

The Quick Guide is not intended as a substitute for your *Owner's Manual*. We strongly encourage you to review the *Owner's Manual* and supplementary manuals so you will have a better understanding of your vehicle's capabilities and limitations.

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## Floor Mat Installation

Use only floor mats designed specifically for vehicles of the same model and model year as your vehicle. Fix them securely in place onto the carpet.



1 Insert the retaining hooks (clips) into the floor mat eyelets.

- 2 Turn the upper knob of each retaining hook (clip) to secure the floor mats in place.
  - \*: Always align the riangle marks.

The shape of the retaining hooks (clips) may differ from that shown in the illustration.

## Keys

### Electronic key



Smart access system with push-button start  $(\rightarrow P.10, 15)$ 

\*: If equipped

### Mechanical key



- Locks and unlocks the doors
- Opens the trunk
- Locks and unlocks the glove box

The mechanical key is stored inside the electronic key. To extract the key, release the latch and pull, or if equipped with a card key, press the button and pull.

### Wireless remote control



- 1 Press: locks both side doors
- Press once: unlocks the driver's door Press twice: unlocks passenger's door
- 3 Press and hold: opens the trunk
- 4 Press and hold: sounds the alarm

(Use the alarm to attract attention to the vehicle in order to help deter break-ins. To stop the alarm, press any button on the wireless remote control.)

## Smart Access System with Push-button Start

The smart access system with push-button start allows you to enter and exit the vehicle or start the engine by simply carrying the electronic key in your pocket or bag. For details on starting the engine, see page 15.

### Entering the vehicle



To unlock the vehicle, simply grasp either of the door handles.

### Exiting the vehicle



To lock the vehicle, press the lock button on either of the door handles.

### Opening the trunk



To open the trunk, press the trunk release button.

For details on what to do when the electronic key does not operate properly, see page 83.

## Theft Deterrent System

The theft deterrent system includes the following features to help protect your vehicle from theft.

### Engine immobilizer system



The engine immobilizer system prevents the engine from being started in the event that an attempt is made to start the vehicle using an unregistered key.

The security indicator light flashes to indicate that the system is set.

#### Alarm

The system sounds the alarm and flashes lights when forcible entry is detected.

To set the alarm: close the doors, trunk and hood, and lock both side doors. The security indicator light comes on to indicate that the alarm is in its preparation state. When the indicator light begins to flash, the system is armed.

To deactivate or stop the alarm: turn the "ENGINE START STOP" switch to ACCESSORY or IGNITION ON mode, or start the engine. Alternatively, unlock the doors or trunk using the entry function, wireless remote door lock function or mechanical key.

## Steering lock



The steering wheel locks when the "ENGINE START STOP" switch is OFF and the driver's door is opened.

When the steering lock cannot be released, the green indicator light on the "ENGINE START STOP" switch will flash and a message will be shown on the multi-information display. To release it, gently turn the wheel left or right while pressing the "ENGINE START STOP" switch.

## Entering or exiting the rear seat

### ▶ Type A —— Switch-operated "Front, Fold & Return" seat

► Type B———Seat slide switch (front passenger seat)



- 1 Moves the front seat forward

  - When enter or exit, fold the seatback.

## Head Restraints

## Vertical adjustment (front seats only)



- **1** To raise: push the head restraint upward.
- **2** To lower: push the head restraint down while pressing the lock release button.

Pull the lever.



# Seat Belts



When fastening a front seat belt, always ensure that it passes through the seat belt guide.





If the shoulder belt sits close to the occupant's neck, secure the seat belt in the guide position.

## Engine (ignition) Switch

With the electronic key on your person, the engine can be started by simply pressing the "ENGINE START STOP" switch, while depressing the brake pedal. (The mechanical key cannot be used to start the engine.)

### Starting the engine



Make sure the parking brake is engaged and the shift lever is in P.

1 Depress the brake pedal.

The "ENGINE START STOP" switch indicator light turns green.

2 Press the "ENGINE START STOP" switch.

## Stopping the engine

- 1 Engage the parking brake and shift the shift lever to P.
- 2 Press the "ENGINE START STOP" switch.

## Changing power modes

To change power modes without turning on the engine, press the "ENGINE START STOP" switch without depressing the brake pedal. The modes can be changed in the following order:



## **Automatic Transmission**

### Shift positions



- P Park\*
- **R** Reverse
- N Neutral (drive not engaged)
- D Drive
- S S mode
- \*: The engine can only be started in P.
- The vehicle can only be shifted out of P when the "ENGINE START STOP" switch is in IGNITION ON mode and the brake pedal is depressed.

