

## Windshield Wipers and Washers\*

#### Windshield Wipers & Washers Controls:



Move lever Up/Down to change Wiper modes.


MIST: Single wipe **OFF:** Wiper off

**INT:** Intermittent wipe

**AUTO\*:** Auto Control function

LO: Slow wipe HI: Fast wipe

#### Rear Wiper & Washer Controls\*:



Rotate Rear Wiper Switch to change Wiper modes.

ON: Normal wipe


**INT\*:** Intermittent wipe

OFF: Wiper off

## **Steering Wheel Adjustment**

When adjusting the steering wheel in and out, the effort is reduced if the wheel is lifted upward when pulling out or pushing in.

## Front Seat Headrest Adjustment



To adjust headrest forward\*: Pull headrest forward at an angle to one of three positions.

To adjust headrest back\*: Pull headrest completely forward at an upward angle, then release.

# To raise headrest: Pull headrest up. To lower headrest: Press lock, then press the headrest down. **PRESS**

## Pair Your Phone via Bluetooth® Wireless Technology

NOTE: Vehicle MUST be in "P" or Park.

- On your Audio System, press the PHONE key, then press Connection on the display screen, followed by Add New
- 2 In the Bluetooth® menu of your phone, select Search for Bluetooth® Devices (or Find, Discovery, Connect. etc.). Select the name of your vehicle displayed on your phone, then press OK/Enter
- 3 On your phone, enter the 4-digit passkey associated with the vehicle name, and press Ok (or Send, Enter, Done, etc.) to complete the pairing

**NOTE:** This process may take a few minutes. Radio may play during the wait

NOTE: Some phones (i.e., iPhone, Android and Blackberry phones) may offer an option to allow acceptance of all future Bluetooth® connection requests by default

NOTE: Phonebook transfer will occur automatically at initial pairing. Wait until complete before placing a call

#### QUICK TIPS

#### Voice Recognition and Phone Contact Tips

The Kia Voice Recognition System may have difficulty understanding some accents or uncommon names. When using Voice Recognition to place a call, speak in a moderate tone, with clear pronunciation

To maximize the use of Voice Recognition, consider these guidelines when storing contacts:

- Do not store single-name entries (e.g., "Bob", "Mom", etc.), Instead, always use full names (including first and last names) for these contacts
- Do not use special characters (e.g., '@', '-', '\*', '&', etc.)
- Do not use abbreviations (i.e., use "Lieutenant" instead of "Lt.") or acronyms (i.e., use "County Finance Department" instead of "C. F. D."; Be sure to say the name exactly as it is entered in the contacts list

## Contacts Sync (Phonebook Download)

The Contacts Sync feature allows you to choose whether your phone contact list will transfer to your vehicle contacts each time your phone is connected or only at the initial phone pairing. To enable or disable Contacts Syncing:

- **1** Depending on the equipped options of your Audio/Navigation System, press the  $(i \diamondsuit)$  key or the [INFO / SETUP] key, as equipped, then Setup → Bluetooth → Contact Sync Settings
- 2 On the display screen, press Phone, Settings, Advanced Setup and Contacts Sync, then press On or **Off** to change the setting

#### **(1)** QUICK **TIPS**

- If Contact Sync is set to **ON**, contacts stored your phone will download each time your phone is connected. There may be a delay before the system is available to place a call.
- If Contact Sync is set to OFF, your phone contacts will download only at the initial pairing. This allows you to make calls without waiting for your phone contact list to download.

## **Using Steering Wheel Control Buttons**

These buttons on your steering wheel provide you with "hands free" control over your mobile phone equipped with Bluetooth® wireless technology, Audio System, and Digital Navigation System.

