

Getting started

Safety Precautions



CAUTION

NOTE FOR EMERGENCY CALLS:

Telephone calls are impossible if the main power fails. The battery must also be charged to make a call.



CAUTION

Use only the original power supply of this telephone. Incorrect adapter polarity or voltage can seriously damage the unit.

Input: 230 VAC 50 Hz/Output: 9 VDC 300 mA



CAUTION

RISK OF EXPLOSION IF BATTERY IS REPLACED BY AN INCORRECT TYPE.

Never use non-rechargeable batteries; use recommended type supplied with this telephone. NiMH batteries must be disposed of in accordance with applicable waste disposal regulations.

Rechargeable batteries became warm during loading (charging the handset); this is a normal process and harmless.

Do not use in the rain, near a bath or with wet hands.

Do not allow the charging contacts to come into contact with conductive materials.

It is recommended that you disconnect the base unit from the main power and telephone line socket during a thunderstorm.

It is normal that a certain amount of heat will be generated in its day to day operation. It is recommended that this product shall not be placed on antique, veneered or wooden surfaces.

To clean the product, use a damp (not wet) cloth or antistatic wipe. Never use a dry cloth as this may cause a static shock. Never spray cleaning fluid directly onto the handset and base unit

Environmental impact

Basic Steps to Install

- Connect the output plug of the power adapter to the adapter socket on the back of the base unit and the main adapter to the wall power supply.
- Connect the telephone line cord to the phone cord socket on the back of the base unit and to the line phone socket to the wall.
- Place the 2 AAA batteries, observing their polarities, into the battery compartment on the handset.
- Slide the battery door firmly into place.
- Place the handset on the base unit and let the batteries charge for a full 14 hours before using.

Switching the handset on and off

The handset is activated as soon as the batteries have been installed.

To switch on press the end key.

To switch off make a long press - you will hear the beep sound.

The handset also is switched on automatically when it is placed in the base station. If the handset is switched on by placing in the base station, the charging status symbol will display.

How to use this phone

Your telephone will be operated with a menu. The menu offers access to all setting procedures and all of the telephone functions. Some menu items open a sub-menu after the selection of menu item. The menu will be controlled by the navigation key and by the softkeys. The exact functionality of every key is described on page 9.

Switching Keypad Lock on and off

You can lock the handset keypad if you are carry the handset in your pocket or bag. This prevents numbers being dialled by accident.

If there is an incoming call, the keypad is automatically unlocked and locked again after the call has ended.

To lock and unlock, press of for more than 2 sec.

Note: Emergency numbers can be dialled also if the keypad lock is activated.

General functions

Making an external call

Dialling with pre-dialling

For Pre-Dialling enter the number you want to call and then press

Using the phone book

- Press *MENU*, select *Phonebook* and press *OK*. (If you press in standby mode, the phone book is opened directly)
- If not empty, you can see entries in the phone book.
- Scroll with the navigation key to select a name/number.
- Press The number will be dialled.
- Press **S** to end the call.


Dialling without pre-dialling

- Press and wait for the dial tone.
- Dial the number.
- Press to finish the call.

Answering an external call

Your handset rings and the on-line status LED on the base station flashes.

- To answer the call, press any key except *Silent* soft key, or take the handset from the base station (automatic answering function).
- Press to end the call.
- If you do not want to answer the call, you can switch off the ring tone by pressing *Silent* soft key. You can press if you still want to answer the call



Displaying the telephone number

If the network provider supports caller line identification (CID), the caller's telephone number is displayed on an incoming call. If the Provider sends also the name, then the name will be displayed. If the caller's number is included in your handset phone book, the corresponding name will be displayed.

Note: The caller list shows the number or name of the phonebook.

Displaying the talk time

During an external call, the handset displays the talk time.

Switching to tone dialling

If your phone is set to pulse dialling, you can switch temporarily to tone dialling during the call (e. g. to control an answering machine). During the call:

- Press *MENU*, select the menu item *Tone*.
- Press *OK* to activate tone dialling.

Handsfree mode

In handsfree mode, other persons in the room can listen and you can you put down the handset and have your hands free.

By pressing you switch to handsfree or back to normal during the call. When you switch from normal to handsfree, the mode is displayed. The speaker symbol is also visible in handsfree mode.

