

Operating Manual



Before connecting, operating or adjusting this product, please read the manual completely. Please keep this manual for future reference.

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IMPORTANT INFORMATION

If the unit is not positioned in a stable location, it can be potentially hazardous due to falling. Many injuries, particularly to children, can be avoided by taking simple precautions such as:

- Using cabinets or stands recommended by the manufacturer of the unit.
- Only using furniture that can safely support the unit.
- Ensuring the television is not hanging over the edge of the supporting furniture.
- Not placing the television on tall furniture (for example, cupboards or bookcases) without anchoring both the furniture and the television to a suitable support.
- Not standing the televisions on cloth or other materials placed between the television and supporting furniture.
- Educating children about the dangers of climbing on furniture to reach the television or its controls.

To prevent the spread of fire, keep candles or other open flames away from this product at all times.

Important Safety Precautions

Electrical energy can perform many useful functions, but it can also cause personal injuries and property damage if improperly handled. This product has been engineered and manufactured with the highest priority on safety. But IMPROPER USE CAN RESULT IN POTENTIAL ELECTRICAL SHOCK OR FIRE HAZARD. In order to prevent potential danger, please observe the following instructions when installing, operating and cleaning the product. To ensure your safety and prolong the service life of your TV product, please read the following precautions carefully before using the product.

- I. Read these instructions---All operating instructions must be read and understood before the product is operated.
- 2. Keep these instructions---These safety and operating instructions must be kept in a safe place for future reference.
- 3. Note all warnings---All warnings on the product and in the instructions must be observed closely.
- **4. Follow all instructions**—-All operating instructions must be followed.
- **5.Attachments**—Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer. Do not use attachments which are not recommended by the manufacturer. Use of improper attachments can result in accidents.
- **6. Power source**—This product is intended to be supplied by a listed power supply indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your product dealer or local power company. For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the cable system.
- **7.Power cord protection**---Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.


NOTE: Where the mains plug or an appliance coupler is used as the disconnected device, the disconnected device shall remain readily operable.

- **8.Overloading**---Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords, or convenience receptacles on other equipment as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.
- **9.Entering of objects and liquids**---Never insert an object into the product through vents or openings. High voltages are present in the product and inserting an object can cause electric shock and/or short internal parts. For the same reason, do not spill water or liquid on the product.
- **10. Servicing**—Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as the power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally or has been dropped.
- **I I.Damage requiring service**----If any of the following conditions occurs, unplug the power cord from the AC outlet and request a qualified service technician to perform repairs.
- a. When the power cord or plug is damaged.
- b. When liquid is spilled on the product or when objects have fallen into the product.
- c. When the product has been exposed to rain or water.
- d. When the product does not operate properly as described in the operating instructions.

Do not touch the controls other than those described in the operating instructions. Improper adjustment of controls not described in the instructions can cause damage, which often requires extensive adjustment work by a qualified technician.

- e. If the product has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged in any way.
- f. When the product displays an abnormal condition or exhibits a distinct change in performance. Any noticeable abnormality in the product indicates that the product needs servicing.
- **12. Replacement parts**—In case the product needs replacement parts, make sure that the service person uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer, or those with the same characteristics and performance as the original parts. Use of unauthorized parts can result in fire, electric shock and/or other danger.
- **13. Safety checks**---Upon completion of service or repair work, request the service technician to perform safety checks to ensure that the product is in proper operating condition.
- **14. Wall or ceiling mounting---**When mounting the product on a wall or ceiling, be sure to install the product according to the method recommended by the manufacturer. This is a safety feature.

15. Stand---Use only with the cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. Do not place the product on an unstable trolley, stand, tripod or table. Placing the product on an unstable base can cause the product to fall, resulting in possible serious personal injuries as well as damage to the product. When mounting the product on a wall, be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions. Use only the mounting hardware recommended by the manufacturer.

16.Careful move---When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from the product tipping over. Sudden stops, excessive force and uneven floor surfaces can cause the product to fall from the trolley.

Never attempt to move the TV unless the AC power cord has been disconnected.

17. Lightning---Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.

For added protection for this television equipment during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna. This will prevent damage to the equipment due to lightning and power-line surges.

18. Do not use this apparatus near water---for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool, and the like. The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and that no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

Do not use immediately after moving from a low temperature to high temperature environment, as this causes condensation, which may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.

