

## Installation

1. Unpack the box and check for the following items enclosed:
  - a. Main unit with hook switch and LCD
  - b. Handset
  - c. Handset cord
  - d. RJ45 Ethernet cable
  - e. D.C. Power Adapter (check with your vendor for this item may not be included)
2. Connect the handset to the base unit using the coiled handset cord provided
3. Connect one end of the Ethernet cable to the WAN port of the main unit, and the other end to the wall Ethernet outlet  
 The WAN port is next to the logo 
4. For your computer, connect its Ethernet cable to the LAN port of the main unit  
 The LAN port is next to the logo 

## Keypad Mapping

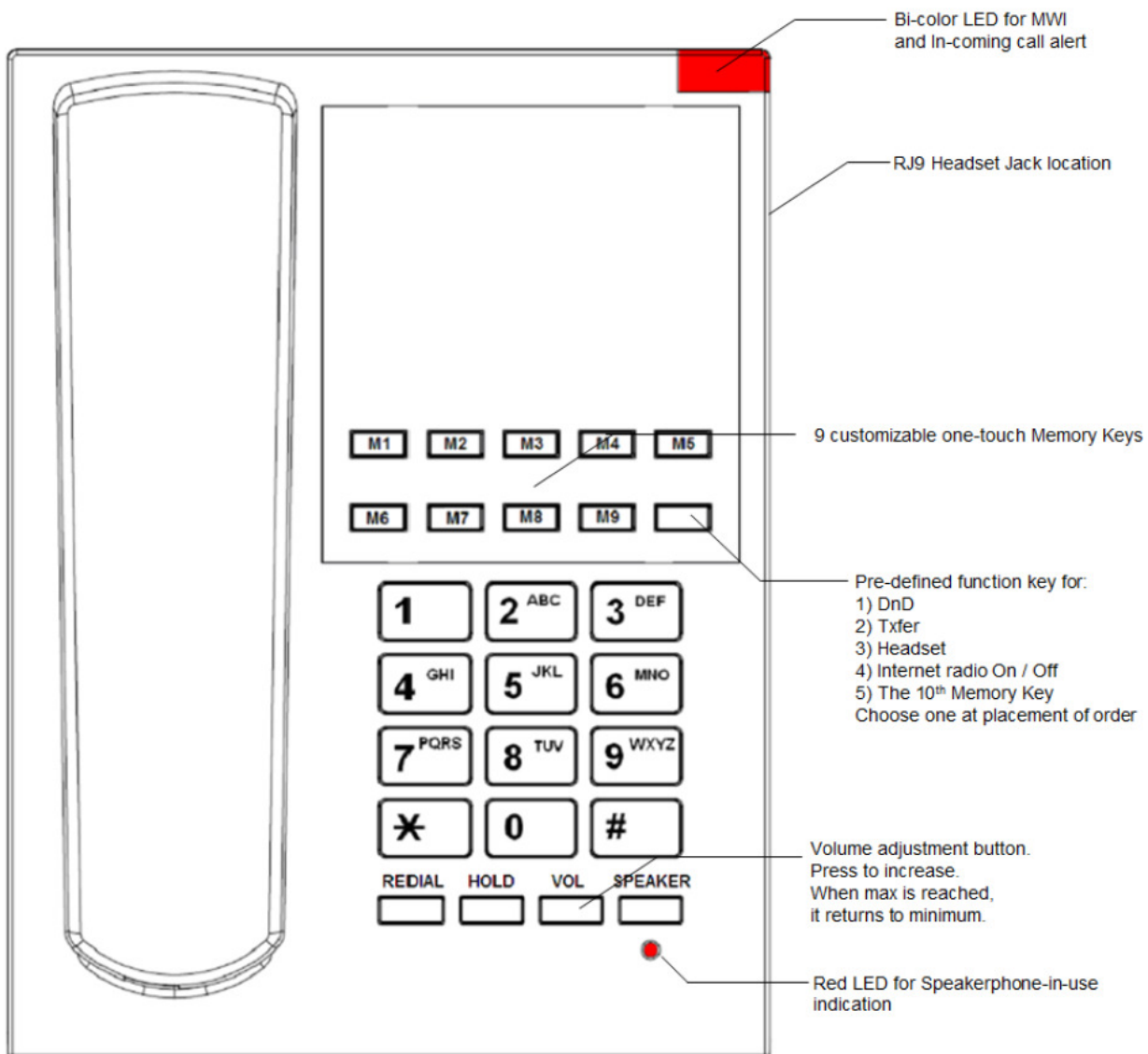


Figure 1 - PH656N Keypad & LED mapping

## Call Operation

### A. Initiating a Call

1. Lift the handset.
2. Listen to dial tone.
3. Press the desired number on the keypad and wait for 5 second or press “#” to dial out.
4. To end the call, place the handset back on the cradle in the base unit.

