Introduction To your Telstra Colombo Digital Cordless Phone with Integrated Answering Machine

- Phonebook lets you store up to 100 names and numbers for easy dialling.
- Calling Number Display* - lets you see who's calling. Your phone stores details of the last 10 callers in a Calls list.
- Hands-free facility allows you to talk to callers without holding the handset.
- Integrated Digital Answering Machine

* IMPORTANT You need to subscribe to Telstra's Calling Number Display service to be able to see the caller's number or name when called, or in the Missed and Received Calls logs. See page 41 for more details.

IMPORTANT This equipment requires electricity to work. You will not be able to make any telephone calls when the power fails. Alternative arrangements shouldbe made to access

emergency services in times of power failure.

Important safety instructions

When using your telephone equipment, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury, including the following:

- 1 Read and understand all the instructions.
- 2 Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.
- 3 Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- 4 Do not use this product near water (for example, near a bath tub, kitchen sink, swimming pool).
- 5 Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in the risk of fire or electric shock.
- 6 Unplug this product from the wall outlet

and contact TecHelp on 1300 369 193 under the following conditions:

- When the power supply cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
- If the product does not operate normally by following the operating instructions.
- If the product has been dropped and the outer casing has been damaged.

- 10 The use of other battery types or nonrechargeable batteries/primary cells can be dangerous. These may cause interference and/or unit damage. The manufacturer will not be held liable for damage arising from such noncompliance.
- 11 Use only the AC power adaptors supplied with this product. Please contact TecHelp on 1300 369 193 for replacement adaptors.

- 12 Please note the correct polarity while inserting the batteries.
- 13 Do not immerse batteries in water, do not place in fire.

Getting started

WARNING

Do not place your Telstra Colombo in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Location

You need to place your Telstra Colombo base within 2 metres of the mains power socket and telephone socket so that the cables will reach.

Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference. Your Telstra Colombo works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you locate the base. Putting it as high as possible ensures the best signal.

Handset range

The Telstra Colombo has a range of up to 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 50 metres. Thick stone walls can severely affect the range.

Signal strength

The Y icon on your handset indicates when you are in range. When out of range of the base, the screen shows SEARCHING, the Y icon flashes and the handset gives an out-of-range warning tone every minute. This tone is repeated until you move back into range. The handset will automatically reconnect - to the base when you move back in range. If you

move out of range during a call, the call will be terminated.

IMPORTANT

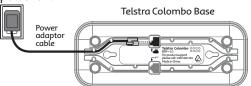
The base must be plugged into the mains power at all times. Do not connect the telephone line cord into the wall socket until the handset is fully charged. Only use the power and telephone cables supplied with the product.

Which power adaptor?

The power adaptor with a clear connector is for the base unit and the power adaptor with a red colour connector is for the charger unit (multi-packs only).

Connecting up the base

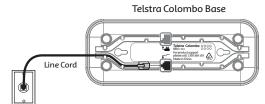
Plug the mains power cable with clear connector into the socket marked ______ on the underside of the base, plug the other end into the mains power wall socket and switch the power on.

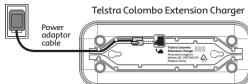
- Insert the 2 x AAA NiMH batteries supplied into the handset. Then slide the compartment cover into place.
- Place the handset on the base to charge for at least 24 hours. When the handset is fully charged the iii icon will indicate that it is fully charged.
- After 24 hours, plug the telephone line cord from the base into the telephone wall socket.



Connecting multipacks

If you have purchased a multiple pack, this process will need to be carried out for all handsets and chargers

1. Plug the mains power cable with the red connector into the socket marked in on the underside of the charger.

Battery low warning

If the iii icon flashes in the display, you will need to recharge the handset before you can use it again.

Battery performance

In ideal conditions, fully charged batteries should give about 10 hours talk time or 100 hours standby time on a single charge.

Note that new batteries do not reach full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days.

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a time.

Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out,

giving the handset less talk/standby time. Eventually they will need to be replaced. Batteries and handset may become warm during charging. This is normal.

Date and time

Providing you have subscribed to Telstra's Calling Number Display service, the date and time is set automatically for all handsets every time a call is received.

If you do not subscribe to Calling Number Display you can set the date and time manually.