- **19. Clean only with dry cloth**---Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a soft cloth for cleaning.
- **20. Ventilation**—Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer instructions. The vents and other openings in the cabinet are designed for ventilation. Do not cover or block these vents and openings since insufficient ventilation can cause overheating and/or shorten the life of the product. Do not place the product on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface, since they can block ventilation openings. This product is not designed for built-in installation; do not place the product in an enclosed place such as a bookcase or rack, unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions are followed.
- **21.Heat sources**---Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- **22.Panel protection**---The display panel used in this product is made of glass. Therefore, it can break when the product is dropped or impacted upon by other objects. Be careful not to be injured by broken glass pieces in case the display panel breaks.
- **23.Pixel defect**---The display panel is a very high technology product, giving you finely detailed pictures. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed point of blue, green or red. Please note that this does not affect the performance of your product.

WARNING: For continued safety, apparatus with class I construction shall be connected to a mains socket outlet with a protective earthing connection.

Important Notice

About Location/ Environment

Do not use in hot and cold rooms (locations)

- When the unit is used in rooms (locations) with low temperature, the picture may leave trails or appear slightly delayed. This is not a malfunction and the unit will recover when the temperature returns to normal.
- Do not leave the unit in a hot or cold location. Also, do not leave the unit in a
 location exposed to direct sunlight, near a heater or in high humidity, as this may
 cause the cabinet to deform, the screen to malfunction and affect the TV's
 performance.

About After-Image

The extended use of fixed image program material can cause a permanent afterimage on the screen.

This background image is viewable on normal programs in the form of a stationary fixed image. This type of irreversible screen deterioration can be limited by observing the following steps:

A. Reduce the brightness/contrast setting to a minimum viewing level.

B. Do not display the fixed image for extended periods of time.

C. Turn the power off when not in actual use.

Important Information Regarding The Use of Video Games, Computers, Captions or Other Fixed Image Displays.

• Do not allow a still picture to be displayed for an extended period, as this can cause a permanent after-image to remain on the screen.

Examples of still pictures include logos, video games, computer images, teletext and images displayed in 4:3 mode.

CAUTIONS:

- The permanent after-image on the screen resulting from fixed image use is not an operating defect and as such is not covered by the warranty.
- This product is not designed to display fixed images for extended periods of time.

Cleaning and Maintenance


To clean this unit, wipe with a soft, dry cloth.


If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth dipped in a soap and water solution or a weak detergent solution.


- Use eyeglass cleaner to remove stubborn dirt from the screen.
- Never use alcohol, paint thinner or benzine to clean this unit.
- Before using a chemically treated cloth, read the instructions that came with the cloth carefully.

Identification of Controls

Main Unit (front/side view)







- I. Remote Sensor
- 2. Power Indicator
- 3. MENU

Press this button to access the main menu screen.

4. INPUT

To access Input Source menu

5. VOL+/-

Press the **VOL+** or **VOL-** button to increase or decrease the sound volume level;

In the menu operations, these buttons serve as right/left buttons.

6. CH^/~

Press these two buttons to change the TV channel;

In the menu operations, these buttons serve as up/down buttons.

7. POWER 也


Press this button to turn the unit ON from STANDBY mode.

Press it again to turn the set back to STANDBY mode.

8. Power Switch

Press to (I) to connect the power, press to (O) to cut off.


Main Unit (back view)



- I. HDMII/2/3: Connect an HDMI device to this jack.
- 2. USB port: Connect a USB device to this port.
- 3. Headphone: Connect headphones to this jack.
- **4. AV INPUT:** Connect an AV device to these jacks.
- $\textbf{5. PC IN VGA}/\textbf{AUDIO:} \ Connect \ a \ computer \ to \ these \ jacks.$
- **6. AV OUTPUT:** Connect a VCR to these jacks to record programs.
- **7. COMPONENT IN:** Connect a component video device to these jacks.
- 8. RF: Connect an antenna or cable TV to this jack.