### B. Answering a Call

An incoming call to the phone.

An audible ringing sound to alert the user.

LED on the top right corner flashes.

1. Lift up the handset to answer the call.
2. To end the call, place the handset back on the cradle. The LED will turn off.

### C. Redial

There is no redial function on this model

### D. Speakerphone Volume

1. Press speakerphone button
  2. Press the Vol+ or Vol- button to increase or decrease the speakerphone volume
  3. Observe the volume bar shown on the LCD

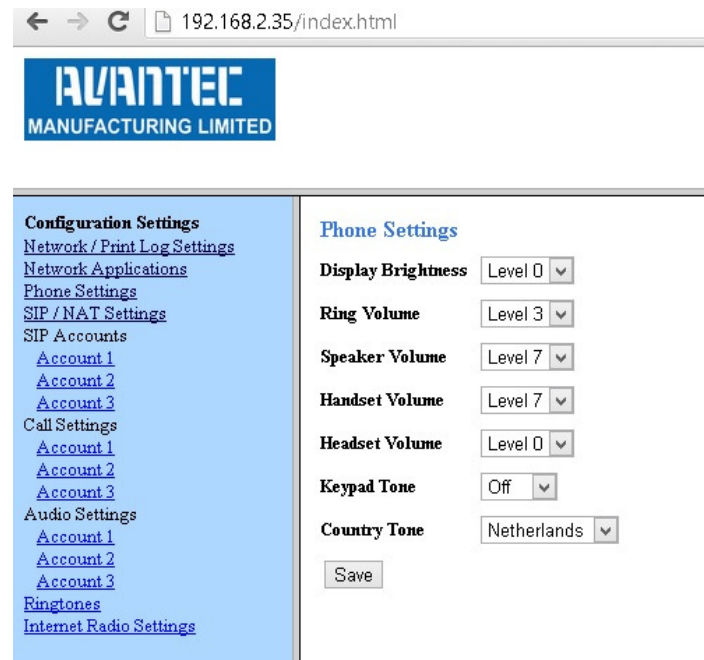


Figure 2 - Phone Settings Page on Web Portal

- Alternatively, go on to the Web Portal, go to Phone Settings page and adjust the volume settings (see Figure 2).

### E. Ringer Volume

1. In idle mode, press the Vol+ or Vol- button to increase or decrease the ringer volume
  2. Observe the volume bar shown on the LCD
- Alternatively, go on to the Web Portal, go to Phone Settings page and adjust the volume settings (see Figure 2).

## F. Call Flash

If the call is on LINE1,

1. During a conversation using the handset or the speakerphone, press LINE2 button
2. The previous conversation is automatically put on-hold.
3. Listen for dial-tone coming from the handset receiver or the speakerphone.
4. To place another call, simply press the desired number on the keypad and wait for 5 seconds or press "#" to dial out immediately.

If the call is on LINE2,

1. During a conversation using the handset or the speakerphone, press LINE1 button
2. The previous conversation is automatically put on-hold.
3. Listen for dial-tone coming from the handset receiver or the speakerphone.
4. To place another call, simply press the desired number on the keypad and wait for 5 seconds or press "#" to dial out immediately.

## G. Call Hold

If the call is on LINE1,

1. During a conversation using the handset or the speakerphone, press LINE1 button
2. The previous conversation is automatically put on-hold.

If the call is on LINE2,

1. During a conversation using the handset or the speakerphone, press LINE2 button
2. The previous conversation is automatically put on-hold.

Alternatively, press the 2<sup>nd</sup> softkey on the LCD to hold.

## H. Mute

1. During a conversation, press the MUTE button
2. The other end is not able to hear you but you can continue to hear from the other end.
3. To deactivate Mute, press the MUTE button again.

## I. Programmable Memory Button and Message (mailbox) Key

PH656N can have up to 10 programmable memory buttons. Contact your distributor for more info.

