


Fig. 4 STANDBY MUTE ψ 1. -2 4 -DTV/VCR 3 -INFO 9 - 5 MENU EXIT CH+ 7 -11--10 10-RECORD TIMESHIFT 12 --13 9. EPG -15 RECALL -16 0 -14 AUDIO TV/RADIO FAV FILE 17-18-21-22--20 -19 SUBTITLE 44 -23 -24 TRONG

## 1.0 INSTRUCTIONS

# 1.1 Safety Instructions

The lightning flash with arrowhead symbol within an equilateral triangle is intended to alert the user to the presence of not isolated dangerous voltage with the inside of the product that may be of sufficient magnitude to constitute a risk of electric shock to persons.

## 1.2 Storage

### 1.3 Equipment Set-up

We recommend you consult a professional installer to set up your equipment. Otherwise, please follow these instructions carefully:

- Refer to the user manual of your TV and your antenna.
- Make sure that the SCART cable and outdoor components of the antenna are in good condition and the SCART connections are well shielded.

This manual provides complete instructions for installing and using this receiver.

#### Note:

The batteries should not be recharged, disassembled, electrically short-circuited or be mixed or used with other types of batteries. If rechargeable accumulators instead of batteries are going to be used, we recommend using (e.g. NiMH) types with low self-discharge to ensure long time operation of remote control.

# 1.5 Usage of external USB devices

- It is recommended to use USB 2.0 storage devices. If your device is not compatible
  to USB 2.0 specifications, recording, playback and other multimedia functions of the
  receiver would not work properly.
- To ensure best performance of your USB storage device please format it by this receiver (menu Media+> Disk Format) to FAT32 system. Other file systems are not supported by the receiver.
- If you are going to use external USB HDD (Hard Disk Drive) please consider that it
  might be the case that the power specifications exceed the supported output of your
  receiver (SV/800mA). If so, please connect your USB HDD to an according external
  power adapter.
- STRONG cannot guarantee compatibility to all types of USB storage devices.
- It is advised not to store important information on USB storage devices used with the receiver. Always make backups of data on USB storage device before usage with receiver. STRONG will not take responsibility for any loss of information or circumstances caused by loss of information.

## 3.2 Rear Panel

1 ANT IN To connect an antenna for reception of broadcasting signal.

Active antennas can be supported with max. 5 V/500 mA DC. 2 TO TV

To connect a TV set or to connect an extra receiver. 3. TV SCART To connect your receiver with your TV set using a SCART cable.

To connect to a Video or DVD recorder 4. DVD/VCR SCART

5. S/PDIF Coaxial To connect your receiver to digital audio amplifier. 6. Power Cord Your receiver requires a voltage of 220-240 V AC (Auto-selectable),

50/60Hz ±5%. Make sure to check the power specification before connecting your receiver to the wall outlet.

## 4.0 FIRST TIME INSTALLATION

If you use the receiver for the first time, the Easy Install menu appears. Use  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  to select Region, OSD Language, Antenna Power and Scan Mode and  $\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright$  to select options. Then use the  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  buttons to move focus to Search and press OK to proceed with the automatic channel scan.

## 5.0 MAIN MENU

In viewing mode press MENU at any time to enter the Main Menu. It consists of the following submenus: Channel, Installation, Setup, Tools and Media+

### 5.1 Channel

- 1. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select *Channel* and press **OK** to enter.
- 2. Use the ▲▼ buttons to highlight an item and press **OK** to select.
- 3. Press EXIT to exit.

NOTE: You can also press OK in TV mode to enter the channel list.

### 5.1.1 TV Channel list

- In Channel submenu select TV Channel List with the ▲▼ buttons and press OK to enter.
- Use the ◆▶ buttons to change channel group (assumed you have already set up Favourite groups).
- 3. With the ▲▼ buttons select the channel you wish to watch. Press **OK** to watch the selected channel in full screen mode.

### 5.1.1.1 Edit

Use this menu to lock, skip, delete or rename channels or add them to a favourite list. Press the numeric button 1 to enter the *Edit* menu.

Highlight a channel with the  $\blacktriangle \nabla$  buttons and press **OK** to select or press numeric button **0** to select all channels. Selected channels will be marked. This way of selection can be executed for each of the edit functions.

Favor: To add selected channel or all channels to a favourite group, press the 1 button. Use the ▲▼ to select a group and press OK. With ◀▶ select Yes

in the confirmation window and press **OK** to save. Selected channels will be marked with a folder symbol.

