# **Assembling**

# **Unpack**

Check your product box for the following items:

- Mobile device
- Battery
- Quick start guide



# Install the SIM or USIM card and battery


When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services. To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

- If the device is on, press and hold the Power key and select **Power off**  $\rightarrow$  **OK** to turn it off.
- 2 Remove the back cover.




- Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the back cover.
- 3 Insert the SIM or USIM card with the gold-coloured contacts facing downwards.




The antenna is located in the upper area on the back of the device. Do not remove the protective tape covering the antenna, as this can damage the antenna.

4 Insert the battery.



5 Replace the back cover.



# Charge the battery

Before using the device for the first time, you must charge the battery.

You can charge the device with a travel adapter or by connecting the device to a PC with a USB cable.




Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unapproved chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.



- When your battery is low, the device will emit a warning tone and display a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty. If the battery level becomes too low, the device will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your device
- If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even with the travel adapter connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

# Charge with a travel adapter

Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



Connecting the travel adapter improperly may cause serious damage to the device. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

2 Plug the large end of the travel adapter into an electrical socket.



- You can use the device while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- If the device receives an unstable power supply while charging, the touch screen may not function. If this happens, unplug the travel adapter from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.
- If your device is not charging properly, take your device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- 3 When the battery is fully charged, first unplug the travel adapter from the device and then from the electrical socket.
- Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing so may cause damage to the device.
- To save energy, unplug the travel adapter when not in use. The travel adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the travel adapter from the electrical socket to interrupt the power supply. The travel adapter should remain close to the socket when in use.

# > Charge with a USB cable

Before charging, ensure that your PC is turned on.

Plug one end (micro-USB) of the USB cable into the multifunction jack.

Plug the other end of the USB cable into a USB port on a PC.



Depending on the type of USB cable you are using, it may take some time before charging begins.

3 When the battery is fully charged, first unplug the USB cable from the device and then unplug it from the PC.

# Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your device accepts microSD<sup>™</sup> or microSDHC<sup>™</sup> memory cards with maximum capacities of 32 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).




Samsung uses approved industry standards for memory cards, but some brands may not be fully compatible with your device. Using an incompatible memory card may damage your device or the memory card and can corrupt data stored on the card.



- Your device supports only the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your device will ask you to reformat the memory card.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of your memory cards.
- When you insert a memory card into your device, the memory card's file directory will appear in the external\_sd folder under the internal memory.

- Remove the back cover and battery.
- Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing downwards.



- 3 Push the memory card into the memory card slot until it locks in place.
- 4 Replace the battery and back cover.

# Remove the memory card

Before removing a memory card, first unmount it for safe removal.

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Storage
   → Unmount SD card → OK.
- 2 Remove the back cover and battery.
- 3 Push the memory card gently until it disengages from the device.
- 4 Remove the memory card.
- 5 Replace the battery and back cover.

# Format the memory card

Formatting your memory card on a PC may cause incompatibilities with your device. Format the memory card only on the device.

In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Storage**  $\rightarrow$ Unmount SD card → OK → Format SD card → Format SD  $card \rightarrow Erase everything.$ 



Before formatting the memory card, remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on your device. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover loss of data resulting from user actions.

# Turn your device on and off

To turn on your device, press and hold the Power key. If you are turning on your device for the first time, follow the onscreen instructions to set up your device.


To turn off your device, press and hold the Power key, and then select **Power off**  $\rightarrow$  **OK**.




- Follow all posted warnings and directions from authorised personnel in areas where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.
- To use only your devices' non-network services, switch to Flight mode. Press and hold the Power key and select Flight mode.

#### Use the S Pen and the touch screen

Your device's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions for using the touch screen.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not tap it with anything sharp.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.
- Do not bend the S Pen.
- The tip of the S Pen is not replaceable.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your device.
- You can purchase a replacement S Pen from your local Samsung retailer.
- If your S Pen is not working properly, take it to a Samsung Service Centre.
- For best results, keep the S Pen mostly perpendicular to the touch screen and avoid using it at sharp angles.

#### Control your touch screen with the following actions:

- Tap: Touch once with your finger or the supplied S Pen to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Tap and hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a list of options.
- Drag: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on lists.
- Drag and drop: Tap and hold your finger on an item, and then drag your finger to move the item.
- Double-tap: Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos or webpages.



- You can perform additional actions with the enhanced S Pen that is supplied with your device.
   p. 42
- Your device turns off the touch screen when you do not use the device for a specified period. To turn on the screen, press the Power key or the Home key.
- You can also adjust the backlight time. In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings → Display → Screen timeout.

# Lock or unlock the touch screen and keys

You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent any unwanted device operations.

To lock, press the Power key. To unlock, turn on the screen by pressing the Power key or the Home key, tap anywhere on the screen, and then drag ① outside of the large circle.



