Batteries should not be disposed of in general household waste. Observe the local waste disposal regulations, details of which can be obtained from your local authority or the dealer you purchased the product from.

First steps

Installing the base station

The base station is designed for use in closed, dry rooms with a temperature range of +5 °C to +45 °C.

Set up the base station at a central point in your apartment or house.

Please note:

- ◆ Never expose the telephone to heat sources, direct sunlight or other electrical appliances.
- ◆ Protect your Gigaset from moisture, dust, corrosive liquids and vapours.

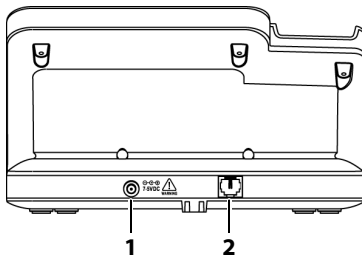
Range and reception strength

Range:

- ◆ Outdoors: up to 300 m
- ◆ Indoors: up to 50 m

Connecting the base station

- **First** connect the power supply unit and **then** the phone jack as shown below.



- 1 Power supply unit 220 V
2 Phone jack with phone cord

Please note:

- ◆ The mains adapter must **always be connected**, as the phone will not operate without mains connection.
- ◆ Only use the mains adapter and phone cord **supplied**.

- ◆ If you buy a replacement phone cord, make sure that the phone jack has the correct type of wiring.

Setting up the handset for use

Inserting the batteries

Warning:

Use only the rechargeable batteries recommended by Gigaset Communications GmbH. Never use a conventional (non-rechargeable) battery or other battery types as this could result in significant health risks and personal injury. For example, the batteries could explode. The phone could also malfunction or be damaged as a result of using batteries that are not of the recommended type.

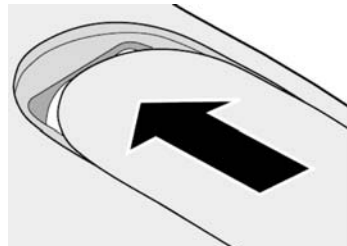
- Insert the batteries the right way round.

The polarity is indicated in/on the battery compartment.



Closing the battery cover

Put the cover on the phone as indicated on the picture below. Push the cover upward until click sound is heard, means the cover is fixed properly.



First steps

Opening the battery cover

Push downward to open the cover.

Initial charging and discharging of batteries

If the handset is activated, the flashing battery icon in the top right of the display indicates that the batteries are being charged.

During handset operation, the battery icon indicates the charge status of the batteries. The correct charge level can only be displayed if the batteries are first fully charged **and** discharged.

- ▶ To do this, leave the handset in the charging cradle **without interruption** for **15** hours.
- ▶ Afterwards, remove the handset from the charging cradle and do not put it back again until the batteries are fully discharged.

Please note:

After the first battery charge **and** discharge you may replace your handset in its charger after every call.

Please note:

- ◆ Always repeat the charging and discharging procedure if you remove the batteries from the handset and reinsert them.
- ◆ The batteries may warm up during charging. This is not dangerous.
- ◆ After a while the charge capacity of the batteries will decrease for technical reasons.

Registering handsets

You can register up to four handsets to your base.

Registering the handset to the base station occurs automatically on first using.

If the automatic register failed, please do the operations on the handset and on the base as below.

Operations on the handset

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **ADVANCED SET.** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **REGISTRATION** and confirm with .
- ▶ Confirm both messages with .
- ▶ Proceed with the operations on the base.

Operations on the base

- ▶ Press and **hold** the paging key  () on the base until beep sounds (approx. 3 sec.).
- ▶ Input the handset name and confirm with .

Once it has been registered successfully, the handset returns to idle status. The name and the handset's internal number is shown in the display e.g. INT 1.

If fail to register, repeat the procedure.

Deregistering handsets

Please note:

Do not deregister handsets unless necessary!

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **ADVANCED SET.** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **DEREGISTRATION** and confirm with .
- ▶ Confirm the message with .
- ▶ **DEREGISTERED** is displayed.

Handset will ask for registering after deregistered, otherwise you will not able to dial by handset.

Locating a handset ("paging")

You can locate your handset using the base station.

