Four Basic Rules of Firearm Safety:

1. Treat every gun as if it were _____.

Entering the Range:

8. _____ and _____ protection must be worn by everyone on the firing line whenever the line is hot.

On the Firing Line:

10. No _____ firearms are allowed on the back bench.
 - A) Do not take an uncased firearm from the back bench to the front bench; bring the _____ firearm to the front bench and then open the case with the _____ pointing down range.
 - B) Do not take an uncased firearm from the front bench to the back bench; bring the _____ to the front bench and then insert the unloaded firearm into the case with the _____ pointing down range.

11. All shooting on the main range must be done at approximately 90 degrees to the firing line. Do not shoot _____ lanes. Your muzzle should be directly over the firing line (yellow on the main range).
12. Always observe the 180 degree rule. Muzzle must always point _____, even when casing and uncasing firearms.
13. Only _____ fire is allowed on the range, no "hip" shooting without using the sights / scope on the gun. No uncontrolled fire is allowed at any time.
14. Drawing from a _____ and firing is not allowed.
15. Fired bullets _____ impact the berms; bullets should not impact the ground, posts, overhead baffles, plastic drums, or any other unauthorized target (see approved target list).
16. Clean up any mess you make on the firing line. This includes sweeping up brass and picking up shotgun hulls. Do not leave _____, _____, or _____ ammo on club property.
17. Handguns and rifles in traditional _____ calibers from .25 ACP up to and including .500 S&W magnum are allowed. .17 HMR, .17 Mach 2, .22LR, and .22 MAG are also allowed. This list is not comprehensive; please see the website for the _____ Cartridge List. If you're not sure if your caliber is allowed, _____ before you shoot! No armor piercing, tracer, or explosive ammunition is allowed.
18. Children under the age of 18 years old on the range:
 - A) Children under the age of _____ are not allowed on the firing line.
 - B) Children must be under the direct _____ and control of an adult member at all times.
 - C) At any time a child is on the range, the supervising adult must be within an _____ reach of the child
 - D) The adult member is responsible for the child's actions, and if a child violates a rule, the adult's membership may be _____ or _____.
 - E) One adult may supervise no more than two children under 18.
19. Airguns, regardless of ft/lbs rating, are subject to all of the same rules as other _____.
20. No smoking is allowed within 30 _____ of any black powder guns or equipment.

Target, Placement, and Usage for the Main Range and Shooting Bays:

21. Only target types listed below are allowed on the range. No targets of _____ (i.e. birds, rocks, soda cans, etc.) are allowed. Maximum height of stationary targets is 5' to the top edge. Minimum height of stationary targets MUST be sufficient to prevent bullets from impacting the gravel.
 - A) Place targets so a bullet passing through the target enters the berm without hitting the _____. Make sure your rounds do not contact the metal target rings.
 - B) Bullets should not strike the _____ at any time.
22. _____ Targets - Any target made of paper commercial or homemade.

23. _____ Targets - Must be commercially produced and rated for the caliber you are shooting.
- A) Steel Targets must be HUNG UP directly in front of a berm and in a manner that causes the lead splatter created when a bullet hits the target to be deflected to the ground below the target. Do not use the Turning Target Frames (South Range at the 25 Yard Line) to hang steel targets, as bullet fragments can damage the turning mechanism. Per the recommendation of the US Practical Shooting Association; place steel targets a minimum of 23 feet from the shooter.
24. _____ Pigeons - Commercially produced clay pigeons used for Skeet and Trap. Aerial target shooting for shotgun allowed, use shot size 6 or higher. If no other shooters are on the main range, clay pigeons may only be thrown from the main range grassy area (where people normally stand during Trap night). If other shooters are present (i.e. at the North or South end), all people must remain behind the yellow firing line. Aerial targets may not be thrown in the bays.

Calling the Line Hot or Cold:

25. Anyone on the range may call a “ _____ ” at any time they see a potentially hazardous situation. Cease fire requires all shooters to immediately stop _____, and point their guns in a _____ direction while _____ them.

29. To call the line cold:

- A) Call “ _____!” and point out to the range. If a shooter is completing a string of shots, he may ignore this command until he is done. Please respect other shooters and clear your guns safely and quickly.
- B) When done shooting, each shooter must clear his gun by removing all _____ (and the magazine, if present) and locking the action open. The gun must then be cased, or set on the bench pointing _____. After their guns are clear, each shooter must step 3 feet back from the firing line and raise _____ hands.
- C) Semi-autos without a slide holdback mechanism should have an _____ case inserted to hold the slide open.
- D) Black powder guns must have the caps removed, pans clear, and hammers down. Any loaded black powder gun must be cleared by _____ before the line can be made safe.
- E) When the person who initially called “CLEAR!” sees that everyone has stepped back, they should raise both hands. The shooter may then say “THE LINE IS _____!” At this point the part of the range in front of the firing line is deemed cold and targets may be changed, items in front of the firing line may be picked up, etc.

30. To call the line hot:

- A) Make sure that no one is in _____ of the firing line, then call “READY!”.
- B) When ready, everyone on the line must respond by raising _____ hand.
- C) Because there are some visual obstructions on the firing line, shooters should step back slightly before gesturing, so everyone can see.
- D) If a shooter sees some reason the line should not go hot, they must say “ _____!” until the line can be safely made hot.
- E) When the person who initially called “READY!” sees that everyone has raised one hand, they should raise their hand and call “THE LINE IS _____”. At this point shooting may begin. Please be respectful of other shooters’ time and minimize the amount of time you spend changing targets, so that we can maximize the amount of time members can shoot.

Rules for the Bays:

- 31. If more than 1 person desires to use a bay, each bay shall be divided amongst up to _____ active shooters and the shooters shall all agree on a common firing line.
- 32. Keep your targets as close to the back _____ and as close to the _____ as possible without risking impacting the ground.
- 33. Targets in the bays may be placed in an array similar to Friday Night Steel, but the muzzle must ALWAYS point _____.
- 34. _____ shooting of aerial targets (i.e. no throwing clay pigeons) in the shooting bays.

General Club and Grounds Rules:

35. The range is open from 8:00am until _____ (when the security lights on the range come on).

Self-Policing:

46. The Board has appointed members who act as Safety Officers that _____ their time to oversee club grounds and ensure that club rules are followed. They enforce the rules as set by the _____ and can be identified by their brightly colored hats and or vests. If they notice that a safety violation has or is about to happen, the following steps will be taken:
 - A) They will fill out a _____ Concern Form and put it in the drop box.
 - B) They will inform the offender of the _____ that was broken.
 - C) If the violation is such that it constitutes a safety hazard, they will request that the person _____ the range. Examples of violations that warrant this action are: Touching or discharging a firearm when the line is cold, any accidental discharge of a gun, allowing an uncased firearm to point at a person, shooting in a manner such that it is likely that a bullet would leave the range, etc.
47. It is the responsibility of _____ MEMBERS to see that association rules are followed. If a member witnesses a rule violation, the following steps should be taken:
 - A) Fill out a _____ Concern Form and put it in the drop box.
