#### Drive safely at all times

Do not use a hand-held phone while driving. Park your vehicle first.

#### Switch off the phone when refuelling

Do not use the phone at a refuelling point (service station) or near fuels or chemicals.

#### Switch off in an aircraft

Wireless phones can cause interference. Using them in an aircraft is both illegal and dangerous.

# Switch off the phone near all medical equipment

Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external radio frequency energy. Follow any regulations or rules in force.

#### Interference

All wireless phones may be subject to interference, which could affect their performance.

#### Be aware of special regulations



Silent profile

You can activate the Silent profile to avoid disturbing other people. In Idle mode, press and hold [#].

- Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <OK>.
- 4. Enter the new password again and press <**OK**>.

## SIM card switching

Your phone supports the Dual SIM cards mode, enabling you to use two SIM cards at the same time without changing them. Activate SIM cards and select the primary SIM card.

- 1. In Idle mode, press [ 🗄 ].
- 2. Scroll to the SIM card you want to use and select **Enable** or **Primary**.
- 3. Press <**Options**> and select **Save**.

If you change the primary SIM card, the phone automatically turns off and back on.

## Use an optional memory card

Important memory card information

- Frequent erasing and writing will shorten a card's lifespan.
- Do not remove a card from the phone or turn off the phone while data is being accessed or transferred. This could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Do not subject cards to strong shocks.
- Do not touch card terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.
- Keep cards away from small children or pets.

 Do not expose cards in a place subject to electrostatic discharge and/ or electrical noise.

#### Insert a memory card

- 1. Remove the battery cover and the battery.
- 2. Unlock the card cover and lift it.
- 3. Insert the card into the card slot, with the label side face up.



- 4. Close the card cover and lock it.
- 5. Attach the battery and the battery cover.

#### Remove the memory card

- 1. Remove the battery cover and the battery, then open the card cover.
- 2. Remove the card from the slot.
- 3. Attach the battery and the battery cover.

## Make or answer calls

Make a call

1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and phone number.

If necessary, press  $[\square]$  to select a SIM card.

- Press [~].
   Press [Volume] to adjust the volume.
- 3. Press [ 🐨 ] to end the call.

#### Answer a call

 When the phone rings, open the phone. If the phone is already open, press [
].


2. Press [ 🐨 ] to end the call.

Use the speakerphone feature

During a call, press [**OK**] and then <**Yes**> to activate the speaker. Press [**OK**] again to switch back to the earpiece.

Make a multi-party call  During a call, call the second participant. The first call is put on hold.

- 2. Press < Options > and select Join.
- 3. Repeat step 1 and 2 to add more participants.
- 4. During a multi-party call:
  - Press < Options > and select Split to have a private conversation with one participant.
  - Press < Options > and select Remove to drop one participant.
- 5. Press [ 5] to end the multi-party call.



## Use the camera

#### Take a photo

- 1. Open the phone.
- 2. In Idle mode, press and hold [回] to turn on the camera.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any desired adjustments.
- Press [OK] or [1] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- Press < Back > to take another photo.

View a photo

- In Idle mode, press
   <Menu> and select My
   files → Images → My
   photos.
- 2. Select the photo you want.

Record a video

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [) to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press [1] to switch to Record mode.
- Press [OK] or [@] to start recording.
- Press < □> or [1] to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.
- 5. Press <**Back**> to record another video.

#### View a video

- In Idle mode, press
   <Menu> and select My
   files → Videos → My video
   clips.
- 2. Select the video you want.

## **Play music**

#### Prepare music files

Use these methods:

- Download from the wireless web.
- Download from a PC using the optional Samsung PC Studio. See Samsung PC Studio User's Guide.
- · Receive via Bluetooth.
- Copy to a memory card. See the next section.

Copy music files to a memory card

- 1. Insert a memory card into the phone.
- In Idle mode, press
   <Menu> and select
   Settings → Phone settings
   → PC connections → Mass storage.
- 3. Connect your phone and PC with an optional PC data cable.
- 4. Select **Open folder to view files** when a pop-up window appears on your PC.
- 5. Copy files from the PC to the memory card.
- 6. When you have finished, disconnect the phone from the PC.