The handsfree mode is possible during an internal and also during an external call.

Note: The handsfree mode is only possible, if the battery signal shows at least one line.

Receiver and speaker volume

Receiver and speaker volume can be adjusted. Three volume levels for the receiver and six volume levels for speaker are possible.

Adjusting the receiver volume

With the Navigation-Key you can adjust the receiver volume during the call. The selected receiver volume is stored.

Adjusting the speaker volume

With Navigation-Key you can adjust the speaker volume during the call in handsfree mode. The selected handsfree volume is stored.

Notebook

You can enter a number during the call. This number will be stored in the redial memory.

- Press *MENU*, select the menu item *Notebook*.
- Press *OK* to confirm.
- Enter the number.
- Press Option.
- Select *Save* and press *OK* to store.

Combox

The telephone supports the possibility to get direct access to your combox in the public network:

- Press key wore than 2 seconds.
- The combox number will be automatically dialled.
- You will be connected to the combox.

In order to use this service you must set your combox number in the service menu.

Voice Portal

This key allows you direct access to the Swisscom Voice Portal, where you can activate additional service s such as call diversion (Service 21, 61 or 67), call waiting (Service 43) or three-party conference with simple voice command. You can also use voice command to access current sport, news and weather information.

- Press key.
- The number 0848849850 will be automatically dialled.
- You will be connected to the Swisscom Voice Portal.

Out of range warning

If the handset is out of range from the base station during the call, you will hear a warning tone.

Paging

The base station has a search function to page the handsets:

- Press the PAGE key on the base station. All registered handsets will ring for about 30 seconds.
- To end paging, press the *PAGE* key on the base station again or press any key on the handset.

Redialling & redial list

The handset automatically saves the last 10 dialled phone numbers.

Dialling a number from redialling list

- Press or Redial key to open the redialling list. If not empty, the last number will be displayed.
- Select the desired phone number.
- Press to dial the selected number.

Redialling number - and change

- Press or the softkey *Redial* to open the redial list in standby mode. If not empty, the last number will be displayed.
- Select the desired phone number.
- Press key to dial the number.

or to edit the number

- Press *Option* to open sub-menu.
- Select *Display Number* and press *OK*.
- Edit number and press key to dial the number.

Copy a number to the phone book

- Press or *Redial* key to open the redial list. If not empty, last number will be displayed.
- Select the desired number.
- Press *Option* to open sub-menu.
- Select Copy to PhoneBk.
- Press *OK* to confirm. The input field is opened in which you can enter a name.
- Enter the name.
- Press Option.
- Select Save and press OK to store.



Deleting a number from the redial list

- Press or *Redial* key to open the redial list. If not empty, last number will be displayed.
- Select the desired phone number.
- Press *Option* to open sub-menu.
- Select *Delete Entry*.
- Press *OK* to delete.

Deleting the redial list

- Press or *Redial* to open the redialling list. If not empty, last number will be displayed.
- Press *Option* to open sub-menu.
- Select *Delete List* and press *OK*.
- Display "Delete All Entries?".
- Press OK to delete all entries.

Phonebook

You can store up to 100 telephone numbers. One entry in the phone book consists of 15 characters for the name and 30 digits for the number.

Entering names

Use the numeric keys to enter names.

To insert lower letters, press the # key. To revert to upper case letters, press the # key again.

Press the corresponding key repeatedly:

Storing an entry

- Press *MENU*, select *Phonebook* and press *OK*. (If you press in standby mode, the phone book will be opened directly)
- Press *Option* to open sub menu.
- Select *Add Entry* and press *OK*.

 Type name and then press to go down and enter the telephone number.
- Press Option.
- Select *Save* and press *OK* to store.



Dialling a number from the phone book

- Press MENU, select Phonebook and press OK.

 (If you press in standby mode, the phone book will be opened directly)
- Select entry.
- Press .
- The number will be dialled.

Displaying a number from the phone book

The number of the entry is displayed with pre-dialling mode.

- Press *MENU*, select *Phonebook* and press *OK*. (If you press in standby mode, the phone book will be opened directly)
- Select entry.
- Press *Option* to open sub menu.
- Select *Display Number*.
- Press *OK* to display the number with pre-dialling mode.

Phonebook and SIM-Card reader

With the SIM-Card Read/Write on the bottom of the base you can read or write entries from or to your SIM Card.