Set date and time manually

- 1. Press and scroll using to CLOCK/
 ALARM. Press Display shows DATE &
 TIME, then press
- 2. Enter the date using the format DD-MM e.g. 04-08 for 4th August.
- 3. Press and enter the time using the 24 hour format HH-MM, e.q. 14-45 for 2.45pm.
- 4. Press to confirm or to return to standby.

Your Telstra Colombo is now ready for use.

Getting to know your phone



Overview of your handset

1. Earpiece

2. Menu/tick

Enter the main menu from standby mode. Select the function displayed on the handset screen.

3. Handset hook

Engages with base when wall mounting.

4. Navigation button UP

Enter the Calls List from standby mode. Scroll through menu options in on-screen menu. Increase the volume when on a call.

5. Talk/Recall

Answer an incoming call. Initiate an outgoing call. Access Recall whilst on a call.

6. Navigation button DOWN

Enter the Phonebook from standby mode. Scroll through menu options in on-screen menu. Decrease the volume when on a call.

7. Star button

Long press to lock and unlock keypad in standby mode.

8. Handsfree

Answer call in handsfree mode. Initiate an outgoing call in handsfree mode. Switch between normal and handsfree mode whilst on a call.

9. Microphone

10. Redial/X

Enter the Redial list from standby mode. Mutes the microphone during a call. Return to the previous menu level.

11. Hangup

End a call. Returns to standby mode from menu list. Long press in standby mode turns handset ON or OFF.

12. Keypad

13. Hash button

Long press to silence ring for incoming calls.

14. Int

For internal calls or call transfers with multi handset packs.

15. 1-key

Long press to auto dial Telstra MessageBank® or Telstra Home Messages 101®

16. 2-key

Long press to answer a Call Waiting call during a call

17.3-key

Long press to activate 3-Way Chat after initiating a second call

Handset display



Handset Battery Level

Displays the current power levels of your handset battery.

In Use

Displayed when the line is in use and flashes when there is an incoming call.

Misse

Missed Calls
Displayed when you have missed calls
and new number(s) in the Calls list.

C Phonebook

Displayed when you are viewing the phonebook list.

Answering machine

Messages 101®.

Displayed when the answering machine is on. Flashes slowly when you have new messages. Flashes quickly when the memory is full.

• Flashing Message Indicator (FMI)
Indicates new message on
MessageBank® or Telstra Home

Alarm

The alarm clock has been set.

Handsfree

Displayed when in handsfree mode.

Silent

Handset ringer is off/set to silent.

Signal

Steady when the handset is registered and within range of the base. Flashes when the handset is out of range or searching for base.

OK ok

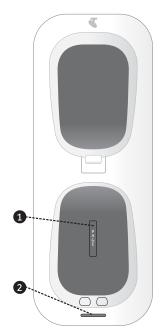
Press the key to select and confirm a setting or an option on screen.

▼▲ UP and Down

Press or to scroll through the options in a menu, to open the phonebook or calls list when in standby.

⊃ ► Back

Press Redail to go back to the previous menu option, to cancel an action or to delete a character.



Overview of the base

1. Page button

In standby, press to ring the handset(s). Press and *hold* to enter registration mode when registering handsets.

2. LED indicator

Flashes if you have received a new answering machine message.

Navigating the menu

The basic steps of navigating through the menu and onscreen options.

- 1. From the standby screen, press Press. The main menu is opened.
- 2. Use the or keys to scroll through the menu.
- 3. Soft key options OK and BACK are displayed.

 Press to select OK and open a submenu or validate an option.

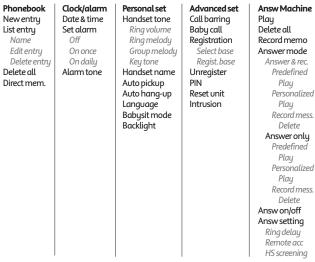
- 4. Press reduce to select BACK and go back to previous menu level, correct a character or cancel an action.
- 5. Press to return to standby.

If you do not press any button on the handset for 15 seconds the display will automatically return to standby.

It will also return to standby when the handset is placed on the base or charger.

Using the phone

To make a call

- 1. Press .
- 2. Dial the telephone number.

To make a call by pre-dialling

- 1. Enter the phone number (maximum 24 digits). If you make a mistake press Redial.
- 2. Press to dial the phone number entered.