Lock: Press 2 to Lock one channel or all channels. Use ◀► to select Yes in the confirmation window and press OK to save. Selected channel/s will be

marked with the 🌡 symbol.

Press 3 to Skip one channel or all channels. Use ◀▶ to select Yes in the

Skip: Press 3 to Skip one channel or all channels. Use ◀▶ to select Yes in the confirmation window and press OK to save. Selected channel/s will be



marked with the ENTER and will be skipped during channel zapping in full

screen mode.

**Delete**: Press **4** to Delete one channel or all channels. Use **◆**▶ to select *Yes* in the

confirmation window and press OK to save.

Rename: To Rename a channel press button 5. When all changes have been made,

press EXIT to leave the menu.

### 5.1.1.2 Find

Press the button 2 in to enter Find menu.

Use the **AV** buttons to highlight letters or numbers and press **OK** to insert. After each character, the channel list will search the channel according your input and list the matched channel.

Press EXIT to guit Find mode.

### 5.1.1.3 Sort

Press the button 3 to enter Sort menu.

Use the AV buttons to highlight a sort option and press OK to confirm.

Default: Sorting by searched Order (from lowest to highest frequency).

Name (A-Z): Sorting in Alphabetical Order.
Name (Z-A): Sorting in Alphabetical Order.

FTA: First in the list will be Free-To-Air channels.

Lock: Unlocked channels will be listed first, followed by all locked channels.

### 5.1.1.4 Move

Press the button 4 to activate the Move function

The selected channel will be marked with the  $\triangle \nabla$  symbol. Use the  $\triangle \nabla$  buttons to move the selected channel to another position. Press **O**K, use  $\blacktriangleleft \triangleright$  to select Yes in the confirmation window and press **O**K to save the changed position.

### 5.1.2 Radio Channel list

The operation of *Radio Channel List* is the same as in *TV Channel List*. Since there is no video information in Radio mode, the radio background will be displayed in the preview window on the right.

### 5.1.3 Delete all Favourites and Groups

Use this menu to delete all favourite channels. Select Delete All Favourites with the  $\blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$  and press OK. Use  $\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright$  to select Yes in the confirmation window and press OK to delete or select No to cancel.

### 5.1.4 Delete all

Use this option to delete all channels. Select *Delete All* with ▲▼ and press **OK**, then enter the Password (defaulti0000). In the confirmation window select Yes with ◀▶ and press **OK** to delete or select No to cancel.



### 5.1.5 Group Rename

In this menu you can change the name of favourite groups. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select *Group Rename* and press **OK** to enter.

- 1. Select a group with ▲▼ and press OK.
- Use the ▲▼◀► buttons to navigate the on screen keyboard. Highlighted characters
  can be inserted by pressing OK. After entering a group name, highlight OK at the
  keyboard to confirm.
- 3. Press EXIT to cancel the group rename.

## 5.2 Installation

#### 5.2.1 Auto Scan

- Use the ▲▼ buttons to select Installation and press OK to enter menu.
- Use ▲▼ to select Auto Scan and press OK to enter the menu.
- Change the Scan Mode with ◀► select Free for searching Free To Air channels only or All for all channel search.
- Use ▲▼ to highlight Action and select Reinstall to create a new channel list or Update
  to update the current channel list with newly found channels.
- 5. Use ▲▼ to highlight Search and press OK to start auto scan.

### 5.2.2 Channel Scan

- 1. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select *Installation* and press **OK** to enter the menu.
- Select Channel Scan with ▲▼ and press OK to enter.
- 3. Use the ◆▶ buttons to select scan modes By Channel or By Frequency.
- 4. When By Channel is selected use the cursor buttons to select Scan Band and Channel No.. When By Frequency is selected use the cursor buttons to select Frequency and Bandwidth. Set Network Search to ON or OFF, highlight Search and press OK to start scanning. Found channels will be stored and the receiver will switch to the first channel in the list

### 5.2.3 Antenna Setting

- 1. Press MENU to enter main menu.
- 2. Use the ▲▼ buttons to select *Installation* and press **OK** to enter the menu.
- 3. Select Antenna setting with ▲▼ and press OK to enter.
- Use the ◀▶ buttons to change the setting. If On is selected, the receiver will provide 5V antenna power (for active antennas).
- 5. Press EXIT button to exit.