**NOTE:** Remember to always wait for the beep before speaking any commands



## **TALK Button**

(press to place a call with minimal vocal command prompts from the system)



#### Media Mode

Media mode includes a variety of modes, such as Audio CD, MP3 CD, USB Music, USB Image, iPod®, Bluetooth® Audio, Aux, and My Music

NOTE: Only MP3 and WMA files may be played or copied to My Music

- Insert your media (if not already inserted). Press the (MEDIA) key to display a list of media devices. Select the desired device by pressing its name on the display screen
- 2 To pause a track or song, press Pause (II) on the display. Press Play (▶) to resume playback

#### Copying Songs to My Music

Media Mode allows you to copy songs from MP3 CDs and USB Devices, and store them in My Music

- While the song is playing, press **Menu** on the display, then press **Copy**
- 2 Once copying is complete, you can listen to the copied music file in My Music by pressing the MEDIA key, then pressing My Music on the display

#### Listening to your iPod®

1 Connect an iPod® device or, if an iPod® device is already connected, repeatedly press the (MEDIA) key, then press iPod® on the display

**NOTE:** Use the iPod® cable that was supplied with your device

**NOTE:** Wait for the song catalog transfer to complete

2 To pause a track or song, press Pause (II) on the display. Press Play (▶) to resume playback

#### Manually Selecting iPod® Music

- 1 Turn the (FILE / TUNE) knob on the Audio System to scan through the music selections
- 2 When you find the desired file, press the (FILE / TUNE) knob to play the file

#### Selecting iPod® Music from a List

- Press LIST on the display screen, then press Category
- 2 Select the song you wish to play from the list

#### Listening to Music from your Bluetooth® Wireless Technology Device

- f not already done, pair your Bluetooth® wireless technology device to the Audio System
- 2 Press the MEDIA key, then select Bluetooth\* Audio by pressing it on the display screen
- Press the 
  Seek/Track 
  key to scroll through music files
- 4 To pause a track or song streaming from your Bluetooth® wireless technology device, press Pause (II) on the display. Press Play (>) to resume playback

## UVO eServices

#### **Setting up eServices**

- 1 On the Internet, visit MyUVO.com and create an account.
- 2 Using a compatible smartphone to access your App Store, download the free Kia UVO app
- 3 On your smartphone, open the Kia UVO app and enter your MyUVO log-in credentials
- 4 In your smartphone's settings, ensure that Location Services are enabled
- (5) If not already done, pair your *Bluetooth*® wireless technology smartphone to the system
- **6** Press the  $(i \stackrel{\leftarrow}{\otimes})$  key on the system, then press **Setup** on the display, then **UVO eServices**
- Press UVO eServices Activation, then press Activate to confirm

#### **Using Parking Minder**

- 1 After parking, and with the vehicle in Park (P), but before turning off the ignition, press eServices on your display screen, then select Parking Minder on the display
- 2 The Kia UVO app will register your vehicle's current parking location. When this is completed, press **OK**, then turn the ignition off
- 3 The Kia UVO app on your Smartphone will now help locate your parked Kia when required

## **Using Your Navigation System**

At start up of the Navigation System, a message will display to caution you against driving your vehicle while distracted. The first time you use your Navigation system, you may be directed to select the desired language for information displayed in your system

#### Retrieve Traffic Information:

Press the (>) symbol near the bottom of the display screen, then select Sirius Traffic.


NOTE: It may take the Navigation System a few minutes to retrieve information on traffic conditions

#### Set Destination:


- 1 Press the (DEST) key, then press Category on the display.
- 2 To enter a new destination, select Address. Enter (or select) the City Name, then the Street Number and Street Name
- 3 To confirm destination, select Set as Destination on the display screen

## **Climate Control System**

Climate Control System functions differ between systems and vehicles. Presented below are descriptions of the most common control functions:



Fan speed control switch/knob\*







## Automatic and Manual Defrosting / Defogging

**Defrost Outside Windshield:** 

Defog Inside Windshield: Select Defrost W Mode

● Select Defrost W Mode 2 Select Max Fan Speed **3** Set **Temperature** to **Hot** 

2 Select Max Fan Speed

Select a warm Temperature setting\*

\*If moisture appears on windshield, adjust **Temperature Control Knob** to a warmer temperature

#### **(I)** QUICK **TIPS**

- Keep inside glass as clean as possible to reduce window fogging
- Defrost W Mode activates A/C and opens Fresh Air Vent
- When Automatic Climate Control is set to Auto Operation, the A/C indicator will NOT illuminate. The fan speed, air intake, air flow and air conditioning may automatically engage at any time to reach desired temperature and reduce humidity
