Getting Started

Closed View of Phone

Key Functions

- Speaker: The speaker allows you to hear the other caller and the different ring tones and sounds offered by your phone.
- Signal Strength Indicator: This icon represents the signal strength by displaying bars. The more bars displayed, the better the signal strength.
- Display Screen: This screen displays all the information needed to operate your phone.
- Headset Jack: Allows you to plug in an optional headset for safe, convenient hands-free conversations.
- 5. Volume Key: Allows you to adjust the ringer volume in standby mode (with the flip open) or adjust the voice volume during a call. The volume key can also be used to scroll up or down to navigate through the different menu options. To mute the ringer during an incoming call, press the volume key up or down.
- 6. Left Softkey: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - In idle mode, press to access the MENU.
 - When using other features, such as the Web Browser, the left softkey performs a context-sensitive action. This action is shown in the bottom left corner of the Display Screen.
- Right Softkey: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - In idle mode, press to access your Contacts.

- When using other features, such as the Web Browse, the right softkey performs a context-sensitive action. This action is shown in the bottom right corner of the Display Screen.
- 8. OK Key: Press when navigating through a menu accepts the highlighted choice in the menu.
- 9. Navigation Key: This key allows you to scroll through the phone menu options and provides a shortcut to phone functions from standby mode.
- 10. SEND Key: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - Allows you to place or receive a call.
 - In standby mode, press the key once to access the Dialed call log.
- 11. Numeric Keypad: Use these keys to enter numbers, letters, and characters.
- 12. Shift/Asterisk Key: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - Enters the asterisk [*] character for calling features.
 - In text entry mode, press and hold to switch character input type (Alpha, 123, T9Word). This key can also be used to select upper or lowercase letters. Press the key once to switch between letter cases when using the input type Alpha (ABC, abc, Abc) or T9Word (T9WORD, T9word, T9Word).
 - In standby mode, press and hold to switch your handset to Silent Mode.

- 13. Power/Accessory Interface Connector: The Power/ Accessory Interface Connector is used to plug in a travel adaptor, or any available accessory to your phone.
- 14. Microphone: The microphone allows the other caller to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.
- 15. Space/Pound Key: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - Enters the pound [#] character for calling features.
 - In text entry mode, press to enter a space.
 - In standby mode, press and hold to switch your handset to Lock Mode.
- **16.BACK Key:** Deletes characters from the display when you are in text entry mode. When in a menu, press to return to the previous menu.
- 17. END Key: This key can be used in several different ways.
 - During a call, press to end the call.
 - When you receive an incoming call, press to enter silent mode and mute the ringer.
 - When the phone is off or in standby mode, press and hold this key for a few seconds to turn your phone On or Off.
 - When in the main menu, press to return the phone to standby mode and cancel your input.
- 18. Ringer/Vibrate Indicator: This icon indicates that a ring tone or vibrate is selected as the ringer.

- 19. Battery Indicator: The battery indicator displays the amount of remaining battery charge currently available in your phone. When all bars are displayed in the battery icon. the phone's battery is fully charged. When no bars are displayed, the phone's battery is completely discharged or emptv.
- 20.1X Indicator: Technology that allows faster data rates, always-on data service, and improved voice network capacity.
- 21. Side Camera Key: This button is used to launch the integrated digital camera:
 - In idle mode, press to activate the Camera menu.
 - In idle mode, press and hold starts the camera's preview mode.
 - When the phone is closed, press and hold to start the camera's preview mode.
- 22. Side Speaker Key: This key works the same way as the SPEAKER key.
- 23. SPEAKER Key: This key can be used in several ways:
 - During a call, this key activiates the phone's speaker mode.
 - In idle mode, press and hold to say a voice command.
 - In idle mode, press the key once to access the Dialed Calls log.
- 24. Camera: the lens for your phone camera.

Viewing the Display Screen

Your phone's interior and exterior display screens provides a wealth of information about your phone's status and options. When the folder is closed, the exterior display screen is dimmed. To illuminate the exterior display screen, press any of the side keys.

This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your phone's display screens:



tells you a call is in progress.

means there is no service, as your phone cannot find a signal.



displays your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.



displays your current battery strength at full.



displays your current battery strength at empty.



indicates that your phone is receiving 3G digital service.



indicates that your phone is receiving digital (non 3G) service.



indicates that your phone is roaming.



indicates that your phone's browser is in security mode.



indicates that your phone is in Airplane Mode. All TX and RX transmissions are turned Off.




indicates that your phone is in Auto Answer mode. Calls are automatically answered after a selected number of rings when a headset is connected to the phone.



indicates that you have new text messages waiting.



indicates that you have new Voice Mail messages waiting.





indicates that you are receiving information.

indicates that you are sending information.

indicates that the ringer is set at a level between 1-5 or that 1-Beep is selected.

indicates that the ringer is turned Off.

indicates that your phone is in Vibrate mode.

indicates that your phone is in High+Vibrate mode.

indicates that your phone is in Silent mode.

indicates that an alarm is set on your phone.

indicates that the self-timer function is enabled. With the self timer enabled, a set amount of time is required prior to taking a picture.

indicates that the white balance has been set to Auto.


This is used for taking pictures indoors or outdoors under normal conditions.


indicates that the white balance has been set to Sunny.
This is used for taking pictures outdoors on bright sunny days.

indicates that the white balance has been set to Cloudy.

This is used for taking pictures outdoors under cloudy conditions.

indicates that the white balance has been set to Tungsten. This is used for taking pictures indoors under normal lighting conditions.

9 Getting Started

Turning Your Phone On and Off

To turn your phone on:

Press to turn your phone on.

Once your phone is On, it displays "Looking for Service" which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode – the phone's idle state. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode. In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned On).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to conserve your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

To turn your phone off:

 Press and hold for two seconds until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

Using Your Phone's Battery and Charger

Battery Capacity

Your phone is equipped with a Lithium Ion (Lilon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained. The battery

provides approximately 3 hours of continuous digital talk time or approximately 6 days of continuous digital standby time. When the battery reaches 5% of its capacity, the battery icon blinks. When there are approximately two minutes of talk time left, the phone sounds an audible alert and then powers down.

Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, playing games, camera and browser usage affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

Installing the Battery

To install the Lilon battery:

- 1. Insert the battery into the opening on the back of the phone at an angle, making sure the plastic tab on the bottom of the battery is inserted into the matching slot in the phone.
- 2. Press down until the battery snaps into place.



Removing the Battery

To remove your battery:

- 1. Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.
- 2. Push the battery release latch up completely.
- 3. Using the side tabs, pull the top of the battery away from the phone and remove.



Charging the Battery

Your phone's Lilon battery is rechargeable and should be charged as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of either of your phone's display screens. indicates that the battery is full. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon blinks and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use a Samsung-approved desktop charger, travel adapter, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Warning! Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

Phone Basics

Displaying Your Phone Number

to display your phone number.

Just in case you forget your phone number, your phone can remind you.

To display your phone number:

Press the left softkey A for MENU, followed by



Note: To access the phone's main MENU, press the left softkey from standby mode. Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the navigation key and pressing \(\bigsize \), or you can press the number corresponding to the menu item on your keypad.

Making and Answering Calls

Making Calls

Placing a call from your phone is as easy as making a call from any land-line phone. Just enter the number and press 🔈 and you're on your way to clear calls.

To make a call using your keypad:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on.
- 2. Enter a phone number. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press to erase one digit at a time. Press and hold to erase the entire number.)
- 3. Press to call.
- 4. Press or close the phone when you are finished.

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press



You can also place calls from your phone by using Voice Command (page 31), Speed Dialing numbers from your Contacts (page 20), and using your Call History listings (page 55).

Answering Calls

To answer an incoming call:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to Voice Mail.)
- 2. Press 🥾 to answer an incoming call. (Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any number key. See "Call Answer Mode" on page 102 for more information.)

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings and/or vibrates.
- The LED flashes.
- The backlight illuminates.
- The screen displays an incoming call message.

If the incoming call is from a number stored in your CONTACTS, the Contacts entry's name is displayed. The caller's phone number may also be displayed, if available.

The following options are also available to handle an incoming call:

- Press or the volume key to guiet the ringer.
- Press the left soft key 4 to Ignore the incoming call and send it directly to your Voice Mail box.

Ending a Call

To disconnect a call when you are finished:

Close the phone or press



Note: When the speakerphone is used together with the connecting headset, closing the phone flip cover does not end a call. Instead. use the key to end your call.

Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, the Missed Call log is displayed on your screen. You have two options:

- Press the left softkey \(\bigle \) to Save the phone number to your Contacts.
- Press the right softkey for Send to call the number back.

Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial governor) even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted.

Warning: 911 call can be terminated by closing a flip or pressing END key.

However, after terminating call phone will stay in Emergency mode and from emergency mode you can exit by pressing \bigcolon \infty.

Warning: You can not make 911 calls when the phone is in airplane mode and the icon "phone off "is displayed. Turn the phone back on, by disabling airplane mode. For more details, see "Airplane Mode" on page 107.

In-Call Options

Select actions by pressing the left softkey of for **MENU** during a call. A list of options is displayed that allows you to perform different actions during the course of a call. The following options are available: (To select an option, press the corresponding keypad number or highlight the option and press .)

- (1) Mute or Unmute allows you to mute or reactivate your phone's microphone.
- (2) DTMF Off or On allows you to activate or deactivate DTMF tones.
- (3) Call History checks your call log for Recent, Dialed, Received and Missed calls. You can also erase the logs and view call times from this menu.
- (4) Contacts accesses the Contacts menu options.
- (5) 3-Way Call allows you to talk to two different people at the same time. (For more information, see "Making a Three-Way Call" on page 26.)
- (6) Messaging allows you to check for Voice Mail and notifications.
- (7) Voice Memo allows you to record the the other person's conversation during a call. (For more information, see "Reviewing and Erasing Memos" on page 39.)
- (8) Tools accesses the Tools menu options.
- (9) Version displays the hardware/software version and Preferred Roaming List (PRL) being used.

End-of-Call Options

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Contacts, the phone number and the duration of the call are displayed. Press the right softkey 🛕 to Save the new number in your Contacts. (See below for more information on "Saving a Phone" Number.")

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as Unknown ID or Restricted number.

Saving a Phone Number

Your phone can store up to 500 entries (numbers/e-mails/URLs) in seven categories (Home, Office, Mobile, Pager, Fax, Email, Others). The Contacts capacity is based on number of entries, not on number of contacts. (For more information, see "Adding a New Contact" on page 50.)

To save a number from standby mode:

- 1. Enter a phone number.
- 2. Press the right softkey A for Save.
- 3. Using the navigation keys, select **New Entry** to create a new contact or **Find** to add the number to an existing contact and press .
- **4.** Select the **Type** using the navigation key and press **2**.
 - Mobile Home Office Pager Fax Others
- 5. Enter the name using the keypad and press . After you have saved the number, your list of Contacts is displayed.

Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as Voice Mail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- P pause (hard pause) sends the next set of numbers when you press
- T pause (2 second pause) automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

- 1. Enter a phone number from standby mode.
- 2. Press left softkey for **Options** and select **P pause** for a hard pause or **T pause** for a 2-second pause.
 - 1. Enter additional numbers.
- 2. Press to dial the number.
 - or—

Press right softkey **b** to **Save** to save the number in your internal Contacts.

 When dialing a number with a hard pause, press to send the next set of numbers.

Dialing From Contacts

To dial directly from a Contacts entry:

- 1. Press the right softkey **b** to display your **CONTACTS**.
- 2. Scroll left or right to search By Name or By Entry.

3. Scroll up or down to highlight the desired entry and press to make the call.

Tip: If the desired entry contains more than one phone number, scroll up or down to display the number you wish to call and press make the call.

Using One-Touch/Two-Touch/Three-Touch Speed Dialing

You can store up to 500 numbers in your phone's speed dial memory to make contacting friends and family as easy as pressing a few buttons. With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 1-9, two key presses for locations 10-99, and three key presses for 100-500.

To use One-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 1-9:

 Press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds. (The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows the saved caller ID or number.)

To use Two-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 10-99:

- 1. Press the first digit.
- 2. Press and hold the second digit for approximately two seconds. (The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows the saved call ID or number.)

To use Three-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 100-500:

- 1. Press the first digit.
- 2. Press the second digit.
- 3. Press and hold the third digit for approximately two seconds. (The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows the saved caller ID or number.)

Note: Your phone also supports 1- 4 digit dialing. If you enter a number using the keypad without holding the last number and then press your phone will dial those digits. (For example, if you enter and press it dials 211, not the number stored in memory location 211.

Entering Text

Selecting a Character Input Mode

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, symbols, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding a Contacts entry or when sending text messages).

To change the character input mode:

- When you display a screen where you can enter text, press the left softkey a for Options.
- 2. Select a character input mode:
 - T9 (English) to enter characters using predictive T9 Text Input (see page 22).
 - Alpha to enter characters by tapping the keypad (see page 22).
 - Symbol to enter symbols (see page 23).
 - Number to enter numbers (see page 23).
 - Quick Text to enter pre-defined sentences.
 - WWW to enter common letter combinations in URLs (for example, www.,.com, or http://).

Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your phone by pressing keys just once per letter. (To select the **T9 (English)** mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" above.)

T9 Text Input analyzes the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) If the word you want does not display after you have entered all the letters, press word to scroll through additional word If you make a mistake, press to erase a single character. Press and hold to delete an entire entry.

To enter text using T9:

- 1. From the text entry screen (for example, a new event in scheduler), press the left softkey A for **Options** and select T9 (English).
- 2. Use your keypad to enter the new event. (For example, to enter "Meeting", press once, so twice, so once, once, once, and once.)

Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad


To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the Alpha mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 21). Press the corresponding key repeatedly until the desired character appears. When the his icon is shown, the first letter of the first word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase. The key can be used to select the case desired.

To enter text using Alpha:

1. From a text entry screen (for example, a Contacts entry), press the left softkey **A** for **Options** and select **Alpha**.

2. Use your keypad to enter the contact's name. (For example, to enter "Bill", press whice, three times, and three times again.)

Characters scroll in the following order:



After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character on a different key.

Entering Numbers and Symbols

To enter numbers:

 Select the Number mode and press the appropriate key. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 21.)

To enter symbols:

 Select the **Symbol** mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 21.) To enter a symbol, press the appropriate key displayed above the desired symbol character.

Using Caller ID

Caller ID allows people to identify a caller before answering the phone by displaying the number of the Received call. If you do not want your number displayed when you make a call, just follow these easy steps.

To block your phone number from being displayed for a specific outgoing call:

- 2. Enter the number you want to call.
- 3. Press .

To permanently block your number, call the Customer Service department of your network service provider.

Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you of incoming calls by sounding two beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

• Press . (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)

To switch back to the first caller:

• Press again.

Do Not Disturb Mode

For those calls where you don't want to be interrupted, you can activate Do Not Disturb mode, which disables Call Waiting. To activate Do Not Disturb Mode:

Press 🚺 followed by 🅟 🐷 🔊 before placing your call.

To disable Do Not Disturb Mode

Press followed by before placing your call.

Using Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number – even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when Call Forwarding is activated. For more information, see "Call Forward" on page 102.

To Activate Call Forwarding

- 2. Enter the area code and phone number to which your future calls should be forwarded.
- 3. Press . You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the activation of Call Forwarding.

To Deactivate Call Forwarding

- 2. Press 🔊 . You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the deactivation of Call Forwarding.

Note: You may be charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

To make a Three-Way Call:

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press
- 2. Once you have established the connection, press the left softkev **A** for **MENU**, followed by **5** for **3-Way Call**.
- 3. Dial the second number and press
- **4.** When you're connected to the second party, press again to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Tip: You can also begin a Three-Way Call by displaying a phone number stored in your Internal Contacts, Call History, or Messaging. To call the third party, press

Note: Call Waiting and Three-Way Calling might not be available while roaming off the network.

Using the Speakerphone

The speakerphone allows you to hear audio through the speaker and talk without holding your phone. When the speakerphone is activated, use the volume keys to adjust the sound level. To turn the speakerphone on during a call:

Press Peace or .

To turn the speakerphone off during a call:

Press (SPEAKER) or (III).

Warning: Due to higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

Roaming

Understanding Roaming

Recognizing Icons on the Display Screen

Your phone's display screen always lets you know when you're off the network. The following chart indicates what you'll see depending on where you're using your phone.

	Roaming Indicator

Other Digital Networks	

Note: You will pay a higher per-minute rate for roaming calls.

Roaming on Other Digital Networks

When you're roaming, your call quality will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on your home network. You may not be able to access certain features, however, such as web services.

