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Instruction Manual

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The SPACE FAN-ST provides high quality training for routine second trimester screening. This phantom contains a 23 week fetus with full anatomy placed in the uterus that can be scanned with 2D and 3D transducers. The oval shape phantom abdomen can be set in four different positions to enrich the training variation. Included life-size fetus model facilitates demonstration and three dimensional understanding.

* Ensure that the ultrasonic diagnostic equipment which you use is properly quality controlled.

Training Items:

Fetal size assessment: BPD, AD, AC and FLConfirmation of normal fetus situ Fetal anatomy assessment: head and brain, heart and lung, abdominal organs, spine and bones. Placental localization Evaluation of amniotic fluid volume

Anatomy

- Uterus: amniotic fluid, placenta, umbilical cord, and a 23 week fetus (26cm).
- Fetus: skeletal structure, brain with septum lucidum, heart with four chambers, lungs, spleen, kidneys, aorta, UV, UA, and the external genital.



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Training Items

Assessment of development and condition of fetus, amniotic fluid amount, abnormality, placenta position, presentation, position, fetal habitus, sexuality and so on. * compatible with 2D and 3D probes.

① Measurement of fetus (measuring at 3 points)

BPD: biparietal diameter - measures BPD using the transparent septum as landmarks .

AC: Abdominal circumference - measures AC using the stomach, abdominal aorta and umbilical vein as landmarks.

FL: Femur length - measures the total length of the bone.

Estimates the weight by measuring at 3 points to evaluate the development condition of the fetus.

(2) Measurement of amniotic fluid volume

Measures the maximum vertical depth of the amniotic fluid (the maximum amniotic fluid depth).

③ Assessment of head, breast, abdomen, spine and so on


- Assessment of the figures of bones of skull and assessment of the brain

DO s

Always attach the protection bowl in the cavity of the mother body torso.

Do not remove the hard plastic protection bowl. Ensure to use it on the torso when setting the phantom unit on. Putting the phantom on the torso directly without the bowl may lead to discoloring or deformation of the torso.

Handle with care

The materials for phantom and models are special composition of soft resin. Please handle with care at all times.

Cleaning and care

Please clean the phantom completely every time after you finish the training. The remaining lubricating gel may deteriorate the phantom.

Keep the training set at room temperature, away from heat, moisture and direct sunlight.

DON'Ts

Never wipe the phantom or models with thinner or organic solvent.

Don't mark on the phantom with pen or leaveprinted materials contacted on their surface.

Ink marks on the models will be irremovable.

Please note:

The color of the phantom may change over time, though, please be assured that this is not deterioration of the material and the ultrasonic features of the phantom stay unaffected.


This phantom has a thin layer of coating for protective purposes which may cause minor wrinkling. However, it has no effect on the ultrasound image.

① Set the phantom unit on the mother body torso in the desired direction. You can rotate the phantom to change the presentation and position of the fetus.




② Apply ultrasound gel on the phantom unit directly. Use plenty of gel.