Briefly press the paging key   on the base station → **PAGING EXTENSION?**

→ Input the number of handset for paging or press   Key for all handsets

Handsets paged will ring, even if the ringer tones are deactivated.

Ending paging

- ▶ **Briefly** press the paging key   on the base station or press the end key  on the handset.

Setting the date and time

Set the date and time so that the correct date and time can be assigned to incoming calls.

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **TIME SETTING** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Input the time/date and confirm with .

e.g. set time and date to 2008-7-17 20:38

- ▶ Enter **TIME SETTING**

- ▶ Ordinal input:

2 ABC	0	3 DEF	8 TUV	2 ABC	0	0
8 TUV	0	7 PQRS	1	7 PQRS	OK	

You do not need to set time and date again on base, for handset will synchronize this setting to base automatically.

Operating the handset

Activating/deactivating the keypad lock

Long press   (handset) to toggle lock and unlock.

The  icon appears in the display when the keypad lock is activated.

The keypad lock is deactivated automatically if someone calls you. It is re-activated when the call is finished.

Ringer OFF/ON

Long press   to turn off ringer tone.

Handset displays  and the base displays .

Long press   once again to turn on ringer.

Reverting to idle status

You can revert to idle status as follows:

- ▶ Press the end call key  (handset) back to idle.

Or:

- ▶ Press  key (base) back to idle.

Changes that you have not confirmed or saved will be lost.

Operating the menu

Your telephone's functions are accessed using a menu.

- ▶ Press  with the handset in idle status to open the main menu.
- ▶ Navigate to the function using the control key . Press the  key to access the function.

Correcting incorrect entries

- ◆ Press  to delete the character to the left of the cursor.

Scrolling to display long number

If a telephone number is more than 12 digits in Phonebook or Redial list, the icon  is displayed.

You can use the  for scrolling to display next digits of the whole number.

Making calls

Making an external call

External calls are calls using the public telephone network.

- ▶ Enter the number and press the talk key  or .

Or:

- ▶ Press  or  and then enter the number.

You can cancel the dialling operation with the end call key .

Please note:

Dialling using the directory (page 13), the last number redial list (page 13), the call history (page 14) or the call-by-call info services list (page 14) saves you from having to re-enter numbers and network provider prefixes ("call-by-call numbers").

Accepting a call

Press  or  and to accept an incoming call.

If the handset is in the charging cradle and the **AUTO ANSWER** function is activated, the handset will take a call automatically when you lift it out of the cradle.

Adjusting talking volume

Press  or  () to adjust the talking volume.

Muting

- ▶ Press  to deactivate the microphone in your handset during an external call.
- ▶ Press  again to reactivate the microphone.

Ending a call

Press the end call key .

Activating/deactivating auto answer

If you activate this function, when you receive a call you can simply lift the handset out of the charging cradle without having to press the talk key .

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **PERSONAL SET.** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **AUTO ANSWER** and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **ON** or **OFF** and confirm with .

Calling Line Identification

Precondition:

You have applied the CID service.

When you get a call, the caller's phone number will be displayed on your handset. The caller's name and number will be both displayed if it is stored in the phonebook

Please note:

The phone was made according to the national standards. However sometimes the CID function can't be displayed properly for the reason of some special using condition: e.g. connecting several phones on a single line or the PABX is not a standard appliance. Please contact your local telecom service supplier.

Using the directory and lists

The options are:

- ◆ Directory
- ◆ Last number redial list
- ◆ Call history
- ◆ Call-by-call list

Directory

In the directory you can store up to 50 phone numbers and corresponding names.

- ▶ In idle status, open the directory by pressing the  key.
- ▶ Press  to look for entries.

Length of entries

Number: max. 24 digits

Name: max. 15 characters

Saving a number in the directory

- ▶ Press  and  to open the directory menu.
- ▶ Select **ADD ENTRY** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Enter the name of the contact and confirm with .
- ▶ Enter the phone number and confirm with .

Dialling with the directory

- ▶ Press  and select an entry with .
- ▶ Press  to dial.

Editing an entry in the directory

- ▶ Press  and  to open the directory menu.
- ▶ Select **EDIT ENTRY** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select an entry and confirm with .
- ▶ Edit the name and confirm with .
- ▶ Edit the phone number and confirm with .