To make a call by speed dial (keypad 1 to 9)

1. Press and hold a key from 1 to 9 until the number is displayed and dialled. If no number is stored, you hear a beep.

Call from the phonebook

- 1. Press . The first entry in the phonebook is displayed.
- 2. Scroll or to the entry you want.
- 3. Press to dial the number.

TIP Instead of scrolling to browse the phonebook entries, press the numeric key corresponding to the first letter of the entry you wish to locate. For example, pressing 2 will show the entries starting with A. Pressing 2 again will show the entries starting with B and so on.

Call from the calls list

NOTE You need to subscribe to Telstra's Calling Number Display service to be able to see the caller's number for received calls in the calls list. See page 41

1. Press to enter CALL LOG menu. You have the options to access CALL LIST or ANSWER MACHINE. Press to enter

Using the phone

CALL LIST. The first entry in the call list is displayed.

- 2. Scroll or to the entry you want.
- 3. Press to dial the number.

Answer a call

1. When the phone rings and flashes in the display, press or press to answer the call via the loudspeaker. When answering the handset from the base with 'Auto Pick up mode' set to ON, nothing needs to be pressed.

WARNING: When the phone is ringing, avoid holding the earpiece too close to your ear as it may damage your hearing. Handsfree activation can suddenly increase the volume in the earpiece to a very high level. Make sure the handset is not too close to your ear.

NOTE: If you have subscribed to Telstra's Calling Number Display service and assigned a VIP Group to the caller's number, the caller's details are displayed before the phone starts ringing. You can set your phone to give the default ringtone as soon as the call is received then once the caller's identity is displayed, the assigned ringtone will start.

TIP: If Auto Pick up mode is on, simply lift up the handset from its base to answer the call. The default setting is OFF. If Auto Pick up mode is set to OFF, you will need to press to answer a call.

NOTE: An incoming call has priority over other events. Whenever there is an incoming call, other operations in progress such as phone settings, menu navigation, etc. will be ended.

To adjust the volume

1. During a call, press or to adjust the earpiece or loudspeaker volume. - The volume level is shown in the handset display.

Using the phone

To mute the microphone

Mute the microphone so that you can talk to someone else in the room without your caller hearing you.

- 1. During a call, press redial. The microphone is muted.
- 2. Press again to turn the microphone back on.

To end a call

 Press . After you hang up, the duration of your call is displayed on the handset display for 5 seconds.

NOTE If auto hang-up is on, replace the handset on the base to end the call. The default setting is ON.

To switch handset on/off

- 1. Press and *hold* until the handset switches off.
- 2. Press and hold again to switch the

To call a second external number

Put an external caller on hold to make a second external call. You can then switch between both callers or hold a 3-Way Chat.

- 1. During your call, press . Scroll to INIT 2ND CALL.
- 2. Press. Menu Display shows CALLING R
- 3. Enter the second number.
- 4. When your second caller answers, press
 to open the option menu:
 CONFERENCE press rounding to initiate a 3-Way

Chat with the two external callers.

- SWITCH CALLS press to switch between the two callers.
- 5. Press to hang up both of the external calls during a 3-Way Chat.

Using multiple handsets

If you have purchased a multi-handset pack you are able to make internal calls, transfer external calls from one handset to another and use the conference option.

To call another handset: intercom

- 1. Press Int on the handset.
- If you have two handsets, the other handset is called automatically.
- If more than two handsets are registered to the base, their numbers are displayed, e.g. 2345*. Enter the number of the handset you want to call or press to ring all handsets.
- 2. Press **t** o hang up.

To transfer an external call to another handset

- 1. During an external call, press Int . Your caller is put on hold.
- 2. Enter the number of the handset you want to call or press to ring all handsets. If there are only two handsets, the other handset is called automatically.
- 3. When the other handset answers, announce the caller then press to transfer the call. If the other handset does not answer, press Int to talk to your caller again.

Using the phone

To switch between an internal and external call

- 1. During an external call, press Int . Your caller is put on hold.
- 2. Enter the number of the handset you want to call or press to ring all handsets. If there are only two handsets, the other handset is called automatically.
- 3. When the other handset answers you can speak privately to your internal caller.
- 4. Press Int to switch between both callers.
- 5. Press to hang up the external call and end the internal call.