Remote control unit



- I. INPUT: Displays Input Source menu.
- 2.0 9 number buttons: Press to enter channel numbers.
- 3. FAV: Press to open the Favorite List you set up.
- **4. MENU:** Open the main menu or return to the previous menu.
- 5. ▲/▼/ ◀ / ▶ /OK: Press the arrows to navigate through the menus or adjust an item. Press OK to confirm a selection or enter a sub-menu.
- **6. FREEZE:** To freeze the current picture.
- 7. PICTURE: Selects picture mode.
- **8. VOL**+/**VOL-:** Increases or decreases the volume.
- 9. AUDIO: Selects sound mode (not available for headphone).
- 10. USB control buttons
- \equiv : Displays the menu bar.
- ▶II : Play/Pause button.
- ■: Stop playing.
- 🤊 : Return to the previous menu.
- **◄**: Fast reverse.
- **►**: Fast forward.
- ₩: Play the previous.
- >>: Play the next.
- II. POWER : Switches the TV power on or to Standby.
- **12.** ♥: Returns to the previous channel.
- **13. MUTE:** Press to mute the sound. Press the button again to restore the sound.
- **14. DISPLAY:** Displays the current program information.
- **15. CH^/CH**∨: Changes channel up and down.
- 16. USB: Press to switch to USB mode.
- **17. ZOOM:** Selects the picture aspect ratio.
- **18. SLEEP:** Sets the sleep timer.
- 19. DCR: Switch the Dynamic Backlight on or off.

Note:

- This operation manual provides a description based on operating functions with the remote control.
- In different mode, some buttons may have different function.

Setting Up

Selecting a location


You should select a **location** for the TV:

- •Where direct light does not reflect on the screen.
- •That has indirect and soft lighting.
- •Where the TV has access to an antenna or cable TV connection.
- •Where the TV has access to a power outlet.


Note: Watching TV in total darkness or with a reflection on the screen may cause eyestrain.

Installing remote control batteries

To install remote control batteries:



- 2 Insert two AAA batteries into the battery compartment. Make sure that the + and symbols on the batteries match the + and symbols in the battery compartment.
- 3 Replace the cover.





Battery precautions:

Improper use of batteries can result in a leakage of chemicals and/or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Place batteries with their terminals corresponding to the (+) and (-) indications.
- Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix batteries of different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries and/or cause old batteries to leak chemicals.
- Remove batteries as soon as they are non-operable. Chemicals that leak from batteries can cause a rash. If chemical leakage is found, wipe with a cloth.
- Dispose of batteries in a proper manner.
- If the remote control is not used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries.
- The batteries should not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

Aiming the remote control





Cautions regarding use of remote control


- •Do not expose the remote control to shock. In addition, do not expose the remote control to liquids, and do not place in an area with high humidity.
- •Do not install or place the remote control under direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformation of the unit.
- •The remote control may not work properly if the remote sensor window of the main unit is under direct sunlight or strong lighting. In such a case, change the angle of the lighting or the TV set, or operate the remote control closer to the remote sensor window.

Connections

Cautions Before Connecting

- When connecting an external device to the TV, make sure that the TV and the device is turned off.
- Check the plugs on the ends of the cables to make sure that they are the correct type before you try to plug them into the jacks on the TV.
- Make sure that all plugs are securely inserted into the jacks. Loose connections can result in image or color problems.
- The illustration of the external device may be different depending on your model.
- Refer to the operating manual of the external device as well.

Antenna Connection




•Connect one end of your antenna cable to the **RF** jack on the back of the TV and connect the other end of the cable to the antenna wall jack.

Note:

- It is recommended that the 75-ohm coaxial cable is used to eliminate interference and noise which may occur due to radio wave conditions.
- The antenna cable should not be bundled with the power cord and the like.
- If the antenna is not installed properly, contact your dealer for assistance.

Power Connection



Connect the power cord to the **AC IN** socket on the back of the TV, then connect the other end to a power outlet.

Note:

- This product should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label.
- Always unplug the AC cord from power outlet when not using for a long period of time.
- This illustration is for reference only. The AC plug may be different on different models.

Connections (Continued)


Connecting Headphones



To connect headphones:

Insert the plug of the headphone into the TV's Headphone jack. When using headphones, adjust the headphone volume to avoid excessive volume levels, as hearing damage may result.

Connecting a USB device



Insert your USB device into the USB port.


To play from the USB device:

- I. Turn on your TV and press the **INPUT** button. The **Input Source** menu will open.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **USB** and press **OK** to confirm.

Note: You can also press the USB button to select directly.

Never remove the USB device or turn off the TV while using the USB device.

Connecting an HDMI device



How to connect an HDMI device:

Note: If your device has an HDMI connection, we recommend you use that to get the best quality possible.


To play from the HDMI device:

- I. Turn on your TV and press the **INPUT** button. The **Input Source** menu will open.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **HDMI** I (or **HDMI** 2/**HDMI** 3 if HDMI2/HDMI3 jack is used) and press **OK** to confirm.
- 3. Turn on the HDMI device and set it to the correct mode. Refer to the instructions that came with the HDMI device.

