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Important Safety Precautions

Please read these guidelines before using your wireless phone. Failure to comply with them may be dangerous or illegal.

Road Safety at All Times

Do not use a hand-held phone while driving; park the vehicle first.

Switching Off When Refueling

Do not use the phone at a refueling point (service station) or near fuels or chemicals.

Switching Off in an Aircraft

Wireless phones can cause interference. Using them in an aircraft is both illegal and dangerous.

Switching Off in Hospitals

Switch your phone off near medical equipment. Follow any regulations or rules in force.

Interference

All wireless phones may be subject to interference, which could affect their performance.

Special Regulations

Follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch your phone off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger (in a hospital, for example).

Sensible Use

Only use the phone in the normal position (held to the ear). Avoid unnecessary contact with the antenna when the phone is switched on.

Emergency Call

Ensure the phone is switched on and in-service. Key in the emergency number for your present location, then press the Key. Give all the necessary information as accurately as possible. Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

Water Resistance

Your phone is not water-resistant. Keep it dry.

Accessories and Batteries

Use only Samsung-approved accessories and batteries. Use of any unauthorized accessories could damage your phone and may be dangerous.

Qualified Service

Closed View of Phone


Your phone has many features that can be accessed while the phone is closed.



- 1. Camera Lens: The lens of your built-in camera/camcorder.
- 2. **Flash**: The built-in flash has manual and automatic capabilities.
- 3. **External Display**: Displays time and date information, incoming calls or messages, and music information.
- 4. Jog Dial: Song selection key.
- 5. **Rewind Key**: Rewind current song.
- 6. Play/Pause Key: Play or pause music playback.
- 7. Stop Key: Stop music playback
- 8. **Fast Forward Key**: Fast forward current song.

- 9. **Micro SD Memory Card Slot**: This expansion slot allows you to insert a Micro SD memory card to add additional memory and storage capacity for your music, video and photos.
- 10. **Camera/Camcorder Key**: This button is used to launch the integrated digital camera:
 - In idle mode, press to activate the **Camera** menu.
 - In idle mode, press and hold starts the camera's preview mode.
 - When the phone is closed, press and hold to start the camera's preview mode.
- 11. **Service Light**: Turns red when the battery is being recharged and turns green when the battery has finished recharging. The light also flashing red when you have an incoming call and green when you have a message waiting.
- 12. **Speaker**: The stereo speakers play music, ringtones, and sounds when headphones are not connected.

Front View of Your Phone



- 1. **Earpiece**: The earpiece allows you to hear the other caller.
- 2. **Display Screen**: This screen displays all the information you need to operate your phone.
- 3. **Headset Jack**: Allows you to plug in an optional headset for safe, convenient hands-free conversations, as well as to listen to your MP3 music.

- 4. **Volume Key**: Allows you to adjust the ringer volume in idle mode (with the phone open) or adjust the voice volume during a call. The volume key can also be used to scroll up or down to navigate through the different menu options. To mute the ringer during an incoming call, press the volume key up or down.
- 5. **Left Soft Key**: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - In idle mode, press to access the **Menu**.
 - When using other features, such as the Web Browser, the left soft key performs a context-sensitive action. This action is shown in the bottom-left corner of the Display Screen.
- 6. **Right Soft Key**: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - In idle mode, press to access your **Contacts**.
 - When using other features, such as the Web Browser, the right soft key performs a context-sensitive action. This action is shown in the bottom right corner of the Display Screen.
- 7. **OK Key**: Press on when navigating through a menu accepts the highlighted choice in the menu. In idle mode, press and hold the key to launch your Web Browser.
- 8. **Navigation Keys**: These keys allows you to scroll through the phone menu options and provides a shortcut to phone functions when in idle mode.
- 9. **SEND Key**: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - Allows you to place or receive a call.
 - In idle mode, press the key once to access the Dialed call log.
- 10. **Numeric Keypad**: Use these keys to enter numbers, letters, and characters.


- 11. **Shift/Asterisk Key**: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - Enters the asterisk [*] character for calling features.
 - In text entry mode, press the key to switch between letter cases when using the input type Alpha (ABC, Abc, abc) or T9 (T9WORD, T9word, T9Word).
 - In idle mode, press and hold to switch your handset to Manner Mode (silent mode with vibration).
- 12. **Power/Accessory Interface Connector**: The Power/Accessory Interface Connector is used to plug in a travel adaptor, or any available accessory to your phone.
- 13. **Microphone**: The microphone allows other callers to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.
- 14. **Space/Pound Key**: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - Enters the pound [#] character for calling features.
 - In text entry mode, press to enter a space.
 - In idle mode, press and hold to switch your handset to Lock Mode (disables all outgoing calls except for emergency, 911).
- 15. **BACK Key**: Deletes characters from the display when you are in text entry mode. When in a menu, press to return to the previous menu.
- 16. **Speakerphone Key**: In idle mode, press and hold this key to say a voice command.
- 17. END Key: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - During a call, press this key to end the call.

- When you receive an incoming call, press this key to reject the call.
- When the phone is off or in idle mode, press and hold this key for a few seconds to turn your phone On or Off.
- When in the main menu, press to return the phone to idle mode and cancel your input.

Understanding the Display Screens

Your phone's display screens provide a wealth of information about your phone's status and options. When the phone is closed, the exterior display screen is dimmed. To illuminate the exterior display screen, press any of the side or front keys.

The interior screen has three areas:




Area	Description

Text and graphics area	Displays messages, instructions and any information that you enter, such as the number you are dialing.



Indicates that the white balance has been set to Tungsten.

This is used for taking pictures indoors under normal lighting conditions.

Indicates that the white balance has been set to Manual.



This is used for taking pictures indoors or outdoors using your own custom settings.

Camera

The camera on the front of your phone allows you to take a photo or record a video while on the move. For further details, see "Camera" on page 75.

Memory Card

Your phone allows you to use a Micro SD memory card and an adapter to expand the phone's available memory space. This digital card makes it easy to exchange images, music, and voice data quickly between SD-compatible devices.

Using Your Phone's Micro SD Memory Card

Your phone is equipped with a Micro SD memory (Secure Digital) memory card to expand the phone's available memory space. It allows you to easily store images, videos, music files, and voice data in your phone. **Note:** Before you can copy files to the memory card from your PC, you must first insert it into the phone. The phone will format the card for you and create the necessary file folders. The card is formatted with a FAT32 file system that can be read by most computers.

Inserting the Micro SD Memory Card

To insert the Micro SD memory card into your phone:

- 1. Open the memory card access panel located on the bottomright side of the phone.
- 2. Position the Micro SD memory card perpendicular to the opening and gently slide it into place until it is fully inserted and locked.

Note: Be sure to use only recommended memory cards (8 MB–512 MB). Using non-recommended memory cards could cause data loss or damage your phone.

Note: Make sure your battery is fully charged before using the Micro SD memory card. Your data may become damaged or unusable if the battery runs out while reading or writing to the card.

Removing the Micro SD Memory Card

To remove the Micro SD memory card from your phone:

- 1. Open the memory card access panel located on the bottomright side of the phone.
- 2. Eject the card by pushing in and then releasing.
- 3. Pull the memory card out of the handset.

Warning: DO NOT remove a memory card while files are being accessed or transferred. It could result in loss or damage of data.

Note: If you remove your memory card, the location to save images will automatically default back to the Phone.

