

If TEAC determines that the product is not repairable on site, TEAC can complete the repair by taking the product to a TEAC Authorised Service Centre.


#### Carry-in Service





Although the LCD screen is made with high-precision technology and 99.99% or more of the pixels are effective, black dots may appear or bright points of light (red, blue, or green) may appear constantly on the LCD screen. This is a property of the LCD screen and is not a malfunction.

Disconnect the power cord from the power source during a thunderstorm.





Watching the LED TV in 4:3 format for a long period of time may leave traces of borders displayed on the left, right and centre of the screen caused by the difference of light emission on the screen. Playing a DVD or a game console may cause a similar effect to the screen. Damages caused by the above effect are not covered by the Warranty. Displaying still images from Video games and PC for longer than a certain period of time may produce partial after-images. To prevent this effect, reduce the 'brightness' and 'contrast' when displaying still images.

## 2. TV PLACEMENT SETUP

#### 2.1 Accessories

The appearance of the components may look different from the following figures.



#### 2.2 TV Stand/Wall Mounting Assembly

This TV comes ready to be set up with the provided TV stand. Alternatively, opt to mount the TV on the wall by obtaining a wall mount bracket and mounting eyebolts/screws (thread size M4 x 10) from your local hardware store. For best results, we recommend that wall mounting should be performed by a professional installer.

#### **(i)** NOTE:


- The TV should be levelled or angled directly at the viewer's eye.
- Allow a space of 10cm around the TV to reduce risk of overheating.
- The TV stand allows sideways turning of the TV to a limited degree. Do not force it to turn more than it can as you will damage the stand.

#### 

- Make sure the TV is completely disconnected and unplugged from power.
- To prevent damage to the TV screen, avoid touching or pressing on the screen with hands or objects at any time. Do not press on the front panel as it may damage the screen.
- To protect the TV from damage or scratching, only place the TV on a soft, flat surface like a table covered with a cotton towel or foam mat.
- Assembly, lifting and moving of the TV must be done by at least 2 people to prevent unit damage or physical injury from accidents.
- Ensure that all screws are tight and secure after assembly, so that the stand or mounting bracket is stable enough to prevent the TV from falling and causing personal injury or property damage.
- Make sure that the TV is not knocked or pulled down from its position.
   Prevent children and pets from playing with or climbing on the TV. If the TV falls, it may cause personal injury or property damage.
- If the TV stand or wall mounting bracket is damaged, do not use it to support the TV. Contact your dealer immediately.

#### **TV Stand Installation/Removal**


- **1.** Place the unit face down on a soft surface.
- 2. Gently position the glass base to the leg at the bottom of the TV.
- **3.** Fasten the 4 provided screws (screw size B4x16F) to secure the stand to the TV according to the diagram.
- **4.** To remove the stand, reverse the steps above.



#### Fall Prevention

To prevent the TV from tilting forward and falling over to cause damage or injury, please secure the TV to your table or wall using screws or eyebolts and strong cord (not provided). An example on fixing the TV to a table is shown below

- 1. Install a wood screw or eyebolt into the table that is supporting the TV.
- 2. Fix a machine screw into a screw hole near the base in the back of the TV.
- 3. Tie the wood screw or eyebolt to the machine screw with a strong cord.



Alternatively, secure the TV to the wall directly behind it by fixing eyebolts to the wall and tying them to screws fixed on the centre of the TV back panel.




## 2. TV PLACEMENT SETUP

#### Wall Mounting

- 1. Ensure that the selected wall is made of appropriate material and can support the weight of the TV. Make sure there are no pipes or cables inside the wall on your chosen position.
- **2.** Obtain a suitable wall mounting bracket and mounting eyebolts (thread size M4x10) and screws from your local hardware store.
- **3.** Place the unit face down on a soft surface.
- **4.** Remove the attached leg at the bottom of the TV by removing the 5 screws on the leg cover.
- **5.** Refit the cover securely by replacing the 5 screws into their original positions.




- **6.** Fasten 4 eyebolts into the four screw holes on the TV's rear panel according to the diagram.
- 7. Fasten the wall mounting bracket using screws onto the wall.
- 8. Connect the eyebolts and the wall bracket securely with strong rope
- **9.** Carefully check that all fastenings are secure before releasing the TV.



- Make sure that the TV is completely disconnected and unplugged from power before making or changing cable connections.
- Make sure that the power output from your power source matches the power input labelled on the TV adapter.

## 4. INITIAL SETUP & INPUT SOURCES

#### 4.1 Initial Power On

When the TV is turned on the first time out of the box or after a factory settings reset, it will prompt you to run auto channel tuning.