Setting Your Roaming Mode

Your phone allows you to control your ability to roam. By using the **Roaming** menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts. Choose from three different settings on your phone to control your roaming experience:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for **Settings**.
- 3. Press for Advanced

- 4. Press for System.
- 5. Press for **Set Mode**.
- 6. To select an option, highlight it and press 🕙 .
 - Digital only: This setting seeks out only digital service networks
 - Analog only: This setting seeks out analog service networks only.
 - Automatic: This setting seeks service. When service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.
 - Home only: This setting allows you to access the home network only and prevents roaming on other networks.

Note: if your phone is shut off while it is in Analog only or Digital only mode, the phone will revert back to the previous state (Automatic or Home-Only) when turned on again.

Set NAM

This setting allows you to associate your mobile identification number (MIN) to your phone's electronic serial number (ESN).

- 1. Press the left softkey & for MENU.
- 2. Press for Settings.
- 3. Press of for Advanced
- 4. Press for System.
- Press for Set NAM.
- Using the navigation keys, select NAM 1 or NAM 2 and press

Voice Services

Activating Voice Recognition

Voice recognition allows you to say commands to perform common functions supported by your phone. There is no voice training required to use the voice recognition feature. You simply say the predesignated command displayed on your screen in a normal tone of voice to perform the desired function.

To activate voice recognition:

- 1. Press and hold or land or land (The phone prompts you to say a voice command.)
- 2. Wait for the beep and then say one of the following commands:
- Voice Dial
- Voice Memo
- My Phone #

- Contacts
- Status

When it recognizes one of these commands, the phone launches the associated application. If the phone does not hear a command within approximately eight seconds, it de-activates voice recognition without taking any action.

Note: You can activate voice recognition even if the phone is closed by pressing .

If you want to use another button to activate voice recognition, in addition to or for MENU, press the left softkey for MENU, followed by 5 for **Shortcuts**. Though this menu, you can change button assignments, including the button used to launch "Voice Dial." which is the voice recognition application.

Using Voice Dial

Voice Dial allows you to dial any valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number by speaking the number naturally, without pausing between the digits.

Tips for using Voice Dial:

- Voice Dial works best in quieter environments.
- When saying a number, speak at a normal speed and say each digit clearly. There is no need to pause between digits.
- The phone recognizes the digits one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, zero, and oh. The phone does not recognize numbers such as "one eight hundred" for "1-800." Instead, say "one-eight-zero-zero."
- The phone recognizes only valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone numbers.
- If your phone does not usually recognize you correctly when you are using Voice Dial, try adapting Voice Dial to your voice, which can significantly improve accuracy for some speakers. (See "Changing Voice Dial Sensitivity" on page 36 for details.)

To place a call using Voice Dial:

- 1. Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding . (The phone prompts you for a command.)
- Say Voice Dial. (The phone prompts you to say the number.)
- Say either a name stored in your Contacts or a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number naturally and clearly.

- If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by the correct number, say "Yes." (You can also select the correct number from those displayed on the screen by pressing on the correct number. The phone will then dial the number.)
- If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect number, say No. (If there are other alternatives. the phone will prompt you with the next one. You can also press the navigation key up or down to select the correct number from the Choice List, and then press 1 dial.)
- If you said a name listed in your Contacts that has more than one number associated with it, the phone displays the different locations (Home, Office, Mobile, Pager, Fax) and asks you which one to dial. Say one of the location names and the phone will dial the number for the location you specified.

Note: In some cases, the phone might ask you to repeat a name or number. Make sure that the number is a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number, and then say the number again. If the number isn't valid, or if the phone still doesn't understand the number on the second try, it will not place a call.

Enabling/Disabling Choice Lists

You can customize whether the Voice Dial feature displays the list of top voice recognition choices or automatically dials the first number, without displaying a choice list.

To enable or disable choice lists for Voice Dial:

1. Press the left softkey 4 for **MENU**.

- 2. Press for **Settings**.
- 3. Press for Voice Dial.
- 4. Press of Choice Lists.
- 5. Press for Name Dialing, for Digit Dialing or for Name Lookup.
- Press the navigation key up or down to select Automatic, Always On or Always Off and press

Using Name Lookup

Name Lookup lets you retrieve contact information for any person in your Contacts by saying the full name of the person.

To retrieve information using Name Lookup:

- Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding (The phone will prompt you for a command.)
- Say Contacts. (The phone will prompt you to say the name.)
- Say the full name of the person, exactly as it is entered in your Contacts. (The phone will play the name it recognized through the earpiece, and then open the contact information for that name.)
 - If the phone says, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say No. The phone then prompts you with the next name, if there is one. If there are no more names, the phone will say "Sorry, No Match Found."

Phone Status Information

The voice recognition Status option gives you an update on your signal strength and battery level.

To retrieve your phone's status information:

- 1. Press and hold 📞 to activate voice recognition. (The phone prompts you to say a voice command.)
- 2. Wait for the beep and say **Status**. Your phone's current status information is displayed.

Customizing Voice Dial

Adapting Voice Dial

Voice Dialing is speaker independent, which means that no initial training or adaptation is required. Some users with heavy accents or unusual voice characteristics may encounter difficulty in achieving high accuracy with speaker independent Voice Dialing, so the Adapt Digits feature allows users to dramatically improve the digit accuracy through adaptation. Users who get acceptable digit recognition accuracy will find no additional benefit to performing the Adapt Digit adaptation.

After you adapt Voice Dial, your phone will be customized to your voice. Other people will not be able to use Voice Dial on your phone unless they reset the phone to factory defaults.

Note: ONLY adapt Voice Dial if the system is frequently misrecognizing your speech. You can always restore the system to its original factory setting.

Adaptation involves recording several digit sequences to teach the system your voice. The adaptation process takes about 3 minutes. Tips for adapting Voice Dial:

- Adapt digits in a guiet place.
- Make sure you wait for the beep before starting to speak.
- Speak clearly, but say each digit sequence naturally.

If you make a mistake while recording a sequence of digits, or
if there is an unexpected noise that spoils the recording, you
can say or select No when the prompt asks, "Did the recording
sound OK?" You will then be prompted to re-record the
sequence.

To adapt Voice Dial to your voice:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for Settings.
- 3. Press of Voice Dial.
- 4. Press for Digit Dialing.
- 5. Press for **Adapt Digits**. (The phone displays the first digit sequence.)
- **6.** When you are ready to start recording, press **2.** (The phone prompts you to say the first sequence of digits.)
- 7. Wait for the beep, and then repeat the digits using a normal tone of voice. (The phone plays back your recording and asks you if the recording sounds "OK.")
 - If the recording sounds OK (no mistakes and no background noises), say Yes.
 - If you need to re-record the digits to fix any problems, say
 No. (The phone then prompts you to say the digits again.)
- **8.** Wait for the beep, and then record the digits again. (Repeat this step until you are satisfied with the recording.)
- 9. After confirming that the recording sounds OK, repeat the recording process with the next set of digits. In total, there are 10 sets of numbers. When you are finished with a full session, you will reach a screen that reads, "Adaptation Complete."

Note: It is recommended that you perform the complete adaptation of Voice Dial at least once to achieve the maximum benefit of this feature. If a partial adaptation is performed, you can always return later and resume the process from the half way point.

Resetting Voice Dial Adaptation

To erase any adaptation and reset Voice Dial to its original state:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for **Settings**.
- 3. Press of Voice Dial.
- 4. Press for Digit Dialing.
- 5. Press for Reset Digits.
- **6.** Press the left softkey \P to select **OK**.

Changing Voice Dial Sensitivity

You can adjust your phone's sensitivity to sounds when listening for voice commands or names, making it require a more exact or less exact sound match before responding to your command.

To adjust your phone's voice dial sensitivity:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for Settings.
- 3. Press 3 of for Voice Dial.
- 4. Press for Sensitivity.
- 5. Press for **Commands** or **2** for **Names**.
- **6.** Press the navigation key up or down to select **Reject More**. **Recommended**, or **Reject Less** and press .

 If you select Reject More, your phone will require a more exact sound match and if you select Reject Less, your phone will require a less exact sound match.

Changing Voice Dial Prompts

By default, your phone provides audio prompts such as "Please say a command". You can turn these prompts on or off.

To turn voice dial prompts On or Off:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Settings.
- 3. Press of voice Dial.
- 4. Press for Sound.
- 5. Press for **Prompts**, for **Digits** or for **Names**
- Press the navigation key up or down to select **On** or **Off** and press .

Changing Voice Launch

By default, Voice Dial is activated by pressing and holding a can change your phone's settings to activate Voice Dialing whenever you open the flip lid of your phone.

