating the phone.

Ring Settings

You can assign a ring tone and a ring tone type for various events such as an incoming call, new message received, among others.

To change the ring tone and ring type of an incoming call

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Sound & Display.
- 2. On the Sound settings tab, tap Phone ringtone.
- 3. Select the **Ring tone** from the lists.
- 4. Tap **OK** when finished.

To change the ring tone of other events

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Sound & Display.
- 2. On the **Sound settings** tab, tap **Notification ringtone**.
- 3. Select the **Ring tone** from the lists.
- 4. Tap **OK** when finished.

11.3 Using Wireless Control

Wireless Manager provides shortcuts to access Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and Phone connection settings.

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless Controls**.
- 2. To turn on or off **Wi-Fi**, **Bluetooth** or **Phone**, simply tap their corresponding bars.
- 3. To change connection settings, tap **Menu**, then select the setting to change.

11.4 Protecting Your Phone

You can protect your phone from unauthorized users by requiring the PIN code or entering a password.

Enable or Disable SIM card PIN

When PIN code is enabled, you are required to enter the PIN code before making a call.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Security & location.
- 2. On the SIM card lock tab, tap Set up SIM card lock.
- 3. Tap Lock SIM card to use PIN to use the phone. Check to enable, uncheck to disable.
- 4. Enter the current PIN code.
- 5. To change the PIN code, tap Change PIN.
- 6. Enter the old PIN code.
- 7. Enter the new PIN code and confirm.

Enabling Password Protection

When Password is enabled, you are required to enter the password every time the phone is turned on.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Security & location.
- 2. Tap Set security question and answer.
- 3. Enter your question and answer, tap **Next** to save your settings.

11.5 Resetting the Phone

With Clean Boot, you can reset your phone to its factory defaults.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > SD card & phone storage.
- 2. On the Internal phone storage tab, tap Factory data reset.
- 3. Tap Reset phone to reset.
