


Assemble and prepare your device

Before you can use your device, you must install the SIM or USIM card, install the battery, and charge the battery. Installing a SIM or USIM card is optional, but may be required to fully utilize some applications and store media files.

Insert the SIM or USIM card and battery



1 Remove the battery cover.



Insert the SIM or USIM card.



Insert the SIM or USIM card with the gold-coloured contacts facing the device.



3 Insert the battery.



4 Replace the battery cover.

Charge battery



- Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the top of the device.
- 2 Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the device.
- 3 Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.

- 4 When charging is finished, unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5 Remove the travel adapter from the device.



Although a charger cable is connected:

- The battery may not charge in some situations to protect the device.
- The battery level may remain low if the device is using a large amount of power.


Insert a memory card (optional)

By inserting a memory card, you can store multimedia files and messages or back up your important information. Your device accepts microSDTM or microSDHCTM, memory cards up to 32 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Only format the memory card on the phone.





- Unlock the memory card holder.
- 3 Lift the memory card holder and insert a memory card, as shown.



4 Close the memory card holder.



5 Lock the memory card holder.

6 Replace the battery cover.

Attach a hand strap (optional)



- Remove the battery cover.
- Slide a hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.
- 3 Replace the battery cover.

Turn on your device for first time

- Press and hold [to turn on your device.
- 2 Follow the on-screen instructions. Your device will automatically connect to the cellular network.

Activate Sleep mode

You can activate Sleep mode to save power when you do not use your device.

To activate Sleep mode, press the Lock key. Your device will turn off the screen. To deactivate Sleep mode, press the Lock key again.

Lock external keys and touch screen

You can lock the external keys and the touch screen to prevent any unwanted device operations from accidentally pressing any of the keys and the screen.

To lock the keys and the screen, press and hold the Lock key. To unlock, press and hold the Lock key again, or tap and hold the lock icon.

Use the touch screen

You can perform the following actions on your device's touch screen:



For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your device.

- Tap: Touch the screen once to select commands or launch applications.
- Tap-and-hold: Tap and hold an item to see a list of available actions.
 Tap the action you want to perform on the pop-up menu.
- Drag: Tap-and-hold a scroll bar or text and then drag it to move the bar or select text



If your device does not respond accurately to your screen taps, realign your touch screen. To realign the screen, tap Start > Settings > Basic Settings tab > General Settings > Align Screen > Align screen.

Use the Cube launcher

The Cube launcher key provides quick access to some applications.

Press and hold the Cube launcher key to open the Cube launcher.

- Select the shortcut you want to use by rotating the cube to the appropriate side.
- 3 Tap the icon to launch the application.

Disable wireless functions

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- 2 On the My Menu screen, tap Settings.
- 3 On the Basic Settings tab, tap General Settings > Wireless Manager.

- 4 Tap next to Phone.
 - Your device will show ▼x on the Today screen.

To enable wireless functions, repeat steps 1-4 above.

Reset the device



If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is still responsive but a program is frozen, close the program via Task Switcher. ▶ p. 32

If your device is frozen and unresponsive, remove the battery cover and use a small object, such as a toothpick, to press the reset button.

Customize your device

Learn to change themes and background images, add or remove items, and adjust the system volume from the Today screen.

Change your theme or background image

- 1 Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Settings.
- 3 On the Basic Settings tab, tap Display and Light.
- 4 Tap Theme or Wallpaper and select the desired option to customize the display.
- 5 Tap Yes or No (if necessary).
- 6 When you are finished, tap Done.

Add or remove items on the Today screen

Tap Start or press the Menu key.

- 2 On the My Menu screen, tap Settings.
- 3 On the Basic Settings tab, tap Display and Light.
- 4 Tap Items on Today.
- 5 Tap the check boxes next to each item to add or remove items.
 - Some items are not compatible with Samsung widgets. If you choose to add Samsung WidgetPlus, the only other items that will work simultaneously are Windows Live and Windows Live Search.
- Tap Done.