To change your Voice Launch method:

- 1. Press the left softkey & for MENU.
- Press for Settings.
- 3. Press of Voice Dial.
- 4. Press for Voice Launch.

5. Press the navigation key up or down to select Talk Only or Talk and Flip and press .

Voice Memos

You can use your phone to record brief memos to remind you of important events, phone numbers, or other items.

Recording Voice Memos

To record a voice memo:

1. Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding (The phone will prompt you for a command.)



- 2. Say Voice Memo.
- 3. Wait for the beep and then start speaking. (As it is recording, the phone displays a countdown timer that shows how many seconds are left for recording.)
 - memo is paused, press the left softkey A again to Resume recording.)
- 4. To finish recording, press the right softkey ${\bf /\!\!\! /}$ to **Stop** to the recording prior to the countdown completion.
- 5. The memo is saved to your phone. Press the right softkey A to **Play** your message for review.

Tip: You can also assign Voice Memos to either the left or right navigation keys. For more information, see "Shortcuts" on page 100. You can also create voice memos by pressing the left softkey **A** for **MENU**, followed by then selecting **Voice Memo**.

To record a conversation during a phone call:

- 1. During a call, press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for **Voice Memo**. (A one minute counter is displayed on the screen to indicating the amount of time a single voice memo can be recorded.)
 - Press the left softkey to Pause the memo. (When a memo is paused, press the left softkey again to Resume recording.)
- 3. Press the right softkey be to **Stop** to the recording prior to the countdown completion. The memo is saved to your phone.

Note: A total of 30 minutes in 30 separate memos can be recorded and saved. Individual memos can record up to 60 seconds of audio.

Reviewing and Erasing Memos

To play the voice memos you have recorded:

- 1. Press the left softkey **(4)** followed by **(4)** for **Do More**.
- 2. Press for Sounds.
- 3. Highlight **Voice Memo** and press either the left softkey or .
- Press for Review. (The phone displays a list of saved memos, with the first one selected.)
- Select a memo and press the right softkey or .
 or .

Press the number corresponding to the memo you want to review. (The phone replays the memo.)

To erase an individual memo:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** followed by **A** for **Do More**.
- Press for Sounds.
- 3. Highlight Voice Memo and press either the left softkev or 🗐.
- 4. Press for **Review**. (The phone displays a list of saved memos, with the first one selected.)
- 5. Using the navigation keys, highlight the memo you want to erase.
- 6. Press the left softkey A for Options followed by of to Erase.
- 7. Press the navigation key up to select **Yes** and press

To erase all voice memos:

- 1. Press the left softkey **a** followed by **b** for **Do More**.
- Press for Sounds.
- 3. Highlight Voice Memo and press either the left softkey A or 🗐 .
- 4. Press of for Erase All.
- 5. Press the navigation key left to select **Yes** and press .

Navigating Through Menus

Menu Styles

Your phone can display the various features and options in one of two different menu styles, **Icon** and **List**. Regardless of which style you prefer, menu organization and key commands do not change.

List

List style displays all the various menu choices in a vertical list. As you navigate through the menu, menu options are highlighted. You can use your navigation keys to scroll through menus quickly and easily. The scroll bar at the right of the menu keeps track of your position in the menu at all times.

- To navigate through a menu, simply press the navigation key up or down. If you are in a first-level menu, such as **Settings**, you may also navigate to the next menu by pressing the navigation key left or right.
- You can also press the number corresponding to the menu choice. For example, if you want to view your last received call:
 - Press the left softkey

 for MENU.
 - 2. Press for Call History.
 - 3. Press of for Received Calls.

lcon

Icon style displays the first level menu choices with graphical icons arranged in a grid pattern. In other menu levels, choices are arranged in a vertical list, similar to List style.

 To navigate through a first level menu, simply press the navigation key in the direction towards your desired menu choice. The currently-highlighted menu choice is enlarged and

Contacts

Adding a New Contact

Your phone can store up to 500 entries (numbers/e-mails/URLs) in eight categories (Home, Office, Mobile, Pager, Fax, E-Mail, Others, URLs). Phone book capacity is based on number of entries, not by number of contacts.

To add a new entry:

- 1. Enter a new phone number and press the right softkey for Save
- 2. Using the navigation keys, select **New Entry** and press **2.**
- 3. Select the **Type** using the navigation key and press .
 - Home Office Mobile Pager Fax Others
- **4.** Enter the name using the keypad and press **1** to save. After you have saved the number, the new Contacts entry is displayed.

Finding Contacts

There are several ways to display your Contacts entries: by name or by entry. To find an entry from the Contacts menu:

- Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- Press for Contacts.
- 3. Press for **List Entries**. A list of all your Contacts is displayed. You can find a specific contact in one of the following ways:

- Scroll through the list using the up and down navigation keys.
- Press the navigation up so that By Name is highlighted.
 Press the navigation key left or right to rearrange your
 Contacts By Name or By Entry. If more than one Contact appears, scroll through the list using the up and down navigation keys.
- Enter the first few letters to locate the desired Contact. If more than one Contact appears, scroll through the list using the up and down navigation keys.
- 4. With the desired Contact highlighted, press to make the call.

Adding a Phone Number to a Contact Entry

To add a phone number to an entry:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- Press for Contacts.
- 3. Press for List Entries.
- 4. Select the desired entry and press 🕙.
- 5. Press the left softkey of for **Options**, followed by to **Edit** the entry.
- **6.** Press the navigation key down until the desired label (Home, Office, Mobile, etc.) is highlighted.
- 7. Enter the phone number using the keypad and press 🖾.

Editing a Contacts Entry's Phone Number

To edit an entry's phone number:

- 1. Press the left softkey **1** for **MENU**.
- Press for Contacts.
- 3. Press for **List Entries**.
- 4. Select the desired entry and press .
- 5. Press the left softkey 4 for **Options**, followed by **2** to Edit the entry.
- **6.** Press and hold to erase the entire number or press once to erase just the last number.
- 7. Enter the phone number using the keypad and press 2.

Selecting a Ringer Type for an Entry

You can assign a ringer type to a Contacts entry so you can identify the caller by the ringer type. (See "Ringer Types" on page 88.) To select a ringer type for an entry:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- Press for Contacts.
- Press for List Entries.
- 4. Select the desired entry and press .
- 5. Press the left softkey A for Options, followed by 2 to Edit the entry.
- 6. Press the navigation key down until **Default** is selected and press the left softkey & for Edit.
- 7. Using the navigation keys, select a ringer category and press 👰.

- 8. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight and listen to the desired Ringer. Press to select the desired ringer.
- 9. Press to save the changes to the contact entry.

Assigning a Contact to a Group

You can associate a preset group name to your entries to help you sort them easier in the Contacts. The preset group names already programmed into your phone are:



To associate an existing number located in your Contacts:

- Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Contacts.
- Press for Groups.
- 4. Select the desired Group and press . If no previous Contacts have been added to the group, the message "No entry saved in this Group" is displayed.
- Press the left softkey for Options followed by for Add
- Select a Contact and press
- 7. Scroll through the Contact entry to select a Mobile number or e-mail address and press .

Note: Each Contact Mobile number or e-mail address can be assigned to only a one Group.

Call History

Viewing History

You'll find the Call History feature very helpful. It is a list of the last 20 phone numbers (or Contacts entries) for each of: calls missed, calls made, or calls accepted. Call History makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the hottom of the list.

Each entry contains the phone number (if it is available) and Contacts entry name (if the phone number is in your Contacts). Duplicate calls (same number and type of call) may only appear once on the list. To view a Call History entry:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Call History.
 - Press for Recent Calls.
 - Press for Dialed Calls.
 - Press for Received Calls.
 - Press for Missed Calls.

Tip: You can access your list of recent calls from the idle screen by pressing the navigation key down. You can also access your list of Dialed Calls from the idle screen by pressing the key.

Call History Options

For additional information on a particular call, highlight a Call History entry and press . The time and date of the call is displayed.

Tip: You can also scroll between Call History entries by pressing the navigation key left or right.

Press the left softkey **(** for **Options** to select one of the following options for this entry:

- Dial
- Save
- Prepend
- Erase

Making a Call From Call History

To place a call from Call History:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Call History.
- 3. Select Recent Calls , Dialed Calls Received Calls , or Missed Calls .
- Highlight the entry you want to call and press to dial the number.

Note: You cannot make calls from Call History to entries identified as Unknown or Restricted.

Saving a Phone Number From Call History

To save a phone number from Call History:

- Press the left softkey

 for MENU.
- Press for Call History.

