We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

• TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance.

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump, etc. In particular when using the phone, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any. To avoid hearing impairment, pick up the call before holding your phone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let children use the phone and/or play with the telephone and accessories without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C to +55°C.

At over 55°C the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Emergency call numbers may not be reachable on all cellular networks. You should never rely only on your phone for emergency calls.

Do not open, dismantle or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or bend your mobile phone.

Do not use the phone if the glass made screen, is damaged, cracked or broken to avoid any injury.

Do not paint it.

During use, the actual SAR values for this device are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimize interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output of the device, the lower its SAR value.

Body-worn SAR testing has been carried out at a separation distance of 10 mm. To meet RF exposure guidelines during body-worn operation, the device should be positioned at least this distance away from the body.

If you are not using an approved accessory ensure that whatever product is used is free of any metal and that it positions the phone the indicated distance away from the body.

Organisation such as the World Health Organisation and the US Food and Drug Administration have stated that if people are concerned and want to reduce their exposure they could use a hands-free device to keep the phone away from the head and body during phone calls, or reduce the amount of time spent on the phone.







Menu key

- · Option menu. Touch to access Manage Home screen, Add widgets, Manage applications, Wallpaper and Settings.
 - Recent apps. Touch and hold to open a list of thumbnail images of apps you've worked with recently. Touch it to open an app. Swipe it upwards or downwards to remove a thumbnail from the list.

Home key

· While on any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.

Back key

 Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.

Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Power on or generate a popup menu selecting from Power off/Restart/Aeroplane mode or icons of Ringer mode.
- Press to mute the ringtone when there's an incoming call.
- Press and hold for more than 10 seconds to restart the phone when the system halted.
- Press and hold Power key and Volume down key to capture a screenshot.
- Press and hold Power key and Volume up key under power off mode to restore factory set.


Volume keys

- Under call mode, adjust the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjust the media volume.
- In general mode, adjust the ringtone volume.
- · Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.
- In Camera mode, using it as the capture key allows you to take a photo.

I.2 Getting started

I.2.I Set up

Removing or installing the back cover



Inserting or removing the SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card.






Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press and slide it out.



For dual SIM models, both SIM1 and SIM2 can support 2G and 3G networks. If both of them are 3G SIM cards, only one card can support 3G network ⁽¹⁾. Your phone only supports mini-SIM card. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types like micro and nano cards, otherwise you may damage your phone.


Installing or removing the battery

Power off your phone before removing the battery.



- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the cover.
- · Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

Installing or removing the microSD card



To install, open microSD card lock first, and then place the external microSD card into the slot with the gold contact facing down. To remove the external microSD card, open microSD card lock and take it out from the slot.

Charging the battery



Connect battery charger to your phone and plug into the socket.



If the battery is very low, there will be no indication that power is being received until the charge is sufficient to show the charging status bar. To reduce power consumption and energy waste, once the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Slide, PIN, Password, Pattern, Face unlock or Voice unlock) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen will then be displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you should set the following options:

- Touch Get started..., then select the phone's language.
- The device will search for service by itself. The process of activation will take a few minutes
- · Select your input keyboard, then touch Next.
- Select a SIM card or choose **Always ask** for voice call, messaging, etc (1).
- Set your date and time zone, you can also choose Automatic time zone, then touch Next.
- Set up your Google account: Touch Set up now. If you have a Google
 account, touch Sign in, then enter your username and password. If you
 forgot your password, you can go to http://www.google.com/ to retrieve
 it. Touch Next to skip to the next step.
- Touch Next, then the Setup complete screen will display, touch Finish to confirm.


When the phone is powered on, you can connect to a Wi-Fi network, without a SIM card inserted (refer to section "6.1.2 Wi-Fi"), to sign into your Google account and to use some features.

1.2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the popup menu appears, select **Power** off to confirm.

1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** key to switch to Home screen.



Touch to open main menu.

Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. The row of small squares at the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

I.3.1 Using the touchscreen



To access an application, touch it with your finger.

4027D only.

Long press the Home screen to access the available options for setting the Home screens.



Place your finger on any item to drag it to another location.



Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, web pages... at your convenience.



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.



Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better view.

Status bar

From status bar, you can view both phone status (to the right side) and notification information (to the left side).

Notification panel

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Quick settings panel or Notification panel. Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, you may touch and drag the Status bar with two fingers to access Quick settings panel directly. From the Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.



Touch to access Quick settings bar.

Touch one notification and slide it sideways to delete it.