## Step outside the phone

Create a playlist

- 1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> and select Music.
- Press < Options> and select Add music from → a memory location.
- 3. Press [**OK**] to select the files you want.
- 4. Press <**Options**> and select **Add**.

Play music files

- From the music player screen, press [OK].
- 2. During playback, use the following keys:
  - **OK**: pause or resume playback.

- Left: return to the previous file. Press and hold to scan backward in a file.
- Right: skip to the next file. Press and hold to scan forward in a file.
- Up: open the playlist.
- Volume: adjust the volume.
- 3. Press [Down] to stop playback.

## Listen to the FM radio

Listen to the radio

- 1. Plug the connecter of the supplied headset into the multi-function jack on the phone.
- 2. In Idle mode, press <Menu> and select FM radio.
- 3. Press [**OK**] to turn on the radio.
- When you turn on the FM radio for the first time, press < Yes> to start automatic tuning. Available radio stations are automatically saved.

5. Press [Left] or [Right] to find the radio station you want.

Alternatively, press [Up] or [Down] to select a stored radio station.

6. Press [**OK**] to turn off the radio.

Store radio stations

#### By automatic tuning:

- 1. From the radio screen, press <**Options**> and select **Self-tuning**.
- Press < Yes > to confirm. Available radio stations are automatically saved.

## Step outside the phone

#### By manual setup:

- 1. From the radio screen, press [Left] or [Right] to find the radio station you want.
- Press < Options > and select Add to Favourites.

## Browse the web

Launch the web browser

In Idle mode, press [**OK**]. The homepage of your service provider opens.

## Navigate the web

- To scroll through browser items, press [Up] or [Down].
- To select an item, press [OK].
- To return to the previous page, press <Back> or [C].
- To return to the homepage, press and hold [C].
- To access browser options, press < Options >.

## **Use Phonebook**

#### Add a contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <**Options**>.
- 2. Select **Save**  $\rightarrow$  a memory location  $\rightarrow$  **New**.
- 3. For **Phone**, select a number type.
- 4. Specify contact information.
- 5. Press [**OK**] to save the contact.

#### Find a contact

- 1. In Idle mode, press <
  Contacts>.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want.

- 3. Select a contact.
- Scroll to a number and press [~] to dial, or press [OK] to edit contact information.

## Send messages

- Send a text message
- In Idle mode, press

   <Menu> and select
   Messages → Create new
   message → Text
   message.
- 2. Enter the message text.
- 3. Press <**Options**> and select **Send only** or **Save and send**.

## Step outside the phone

- 4. Enter destination numbers. If necessary, press [囹] to select a SIM card.
- 5. Press [**OK**] to send the message.

Send a multimedia message

- In Idle mode, press
   <Menu> and select

   Messages → Create new
   message → Multimedia
   message.
- 2. Select Subject.
- 3. Enter the message subject and press [**OK**].
- 4. Select **I mage or video** and add an image or a video clip.

- 5. Select **Music or sound** and add a music or a sound clip.
- 6. Select Text.
- 7. Enter the message text and press [**OK**].
- 8. Press < Options > and select Send.
- 9. Enter destination numbers or email addresses.
- 10.Press [**OK**] to send the message.

Send an email

- In Idle mode, press
   <Menu> and select

   Messages → Create new
   message → Email.
- 2. Select Subject.

- 3. Enter the email subject and press [**OK**].
- 4. Select Message.
- 5. Enter the email text and press [**OK**].
- 6. Select File attach.
- 7. Add image, video, sound, music, or document files.
- 8. Press <**Options**> and select **Send**.
- 9. Enter email addresses.
- 10.Press [**OK**] to send the email.

## **View messages**

View a text message

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> and select Messages → My messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a text message.

View a multimedia message

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> and select Messages → My messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a multimedia message.

## Step outside the phone

#### View an email

- In Idle mode, press
   <Menu> and select
   Messages → My
   messages → Email inbox.
- 2. Select Check new mail.
- 3. Select an email or a header.
- If you selected a header, press < Options > and select Retrieve to view the body of the email.