Using the Micro SD Adapter

The supplied Micro SD memory adapter allows Micro SD memory cards to be used in SD-compatible devices. Before using with a reader, you will need to insert the Micro SD memory card into the Micro SD memory adapter:

- 1. With the label side of the Micro SD memory card facing up, insert the card into the supplied Micro SD memory adapter and gently slide the card until it is fully inserted.
- 2. To remove the Micro SD memory card from the memory adapter:
- 3. Hold the front edge of the Micro SD memory card and gently pull outward to remove it from the adapter.

Getting Started

Installing and Charging the Battery

Your phone is equipped with a Lithium Ion (Lilon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained. When the battery is weak and only a few minutes of talk time remain, a warning tone sounds and a message repeats at regular intervals on the display. If this happens, the display dims to conserve the remaining battery power. When the battery level becomes too low, the phone automatically turns off.

Check the battery indicator icon periodically and recharge as needed to make sure the phone has enough battery power when needed.

Important: The battery must be fully charged before you use the phone, otherwise you could damage the battery.

Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibration mode, playing games, camera and browser usage affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power. You can use the phone while the battery is charging, but this causes the phone to charge more slowly.

Installing the Battery

- 1. Insert the bottom end of the battery into the phone housing with the label side down. The gold contacts on the end of the battery should match up with those on the phone
- 2. Push the top end of the battery down until it snaps into place.

Removing the Battery

- Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.
- 2. Pull the battery release latch toward the top of the phone. The top of the battery should pop up.
- 3. Use your finger to lift the battery (top end first) up and away from the phone.

Charging the Battery with the Travel Adapter

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable standard Li-ion battery. Only use Samsung-approved charging devices and batteries. Samsung accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

The **I** icon indicates that the battery is full. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon **I** blinks and the phone sounds a warning tone.





Warning! Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

1.Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.

2.Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a standard 120/220 VAC wall outlet.

3.Insert the smaller end of the adapter into the charger/ accessory connector at the bottom end of the phone.


Turning Your Phone

On and Off

- 1. Open the phone.
- 2. Press and hold the *b* key until the phone switches on. Once your phone is On, it displays "Looking for Service". When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters idle mode. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, the phone enters Power Save mode and periodically searches for a signal. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to idle mode.

3. To turn your phone off, Press and hold the 💋 key until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.



Phone Basics

Displaying Your Phone Number

In case you forget your phone number, your phone can remind you. To display your phone number, Press the left soft key if for **Menu**, followed by is in the card is displayed with your phone number.

Making Calls

Making Regular Calls

From the idle screen, enter the phone number and press the $\underbrace{\textcircled{}}$ key. To end the call, press the $\underbrace{\textcircled{}}$ key or close the phone.

Note: If the speakerphone is used together with a connecting headset, closing the phone flip cover does not end a call. Instead, press the place key.

Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial 2000 Two and press), even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted.

Adjusting the Volume

During a call, if you want to adjust the earpiece volume, use the Volume keys on the left side of the phone.

- Press the ▲ key to increase the volume level and the ▼ key to decrease the level.
- In idle mode, you can also adjust the ringer volume using these keys.

Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as Voice Mail or credit card billing numbers. There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- Hard pause sends the next set of numbers when you press
- Time Pause automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

- 1. Enter a phone number from idle mode.
- Press right soft key in for Options and select is for Hard Pause or in Time Pause for a 2-second pause.
- 3. Enter additional numbers.

4. Press 📓 to dial the number.

— or—

Press right soft key in to **Options** and select **Save** to save the number in your internal Contacts.

• When dialing a number with a hard pause, press 💽 to send the next set of numbers.

Dialing From Contacts

To dial directly from a Contacts entry:

- 1. Press the right soft key 🗈 to display your **Contacts**.
- 2. Scroll up or down to highlight the desired entry and press to make the call.

Tip: If the desired entry contains more than one phone number, scroll up or down to display the number you wish to call and press to make the call.

Using One-Touch/Two-Touch Speed Dialing

You can store up to 98 numbers in your phone's speed dial memory to make contacting friends and family as easy as pressing a few buttons. With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9 and two key presses for locations 10-99. To use One-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 2-9:

 Press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds. (The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows the saved caller ID or number.)

To use Two-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 10-99:

1. Press the first digit.

 Press and hold the second digit for approximately two seconds. (The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows the saved call ID or number.)

Note: Your phone also supports 1 to 4 digit dialing. If you enter a number using the keypad without holding the last number and then press , your phone will dial those digits.

For example, if you enter 2 and press , it dials 21, not the number stored in memory location 21.

Answering Calls

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings and/or vibrates.
- The LED flashes.
- The backlight illuminates.
- The screen displays an incoming call message.

If the incoming call is from a number stored in your **Contacts**, the entry's name is displayed. The caller's phone number may also be displayed, if available.

Answering Calls

- 1. If necessary, open the phone.
- 2. Press the 🙀 key to answer the incoming call.
 - When the Flip Open option in the Call Answer menu is activated, you can answer a call by opening the phone (Menu ⁹
 ⁶
 ²
 ²
- 3. To end the call, press the \swarrow key or close the phone.

The following options are also available to handle an incoming call:

- Press either of the side volume keys to quiet the ringer.
- Press the right soft key is or by key to lgnore the incoming call and send it directly to your Voice Mail box.

Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, the Missed Call log is displayed on your screen. You have two options:

- Press the left soft key i to Save the phone number to your Contacts. See "Call History" on page 47 for further information.
- Press the right soft key information for Detail to view information about the missed call.

In-Call Options

Using the Menu Options

Select actions by pressing the right soft key in for **Options** during a call. A list of options is displayed that allows you to perform different actions during the course of a call. The following options are available:

- Key Mute allows you to activate or deactivate DTMF tones. See "DTMF Length" on page 113 for more information.
- **Contacts** accesses the Contacts menu options. See "Contacts" on page 39.
- **Messaging** allows you to check for Voice Mail and notifications. See "Messaging" on page 50.

- **3-Way Call** allows you to talk to two different people at the same time. See "Making a 3-Way Call" on page 24.
- **Call History** checks your call log for Recent, Dialed, Received and Missed calls. You can also erase the logs and view call times from this menu. See "Call History" on page 47.
- **Voice Memo** allows you to record the other person's conversation during a call. For more information, see "Voice Memo" on page 105.
- **Tools & Apps** accesses the Tools & Apps menu options. See "Tools & Apps" on page 90.
- Bost Phone Info displays your phone's hardware and software versions. See "Phone Info" on page 128.

Making a 3-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press 🔄.
- Once you have established the connection, press the right soft key in for **Options**, followed by *(a)* for **3-Way Call**.
- 3. Dial the second number and press 🚇.
- 4. When you're connected to the second party, press again to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Tip: You can also begin a Three-Way Call by displaying a phone number stored in your Internal Contacts, Call History, or Messaging. To call the third party, press

Mute/UnMute

You can place the current call on hold by pressing the left soft key for **Mute**. To reactivate your phone's microphone, press the left soft key for **UnMute**.

End-of-Call Options

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Contacts, the phone number and the duration of the call are displayed. Press the left soft key 🔅 to **Save** the number to your Contacts.

If the number is already in your Contacts, press the left soft key 📻 to **Call** the number back.

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as Unknown ID or Restricted number.

