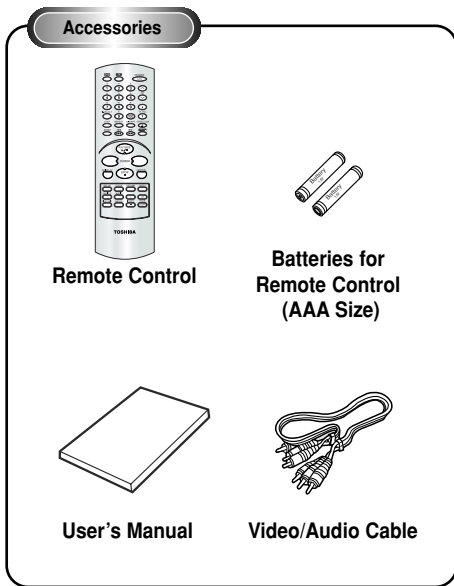
- Do not keep under direct sunlight.

Before you start



Install Batteries in the Remote

1. Open the battery cover on the back of the remote.
2. Insert two AAA batteries. Make sure that the polarities (+ and -) are aligned correctly.
3. Replace the battery cover.

If remote doesn't operate properly:

- Check the polarity + - of the batteries (Dry-Cell)
- Check if the batteries are drained.
- Check if remote sensor is blocked by obstacles.
- Check if there is any fluorescent lighting nearby.
- Add in the distance & angle of the remote control with reference whit remote receiver.

General Features

DVD Changer

The DVD Changer holds 5 discs and provides full random play with fast disc changes when press and hold NUMBER button.

Excellent Sound

Dolby Digital, a technology developed by Dolby Laboratories, provides crystal clear sound reproduction.

Screen

Both regular and widescreen(16:9) pictures can be viewed.

Slow Motion

An important scene can be viewed in slow motion.

Programmed Play (CD)

You can program tracks to play in desired order.

Parental Control (DVD)

The parental control allows users to set the level necessary to prohibit children from viewing harmful movies such as those with violence, adult subject matter, etc.

Various On-Screen Menu Functions

You can select various languages (Audio/Subtitle) and screen angles while enjoying movies.

Progressive Scan

Progressive scanning creates an improved picture with double the scan lines of a conventional interlaced picture.

Digital Photo Viewer (JPEG)

You can view Digital Photos on your TV.

Repeat

You can repeat a song or movie simply by pressing the REPEAT button.

MP3/WMA

This unit can play discs created from MP3/WMA files.

SACD (Super Audio CD)

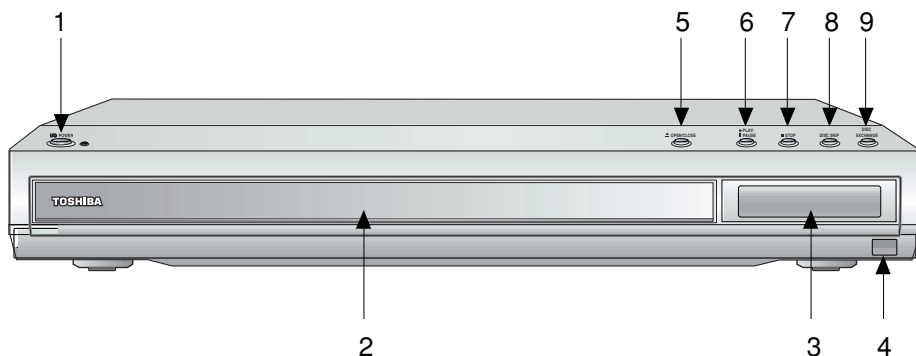

Play Region Number

Both the DVD player and the discs are coded by region. These regional codes must match in order for the disc to play. If the codes do not match, the disc will not play. The Region number for this player is 1. If region for numbers, which stand for their playable area, are printed on your DVD video disc and you do not find  or , disc playback will not be allowed by the player. If the DVD disc does not have any region number printed, the disc playback is not guaranteed.

Description-Front Panel



Front Panel Controls

1. POWER (I/O)

- Use to turn your player on and off (standby).

