Connect FM antenna



• For optimal reception, fully extend and adjust the position of the antenna.

Connect the supplied FM antenna to the FM ANT socket on the main unit.



Prepare the remote control




Caution

Connect power




Vote

• The type plate is located at the back of the main unit.

Connect the power adapter to:

- the **DC IN** socket on the main unit.
- the wall socket.



Set clock

- In standby mode, press and hold CLOCK SET on the remote control for two seconds.
 - → [SET CLOCK] (set clock) scrolls on the display.
- 2 Press CLOCK SET again.
 - → The 12/24 hour format blinks.

- 3 Press I◀◀ / ▶▶ repeatedly to select hour format.
- 4 Press CLOCK SET to confirm.
 - → The hour digits blink.
- **5** Repeat steps 3-4 to set the hour.
- 6 Repeat steps 3-4 to set the minute.
- Repeat steps 3-4 to select whether to synchronize time of this unit with RDS stations.
 - [NO SYNC CLOCK]: time synchronization is deactivated.
 - [SYNC RDS CLOCK]: the unit synchronizes time from the RDS stations automatically.



Note

- The accuracy of the transmitted time depends on the RDS station that transmits the time signal.
- If no button is pressed in 90 seconds, the unit exits clock setting mode automatically.

Turn on

Press O.

→ The unit switches to the last selected source.



Note

To select a source, press **SOURCE** repeatedly or the source selection buttons on the remote control.

Switch to standby mode

Press $\ensuremath{\mathfrak{O}}$ again to switch the unit to standby mode.

→ The clock (if set) appears on the display panel.

Store FM radio stations automatically

When the unit turns to FM tuner mode, and no radio stations are stored, [AUTO INSTALL - PRESS PLAY, STOP CANCEL] (to auto install, press ▶ III; to cancel, press ■) is displayed.

Press and hold ►II for 3 seconds to start full scan.

→ The unit automatically stores FM radio stations with sufficient signal strength and then broadcasts the first preset station.



• To exit storing mode, press \lozenge or \blacksquare .

4 Play

Play disc

- 1 Press ≜ to open the disc compartment.
- Insert a disc with the printed side facing up.
- 3 Press **≜** to close the disc compartment.
- 4 Press CD on the remote control to select the disc source.
 - → [Reading] (reading) blinks for a moment, then CD starts playing automatically. If not, press ▶■.

Play from USB



Note

- Make sure that the USB device contains playable audio content.
- 1 Insert the USB device into the ← socket.



- 2 Press **USB** on the remote control to select the USB source.
 - → The files play automatically. If not, press ►Ⅱ,

Play options

Pause/resume play

During play, press ►II to pause/resume play.

Repeat/shuffle play

- 1 During play, press REPEAT/SHUFFLE repeatedly to select:

 - ALB (for MP3/WMA only): play all tracks in this album repeatedly.
 - ALL: play all tracks repeatedly.
 - • play all tracks randomly.
- 2 To resume normal play, press REPEAT/ SHUFFLE repeatedly until the above icon disappears.

Skip to a track

For CD:

Press I◀◀ / ▶▶I to select another track. For MP3 disc and USB:

- 1 Press ▲ / ▼ to select an album or a folder.
- 2 Press | ◀ / ▶ I to select a track/file.



Tip

 To select a track directly, you can also press a key on the numerical keypad.

Search within a track

- 1 During play, press and hold I◀◀ / ▶▶I.
- 2 Release to resume normal play.

Program tracks

You can program a maximum of 20 tracks.

- 1 In CD/USB mode, press to stop playback, then press PROG to activate the programming mode.
 - → [PROG] (program) is displayed.
- 2 For MP3/WMA tracks, press ▲ / ▼ to select an album.
- 3 Press I ✓ / ►►I to select a track, then press PROG to confirm.
- **4** Repeat steps 2 to 3 to program more tracks.
- 5 Press ►II to play the programmed tracks.
 - → During play, [PROG] (program) is displayed.
 - To erase the program, when playback is stopped, press ■.

Adjust sound

During play, you can adjust volume and select sound effects.

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5 Listen to FM radio

Tune to FM radio stations



Note

- Position the antenna as far as possible from TV,VCR, or other radiation source.
- Ensure that you have connected and fully extended the supplied FM antenna.
- 1 Press **FM** to select FM tuner mode.
- Press and hold I◀ / ▶▶I for 3 seconds.
 - → [SEARCH] (search) is displayed.
 - → The unit tunes to an FM station with strong reception automatically.
- Repeat step 2 to tune to more stations. To tune to a weak station:

Press I◀◀ / ▶▶I repeatedly until you find optimal reception.

Program FM radio stations automatically



Note

 You can program a maximum of 20 preset FM radio stations.

In FM tuner mode, press and hold $\mbox{\bf PROG}$ for 3 seconds.

- → [AUTO] (auto) is displayed.
- → The unit stores all the FM radio stations automatically and then broadcasts the first preset radio station.

Program FM radio stations manually

- 1 In tuner mode, tune to an FM radio station.
- 2 Press PROG to activate programming mode.
 - → [PROG] (program) blinks.
- 3 Press ▲ / ▼ repeatedly to select a channel
- 4 Press PROG again to confirm.
- 5 Repeat steps 1-4 to store other FM stations.



Note

 To remove a pre-stored station, store another station in its place.

Select a preset radio station

In tuner mode, press \triangle / ∇ or the numeric buttons to select a preset number.

Show RDS information

RDS (Radio Data System) is a service that allows FM stations to show additional information. If you tune to an RDS station, an RDS icon is displayed.

- 1 Tune to an RDS station.
- 2 Press RDS repeatedly to scroll through the following information (if available):
 - → Program service
 - → Program type such as [NEWS] (news), [SPORT] (sport), [POP M] (pop music)...
 - → Radio text message
 - → Time

Select stereo/mono broadcast



- Stereo broadcast is the default setting for tuner mode. For stations with weak signals: to improve the reception, change to monaural sound.

In FM tuner mode, press ►II to switch between mono and stereo broadcast.

Other features

Set the alarm timer

This unit can be used as an alarm timer. You can select disc, FM tuner, or USB as alarm source.



- Make sure that you have set the clock correctly.
- In standby mode, press and hold TIMER until [SET TIMER] (set timer) scrolls on the display.
- 2 Press TIMER.
 - → [SELECT SOURCE] (select source) scrolls on the display.
- Press **SOURCE** repeatedly or the source selection buttons on the remote control to select a source: disc, FM tuner, or USB.
- Press **TIMER** to confirm.
 - → The hour digits blink.
- 5 Press **I**◀◀ / **▶▶**I repeatedly to set the hour.
- Press **TIMER** to confirm.
 - → The minute digits blink.
- Repeat steps 5-6 to set the minute.



Note

• If no button is pressed in 90 seconds, the unit exits timer setting mode automatically.

To activate or deactivate the alarm timer,

In standby mode, press TIMER repeatedly to activate or deactivate the alarm.

→ ⊕ appears when the timer is activated.

• If CD/USB source is selected, but no disc is inserted or no USB connected, the unit switches to the tuner source automatically

No power

No sound or poor sound

- Adjust the volume.

No response from the unit

 Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the unit again.

Remote control does not work

- Before you press any function button, first select the correct source with the remote control instead of the main unit.
- Reduce the distance between the remote control and the unit.
