
## Wired Beltpack





# Connect and Position Headset Place the microphone directly in front of mouth, almost touching the lips.





#### 4 Adjust the Volume Level

**A)** Press the Talk Button and the Talk LED turns green.

B) Turn the Volume up all the way and then back down a quarter of a turn. Your own voice may sound low to you, but others will hear you loud and clear.

### **Command Center**

## Wireless Beltpack



#### Connect the Antenna

For best results, position the antenna **horizontally** as shown and place the Command Center within the line of sight of headset users.



#### Connect to a Power Source

(If outlet is available)



#### **Power the Command Center**

**Important!** Press and hold power button for 3 seconds.



#### Connect and Position the Headset



Place the microphone directly in front of mouth, almost touching the lips.



#### **Adjust the Volume Level**


A) Press the Talk Button and the Talk LED lights green.

B) Turn the Volume up all the way and then back down a quarter of a turn. Your own voice may sound low to you, but others will hear you loud and clear.



Note: All Talk Buttons should be turned off whenever the headset for that Talk Button is not on someone's head. This will avoid noise or echo in the system.

#### **Set the Command**

Repeat Steps 4 through 6 for the other Command Center position if it will be used.

#### **Optional External Antenna**

Attach the directional antenna to a secure structure or stand, and aim the directional antenna toward the center of the work site where your users will be located.



#### **Connect and Position Headset**

Place the microphone directly in front of mouth, almost touching the lips.



#### **Power the Beltpack**

Turn the volume knob clockwise to turn on Note: One of the five battery LEDs should come on and flash to indicate that the Beltpack is logged onto