Deleting an entry in the directory

- ▶ Press  and  to open the directory menu.
- ▶ Select **DELETE ENTRY** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select an entry and confirm with .
- ▶ Confirm the message **DELETE ? / DELETE ALL?** with  (on base) /  (on handset).

The entry is deleted, **DELETED** is displayed.

Please delete expired entries to keep up the directory storage.

Deleting the complete directory

- ▶ Press  and  to open the directory menu.
- ▶ Select **DELETE LIST** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Confirm the message **DELETE ? / DELETE ALL?** with  (on base) /  (on handset).

The directory is deleted, **DELETED** is displayed.

Last number redial list

The last number redial list contains the ten numbers last dialled.

- ▶ Press  and select a number with .
- ▶ Press  to dial.

Call history

- ▶ Press  (Handset)/ (Basestation) and select a number with .
- ▶ Press  to dial.

Precondition: Calling Line Identification (page 10) is applied and there are stored calls.

Setting the type of list

Depending on the type of list set, all numbers of the last 30 incoming calls or just the missed calls are saved.

- ▶ Press  to open the menu.
- ▶ Select **PERSONAL SET.** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **CALL LOGS** and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **ALL CALLS** or **MISSED CALL** and confirm with .

The calls list entries are retained when you change the list type.

Call-by-call list

In the call-by-call list, you can store network provider prefixes ("call-by-call numbers").

Store a call-by-call number

- ▶ Press the  key **twice**.
- ▶ Enter the provider's name and confirm with .
- ▶ Enter the provider's number and confirm with .

The method for entering the call-by-call number below is for your reference since it may be different for various cards.

- ▶ Enter the call-by-call number, e.g. 17910.
- ▶ Insert a pause by pressing the # key **twice** if necessary.

Use the call-by-call dialling

- ▶ Enter a long distance number and then press .

Or:

- ▶ Select a number from the directory or redial list and then press .

Or:

- ▶ Press  or , then press  and then enter the long distance number.

Using several handsets

Making internal calls/Intercom

Internal calls to other handsets registered to the same base are free.

Calling handset

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Enter the number of the handset.
Or press  to call the base.
Or press the star key  to call all handsets.
- ▶ To answer the call with the handset or base, press  or .

Ending a call

- ▶ Press the end call  key.

Transferring a call to another handset

You can transfer an external call to another handset (connect).

- ▶ During the external call, press .
- ▶ Enter the handset number you want to transfer.

When the internal participant answers:

- ▶ If necessary announce the external call.
- ▶ Press the end call key .

The external call is transferred to the other handset.

Internal consultation calls

When you are speaking to an **external** participant, you can call an **internal** participant at the same time for consultation.

- ▶ During the external call, press .
- ▶ Enter the handset number you want to consult with.

You are connected with the internal participant. To return to held call press . If an **internal** participant presses the end call key , the other handset remains connected to the external participant.

Conference calls

When you are speaking to an **external** participant, an internal caller can listen in on this call and take part in a conference call.

Activate/Deactivate conference call

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **CONFERENCE** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **ON/OFF** to activate/deactivate the function and confirm with .

Starting a conference call

The **CONFERENCE** function must be activated as described above.

The line is engaged with an external call. Your display will show information to that effect.

- ▶ Press  or  to start a conference call.

Ending a conference call

- ▶ Press the end call key .

If an **internal** participant presses the end call key , the other handset remains connected to the external participant.

Setting the handset

Your handset is preconfigured, but you can change the settings to suit your individual requirements.

Changing audio settings

Changing the ringer volume

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **AUDIO SETTING** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **RINGER VOLUME** and confirm with .
- ▶ Choose between five volumes: **HIGH**, **MEDIUM**, **LOW**, **OFF** and the **ASCENDING** ring (volume increases with each ring) and confirm with .

Changing the melody

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **AUDIO SETTING** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **RINGER MELODY** and confirm with .
- ▶ Choose between various ringer melody and confirm with .

Setting the contrast

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **PERSONAL SET.** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **CONTRAST** and confirm with .
- ▶ Choose between three levels (**LEVEL 1**, **LEVEL 2**, **LEVEL 3**) and confirm with .