Saving a Phone Number

Your phone can store up to 500 entries (numbers/e-mails/URLs) in seven categories (Home, Office, Mobile, Pager, Fax, Email1, Email2, Others). The Contacts capacity is based on number of entries, not on number of contacts. (For more information, see "Adding a New Entry" on page 39.)

Entering Text

Selecting a Character Input Mode

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, symbols, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding a Contacts entry or when sending text messages).

To change the character input mode:

- 1. When you display a screen where you can enter text, press the right soft key in for **Options**.
- 2. Select a character input mode:
 - **Alpha** to enter characters by tapping the keypad (see page 27).
 - **T9(English)** to enter characters using predictive T9 Text Input (see page 26).
 - 3 Symbols to enter symbols (see page 28).
 - 🕰 Number to enter numbers (see page 28).
 - 🖅 Quick text to enter pre-defined sentences.
 - www to enter common letter combinations in URLs (for example, www., .com, or http://).

Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your phone by pressing keys just once per letter. To select the **T9(English)** mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 26.

T9 Text Input analyzes the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) If the word you want does not display after you have entered all the letters, press \bigcirc to scroll through additional word selections. To accept a word and insert a space, press \bigcirc .

If you make a mistake, press we to erase a single character. Press and hold we to delete an entire entry. To enter text using T9:

- From the text entry screen (for example, a new event in scheduler), press the right soft key in for **Options** and select **T9(English)**.
- Use your keypad to enter the new event. (For example, to enter "Meeting", press once, so once, so once, so once, once, and once.)

Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad

To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the Alpha mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 26). Press the corresponding key repeatedly until the desired character appears. When the Abc icon is shown, the first letter of the first word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase. The Key can be used to select the case desired.

To enter text using Alpha:

- 1. From a text entry screen (for example, a Contacts entry), press the right soft key in for **Options** and select **Alpha**.
- Use your keypad to enter the contact's name. (For example, to enter "Bill", press *2* twice, *4* three times, *5* three times, and *5* three times again.)

Characters scroll in the following order:



After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character on a different key.

Entering Numbers and Symbols

To enter numbers:

 Select the Number mode and press the appropriate key. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 26.)

To enter symbols:

• Select the **Symbol** mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 26.) To enter a symbol, press the appropriate key displayed above the desired symbol character.

Using Caller ID

Caller ID allows people to identify a caller before answering the phone by displaying the number of the Received call. If you do not want your number displayed when you make a call, just follow these easy steps.

To block your phone number from being displayed for a specific outgoing call:

- 1. Press $\underbrace{*_{t_0}}_{6^{mco}}$ $\underbrace{7_{per}}_{7_{per}}$.
- 2. Enter the number you want to call.
- 3. Press 🖉.

To permanently block your number, call the Customer Service department of your network service provider.

Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you of incoming calls by sounding two beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

Press . (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)

To switch back to the first caller:

• Press 🖉 again.

Do Not Disturb Mode

For those calls where you don't want to be interrupted, you can activate Do Not Disturb mode, which disables Call Waiting. To activate Do Not Disturb Mode:

Press 🐜 followed by 🖾 🖉 before placing your call.

To disable Do Not Disturb Mode:

Press 🐜 followed by 🏹 🕬 🕼 before placing your call.

Using Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number – even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when Call Forwarding is activated.

To Activate Call Forwarding

1. Press $(*_{\bullet})$ followed by (7_{\bullet}) (2_{\bullet}) .

- 2. Enter the area code and phone number to which your future calls should be forwarded.
- 3. Press . You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the activation of Call Forwarding.

To Deactivate Call Forwarding

- 2. Press . You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the deactivation of Call Forwarding.

Note: You may be charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

Using the Speakerphone

The speakerphone allows you to hear audio through the speaker and talk without holding your phone. When the speakerphone is activated, use the volume keys to adjust the sound level. To turn the speakerphone on or off during a call:

Press Joranee .

Warning: Due to higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

Contacts

The Contacts menu is used to store your phone numbers and other contact information (Mobile, Home, Office, Pager, Fax, E-mail1, E-mail2, and Other). You can store up to 500 entries.

Adding a New Entry

Adding a New Entry in Idle Mode

To add a new entry while in idle mode:

- 1. Enter a new phone number and press the right soft key in for **Options**.
- 2. Using the navigation keys, select **Save** and press **C**.
- Select the type of the number to be stored: Mobile, Home,
 Office, Pager, Fax, E-mail1, or E-mail2. To select the category, press the Up or Down navigation key and then press or.
- 4. Enter a name and press the left soft key 🔅 for **Done**. For information about entering text, see "Entering Text" on page 26.
- 5. Press the Up or Down navigation keys to edit information in the other categories.
- 6. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Done** to save the entry.

Adding a New Entry from the Contacts Menu

To add a new entry from the Contacts menu:

- 1. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press **I**m for **Contacts**.
- 3. Press 2. for **New Entry**.
- 4. Enter the new contact information. See "Adding a New Entry in Idle Mode" on page 39.

Finding, Editing or Dialing Contacts

There are several ways to display your Contacts entries: by name or by entry. To find an entry from the Contacts menu:

- 3. Press for **List Entries**. A list of all your Contacts is displayed. You can find a specific contact in one of the following ways:

Messaging

You can send a receive a range of different message types from your phone. Your phone has the following messaging options:

- Voice Mail: Allows you to access your voice mailbox and check for voice messages.
- **Text and Multimedia**: Allows you to compose and send text and multimedia messages to other phones able to receive the messages.
- Web Alert: Allows you to view specific Web alerts from your service provider
- E-Mail: Allows you to access your E-mail messages.
- IM & Chat: Allows you send and receive messages to and from popular Instant Messaging services and chat.
- Short Codes: Allows you to view specific information and links from your service provider.

Voice Mail

Setting Up Your Voice Mail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to your voice mail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. Therefore, you will want to set up your voice mail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated.

- 1. Press and hold the $\overbrace{}$ key.
- 2. Follow the system prompts to create your passcode, record your greeting, and record your name announcement.

Note: You must request this feature from your service provider for it to work correctly.

Voice Mail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you of a new message:

- By displaying a message on the screen.
- By sounding the assigned ringer type.
- By the LED blinking red.
- By displaying 🔀 at the top of your screen.

New Voice Mail Message Alerts

When you receive a new voice message, your phone alerts you and prompts you to call your voice mail.

To call your voice mail immediately after a message is received:

- 1. Press the \bigvee key to listen to the message.
- 2. Press the \swarrow key to return to the Idle screen.

Tip: You can also press and hold *we* to check your voice mail.

To display your Voice Mail:

Press the left soft key \bigcirc for **Menu**, followed by \bigcirc

Important: When you are roaming off the network, you may not receive notification of new voice mail messages. It is recommended that you periodically check your voice mail by dialing 1 + area code + your Phone Number. You will be charged roaming rates when accessing voice mail while roaming off the network.

Note: Your phone accepts messages even when it is turned off. However, you are only notified of new messages when your phone is turned on and you are in a Service Area.

Retrieving Your Voice Mail Messages

To dial your voice mail from your phone, you can either speed dial your voice mail by pressing and holding the navigation key up or by using the menu keys.

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press *for* **Messaging**.
- 3. Press *(Image)* for **Voice Mail**.
- 4. Press 💽 for **Dial Voice Mail**.