Copy entries from SIM-Card to the handset

- Press MENU, select Phonebook and press OK. (You can also select the symbol on the navigation key for direct access)
- Press Option.
- Select *Copy from SIM* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Enter the PIN of your SIM-Card.

Copy one entry:

- Select the entry you whish to copy and press *Option*.
- Select *Copy Entry* and confirm by pressing *OK*.

Copy all entries:

- Press Option.
- Select Copy all and confirm by pressing OK.

Copy from Handset to SIM-Card

- Press MENU, select Phonebook and press OK. (You can also select the symbol for direct access.)
- Press Option.
- Select *Copy to SIM* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Enter the PIN-Code of your SIM-Card.

Set the Area-Code:

- Press Option.
- Select *Area-Code* and confirm by pressing *OK*.
- Enter your Area-Code, including the needed 0 (zero).
- Press OK for confirmation.

Editing an entry

- Press MENU, select Phonebook and press OK. (If you press in standby mode, the phone book will be opened directly)
- Select entry.
- Press *Option* to open sub menu.
- Select *Edit Entry* and press *OK*. Now you can change the entry.
- Press Option.
- Select *Save* and press *OK* to store.

Deleting an entry

- Press MENU, select Phonebook and press OK. (If you press in standby mode, the phone book will be opened directly)
- Select entry.
- Press *Option* to open sub menu.
- Select Delete Entry.
- Press *OK* to delete.

Deleting the phone book

- Press MENU, select Phonebook and press OK. (If you press in standby mode, the phone book will be opened directly)
- Press *Option* to open sub menu.
- Select *Delete List* and press *OK*.
- Display "Delete All Entries?".
- Press OK to delete all entries.

Displaying the memory status

- Press MENU, select Phonebook and press OK. (If you press in standby mode, the phone book is opened directly)
- Press *Option* to open sub menu.
- Select *Memory Status*.
- Press OK.

The number of phone book entries is displayed.

Message (SMS)

Copy one entry:

- Select the entry you whish to copy and press *Option*.
- Select *Copy Entry* and confirm by pressing *OK*.

Copy all entries:

- Press Option.
- Select *Copy all* and confirm by pressing *OK*.

Explanation for the service "SMS over the fixed network"

Note: The network operator must support the SMS function.

The SMS service allows the transmission or reception of text messages to other devices. One message can have up to 160 characters. SMS service can only be used, if the device supports the display of the subscriber number (CLIP).

In order to receive a SMS it is necessary that you have already sent at least one SMS.

The sending number 062 210 00 0 for SMS centre 1 and receiving number 062 210 00 0 for SMS centre 2 are already preinstalled for Swisscom.

If the phone is connected to a PBX do not forget to enter the access code (e. q. 0) before the number of the SMS centre 1.

You can send and receive the SMS (Short Message Service) messages. You can write, read, edit and delete messages.

Note: To send and receive a message, you have to enter the call number of the service centre of your service provider.

At delivery state the number of the service centre of Swisscom is pre-programmed (sending and receiving: 062 210 00 0).



Setting the number for service centre (Send)

- Press MENU, select the menu item Message and press OK. (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be opened directly)
- Select *SMS* and press *OK*.
- Select Service Centre and press OK.
- Select *Send* and press *OK*.
- Enter the number.
- Press *OK* to confirm.

Setting the number for service centre (Receive)

- Press MENU, select the menu item Message and press OK. (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be opened directly)
- Select *SMS* and press *OK*.
- Select *Service Centre* and press *OK*.
- Select Receive and press OK.
- Enter the number.
- Press *OK* to confirm.

Receiving message

SMS Alert On / Off

- Press MENU, select the menu item Message and press OK. (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be opened directly)
- Select *SMS* and press *OK*.
- Select SMS Alert and press OK.
- Select *On* or *Off* and press *OK*.

Writing and sending message

- Press MENU, select the menu item Message and press OK.
 (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be pened directly)
- Select *SMS* and press *OK*.
- Select the menu item Write Message.
- Edit text message.
- Press *Option* to open sub menu.
- By selection Save, the text message will be saved in Saved directory with display "Saving Message".
- Select Send To and press OK.
- Enter the recipient's number (with the digits on the keypad or by selecting Option and getting a number from the Phonebook).
- Press Option.
- Select Send and press OK.
 The message will be sent by displaying "Sending Message".