- **1.** Connect the TV to your antenna wall socket using a coaxial TV cable.
- 2. After making sure all connections are secure, plug in the power cord and turn on AC power.
- **3.** Press () on the remote control to turn on the TV.
- **4.** The TV will initialise and prompt you to choose between Home Mode and Shop Mode. Home Mode is recommended for optimal energy saving. Choose with
  - **( )** ▲ **-** and press  $\Theta$  to proceed.
- **5.** Next, a tuning menu will display. Adjust the settings with → → and press <sup>OK</sup> to start tuning.
- **6.** After tuning is complete, the TV will display programmes from detected channels.

(i) **NOTE:** If no channels are detected, please check the connection and condition of your external antenna.

#### 4.2 Selecting an Input Source

To play different media types and from any connected external device, change input sources to activate the desired connection.

- **1.** Press ( **I** Press (
- **2.** Press  $\checkmark$  to choose an input source.
- **3.** Press  $\overset{()}{\otimes}$  to confirm.

DTV, USB and HDMI can also be accessed using the shortcut buttons (DTV/USB) and (HDMI).

This TV starts in DTV mode by default when it is switched on for the first time. Subsequently, it will start in the most recently selected input mode.



## 5. REMOTE CONTROL

The remote control uses Infrared signals. Point it at the Infrared sensor at the front of the TV.

The OSD menu system acts as the Main Menu and allows access to main feature controls as well as optional user settings.



#### **Favourite Channels**

- **1.** Use  $\land \checkmark \land \lor$  to highlight a desired channel.
- 2. Press DCLEAR to mark it as a Favourite Channel. This channel will now be listed in the Favourite Channel List.

## 8. DIGITAL VIDEO RECORDING (DVR)

- USB devices such as mobile phones, MP3 players and cameras do NOT support file recording.
- Recorded file sizes depend on the broadcast content, up to several GB per hour.

For best recording and playback results, we recommend using a USB storage device with:

- A. Data storage capacity up to 1.5TB
- B. Maximum disk partition size 400GB
- C. An external power supply
- D. Maximum USB extension cable length 50cm.

#### Selecting a Disk Drive and Checking Compatibility

Select a desired USB storage device for recording if multiple devices are connected. Then check if the connected USB storage device is compatible and ready for recording.

- **1.** Select a disk drive using the Select Disk option.
- **2.** Select Check DVR File System in the DVR File System Menu and press  $^{(N)}$ .
- **3.** One of the following messages will appear: 'SUCCESS' for a compatible device and 'FAIL' for an incompatible device.

#### (i) NOTE:

- This TV will always use the first partition (C:\) for recording purposes. If your hard disk contains more than one partition, please use the first partition for recording purposes.

Formatting will ensure that the USB storage device is in the FAT32 file system and that there is enough storage space available for recording programs.

#### Time Shift Size

After the USB storage device is formatted into the FAT32 file system, Time Shift cannot be altered. During 'DVR File System Check', the display will show that the whole storage device space will be used for Time Shift. However, Instant and Scheduled Recording will still have priority over available storage space.

#### 8.2 Instant Recording



- 3. Turn on 3D Mode by pressing (3D). The default 3D Type is Side by Side. Adjust the 3D Type setting if necessary to match the 3D video format. If the 3D picture layers look reversed or otherwise incorrect, adjust the Exchange 3D L/R setting.
- 4. Press (3D) again to close the 3D Setup Menu.

#### (i) NOTE:

- If you have eyesight conditions like short-sightedness and astigmatism, please put on your corrective lenses before using the 3D glasses.
- Maintain a distance of at least 2 times the screen width or 3 times the screen height.
- Maintain a position where your eyes are on the same level as the TV screen and looking straight at the screen.

#### 9.2 3D Glasses

Use the provided 3D Glasses when watching 3D TV. Please use your corrective lenses together with the 3D Glasses to watch 3D TV. The 3D Glasses do not have eyesight correcting properties by themselves.

#### 

- Please use the 3D Glasses only when watching 3D TV. Do not move around while wearing the 3D Glasses as they may alter your sense of sight, balance and distance, leading to possible physical injury or property damage.
- After watching 3D TV, remove the 3D Glasses and from possible disorientation due to the change balance and distance before moving around

- **1.** Connect the USB storage device to the USB port on the back panel of the TV.
- **2.** If the USB storage device uses its own power supply, make sure it is turned on.
- **3.** When the device is detected, it will be listed in the Multimedia Menu. The TV may take a while to read the data, depending on the device's storage size and content.

Press OTVUSE or And switch to the USB input source. When in USB Input Mode, the USB Menu will be shown. Browse and play files using specific menus for different file types.



- 1. In the USB Menu, press → to choose the desired multimedia type: Photo for images, Music for audio, Movie for videos, and Text for text files.
- 2. Use ▲ in the list to select the device you wish to play from, and press <sup>OK</sup>. Choose the 'Return' icon to return to the main USB
- **4.** Press **I** to start playing the current highlighted file. Normal playback controls such as Pause, Fast Forward and Fast Rewind are available.
- **5.** Press  $\bigcirc$  or ok during Photo and Movie file playback to display a control bar for more playback controls.