If the external device has a DVI output only, use a DVI to HDMI adapter cable to connect to the HDMI terminal. Connect the audio cable to the PC IN AUDIO jack on the TV.

Connections (Continued)

Connecting a component video device



To connect a component video device:


Connect the Component Video cable between the Y, Pb, Pr input jacks on the TV and Y, Pb, Pr(or Y, Cb, Cr) output jacks on the device . Connect the Audio cable between the AUDIO input jacks on the TV and AUDIO output jacks on the device.

To play from the component video device:

- I. Turn on your TV and press the **INPUT** button. The **Input Source** menu will open.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **COMP**. and press **OK** to confirm.
- 3. Turn on your external device and set it to the correct mode. See the device's user guide for more information.

Component cables often have red, green, and blue color-coded video connectors and red and white audio connectors. Match the colors when making connections.

Connecting a computer



To connect a computer:

Connect a VGA cable between the VGA jack on the computer and the VGA input jack on the TV.


Connect an Audio cable between the AUDIO output jack on the computer and AUDIO input jack on the TV.

To play video from the computer:

- 1. Turn on your TV and press the **INPUT** button. The **Input Source** menu will open.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **VGA** and press **OK** to confirm.
- 3. Turn on your computer and adjust the display properties as required.

Connections (Continued)

Connecting an AV device




To connect an AV device (such as VCR, camcorder, or game console):

Connect the Audio/Video cables between the Audio (L/R)/Video jacks on the TV and AV device.

To play the AV device:

- Turn on your TV and press the INPUT button. The Input Source menu will open.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select AV and press OK to confirm.
- 3. Turn on the AV device, insert a videotape and press the Play

Connecting a VCR for recording



Cable are often colorcoded to connectors. Connect yellow to yellow, red to red, white to white.

To connect a VCR for recording

Connect an AV cable to the AV OUT jacks on the TV and the AV IN jacks on the VCR.

To record a program:

- I. Turn on your TV and select the program you want to record.
- 2. Turn on your VCR and insert a videotape.
- 3. Press **RECORD** on your VCR to start the recording.

Note: Only TV and AV programs can be recorded.

Basic Operations

Turning the TV on or off

To turn the TV on or off:

- I Plug the power cord into an AC power outlet. Press the **Power Switch** on the TV.
- 2 Now the unit is in standby mode. Wait a few seconds until the power indicator lights up and press **POWER** to turn the TV on.
- **3** Press O button again to turn off the TV and put the TV in standby mode. To cut off the power completely, press the **Power Switch** on the TV.

Warning: When the TV is in standby mode, power is still entering into the TV. For the sake of saving energy and safety purposes, please press the **Power Switch** to completely cut off the power.

Note: If the TV does not receive a broadcast signal for several minutes, the TV will automatically turn off and go into standby mode.

Selecting the input source

Input Source TV AV COMP. VGA HDMI 1 HDMI 2 HDMI 3 USB

To select the input source:

- I Press the **INPUT** button.
- 2 Press ▼ or ▲ to select the input source. Options include:
 - TV Watch the TV signal.
 - AV Watch the AV signal.
 - •COMP. Watch the signal from the COMPONENT input terminals.
 - •VGA Watch the signal from the VGA input terminal.
 - •**HDMI I** Watch the signal from the HDMII input terminal.
 - •**HDMI 2** Watch the signal from the HDMI2 input terminal.
 - •**HDMI 3** Watch the signal from the HDMI3 input terminal.
 - •USB Watch the media source from the USB.
- 3 Press **OK** to confirm the selection.

Selecting a channel

You can use the following ways to change channels:

- Press **CH**^ or **CH**\struct to go to the next or previous channel. The skipped channels can not be selected.
- Press the number buttons to directly select any channel you want and press the **OK** button or wait for the channel to change.
- To go to the previous channel viewed, press.
- To browse among your favorite channels you set up, press the FAV button to display
 the Favorite List menu. Press ▲ or ▼ to select a channel, press the OK button to
 confirm.

Note: If the Favorite List menu has more than one page, you may press ◀ or ▶ for page upward or downward.

Adjusting the volume

To adjust the volume:

- Press **VOL**+ or **VOL** to increase or decrease the volume.
- Press the **MUTE** button to temporarily turn off the sound. To restore the sound, press the **VOL**+ or **MUTE** button.

Note: The speaker volume and the headphone volume will be memorized separately.