Touch the icon $=_{\overline{\otimes}}$ to clear all event–based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

Touch ♣ and then the Settings icon ∅ to access **Settings**.



1.3.3 Search bar

The phone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.



Search by text

- Touch Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch Q on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.

Search by voice


- ullet Touch $igcup_{ullet}$ from the Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone screen by choosing slide or creating a variety of patterns, PIN or password, etc.

To create a screen unlock pattern (refer to section "Screen lock" for detail settings)

- Drag down the notification panel and touch $\stackrel{\triangle}{\longleftrightarrow}$ and then the settings icon $\stackrel{\triangle}{\diamondsuit}$ to enter **Settings**, then touch **Lock settings\Select screen lock\Pattern**.
- Draw your own pattern.



To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch Settings\Security\Lock settings\Select screen lock\PIN or Password.
- Set your PIN or password.

To lock phone screen

Press the Power key once to lock the screen.

To unlock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter your PIN or password, etc. to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen **Slide** as the screen lock, touch and drag lock screen to right to unlock the screen.



1.3.5 Personalise your Home screen

Add

Touch the application tab iiii, touch and hold an application to activate Move mode, and drag the item to any Home screen as you prefer.

Reposition

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Touch and hold an item to activate Move mode and remove it by dragging it on top of the **Remove** icon. Release after the icon turns red.

Create folders

To improve the organisation of items (shortcuts or applications) on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it, touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customisation

Touch and select **Wallpaper**. A popup window named **Select wallpaper from** will appear, offering a range of options. Select an option and slide left or right to locate a desired image, touch **Set wallpaper** to confirm. Alternatively follow these steps: **Settings > Display > Wallpaper**.

1.3.6 Application tab

Touch iiii from the Home screen to enter the applications list.

To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key.

Consult recently-used applications

To consult recently-used applications, you can long press ... Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the related application. Touch one thumbnail and slide it upwards or downwards to delete it.



1.3.7 Volume adjustment

Using volume key

Press **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To activate the vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrates. Press the **Volume down** key once more to activate the silent mode.

Using Settings menu

Drag down the notification panel and touch $\stackrel{\triangle}{\longrightarrow}$ and then the settings icon to enter **Settings**, then touch **Sound**, you can set the volume of calls ringtones, notification, system and etc. to your preference.

1.4 Applications and widgets

The Applications (apps) list contains all pre-embedded and newly installed apps.

To access the list, touch **iiii** from the Home screen. To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key or the **Back** key.

By touching and holding an empty area in the Home screen, you can switch to widget interface mode.

2.1 Using Onscreen Keyboard



2.2 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- Touch the icon \checkmark to confirm.





You can also insert new text

Phone call, Call log and Contacts

3.1 Phone.....

3.1.1 Placing a call

You can easily launch a call using **Phone**. Touch Application tab from the Home screen and select **Phone**.



Enter the desired number from the keyboard directly or select a contact from **All contacts** or **Call log** by sliding or touching tabs, then touch to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to Contacts by touching \mathsection and selecting Add to Contacts.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching igotimes . To hang up a call, touch .

International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold $\frac{U}{+}$ to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch \boxed{U} .

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.



When making a call with two SIM cards installed, a dialog box will pop up for you to choose the preferred SIM card.

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call, touch .

- · Slide rightward to answer;
- Slide leftward to reject;
- · Slide upward to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute incoming calls, press the **Volume up/down** key.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the **Volume up/down** key or turn the phone face down if **Turn over to mute** is activated. To activate, touch **Settings\Gestures\Turn over to mute**.

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold $\frac{1}{200}$ **Phone** tab.

To set your voicemail number, touch \square and select **Settings\Call settings\Voice** call**Voicemail.**

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon \mathbf{QQ} appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and touch **New Voicemail** to hear it.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume up/down key.









Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.





To avoid accidental touchscreen operations during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the cellphone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the cellphone is taken away from your ear.

3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch icon , you can now switch between two lines. The current call is put on hold and you can join in the other call.

Conference calls (1)

To set up a conference call:

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch icon and select Add call.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your network operator.

- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to the conference and touch icon Call. You can also add participants from People or Call log.
- Touch the icon to start a conference call.
- During a conference call, touch to drop a participant or to talk privately to one of the participants. Touch End to drop the participant from the conference, touch to talk privately to the participant and hold the other participants.
- Touch no to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.1.6 Call settings

Touch and select **Settings** from the Dial screen. The following options are available:

Call barring

You can activate or deactivate the call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

Touch to configure how your calls are forwarded when you are busy unanswered or unreachable.