(i) **NOTE:** Depending on the file content, some files may not play even if they are in a supported format.

#### Making a Playlist

- **1.** While browsing files, follow the on-screen hints for button controls. Add a file to a playlist by pressing <sup>(K)</sup> on a highlighted file and checking its checkbox. Repeat this action on other files to add them to the playlist.
- **2.** Remove individual files from the playlist by unmarking the checkboxes with  $^{OK}$ .
- **3.** Alternatively, press BookMark to select or unselect all files in the folder.
- **4.** Press **b** to start playing the highlighted file.

#### Photo Playback

- **1.** In the USB Menu, choose Photo Playback with  $\bullet$  and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Add image files to a playlist by following on-screen hints for button controls.
- **3.** Press **I** to view in full screen. Press **O** to see the Photo Playback control bar.
- **4.** Press  $\bullet$  and  $\overset{\bigcirc}{}$  to use the buttons on the bar.


- **1.** In the USB Menu, choose Music Playback with  $\bullet$  and press  $\overline{OK}$ .
- **2.** Add music files to a playlist by following on-screen hints for button controls.
- **3.** Press to start playback. Press and <sup>OK</sup> to use the Music Playback control bar.



Control	Description
Repeat	Select between Repeat All, Repeat One, Repeat None.
Go To	Jump to a specific time in the track by keying in the format HH:MM:SS
Playlist	Press A to navigate into the current playlist. Use A - and K to choose a specific image. Press DIGEST to remove a highlighted file from the list, or EXIT TO remove all files. Press to return to the control panel.
Screen Mute	Press to turn off the screen while continuing to play music.

#### Text Display

- **1.** In the USB Menu, choose Text Playback with  $\bullet$  and press  $\overline{OK}$ .
- **2.** Add text files (.txt) to a playlist by following on-screen hints for button controls.
- **3.** Press I to display text files in full screen. Press and K to use the Text Playback control bar.

#### Movie Playback

- **1.** In the USB Menu, choose Movie Playback with  $\bullet$  and press  $\overline{OK}$ .
- 2. Add movie files to a playlist by following on-screen hints for button controls.
- **3.** Press I to start playback. Press O to see the Movie Playback control bar.
- **4.** Press  $\bullet$  and  $\overset{\bigcirc}{\ltimes}$  to use the buttons on the bar.



#### (i) NOTE:

If playback is stopped, the track position is remembered and playback will resume from there.

Repeat	Select between Repeat All, Repeat One, Repeat None.
A-B	Press once to set Point A, and again to set Point B for looping playback. Press again to resume normal playback.
Playlist	Press $\checkmark$ to navigate into the current playlist. Use $\checkmark \checkmark$ and $\bigcirc K$ to choose a specific image. Press $\bigcirc$ to remove a highlighted file from the list, or $\bigcirc K$ to remove all files. Press $\bigcirc$ to return to the control panel.
Info	Display detailed video information.
Slow Fwd	Use the on-screen b button to toggle slow motion playback at different speeds. To resume normal playback, press
Step Fwd	Use the on-screen ▶ button to step forward within the track in small time increments.
GOTO	Key in a specific point to jump to using the HH:MM:SS format.

#### **Musical Photo/Text Slideshow**

Play music while viewing images or text.

- **1.** In the USB Menu, choose Music Playback with  $\bullet$  and press  $\overline{OK}$ .
- **2.** Add music files to a playlist by pressing  $\bigcirc \aleph$  on a highlighted file. For details on adding files to playlists, please see the Making a Playlist section.
- **3.** After the music playlist is done, press <sup>(C)</sup> to return to the USB Menu.
- **4.** Choose Photo or Text Playback with  $\bullet$  and press  $\Theta$ .
- 5. Add the desired image/text files to a playlist.
- **6.** Press to start displaying the images/text.
- **7.** Press  $\bigcirc$  to display the on-screen control bar.
- 8. Start simultaneous music playback by choosing the Music button in the control bar.

Please do not use functions not mentioned in this user manual. If a problem occurs with your TV, please refer to the table below. If the problem persists, please turn the TV off and consult the TEAC Customer Service Hotline.

Problem	Action
No picture	Is the power plugged in? Insert the power plug.
The picture appears too slowly after the power is turned on	Like your computer, the TV runs diagnostic and software checks before it can display broadcast channels. The picture should appear in approximately 15 seconds.
Picture is too bright or too dark.	Adjust picture brightness or contrast settings.
Picture is too large or too small.	Adjust the aspect settings.
Picture shakes.and stripes appear	Keep appliances that emit magnetic radiation away from the TV.
Picture does not move	Press the PAUSE button. Check if playback is on Pause through any other equipment.