To make a three way conference call

- 1. During an external call, press Int . Your caller is put on hold.
- 2. Enter the number of the handset you want to call or press to ring all handsets. If there are only two handsets, the other handset is called automatically.
- 3. When the other handset answers, announce the call then press and hold Int to connect both calls. If the other handset does not answer, press Int to talk to your caller again.
- 4. Press to hang up both of the external calls.

Personal settings

WARNING

When the phone is ringing, avoid holding the earpiece too close to your ear as it may damage your hearing.

To set the ring volume

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to PERSONAL SET and press Menu.
- 2. HANDSET TONE is displayed. Press
- 3. RING VOLUME is displayed. Press
- 4. Scroll or to adjust the ringer volume level. Choose from: Ringer Off, Low, Medium, High, Boost and Progressive (increasing ring volume). The default setting is High.
- 5. Press to save the settings.
- 6. Press **t** o return to standby.

To set the ring melody

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to PERSONAL SET and press Menu.



- 4. Press or to select the ringtone. Choose from 10 ringer melodies. A sample of the ringtone is played.
- 5. Press to confirm.
- 6. Press ____ to return to standby.

To set a group melody

To benefit from this feature, you must subscribe to Telstra Calling Number Display. This menu enables you to select and set the melodies to be played when there is an external incoming call from a contact whose name is stored in your phonebook and is part of a group. You can associate one ring melody

to each group. There are three phonebook groups (Group A, B, C) available for you to organize your contacts. Each group can be assigned a unique melody.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to PERSONAL SET and press Menu.
- 2. HANDSET TONE is displayed. Press and scroll to GROUP MELODY. Press her.
- 3. Scroll or to select: GROUP As B or C, then press or.
- 4. Press or to select the ringtone you want for the group and press ...
- 5. Press ____ to return to standby.

To set the key tones on/off

When you press a key on the handset you hear a beep. You can switch beeps on or off.

1. Press eroll to PERSONAL SET and press to PERSONAL SET and

- 2. HANDSET TONE is displayed. Press and scroll to KEY TONE. Press .
- 3. Scroll or to select ON or OFF.
- 4. Press to confirm.
- 5. Press ____ to return to standby.

To change the handset name

Personalise your handset, with a name or location for example *Peter* or *Bedroom*. Maximum 10 characters.

- 1. Press Meny, scroll to PERSONAL SET and press Meny.
- 2. Scroll to HANDSET NAME and press The current name is displayed.
- 3. Press to delete the current name.
- 4. Enter the name you want, maximum 10 characters and press to save.
- 5. Press **t** o return to standby.

To set auto pick up answer

With auto pick up switched on, you can answer a call just by lifting the handset off the base or charger. If switched off, you will have to press to answer a call. The default setting is OFF.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to PERSONAL SET and press Menu.
- 3. Scroll or or off.
- 4. Press to confirm.
- 5. Press ____ to return to standby.

To set auto hang up

With auto hang up switched on, you can end a call just by replacing the handset on the base or charger. If switched off, you have to press to hang up. The default setting is ON.

- 1. Press Meny, scroll to PERSONAL SET and press Meny.
- 2. Scroll to AUTO HANG UP. Press Mery.
- 3. Scroll or or off.
- 4. Press to confirm.
- 5. Press **t** o return to standby.

NOTE If auto hang up is set to OFF then placing the handset in the charge cradle whilst on a call will activate handsfree mode on the handset.

To set the display language

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to PERSONAL SET and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to LANGUAGE. Press Menu.
- 3. Scroll or to select the language you want.
- 4. Press to confirm.
- 5. Press **t** o return to standby.

Using the phone

To set babysit mode on

Leave one handset in a room and use another handset to hear sounds in that room.

- 1. Press , scroll to PERSONAL SET and press .
- 2. Scroll to BABYSIT MODE. Press
- 3. Press or to select ON or OFF.
- 4. Press to confirm.

When switched on, you can leave this handset in the room you wish to monitor.
Only the microphone is on. Anyone in the room cannot hear you.

- 5. Place that handset in the room.
- 6. At a second handset, press Int and enter the number of the handset you are using as a room monitor. You can now hear sounds coming from the room.

To stop room monitoring at any time, press .

To set the backlight on/off

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to PERSONAL SET and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to BACKLIGHT. Press Menu.
- 3. Press or to select ON or OFF.
- 4. Press to confirm.