Touch to configure how your calls are forwarded when you are busy, unanswered or unreachable.

 Additional settings

Caller ID Open a dialog box where you

can set whether your phone number is displayed when making calls.

Call waiting

Mark the check box to notify you of a new incoming call.

Call waiting status

Touch to view call waiting status if available.

Fixed Dialling Numbers

Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) is a SIM service mode, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers which their children can dial.

For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

Minute reminder

Mark the checkbox to enable minute reminder at 50s of every minute during a call.

Ouick responses

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

International dialling assist

Mark the checkbox to activate.

Other settings

Depending on your model.

3.2 Viewing your call history

You can access your call memory by touching () from the Phone screen to view call history in categories of Incoming calls, Outgoing calls, and Missed calls.

Missed calls

Outgoing calls

Incoming calls

Touch icons on top of call logs to change among different kinds.

Touch a contact or number to view information or perform further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **People** (only available for unsaved phone numbers), etc.

Touch the photo

to open the Quick Contact panel.

To clear the entire call memory, touch \square and select **Delete**.

3.3 Speed dial settings

You can access this setting screen by touching \S and then **Speed Dial** on Dial screen, then select contacts to define 2-9 screen keys as a speed dialler. Touch \bigoplus to remove contacts from speed dial.

3.4 People.....



The **People** enables quick and easy access to the people you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronise these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

3.4.1 Consult your contacts



Touch [to display contacts list option menu.

The following actions are enabled:

Delete contact Select and delete unwanted contacts.

Contacts to display Choose contacts to display.

Import/Export Import or export contacts between phone, SIM

card, microSD card and phone storage.

Accounts
 Manage the synchronisation settings for different

accounts.

Settings Set contacts' display mode.

• Share visible Share contacts with others by sending the contacts contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Fmail.

3.4.2 Managing contact groups


The contact group helps you to improve the organisation of your contacts. You can add, remove and view groups in the **Contact group** screen.

Touch the icon to view local groups. To create a new group, touch the icon, enter the new name and touch **DONE** to confirm. If you have added accounts to your phone, touch the icon to view groups in accounts.

3.4.3 Adding a contact

Touch the 8 icon in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.



If you want to add more information, touch \boldsymbol{Add} another field to add a new category.

When finished, touch **DONE** to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch $\ \ \ \$ and press **Discard** or press Back key to cancel.

Add to/remove from Favourites

To add a contact to Favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch to add the contact to Favourites (the star will turn gold in colour).

To remove a contact from favourites, touch the gold star \bigcirc on contact details screen.



Only phone contacts can be added to Favourites.

3.4.4 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch on the contact details screen, then touch **Edit.** When finished touch **DONE**.

Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, touch and hold the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**. A $\sqrt{}$ appears after the number.

This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number.

Set the ringtone for a contact

Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch \square and select **Delete** from the contact details screen.

On contacts list screen, touch and then **Delete contact**, select the contact(s) you want to remove and touch **OK** to confirm. Touch **Select all** and then **OK** to delete all contacts, touch **CANCEL** to exit en



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronise your phone.

3.4.5 Communicating with your contacts

From the contacts list, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To launch a call to a contact, touch the contact to enter the detail screen, then touch the number.

To send a message to a contact, touch the contact to enter the detail screen, then touch the picon on the right side of the number.

Use Quick contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number or the picture icon for the way you want to connect.



The icons available on Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

3.4.6 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

This phone enables you to import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, microSD card and phone storage.

From Contacts screen, touch \square to open the options menu, touch **Import/ export**, then choose to import/export contacts from/to SIM card, Phone, SD card, Phone storage, Accounts, etc.

To import/export a single contact from/to SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), select the contact you want to import/export, and touch ___ to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), touch **Select all** and touch \checkmark to confirm.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

3.4.7 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts, for each account you want to display in the People list. Touch \square and select **Contacts to display** from the contacts list screen, then you can choose which contacts to display.

By touching and selecting **Settings**, you can sort list by the first name or last name, as well as view contact names as first/last name first.

3.4.8 Joining/Separating contacts (1)

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch ☐ and select **Edit**, then touch ☐ again and touch **Join**.

At this time, you will be required to select the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch \square and touch **Edit**, then touch \square again and touch **Separate**, touch **OK** to confirm.