You can activate the screen lock feature to prevent others from using or accessing your personal data and information saved in your device. ▶ p. 32

#### Get to know the idle screen

When the device is in Idle mode, you will see the idle screen. From the idle screen, you can view indicator icons, widgets, shortcuts to applications, and other items.

The idle screen has multiple panels. Scroll left or right to the panels on the idle screen. You can also select a dot at the bottom of the screen to move directly to the corresponding panel.

#### Add items to the idle screen

You can customise the idle screen by adding shortcuts to applications or items in applications, widgets, or folders. To add items to the idle screen,

- Press [=] → Add or tap and hold the empty area on the idle screen.
- 2 Select the item category  $\rightarrow$  an item:
  - Widgets: Add widgets to the idle screen.
  - **Shortcuts**: Add shortcuts to items, such as applications, bookmarks, and contacts.
  - Folders: Create a new folder or add folders for your contacts.
  - Wallpapers: Set a background image.

#### Move items on the idle screen

- I Tap and hold an item.
- 2 Drag the item to a new location.

#### Remove items from the idle screen

- 1 Tap and hold an item. The rubbish bin appears at the bottom of the idle screen.
- 2 Drag the item to the rubbish bin.
- 3 When the item turns red, release it.

# Use the notifications panel

In Idle mode, or while using an application, tap the indicator icons area and drag your finger downwards to open the notifications panel. You can activate or deactivate wireless connection features and access a list of notifications for messages, calls, events, or processing status. To hide the panel, drag the bottom of the list upwards.

From the notifications panel, you can use the following options:

- Wi-Fi: Activate or deactivate the WLAN connection feature.
   ▶ p. 129
- **Bluetooth**: Activate or deactivate the Bluetooth wireless connection feature. ▶ p. 126
- **GPS**: Activate or deactivate the GPS feature.
- Silent mode: Activate or deactivate Vibration mode.
- Auto rotation: Activate or deactivate the auto rotation feature.



Available options may vary depending on your region or service provider.

# > Add or remove panels to the idle screen

You can add or remove idle screen panels to organise widgets.

- In Idle mode, press [□] → Edit.
  You can also place two fingers on the screen and pinch them together to switch to Edit mode.
- 2 Add, remove, or reorganise panels:
  - To remove a panel, tap and hold the thumbnail image of the panel, and then drag it to the rubbish bin at the bottom of the screen.
  - To add a new panel, select 1.
  - To change the order of the panels, tap and hold a thumbnail image of a panel, and then drag it to a new location.
- 3 When you are finished, press [≤].

# **Access applications**

To access your device's applications,

- In Idle mode, select **Applications** to access the application list.
- 2 Scroll left or right to another screen.
  You can also select a dot at the bottom of the screen to move directly to the corresponding screen.

3 Select an application.



- When you use applications provided by Google, you must have a Google account.
- You can add an application shortcut by tapping and holding the appropriate icon from the application list.
   You can move shortcut icons to any location on the idle screen.
- 4 Press (➡) to return to the previous screen or press the Home key to return to the idle screen.



If you rotate the device while using some features, the interface will automatically rotate as well. To prevent the interface from rotating, open the notifications panel and select **Auto rotation**.

#### Organise applications

You can reorganise the applications in the application list by changing their order or grouping them into categories.

- 1 From the application list, press  $[\Box] \rightarrow Edit \rightarrow OK$ .
- 2 Tap and hold an application icon.
- 3 Drag the application icon to a new location. You can move an application icon to another screen. You can also move frequently-used applications next to Home.
- 4 Press [**□**] → **Save**.

To add a folder or panel to the idle screen,

- In the application list, press  $[=] \rightarrow Edit$ .
- 2 Tap and hold an application icon.
- 3 Drag the application icon to Add Folder or Add Page at the bottom of the screen.
- 4 Drag Add Folder or Add Page to the idle screen. A new folder or panel containing the applications is added to the idle screen.
- 5 If you added a folder, enter a name and select OK.
- 6 Press  $[\blacksquare] \rightarrow Save$ .

To change the order of the panels,

- In the application list, place two fingers on the screen and pinch them together.
- 2 Tap and hold a panel's thumbnail image, and then drag it to a new location.

# Access recent applications

- Press and hold the Home key to view the applications you have accessed recently.
- 2 Select an application.

# Use the task manager

Your device is a multitasking device, so can run more than one application at the same time. However, heavy multitasking may cause hang-ups, freezing, memory problems, or additional power consumption. To avoid these problems, end unnecessary programs with the task manager.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Task**manager → Active applications.
  - A list of all the active applications on your device appears.
- 2 To close an application, select Exit.
  To close all active applications, select Exit all.

# **Customise your device**

Get more from your device by customising it to match your preferences.

#### Set the current time and date

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Date and time.
- 2 Set the time and date and change other options.