2. DVD CHANGER (TRAY)

- Press OPEN/CLOSE to open and close the disc changer.

3. FRONT DISPLAY

- Operation indicators are displayed here.

4. REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR

5. OPEN/CLOSE (▲)

- Press to open and close the disc tray.

6. PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||)

- Begin or pause disc play.

7. STOP (■)

- Stops disc play.

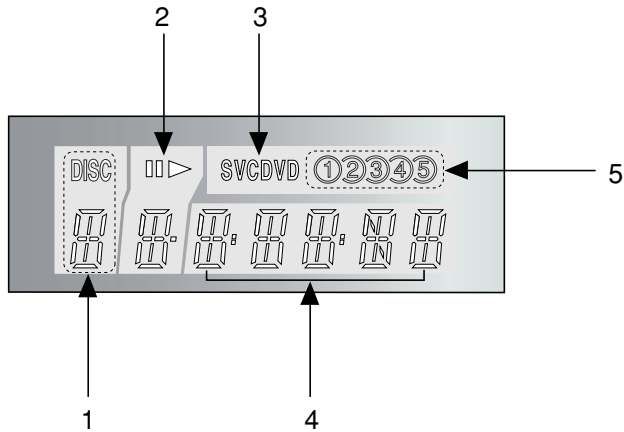
8. DISC SKIP

- Use to skip a disc in order.

9. DISC EXCHANGE

- Press this button when you want to change a disc without stopping playback of the current disc.

Display Indicators



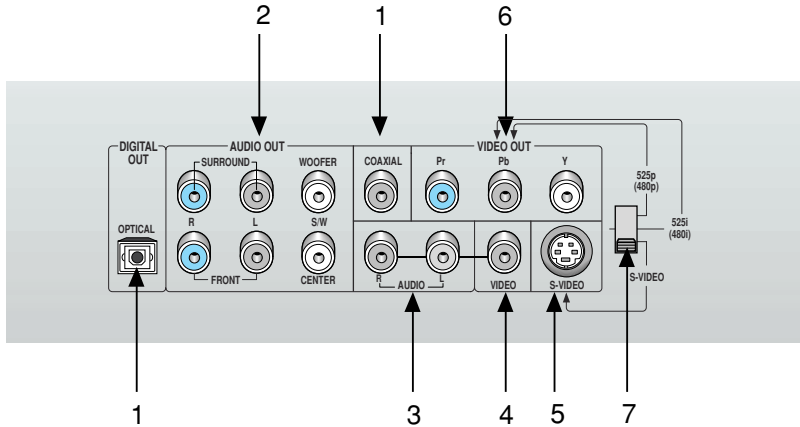
Front Panel Display

1. Tray number / Chapter / Track Indicator
2. Play / Pause / Forward play
3. Disc type indicator
4. Displays various messages concerning operations such as PLAY, STOP, LOAD, ...
no DISC : No disc loaded.
OPEN : The disc tray is open.
LOAD : Player is loading disc information.
5. Disc indicator
 - Indicates all the discs being in tray.
 - The tray number in playing twinkles.

Important Note

- In case of initial playback after opening, the indicator inexactly displays a tray number whether or not each tray has a disc, please check the tray by using the DISC SKIP button.
- During playback of SACD, the indicator scrolls "SACD" once after first loading and display "CD".
- During playback of DVD-AUDIO, the indicator scrolls "DVD-AUDIO" once after first loading and display "DVD".

Description-Rear Panel



Rear Panel

1. DIGITAL AUDIO OUT JACKS

- Use an optical or coaxial digital cable to connect to a compatible Dolby Digital receiver. Use to connect to an A/V Amplifier that contains a Dolby Digital or DTS decoder.

2. 5.1CH ANALOG AUDIO OUT JACKS

- Connect to an amplifier with 5.1ch analog input jacks.

3. MIXED AUDIO OUT JACKS

- Connect to the Audio input jacks of your television, audio/video receiver.

4. VIDEO OUT JACK

- Use a video cable to connect to the Video input jack on your television.
- The Video Output must select the 525i(480i) or S-Video by setting Video select switch.