3.4.9 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, drag down the notification panel and touch on to enter **Settings**, then touch **Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account setups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the phone. Open the **Settings** screen, touch the account you want to delete, touch \square and select **Remove account**, then confirm.

Turn on/off the sync & Auto-sync

Touch an account to enter the account screen, mark/unmark the checkbox(s) to turn on/off the account's auto-sync. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronised to each other.

Sync manually

You can also synchronise an account manually on the **Accounts** screen. Touch an account in the list, then touch \square and select **Sync now**.

4 Messaging, Email.....

4.1 Messaging.....

You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this mobile phone. To access this feature, touch from the Home screen.

All messages you receive or send out can be saved in the phone's memory or SIM card. To consult the SMS messages stored in the SIM card, touch from the Messaging screen, then touch Settings\
Text message(SMS)\Manage SIM messages.

4.1.1 Writing a message

On the message list screen, touch the new message icon $\ensuremath{\textcircled{\tiny{!}}}$ to write text/multimedia messages.



For saved contacts, touch the photo to open the **Quick Contact** panel to communicate with the contact. For unsaved contacts, touch the photo to add the number to your **People**.

Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient on **Type person's** name or number bar or touch $\[\]$ to add recipients, touch **Type text** message bar to enter the text of the message. When finished, touch $\[\]$ to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific (accented) letters will also increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, contacts, calendar animations, slides and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the "Type person's name or number", touch the Type text message bar to enter the text of the message. Touch to open the option menu, select Add subject to insert a subject, and touch to attach a picture, video, audio and so on.

When finished, touch be to send the multimedia message.

Attachment options:

Capture picture Access the Attachment Camera to capture a new picture for attaching.
 Capture video Access the Camcorder to record a new video for attaching.
 Record audio Enter the Sound Recorder to record a voice message for attaching.
 Contact Access People application to select one or more contact(s) to attach.



4.1.2 Manage messages

When receiving a message, a icon will appear on the status bar as notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and touch the message to open.

Messaging are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter the message-composing screen, enter the text, then touch \triangleright .

Touch and hold a message in message details screen, the following options will be available:

Copy
 This option is only available for SMS. Touch to copy current message content and past it to Type text message bar of the new message you are going to compose.

Forward Touch to forward the message to another recipient.

• **Delete message** Delete the current message.

 Lock/Unlock message 	Touch to lock/unlock the message so it can't/can be deleted if you reach the maximum number of stored messages.
 View message details 	Touch to view details of the message.

4.2 Gmail/Email

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail or to create a new Email account.

4.2.1 Gmail



As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email account, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organized by labels instead of folders.

To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch the Application tab to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.

Gmail displays messages and conversations from one single Gmail account at a time, if you own more than one account, you can add an account by touching the $\$ and select **Settings** from Inbox screen, then touch **ADD ACCOUNT**. When finished, you can switch to another by touching the account name from Inbox screen, then select the account you want to view.

Mark the checkbox to automatically launch Service Loading (SL) messages when received.

Auto-Launch SL

To create and send emails

- Touch the icon from Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s)'s email address in To field, and if necessary, touch vand select Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch and select Attach file to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch the icon to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch and select Save draft or touch Back key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch your account name to display all labels, then select Drafts.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch $\ \ \ \$ and then select **Discard**.

To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and a icon will appear on Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. Or you can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, receiver, subject, etc.

- Touch the Search icon from Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the searching box and touch \bigcirc in the soft keyboard.

To reply or forward emails

• Reply When viewing an email, touch • to reply the sender of this mail

• Reply all Touch § and select "Reply all" to send messages to

all people in a mail loop.

• Forward Touch § and select "Forward" to forward the

received mail to other people.

Managing Gmails by Labels

To conveniently manage conversations and messages, you can organise them using a Label.

To label a conversation when reading a conversation's messages, touch the icon and select the label to assign to the conversation.

To view conversations by labels when viewing your inbox or another conversation list, touch the icon then touch a label to view a list of conversations with that label.

To manage labels, touch MANAGE LABELS from account setting.

Mark the checkbox to select email to activate batch mode, and generate the following options:

•	Touch to archive the email message. To display the archived messages, you can touch in Inbox screen then touch All mail .
• i	Touch to delete the email message.
• 🖭	Touch to mark an email message as read or unread.
•*	To assign a star or remove the star from the conversation.
Mark as (not) important	To mark the email as important or not important.
• Mute	To mute the entire conversation. When muted, new mails related to this conversation will not be displayed in the Inbox , but archived.
• Report spam	To report the email message/conversation as spam.