Displaying program information

To display program information:

You can press the **DISPLAY** button to display current program information such as channel number, color/audio system, or video input source, etc. To clear the display, press this button again or wait a few seconds and it disappears automatically.

Freezing the Picture

To freeze the picture:

Press the **FREEZE** button to freeze the image on the screen (the video sources still run). Press this button again to reactivate the image.

Note:

- If a fixed image is displayed on the screen for a long time, that fixed image may become imprinted on the screen and remain visible. Therefore do not freeze the picture for a long time.
- In some modes, the FREEZE function can not work.

Using the OSD (on-screen display) menu

- With the power on, press **MENU** and the main menu screen displays.
- The screen will now display the PICTURE menu.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to select menu, press ▼ or **OK** to access the menu.
- Within the menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select items and press ▶ or **OK** to access and adjust the selected item. If a sub-menu exists, press ▶ or **OK** to open it and use ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ and **OK** to operate.
- Continue pressing the **MENU** button to exit the menu screen. Or you can also wait for a few seconds and the on-screen menu will disappear from the screen automatically.

Note:

- Some menu items may be different when the unit works in different mode. The above main menus are illustrated under TV mode.
- Menu items that are not selectable are grayed out. If without special indication, this manual is described under TV mode.
- The illustrations and on-screen displays in this manual are for explanation purposes only (some are enlarged, others cropped) and may vary slightly from the actual ones.

Memorizing the Channels & Setting Channels

Auto Channel Search





Note: Be sure to select the **TV** input source before operation.

- Press **MENU** and the main menu screen displays.
- 2 Press ◀ or ▶ to select the **CHANNEL** menu and press ▼ or **OK** to access the menu.
- 3 Highlight the Auto Search and press ▶ or OK to begin the auto search for all available channels and stores them into memory. It may take several minutes. Please wait.
- 4 If you want to stop the auto search, press the **MENU** button.

Manual Channel Tuning






If desired programs can not be found by Auto Search, you can make use of Manual Tuning to search for programmes manually.

- I Use number buttons to select a current position number.
- 2 Navigate to the CHANNEL menu and press ▼ or OK to access the menu.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to select the **Manual Tuning** and press ➤ or **OK** to access.
 - Press ▶ for the unit to search towards higher frequency;
 - Press for the unit to search towards lower frequency.
- 4 The search stops when a program is found and this program will be stored in the current channel position. If you want to stop the search, press the MENU button.

Memorizing the Channels & Setting Channels (Continued)

Fine Tuning



♦ Left/Right Search

Fine Tuning is not necessary under normal conditions. However, in area of inferior broadcast conditions where adjustment is necessary for a better picture and sound, use fine tuning.

- Select a channel that you want to fine tune.
- 2 In the CHANNEL menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select the Fine-Tune and press ▶ or OK to access.
- **3** Press **4** or **▶** button to fine tune until the best possible picture and sound are obtained.
- 4 Continue pressing the **MENU** button to exit the menu screen.

Setting Color/Audio System





If some channel's color or audio is abnormal, it may be that the color or audio system setting is incorrect. Please do the following to select a proper color or audio system.

- Navigate to the CHANNEL menu and press ▼ or OK to access the menu.
- 2 To set the color system, press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Color System and press ◀ , ▶ or OK to access. Use ▲ or ▼ to select a proper color system and press ◀ , ▶ or OK to confirm.
 - To set the audio system, press ◆ or ▼ to highlight **Audio System** and press ◀ , ▶ or **OK** to access. Use ◆ or ▼ to select a proper audio system and press ◀ , ▶ or **OK** to confirm.
- 3 Continue pressing the **MENU** button to exit the menu screen.

Memorizing the Channels & Setting Channels (Continued)

Setting Favorite Channels





- I In the CHANNEL menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select Programme Edit and press ▶ or OK to access.
- 2 Highlight Current CH and press (or) to select your favorite channel.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to select Favorite and press ◀ , ▶ or OK to access. Use ▲ or ▼ to select Yes. (If you want to cancel the favorite setting, select No.)
- 4 Repeat the steps above to set more favorite programs.

Note:

If the Favorite List menu has more than one page, you may press \P or \P for page upward or downward.

Skipping Channels





You can skip unnecessary channels so that only the channels you want to watch can be selected by **CH** ^/v button.

- In the CHANNEL menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select Programme Edit and press ▶ or OK to access.
- 2 Highlight Current CH and press (or) to select your unwanted channel.