#### > Turn on or off the touch tone

In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Sound**  $\rightarrow$  **Audible selection**.

# Adjust the ringtone volume

Press the Volume key up or down to adjust the ringtone volume.

#### > Switch to Silent mode

To mute or unmute your device, do one of the following:

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Phone → Keypad, and then tap and hold #.
- Press and hold the Power key and select **Silent mode**.
- Open the notifications panel at the top of the screen and select **Silent mode**.



You can set the device to alert you to various events in Silent mode. In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Sound**  $\rightarrow$  **Vibration**  $\rightarrow$  **Always** or **Only in silent mode**.

# Change your ringtone

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Sound → Phone ringtone.
- 2 Select a ringtone from the list, and then select **OK**.
- Activate an animation for switching windows
   In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Display → Animation → Some animations or All animations.

# > Select a wallpaper for the idle screen

- I In Idle mode, press [ $\blacksquare$ ] → **Wallpaper** → an option.
- 2 Select an image.
- 3 Select **Save** or **Set wallpaper**.



Samsung is not responsible for any misuse of default images or wallpapers provided on your device.

# Adjust the brightness of the display

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Display → Brightness.
- 2 Clear the tick box next to Automatic brightness.
- 3 Drag the slider to adjust the brightness.
- 4 Select **OK**.



The brightness level you set will affect how quickly the device consumes battery power.

#### Set a screen lock

You can lock the touch screen by activating the screen lock feature. Your device will require the unlock pattern, PIN, or password each time you turn on the device or unlock the touch screen.



- If you forget your unlock code, take your device to a Samsung Service Centre to reset it.
- Samsung is not responsible for the loss of security codes or private information, or other damages caused by illegal software.

# Set an unlock pattern

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Location and security → Set up screen lock →
   Pattern.
- View the on-screen instructions and example patterns, and then select **Next**.
- 3 Draw a pattern by dragging your finger to connect at least 4 dots, and then select **Continue**.
- 4 Draw the pattern again to confirm and select **Confirm**.

#### Set an unlock PIN

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Location and security**  $\rightarrow$  **Set up screen lock**  $\rightarrow$  **PIN**.
- 2 Enter a new PIN (numeric) and select **Continue**.
- 3 Enter the PIN again and select **OK**.

#### Set an unlock password

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Location and security → Set up screen lock →
   Password.
- 2 Enter a new password (alphanumeric) and select **Continue**.
- 3 Enter the password again and select **OK**.

# Lock your SIM or USIM card

You can lock your device with the PIN that is supplied with your SIM or USIM card.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Location and security → Set up SIM card lock →
   Lock SIM card.
- 2 Enter your PIN and select **OK**.

Once the SIM lock is enabled, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on the device.



- If you enter an incorrect PIN too many times, your SIM or USIM card will be blocked. You must enter a PIN unlock key (PUK) to unblock the SIM or USIM card.
- If you block your SIM or USIM card by entering an incorrect PUK, take the card to your service provider to unblock it.

# Activate the Find my mobile feature

When someone inserts a new SIM or USIM card into your device, the Find my mobile feature will automatically send the contact number to specified recipients to help you locate and recover your device.

To use this feature, you need a Samsung account to control the device remotely via the web.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Location and security → SIM Change Alert.
- 2 Select Continue.
- 3 Enter the email address and password for your Samsung account, and then select Sign in.
  To create a Samsung account, select Create an account.
- 4 Select **Alert message recipients**.
- 5 Enter the password for your Samsung account again and select **Confirm**.
- 6 Enter a phone number, including the country code (with a +).
- 7 Enter the text message that will be sent to the recipients.
- 8 Select **Done**.

#### **Enter text**

You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad or by inputting handwriting on the screen.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you must change the writing language to one of the supported languages. ▶ p. 163

# Change the keyboard type

You can change the keyboard type. Tap and hold the text input field, and then select **Input method**  $\rightarrow$  a keyboard type (Samsung keypad or Swype).

# > Enter text with the Swype keyboard

- 1 Tap the first character of a word and then drag your finger to the second character without releasing your finger from the screen.
- 2 Continue until you have finished spelling the word.





## > Copy and paste text

From a text field, you can use the copy and paste feature to use the text in other applications.

- 4 Drag or to select the text.
- 5 Select Copy to copy, or Cut to cut the text onto the clipboard.
- 6 In another application, place the cursor where you want to paste the text.
- 7 Select → Paste to insert the text from the clipboard into the text field.

# Download applications from Android Market

Your device's functionality can be extended by installing additional applications for the Android platform.

Android Market provides a quick and easy way to shop for games and mobile applications.



- This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.
- Your device will save user files from downloaded applications in the internal memory.

## Install an application

- I In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Market**.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, read the terms and conditions, and then select **Accept**.
- 3 Search for a file or application and download it.