• Report phishing To report the email message/conversation as phishing.

4.2.2 Email.....



Besides your Gmail account, you can also set up external POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts in your phone.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- Enter the email address and password of the account you want to set up.
- Touch Next. If the account you entered is not provided by your service
 provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account
 settings screen to enter settings manually. Alternatively, you can touch
 Manual setup to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for
 the email account you are setting up.
- Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.
- To add another email account, you can touch

 and Settings, and finally touch ADD ACCOUNT on the right of the title to create the account.

To create and send emails

- Touch the icon // from Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in To field.
- If necessary, touch and touch Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind carbon copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch , touch **Attach file** to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch >> to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch and Save draft or touch Back key to save a draft.

4.3 Hangouts.....



Google's instant messaging service, Google Hangouts, lets you communicate with your friends whenever they are connected to this service.

To access this feature and sign in, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Hangouts**. All friends added by using Google Hangouts from the web or phone will be displayed in your friends list.

4.3.1 Chatting with your friends

To start a chat, touch the name of a friend in your Friends list, then enter your message and finally touch >.

You can invite other friends to join in a group chat by touching and selecting **Add people** on the new group conversation screen and then selecting the friend you want to add.

4.3.2 To add a new friend

From the Friends list, touch the icon to add a new friend.

Enter the name, email, number or Circle of the friend you want to add, and if the friend is not yet on Hangouts, the system will require to send invite by telling the friend via SMS or Gmail. A notification with this invitation will be showed in your friend' messaging or Gmail.

If your friends invite you to do video talk or they send you message in the first time, you could select **Decline** or **Reply** in response.

4.3.3 To start and close a chat

Touch one friend from friends list, you could send messages to your friends or have a video call;

After you join Google+, you could send pictures to everyone in the google hangouts.

When you want to end a chat, touch back key from Chatting screen directly.

If you want to sign out, touch **Menu** key and **Settings\Choose an account \Sign out**.

4.3.4 To manage your friends

Besides adding new friends to your friends list, the following actions are available for your choice:

• To view all friends By default, all your friends are displayed in

Friends list. Touch your friend could start the conversation directly. Touch and hold the friend

to activate archive and delete.

• **New group** Add the person to a new group Hangout.

4.3.5 Settings



Use the Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

5.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view.

Touch the month label on the top of the screen to change your Calendar view, and a drop-down menu will display for you to choose. Touch **Today** to return to Today's view.



5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch the icon to access new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select All day.
- Invite guests to the event. Enter the email addresses of the guests you
 want to invite with commas to separate. The guests will receive an
 invitation from Calendar and Email.
- When finished, touch **DONE** from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the Day or Week view screen, touch and hold an empty spot or an event to open the Option menu, then touch **New event** to enter the event details screen of the time you have previously selected. Or you can also touch the empty spot to select the target area which will turn blue, and tap again to create the new event.

5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To share, delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter details screen, touch the icon to share the event to other people by Bluetooth, Email and messaging, etc., touch the icon to edit the event, and touch the icon to delete.

5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon awill appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the notification panel, touch the event name to view the Calendar notification list.

Touch **Snooze** to turn off all event reminders for 5 minutes.

Touch the **Back** key to keep the reminders pending on the status bar and the notification panel.

Important options activated by touching _ from the Calendar main screen:

• Search To search in the calendar

• Calendars to display To show or hide the synchronised calendars.

To refresh the calendar

• Clear events To clear the selected events

• **Go to** Select to go to specific date.

• **Settings** To set a series of Calendar settings.

5.2 Time.....

Refresh



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Time**.

Time application includes four applications – World clock, Alarm, Timer and Countdown.

Touch to add or set an alarm.

To set an alarm

From the **Time** screen, touch to enter the **Alarm** screen, touch to add a new alarm. The following options will show:

 Time Touch numbers to set the time for your alarm.

 Label Touch to set a name for the alarm.

 Repeat Touch to select days you want alarm to work.

 Vibrate Select to activate vibration.

 Ringtone Touch to select a ringtone for the alarm.

When finished touch **OK** to confirm.

Touch in to delete the selected alarm.

5.2.2 To adjust alarm settings

Touch from Alarms screen. The following options will be available under Settings:

 Alarm in silent Touch to play alarm even when the phone is in mode silent mode

 Snooze duration Touch to set up the duration of snooze.