### 5.2.4 LCN Mode

If LCN (Logical Channel Numbering) is activated and LCN signal is provided by the operator, channels will be stored in operator defined order. You can activate/deactivate the LCN function by setting the LCN Mode to ON or OFF.



## 5.3 Setup

This menu allows you to set OSD Language, Subtitles preference, TV System, Region and Time, Timer Setting, OSD Setting and Parental Lock.

- Use ▲▼ to highlight a menu and press OK to proceed. Select an item with ▲▼.
   Settings can be changed with the ◀▶ buttons. To get a better overview of possible settings, press OK first. Now you can select settings with ▲▼ and confirm with OK.
- Press EXIT button to exit.

### 5.3.1 OSD Language

This menu allows you to set the OSD Language.

### 5.3.2 Subtitles preference

This menu allows you to set the preferred Subtitles Language and to switch Subtitles Type between Normal and Hard of Hearing.

### 5.3.3 TV System

This menu allows to setup different settings concerning your TV set.

Display Mode: PAL/NTSC/AUTO

Aspect Ratio: Use this menu to configure the screen aspect. Possible settings are: 4:3PS

(Pan@Scan), 4:3LB (Letter Box), 16:9 (Wide Screen) and AUTO.

Video Output: Use this menu to switch the video output mode between RGB and CVBS.

## 5.3.4 Region and Time

Here you can set your region and time zone.

Region: This menu is used for changing the region setting.

GMT Usage: This setting allows you to switch the usage of GMT time on or off.

The options are: Off / User Define / By Region

GMT Offset: This menu is valid only when User Define is selected in GMT Usage menu.

The GMT offset range is -11130 ~ +12100, increasing by half

hours progressively.

Date 1 Date and Time menus are valid only when Off is selected in GMT Usage

menu. Press OK followed by numbers to change the date and time.

Time Display: This menu allows to control whether the time is displayed on screen or not.

The options are: Off/On.

# 5.3.5 Timer Setting

In this menu you can set a programme timer or sleep timer.

Programme timer

Timer Number: You can set up to 8 timers

Timer Mode: Off/Once/Daily/Weekly/Monthly

Timer Service: TV Service/Radio Service

Wake-up Channel: You can select any channel as wake-up channel.

Month/Date/Day: Use ▲▼ to select the start month, date and day.



Time: Press **OK** to input the time with the numeric buttons.

When you leave the programme timer, a saving window appears. Use to select Yes in the confirmation window and press **OK** to save or select No.

to cancel

Duration: Press OK to input the timer duration with the numeric buttons.

#### Sleep Timer

You can set the receiver to power OFF in 10 min, 30min, 60min, 90min and 120min automatically.

### 5.3.6 OSD Setting

This menu allows you to change settings for: Subtitle Display, OSD Transparency and Load Default

OSD Setting.

Subtitle Display: To set the subtitle to Standard or OFF.

OSD Transparency: To set the OSD transparency from Off ~ 50%.

OSD Timeout: To define how long the information banner is to be shown (55~10S)

Load Default OSD Setting:

To clear all OSD settings and reset to default value.

### 5.3.7 Parental Lock

This menu allows you to protect the installation menu or channels with a password. You can also change the Password here. When entering the menu you will be asked to input the password (default)00001.

Menu Lock: Locks the installation menu. You can set menu lock to ON/OFF.

Channel Lock: Off/Manual/Age: 4 - Age: 18

New Password: Input your new password here to change the password.

Confirm Password: Input your new password again to confirm the new password.

### 5.3.8 Auto Standby

This option allows you to enable or disable Auto Standby. The default setting for Auto Standby is ON. The receiver will switch to standby automatically when it doesn't receive commands from the remote control for three hours. To avoid the automatic switch off, set Auto Standby to OFF.

## 5.4 Tools

Press **MENU** to enter Main Menu. Select *Tools* with the ▲▼ buttons and press **OK** to enter.

- Use ▲▼ to highlight a menu and press OK to enter.
- 2. Press EXIT to leave.

### 5.4.1 Receiver Information

This menu displays relevant Receiver information like the Receiver Model, Software version, Signature, and our website www.strong.tv.

- 1. In Tools menu, select Receiver Information and press OK to open receiver information.
- Press EXIT to leave.



#### 5.4.2 Game

This menu allows you to play games (Tetris, Snake and Othello) on this receiver.