Note: You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voice mail from your phone.

Clearing the Message Icon

Your phone may temporarily continue to display the message icon after you have checked your voice messages. To clear the icon from the display screen:

- 2. Press $\overbrace{3}^{3}$ for **Messaging**.
- 3. Press 💷 for **Voice Mail**.
- 4. Press 2. for **Clear Icon**.

 Inighlight the desired contact and press the I key.
 When you are finished adding contacts, press the left soft key infor Next.
 - If you wish to send your message to multiple numbers or addresses, repeat step 5. Use the navigation keys to move up and down your list of addressees. You can send a message to a maximum of 10 numbers.

- 6. Create your message using the keypad. For more information on entering text, see "Entering Text" on page 26. When you are finished creating your message, press the left soft key [1] for **Send**.
 - To add a Subject line to your message, highlight the Subject box using the navigation keys. Enter the subject text. When you are finished press the left soft key i for Done.
 - To write the body of your message, highlight the main body box using the navigation keys. Enter the text of the message. When you are finished press the left soft key for **Done**.
 - To send the message, press the left soft key 🗐 to **Send**.

To add a sound, picture, or video file to your message

You can add sound clips, pictures, or videos to your message.

 - For pictures, select **Take Picture** or **Image Album**.

- If you selected **Take Picture**, the camera will start. For more information, see "Taking Pictures" on page 75.
- If you selected **Image Album**, highlight the desired clip or photograph and press or.

• For videos, select **Record Video** or **Video Album**.

- If you selected **Record Video**, the camcorder will start. For more information, see "Camcorder" on page 83.
- If you selected Video Album, highlight the desired clip and press .
- 4. The file is attached to your message. You can now finish composing and send your message.

To add a slide to your message

For lengthy messages, you can divide your message text among two slides. Each slide presents one screen of information. Each slide can contain its own sound and picture attachments.

- 1. From the message composition screen, highlight **More** using the navigation keys and press .
- 2. Highlight Add Slide using the navigation keys and press 💌.
- 3. A new body box appears below the first box. You can move between the first and second slides using the Up and Down navigation keys. You can now finish composing and send your message.

To change the sending options of the message

1. From the message composition screen, highlight **More** using the navigation keys and press the right soft key in for **Options**.

If your message contains sounds, images or slides, then your message is an MMS message. Select *for Sending Options*.

Otherwise, it is likely a SMS message. Select *for* **Sending Options**.

3. Select the option you wish to change.

- **Priority**: allows you to change the priority of the message between **Normal** and **Urgent**.

- **CC**: allows you to add a CC address to your message.
- BCC: allows you to add a BCC address to your message.
- Slide Timing: allows you set the duration (in seconds) of each slide.
- 4. When finished with your messaging options, press the 🔤 key to return to the message window.

To save your MMS message

You can save a draft of your message prior to sending it.

To save your text message

Inbox

This folder contains all your received text and multimedia messages. From this folder, you can view your messages, reply to or forward the message to another destination.

- 2. Press *for* **Messaging**.
- 3. Press 2. for **Text and Multimedia**.
- 4. Press 2 for **Inbox.** Your messages appear in a list.
- 5. Highlight the desired message and press . The message appears on screen.

To reply to a message:

- 2. Compose your reply message. For more information, see "To send a message", beginning at step 6.

Note: The address field is already filed in when replying to a message.

To select Inbox options

This folder contains saved text and multimedia messages. Saved messages will not automatically expire and must be manually deleted.

- 4. Press for **Saved.** Your saved messages appear in a list.

- Delivery Report: allows you to turn Delivery Receipt Off or On. When On, you will be notified when your message is received by the message's recipient.

- **Priority**: allows you to change the priority of the message between **High**, **Normal**, and **Low**.
- Auto Download: allows you to turn Auto Downloading Off or On. When On, the attachments for multimedia messages will automatically be downloaded to your phone.
- **Rejection Settings**: allows you to adjust the Rejection settings for your phone. The options available are:
 - **By Size**: allows you to reject multimedia messages that over a specified size.

Your phone comes equipped with Wireless Web access (**Menu** (Hernice)) through your browser. You can view specially designed version of popular sites which includes sports, weather, news, stock quotes etc.... as well as downloadable ringtones, wallpapers and games. When you launch the browser, the phone will automatically connect to the Internet.

Note: Rates and pricing vary according to your service plan. Please contact your service provider for additional information.

Launching the Browser

To launch a web connection:

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press for **Wireless Web**. You now are connected to your service provider's Web page.

Hint: In idle mode, launch the browser by pressing and holding the \propto key.

Navigating the Wireless Web

Navigating through menus and Web sites during a web session is easy once you've learned a few basics. Here are some tips for getting around:

Soft Keys

When browsing the Web, the bottom line of your phone's display contains one or more soft keys. These keys are shortcut controls for navigating around the Web, and they correspond to the soft key buttons directly below the phone's display screen. Depending on which Web sites you visit, the labels on the soft keys may change to indicate their function.

To use soft keys, simply press the desired soft key button. If an additional pop-up menu appears when you press the soft key button, select the menu items using your keypad (if they're numbered) or by highlighting the option and pressing [or].

Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to scroll up and down to see everything on some Web sites.

• Press the Up and Down navigation keys to scroll line by line or press the volume buttons on the side of the phone to scroll one page at a time.

Navigating Between Web Pages

Once you've learned how to use soft keys and scroll, you can start navigating Web sites.

 Select on-screen items by using the navigation key to highlight the desired item, then press the desired soft key button (or press ().

You'll find that the left soft key 🔃 is used primarily for selecting items.

 If the items on a page are numbered, you can use your keypad (number keys) to select an item.

Links, which appear as <u>underlined text</u>, allow you to jump to different Web pages, select special functions, or even place phone calls.

• Select links by highlighting the link and then selecting the appropriate soft key.

Tip: The tenth item in a numbered list may be selected by pressing the *low* key on your phone's keypad, even though the number 0 doesn't appear on the screen.

To go back one page, press any our phone. (Note that is also used to delete text.)

- 4. Select **Get New** and press **•**. You now are connected to your service provider's Web page. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Camera

Using the camera menu (Menu 5) in your phone, you can take photos of people or events while on the move. Additionally, you can send photos to other people in a multimedia message or set one as a wallpaper.

Taking Pictures

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in Digital Camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a button. You can activate Camera mode and take pictures whether the phone is open or closed.

To Take a Picture With the Phone Open

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press **5** for **Music&Media**.
- 3. Press *for* **Camera**.
- 4. Press for **Take Photo**.

Shortcut: To activate Camera mode, you can also press and hold the Side Camera button (C).

- 5. Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
 - To change the brightness of the screen, press the Up or Down navigation keys.
 - To zoom in or out, press the Left or Right navigation keys.
- 6. Hold the camera steady. To take the picture, press or the Side Camera button (until the shutter sounds.
 - If you wish to save your picture, press the left soft key (:) to Save your photo. The photo is stored in your photo gallery. See "Image Album" on page 79 for more details.
 - If you wish to send your picture to someone via multimedia messaging, press . Your picture is embedded in a new multimedia message. See "Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging" on page 78 for more details.
 - If you wish to discard the current picture, press the right soft key in for **Reject**. You can continue to take pictures.

To Take a Picture With the Phone Closed

- 1. Press and hold the Side Camera button (5) to activate Camera mode.
- 2. Point the camera lens at your subject. You can check the picture framing through the external display screen.

