### 1. Intended Use

FMDV real time RT-PCR kit is used for the detection of foot and month disease virus in herpes secretion or saliva samples by using real time PCR systems.

# 2. Principle of Real-Time PCR

The principle of the real-time detection is based on the fluorogenic 5'nuclease assay. During the PCR reaction, the DNA polymerase cleaves the probe at the 5' end and separates the reporter dye from the quencher dye only when the probe hybridizes to the target DNA. This cleavage results in the fluorescent signal generated by the cleaved reporter dye, which is monitored real-time by the PCR detection system. The PCR cycle at which an increase in the fluorescence signal is detected initially is proportional to the amount of the specific PCR product. Monitoring the fluorescence intensities in real-time allows the detection of the accumulating product without having to re-open the reaction tube after the amplification.

# 3. Product Description

Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) is an acute, highly contagious picornavirus infection of cloven hooved animals. The virus (FMDV) is sensitive to environmental influences, such as pH less than 5. sunlight and dessication, however it can survive for long period of time at freezing temperatures. The disease is highly contagious and may spread over great distances with movement of infected or contaminated animals, products, objects, and people. People can be infected through skin wounds or the oral mucosa by handling diseased stock, the virus in the laboratory, or by drinking infected milk.FMDV real time RT-PCR kit contains a specific ready-to-use system for the detection of FMDV using RT-PCR (Reverse Transcription Polymerase Chain Reaction) in the real-time PCR system. The master contains a Super Mix for the specific amplification of FMDV RNA. The reaction is done in one step real time RT-PCR. The first step is a reverse transcription (RT), during which FMDV RNA is transcribed into cDNA. Afterwards, a thermostable DNA polymerase is used to amplify the specific gene fragments by means of PCR (polymerase chain reaction). Fluorescence is emitted and measured by the real time systems' optical unit during the PCR. The detection of amplified FMDV DNA fragment is performed in fluorimeter **channel FAM** with the fluorescent quencher BHQ1. In addition, the kit contains a system to identify possible PCR inhibition by measuring the HEX/VIC/JOE fluorescence of the internal control (IC). An external positive control defined as  $1 \times 10^7$  copies/ml is supplied which allow the determination of the gene load. For further information, please refer to section 9.3 Quantitation.

Note: Analysis sensitivity depends on the sample volume, elution volume, nucleic acid extraction methods and other factors .If you use the RNA extraction kits recommended, the analysis sensitivity is the same as it declares. However, when the sample volume is dozens or even hundreds of times greater than elution volume by some concentrating method, it can be much higher.

- All reagents should be stored at -20°C. Storage at +4°C is not recommended.
  All reagents can be used until the expiration date indicated on the kit label.
- Repeated thawing and freezing (> 3x) should be avoided, as this may reduce the sensitivity of
- Cool all reagents during the working steps.
- Super Mix should be stored in the dark

# 7. Warnings and Precaution

- Carefully read this instruction before starting the procedure.
- · For in vitro diagnostic use only.
- This assay needs to be carried out by skilled personnel.
- Clinical samples should be regarded as potentially infectious materials and should be prepared in a laminar flow hood.
  This assay needs to be run according to Good Laboratory Practice.
- · Do not use the kit after its expiration date.
- · Avoid repeated thawing and freezing of the reagents, this may reduce the sensitivity of the
- Once the reagents have been thawed, vortex and centrifuge briefly the tubes before use
- Prepare quickly the Reaction mix on ice or in the cooling block.
- Set up two separate working areas: 1) Isolation of the RNA/ DNA and 2) Amplification/ detection of amplification products.

- Pipets, vials and other working materials should not circulate among working units.
  Use always sterile pipette tips with filters.
- Wear separate coats and gloves in each area
- Do not pipette by mouth. Do not eat, drink, smoke in laboratory.
  Avoid aerosols.

# 8. Sample Collection, Storage and transport

- Collected samples in sterile tubes.
  Specimens can be extracted immediately or frozen at -20°C to -80°C.
- Transportation of clinical specimens must comply with local regulations for the transport of etiologic agents.

#### 9. Procedure

#### 9.1 RNA-Extraction

Different brand RNA extraction kits are available. You may use your own extraction systems or the commercial kit based on the yield. For the RNA extraction, please comply with the manufacturer's instructions. The recommended Extraction kit is as follows:

#### 9.2 Internal Control

It is necessary to add internal control (IC) in the reaction mix. Internal control (IC) allows the user

to determine and control the possibility of PCR inhibition. Add the internal control (IC)  $1\mu l/rxn$  and the result will be shown in the HEX/VIC/JOE.


### 9.3 Quantitation

The kit can be used for quantitative or qualitative real-time RT-PCR. A positive control defined as 1×10<sup>7</sup>copies/ml is supplied in the kit.

For performance of quantitative real-time PCR, Standard dilutions must prepare first as follows. Molecular Grade Water is used for dilution.

# Dilution is not needed for qualitative real-time PCR detection.

pipette 36ul Molecular Grade Water into next three tubes. Do three dilutions as the following figures: Take positive control (1×10<sup>7</sup>copies/ml) as the starting high standard in the first tube. Respectively



To generate a standard curve on the real-time system, all four dilution standards should be used and defined as standard with specification of the corresponding concentrations.


#### Attention:

A. Mix thoroughly before next transfer.

**B.** The positive control  $(1\times10^7 \text{copies/ml})$  contains high concentration of the target DNA. Therefore, be careful during the dilution in order to avoid contamination.

#### 9.4 RT-PCR Protocol

The Master Mix volume for each reaction should be pipetted as follows:

- The volumes of Super Mix and Enzyme Mix per reaction multiply with the number of samples, which includes the number of controls, standards, and sample prepared. Molecular Grade Water is used as the negative control. For reasons of unprecise pipetting, always add
- an extra virtual sample. Mix completely then spin down briefly in a centrifuge. Pipet  $20\mu l$  Master Mix with micropipets of sterile filter tips to each of the real time PCR reaction plate/tubes. Separately add  $5\mu l$  RNA sample, positive and negative controls to
- different reaction plate/tubes. Immediately close the plate/tubes to avoid contamination. Spin down briefly in order to collect the Master Mix in the bottom of the reaction tubes.