5. S-VIDEO OUT JACK

- Use the S-Video cable to connect this jack to the S-Video jack on your television for a higher quality picture.
- The Video Output must select the S-Video by setting Video select switch.

6. COMPONENT VIDEO OUT JACKS

- Use these jacks if you have a TV with Component Video in jacks. These jacks provide Pr, Pb and Y video. Along with Component Video provides the best picture quality.
- If 525p(480p) Video Out is selected by setting Video select switch progressive scan mode will work.
- If 525i(480i) Video Out is selected by setting Video select switch interlace scan mode will work.

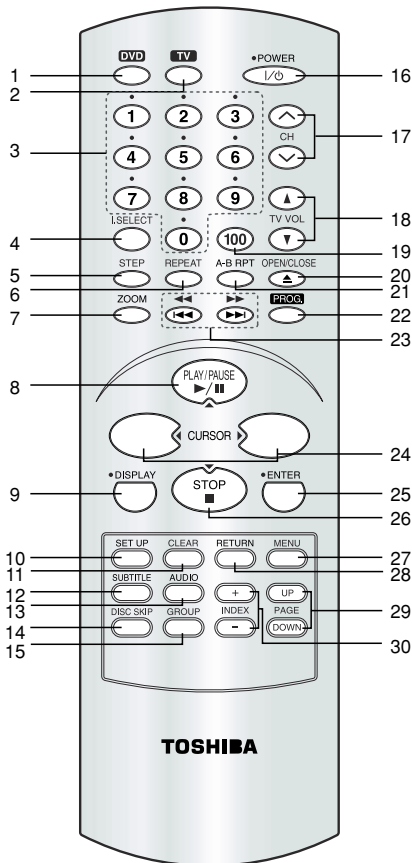

DVD Function Buttons

- 1. DVD Button**
 - DVD mode select button.
- 2. TV Button**
 - TV mode select button.
- 3. NUMBER Buttons**
- 4. I.SELECT Button**
 - TV input select.
- 5. STEP Button**
 - Advances play one frame at a time.
- 6. REPEAT Button**
 - Allows you to repeat play a title, chapter, track, or disc.
- 7. ZOOM Button**
 - Enlarges DVD picture.

- 8. PLAY/PAUSE Button (▶/||)**
 - Press and hold the button for about 2 second to begin/pause disc play in menu.
- 9. DISPLAY Button**
 - Displays the current disc mode.
- 10. SET UP Button**
 - Brings up the DVD player's menu.
- 11. CLEAR Button**
 - Use to remove menus or status displays from the screen.
- 12. SUBTITLE Button**
- 13. AUDIO Button**
 - Use this button to access various audio functions on a disc.
- 14. DISC SKIP Button**
 - Use to skip a disc in order.
- 15. GROUP Button**
 - Use to select the GROUP.
- 16. POWER Button**
 - Turns the DVD player's power on or off.
- 17. TV CH ^/∨ Buttons**
 - Channel selection.
- 18. TV VOL +/- Buttons**
 - Control volumes.
- 19. TV 100 button**
 - Channel number button.
- 20. OPEN/CLOSE (▲) Button**
 - To open and close the disc tray.
- 21. A-B REPEAT Button**
 - Use to mark a segment to repeat between A and B.
- 22. PROG Button**
 - Allows you to program a specific order.
- 23. SEARCH/SKIP Buttons (◀◀ / ▶▶, ◀◀◀ / ▶▶▶)**
 - Allows you to search forward/backward through a disc. Use to skip the title, chapter or track.
- 24. CURSOR Button**
- 25. ENTER Button**
 - This button functions as a toggle switch.
- 26. STOP Button (■)**
 - Press and hold the button in menu for about 2 second.
- 27. MENU Button**
 - Brings up the Disc menu.
- 28. RETURN Button**
 - Returns to a previous menu.
- 29. PAGE Buttons**
 - Use to skip the PAGE.
- 30. INDEX Buttons**
 - Use to skip the INDEX.