Note: If the subject images in reverse on the external display, select inversion using the volume keys to display the image correctly.

 - Self-Timer: Allows you to configure a timer for Off, 5 Seconds or 10 Seconds. To start the timer, press .
 - Fun Tools: Allows you to select one of the following options:
 - Fun Frames: A frame around the image before the picture is taken. Press the navigation key left or right to select the desired frame. Press is to select and return to camera mode.
 - Color Tones: Press the Left and Right navigation keys to select the color of the image: Auto, Monochrome, Green, Sepia, or Blue. When you find the desired tone, press .
 - White Balance: Allows you to set up the white balance of the camera automatically or manually using the different preset modes. The modes available are:
 - Auto: Automatically adjusts the lighting.

- **Sunny**: Decreases the light sensitivity for taking pictures in full or mostly sunny conditions.
- **Cloudy**: Increases light sensitivity for taking pictures under cloudy conditions.
- **Tungsten**: Adjusts the white balance to match inside lighting conditions displayed using common household light bulbs.
- **Fluorescent**: Adjusts the white balance to match inside lighting conditions displayed using common fluorescent lighting.
- **Manual**: Allows you to adjust the white balance settings manually.
- **Settings**: Allows you to configure the following settings (when you change these settings, they are saved for all subsequent shots):
 - **Resolution**: Select the size of the picture: **Best: 1280x960**, **HI: 800x600**, **Med: 640x480**, or **Low: 320x240**.
 - .Quality: Select the detail quality of the picture: Fine, Normal, or Economy.
 - Shutter Sound: Select the sound the phone makes when a picture is taken: Shutter1, Shutter2, Shutter3, or Say Cheese.
 - View Mode: Select between Landscape or Portrait layout.
- Review Pictures: View your Photo Gallery. See "Image Album" on page 79.
- Camcorder: Switch to Camcorder mode. See "Camcorder" on page 83.

Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging

1. Take your picture, as described in "To Take a Picture With the

Phone Open" on page 75, steps 1 to 4. From the Taken Picture screen, press or to send your picture as part of a multimedia message.

2. Compose your multimedia message. Your picture is already attached to the message. For more information, see "To send a message", beginning at step 6 on page 54.

Note: You will need to add a destination phone number or e-mail address to your message prior to sending it.

Image Album

From your Image Album, you can view all the pictures that you have stored on your phone. Stored pictures can be sent to others as multimedia messages.

 - To view the highlighted picture, press the left soft key i for Expand (Photo Gallery only).

- To modify your picture options, press the right soft key in for
 Options. The following options are available:
 - **Send**: Sends the picture to someone via multimedia messaging. For more information, see "Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging" on page 78.
 - **Upload**: Allows you to send a picture to an online album.
 - **Print**: Allows you to print the picture. See "PictBridge Print" on page 81.
 - **Assign**: Allows you to use the picture for a wallpaper, picture ID, or incoming caller. In the address book, pictures can be used to identify incoming callers by displaying the image on screen.
 - **Erase**: Deletes the picture from memory.
 - Erase all: Deletes all the pictures from memory.
 - **Copy/Move**: Allows you to Copy or Move the picture to your memory card.
 - Edit: Allows you to change the name of the picture.
 - **Info:** This option displays the caption, time and date, resolution, size, location and upload status of the image.

Settings

The Settings menu allows you to change the default options for common camera settings.

- Save To: Select either In Phone or In Memory card as the default save location.
- View Mode: Allows you to select between Portrait and Landscape viewing.

PictBridge Print

PictBridge is an industry standard established by the Camera & Imaging Products Association (CIPA) that enables a range of digital photo solutions including direct photo printing from a digital camera to a printer without the need for a PC.

Note: There are many PictBridge devices in the market whose compatibility with your phone cannot be guaranteed.

Printing From Your Phone

Your phone comes equipped with a built-in camera that allows you to print images directly to a printer using the PictBridge technology. A USB cable must be connected between the two devices before any printing can occur.

To use PictBridge to print pictures from your phone:

- 1. Insert one end of the accessory cable into the USB slot on the printer. (Printer must support PictBridge technology.)
- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press 5 for Music&Media.
- 3. Press *for* **Camera**.
- 4. Press 4 for **PictBridge Print**.
- 5. Insert the USB cable into your phone.
- 6. Read the on-screen "Connect Printer" message and press the left soft key 🔅 for **OK**.
- 7. Select the image gallery (**Photo Gallery**, **MMS**, or **Transferred Images**) and press **ON**.
- 8. Highlight the desired image and press the left soft key 🔅 for **Next**. (To select multiple images, press 🐼 to place a check mark next to each image selected.)

- 9. Highlight **Copies** and press the navigation key left or right to select the desired number of copies to print.
- Press the navigation key down to select Size. Press the navigation key left or right to select one of the following sizes:
 4x6, Letter, A4, or Default.

Note: These sizes are may vary and are dependent on the printer's capabilities.

- 11. Press the navigation key down to select **Type**. Press the navigation key left or right to select one of the following:
 - **Standard**: prints the standard image.
 - Index: prints the index information.

Note: These options may vary and are dependent on the printer's capabilities.

- 12. Press the navigation key down to select **Border**. Press navigation key left or right to select on or off.
- 13. Press the navigation key down to select **Date Print**. the navigation key left or right to select **On** or **Off**.
- 14. Press the right soft key 🗈 to **Preview** the image the left soft key 🔅 to **Print** the image.
- 15. Select **Yes** to confirm printing and press **•**.

Camcorder

Using the Camcorder menu (Menu 5 2) in your phone, you can take videos of people or events while on the move. Additionally, you can set one as a wallpaper.

Taking Videos

Taking videos with your phone's built-in camcorder is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a button.

To Take a Video

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press **5** for **Music&Media**.
- 3. Press *(The concorder.)*
- 4. Press for **Take New**.
- 5. Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camcorder lens at your subject.
 - To change the brightness of the screen, press the Up or Down navigation keys.
 - To zoom in or out, press the Left or Right navigation keys.
- 6. Hold the camcorder steady. To start the video, press . To stop the video, press . To again.
 - If you wish to save your video, press the left soft key it to
 Save your video. The video is stored in your video gallery.
 See "Video Album" on page 85 for more details.
 - If you wish to send your video to someone via multimedia messaging, press . Your video is embedded in a new multimedia message. See "Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging" on page 78 for more details.

 If you wish to discard the current video, press the right soft key in for **Reject**. You can continue to take videos.

Camcorder Options

There are several settings associated with the camcorder. These settings allow you to customize how the camcorder operates when taking videos.

- 1. Start the camcorder. For more information, see "Taking Videos" on page 83.
- 2. Press the right soft key 🗈 for **Options**.
- 3. Press the number key corresponding to the desired option.
 - Movie Light: Allows you to configure the operation of the light: Off, On This Movie, or Always On.
 - Self-Timer: Allows you to configure a timer for Off, 5 Seconds or 10 Seconds. To start the timer, press .
 - Color Tones: Press the Left and Right navigation keys to select the color of the video: Auto, Monochrome, Green, Sepia, or Blue. When you find the desired tone, press .
 - White Balance: Allows you to set up the white balance of the camcorder automatically or manually using the different preset modes. The modes available are:
 - Auto: Automatically adjusts the lighting.
 - **Sunny**: Decreases the light sensitivity for taking videos in full or mostly sunny conditions.
 - **Cloudy**: Increases light sensitivity for taking videos under cloudy conditions.
 - **Tungsten**: Adjusts the white balance to match inside lighting conditions displayed using common household light bulbs.