## Uninstall an application

- I From the main Android Market screen, select **My apps**.
- 2 Select an item.
- 3 Select **Uninstall**  $\rightarrow$  **OK**.

## Download files from the web



Files you download from the web can include viruses that will damage your device. To reduce your risk, only download files from sources you trust.



Some media files include Digital Rights Management to protect copyrights. This protection may prevent you from downloading, copying, modifying, or transferring some files.

To download files from the web,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Internet**.
- 2 Search for a file or application and download it.

To install applications downloaded from websites other than Android Market, you must select **Settings** → **Applications** → **Unknown sources** → **OK**.

## Synchronise data

You can synchronise data with various web servers and back up or restore your data.

Once the synchronisation is complete, your device stays connected to the web. If a change is made to the data, the updated information will automatically be synchronised between your device and the web server.



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

## Set up a server account

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Accounts and sync.
- 2 Select **Add account**  $\rightarrow$  an account type.
- 3 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the account setup.

## Activate automatic sync

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Accounts and sync.
- 2 Select **Auto-sync**.
- 3 Select an account.
- 4 Select the applications that you want to synchronise.

To exclude applications from automatic synchronisation, clear the tick boxes next to the application names.

## Synchronise data manually

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Accounts and sync.
- 2 Select an account.
- 3 Select **Sync now**. Your device will start synchronising the data you set for synchronisation.

## **Using special features**

Your device can be used as a powerful notepad, thanks to multiple features that help you input text, capture drawings, and use motion controls or voice commands.

## Learn basic S Pen actions

Your device is supplied with a specialised S Pen. To perform the following actions, first remove the S Pen from the slot at the bottom of your device.





You cannot press the touch keys with the S Pen.

- Tap: Tap an item or area on the screen to select an item, open a menu, or launch an application.
- Tap and hold: Tap and hold the S Pen on an item for more than two seconds.
- Double-tap: Quickly tap an item or area on the screen twice.
- Flick: Tap an area on the screen and then slowly drag the S Pen up, down, left, or right to move through lists or screens.
- Draw: Draw a line or shape on the drawing pad.
- Write: Write text on the handwriting panel.

## **Learn advanced S Pen actions**

Press and hold the button on the side of the S Pen to perform the following actions:



### **Back**

Drag the S Pen to the left to return to the previous screen.



#### Menu

Drag the S Pen up to open a list of options available on the current screen.



## Screen capture

Tap and hold the screen to capture a screenshot.

After capturing a screenshot, you can draw on it, write on it, or crop it. The edited image will be saved in My files → ScreenCapture → Capture\_ Edited.



You cannot capture a screenshot while using a camera or playing a video.



### **Ouick memo**

Double-tap to launch the Quick memo function.


## Learn motions

Built-in motion recognition provides you with enhanced controls. You can perform actions by moving your device or performing gestures with your hands.

To use some of these functions, you must first activate the motion recognition feature. In Idle mode, open the application list, and then select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Motion**  $\rightarrow$  **Motion activation**.

### **Shake**

Shake your device to search for Bluetooth-enabled devices.



## **Double-tap**

While using Voice talk, begin voice recognition by tapping the device twice quickly.




### Tilt

While holding the device with two hands, tap and hold two points on the screen, and then tilt the device back and forth to zoom in or out.



## Palm sweep

Sweep your palm across the screen to capture a screenshot. The image will be saved in **My files**  $\rightarrow$  **ScreenCapture**.



### Palm touch

Touch the screen with your palm to pause media playback or mute the radio.




## Tap and twist

Place your finger on the screen and then twist it to rotate an image.



### Pan

Tap and hold an item on the screen, and then pan the device to the left or right to move the item to another page on the idle screen or application list.



### **Turn over**

Place the device face down to mute ringtones.



## **Use Handwriting mode**

From the Samsung keypad, you can switch to Handwriting mode to enter text more easily. To switch to Handwriting mode, select ...



Write your text on the handwriting panel. When the device recognises the correct word, select to enter it in the text input field. Otherwise, select a word from the alternative word list.



You can use a variety of gestures in Handwriting mode to edit text. For more information about gestures, select  $\bigcirc$   $\rightarrow$  **Handwriting settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Gesture guide**.

To switch to the Samsung keypad, select .

### > Pen detection

Your device can detect inputs from the S Pen. When you tap the field with the S Pen, the device will open the handwriting panel. To use this feature, select  $\bigcirc \rightarrow$  **Pen detection**.



## **Use S Memo**

With S Memo, you can create memos with enriched content by drawing sketches or adding photos or sound clips.

- I In Idle mode, open the application list and select **S Memo**.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, select the tick box next to **Do not show again**, and then select **Done**.
- 3 Select ∠.
  To enter text with the keyboard, select T.
- 4 Enter text or draw a sketch.




To change the pen type, line thickness, or pen colour, double-tap **∠**.