 Volume buttons Touch to set the alarm sounds: None.Snooze. Dismiss.

 Turn over to Touch to select the turn over behaviour: activate Snooze or Stop.



Getting connected..

To connect to the Internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/EDGE/3G networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

6.1 **Connecting to the Internet**

GPRS/FDGF/3G

The first time you turn on your phone with a SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure network service: GPRS, EDGE or 3G, If the network is not connected, you can touch on Quick setting bar.

To check the network connection you are using, touch Application tab on the Home screen, then touch Settings\More...\Mobile networks\ Access Point Names or Network operators.

To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/3G network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- Drag down notification panel and touch to access Settings.
- Touch More...\Mobile networks\Access Point Names
- Touch
 ☐ and select New APN.
- Enter the required APN information.
- When finished, touch
 □ and select Save.

To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can decide to connect/disconnect to a data service.

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch SIM management\Roaming\Data roaming.
- Touch to select from popup options: Disable, National Roaming only and All Networks.
- When Data roaming is deactivated, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi").

6.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on the phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch the switch beside Wi-Fi to turn on\off Wi-Fi.
- Touch Wi-Fi, detailed information of all detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (contact network operator for details). When finished, touch Connect.

To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- Drag down notification panel and touch oto access Settings.
- Touch Wi-Fi. Then touch ☐ and select Advanced from Wi-Fi screen.
- Mark/Unmark the Network notification checkbox to activate/ deactivate this function.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access **Settings**.
- Touch Wi-Fi, and then touch .
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- · Touch Save.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, long press the name of the saved network.
- Touch Forget network in the dialog that opens.

6.2 Browser.....



Using Browser, you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Browser**.

To go to a web page

On Browser screen, touch the URL box at the top, enter the address of the web page, then touch 60 to confirm.



The URL bar will hide after a few seconds. To show the URL bar, you can touch and slide down the screen.

To set a home page

- Touch from the Browser screen to display the option menu, touch Settings\General\Set home page.
- · Choose a page or most visited website as your home page.
- If you choose Other, enter the URL of the website you want to set as your home page, touch OK to confirm.

6.2.1 Viewing web pages

After opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.

To zoom in/out of a web page

Pinch/Spread your finger on the screen to zoom out/in of the web page.

To quickly zoom into a section of a web page, double touch on the section you want to view. To return to normal zoom level, double touch again.

To find text on a web page

- Touch \square from the web page screen, then select **Find on page**.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- The first word with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen, and subsequent matches will be boxed.
- Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- When finished, you can touch

 or the Back key to close the search bar.

Further operations for the text on a web page

You can copy, share or search the text on a web page:

- · Touch and hold the text to highlight it.
- Move the two tabs to select the text.
- Touch SELECT ALL to select all words in this web page.
- Long press the selected text, Copy, Share, Find and Web Search will appear on the screen.
- When finished, touch \checkmark or the **Back** key to deactivate the mode.

To open new window/switch between windows

Multiple windows can be opened at the same time for your convenience.

- copying link URL, etc.
- Phone number Touch to call the phone number.
- Address Touch to open Google Maps and locate the address.

To view Browser history

- Touch ☐ from the Browser screen.
- Touch Bookmarks/History.
- Touch the **History** tab to view browser history.
- Touch **Saved pages** to view the pages you've saved.

To download a web application/view your downloads

Before downloading a web application, you need to enable your phone to install web applications (touch \square from the Home screen, touch **Settings**\ Security, mark the checkbox of **Unknown sources**, finally touch **OK** to confirm).

To download an item, touch the item or the link you want to download.

To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification panel, select the item to be cancelled, and touch $\stackrel{*}{=}$ to confirm.

To view items you have downloaded, touch the application **Downloads**.

Manage bookmarks

To bookmark a web page

- · Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- Touch and select Save to bookmarks, or from the History screen, touch the star beside the URL.
- Enter the name and the location if needed and touch **OK** to confirm.

To open a bookmark

- Touch and select Bookmarks/History, or touch the icon to enter the Bookmarks screen.
- · Touch the bookmark you want to open.
- You can also touch and hold to display the options screen, then touch Open or Open in new window.

To edit a bookmark

- Touch and select Bookmarks\History, or touch the icon to enter the Bookmarks screen.

6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices (1)

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses

To access this function, drag down notification panel and touch to access **Settings**. Then touch **Bluetooth**. Your device and other available ones will display on the screen.