- **Fluorescent**: Adjusts the white balance to match inside lighting conditions displayed using common fluorescent lighting.
- **Manual**: Allows you to adjust the white balance settings manually.
- .Quality: Select the detail quality of the video: Fine, Normal, or Economy.
- **Review Movies**: View your Video Album. See "Video Album" on page 85.
- **Camera Mode**: Switch to Camera mode. See "Camera" on page 75.

Video Album

From your Video Album, you can view all the videos that you have stored on your phone. Videos can be sent to others as multimedia messages.

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press **5** for **Music&Media**.
- 3. Press **T** for **Camcorder**.
- 4. Press 2 for Video Album.
- 5. Select an album:
 - Wideo Gallery: Videos you have taken.

 - **Transferred Videos**: Videos you have transferred from the memory card.

- 6. Using the navigation keys, scroll through the your stored videos and highlight the desired video.
 - To play the highlighted video, press the left soft key i for Play (Video Gallery only).
 - To modify your video options, press the right soft key in for Options. The following options are available:
 - **Send**: Sends the video to someone via multimedia messaging. For more information, see "Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging" on page 78.
 - **Upload**: Allows you to send a video to an online album.
 - **Assign**: Allows you to use the video for a wallpaper.
 - **Erase**: Deletes the video from memory.
 - **Erase All**: Deletes all the videos from memory.
 - Copy/Move: Allows you to Copy or Move the video to your memory card.
 - Edit: Allows you to change the name of the video.
 - **Info:** This option displays the caption, time and date, resolution, size, location and upload status of the video.

Settings

The Settings menu allows you to change the default options for common camcorder settings.

• Save To: Select either In Phone or In Memory card as the default save location.

You can download and play games already stored on your phone.

- 3. Highlight **Get New** and press . The browser will launch and take you to the download menu.
- 4. Follow the instructions of the screen for information about online and downloadable games.

Fools & Apps

Tools & Apps

Tools & Apps (**Menu**) provide helpful software applications to help you perform common functions, such as:

- set an alarm so that the phone rings at a specific time, such as to remind you of an appointment.
- view a calendar and organize your schedule.
- use the phone as a calculator for basic mathematical equations or currency exchange operations.
- view times in different parts of the world.
- use a timer or stopwatch.

New Tools

You can download new tools and applications:

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press *m* for **Tools & Apps**.
- 3. Press for **New Tools**. The browser will launch and take you to the download menu.

GPS Services

With GPS Services, you can download new applications that use your phone's GPS features.

Note: Feature based on carrier network availability.

- 1. Press the left soft key 📋 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press end for Tools & Apps.
- 3. Press 2. for **GPS Services**.

4. Highlight **Get New** and press . The browser will launch and take you to the download menu.

Calculator

Your phone comes with a built-in calculator.

- 1. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press 🖅 for **Tools & Apps**.
- 3. Press 🔊 for **Calculator**.
- 4. Enter a number with the keypad. (Press : or to insert a decimal point and/or to make the number negative or positive.)
- 5. Use your navigation key to select a mathematical function:
 - Left to Subtract
 - Up to Multiply
 - Right to Add
 - Down to Divide
- 6. Enter the next number using the keypad. Repeat steps 5 to 7 as necessary.
- 7. Press or to view the results.

Alarm Clock

Your phone comes with a built-in alarm clock with multiple alarm times. To use the alarm clock:

- 1. Press the left soft key 📄 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press 🖅 for **Tools & Apps**.
- 3. Press 4 for Alarm Clock.

- 9. Press the navigation key down once and then press it right or left to select the Repeat interval:



10. Press the left soft key 🔃 for **Done**.

Planner

Your Planner helps organize your time and reminds you of important events. To add an event to today's schedule:

- 1. Press the left soft key 📄 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press *m* for **Tools & Apps**.
- 3. Press **5** for **Planner**.
- 4. Select a Planner type:
 - Today: Displays today's events.
 - Scheduler: Displays a calendar from which you can select a day.
 - 399 **Task List:** Displays a to-do list.
 - Countdown: Displays a countdown to a specific time.

Using Today Entries

You can use the Today menu (**Menu** \square \square \square \square \square) to display all the **Scheduler**, **Task**, and **Count** entries for the current day:

- Press the Left and Right navigation keys to switch between Scheduler, Task, and Countdown.
- Press the right soft key in and select Jump to date to view a different day.

Using Scheduler Entries

The Scheduler menu contains a calendar to keep track of your schedule and lets you set alarms to act as reminders.

To Enter a Scheduler Entry

- 2. If this is the first entry, enter a description of the event. See "Entering Text" on page 26.

Otherwise, press the navigation keys to select a day and press the left soft key i for **View**, then press the left soft key i for **Add New**. Enter a description of the event.

- 3. Press the left soft key 🧾 for **Next**.
- 4. Press the Left or Right navigation keys to select the amount of warning before the event: **Appointment**, **Business**, **Personal**, **Vacation**, or **Birthday**.
- Press the navigation key down once and press the Left or Right navigation keys to select the type of event: 10min before, 30min before, 1Hr before, No Alarm, or On Time.
- Press the navigation key down once and press the Left or Right navigation keys to select how often the event occurs: Once, Daily, Weekly, Monthly, or Yearly.
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- Press the navigation key down once and press or to select an alarm tone from Single Tones, Ring Tones, Melodies, or Downloaded. See "Ringers" on page 110.
- 8. Press the navigation key down once and then use the keypad to enter the Start time.
- 9. Press the right soft key 🗈 to select AM or PM.
- 10. Press the navigation key down once and then use the keypad to enter the End time.
- 11. Press the navigation key down once and press or to select a contact.
- 12. Press the left soft key 🔅 to select **Done.**

To View Scheduler Options

You can select the following options in the Scheduler menu by pressing the right soft key in for **Options**:

- Add New: Enter a new Scheduler event.
- View Type: Switch the Scheduler view to Monthly, Weekly, or Daily.
- **Jump to Date**: View the events for a specific day. Press the Left or Right navigation key to select an option and then press the Down navigation key to enter the date information:
 - By Date: Use the keypad to enter a date and press the left soft key if for OK.
 - By Term: Select either Before or After, press Down, and use the keypad to enter the number of days. Press the left soft key () for OK.
- Erase All: Use the Up or Down navigation key to select either Yes or No.

Using the Task List

You can use the Task function to in the same way you would use a todo list. When the task has been completed, you can check it off as done. To enter tasks into your Planner, follow these steps:

To Enter a Task

- 1. Display the Task List (Menu 📧 5...)
- If this is the first entry, enter a description of the countdown. Otherwise, press the left soft key if for Add New and enter the text. See "Entering Text" on page 26.
- 3. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **Next**.
- 4. Use the Left and Right navigation key to select a priority for the task: **Low** or **High**.
- 5. Press the Down navigation key and use the keypad to enter the **Due Time**. Press the right soft key : to select **AM** or **PM**.
- 6. Press the navigation key down once.
- 7. Use the keypad to enter the **Due Date**.
- 8. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **Done**.