Adjust the system volume

To adjust the system volume, press the Volume key up or down. To set the device to vibrate, press and hold the Volume key down. To deactivate the vibrate feature, press and hold the Volume key down again.

Activate Etiquette pause

You can temporarily pause the media player or mute event alarms by placing the device face down when Etiquette pause is activated. To activate Etiquette pause:

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Settings.
- 3 On the Basic Settings tab, tap Motion Settings > Etiquette.
- 4 Tap next to Enable etiquette pause.
- 5 Tap Done.

Use Widgets

Use widgets on the Today screen. Widgets are user friendly shortcuts to commonly used applications allowing you to customize the Today screen.

Open the toolbar

Tap the arrow at the bottom left of the Today screen to open the toolbar. You can rearrange widgets on the toolbar or drag them to the Today screen.

Drag the widgets to the Today screen

- 1 Tap the arrow at the bottom left of the Today screen to open the widget toolbar.
- 2 Drag a widget from the toolbar to the Today screen. You can position the widget anywhere on the screen.

Customize widgets

- Tap the arrow at the bottom left of the Today screen to open the widget toolbar.
- 2 Tap at the top of the toolbar.
- 3 Tap the check boxes next to items that you want to appear on the widget toolbar.
- 4 When you are finished, tap **Done**.

Work with applications

Learn to open applications or folders and switch between open applications.

Open applications or folders

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- To open an application, tap the application icon.

Open folders

- Tap **Start** or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Others > My Files.
- 3 To locate My Files, scroll right in My Menu screen to move to Multimedia screen.
- 4 To open a folder, tap My Files and navigate to the desired folder.

Organize applications

- Press the Menu key and tap Edit.
 - Tap to move an application to Others.
 - Tap to move an application from Others to the current screen. Tap checkbox of the application to move and tap ok.
 - · Scroll left or right to move to one of Menu mode screens.

- · Tap an application icon and drag it to the location you want.
- 2 Tap Save.

Switch applications

Your device allows you to multi-task by running multiple applications at the same time.

To switch from one active application to another,

- Press and hold the Menu key.
 - Task Switcher shows thumbnail images of all open programs.
- 2 Tap a thumbnail to switch to the corresponding application.

Close applications

To send the current application to the background, tap **X** or **OK**.

To close an application,

- Press and hold the Menu key.
- 2 Tap End.
- 3 Tap X of the application you want to end.

If you tap , scroll left or right to display an application, and tap End to close it.

Access the Windows Mobile Help system

To access the help system of your device, deactivate Samsung TouchWiz UI. To deactivate Samsung TouchWiz UI,

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Settings.
 - The My Menu screen only appears after tapping Start when you enable Samsung TouchWiz UI.
- 3 On the Basic Settings tab, tap General Settings > Samsung TouchWiz UI.
- 4 Tap next to Enable Samsung TouchWiz UI.
- 5 Tap Done.
- Open an application and tap ②, if shown.
 - The embedded Windows Mobile Help system appears.

Enter text

When you need to enter text, tap the default input panel icon () at the bottom of the screen. Tap the arrow next to the icon and select one of the following input methods for entering text:

- Block Recognizer
- Keyboard
- Letter Recognizer
- Samsung Keypad
- Transcriber


You can tap the input panel icon at any time to show or hide the input panel.

You can also use the virtual QWERTY keyboard if you are creating a text, multimedia, or email message. Rotate the device anti-clockwise to the landscape orientation.

Enter text with Block Recognizer

Write individual letters and numbers in the writing area in the Palm Graffiti style.

- In a text entry application, tap the input panel icon.
- 2 Tap the arrow next to the input panel icon and select **Block Recognizer**.



- Write each character in the writing area at the bottom of the screen:
 - Write letters on the left side of the writing area.
 - Write numbers on the right side of the writing area.



Drag your finger upward to change the case (ABC, Abc, or abc). Tap once on the screen to enter symbols (123 or abc will change to the icon). Drag your finger leftward to delete the last letter. To view demonstrations of how to enter characters, refer to the embedded help system.