- You can also change the background image of the memo. Press [□] → Change background → an image.
- To zoom in, place two fingers on the screen and spread them apart. To zoom out, move your fingers closer together. When zoomed in, drag with two fingers to scroll through the screen.



Your device provides you with a powerful planner to help you organise your schedules and tasks more conveniently and effectively. You can create and view events, add items, and change view modes.

To launch S Planner, in Idle mode, open the application list, and then select **S Planner**.

The tasks and notes you create cannot be synchronised with Google Calendar<sup>™</sup>.


To create an event,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select
  S Planner → ■.
- 2 If alert messages about the calendar sync appear, select **OK**.
- 3 Select **Add event**, and then enter details.
  - To search for and add a location view, select <a>m</a>.
  - To add a memo, select Memos → Create S Memo or Link to S Memo.
  - To add a photo, select Pictures → Capture picture or Pictures.
- 4 When you are finished, select **Save**.

To create a task,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select S Planner → ...
- 2 Select Add task, and then enter details.
  - To add a memo, select Memos → Create S Memo or Link to S Memo.
  - To add a photo, select Pictures → Capture picture or Pictures.
- *3* When you are finished, select **Save**.

To create an event or task from a memo,



In Idle mode, open the application list and select **S Planner**  $\rightarrow \blacksquare$ .

- 2 Select Quick add, and then enter details.
- 3 When you are finished, select Save.
  The device will automatically classify the details in the text and enter them into the corresponding fields.

### > Add a memo


### **Use Voice talk**

Built-in voice recognition provides you with a quick and easy way to launch applications and features. When your hands are engaged with other tasks or you are not able to look at the device's screen, such as while you are driving, you can say a command to perform an action.

To launch the voice command feature, quickly press the Home key twice. If you are launching the application for the first time, you will see a tutorial and help information. Afterwards, you will see the main Voice talk screen.

### Use voice commands

## **Communication**

## **Calling**

Learn to use calling functions, such as making and answering calls, using options available during a call or customising and using call-related features.

### Make or answer a call

You can use the buttons or the touch screen when you make, accept, end, or reject calls.



- To prevent accidental inputs, the proximity sensor automatically locks the touch screen when you hold the device near your face. ▶ p. 155
- Static electricity discharged from your body or clothing may interfere with the proximity sensor during a call.

#### Make a call

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Phone** → **Keypad**, and then enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2 Select \( \subseteq \text{ to make a voice call.} \)
  To make a video call, select \( \subseteq \text{...} \)
- 3 To end the call, select End call.



- Use the phonebook to save numbers that you dial frequently. ➤ p. 102
- To access the call log and redial numbers you have called recently, select **Phone** → **Logs**.

#### **Answer a call**

1 When a call comes in, drag  $\square$  outside of the large circle.



To mute the ringtone, press the Volume key while the device is ringing.

2 To end the call, select **End call**.

### Reject a call

When a call comes in, drag outside of the large circle.
To send a message when you reject an incoming call, select
Reject call with message.



First create a text message to be sent to callers. In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Call**  $\rightarrow$  **Set reject messages**.

### Call an international number

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Phone
   → Keypad, and then tap and hold 0 to insert the + character.
- 2 Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then select \(\scale=\) to dial the number.

### Use a headset

By plugging a headset into the device, you can answer and control calls conveniently:

- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To reject a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To place a call on hold or retrieve a held call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.

## Use options during a voice call

You can use the following options during a voice call:

- To adjust the voice volume, press the Volume key up or down.
- To place a call on hold, select . To retrieve a held call, select
   .
- To dial a second call, select Add call, and then dial a new number.
- To answer a second call, drag outside of the large circle when a call waiting tone sounds. The device asks whether to end or hold the first call. You must subscribe to the call waiting service to use this feature.
- To open the dialling screen, select **Keypad**.
- To activate the speakerphone feature, select **Speaker**.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing some calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

- To turn off the mouthpiece so that the other party cannot hear you, select **Mute**.
- To converse with the other party via a Bluetooth headset, select **Headset**.
- To open the phonebook, press [□] → Contacts.
- To add a memo, press  $[=] \rightarrow Memo$ .
- To switch between two calls, select **Swap**.
- To make a multiparty call (conference call), make or answer a second call, and then select **Merge** when connected to the second party. Repeat to add more parties. You must subscribe to the multiparty call service to use this feature.

## Use options during a video call

You can use the following options while a video call is in progress:

- To switch between the front and rear camera lens, select Switch Camera.
- To turn off the mouthpiece so that the other party cannot hear you, select **Mute**.
- To hide your image from the other party, press [□] → Hide me.
- To select an alternative image to be shown to the other party, press [□] → Outgoing image.
- To open the dialling screen, press [□] → Dialpad.
- To converse with the other party via a Bluetooth headset, press [r=1] → Switch to headset.
- To activate the speakerphone feature, press [□] →
   Speaker On/Off.
- To use the other party's image, tap and hold it. You can capture an image of the screen or record the video call.