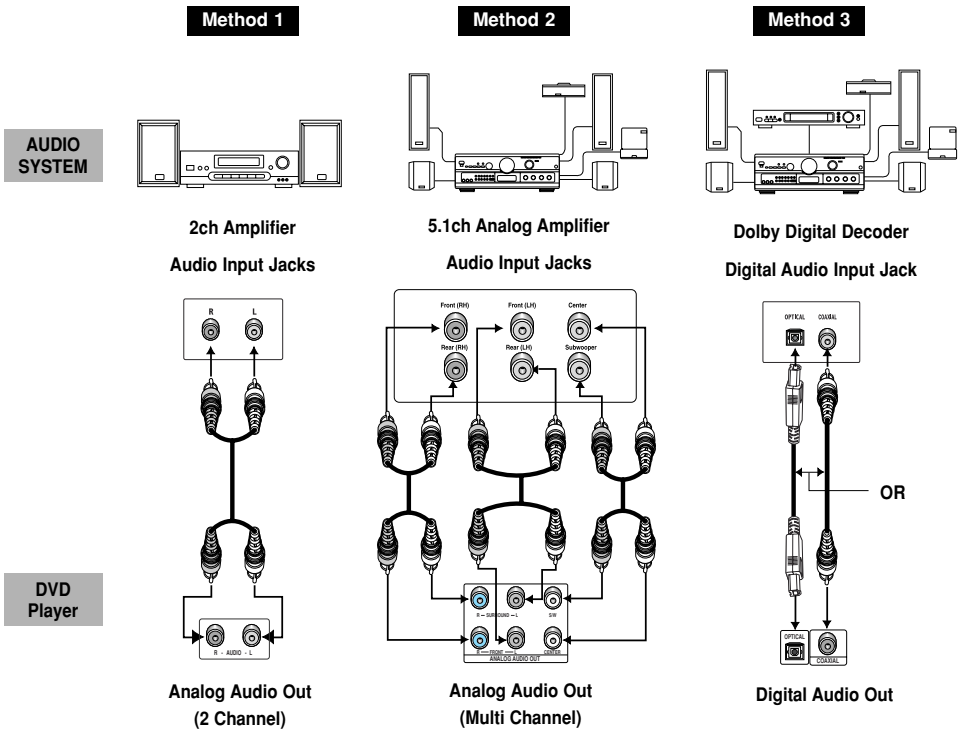
Choosing a Connection

The following shows examples of connections commonly used to connect the DVD player with a TV and other components.

Before Connecting the DVD Player

- Always turn off the DVD player, TV, and other components before you connect or disconnect any cables.
- If you connected an external Audio System, turn on your Audio System and set it to the correct Audio Input.
- Refer to the owner's manual of the additional components you are connecting for more information on those particular components.

Connection to an Audio System



Note

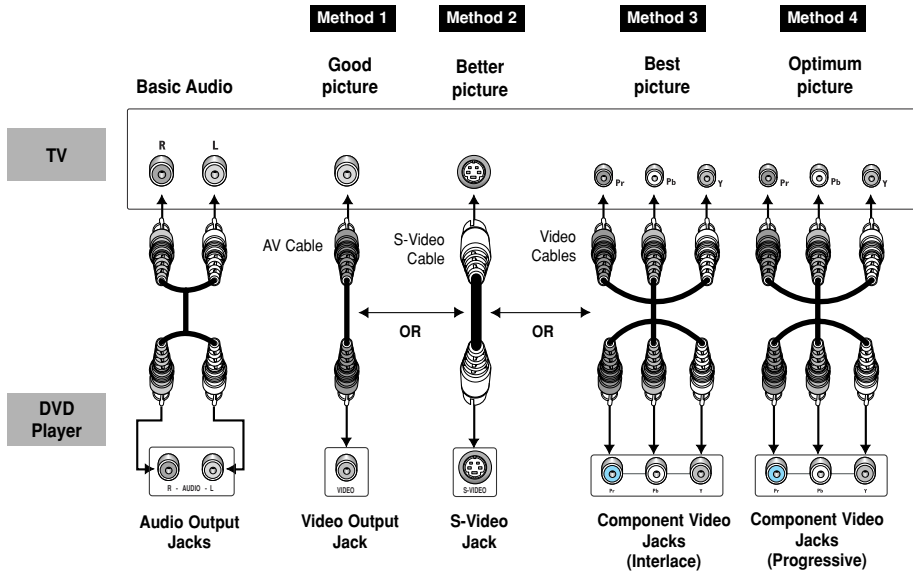
- In case of DVD-AUDIO, SACD playback cannot use Digital Audio Out.
- In case of SACD playback cannot use multi channel or 2 channel Digital Audio out. (See page 31~32)