- 1. Select Game in Tools menu and press OK to enter the game menu.
- Use ▲▼ to select a game, and press OK to enter the game. Highlight Start and press
  OK to start the game. For changing levels highlight Setup and use the ◀▶ buttons.
- 3. Press EXIT to guit the game.

NOTE: You can also press OK to pause playing.

### 5.4.3 Load Factory Default

This option allows you to reset the receiver to factory settings, which clears all stored channels and settings.

# **A WARNING** This or

G: This option will permanently delete all your settings and channel lists and set your receiver to factory default! Please use with caution.

- Enter Tools menu, select Load Factory Default and press OK button. You are asked to input your password.
- Input the correct password using the numeric buttons (the default password is 0000). A confirmation window will be displayed.
- 3. Select Yes to return back to factory settings and clear all channels. Select No to cancel.
- 4. Press EXIT button to exit.

## 5.4.4 Software Upgrade

- Enter Tools menu, select Software Upgrade and press OK button. The Software Upgrade menu is shown
- 2. Use ▲▼ to select *Upgrade by Storage* and press **OK**. You are asked to input password.
- Input the correct password (the default password is 0000). The Software Upgrade submenu will be opened. Then select the correct software file and press OK to start. A message will be displayed to confirm the update process. Select Yes to confirm or No to cancel
- 4. Press EXIT button to leave.

#### A WARNING:

After an update the receiver restarts automatically! During this process NEVER disconnect the receiver from the mains or switch OFF the power! This can damage your receiver and will void the warranty.

#### O Note:

This receiver is equipped with an over the air update function, which might not be operational in your broadcast region. For further details visit our website www.strong.tv or contact your local Service line.

### 5.5 Media+

The Media+ menu consists of following submenus: Media Player, Record Manager, Removable Disk Information, Record Settings, Safely remove storage device and Disk Format.

 Press MENU to enter main menu. Select Media+ and press OK to enter Media+ menu.



- 2. Press ▲▼ to highlight a menu and press OK to enter.
- 3. Press EXIT to exit.

Use the three button rows on the bottom of RCU for player operation. Description for further usage of buttons will be displayed on screen.

### 5.5.1 Media Player

This function allows you to play MPEG-1, MPEG-2, audio and photo files from a connected storage device.

- 1. In Media+ menu, select Media Player and press OK to enter Media Player menu.
- 2. Use ▲▼ to select an item, and press OK or BLUE (▶) to play a file.
- 3. Press **EXIT** to exit.

### 5.5.2 Record Manager

This menu allows you to playback earlier recorded files.

- 1. In Media+ menu, select Record Manager and press OK to enter Record Manager menu.
- Use ▲▼ to select a recording and press OK or BLUE (►) button to playback the selected file
- 3. Press EXIT to exit.

During the playback, it is possible to perform the following actions:

YELLOW (II): to pause the playback.

for fast forward or fast rewind during playback

GREEN (I▶): press once to perform slow motion, every further press will change the slow

motion speed (1/2,1/4, 1/8).

**RED** (**II**) to stop playback function.

During the playback info banner is on screen (activated by pressing INFO or BLUE  $(\triangleright)$ ), the following actions are possible:

Use numbered button 1 = to set a bookmark during the playback or press it again to delete it. You can also use the ◀▶ buttons to select the position.

Use numbered button 2 = to jump between the bookmarks.

Use numbered button 3 = to jump forwards in time according the set time in *Record Settings*. See details in chapter 5.5.4 Record Settings under *Stens to (min)* 

details in chapter 5.5.4 Record Settings under Steps to (min)

To directly access your recordings from viewing mode press the  ${f FILE}$  button on the remote control.

Use ▲▼ to select a recording and press **OK** to start playback.

### 5.5.3 Removable Disk Information

In this menu you can view information about the connected USB storage device.

- 1. In Media+ menu, select Removable Disk Information and press OK to enter this menu.
- Press EXIT to exit.

## 5.5.4 Record Settings

This menu allows you to set the time for *Timeshift*, define *Record Type*, set *Standby Mode* and *Record Recovery*.

- 1. In Media+ menu, select Record Settings and press OK to enter this menu.
- 2. Use ▲▼ to select a item and use ◀▶ to change settings.
- 3. Press EXIT to exit.



Timeshift Time(min): Maximum shifted time 10/20/30/40/50/60

Record Type: TS/PS (TS mode will record all broadcasted data, including subtitles)

Standby Mode: ON/ OFF (After a Timer recording has ended.)

Record Recovery: ON/ OFF (After a power cut, the receiver will continue to record.)