It is illegal in many areas to record a call without permission. Always ask the other party for permission before recording a call.

### View and dial missed calls

Your device will display missed calls on the display. To return the call, open the notifications panel and select the missed call.

### Use additional features

You can use other call-related features, such as auto rejection, Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) mode, or call diverting or barring.

### Set auto rejection

Use auto rejection to reject calls from certain numbers automatically. To activate auto rejection and create auto reject lists,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Call → Call rejection.
- 2 Select **Auto reject mode**  $\rightarrow$  an option.

Option	Function
All numbers	Reject all calls.
Auto reject numbers	Reject calls from phone numbers on the Auto reject list.

- 3 Select **Auto reject list**.
- 4 Select **Add** and enter a phone number.
- 5 Select **Match criteria**  $\rightarrow$  an option (if necessary).
- 6 Select **Save**.
- 7 To add more numbers, repeat steps 4-6.

### **Use Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) mode**

In FDN mode, your device will restrict outgoing calls, except for the numbers stored in the FDN list. To activate FDN mode,

In Idle mode, open the application list and select
Settings → Call → Additional settings → Fixed Dialing
Numbers → Enable FDN.

- 2 Enter the PIN2 supplied with your SIM or USIM card and select **OK**.
- 3 Select **FDN list** and add contacts to be used in FDN mode.

### **Set call forwarding**

Call diverting is a network feature to send incoming calls to another number that you specify. You can set this feature separately for several conditions when you are not able to answer calls, such as when you are already on the phone or when you are outside of the service area.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Call**  $\rightarrow$  **Call forwarding**  $\rightarrow$  a call type.
- 2 Select a condition.
- 3 Enter a number to which calls will be forwarded and select **Enable**.

Your setting will be sent to the network.

### Set call barring

Call barring is a network feature to restrict certain types of calling or to prevent others from making calls with your device.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Call → Additional settings → Call barring → a call type.
- 2 Select a call barring option.
- 3 Enter a call barring password and select OK. Your setting will be sent to the network.

### Set call waiting

Call waiting is a network feature to alert you of an incoming call while you are on a previous call. This feature is available only for voice calls.

In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Call**  $\rightarrow$  **Additional settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Call waiting**. Your setting will be sent to the network.

## View call logs

You can view logs of your calls filtered by their types.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Phone** → **Logs**.
- 2 Press [ $\blacksquare$ ] → **View by** → an option to sort the call logs.



From the call logs, you can make a call or send a message directly to a contact by quickly flicking the contact to the left or right.

3 Select a log to view its details.



From the detail view, you can dial the number, send a message to the number, or add the number to the phonebook or Auto reject list.

## Messaging

Learn to create and send text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) messages, and view or manage messages that you have sent or received.




You may incur additional charges for sending or receiving messages while outside of your home service area. For details, contact your service provider.

## Send a text message

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Messaging**.
- 3 Add recipients:
  - Enter phone numbers manually and separate them with a semicolon or a comma.
  - Select phone numbers from your call and contact lists by selecting
- 4 Select **Tap to enter message** and enter your message text.
  - To insert emoticons, press  $[=] \rightarrow$  Insert smiley.
- 5 Select **Send** to send the message.

## Send a multimedia message

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Messaging.
- 2 Select ™.
- 3 Add recipients:
  - Enter phone numbers or email addresses and separate them with a semicolon or a comma.
  - Select phone numbers or email addresses from the call, message, or contact by selecting



4 Press [□] → Add subject and enter a subject for the message.

- 5 Select **Tap to enter message** and enter your message text.
  - To insert emoticons, press  $[=] \rightarrow$  **Insert smiley**.
- 6 Select ② and add an item.
  You can select a file, sketch memo, or event from the file list or create a new photo, video, sound, or sketch memo.
- 7 Select **Send** to send the message.


## View a text or multimedia message

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Messaging.
  - Your messages are grouped into message threads by contact.
- 2 Select a contact.
- 3 Select a multimedia message to view more details.

## Listen to voice mail messages

If you have set missed calls to be diverted to the voice mail server, callers can leave voice messages when you do not answer incoming calls. To access your voice mail inbox and listen to your messages,

- In Idle mode, open the application list, select Phone → Keypad, and then tap and hold 1.
- 2 Follow the instructions from the voice mail server.



## **Google Mail**

You can retrieve new email messages from the Google Mail<sup>TM</sup> webmail service to your Inbox. When you access this application, the Inbox screen appears. The total number of unread messages appears in the title bar and unread messages appear in bold type.



- This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.
- This menu may be labelled differently depending on your service provider.