## Changing shift ranges in the D position

Operating the shift paddle switches allows shift ranges to be selected to suit the driving conditions.



1 Pull the "-" shift paddle switch toward you. The indicator in the meter cluster will display the selected shift range.

#### 2 Higher shift range:

Pull the "+" shift paddle switch toward you. Lower shift range: Pull the "-" shift paddle switch toward you.

Pulling and holding the "+" shift paddle switch for a certain period of time allows you to return to normal D position driving. If the accelerator pedal is depressed for more than a certain period of time in one range, shift range selection in the D position will be automatically deactivated.

## Changing shift ranges in the S position

Operating the shift lever or shift paddle switches allows shift ranges to be selected to suit the driving conditions.



#### 1 Shift the shift lever to S.

The indicator in the meter cluster will display the selected shift range.

#### 2 Higher shift range:

Move the shift lever in the "+" direction or pull the "+" shift paddle switch toward you.

#### Lower shift range:

Move the shift lever in the "-" direction or pull the "-" shift paddle switch toward you.

## **Multi-information** Display

The multi-information display shows information about your vehicle, including the items shown below.

## Display information



- Roof function status indicator
- Warning messages

### Changing the display of trip information



Trip information items can be switched by pressing the DISP switch.

When using intuitive parking assist or dynamic radar cruise control, the appropriate display is shown on the screen.

In the event that a problem is detected in any of the vehicle's systems, a warning message is shown on the multi-information display.

## **Satellite Switches**

The satellite switches can be used to change the settings of various functions. Settings are shown on the multi-information display.



The satellite switches can be used to change the settings of the following items.

- Intuitive parking assist (if equipped)
- Tire pressure warning system initialization
- ID code selection for tire inflation pressure warning system
- Vehicle speed indicator
- Tacho indicator
- Pre-collision braking function activate/deactivate (if equipped)
- Front seat auto return function

## Changing the ON/OFF settings



1 To cycle through the functions, press either the left or right selector switch.

2 To change the settings, press the ON/OFF button.

For detailed information of changing the settings, see the Owner's Manual.

## Turn Signal Lever



Right turn signal

To signal a lane change, move the lever partway and hold.

## ECT Switch

Use the ECT switch to select the driving mode that best suits the driving and road conditions.



#### 1 Power mode

For more powerful acceleration and uphill driving.

#### 2 Normal mode

#### 3 Snow mode

For starting or accelerating on snow-covered roads or other slippery surfaces.

An indicator comes on when in power or snow mode.

## Intuitive Parking Assist (If Equipped)

The system uses a screen display and buzzer to inform the driver of obstacles near the vehicle when parking or driving at low speed.

Owners of models equipped with a navigation system should refer to the "Navigation System Owner's Manual".

## Turning the system on and off

The system can be turned on and off using the satellite switch.  $(\rightarrow P.20)$ 

## Multi-information display



Sensors are used to detect obstacles near the vehicle. The distance to a detected obstacle is shown by the number of indicator bars.

- Indicates obstacles detected by the corner sensors
- **2** Indicates obstacles detected by the back sensors

## **Cruise Control (If Equipped)**

Cruise control allows the driver to maintain a constant speed without having to operate the accelerator pedal.

Use for highway driving or when traveling at a constant speed for long periods of time.

## Setting the speed



- 1 Press the ON-OFF button. The system will turn on.
- 2 Accelerate or decelerate to the desired speed, and then push the lever down.
  - This sets the speed in the cruise control memory.

## Canceling



- To temporarily cancel the cruise control, pull the lever toward you. To resume the cruise control, push the lever up.
- 2 To turn the system off, press the ON-OFF button.

Adjusting the speed setting



To increase speed: push the lever up. To decrease speed: push the lever down.

Release the lever when the desired speed is reached.

## **Dynamic Radar Cruise Control (If Equipped)**

Dynamic radar cruise control supplements conventional cruise control with a vehicle-to-vehicle distance control mode.

### ■ Canceling



- **1** To temporarily cancel the dynamic radar cruise control, pull the lever toward you. To resume the cruise control, push the lever up.
- **2** To turn the system off, press the ON-OFF button.

#### Adjusting the speed setting



To increase speed: push the lever up. To decrease speed: push the lever down.

Release the lever when the desired speed is reached.

The vehicle-to-vehicle distance control mode maintains the preset cruising speed as long as no vehicle is detected ahead.