Step to (min): 0.5/1/3/5/10 minutes. Defines the jump interval during the playback of

a recording.

## 5.5.5 Safely Remove Storage Device

In Media+ menu, select Safely Remove Storage Device and press **OK** to safely remove the USB device. A message will then be displayed.

#### 5.5.6 Disk Format

In Media+ menu, select Disk Format and press OK to enter this menu.

You will see actual used *Device* and *Partition* displayed, furthermore the available *Capability* in GB is shown.

# 5.6 Time shift and Recording functions

Please connect your USB device to the USB port of your receiver. Wait a few seconds after the sign for connected device is shown on screen, then you are ready to start Time shift or to record a broadcasted programme.

#### Time shift

Time shift function allows you to watch a programme in time shifted mode.

Press TIMESHIFT in viewing mode. Now you can use ◀▶ to move the cursor to the time at which you want to watch, afterwards press OK to confirm. In case the info banner is not shown, press the INFO button to call it up/show it again.

#### Time shift and Record

To perform this action, press ● followed by the YELLOW (II) button.

#### Stop Time shift

To stop Time shift, press **EXIT** or  $\blacktriangle \nabla$ . A confirmation window will appear. Select *Yes* to stop Time shift or select *No* to continue Time shift.

#### Record

There are 3 different ways to record programmes: Instant recording, recording from EPG and recording via timer  $\,$ 

#### Instant recording

Press • in viewing mode to start an instant recording of the current channel.

To adjust the record duration, press lacktriangle again. Insert the time with the numeric buttons and press **OK** to confirm. Then press **EXIT** to remove the message from the screen. Press **RED** (lacktriangle) to stop recording.



#### From EPG

Press the EPG button to enter the programme guide. Select an event and channel with the buttons described on screen. Once an event is highlighted, press  $\bullet / \bullet$  to plan a timer on this event. The event time will be copied into a free Program Timer. It is possible to adjust the start and duration time for this timed event

#### Manual scheduling

You can set a record manually via the *Timer* menu. For details refer to chapter 5.3.4 Timer Setting.

#### O NOTE:

In case there is not enough space on the connected USB device, the recording operation will stop automatically. The maximum allowed Time shift setting is 1h. Available record types: TS: Transport stream including Teletext, subtitles etc. PS: Program stream for video and audio only. With SRT 5303 you can watch one programme while recording another one within the same frequency.

#### A WARNING:

Please consider that Time shift needs min. 0,58 GB free space on the USB device and an accurate Time shift function is depending on the speed of the used USB device.

### **6.0 OPERATION**

# **6.1 Changing Channels**

There are 4 ways of channel selection: stepping through the channel list, selection by number, from the on-screen channel list, and using the electronic programme guide (EPG).

- 1. Stepping through the channel list
  - To move through the channel list, use the AV buttons on the remote control.
- 2. Selection by direct channel number input
  - Enter the channel number directly by using numeric buttons, and press the **OK** button to select the channel.
- 3. Selection by on-screen channels list

You can also select the required channel directly from on-screen channel list. To call up the channel list, **OK** in viewing mode. Alternatively, the list can be displayed using the receiver's main menu. See chapter 5.1.1 TV Channel list in this manual for operation details.

4. Selection via EPG

You can also select the required channel directly from electronic programme guide (EPG).

To display the EPG, press EPG on remote control. See chapter 6.2 below for details.

# 6.2 Accessing the Electronic Program Guide (EPG)

- 1. Press EPG to enter EPG menu.
- Use the numeric button 2 to switch the highlight between channel list, events schedule of the selected channel and now/next events.



- 3. In the event schedule, press the numeric button 3 to book a timer for the highlighted event. Press **OK** to open the *Detail menu* for the selected event.
- 4. Press the numeric button 1 to open the Booking list menu.

# 6.3 Accessing the favourite channels

- 1. In viewing mode, press FAV to enter the favourite group menu.
- Use ▲▼ to select a favourite group.
- Press OK to enter the favourite channels list, and use ▲▼ to select a channel.

## 7.0 TROUBLE SHOOTING

There may be various reasons for abnormal operation of the receiver. Check the receiver according to the procedures shown below. If the receiver does not work properly after checking it, please contact your local Service line or STRONG dealer. Alternatively you can send a support mail via our website: www.strong.tv. DO NOT open the receiver cover. It may cause a dangerous situation and will void the warranty.