OR

Receive call number from phone book by pressing Option, selecting Phone book list and confirming with OK.





Editing and deleting stored SMS

Inbox 01 (Numbers of Inbox messages)

Outbox 02 (Numbers of Outbox messages)

Saved 01 (Numbers of Saved messages)

- Press MENU, select the menu item Message and press OK.
 (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be opened directly)
- Select *SMS* and press *OK*.
- Select *Inbox*, *Outbox* or *Saved* and press *OK*.
- Select entry and press *Read*.
- The message will be displayed.
- Press Option.

To edit and / or use entry:

- Select *Use* and press *OK*.
- Edit text message.
- Press Option (by selecting Save, the text message will be saved).
- Select Send To and press OK.
- Edit the recipient's number.

OR delete the number and

- Select Option and then Phonebook List.
- Select the desired entry and press *OK*.
- Press Option.
- Select *Send* and the message will be sent.

To delete entry:

■ Select *Delete entry* and press *OK*.

To delete all entries in the box:

- Select *Delete List* and press *OK*. Display "Delete All Entries?".
- Press *OK*.

Delete SMS memory

- Press MENU, select the menu item Message and press OK.
 (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be opened directly)
- Select *SMS* and press *OK*.
- Select *Delete Memory* and press *OK*.
- Display "Delete All Entries".
- Press *OK*.

Copying a number into the phonebook

- Select SMS and press OK.
- Select *Inbox* and press *OK*.
- Select entry and press OK.
 The message will be displayed.
- Press *Option* to open sub menu.
- Select Copy to PhoneBk and press OK to confirm.
 An input field will be opened in which you can enter a name.
- Enter the Name and change with the Navigation-Key to the Number.
- Correct the number if necessary.
- Select VIP-field *On* or *Off*.
- Press Option.
- Select *Save* and press *OK* to store.

Caller list

The telephone numbers for the last 30 incoming calls are copied to the caller list.

Dialling a number from the caller list

- Press *MENU*, select the menu item *Message* and press *OK*. (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be opened directly)
- Select Caller List and press OK.
- Select New Calls or All Calls, and press OK.
- Scroll to the desired number.
- Press dial the number.

Copying a number into the phonebook

- Press *MENU*, select the menu item *Message* and press *OK*. (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be opened directly)
- Select *Caller List* and press *OK*.
- Select New Calls or All Calls and press OK.
- Select entry and press *Option* to open sub menu.
- Select Copy to Phoneb and press OK to confirm.
 An input field is opened in which you can enter a name.
- Enter the Name and change with the Navigation-Key to the Number.
- Correct the number if necessary.
- Select VIP-field *On* or *Off*.
- Press Option.
- Select *Save* and press *OK* to store.

Caller list and deleting

- Press MENU, select the menu item Message and press OK. (If you press in standby mode, the message menu will be opened directly)
- Select *Caller List* and press *OK*.
- Select New Calls or All Calls, and press OK.
- Scroll to the desired number.
- Press *Option* to open sub-menu.

To delete an entry:

■ Select *Delete Entry* and then press *OK* to delete.

To delete the caller list:

- Select *Delete List* and press *OK*.
- Display "Delete All Entries?".
- Press OK.

Services

With this menu you have the possibility to use the supplementary services of the network in an easy way. To activate the Combox Service please use the user manual "combox basic" from Swisscom.

Note: The Combox is a service of the network provider. The activation will be done by a call forwarding functionality. This functionality is the same as the normal call forwarding function. You can set a call forwarding for the line. That means, the activation of call forwarding is similar to the normal call forwarding to an entered number. If you ask for the status of call forwarding to the network, it is only possible to get a message like "The Service is activated". You will not get an information if the forwarding to the Combox or to an entered number has been activated. You have to remind this by yourself. If you are unsure you have the possibility to deactivate the forwarding and set the desired kind of forwarding again.

Set Combox number

By pressing for more than 2 sec. the telephone is dialling the combox number automatically. The condition is that the combox number is stored:

- Press *MENU*, select *Services* and press *OK*.
- Select *Combox* and press *OK*.
- Select Combox number and press OK.
- Enter your Combox number (086.. followed by your own telephone number including the area code and the zero).
- Press *OK* to save.