Choosing a Connection

Connection to a TV (For Video)

TV (Normal, Widescreen, Projection, etc..)

- Turn on your TV and set it to the correct Video Input by pressing TV/VIDEO button on.



Method 1

DVD Player + TV with Video Input Jack
(The Video Output must select the S-Video or 525i(480i) by setting Video select switch.)

Method 2

DVD Player + TV with S-Video Input Jack
(The Video Output must select the S-Video by setting Video select switch.)

Method 3

DVD Player + TV with Component Video Jacks
(The Video Output must select the 525i(480i) by setting Video select switch.)

Method 4

DVD Player + TV with Progressive Scan Jacks.
(The Video Output must select the 525p(480p) by Video select switch.)

- If you want to convert Video Output to the Progressive Scan, you have to first connect Video or S-Video on your TV. Then select 525p(480p) by using Video select switch.
- If 525p(480p) Video Output is selected by setting Video select switch, Video(Composite) and S-Video will not work.
- Our set do not have Video output setting in setup menu.

Important Note

- Consult your TV User's Manual to find out if your TV supports Progressive Scan. If Progressive Scan is supported, follow the TV User's Manual's instructions regarding Progressive Scan settings in the TV's menu system.
- Depending on your TV, the Method of connection may differ from the illustration above.

Playing a Disc

Before Play

- Turn on your TV and set it to the correct Video Input by pressing TV/VIDEO button on.
- If you connected an external Audio System, turn on your Audio System and set it to the correct Audio Input.

After plugging in the player, the first time you press the DVD POWER button, this screen comes up :
If you want to select language, press a NUMBER button. (This screen will only appear when you plug in the player for the first time.)
If you don't select language, at first time, setting value of Setup menu will be lost.



Play

1. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button.
The STANDBY indicator light goes out and the tray opens.
2. Place a disc gently into the tray with the disc's label facing up.
3. Press and hold the PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||) button or OPEN/CLOSE button to close the disc tray.
4. Stopping Play
Press the STOP (■) button during play.
5. Removing Disc
Press the OPEN/CLOSE button.
6. Pausing Play
Press and hold the PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||) or STEP button on the remote during play.
 - Screen stops, no sound.
 - To resume, press and hold the PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||) button once again.

7. Step Motion Play

(Except CD/DVD-AUDIO/SACD)

Press the STEP button on the remote during play.

- Each time the button is pressed, a new frame will appear.
- No sound is heard during STEP mode.
- Press and hold the PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||) to resume normal play.
(You can only perform step motion play in the forward direction.)

8. Slow Motion Play

(Except CD/DVD-AUDIO/SACD)


Press and Hold the FWD SEARCH (▶▶) button on the remote during PAUSE or STEP mode.

- By pressing the FWD SEARCH (▶▶) button, you can select slow motion play for 1/8, 1/4 or 1/2 of normal speed.
- No sound is heard during slow mode.
- Press and hold the PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||) to resume normal play.
- Reverse slow motion play will not work.

RESUME function

When you stop disc play, the player remembers where you stopped, so when you press and hold the PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||) button again, it will pick up where you left off. (unless the disc is removed or the player is unplugged, or if you press and hold the STOP (■) button twice.)

Note

- If the player is left for about 5 minutes in pause mode, it will stop.
- If the player is left in the stop mode for more than about 30 minutes, the power will automatically shut off. (Automatic Power-Off Function)
- If the player is left in the stop mode for more than one minute without any user interaction, a screen saver will be activated. Press and hold the PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||) button to resume normal play.
- This  icon indicates an invalid button press.
- When menu screen is displayed, one press of PLAY/PAUSE (▶/||) button or STOP (■) button function as the Up/down cursor. It will only activate the Play, Pause or Stop function when it is press and hold for about 2 seconds.