- Write upper-case letters in the ABC column on the left side of the writing area.
- Write lower-case letters in the abc column in the middle of the writing area.
- Write numbers and symbols in the 123 column on the right side of the writing area.
- To view demonstrations of how to write characters, refer to the embedded help system.





Enter text with Samsung Keypad

- In a text entry application, tap the input panel icon.
- 2 Tap the arrow next to the input panel icon and select Samsung Keypad.
- 3 Tap characters to enter your text:
 - To enter the text in T9 mode, tap MODE to turn on xt9. Tap the appropriate keys to enter an entire word.
 - To enter the text in ABC mode, tap MODE to turn off xt9. Tap the appropriate key to enter a character.
 - · To enter symbols, tap SYM.
 - To enter numbers, tap 123.
 - To change the keypad style, tap and hold MODE, select a style and tap Done.

Enter text with Transcriber

With Transcriber, you can write anywhere on the screen. Unlike Letter Recognizer or Block Recognizer, you can use cursive (joined-up) handwriting to write complete words.



- In a text entry application, tap the input panel icon.
- 2 Tap the arrow next to the input panel icon and select **Transcriber**.
- *3* Write legibly anywhere on the screen.
- Pause and allow Transcriber to convert your writing to text.

- Tap characters to enter your text:
 - To enter the text in T9 mode, tap **xt9** to turn it on. Tap the appropriate keys to enter an entire word.
 - To enter the text in ABC mode, tap xt9 to turn it off. Tap the appropriate key to enter a character.
 - To enter numbers and symbols, tap **SYM**.
 - Rotate the device anti-clockwise to the landscape orientation.

Communication

Work with contacts

Learn to use contact cards and groups to store personal information, such as names, phone numbers, and addresses.

Create a new Outlook or SIM contact card

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Phonebook > New > Save to outlook or Save to SIM.
- 3 Enter contact information.
- When you are finished entering information, tap Done to save the contact card.

Search for a contact card

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Phonebook.
- *3* Tap **Q**.
- Tap a few letters of the contact's name.
 - As you enter letters, the screen will show contacts that match your input.
- 5 Tap a contact to open it.

Copy or move contact cards

To copy or move contact cards from your device's memory to a SIM or USIM card and vice versa,

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Phonebook.
- 3 To copy contacts, tap Menu > Copy > a copy option. Refer to step 5.

- 4 To move contacts, tap Menu > Move > a move option.
- 5 Tap the check boxes next to the contacts that you want to copy or move.
- 6 Tap Done.

Organize your contacts into categories

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Phonebook.
- 3 Tap a contact in the device's memory.
- 4 Tap Edit.
- 5 Scroll down and tap the categories field.
- 6 Tap the check boxes next to the desired categories.
- 7 Tap Done.
- 8 Tap Done to save the contact card.

Assign a speed dial number to a contact card

To assign a speed dial number to one of your contacts,

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Phonebook.
- *3* Tap **⚠**.
- 4 Tap New and select a contact.
- 5 Select the contact's phone number to use for speed dialing.
- Select a speed dial location.

Assign a photo to a contact card

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Phonebook.
- 3 Tap a contact in the device's memory.
- 4 Tap Edit.
- 5 Tap the photo icon at the top left of the contact card.
- Take a new photo or select a photo.
- 7 Tap Done twice to save the contact card.

Assign a ringtone to a contact card

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- On the My Menu screen, tap Phonebook.
- 3 Tap a contact in the device's memory.
- 4 Tap Edit.
- 5 Scroll down and tap Add field.
- 6 Scroll down and tap the ringtone field.
- 7 Select a ringtone.
- 8 Tap Done.
- 9 Tap Done twice to save the contact card.

Calling

Learn to make and receive calls, reject calls, and adjust the call volume.

Make a call

- 1 Press [-].
- 2 Enter an area code and phone number.
- 3 Tap \bigcirc or press $[\frown]$.
 - For a video call, tap Menu > Video Call.
- To end the call, press [].

Make a call from Phonebook

- Tap Start or press the Menu key.
- 2 On the My Menu screen, tap Phonebook.
- 3 Tap a contact.
- 4 Tap a number.