The standard cabinet has 1 programmable memory button labeled, "M1".

To activate, lift the handset and simply press it once. The number will be dialed out immediately.

To store a number for memory button and mailbox:

1. Access the Web Portal, go to the Configuration page
2. On the left panel, click on "SIP/NAT Settings" link
3. Fill in the entries for Memory key and Message key
4. Remember to press save at the bottom of the page when you are done

## J. Message Light LED (MWI)

When a voice message is received at the voicemail box, the MWI LED goes up

The mailbox access number can be programmed to the memory key. See Figure 3 above

## K. Call Waiting

1. During a conversation, when there is an incoming call, you will hear an alert tone. An alert message will also display on the LCD
2. Press the 1<sup>st</sup> softkey to answer the incoming call
3. The previous party is put on-hold automatically
4. To end the second call, place the handset back on the cradle
5. The LINE1 LED stays ON to remind users that the previous call is still on the line
6. To retrieve the previous call, press the 1<sup>st</sup> softkey (RSM)

## Web Portal


The Web Portal of PH656N can be accessed by Google Chrome, Internet Explorer and Mozilla Firefox.

### A. To Log in

Enter **http://< IP Address of the handset >** on the browser.

There are two levels of access: (1) "Adminstrator / Full access" and (2) "Users / Limited access" (see below).

The welcome page shows the hardware version and firmware date code of the model (see below).

#### (A.1) Users Access

When prompt for login, enter **"users"** for user name, **"1111"** for password.

Users have limited functions and controls over the behavior of the phones.

Firmware upgrade, SIP registry settings are not available to users.

#### (A.2) Adminstrator Access

When prompt for login, enter **"avantec"** for user name, **"admin"** for password.

Adminstrators enjoy full access to all configurations and actions important to phone settings.

Firmware upgrade, SIP registry settings are only available to administrators.

#### (A.3) Logout

When done, remember to logout completely.


Clear the cache / cookie of your web browser so that the previous login is not re-cycled by the next user.

## B. To set login password for Web Portal

There is no default password for first-time login.

It is recommended for administrators to set login name and password to enhance security.

1. Go to the Admin page.
2. On the left panel, find the "Set Password" link and press on it.
3. Enter username for login name
4. Enter password and re-enter for confirmation purpose
5. When the mask password box is checked, both password entries are masked. To un-mask, simply un-checked the mask password box.

## C. Network Settings

Administrators may choose to operate in either dynamic IP environment and static IP environment.

1. Go to Configuration page.
2. On the left panel, click on the "Network / Print Log Settings" link
3. After making changes, click save at the bottom of the page
4. A pop-up window appears, you may choose between "*back*" and "*restart*"
5. In order to have the changes take effect immediately, click "*restart*"
6. You can always perserve the changes and decide to restart the phone at a later time



## D. SIP Account Settings

Parameters for Session-initiation-protocol (SIP) such as registrar address, proxy address, port etc. can be found in the "SIP Accounts" section on the Configuration page.

1. Go to Configuration page
2. On the left panel, under "SIP Accounts", click on the "Account 1" link
3. Enter the SIP registration particulars for Account 1  
Note that you have the flexibility of registering to one server per account
4. When done, click **Save**
5. The changes take effect immediately
6. Proceed to complete the entries for Account 2 and Account 3

Parameters for Call settings for each account can be found under the title, "Call Settings", on the left panel.

Such parameters include:

- Call Forward Mode
- Call Waiting activation / deactivation
- DND activation / deactivation
- Auto-Answer activation / deactivation

Parameters for Audio settings for each account can be found under the title, "Audio Settings", on the left panel.

Such parameters include:

- DTMF mode (in-band / RFC2833 / SIP INFO)
- Audio Codec preference (PCMU / PCMA / G.722 / G.729 / iLBC)
- ToS
- Jitter

## E. Other Settings

One-touch memory key and mailbox number key can be found in the "SIP / NAT Settings" section. Also, administrators can set parameters for Network-Address-Traversal (NAT) if required by the network environment in which the phone is deployed.