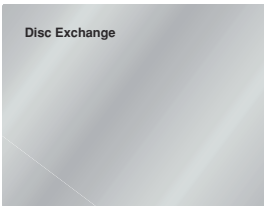
Operating the Disc Changer

The DVD Changer holds 5 discs and provides full random play with fast disc changes when press and hold NUMBER button.

Exchanging Discs

Exchange allows you to change up to 4 discs except the disc currently playing.

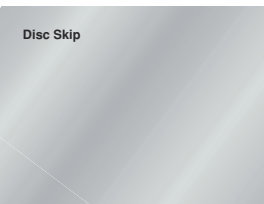
1. Press the DISC EXCHANGE button on the front of the player when in the play mode.
The tray opens with two slots available for you to load or change discs.
2. Press the DISC SKIP button on the remote or on the front of the player to turn the platter to the other two slots. And load or change the third and fourth discs.
 - To change all the discs, first press the STOP button, then the OPEN/CLOSE and DISC SKIP buttons.
3. Press the DISC EXCHANGE or OPEN/CLOSE button on the front of the player to close the disc tray.



Using the DISC SKIP function

Use the Disc Skip function to change to another disc currently in the disc platter.

1. While in play or stop mode, press the DISC SKIP button. The platter turns clockwise to the next available disc.



Using the Search & Skip Functions

During play, you can search quickly through a chapter or track or use the skip function to jump to the next selection.

Searching through a Chapter or Track

During play, press and hold the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button on the remote.

- In case of SACD, when the clip menu is off, you can use this function. (See page 23)

DVD	2X, 4X, 8X, 32X, 128X
CD/SACD/DVD-AUDIO	2X, 4X, 8X

Skipping Tracks

During play, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ button.

- When playing a DVD/DVD-AUDIO, if you press the ▶▶ button, it moves to the next chapter. If you press the ◀◀ button, it moves to the beginning of the chapter. One more press makes it move to the beginning of the previous chapter.
- When playing a SACD or CD, if you press the ▶▶ button, it moves to the next track. If you press the ◀◀ button, it moves to the beginning of the track. One more press makes it move to the beginning of the previous track.

Using the Display Function

When Playing a DVD

1. During play, press the DISPLAY button on the remote.
2. Use the UP/DOWN buttons to select the desired item.
3. Use the LEFT/RIGHT buttons to make the desired setup and then press the ENTER button.
 - You may use the number buttons of the remote control to directly access a title, chapter or to start the playback from the desired time.
4. To make the screen disappear, press the DISPLAY button again.

DVD



When Playing a CD

1. A CD play starts.
The DISPLAY window appears directly.
2. Press the DISPLAY button, the display window disappears

CD



Title

To access the desired title when there is more than one in the disc.
For example, if there is more than one movie on a DVD, each movie will be identified.



Chapter

Most DVD discs are recorded in chapters so that you can quickly find a specific passage (similar to tracks on an audio CD).



Track



Time

Allows playback of the film from a desired time. You must enter the starting time as a reference.



Audio

Refers to the language of the film soundtrack. In the example, the soundtrack is played in English 5.1CH. A DVD disc can have up to eight different soundtracks.



Subtitle

Refers to the subtitle languages available in the disc.
You will be able to choose the subtitle languages or, if you prefer, turn them off from the screen.
A DVD disc can have up to 32 different subtitles.

Using the Disc and Title Menu

Using the Disc Menu

1. During the playback of a DVD disc, press the SETUP button on the remote.
2. Select **Disc Menu** using the UP/DOWN buttons, then press the RIGHT or ENTER button.



Using the Title Menu

1. During the playback of a DVD disc, press the SETUP button on the remote.
2. Select **Title Menu** using the UP/DOWN buttons, then press the RIGHT or ENTER button.