Activation of the Combox

- Press *MENU*, select *Services* and press *OK*.
- Select *Combox* and press *OK*.

■ Select fixed, when busy or when no answer and press OK.

Fixed means: The call will be forwarded immediately to your

Combox.

When busy means: The call will be forwarded to your Combox only

when your line is busy.

When no answer means: The call will be forwarded to your Combox only

when you are not able to answer the call.

■ Press *OK* to confirm.

■ Select Activate or Deactivate.

■ Press *OK* to confirm.

You will hear a confirmation of the activation/deactivation over the earpiece of your handset.

Note: If you did not set the number for the Combox you will get an error message.

Set call forwarding

- Press MENU, select Services and press OK.
- Select Call forwarding and press OK.
- Select fixed, when busy or when no answer and press OK.

Fixed means: Calls will be forwarded immediate to the entered

number.

When busy means: Calls will be forwarded to the entered number

only when your line is busy.

When no answer means: Calls will be forwarded to the entered number

only when you are not able to answer the call.

■ Press *OK* to confirm.

 Select Activate or Deactivate and press OK (by pressing OK after selecting Deactivate the deactivation will start immediately).

■ Enter the destination number (keypad or phonebook via *Option* Menu).

■ Press Option.

■ Select Send to and press OK.

Your Call forwarding is activated/deactivated. (You will hear a confirmation of the activation/deactivation over the earpiece of your handset.

Several handsets

Status of call forwarding (Combox and number)

- Press *MENU*, select *Services* and press *OK*.
- Select Combox or Call forwarding and press OK.
- Select fixed, when busy or when no answer and press OK.
- Select *Status* and press *OK*.

You will hear the status of the chosen call forwarding over the earpiece of your handset.

Call waiting

- Press *MENU*, select *Services* and press *OK*.
- Select Call Waiting and press OK.
- Select Activate, Deactivate or Status and press OK.
 (You will hear a confirmation/state of the activation/deactivation over the earpiece of your handset.)

You can operate up to six handsets on your base station.

In addition to an internal call between 2 handsets an external call can be held simultaneously with a third handset.

Registering handsets

In order to connect a handset to a base station, the handset must be registered at the base station. One handset can be registered up to 4 base stations.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select *Register* and press *OK*.
- Select the base station you want to register the handset and press *OK*.
- Press the paging button on the base station (more than 8 seconds) until you see the blink LED on base unit.
- Enter the base station PIN and press *OK* (Factory setting for PIN: 0000).
- Wait until the free handset numbers are displayed.
- Select the handset number with the appropriate numeric keys.
 Now, the handset is registered to the selected base station.

Note: To connect the handset at other base stations please look at the manual of the desired one.

De-registering handsets

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select Base Settings and press OK for confirmation.
- Select *Deregister* and press *OK*.
- Enter the base station PIN (Factory setting for PIN: 0000).
- Select the handset to be de-registered and press OK.
- Press *OK* to de-register.

Making an internal call

- Press *INT*.
- Enter the handset number.

 If you want to call all handset, press All.

Answering an internal call

Your handset rings.

- To answer the call, press any key except or remove the handset from the base station (Auto Talk function).
- Press 🕶 to end the call.

Transferring a call

You can transfer an external call to another handset.

- Press *INT*.
- Enter the handset number.

 If you want to call all handsets, press the All key.
- When the called party answers, press 🔊 to transfer the call.
- Instead of announcing the call, you can immediately press <a>.
 If the called party does not answer the call will get back automatically to you.

Call brokering

Even though your handset is connected to the external party, you can toggle to an internal handset and get back to the external party.

- Press *INT*.
- Enter the handset number.
 You will be connected to the internal partner and the external is set on hold.
- Press INT again.
 You will be connected to the external caller again.

Conference call

A conference call is possible between one external and two internal parties.

Making a conference call

You must make an external call first.

- Press *INT*.
- The external partner will be set on hold.
- Enter the handset number.
- The internal partner picks up.
 Now the both internal partners are connected.
- Press Conf. to make a conference call.

Ending a conference call

- If you press *C.End* to end the conference call, the connection to the external party is maintained and the internal call is placed on hold.
- If you press to end the conference call, your handset returns to the standby mode and the connection to the external party is maintained with the other internal party.