To lock the keypad

Prevent accidental dialling while carrying the handset by locking the keypad.

- 1. Press and hold . The display shows KEYS LOCKED.
- 2. To unlock the handset, press and hold * again.

NOTE While the keypad is locked, you can answer incoming calls as normal.

Advanced settings

Call barring

This feature has been disabled in the Telstra Colombo. Turning this feature ON will not bar outgoing calls or affect the telephone functionality or your ability to make calls. It is highly recommended that you leave this feature switched OFF. If you wish to bar outgoing calls call Telstra on 13 2200 to make use of Telstra's network call barring feature.

NOTE If you switch Call barring on, BARR MODE ON will be displayed on your screen in standby mode however call barring will not be activated.

If you have turned on the Call Barring feature follow the instructions below to turn the feature off. It is important to note that turning this feature on will no effect as this feature has been disabled in the Telstra Colombo.

To switch call barring on/off

- 1. Press Menu, scroll to ADVANCED SET and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to CALL BARRING. Press
- 3. Enter the master PIN (default setting 0000) and press Menu.
- 4. MODE is displayed. Press Menu.
- 5. Press or to select ON or OFF. Press to confirm.
- 6. Press ____ to return to standby..

Using the phone

Registration

Your Telstra Colombo handsets are preregistered to the base. If however a handset loses its registration to the base you can reregister the handset as follows.

To register a handset

At the base:

1. Press and *hold* the m ♠ ➤ ▼ button on the base station for at least 3 seconds. You will then have 90 seconds in which to register a handset.

At the handset:

- 1. Press eroll to ADVANCED SET and press to ADVANCED.
- 2. Scroll to REGISTRATION and press were.
- 4. If necessary, scroll or to display REGIST. BASE and press

- 5. BASE 1 2 3 4 is displayed and the registered base number is flashing.
- 6. Enter the number of the base on which you wish to register your handset. If you have only 1 base station, press 1. If you have 2 base stations, press 1 or 2, etc.
- 7. When the display shows PIN----, enter the base PIN (Default is 0000).
- 8. When the handset registers with the base, it is assigned a handset number.

To select a base

You can register your Telstra Colombo handset with up to 4 bases. Once registered, you can switch between bases, for example, bases at home and at work.

1. Press Meny, scroll to ADVANCED SET and press Meny.

Using the phone

- 2. Scroll to REGISTRATION and press Very.
- 3. SELECT BASE is displayed. Press Menu. The available bases are displayed with the current base number flashing.
- 4. Enter the number of the base you want 1,2,3 or 4 and press When the base is found you hear a beep. If not found, the display shows UNREGISTERED.

To unregister a handset

Your Telstra Colombo answering machine records unanswered calls when it is activated. It can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of 12 minutes. Each message can be up to 3 minutes long. Your personal outgoing messages can be up to 1 minute long.

NOTE Your answering machine is designed to answer calls after 14 rings even when it is switched off. This is to enable you to operation the remote access functions of your answering machine in the event you answering machine is switched off.

To switch the answering machine on/off

Memory full

The memory is full if there is less than 15 seconds of recording time left or if the maximum total of 59 messages has been reached.

When the memory becomes full:

- The machine will automatically switch to Answer Only mode.

If the memory becomes full while a caller is leaving a message, they will hear a beep and the call is ended.

No display

No dial tone

- Check that the telephone line cord is plugged into the phone socket.

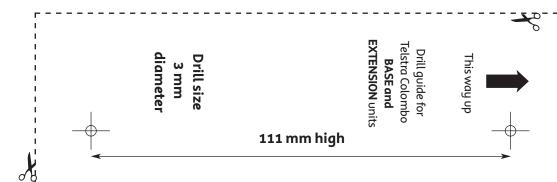

Your Telstra Colombo base unit (or extension handset charger if you have purchased one) can be wall mounted directly on to a wall.

- Use this template to drill 2 holes in your desired location. These holes should be made 25mm deep using a 3mm diameter drill.
- 2. Insert the wall plugs and insert a screw into each hole. Leave 3mm between the head of the screw and the wall.
- 3. Position the base unit or extension charger on to the screws and slide down to secure.

NOTE: Check and ensure before drilling that you will not be drilling into any hidden wiring or pipes.