- 3. Select Recent Calls \(\bigcup_{\text{max}} \), Dialed Calls \(\bigcup_{\text{max}} \) Received Calls , or Missed Calls .
- 4. Highlight the entry you want to save and press 2.
- 5. Press the left softkey A for **Options**, followed by **2** to Save the number.

Follow the onscreen prompts to complete the entry. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 18 for more details.)

After you have saved the number, the new Contacts entry is displayed.

Note: You cannot save phone numbers already in your Internal Contacts or from calls identified as Unknown ID or Restricted.

Prepending a Phone Number From **Call History**

If you need to make a call from Call History and you happen to be outside your local area code, you can add the appropriate prefix by prepending the number.

To prepend a phone number from Call History:

- 1. Press the left softkey A for MENU.
- 2. Press for Call History.
- 3. Select Recent Calls 📭, Dialed Calls 📧, Received Calls , or Missed Calls
- 4. Highlight the entry you want to prepend and press 💽.
- 5. Press the left softkey **A** for **Options**, followed by **a** to Prepend the number.
- **6.** Use the keypad to enter the desired numbers.

7. Press **a** to call the pre-pended number.

Erasing Call History

To erase individual Call History entries, see "Call History Options" on page 54.

To erase Call History:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Call History.
- 3. Press for Erase History.
- 4. Select Recent Calls , Dialed Calls Received Calls , or Missed Calls .
- 5. Using the navigation key, highlight Yes, and press 🖭 .

Air Time

Air time allows you to check the time of the last call or the total air time since your phone was activated on the network. **These times are not meant for billing purposes**. To view the air time:

- 1. Press the left softkey A for MENU.
- Press for Call History.
- 3. Press of for Call Timers.
- 4. Press for Last Call, for Recent Calls, or for LifeTime.

Messaging

Now you can exchange text, multimedia and email messages right from your phone and stay connected without saying a word. Within the Messaging menu you can also view the number of voice mail messages you have waiting for you. The following folders are available in the Messaging menu:

Voice Mail

Setting Up Your Voice Mail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to your voice mail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. Therefore, you will want to set up your voice mail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated.

To set up your voice mail:

- 1. Press and hold the navigation key up.
- 2. Follow the system prompts to create your passcode, record your greeting, and record your name announcement.

Note: You must request this feature from your service provider for it to work correctly.

Voice Mail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you of a new message:

- By displaying a message on the screen.
- By sounding the assigned ringer type.
- By the LED blinking red.
- By displaying at the top of your screen.

New Voice Mail Message Alerts

When you receive a new voice message, your phone alerts you and prompts you to call your voice mail.

To call your voice mail:

- 1. Press the left softkey **4** to **Listen** to the message.
- 2. Press the right softkey A for **Back** to return to the Idle screen.

Tip: You can also press and hold **has** to check your voice mail.



To display your Voice Mail:

Press the left softkey (for MENU, followed by





Important: When you are roaming off the network, you may not receive notification of new voice mail messages. It is recommended that you periodically check your voice mail by dialing 1 + area code + your Phone Number. You will be charged roaming rates when accessing voice mail while roaming off the network.

Note: Your phone accepts messages even when it is turned off. However, you are only notified of new messages when your phone is turned on and vou are in a Service Area.

Retrieving Your Voice Mail Messages

To dial your voice mail from your phone, you can either speed dial your voice mail by pressing and holding the navigation key up or by using the menu keys.

Using the Menu to Retrieve Your Messages

1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.

- Press for Messaging.
- Press for Voice Mail.
- 4. Press for Inbox.
- 5. Press the left softkey 🐧 to **Listen** to your messages. You can also press and hold has to check your voice mail.

Note: You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voice mail from your phone.

Clearing the Message Icon

Your phone may temporarily continue to display the message icon after you have checked your voice and text messages.

To clear the icon from the display screen:

- 1. Press the left softkey **4** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press of for Messaging.
- 3. Press for Voice Mail.
- 4. Press for Clear VM Count.
- 5. Press the navigation key up to select **Yes** and press ...



Text & Multimedia Messages

Create New

Using your phone you can send text and multimedia messages to other mobile phones in North America and rest of the world. depending on your carrier.

To send a message

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for Messaging.

- 3. Press for Text & Multimedia.
- 4. Press for **Send New**.
- 5. Enter the phone number or e-mail address. After entering the number or address, press . When you are finished entering numbers or addresses, press the right softkey \mathbb{A} for Next.

Tip: To change text entry mode, press and hold



- To send the message to one of your contacts, press the down navigation key to highlight Contact List and press . Highlight the desired contact and press the left softkey **A** for **Mark**. When you are finished adding contacts, press 🗐.
- If you wish to send your message to multiple numbers or addresses, repeat step 5. Use the navigation keys to move up and down your list of addressees. You can send a message to a maximum of 10 numbers.
- 6. Create your message using the keypad. For more information on entering text, see "Entering Text" on page 21. When you are finished creating your message, press the right softkey **A** for **Send**.
 - To add a Subject line to your message, highlight the **Subject** box using the navigation keys. Enter the subject text. When you are finished press .
 - To write the body of your message, highlight the main body box using the navigation keys. Enter the text of the message. When you are finished press . To send the message, press the right softkey **A** to **Send**.

Tip: If you have already entered a subject for your message, the body box is already highlighted.

To add a sound file to your message

You can add sound clips or, voice memos to your message.

- From the message composition screen, highlight More using the navigation keys and press
- Highlight Add Sound using the navigation keys and press
- 3. Select for Record New, for Sound Clips, or for Voice Memos.
 - If you selected **Record New**, you will be prompted to record a new voice memo. For more information on recording voice memos, see "Voice Memos" on page 38.
 - If you selected Sound Clips or Voice Memos, highlight the desired clip or voice memo and press
- **4.** The sound file is attached to your message. You can now finish composing and send your message.

To add a picture to your message

You can add photographs or image clips to your message.

- From the message composition screen, highlight More using the navigation keys and press
- 2. Highlight **Add Picture** using the navigation keys and press
- 3. Select for Take Picture or for Image Clips.
 - If you selected Take Picture, the camera will start. For more information, see "Taking Pictures" on page 109.

- If you selected **Image Clips**, highlight the desired clip or photograph and press
- **4.** The picture file is attached to your message. You can now finish composing and send your message.

To add a slide to your message

For lengthy messages, you can divide your message text among two slides. Each slide presents one screen of information. Each slide can contain its own sound and picture attachments.

- From the message composition screen, highlight More using the navigation keys and press
- Highlight Add Slide using the navigation keys and press
- A new body box appears below the first box. You can move between the first and second slides using the navigation keys. You can now finish composing and send your message.

To change the sending options of the message

- From the message composition screen, highlight More
 using the navigation keys and press the left softkey of
 Options.
- If your message contains sounds, images or slides, then your message is an MMS message. Select for Sending Options.
 Otherwise, it is likely a SMS message. Select for Sending Options.
- 3. Select the option you wish to change.

SMS Options

- Callback Number: allows you to change the callback number for this message. The default callback number is your mobile phone number.
- Priority: allows you to change the priority of the message between Normal and Urgent.
- Validity Period: allows you to set an expiry date for this message.
- **Deferrd Delivery**: allows you to delay the delivery of this message to a selected time.
- Acknowledge: allows you to turn Acknowledge Off or On.

MMS Options

- Read Report: allows you to turn Read Report Off or On. When On, you will be notified when your message is read by the message's recipient.
- **Delivery Report**: allows you to turn Delivery Report **Off** or On. When On, you will be notified when your message is received by the message's recipient.
- Priority: allows you to change the priority of the message between High, Normal, and Low.
- **CC**: allows you to add a CC address to your message.
- **BCC:** allows you to add a BCC address to your message.
- Slide Timing: allows you set the duration (in seconds) of each slide.
- 4. When finished with your messaging options, press the right softkey A for Back. Press the right softkey A for Back again to return to your message.

To save your message

You can save a draft of your message prior to sending it. You can save the entire message as a draft, the text of the message or the image.

- From the message composition screen, highlight More
 using the navigation keys and press the left softkey for
 Options.
 - Select (MMS) or (SMS) for Save To Drafts.
 The message is now stored in your Drafts folder. Once the message is sent, the draft will be deleted.
 - Select (MMS) or (SMS) for Save Text. The text of your message is now stored as a Quick Text message.
 - If your message is MMS, select for **Save As Template** (SMS mesages cannot be saved as a template).