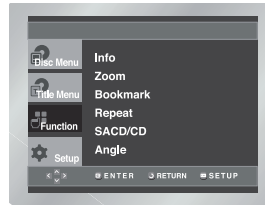

 - Random 1: Plays all the tracks on a single disc in random order and then stop.
 - Random 2 : Plays all the tracks on current disc in random order and then plays all the tracks on each succeeding disc in random order and then stops.
 - Random 3 : Plays 3 tracks randomly from a disc and then plays 3 tracks randomly on other discs until all CD discs turn twice.
4. To return to normal playback, press CLEAR button.

- Depending on a disc, the Program and Random Play functions may not work.
- This unit can support a maximum of 20 programmed tracks.
- While in playback mode, press the CLEAR button on the remote control to cancel Programmed Play or Random Play.
- During EXCHANGE function, Random play doesn't work.

You can select a desired language quickly and easily with the AUDIO button.

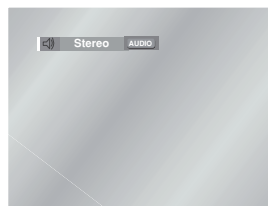

 - The tray closes and disc plays.

Using the Display Function

1. During play, press the DISPLAY button on the remote.
2. Use the UP/DOWN buttons to select the desired item.
3. Use the LEFT/RIGHT buttons to make the desired setup and then press ENTER.
 - You may use the number buttons of the remote control to directly access a Group, Track, Page or to start the playback from the desired time.

- Random : Song files which have the same extension will be played in random order.

* To resume normal play, press the CLEAR button.

CD-R MP3/WMA discs

When you record MP3 or WMA files on CD-R, please refer to the following.

- **Your MP3 or WMA files should be ISO 9660 or JOLIET format.**

ISO 9660 format and Joliet MP3 or WMA files are compatible with Microsoft's DOS and Windows, and with Apple's Mac. This format is the most widely used.

- **When naming your MP3 or WMA files, do not exceed 8 characters, and enter “.mp3, .wma” as the file extension.**

General name format of: Title.mp3. or Title.wma.

When composing your title, make sure that you use 8 characters or less, have no spaces in the name, and avoid the use of special characters including: (,.,/, \, =, +).

- **Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 128 Kbps when recording MP3 files.**

Sound quality with MP3 files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose. Getting CD audio sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate, that is conversion to MP3 format, of at least 128 Kbps and up to 160 Kbps. However, choosing higher rates, like 192 Kbps or more, only rarely give better sound quality. Conversely, files with decompression rates below 128 Kbps will not be played properly.

- **Use a decompression transfer rate of at least 64Kbps when recording WMA files.**

Sound quality with WMA files basically depends on the rate of compression/decompression you choose.

Getting CD audio sound requires an analog/digital sampling rate, that is conversion to WMA format, of at least 64Kbps and up to 192Kbps.

Conversely, files with decompression rates below 64Kbps or over 192Kbps will not be played properly.

- **Do not try recording copyright protected MP3 files.**

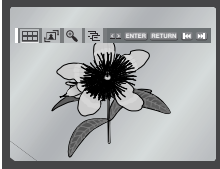
Certain "secured" files are encrypted and code protected to prevent illegal copying. These files are of the following types: Windows Media™ (registered trade mark of Microsoft Inc) and SDMI™ (registered trade mark of The SDMI Foundation). You cannot copy such files.

- **Important:** The above recommendations cannot be taken as a guarantee that the DVD player will play MP3 recordings, or as an assurance of sound quality. You should note that certain technologies and methods for MP3 file recording on CD-Rs prevent optimal playback of these files on your DVD player (degraded sound quality and in some cases, inability of the player to read the files).






- This unit can play a maximum of 3000 files and 300 folders per disc.


Picture CD Playback

1. Select the desired folder. (See page 26 to select the folder)
2. Use the UP/DOWN buttons to select a Picture file in clips menu and then press the ENTER button. You should get a screen that looks like the one below.

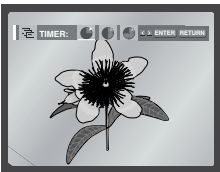

-  : Returns to the Album Screen.