## Send an email message

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Google** Mail.
- 2 If you are launching this application for the first time, select **OK**.
- $\beta$  Press [**□**] → **Compose**.
- 4 Enter a name or address in the recipient field.
  To add more recipients, press [□] → Add Cc/Bcc.
- 5 Enter a subject and message.
- $\bigcirc$  To attach an image file, press [ $\bigcirc$ ] → **Attach** → a file.
- 7 Select send the message.

## View an email message

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Google** Mail.
- 2 Select an email message.

From the message view, use the following options:



Available options may vary depending on the account.

- To reply to the message, select
- To reply to the message and include all recipients, select ■
   → Reply all.
- To mark the message as important, select ★.
- To view an attachment, select Preview. To save it to your device, select Download.
- To archive the message, select **Archive**.
- To delete the message, select **Delete**.

## Organise email by labels

You can organise your email by labelling your messages. You can sort messages with the label filter.

### Add a label to a message

- I From the Inbox screen, tap and hold a message.
- 2 Select Change labels.
- 3 Select a label, and then select **OK**.

### Filter messages

- I From the Inbox screen, press  $[=] \rightarrow Go$  to labels.
- 2 Select the label for the messages you want to view.

### **Email**

Learn to send or view email messages via your personal or company email account.

## Set up an email account


- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Email**.
- 2 Enter your email address and password.
- 3 Select Next (for general email accounts, such as Google Mail and Yahoo) or Manual setup (for other company email accounts).
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions.

When you are finished setting up the email account, the email messages are downloaded to your device. If you have created more than two accounts, you can switch between email accounts. Select an account name at the top left of the screen and select the one you want to retrieve messages from.

## Send an email message

- I In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Email**.
- 2 Select **№**.
- 3 Add recipients:
  - Enter email addresses manually and separate them with a semicolon or a comma.
  - Select email addresses from the call, message, or contact lists by selecting <a>I</a>.
  - Add more recipients by pressing [□] → Add Cc/Bcc.
- 4 Select the subject field to enter a subject.

- 5 Select the text input field to enter your email text.
- Select Attach and attach a file.
  You can select a file, sketch memo, or event from the file list or create a new photo, video, sound, or sketch memo.
- You cannot attach Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected files.
- 7 Select **Send** to send the message.



## View an email message

When you open an email account, you can view previously retrieved emails offline or connect to the email server to view new messages. After retrieving email messages, you can view them offline.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Email**  $\rightarrow$  an email account.
- 2 Press  $[=] \rightarrow$ **Refresh** to update the message list.
- 3 Select an email message.

From the message view, use the following options:

- To move to the previous or next message, select or .
- To move the message to another folder, select 5.
- To delete the message, select 💼.
- To reply to the message, select  $\bowtie$   $\rightarrow$  **Reply**.

#### **Talk**

Learn to chat with friends and family with the Google Talk<sup>™</sup> instant messaging service.



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

## Add friends to your friend list

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Talk**. The friend list shows all of your messaging contacts at a glance.
- 2 Press [ $\blacksquare$ ]  $\rightarrow$  Add friend.
- 3 Enter a friend's email address and select **Send invitation**.

When your friend accepts the invitation, he or she is added to your friend list.

#### > Start a chat

- $I_{\parallel}$  In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Talk**.
- 2 Select a friend from the friend list. The chat screen opens.
- 3 Enter your message and select Send.
  To insert emoticons, press [□] → More → Insert smiley.

- Open Windows Media Player to synchronise music files.
- 3 Edit or enter your device's name in the pop-up window (if necessary).
- 4 Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list.
- 5 Start the synchronisation.

# Connect as a mass storage device

You can connect your device to a PC and use it as a removable disk. When you insert a memory card, the device acts as a card reader and allows you to access the file directory.



The file directory of the memory card will appear as a removable disk, separate from the internal memory.

- If you want to transfer files from or to a memory card, insert a memory card into the device.
- 2 In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings → Wireless and network → USB utilities → Connect storage to PC.
- 3 With a USB cable, connect the multifunction jack on your device to a PC.
- 4 When connected, select **Connect USB storage**.
- 5 Open the folder to view files.
- 6 Copy files from the PC to the memory card.
- When you are finished, select **Disconnect storage from PC**.



To disconnect the device from the PC, click the USB device icon on the Windows task bar and click the option to safely remove the mass storage device. Then remove the USB cable from the PC. Otherwise, you may lose data stored on the memory card or damage it.

#### **VPN** connections

You can create virtual private networks (VPN) and connect to your private network securely through a public network, such as the internet.



Your device should already be configured with internet access. If you have trouble accessing the internet, you need to edit connections. If you are not sure about the connection information to enter, ask your service provider.

  → Wireless and network → VPN settings → Add VPN.
- 2 Select a VPN type.
- 3 Customise the connection information.

DNS search domains	Enter the domain name server (DNS) address.