Answer a call

- *1* Press [**一**].
- 2 For a video call, tap Show me to allow the caller to see you via the front camera lens.
- 3 To end the call, press [].

Reject a call

Press []. When you reject a call, the caller will hear a busy tone.

Adjust the call volume

Troubleshooting

If you have trouble with your device, try these procedures before you contact a service professional.

When you turn on your device, the following messages may appear:

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
The SIM card is missing.	Ensure that the SIM or USIM card is installed correctly.
Enter PIN.	When using the device for the first time or when the PIN requirement feature is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM or USIM card. To disable the PIN requirement feature, tap Start or the Menu key and on the My Menu screen, tap Settings > Basic Settings tab > Security > SIM PIN, and then tap next to Require PIN when phone is used.
SIM card blocked.	Your SIM or USIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

Your device does not show a signal (no bars next to the network icon)

- If you just turned on the device, wait about 2 minutes for your device to find the network and receive a signal.
- You may not be able to receive a signal in tunnels or elevators. Move to an open area.
- You may be between service areas. You should receive a signal when you enter a service area.

You forgot a security code, PIN, or PUK

If you forget or lose this or another code, contact the seller or your service provider.

Your display shows white lines

The display may show white lines if you have turned the device on after a long period of disuse or if you removed the battery without first turning off the device. The display should correct itself in a short time.

You enter a number, but the call is not dialled

- Ensure that you have pressed [—].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled

Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact information.

Re-enter and save the number (if necessary).

Another caller cannot hear you speaking

- Ensure that you are not blocking the built-in microphone.
- · Move the built-in microphone closer to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

The sound quality of a call is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the internal antenna and the Bluetooth antenna. The internal antenna and the Bluetooth antenna are located at the bottom of the device.
- When you are in areas with weak signals, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

The battery does not charge properly or sometimes your device turns itself off while charging

- Disconnect the device from the charger, remove and reinstall the battery, and try charging again.
- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean and soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery no longer charges completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.

 If you are using the PC data cable to charge the battery, install ActiveSync on your computer first.

Your device is hot to the touch

When you use several applications at once, your device requires more power and may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

Your device cannot connect to the internet

- Ensure that you have entered valid settings for your internet service provider.
- Ensure that you have activated the wireless connection to your mobile service provider and that the signal is not obstructed.
- Ensure that you have entered the correct user name and password.

You cannot find a Bluetooth-enabled device

- Ensure that both devices have activated the Bluetooth wireless feature.
- Ensure that the distance between the devices is not more than 10 metres and that they are not separated by walls or other obstacles.
- Ensure that the settings for each device allow them to be visible to other devices.
- Ensure that both devices are compatible with Bluetooth wireless technology.
- Ensure that the correct PIN has been entered on both devices.

You cannot listen to music on a remote Bluetooth headset

- · Ensure that your device is connected to the headset.
- Ensure that the music format you are trying to listen to is supported by the headset.
- Ensure that the distance between the headset and device is not more than 10 metres and that they are not separated by walls or other obstacles.

Health and Safety Information

Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

Knowing Radio Frequency Safety

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below. In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than

120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines for operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a dealer store or call Customer Support for service.

For the best care of your phone, only authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

Failure to follow the instructions outlined may lead to serious personal injury and possible property damage.

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- · Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and re-dial.
- · When available, use a hands-free device.
- · Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road
- Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.



Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the

plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives. Turn off your phone when you are in an area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it is rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. These areas include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- · Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.



Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Restricting Children's Access to your Phone

The display on your handset is made of glass or acrylic and could break if your handset is dropped or if it receives significant impact. Do not use if screen is broken or cracked as this could cause injury to you.

Caring for the Battery

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Samsung approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.

- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable
 performance. When used correctly, the battery can be recharged hundreds of
 times before it needs replacing.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:
 - Less than one month:
 - -4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C)
 - More than one month:
 - -4° F to 113° F (-20° C to 45° C)