To View or Edit the Current Tasks

- 2. Highlight a talk and press 💽. The task is displayed.
 - To edit the task, press the left soft key 🧾 for **Edit**.
 - To delete task, press the right soft key 🗈 for **Options** and select **Erase**.

Note: To delete all the tasks, from the **Task List** menu, press the right soft key for **Options** and select **Erase All**.

Using Countdown List

You can use the Countdown List function to remind you how much time is left until a specific event.

To Enter a Countdown

- If this is the first entry, enter a description of the countdown. Otherwise, press the left soft key for Add New and enter the text. See "Entering Text" on page 26.
- 3. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **Next**.
- 4. Use the keypad to enter the countdown Time.
- 5. Press the right soft key 🗈 to select **AM** or **PM**.
- 6. Press the navigation key down once.
- 7. Use the keypad to enter the countdown date.
- 8. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **Done**.

To View or Edit the Current Countdowns

- 1. Display the **Countdown** (Menu **Bundle 1**.)
- 2. Highlight a countdown and press . The countdown is displayed.
 - To edit the countdown, press the left soft key 🧾 for **Edit**.
 - To delete countdown, press the right soft key in for Options and select Erase.

Note: To delete all the countdowns, from the **Countdown** menu, press the right soft key for **Options** and select **Erase All**.

Notepad

Your phone comes with a notepad you can use to compose and store reminders and notes to help keep you organized.

Adding a Note

- 1. Display the **Notepad** (Menu \bigcirc).
- 2. If this is the first entry, enter the text. Otherwise, press the left soft key if for **Add New**. See "Entering Text" on page 26.
- 3. Enter up to 160 characters in the note using the keypad and press the left soft key 🗐 for **OK**.

Viewing a Note

- 1. Display the **Notepad** (Menu 🖭 6...).
- Use the navigation keys to scroll to the desired note and press
 to view the note details.

Deleting a Note

- 1. Display the **Notepad** (Menu 📧 6⁻⁻⁻⁻).
- 2. Highlight the note you wish to delete using the navigation keys.
- 3. Press the right soft key 🗈 for **Options**.
- 4. Select an option:
 - Erase: Delete the highlighted note.
 - Erase All: Delete all the notes.
- 5. Highlight **Yes** with the navigation key and press or to confirm.
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Setting the Skin of a Note

- 1. Display the **Notepad** (Menu 🕑 🍅).
- 2. Highlight the note using the navigation keys.
- 3. Press the right soft key 🗈 for **Options**.
- 4. Select Set Skin.
- 5. Press the left and right navigation keys to display the different skins.
- 6. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **Assign**. The note is saved with the new skin.

World Clock

World Clock displays what time it is in twenty-four different time zones around the world together with one or more major cities, states, regions, or countries in a time zone.

- 1. Display World Time (Menu 📧 🔽).
- 2. Press the navigation key left, right, up, or down to display the different time zones.
- 3. Press the right soft key 🗈 set Daylight Savings **On** or **Off**.

Voice Service

Activating Voice Recognition

Voice recognition allows you to say commands to perform common functions supported by your phone. There is no voice training required to use the voice recognition feature. You simply say the predesignated command displayed on your screen in a normal tone of voice to perform the desired function.

To activate voice recognition:

- 1. Press and hold *m* or . (The phone prompts you to say a voice command.)
- 2. Wait for the beep and then say one of the following commands:
 - Call

• Go To

- Send Text
- Lookup
- Check

When it recognizes one of these commands, the phone launches the associated application. If the phone does not hear a command within approximately eight seconds, it de-activates voice recognition without taking any action.

Call

Call allows you to dial any valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number by speaking the number naturally, without pausing between the digits.

Tips for using voice Dial:

- Call works best in quieter environments.
- When saying a number, speak at a normal speed and say each digit clearly. There is no need to pause between digits.
- The phone recognizes the digits one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, zero, and oh. The phone does not recognize numbers such as "one eight hundred" for "1-800." Instead, say "one-eight-zero-zero."
- The phone recognizes only valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone numbers.
- If your phone does not usually recognize you correctly when you are using voice Call, try adapting Call to your voice, which can significantly improve accuracy for some speakers. (See "Changing Voice Dial Sensitivity" on page 103 for details.)

To place a call using voice Call:

- 1. Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding. (The phone prompts you for a command.)
- 2. Say **Call**. (The phone prompts you to say the number.)
- 3. Say either a name stored in your Contacts or a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number naturally and clearly.
 - If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by the correct number, say "Yes." (You can also select the correct number from those displayed on the screen by pressing on the correct number. The phone will then dial the number.)
 - If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect number, say No. (If there are other alternatives, the phone will prompt you with the next one. You can also press the navigation key up or down to select the correct number from the Choice List, and then press or to dial.)
 - If you said a name listed in your Contacts that has more than one number associated with it, the phone displays the different locations (Home, Office, Mobile, Pager, Fax) and asks you which one to dial. Say one of the location names and the phone will dial the number for the location you specified.

Note: In some cases, the phone might ask you to repeat a name or number. Make sure that the number is a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number, and then say the number again. If the number

isn't valid, or if the phone still doesn't understand the number on the second try, it will not place a call.

Enabling/Disabling Choice Lists

You can customize whether the Call feature displays the list of top voice recognition choices or automatically dials the first number, without displaying a choice list.

To enable or disable choice lists for Voice Dial:

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press 🖅 for **Tools & Apps**.
- 3. Press 🖅 for **Voice Service**.
- 4. Press the left soft key 🧾 for **Settings**.
- 5. Highlight **Choice Lists** and press **•**.
- 6. Press the navigation key up or down to select **Automatic**, **Always On** or **Always Off** and press left soft key i for **OK**.

Lookup

Lookup lets you retrieve contact information for any person in your Contacts by saying the full name of the person.

To retrieve information using Lookup:

- Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding so or .
 (The phone will prompt you for a command.)
- 2. Say **Lookup**. (The phone will prompt you to say the name.)
- 3. Say the full name of the person, exactly as it is entered in your Contacts. (The phone will play the name it recognized through the earpiece, and then open the contact information for that name.)
 - If the phone says, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say **No**. The phone then prompts you with the next

name, if there is one. If there are no more names, the phone will say "Sorry, No Match Found."

Send Text

The Go To option allows you to quickly send a text message to a person in your Contacts by saying the full name of the person.

- Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding e or .
 (The phone will prompt you for a command.)
- 2. Say the full name of the person, exactly as it is entered in your Contacts. (The phone will play the name it recognized through the earpiece, and then open the contact information for that name.)
- 3. If the phone says, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say **No**. The phone then prompts you with the next name, if there is one. If there are no more names, the phone will say "Sorry, No Match Found."

Go To

The Go To option allows you to quickly launch a menu item.

- Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding sor (The phone will prompt you for a command.)
- Wait for the beep and say Go To followed by one of the following words: Contacts, Call History, Messaging, Wireless Web, or Next Menu.

Check

The Check option gives you an update on the status of your phone.

Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding e or .
 (The phone will prompt you for a command.)

 Wait for the beep and say Status followed by one of the following words: Status, Signal, Network, Battery, or My Phone #.

Changing Voice Dial Sensitivity

You can adjust your phone's sensitivity to sounds when listening for voice commands or names, making it require a more exact or less exact sound match before responding to your command.