4 When you are finished, press [ □ ] → **Save**.

# Connect to a private network

   → Wireless and network → VPN settings.
- 2 Select a private network to connect.
- 3 Enter the user name and password and select Connect.

# **Tools**

### Clock

Learn to set and control alarms, and world clocks. You can also use the stopwatch and the desk clock.

#### > Set a new alarm

Brightness	Set the brightness of the display.

Dock settings	Set to use the dock speaker when your device is connected to a car or desktop dock.

### **Calculator**

### **Downloads**

Learn to manage logs of files you have downloaded from the web.

- 2 Select a download folder.
- 3 To open a downloaded file, select the log.
  To delete a log, select the tick box and then select **Delete**.

# **Google Search**

You can search for applications and data saved in your device and specific data on the web.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Google Search**.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, set whether or not to view the search history of your Google account.
- 3 Enter a letter or a word of the data to search for. To search for data by voice, select 
  ■ and say a keyword into your device's microphone.
- 4 Select the item's name you want to access.

### Kies air

Kies air allows you to connect your device to another device via a WLAN. From a browser, you can view and control media files, contacts, messages, and any other data saved on your device.

- Samsung Apps: Select a network connection (Wi-Fi or packet switched data network) to get notifications for new applications from Samsung Apps.

Change the settings for the auto sync feature or manage accounts for synchronisation.

- Shake to update: Set your device to search for Bluetoothenabled devices by shaking it.
- **Turn over to mute**: Set to mute incoming calls, alarms, music, and the FM radio by placing the device face down.

- Launch Voice talk: Set to launch Voice talk by pressing the Home key twice.
- **Launch on Bluetooth**: Set to activate Voice talk when a Bluetooth headset is connected.
- **Listen via Bluetooth**: Set to recognise your voice commands when using a connected Bluetooth headset.
- **Use location data**: Set to use your location information for voice search results.
- Hide offensive words: Hide offensive words from voice search results.
- Help: Access help information for using the Voice talk feature.
- About: View version information.
- Auto-dial: Set to automatically dial a number when the device is confident that it has properly recognised your input.
- **Auto-start speaker**: Set to automatically turn on the speakerphone when making a call with Voice talk.
- **Show body of message**: Set to view the text of a new message received while in Driving mode.
- **Wake up command**: Set to begin voice recognition by saying a wake up command while using Voice talk.



- **Only on while charging**: Set to activate the Wake up command feature only when a charger is connected.
- **Wake-up motion**: Set to begin voice recognition by tapping the device twice quickly while using Voice talk.
- Check missed events: Set to check your missed calls, messages, or events when you launch Voice talk by pressing the headset button.
- Customize main prompt: Change the prompt message.
- Home address: Enter your home address to use your location information in the voice command feature.

For the Google voice recognition, use the following options:

- Language: Select a language for the voice recognition.
- **SafeSearch**: Set the device to filter explicit text and images from voice search results.
- Block offensive words: Hide offensive words from voice search results.

### Text-to-speech settings

### Date and time

Access and alter the following settings to control how time and date are displayed on your device.



If the battery remains fully discharged or removed from the device, the time and date will be reset.

- Automatic: Automatically update the time when you move across time zones.
- **Set date**: Set the current date manually.
- **Select time zone**: Set your home time zone.
- **Set time**: Set the current time manually.
- Use 24-hour format: Set to the time to be displayed in 24-hour format.
- Select date format: Select a date format.

# Pen settings

- **Dominant hand**: Select the hand you write with to enhance the reaction to S Pen inputs.
- **Pen help**: Access help information for using the S Pen.

# **Troubleshooting**

### When you turn on your device or while you are using the device, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the device lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the device.
PIN	When using the device for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM or USIM card. You can disable this feature by using the <b>Lock SIM card</b> menu.
PUK	Your SIM or USIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM or USIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

### Your device displays network or service error messages

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

### The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If your device has a touch screen and the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen.
   Protective covers may prevent the device from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen devices.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local Samsung Service Centre.

### Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold the Power key for 10-15 seconds. The device will reboot automatically. If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings → Privacy → Factory data reset → Reset phone → Erase everything.

### Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.

### Outgoing calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialling.

### Incoming calls are not connected

- Ensure that your device is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

### Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

### Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the device's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

### When dialling from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.



### The device beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the device.

# The battery does not charge properly or the device turns off

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose
  of the old battery properly and replace it with a new
  battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal
  instructions).

#### Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

### Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile device must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your device.
- Restart the device. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your Samsung mobile device uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio will be unable to receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio stations.

If you still cannot use the FM radio after performing these steps, try accessing your desired station with another radio receiver. If you can hear the station with another receiver, your device may require service. Contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### Error messages appear when opening music files

### Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

# A connection is not established when you connect the device to a PC

- Ensure that the USB cable you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.