1. Go to Configuration page
2. On the left panel, click on the "SIP / NAT Settings" link
3. Enter the memory key number, message key number and NAT entries
4. When done, click **Save**
5. The changes take effect immediately

## F. Internet Radio


This is a neat feature on PH656N. Simply preset your favorite music channels on the Web Portal and you can turn it on easily on the phone whenever you feel like some tunes

1. Go to Configuration page
2. On the left panel, click on the "Internet Radio Settings" link at the bottom of the panel
3. Enter the description and URL of your favorite music stations
4. When done, click Save
5. A pop-up window appears, you may choose between "*back*" and "*restart*"
6. In order to have the changes take effect immediately, click "*restart*"
7. You can always perserve the changes and decide to restart the phone at a later time

After the channels are preset properly, you may tune in:

1. When in idle mode, see that the speakerphone is not ON and the handset is on the cradle / rest
2. Press the Call Conference button to listen
3. You may have to wait for some seconds depending on the network traffic
4. To turn off, press the Call Conference button again

## G. Firmware Upgrade and User Configuration Backup / Restore

The firmware of the phone can be provisioned remotely.

Administrators can do so easily on the Web Portal.

Browsers that support this function include Internet Explorer and Mozilla Firefox.

1. Go to the "Admin" page
2. On the left panel, click on "Upgrade" link
3. Click on "Choose File" button and browse for **vmlinux**
4. Click Upload
5. A progress bar appears. There may be some seconds when it temporarily disappears.  
**Important: Do not unplug the power or Ethernet connection**
6. The whole progress takes approximately 55 seconds.
7. When complete, the browser brings you to a new page and shows a confirmation. See Figure 11.
8. The phone power-cycles itself and comes back to run in the new firmware

If the upgrade fails, disconnect the base from the Ethernet and re-connect it in order to trigger a power-cycle. Redo the firmware upgrade procedure.

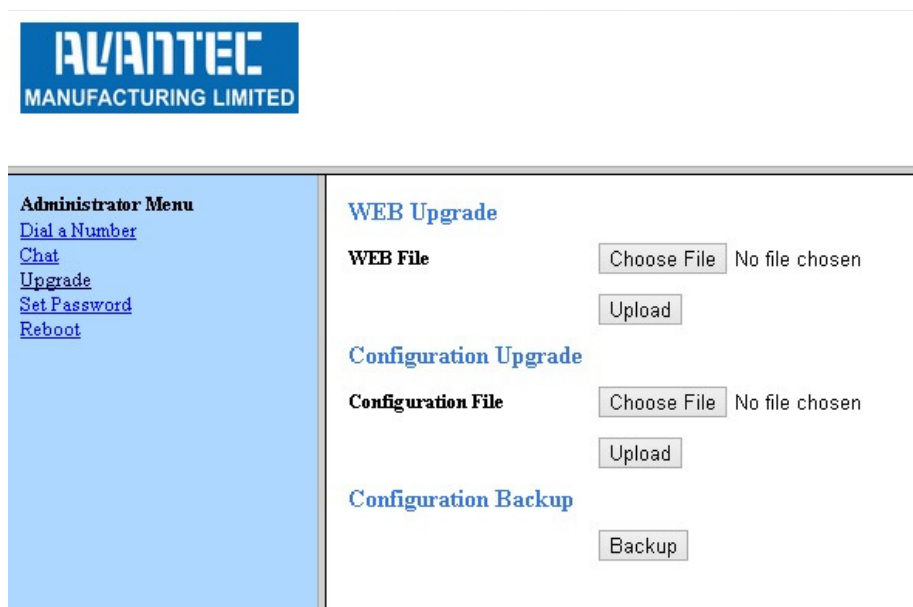


Figure 10 - Firmware upgrade, User Configuration Backup / Restore on Web Portal

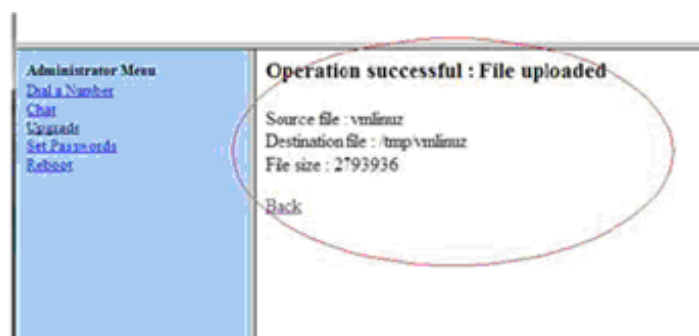


Figure 11 - Firmware upgrade confirmation