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press 🖅 for **Tools & Apps**.
- 3. Press 🔊 for **Voice Service**.
- 4. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Settings**.
- 5. Press 2. for **Sensitivity**.
- 6. Press the navigation key up or down to select **Reject More**, **Recommended**, or **Reject Less** and press the left soft key for **OK**.
 - If you select **Reject More**, your phone will require a more exact sound match and if you select **Reject Less**, your phone will require a less exact sound match.

Configuring Digit Dialing

You can configure your phone to adapt to your voice when using voice-based dialing.

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press 🔊 for **Tools & Apps**.
- 3. Press **B** for **Voice Service**.
- 4. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Settings**.

- 5. Press 3 for **Digit Dialing**.
- 6. Press for Adapt Digits.
- 7. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **OK**.
- 8. Follow the instructs presented on your screen to configure your phone for your voice. You will be prompted to record a series of numbers. After listening to each recording, press the left soft
 iii key for Yes to keep the recording, or press the right soft key iii for No to reject the recording.

Hint: To reset digit dialing, press *for* **Reset Digits** while in the Digit Dialing menu.

Changing Voice Dial Prompts

By default, your phone provides audio prompts such as "Please say a command". You can turn these prompts on or off.

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press 🔊 for **Tools & Apps**.
- 3. Press **B** for **Voice Service**.
- 4. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Settings**.
- 5. Press $\overset{4}{\frown}$ for **Sound**.
- 6. Press \frown for **Prompts**, \frown for **Digits** or \frown for **Names**.

Hint: Press 4 to change the speed and volume that names are repeated.

7. Press the navigation key up or down to select **On** or **Off** and press the left soft key if for **OK**.

Changing Voice Launch

By default, voice commands are activated by pressing and holding or . You can change your phone's settings to activate voice commands whenever you open the flip lid of your phone.

Voice Memo

You can use your phone to record brief memos to remind you of important events, phone numbers, or other items.

Recording Voice Memos

To record a voice memo:

 - Press the left soft key i to Pause the memo. (When a memo is paused, press the left soft key i again to Resume recording.)

- 6. To finish recording, press the right soft key 🗈 to **Finish** the recording prior to the countdown completion.
- 7. The memo is saved to your phone. Press the left soft key 📻 to **Play** your message for review.

Tip: You can also assign Voice Memos to either the left or right navigation keys. For more information, see "Configure Nav. Key Shortcuts" on page 123.

Recording Phone Call Conversations

To record a conversation during a phone call:

- 2. Press for **Voice Memo**. (A one minute counter is displayed on the screen to indicating the amount of time a single voice memo can be recorded.)

Voice Memo Options

- **Erase All**: Erase all the voice memos.
- Copy/Move: Copy or Move the selected voice memo to your memory card, if present.
- **Rename**: Change the description of the voice memo.
- Info: Displays information about the selected voice memo, such as length and recording date.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth[®] is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet without requiring a physical connection.

Unlike infrared, you don't need to line up the devices to beam information with Bluetooth[®]. If the devices are within a range of one another, you can exchange information between them, even if they are located in different rooms.

Add New Device

To add a new device:

- 1. Display **Bluetooth** (Menu 📧 🗆.
- 2. Press the left soft key 🔅 for Add New.
- 3. Select one of the following options:
 - Search: The phone will search for available devices. After the phone finds a new device, press the left soft key i for Add to List. Enter a PIN for your phone and press .

- 4. Enter a name for the device or keep the default name.
- 5. Press the left soft key 🔅 for **Done**.

Options

After a device is added to your list of Trusted Devices, press the right soft key : to select from the following options:

- **Erase**: This option lets you delete the highlighted trusted device.
- Erase All: This option lets you delete all the trusted devices.
- Info: This option lets you view information about the highlighted trusted device.
- Settings: This option lets you configure your Bluetooth[®] settings. See "Bluetooth" on page 121 for more information.

Note: The software in this handset supports Bluetooth profiles: HSP, HFP, OPP (v-card only), DUN, BPP. However, the software does not support the transfer of data files.

Other Applications

Other applications (**Menu Service**) shows any applications you have downloaded from your service provider. See "Tools & Apps" on page 90 for information about downloading new software. To see how much memory you have left for applications, press the right soft key in and then press is to display **Memory Status**.

Phone Settings

You can customize your phone's display, sound and other settings to the way you like it.

Ringers

Different ringer types help you identify incoming calls and messages. You can assign ringer types to individual Contacts entries, types of calls, schedules, types of alarms, and types of messages. Ringer types available for assignment include:

- Single Tones: include a variety of standard ringer types.
- **Ring Tones**: include a variety of standard musical melodies.
- **Melodies**: includes a variety of short songs.
- Downloaded: Ringtones includes all the ringtones you have previously downloaded. See "Shop" on page 89

Voice Calls

- Lock Camera: Restricts the use of the phone's built-in camera. Select **On** or **Off**.
- Lock Camcorder: Restricts the use of the phone's builtin camcorder. Select On or Off.
- Change Lock: Change the lock code for your phone. Enter the new number and press the left soft key for Next. You will be asked to confirm the new number.
- Special #: Allows you to enter special phone numbers which can be called even if the phone is locked. Select one of the slots and press the left soft key if for Select. Type in the new number and press or to save.

- Erase Contacts: Deletes all your Contacts. Select Yes or No.
- **Erase Downloads**: Deletes the contents of your Downloads. Select **Yes** or **No**.
- Erase Image Album: Deletes the contents of your Image Album. Select Yes or No.
- Erase Sound Album: Deletes the contents of your Sound Album. Select Yes or No.
- **Erase Video Album**: Deletes the contents of your Video Album. Select **Yes** or **No**.
- **Reset Phone**: Returns all phone options to their factory default. Select **Yes** or **No**.

Airplane Mode

Airplane Mode allows you to use many of your phone's features, such as Games, Notepad, Voice Memos, etc., when you are in an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited. When your phone is in Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information. All incoming calls will be sent directly to your voice mail box.

- 1. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Menu**.
- 2. Press 🔊 for **Settings**.
- 3. Press **B** for **Airplane Mode**.
- 4. Press the left soft key 🗐 for **Next**.
- 5. Press the navigation key up or down to select **On** or **Off**.
- 6. Press or to save and exit.

Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

Understanding the Power Save Feature

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to standby mode.

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

Knowing Radio Frequency Safety

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below. In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- Try not to cover the phone's antenna.
- Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a dealer store or call Customer Support for service.

Note: For the best care of your phone, only authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first. When using your phone in the car:

- Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and re-dial.
- When available, use a hands-free device.
- Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Restricting Children's Access to your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone, dial 911 by mistake or make calls that increase your phone bill.

Caring for the Battery

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Samsung approved batteries and travel adapters. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. When used correctly, the battery can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:
 - Less than one month: 4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C)
 - More than one month: 4° F to 113° F (-20° C to 45° C)

Disposal of Lithium Ion (Lilon) Batteries

For safe disposal options of your Lilon batteries, contact your nearest service center.

Special Note: Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

Note: For safety, do not handle a damaged or leaking Lilon battery.

What is important to remember is that each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SARs do not represent a variation in safety. All phones must meet the federal standard, which incorporates a substantial margin of safety. As stated above, variations in SAR values between different model phones do not mean variations in safety. SAR values at or below the federal standard of 1.6 W/kg are considered safe for use by the public.