Handset settings

Ringer volume for general calls

Five ringer volumes are possible for the handset. Ringer off also is available.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select *Ringer Set* and press *OK*.
- Select *Ringer Volume* and press *OK*.
- Select the desired volume with the Navigation-Key (Off, 1~5).
- Press OK to save.

Ringer melody for general calls

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select Handset Settings and press OK for confirmation.
- Select *Ringer Set* and press *OK*.
- Select *Ringer Melody* and press *OK*.
- Select the desired melody with the Navigation-Key (From 1~17).
- Press OK to save.

VIP volume

To give the possibility to distinguish special entries in the phone book the VIP-defined entries have their own volume. Example: the VIP's will ring loud and the normal ones will ring low or can also be muted. Five ringer volumes are possible for the VIP's. Ringer off also is available.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select *Ringer Set* and press *OK*.
- Select *VIP Volume* and press *OK*.
- Select the desired volume with the Navigation-Key (Off, 1~5).
- Press *OK* to save.

VIP Melody

To differentiate the incoming calls, you can select single melodies to a single entry. The defined entries are selected by VIP ON.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select Handset Settings and press OK.
- Select *Ringer Set* and press *OK*.
- Select VIP Melody and press OK for confirmation.
- Select the desired melody with the Navigation-Key (From 1~17).
- Confirm by pressing *OK*.

Key beep

Key click is the sound you hear each time you press a key. This feature can be enabled or disabled.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select *Ringer Set* and press *OK*.
- Select *Key Beep* and press *OK*.
- Select *On* or *Off* and press *OK* to confirm.

Alarm clock

You can use your handset as an alarm clock.

If you have set a time for the alarm call, this is indicated by the \mathbf{Q} symbol in the display. To switch off the alarm during signalling press any key.

Activating the alarm clock

You can set the alarm clock with once mode or everyday mode.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select Alarm Clock and press OK.
- Select *Alarm Set* and press *OK*.
- Select *Once* or *Everyday*.

Choosing the ringer melody for the alarm call

If the ringer volume is off, one desired melody is selected for the ringer volume for the alarm call.

- Select Alarm Clock and press OK.
- Select Alarm Melody and press OK.
- Select the desired melody and press OK to confirm.

Deactivating the alarm clock

- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select Alarm Clock and press OK.
- Select Alarm Cancel.
- Press OK to deactivate the alarm clock with display the "Alarm Canceled".

Contrast

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select *Contrast* and press *OK*.
- Select the contrast with the navigation key.
- Press *OK* to save.

Note: The illumination of the handset can be only lighted up when the battery symbol has at least one segment.

Wall Paper

You can select the wall paper.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select Wall Paper and press OK.
- Select with the Navigation-Key and press *OK* to save.

Automatic answering

When this function is activated you can remove the handset from the base station to answer a call.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select Auto Answer and press OK.
- Select *On* or *Off*.
- Press OK to save.

Selecting base station

If the handset is registered at several base stations, you can set to select a base station automatically or specify a base station to connect.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select Select Base and press OK.
- Select the desired base station or Any Base and press OK to confirm.

Handset name

You can assign a name of 8 characters for the handset.

If the name is entered, the name is displayed on standby mode.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select *Handset Name* and press *OK*.
- Enter the name.
- Press *OK* to store.

Language

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select *Language* and press *OK*.
- Select the desired language and press *OK* to confirm.

Area-Code

This setting is needed for reading from the SIM-Card and adapting to the Swiss network. If you have a country code on the SIM-Card it will be replaced by a 0 (zero). If you have a foreign number with "+" this will be replaced by 00 (two zero's). The phone's default setting is prepared for the Swiss network.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.
- Select *Handset Settings* and press *OK* for confirmation.
- Select *Area-Code* and press *OK*.
- Select the Country-Code, Int. Prefix or Nat. Prefix and press OK.
- Enter the Number needed and press *OK* to store.

Changing the handset PIN

To protect the handset settings from unauthorized access you should change the handset PIN (factory setting: 0000) to a PIN that only you know.

- Press *MENU*, select *Settings* and press *OK*.

By setting this functionality one handset will ring first.

- Select the handset number or *Disable*:
 Disable means all the handsets ring at the same time.