## **Use Bluetooth**

Your phone is equipped with Bluetooth technology, enabling you to connect the phone wirelessly to other Bluetooth devices and exchange data with them, talk hands-free, or control the phone remotely.

## Turn on Bluetooth

- In Idle mode, press
   <Menu> and select
   Applications → Bluetooth
   → Activation → On.
- Select My phone's visibility → On to allow other devices to locate your phone.

Search for and pair with a Bluetooth device

- In Idle mode, press

   <Menu> and select
   Applications → Bluetooth
   My devices → Search
   new device.
- 2. Select a device.

 Enter a Bluetooth PIN or the other device's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and press <**OK**>.

When the owner of the other device enters the same code, pairing is complete.

- Send data
- Access an application, such as Phonebook, My files, Calendar, Memo or Task.
- 2. Select an item.
- Press < Options > and select Send via or Send namecard via → Bluetooth.

- For sending a contact, select which data you want to send.
- 5. Search for and select a device.
- If necessary, enter the Bluetooth PIN and press <OK>.
- Receive data
- If necessary, enter a Bluetooth PIN and press <**OK**>.

 Press < Yes > to confirm that you are willing to receive.

This section provides brief explanations of menu functions on your phone.

## Call log

Menu	Description
Recent contacts, Missed calls, Dialled calls, Received calls	Check the most recent calls dialled, received, or missed.
Delete all	Delete all of the records in each call type.
Call manager → Call time	Check the time record for calls made and received.

Menu	Description
Call manager → Call costs	Check the cost of your calls, if supported by your SIM card.
Call manager → Reject list	Make a list of the phone numbers of callers to reject.

#### Phonebook

Search for contact information stored in Contacts.

## Music

Listen to music. You can also make your own music playlists.

## Browser

Menu	Description
Home	Connect your phone to the network and load the homepage of the wireless web service provider.
Bookmarks	Save URL addresses in order to quickly access web pages.
Enter URL	Enter a URL address and access the associated web page.
Clear cache	Clear the cache, which is a temporary memory site that stores recently accessed web pages.

Menu	Description
Profile settings	Select a connection profile to be used for accessing the wireless web.
Current profile	Select a connection profile to be used for accessing the wireless web.

## Messages

Menu	Description
Create new message	Create and send text, multimedia, or email messages.
My messages	Access messages that you have received, sent, or that have failed during sending.

Menu	Description
Templates	Make and use templates of frequently used messages or passages.
Delete all	Delete messages in each message folder all at once.
Settings	Set up various options for using the messaging services.
SOS messages	Specify options for sending and receiving an SOS message. You can send an SOS message by pressing [Volume] 4 times when the phone is closed and the exposed keys are locked.

Menu	Description
Broadcast messages	Change the settings for receiving broadcast messages.
Memory status	Check information about the memory currently in use.

Menu	Description
Images, Videos, Sounds, Music, Other files	Access media files and other files stored in the phone's memory.

Keep track of your schedule.

Use the camera embedded in your phone to take photos and record videos.

#### FM radio

Listen to music or news via the FM radio on your phone.

Image stamp	Make an outline stamp of a photo and merge it with another photo.

Memo	Make memos for things that are important and manage them.
Task	Make a list of tasks you need to complete.
World clock	Set your local time zone and find out the current time in another part of the world.

Timer	Set a period of time for the phone to count down.

#### SAR certification information

This phone meets European Union (EU) requirements concerning exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed the limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy, as recommended by the EU Council. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines were developed by independent scientific organisations through the periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The limits include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit recommended by the EU Council is 2.0 W/kg.<sup>1</sup>

The highest SAR value for this model phone was 0.219 W/kg.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station, the lower the power output of the phone.

Before a new model phone is available for sale to the public, compliance with the European R&TTE Directive must be shown. This directive includes as one of its essential requirements the protection of the health and safety of the user and any other person.

The SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 2.0 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of body tissue. The limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements. The SAR values may vary, depending on national reporting requirements and the network band.

#### Precautions when using batteries

- Never use a charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- · Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- If you use the phone near the network's base station, it uses less power. Talk and standby time are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the service provider.
- Battery charging time depends on the remaining battery charge, the type of battery, and the charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out.
   When the operation time is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.
- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time.
- Use only Samsung-approved batteries, and recharge your battery only with Samsung-approved chargers. Disconnect the charger from the power source when it is not in use.

Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for more than a week, since overcharging may shorten its life.

- Extreme temperatures will affect the charging capacity of your battery: it may require cooling or warming first.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places because the capacity and lifetime of the battery will be reduced. Try to keep the battery at room temperature. A phone with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily, even when the battery is fully charged. Li-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below 0° C (32° F).
- Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental shortcircuiting can occur when a metallic object like a coin, clip or pen causes a direct connection between the + and – terminals of the battery (metal strips on the battery). For example, do not carry a spare battery in a pocket or bag where the battery may contact metal objects. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the object causing the short-circuiting.

 Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Always recycle. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.

#### Road safety

Your wireless phone gives you the powerful ability to communicate by voice, almost anywhere, anytime. But an important responsibility accompanies the benefits of wireless phones, one that every user must uphold.

When you are driving a car, driving is your first responsibility. When using your wireless phone while driving, follow local regulations in the country or region you are in.

#### **Operating environment**

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in the area you are in, and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger.

When connecting the phone or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products. As with other mobile radio transmitting equipment, users are advised that for the satisfactory operation of the equipment and for the safety of personnel, it is recommended that the equipment should only be used in the normal operating position (held to your ear with the antenna pointing over your shoulder).

#### **Electronic devices**

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

#### Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm (6 inches) be maintained between a wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, switch off your phone immediately.

#### Hearing aids

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may wish to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

#### Other medical devices

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy.

Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Switch off your phone in health care facilities when regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so.

#### Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle.

You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

#### Posted facilities

Switch off your phone in any facility where posted notices require you to do so.

#### Potentially explosive environments

Switch off your phone when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Users are advised to switch off the phone while at a refuelling point (service station). Users are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants, or where blasting operations are in progress.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often but not always clearly marked. They include the areas below decks on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas, such as propane or butane, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust or metal powders, and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

#### **Emergency calls**

This phone, like any wireless phone, operates using radio signals, wireless, and landline networks as well as user-programmed functions, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you should never rely solely on any wireless phone for essential communications like medical emergencies.

To make or receive calls, the phone must be switched on and in a service area with adequate signal strength. Emergency calls may not be possible on all wireless phone networks or when certain network services and/ or phone features are in use. Check with local service providers.

To make an emergency call:

- 1. Switch on the phone.
- 2. Key in the emergency number for your present location. Emergency numbers vary by location.
- 3. Press [**n**].

Certain features like Call Barring may need to be deactivated before you can make an emergency call. Consult this document and your local cellular service provider.

#### Other important safety information

- Only qualified personnel should service the phone or install the phone in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.
- Check regularly that all wireless phone equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.
- For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment could result in serious injury if the air bag inflates.
- Switch off your phone before boarding an aircraft. It is dangerous and illegal to use wireless phones in an aircraft because they can interfere with the operation of the aircraft.

 Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of telephone services to the offender, or legal action, or both.

#### Care and maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years.

- Keep your phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children and pets. They may accidentally damage these things or choke on small parts.
- Keep the phone dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that corrode electronic circuits.
- Do not use the phone with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the phone.

- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas, as its moving parts may be damaged.
- Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone warms up to its normal operating temperature, moisture can form inside the phone, which may damage the phone's electronic circuit boards.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the phone. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the phone. Wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Do not paint the phone. Paint can clog the device's moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Do not put the phone in or on heating devices, such as a microwave oven, stove, or radiator. The phone may explode when overheated.

- When the phone or battery gets wet, the label indicating water damage inside the phone changes colour. In this case, phone repairs are no longer guaranteed by the manufacturer's warranty, even if the warranty for your phone has not expired.
- If your phone has a flash or light, do not use it too close to the eyes of people or animals. This may cause damage to their eyes.
- Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorised antennas or modified accessories may damage the phone and violate regulations governing radio devices.
- If the phone, battery, charger, or any accessory is not working properly, take it to your nearest qualified service facility. The personnel there will assist you, and if necessary, arrange for service.