Setting the key tone

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **PERSONAL SET.** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **KEY BEEP** and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **ON/OFF** to activate/deactivate the key tone and confirm with .

Changing the display language

You can view the display texts in different languages.

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **PERSONAL SET.** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **LANGUAGE** and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **ENGLISH/FRENCH** to change the language and confirm with .

Restoring the handset to the factory settings

You can reset any individual settings and changes that you have made. This will not affect entries in the directory or the handset's registration to the base.

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **ADVANCED SET.** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **HANDSET RESET** and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **YES** to reset the handset or **NO** to cancel the restoring process and confirm with .

Setting the base

The base settings are carried out using a registered Gigaset C67H handset.

Setting the date and time

You do not need to set time and date on base again, if you have set on handset (see page 9).

Changing audio settings

Changing the ringer volume

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **AUDIO SETTING** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **RINGER VOLUME** and confirm with .
- ▶ Choose between four volumes (**HIGH**, **MEDIUM**, **LOW**, **OFF**) and confirm with .

Changing the melody

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **AUDIO SETTING** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **RINGER MELODY** and confirm with .
- ▶ Choose between various ringer melody (by pressing 0 to 9) and confirm with .

Setting the key tone

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **KEY BEEP** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **ON/OFF** to activate/deactivate the key tone and confirm with .

Setting the contrast

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **CONTRAST** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Choose between three levels (**LEVEL 1**, **LEVEL 2**, **LEVEL 3**) and confirm with .

Restoring the base to the factory settings

When the settings are restored, the handsets are still registered.

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **BASE RESET** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **YES** to reset the base or press **NO** to cancel the restoring process and confirm with .

Connecting the base to PABX

The following settings are only necessary when your PABX requires them; see the PABX user guide.

Dialling modes and flash time

Changing the dialling mode

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **TONE/PULSE** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select the dialling mode **TONE** (Touch tone dialling (DTMF)) or **PULSE** (Dial pulsing (DP)) and confirm with .

Setting flash time

Your phone is preset at the factory for operation on the main connection. For operation on a PABX, you may have to change this value. Please refer to the user guide for your PABX.

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **FLASH TIME** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select the flash time in ms (100, 300, 600) and confirm with .

Saving an access code (PABX prefix)

Precondition: You may have to enter an access code for external calls in your PABX, e.g. "9". This number can be automatically prefixed if you set the prefix.

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **PABX PREFIX** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Enter or change the access code, at least two digits and confirm with .

Network Setting

- ▶ Press .
- ▶ Select **NETWORK** with  and confirm with .
- ▶ Select **PUBLIC NET.** or **PRIVATE NET.** and confirm with .

Dial an external number

The access code (**PABX PREFIX**) is automatically prefixed, if all preconditions are fulfilled:

- ◆ The **NETWORK** is set to **PRIVATE NET.** .
- ◆ The access code (**PABX PREFIX**) is set.
- ◆ You enter the phone number before pressing  or .

Example:

- ▶ Set **NETWORK** to **PRIVATE NET.**.
- ▶ Set **PABX PREFIX** number to 9.
- ▶ Enter     .
- ▶ Press  or .

The number dialled out is 9P12345.

Caution:

The access code (**PABX PREFIX**) is not prefixed if you press  or  before entering number.

Appendix

Care

Wipe the base station, charging cradle and handset with a **damp** cloth (do not use solvent) or an antistatic cloth.

Never use a dry cloth. This can cause static.

Contact with liquid

If the handset has come into contact with liquid:

1. **Switch off the handset and remove the battery pack immediately.**
2. Allow the liquid to drain from the handset.
3. Pat all parts dry, then place the handset with the battery compartment open and the keypad facing down in a dry, warm place **for at least 72 hours (not in a microwave, oven etc.)**.
4. **Do not switch on the handset again until it is completely dry.**

When it has fully dried out, you will normally be able to use it again.

Writing and editing text

The following rules apply when writing text:

- ◆ Control the cursor with    .
- ◆ Characters are inserted on the left of the cursor.
- ◆ The first letter of the name of directory entries is automatically capitalised, followed by lower case letters.

Writing names

Press the relevant key several times to enter letters/characters.