To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch
 on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your phone more recognisable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

- Touch Ø on Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch Bluetooth.
- Touch \square and select **Rename phone**.
- Enter a name, and touch **Rename** to confirm.

To make device visible

- Touch
 on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch Bluetooth.
- · Touch your device to make it visible or invisible.
- Touch and select **Visibility timeout** to select the visible time.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch Bluetooth.
- Touch SEARCH FOR DEVICES.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- A dialog will pop up, touch **Pair** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone will connect with the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch the device name you want to unpair.
- Touch Unpair to confirm.

6.4 Connecting to a computer

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between micro SD card/internal storage and a computer.

Before using MTP or PTP, first mark USB debugging.

Touch Settings\About phone, then touch Build number 7 times.
 Then touch Settings\Developer options\USB debugging.

To connect/disconnect your phone to/from the computer:

- Use the USB cable to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- If you use mass storage, open the Notification panel and touch USB connected, then touch Mount in the dialog that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.
- If you use MTP or PTP, your phone will be automatically connected.
 To disconnect (from mass storage):
- Unmount the microSD card on your computer.
- Open the Notification panel and touch **Turn off USB storage**.
- For Windows XP or lower operating systems, you should download and install Windows Media Player II on your computer.

To locate the data you have transferred or downloaded in the internal storage:

- Touch Application tab from the Home screen to open the applications list.
- Touch File Manager.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **File Manager**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install applications on your phone, etc.

To format a microSD card

- Touch
 on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- · Touch Storage.
- Touch **Format SD card**. On the screen a popup warns you that formatting the microSD card will erase its contents, touch **Format** .

6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

To turn on USB tethering or Portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Mark the checkbox of USB tethering or turn on Wi-Fi hotspot to activate this function.



These functions may incur additional network charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas. You can check data usage by touching **Settings\Data usage**.

To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that along with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Mark\Unmark the checkbox of USB tethering to activate/deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

Touch
 on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.

- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Touch the switch beside Wi-Fi hotspot to activate/deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection via Bluetooth

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Mark/Unmark the check box of Bluetooth tethering to activate/ deactivate this function.

To rename or secure your portable hotspot

When Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is activated, you can change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Touch
 on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot\Wi-Fi hotspot.
- Touch Set up Wi-Fi hotspot to change the network SSID or set your network security.
- · Touch Save.

6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to Settings.
- Touch **More...\VPN** settings and then touch **—**.
- In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- · Touch Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a lock screen pattern, PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More...\VPN settings.
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch Connect.

To disconnect:

 Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for the VPN disconnection.

To edit/delete a VPN

- Touch on Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- Touch More...\VPN settings.
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch & hold the VPN you want to edit.
- · Touch Edit profile.
- · After finishing, touch Save.

To delete:

Google Play Store is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android powered phone.

To open Google Play Store:

- Touch Play Store from extended screen.
- For the first time you access Google Play Store, a screen with terms of service pops up for your attention, touch Accept to continue.



- \bullet The progress of the download will show on the details screen, touch \times to stop downloading the item. You can also access this screen through Notification panel.
- After download and installation have finished, you will see a notification icon 1 on the status bar.
- Be especially cautious with applications that have access to many functions or to a significant amount of your data. Once you accept, you are responsible for the results of using this item on your phone.

Depending on your country and operator.

To open the application you have downloaded:

- Touch the installed application in the list, then touch Open.

To buy an application (1)

On **Google Play Store**, some applications are labelled as free, while some of them are to be paid for before downloading and installing.

- · Touch the application you want to buy.
- Touch the price on the up-right of the screen to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch Continue to confirm.
- When making your first purchase, you are required to input your credit card information and to log into the Google payment and billing service.



8.1 Camera.....



Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera, please be sure to open the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.



To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the oicon to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

To shoot a video

First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch the icon to start recording. Touch II to pause recording, touch or press Back key to save the video. or press the **Back** key to save the video.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Touch the icons below the screen to share and edit the photo or video you have taken.
- Touch the photo icon to access Gallery.

8.1.1 Settings in framing mode

Before taking a photo/shooting a video, touch the opinion to adjust a number of settings in framing mode.

Back camera shooting mode

Touch \square to access camera settings and below options will display for you to choose from:

HDR

Touch to turn on HDR (High-Dynamic Range) function. HDR photos can better reflect the visual effects people have in the real environment by synthesizing images under different exposure time. The phone will then automatically save the original photos and HDR ones.