-  Slide The unit enters slide show mode.

*Before beginning the Slide Show, the picture interval must be set.



-  : When this icon is selected and ENTER is pressed, the pictures change automatically with about a 6 second interval.
-  : The pictures change automatically with about a 12 second interval.
-  : The pictures change automatically with about a 18 second interval.

*Depending on a file size, the amount of time between each picture may be different from the manual.

*If you don't press any button, the slide show will start automatically in about 10 seconds by default.

Note

- If no buttons on the remote control pressed for 10 seconds, the menu will disappear. Press the DISPLAY button on the remote control to display the menu again.
- Press and hold the STOP button to return to the clips menu.
- When playing a Kodak Picture CD, the unit displays the Photo directly, not the clips menu.

CD-R JPEG Discs

- Only files with the ".jpg" and ".JPG" extensions can be played.
- If the disc is not closed, it will take longer to start playing and not all of the recorded files may be played.
- Only CD-R discs with JPEG files in ISO 9660 or Joliet format can be played.
- The name of the JPEG file may not be longer than 8 characters and should contain no blank spaces or special characters (. / = +).
- Only a consecutively written multisession disc can be played. If there is a blank segment in the multisession disc, the disc can be played only up to the blank segment.
- A maximum of 3000 images can be stored on a single CD.
- Kodak Picture CDs are recommended.
- When playing a Kodak Picture CD, only the JPEG files in the pictures folder can be played.
- Kodak Picture CD : The JPEG files in the pictures folder can be played automatically.
- Konica Picture CD : If you want to see the Picture, select the JPEG files in the clips menu.
- Fuji Picture CD : If you want to see the Picture, select the JPEG files in the clips menu.
- QSS Picture CD : The unit cannot play QSS Picture CD.
- If the number of files in 1 Disc is over 3000, only 3000 JPEG files can be played.
- If the number of folders in 1 Disc is over 300, only JPEG files in 300 folders can be played.

Using the Setup Menu

The Setup menu lets you customize your DVD player by allowing you to select various language preferences, set up a parental level, even adjust the player to the type of television screen you have.

1. With the unit in Stop mode, press the **SETUP** button on the remote. Select **Setup** using UP/DOWN buttons, then press the **RIGHT** or **ENTER** button.

- ❶ **Language Setup** : Setup of the Language.
- ❷ **Audio Setup** : Setup of the Audio Options
- ❸ **Display Setup** : Setup of the Display Options
Use to select which type of screen you want to watch and several display options.
- ❹ **Parental Setup** : Setup of the Parental Level
Allows users to set the level necessary to prevent children from viewing unsuitable movies such as those with violence, adult subject matter, etc.



2. Use the UP/DOWN buttons on the remote to access the different features.
3. Press the **ENTER** button to access the sub features.

To make the setup screen disappear after setting up, press the **SETUP** button again.

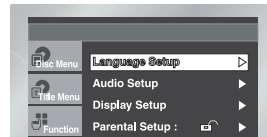

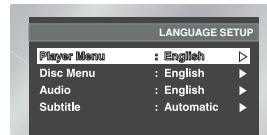

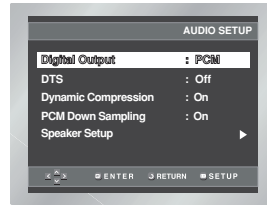

1. Off : Doesn't output digital signal.
2. On : Outputs DTS Bitstream via digital output only.
Select DTS when connecting to a DTS Decoder.

Note There is no analog audio output when you play DTS sound disc.

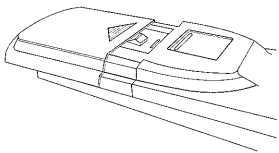

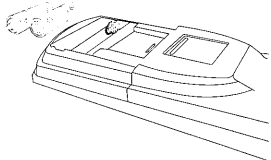

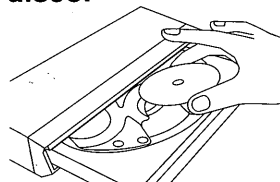