 Enter a name for the template and press folder. Unlike draft messages, templates are not deleted when sent.
- 2. You can now continue to compose or send your message.

Inbox

This folder contains all your received text and multimedia messages. From this folder, you can view your messages, reply to or forward the message to another destination.

To read a text message:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press of for Messaging.
- 3. Press for Text & Multimedia.

- 4. Press for **Inbox**. Your messages appear in a list.
- Highlight the desired message and press . The message appears on screen.

To reply to a message:

- While the message is open, select the left softkey for Options.
- Press to Reply.
- Compose your reply message. For more information, see "To send a message", beginning at step 6.

Note: the address field is already filed in when replying to a message.

To select Inbox options

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Messaging.
- 3. Press for Text & Multimedia.
- 4. Press for **Inbox**. Your messages appear in a list.
- 5. Press the left softkey **A** for **Options**.
 - **Reply**: allows you to reply to the sender of the message.
 - Reply with Copy: allows to to reply to the sender of the message with the messaged copied into your reply.
 - Forward: allows you to forward a copy of the message to another person.
 - Move to saved: allows you to move the message to the Saved list.
 - Save address: allows you to save an address in your Contacts list.

- Message details: allows you to view information about the message, such as date and time.
- Erase: allows you to delete the message.
- Erase Multiple: allows you to select and delete several messages.
- Erase All: allows you to delete all the messages in the list.

Outbox/Sent

This folder contains all the messages you have sent or are waiting to send. From this folder, you can resend your messages or forward them to different destinations.

To resend your message

- 4. Press list. For **Outbox/Sent**. Your messages appear in a

This folder contains drafts of unfinished or unsent text and multimedia messages. From this folder, you can complete and send your messages. Once sent, the draft message is erased.

To compose a message using a draft:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- Press for Messaging.
- 3. Press for Text & Multimedia.
- 4. Press for **Drafts.** Your draft messages appear in a list.
- 5. Highlight the desired draft message and press 🚱.
- 6. Complete your message. For more information, see "To send a message", beginning at step 6 on page 61. You can modify the draft message as desired.

Saved

This folder contains saved text and multimedia messages. Saved messages will not automatically expire and must be manually deleted.

To view a saved message:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press of Messaging.
- 3. Press for Text & Multimedia.
- 4. Press for **Saved**. Your saved messages appear in a list.
- Highlight the desired saved message and press . The message appears on screen.

Erase Messages

You can erase messages at anytime from the Inbox, Outbox/Send, Draft or Saved message folders. To erase the messages from the desired folder:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for Messaging.
- 3. Press for Text & Multimedia.
- 4. Press for Erase Messages.
- 5. Press for Inbox, for Outbox/Sent, for Templates, for Drafts, for Saved or Messages.
- Press the navigation key left or right to select **Yes** and press

Settings

There are several options associated with messages. The Settings menu allows you to customize the options to fit your preferences.

To access the Settings menu:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press of for Messaging.
- 3. Press for Text & Multimedia.
- 4. Press for Settings.

The following options are available:

SMS Options

- Callback #: allows you to change the callback number for this message. The default callback number is your mobile phone number.
- Priority: allows you to change the priority of the message between Normal and Urgent.
- Acknowledge: allows you to turn Acknowledge Off or On.
 When On, this option allows you to have a return message
 sent back notifying you that the message was received and
 read by the recipient.

MMS Options

- Read Report: allows you to turn Read Receipt Off or On. When On, you will be notified when your message is read by the message's recipient.
- Delivery Report: allows you to turn Delivery Receipt Off or On.
 When On, you will be notified when your message is received by the message's recipient.

- Priority: allows you to change the priority of the message between High, Normal, and Low.
- Auto Download: allows you to turn Auto Downloading Off or On. When On, the attachments for multimedia messages will automatically be downloaded to your phone.
- Rejection Settings: allows you to adjust the Rejection settings for your phone. The options available are:
 - By Size: allows you to reject multimedia messages that over a specified size.
 - Reject Adv.: allows you to reject multimedia messages that are labeled as advertising (Adv.)
 - MIN/Email: allows you to reject multimedia messages sent from a specific phone number (MIN) or Email address.

Save to Outbox: allows you to adjust whether sent messages are saved in your Outbox. Your options are:

- Auto Save automatically saves a copy of the outgoing message in the filed folder.
- Prompt prompts you to save a copy of the outgoing message.
- Do Not Save does not save a copy of the outgoing message.

Auto Delete Inbox: allows you to adjust whether read messages are automatically deleted from your Inbox. Your options are **Off** or **On**.

Default Entry Mode: The Entry Method allows you to set the default character input method for new text messages. You can select between:

• **Alpha**: is the standard keypad text entry mode.

- **T9 Word**: is a predictive text entry mode
- Number: is the standard numeric entry mode.

Quick Text: Quick Text messages are used to enter common responses to questions. A Quick Text can be selected and automatically entered into the message. Quick Text can also be customized to whatever you want by editing the 9 pre-set messages already stored in your phone. To edit a Quick Text message:

- From the Settings menu, select for Quick Text. A list of Quick Text messages appears on screen.
- Highlight the desired Quick Text message and press
- 3. Edit the message and press when finished.

Auto Scrolling: The scroll timer allows you to set the length of time a message takes to scroll across the screen. Options are **Off**, **3 Seconds**, **5 Seconds** or **10 Seconds**.

Your phone is capable of engaging in online chat sessions. Consult with your Service Provider for more details.

- 3. Press for IM & Chat.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions.

Do More

Wireless Web

Your phone comes equipped with Wireless Web access through your browser. You can view specially designed version of popular sites which includes sports, weather, news, stock quotes etc.... as well as downloadable ringtones, Wallpapers and games. When you launch the browser, the phone will connect to the Internet and the service indicator icon will display.

Note: Rates and pricing vary according to your service plan. Please contact your service provider for additional information.

Launching the Browser

To launch a web connection:

- 3. Press for Wireless Web.
- 4. You are connected to the Mobile Web Home page.

Web Connection Status and Indicators

Your phone's display lets you know the current status of your web connection through indicators which appear at the top of the screen. The following symbols are used:

- Your web connection is active (data is being transferred).
 Incoming voice calls go directly to voice mail; outgoing voice calls can be made, but the web connection will terminate.
- When your web connection is dormant (no data is being sent or received). Though not currently active, when dormant the phone can restart an active connection quickly; voice calls can be made and received.

Navigating the Wireless Web

Navigating through menus and Web sites during a web session is easy once you've learned a few basics. Here are some tips for getting around:

Softkeys

When browsing the Web, the bottom line of your phone's display contains one or more softkeys. These keys are shortcut controls for navigating around the Web, and they correspond to the softkey buttons directly below the phone's display screen. Depending on which Web sites you visit, the labels on the softkeys may change to indicate their function.

To use softkeys, simply press the desired softkey button. If an additional pop-up menu appears when you press the softkey button, select the menu items using your keypad (if they're numbered) or by highlighting the option and pressing .

Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to scroll up and down to see everything on some Web sites.

Press the navigation key up and down to scroll line by line or

press the volume buttons on the side of the phone to scroll one page at a time.

Navigating Between Web Pages

Once you've learned how to use softkeys and scroll, you can start navigating Web sites.

 Select on-screen items by using the navigation key to highlight the desired item, then press the desired softkey button (or press

You'll find that the left softkey 🌉 is used primarily for selecting items.

 If the items on a page are numbered, you can use your keypad (number keys) to select an item.

Links, which appear as <u>underlined text</u>, allow you to jump to different Web pages, select special functions, or even place phone calls.

 Select links by highlighting the link and then selecting the appropriate softkey.

Tip: The tenth item in a numbered list may be selected by pressing the key on your phone's keypad, even though the number 0 doesn't appear on the screen.

To go back one page, press on your phone. (Note that
 is also used like a BACKSPACE key to delete text.)

- Press for Settings.

- 5. Press for **Call Answer** and select one of the following:
 - Send KeyFlip OpenAny Key
- 6. Press to save and exit.

Auto Answer

To answer calls when your phone is connected to an optional handsfree car kit or head set:

1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.

- Press for Settings.
- 3. Press for **Setup**.
- 4. Press for Call Setup.
- 5. Press for Auto Answer.
- 6. Press the navigation key up or down to select **Off**. **After 5** sec. After 3 sec or After 1 sec.
- 7. Press to save and exit.

Note: When your phone is in Auto Answer mode, the 1 and 1icon appears on the display screen.