YouTube is an online video-sharing service where the user can download, share and view videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet

8.4 Music



Using this menu, you can play music files stored on the microSD card or the phone storage. Music files can be downloaded from a computer the phone using a USB cable.

You will find four categories in which all songs are classified: ALL, Favourite, Folder, Artist, Album, Genre, Recent add and Plalist. Slide left and right to view all. Touch Shuffle all to shuffle all songs.

8.4.1 Playing music

Touch a song to play it.



- Touch to play the current playlist in shuffle mode (tracks are played in random order).

- Touch to pause/resume playback.

While playing songs with Play Music, the operation of pause, play or skip is still available even if the screen is locked.

8.4.2 Working with playlists

Playlists allow you to conveniently organise all songs stored in the SD card or phone storage.

In the search box, enter an address, a city or a local business.

Touch the search icon to search, and in a while your search results will appear on the map as red dots. You can touch one to show a label.



9.3 Star a location

Just like bookmarking a web address on the Internet, you can star any position on the map for later use.

9.3.1 How to star (or unstar) a location

9.4.1 Get suggested routes for your trip

- Touch the enter bar or the triangle to edit your start point by one of the following methods: entering an address, using My Location, selecting a start point on a map, selecting a starred item, selecting an address from your contacts or using search history.
- Do the same for your end point.
- To reverse directions, touch 11.
- A couple of suggested routes will appear in a list. Touch any routes to view their respective detailed directions.

To get reverse directions for a route you've already made, simply open that route's directions window and touch 11. No need to enter your start point and end point again.

9.4.2 Preview suggested routes and decide on a route more preferable or feasible to you

You can preview each turn in your route in Navigation, Satellite, and other views.

 Touch a left or right arrow to preview the next or previous leg of your route. You can view turn-by-turn directions, estimated distance and possible arrival time in a list by touching DIRECTIONS LIST, touch Back key or MAP VIEW to return to previous view.

When selecting a more preferable or feasible route, distance and time will be the two most important factors for your evaluation. Distance and estimated time will be displayed at the top of the directions screen.

9.4.3 Search for locations along your route

9.5 Arrangement of Layers

Layers allow you to view locations and additional information overlaid on the map. You can add multiple layers or remove only certain layers so you control exactly what information you want visible on the map at one time.

9.5.1 To view multiple layers

Touch icon from Maps screen. All available layers are listed (like Traffic, Satellite, etc.), select one to view.

9.5.2 To clear the map

After you get directions or search on a map, you can clear the markers/ layers that have been drawn: touch and **Settings**, select **Maps history**, then touch ...



Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspend-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN cannot survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

In the battery management screen you can view battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch one category to reveal its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use by adjusting screen brightness or screen timeout in the Display screen.

11.2.8 Applications

You use the Applications settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites and emails.

You will need to stand in a place with a clear view of the sky and avoid moving. After this, GPS will only need 20-40 seconds to identify your precise location.

11.3.3 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your phone and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

Mark the checkbox to enable the system to show suggested words.

User dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

Touch to select a default input method. Touch **Configure input methods** to show all input methods. Touch the settings icon to configure a certain input method.

Android keyboard

The Android keyboard settings apply to the onscreen keyboard that is included with your phone. The correction and capitalisation features affect only the English version of the keyboard. Available options are as follows:

11.3.4 Back up and reset

If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up are restored onto the new phone for the first time you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure with the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google Servers.

Back up account

Touch to back up your account.

Automatic restore

Mark the checkbox to restore your backed up settings or other data when you reinstall an application.

DRM reset

Touch to select delete all DRM licenses.

Factory data reset

Phone reset will erase all of your personal data from internal phone storage, including information about your Google account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the phone does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded or any files on your microSD card, such as music or photos. If you mark the checkbox - Reserve the content of Phone storage before touching **Reset phone**, any files stored on your phone's storage will not be erased. If you reset the phone in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your phone, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the **Volume up** key and the **power** key at same time until the screen lights up.

and carry out the following checks:

My phone cannot be switched on or is frozen

- When the phone cannot be switched on, charge for at least 20 minutes to ensure the minimum battery power needed, then try to switch on again.
- When the phone falls into a loop during power on-off animation and the user interface cannot be accessed, press and hold the **Volume** down key to enter Safe Mode. This eliminates any abnormal OS booting issues caused by 3rd party APKs.