Auto-Hyphen

When the Auto-Hyphen feature is turned on, your phone automatically inserts dashes between blocks of numbers, making them easier to read. Dashes are inserted into 7, 10 or 11 digit formats. For instance, if you enter the digits 4165551212, your phone will display the number as 416-555-1212.

To change turn Auto-Hyphen On or Off:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for **Settings**.
- 3. Press for **Setup**.
- 4. Press for Call Setup.
- 5. Press for Auto-Hyphen.
- **6.** Select **On** or **Off** using the navigation keys and press **2**.

Auto Prepend

When the Auto-Prepend feature is turned on, your phone automatically inserts a predetermined set of digits and symbols at the beginning of any number entered. For example, you could enter a '1' if all your calls are going to be long-distance.

- 1. Press the left softkey A for MENU.
- Press for Settings.
- 3. Press for Setup.
- 4. Press for Call Setup.
- 5. Press for Auto Prepend.
- **6.** Highlight **0n** or **0ff** using the navigation keys. If you select On, then enter the prepending sequence.
- 7. When you are finished, press 🗐.

Language

Your phone can display text in English or French. Language selection changes all menus and voice message settings.

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- Press for Settings.
- 3. Press for Setup.
- 4. Press of Language.
- Press the navigation key up or down to select English or French.
- 6. Press to save and exit.

Data Setup

Your phone is capable of sending and receiving digital data and fax calls when connected to a computing device (laptop, desktop, hand held, palmtop, etc.) running the Windows operating system. Your phone functions similar to a typical modem on your PC, enabling you

to use wireless data involving a wide variety of Windows applications.

To use digital data or fax services with your phone, you will need to obtain a digital data/fax kit from your service provider. This kit contains the necessary cables, software, and documentation required for you to connect and use your phone with your computing device.

- 1. Press the left softkey A for MENU.
- 2. Press for Settings.
- 3. Press for **Setup**.
- 4. Press for Data Setup.
- 5. Using the navigation keys, highlight the desired option.
 - Off: No incoming Data/Fax calls can be received.
 - Fax In Once: No Voice Calls can be received. Allows one incoming fax call, and then reverts to Off.
 - Fax in Always: No Voice Calls can be received. Only allows incoming Fax calls.
 - Data In Once: No voice calls can be received. Allows one incoming data transmission and then reverts to Off
 - Data in Always: No voice calls can be received. Only allows incoming data transmissions.
- 6. Press to save and exit.

Advanced

Phone Info

The Phone Info screen displays information about your handset's current hardware and software, and is used only for diagnostics.

To view your Phone Info:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- Press for Settings.
- 3. Press of for Advanced.
- 4. Press for Phone Info.
- When you are finished viewing the phone information, press to exit.

System

Security

Memory Usage

The Memory Usage screen tells you how much of your phone's memory is used and how much remains available.

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- Press for Settings.
- 3. Press for Advanced.
- 4. Press for Memory Usage.
- Your phone's memory usage is displayed. Press when finished.

Memory MGR

The Memory MGR allows you to free up phone memory by deleting unwanted Ringtones, Wallpapers, Games, Tools, Others, Photo, Multimedia, Sound Clips, and Voice Memos.

To delete a file:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Settings.
- Press for Advanced.
- 4. Press for Memory MGR.
- 5. Select the category of the file or files that you wish to delete. If you select Multimedia, you will have to select the subcategory of files that you wish to delete.
- **6.** Select the file you wish to delete and press **2**.



Tip: If you wish to delete all the files in a category, press the left softkey **A** for **Options** and select **Erase All**.

Airplane Mode

Airplane Mode allows you to use many of your phone's features, such as Games, Notepad, Voice Memos, etc., when you are in an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited. When your phone is in Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information. All incoming calls will be sent directly to your voice mail box.

To set your phone to Airplane Mode:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Settings.
- 3. Press for Airplane Mode.
- 4. Press the navigation key up or down to select **On** or **Off** and press to save and exit.

While in Airplane Mode, your phone's standby screen will display "Phone off."

Note: 911 and emergency calls can not be made when the Airplane mode is on.

Camera

Taking Pictures

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in Digital Camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a button. You can activate Camera mode and take pictures whether the phone is open or closed.

To Take a Picture With the Phone Open

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press of for Camera.
- Press for Take Picture.

Shortcut: To activate Camera mode, you can also press and hold the Side Camera button (Soe illustration on page 1).

- Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
 - To change the picture resolution between Low, Medium and High, press the up or down navigation keys.
 - To zoom in or out, press the left or right navigation keys.
 With higher resolutions, you will not be able to zoom in as much.
- 5. Hold the camera steady. To take the picture, press or the Side Camera button and until the shutter sounds.
 - If you wish to save your picture, press the right softkey to Save your photo. The photo is stored in your photo gallery. See "Photo Gallery" on page 114 for more details.
 - If you wish to send your picture to someone via multimedia messaging, press
 Your picture is embedded in a new

- multimedia message. See "Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging" on page 112 for more details.
- If you wish to discard the current picture, press the left softkey for Cancel. You can continue to take pictures.

To Take a Picture With the Phone Closed

- Press and hold the Side Camera button to activate Camera mode.
- 2. Point the camera lens at your subject. You can check the picture framing through the external display screen.

Note: If the subject images in reverse on the external display, select inversion using the volume keys to display the image correctly.

- 3. Press the Side Camera button to take the picture.
- **4.** Open the handset to view your picture. For more information, see step 5, listed above.

Camera Options

There are several settings associated with the full-color digital camera. These settings allow you to customize how the camera operates when taking pictures.

To set a camera option:

- 1. Start the camera. For more information, see "Taking Pictures" on page 109.
- 2. Press the left softkey **(4)** for **Options**.
- 3. Press the number key corresponding to the desired option.
 - 1.Self Timer: Allows you to configure a timer for Off, 5 sec or 10 sec
 - **2.Brightness:** Allows you to set the brightness level. Press the navigation key left or right to increase or

decrease the desired brightness.

- **3.Fun Frames**: Allows you to select a frame around the image before the picture is taken. Press the navigation key left or right to select the desired frame. Press to select and return to the camera mode.
- **4.Color Tones**: Allows you to select between several different color tones including **Normal**, **Sepia**, **Monochrome**, **Negative**, **Emboss**, and **Sketch** by pressing the navigation key left or right. When you find the desired tone, press
- **5.White Balance**: Allows you to set up the white balance of the camera automatically or manually using the different preset modes. The modes available are:
 - Auto: Automatically adjusts the lighting.
 - **Sunny**: Decreases the light sensitivity for taking pictures in full or mostly sunny conditions.
 - **Cloudy**: Increases light sensitivity for taking pictures under cloudy conditions.
 - Tungsten: Adjusts the white balance to match inside lighting conditions displayed using common household light bulbs.
 - Fluorescent: Adjusts the white balance to match inside lighting conditions displayed using common fluorescent lighting.
 - **Manual**: Allows you to adjust the white balance settings manually.
- **6.View Mode**: Allows you to select between **Portrait** and **Landscape** viewing.

Setting the Self-timer

To activate the Self-timer and get yourself in on the picture:

- With the phone open and in Camera mode, press the left softkey for Options.
- 2. Press for Self Timer.
- 3. Using the navigation key, highlight the length of delay you want the timer to use (5 or 10 seconds) and press .
- 4. Press to start the timer. (A timer is displayed in the lower left portion of the main LCD during the Self Timer countdown and the phone starts beeping.)
- Get ready for the picture. When the timer is down to 3 seconds, beep sounds are made and the countdown turns red.

To cancel the Self Timer after it has started:

Press the left softkey 4 to Cancel.

Note: While the Self-timer is active, all keys are disabled except the left softkey **4**, **and** and **...**.

Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging

- Take your picture, as described in "To Take a Picture With the Phone Open" on page 109, steps 1 to 4. From the Taken Picture screen, press to send your picture as part of a multimedia message.
- Compose your multimedia message. Your picture is already attached to the message. For more information, see "To send a message", beginning at step 6 on page 61.

Note: You will need to add a destination phone number or e-mail address to your message prior to sending it.

Make a postcard

Postcards are photographs that you can send to other people that have hand-written text superimposed over the image. To create a postcard:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press of for Camera.
- 3. Press for Make a postcard.
- 4. Take your picture.
- 5. Write your message on a plain white piece of paper.
- 6. Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your written message and press
- 7. Review your postcard.
 - If you wish to send your Postcard to someone via multimedia messaging, press Your picture is embedded in a new multimedia message. See "Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging" on page 112 for more details.
 - If you wish to discard the current picture, press the right softkey for Back. You can continue to take pictures.
 - If you wish to alter the appearance of your Postcard, press the left softkey for **Options**. The following options are available:
 - **1.Save**: save your Postcard to your Photo Gallery for future editing.
 - 2.Ink Color: change the color of your Postcard text.

Scroll left or right using the navigation keys to highlight a color and press

- **3.Shadow**: add a drop shadow your text. Select **Off** or **On** using the navigation keys and press **3.**
- **4.Rotate**: use the left and right navigation keys to rotate your text clockwise or counterclockwise around the image. When you are finished, press .
- **5.Zoom**: use the navigation keys to zoom in or out on your text. The background image does not change. When you are finished, press .
- **6.Move**: use the navigation keys to move the text up, down, left or right. When you are finished, press

Photo Gallery

From your Photo Gallery, you can view all the pictures that you have stored to your phone. Stored pictures can be sent to others as multimedia messages or postcards.

To view a picture stored in your Photo Gallery:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Camera.
- 3. Press for Photo Gallery.
- Using the navigation keys, scroll through the thumbnail images of your stored photos and highlight the desired photograph.
 - To view the highlighted picture, press the right softkey for **Expand**.
 - To send your picture to someone via multimedia messaging, press Your picture is embedded in a new multimedia

- message. See "Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging" on page 112 for more details.
- To modify your picture options, press the left softkey for Options. The following options are available:
 - **1.Pix Msg**: Sends the picture to someone via multimedia messaging. For more information, see "Sending a Picture via Multimedia Messaging" on page 112.
 - **2.W-Postcard**: Creates a Postcard using the picture as the background. For more information, see "Make a postcard" on page 113.
 - **3.Set As:** Allows you to use the picture for a wallpaper, picture ID, or incoming caller. In the address book, pictures can be used to identify incoming callers by displaying the image on screen.
 - **4.Rename**: allows you to change the name of the picture file.
 - **5.Upload**: Allows you to send a picture to an online album
 - **6.Erase**: Deletes the picture from memory.
 - **7.Erase All**: Deletes all the pictures in your Photo Gallery.
 - **8.Photo Info:** This option displays the caption, time and date, resolution, size and quality of the image.

Online Album

Online Albums are remote storage space that can be accessed using your phone. The locations can be used to save pictures from your phone.

Creating an Online Album

The first time you use any of the multimedia messaging management options involving the multimedia messaging Web site you will need to establish a multimedia messaging password through your phone. This password will also allow you to log in to the multimedia messaging Web site. Please contact your service provider for the web site details to access and manage your uploaded pictures and albums

To create your multimedia messaging password:

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for Camera.
- 3. Press for Online Album.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to create your account.

 Once you have received confirmation that your account has been

successfully registered, you may upload and share pictures and access the multimedia messaging Web site.

To access the multimedia messaging Web site:

- From your computer's web browser, go to the multimedia messaging web site provided by your service provider.
- Enter your Phone Number and multimedia messaging password to log in.

Uploading a picture to the multimedia messaging Web Site

- 1. Press the left softkey **A** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for Camera.
- 3. Press for Online Album.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to upload your picture(s).

To view Online Albums

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for MENU.
- 2. Press for Camera.
- 3. Press for Online Album.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to view your picture(s).

Note: Online album can be viewed with you computer (for more info refer to TELUS web site).

Camera Settings

The Camera Settings menu allows you to change the default options for common camera settings such as picture resolution, white balance, or fun frames.

Tip: When you are in the camera mode, many of the Camera Settings options can be adjusted by pressing the left softkey **4**.

- Resolution: Your full-color digital camera can take pictures in three different modes. Different resolutions allow you to increase the zoom multiple levels. This allows you to get a closer view of the subject or scenery being photographed. In High resolution mode, you cannot increase the zoom level. The available sizes are:
 - High: This is the highest resolution setting available for this camera, thus allowing you the most image detail. Images taken at the high setting require more memory to save than the other two modes.
 - Medium: The medium setting allows you to take good quality images without using too much memory.

- Low: The low setting allows you to take average quality images.
 You can save the most images in memory using this setting.
- Fun Frames: Allows you to select a frame around the image before the picture is taken. Press the navigation key left or right to select the desired frame. Press to select and return to the camera mode.
- Color Tones: Allows you to select between several different color tones including Normal, Sepia, Monochrome, Negative Emboss, and Sketch by pressing the navigation key left or right. When you find the desired tone, press
- White Balance: Allows you to set up the white balance of the camera automatically or manually using the different preset modes. The following modes are available:
 - Auto: Automatically adjusts the lighting.
 - Sunny: Decreases the light sensitivity for taking pictures in full or mostly sunny conditions.
 - Cloudy: Increases light sensitivity for taking pictures under cloudy conditions.
 - Tungsten: Adjusts the white balance to match inside lighting conditions displayed using common household light bulbs.
 - Fluorescent: Adjusts the white balance to match inside lighting conditions displayed using common fluorescent lighting.
- Shutter Sound: The shutter sound allows you to select between 5 different shutter sounds. The shutter sound is heard when you take a picture.
- Quality: The quality allows you to select between Fine, Normal, and Economy. These settings reflect the image quality settings for the pictures.

• View Mode: Allows you to select between Portrait and Landscape viewing.

Phone Security

Accessing the Security Menu

All of your phone's security settings are available through the Security menu. You must enter your lock code to view the Security menu.

To access the Security menu:

- 1. Press the left softkey **4** for **MENU**.
- 2. Press for Settings.
- 3. Press for Advanced.
- 4. Press for **Security**.
- 5. Enter your lock code. (The security menu is displayed.)

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of your Phone Number.

Locking Your Phone

When your phone is locked, you can only receive incoming calls or make calls to 911 or special numbers.

To lock your phone:

- 1. From the Security menu, press for **Lock Phone**.
- Using the navigation key, select Unlocked, On Power-Up or Lock Now, and press

Unlocking Your Phone

To unlock your phone:

- 1. Press the left softkey 4 for Unlock.
- 2. Enter your lock code.

Changing the Lock Code

To change your lock code:

- 1. From the Security menu, press for **Change Lock**.
- Enter your new lock code. Your new lock code must have 4 digits.
- 3. Re-enter your new lock code.

Calling in Lock Mode

You can place calls to 911 and to your special numbers when in lock mode.

To place an outgoing call in lock mode:

- To call an emergency number or special number, enter the phone number and press
- To place normal outgoing calls, press to display the lock code screen. Enter your lock code. Enter the desired phone number and press .

Special Numbers

You can save up to three special numbers in addition to your Internal Contacts entries (the same number may be in both directories). You can make and receive calls from special numbers even when your phone is locked. You can save three special numbers in addition to your Contacts entries (the same number may be in both directories). To add or replace a special number:

- 1. From the Security menu, press and for Special #.
- Select entry one, two, or three and press
- 3. Enter the number using the keypad.
- 4. Press 😰 to save.

Note: There are no Speed Dial options associated with special numbers.

Erasing the Contacts

To erase all the names and phone numbers in your Contacts:

- 1. From the Security menu, press for **Erase Contacts**.
- 2. Using the navigation key, select **Yes** and press **1** to permanently delete.

Erasing Content

This option deletes all saved downloaded content from the phone, including games, Ringtones, Wallpapers, and applications.

To erase your downloads:

- 1. From the Security menu, press for **Erase Content**.
- 2. Using the navigation key, select **Yes** and press **1** to permanently delete.

Resetting Your Phone

Resetting the phone restores all the factory defaults, including the ringer types and display settings. The Contacts, Scheduler, and Messaging are not affected.

To reset your phone:

- From the Security menu, press for Reset Phone. Your phone will reset.
- Using the navigation key, select Yes and press .Your phone will reset.

Safety

Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

Understanding the Power Save Feature

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to standby mode.

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

Knowing Radio Frequency Safety

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below. In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after

reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- Hold the phone with the antenna raised, fully-extended, and over your shoulder.
- Try not to hold, bend, or twist the phone's antenna.
- Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
- Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a dealer store or call Customer Support for service.

Note: For the best care of your phone, only authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first. When using your phone in the car:

- Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and re-dial.
- When available, use a hands-free device.
- Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that

two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Restricting Children's Access to your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone, dial 911 by mistake or make calls that increase your phone bill.

Caring for the Battery

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Samsung approved batteries and travel adapters.
 These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. When used correctly, the battery can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:
 - Less than one month:
 4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C)
 - More than one month:
