1.Safety Instructions

This user manual includes important safety information. Please read below instructions carefully. It may be dangerous or illegal if you do not follow these instructions.

Pay attention to Traffic Safety

Obey local traffic laws and do not use the phone while driving. Using a cell phone while driving is dangerous and it is illegal in some areas. Radio frequency (RF) signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles such as electronic fuel injection systems, electronic antiskid (antilock) braking systems, electronic speed control systems, air bag systems. For more information, check with the manufacturer of your vehicle for any equipment that has been added. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area.

🕫 Pacemaker Interference

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15.3 centimeters (6 inches) be maintained between a wireless phone and a pacemaker in order to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker.



🗂 Turn Off Your Cell Phone in Medical and Health Care Facilities

2. Getting Started

Remove the Back Cover

Open the battery cover carefully by prising open from the bottom where you will find a small notch.

Install the SIM card and battery

For availability and information about using SIM card services, contact your SIM card vendor. This may be the service provider, network operator, or other vendor.





Note: The SIM card and its contacts are easily damaged by scratches or bending, so please be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card.

Note: Keep all SIM cards out of the reach of small children.

- 1. Ensure the phone is switched off and the charger is disconnected before removing the battery.
- 2. With the back cover removed, install the SIM card by sliding it into its nest and under the metal holding plate. Ensure the angled corner is on the upper left hand side. (To remove the SIM card. gently press on it and slide it out of its nest.) Please note Micro SD you can only use a standard SIM card not 60700 a Micro or Nano SIM You can install SIM a microSD

memory card into the slot above SIM slot.

- 3. Install the battery into the battery slot, ensuring that the
 - three metallic stripes on the battery align with the three metallic prongs in the battery slot.



- 4. Put on the battery cover. Ensure the cover is completely closed and the matching sound (click) could be heard.
- 5. Plug the phone in to charge it fully.





Turning the Phone On

To turn the phone on, press and hold the red key until the screen lights up.

If you switch on the mobile phone before inserting the SIM card, it prompts you to insert the SIM card. The mobile phone checks whether the SIM card is valid automatically after it is inserted.

The following prompts appear on the screen in sequence when the mobile phone is just switching on:

- Input phone password If the password of the phone has been set.
- Input PIN If the password of the SIM card has been set.
- **Searching** The mobile phone is searching for available network.

Turning the Phone Off

To turn the phone off, press and hold the red key until the screen turns blank.

Charging the Battery

The battery can be charged when the phone is either on or off. Please ensure the battery is inserted into the phone before charging. The charging time is three hours. To connect the charger:

1. Insert the cord into its port on the bottom panel of the phone

2. Plug the charger into a 240V electrical outlet.

To disconnect the charger:

1. Unplug the wall charger.

2. Remove the cord from the phone.

Charging Using the Docking Charger

You can also use the included docking charger for easy charging.

- 1. Simply plug the charger into the back of the dock
- 2. Place the phone into the dock to start charging.
- 3. Remove the phone when charging is complete.

3. Using the Menu

In the standby state press the **end** left soft key to access the main menu.

Exit a menu: press the **matrix** right soft key to return to the previous menu.

Enter the standby state: press the **matrix** red key.

How to set Date and Time

As soon as your phone is charged, we recommend you set the date and time so you can retrieve voice messages and texts more easily.

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to enter the menu.
- 2. Press the pup or down key until "Settings" appears.
- 3. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 4. Press the down key to select "Phone Settings".
- 5. Press the **E**left soft key.
- 6. Press the down key to select "Time and date". Press the end left soft key.
- 7. Press the down key to select "Set time/date" Press the end left soft key.
- 8. Enter the time using the 24 hour clock.


- 9. Use the down key to set the date.

Volume Adjustment

- 1. During a normal or hands-free call connection, press and hold the Volume key on the side of the phone up or down to increase the volume
- 2. During a phone call to reach max volume you can press the **E** left soft key to select the options menu then select "H-Free" and press the **end** left soft key again. This is an aid for users with a hearing aid.



5. Making and Receiving Phone Calls

To Make Calls

1. Enter a number and Press the green key. The screen will show a moving picture when you are dialing the number.

- To delete a digit, press the set red key.
- To clear the screen, press and hold the screen key.

To Answer Calls

When your phone rings or vibrates, press the green key once or the green left soft key to answer the call. If you have chosen "Any key" in the answer mode menu, you can press any key to answer the call

Accessing the Menu during a Call

To access the menu, press the the left soft key. Scroll up or down to the desired command by using the up or down key and press the the left soft key again.

To End a Call

To end a call, press the select red key.

To Reject a Call

To reject a call without answering, press the red key when your phone rings.

To Redial a Number

- 1. Press the green call key, this will take you to all your recently dialed call list
- 2. Press the green call button again to call the number highlighted

Making International Calls

- 1. Press the 📧 star key and hold until a "+" character appears on the screen.
- 2. Enter the country code, area code and phone number as instructed by your long distance network service carrier
- 3. Press the green call key to complete the call.

To display the "P" symbol for international calling, press the star key three times until "P" appears.

Changing the Volume during a Call

To change the volume during a call:

 Press the Volume key up or down on the side of the phone.



6. Phone Book

Storing, Searching and Deleting Numbers in the Phone Book

Phone numbers can be stored on the phone or the SIM card.

The phone symbol indicates that the contact is saved in the phone. The SIM card symbol indicates that the contact is saved on the SIM card.

You can store up to 1000 entries in the phone memory.

To Add a New Contact to the Phone Book

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to enter the menu.
- 2. Press or down key until "Phone Book" appears.
- 3. Select the option "Phone Book" by pressing the **Constant** left soft key.
- 4. Press the up or down key until the "Add New Contact" option displays.
- 5. Press the end left soft key twice to select.
- 6. Here you can select where you would like to save the number. You can choose either on the Sim card or to the phone. To select Press the **General** left soft key.

- 7. Enter the name for the number by using the number key pad. Press a key 1 to 4 times to enter the correct letter. Press "0" for a space.
- Once the name is set, press the **I** down key to 8. enter the number
- Press the **E** left soft key twice to save. 9.

To Search for an Existing Contact

- 1. Press the **I** left soft key to enter the menu.
- Press the 🚊 up or down key until "Phone Book" 2. appears.
- 3. Select the option "Phone Book" by pressing the left soft key..
- Scroll 🚊 up or down to search for the contact. 4.
- 5. Press the **Equation** left soft key twice to place the call.

To Delete an Existing Contact

- 1 Press the **I** left soft key to enter the menu.
- Press the 📄 up or down key until "Phone Book" 2. appears.
- Select the option "Phone Book" by pressing the 3. left soft key.



- 4. Press the up or down key to find the contact that you want to delete.
- 5. Select the contact by pressing the **Contact** left soft key.
- 6. Press up or down key until the "Delete Option" displays
- 7. Press the soft key twice until the contact list displays.

To Edit Phone Numbers for Your Speed Dial

You can set up to 8 numbers for the speed dial using the number key from 2 to 9.

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to enter the menu.
- 2. Press the 📮 up or down key "Organiser" appears.
- 3. Select option "Organiser" by pressing the **Constant** left soft key.
- 4. Press up or down key until "Speed Dial" appears.
- 5. Press the end left soft key. "Set number" appears.
- 6. Press the eleft soft key. A list of speed dial numbers appears.
- 7. Scroll up and down to choose the correct key and press the correct key to edit.

- 8 Choose a contact from the phone book.
- 9. Press the **E** left soft key to save.
- 10. Press the **E** right soft key four times to exit.

To call a Speed Dial Number

Select the speed dial number you want to call by pressing and holding the desired speed dial number. (2 through 9)

7. SOS Emergency Button

Important Notice: Wireless phones, including this device, operate using radio signals, wireless networks, landline networks, and user-programmed functions. Because of this, connections in all conditions and/or locations cannot be guaranteed. You should never rely solely on any wireless device for medical emergency communication.

You can set the emergency numbers in the phone book according to your requirements; you can set a total of up to four emergency numbers.

In case of an emergency, when the SOS button is pushed down the phone will automatically send a text message to the emergency numbers set up on the phone. The

mobile phone will then make the emergency call. If the first call fails, the phone will proceed to dialling the second emergency number. In this manner the phone will circulate the emergency contact numbers three times in order to receive an answer.

The phone will also sound an alarm when an emergency call or message is sent.

Attention!

The Emergency SOS button will only make calls if:

- 1. A SIM card is in the mobile.
- 2. There is at least one SOS numbers programmed.
- 3. There is a SOS text message saved.

To Add the Emergency Contact Numbers to the Phone Book

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to enter the menu.
- 2. Press the up or down key until "Organiser" appears.
- 3. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 4. Press the up or down key to select "Emergency Settings" appears.
- 5. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 6. Press the pup or down key to select "SOS Number".

- 7. Select OK by pressing the left soft key.
- 8. Select the number by pressing the left soft key and scroll through your phonebook using the up or down key press the left soft key to select a contact.
- 9. Press the OK **Const** left soft key to save.
- 10. Repeat process to add 4 other emergency contacts.

Edit the SOS Message

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to enter the menu.
- 2. Press the up or down key until "Organiser" appears.
- 3. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 4. Press the up or down key to select "Emergency Settings" appears.
- 5. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 6. Press the cup or down key to select "SOS Message".
- 7. Select OK by pressing the **Constant** left soft key.
- 8. Edit the text of the message
- 9. Press the **Const** left soft key to save.

Writing and Sending a Message

To write a message, use numbers 2-9 on the keypad to enter letters, and 0 to enter a space. The # button will change text between upper and lower case and Numbers. The Right Option button functions as a backspace (short press) or a clear (long press). The star button brings up special characters and punctuation marks, which can be scrolled through with the volume +/- button on the left side of the phone and the Navigation Button (up/ down arrows). Select a character with the Left Option button.

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to enter the menu.
- 2. Press the up or down key until "Messaging" appears.
- 3. Select the option "Messages" by pressing the eleft soft key.
- 4. Press the up or down key until "Write message" option displays.
- 5. Press the **Constant** left soft key and start typing your text.
- 6. When done typing, enter the phone number by:
- Pressing the **Constant** left soft key twice, select Enter number and typing a phone number.

Or

- Select Add from Phonebook and press the Up or down key to search for a number in your phone book.
- 7. Press the eleft soft key twice to send your message. Other options include: Edit recipient, Remove recipient, Save to drafts

You can also access a stored message in your inbox and reply to it by selecting the option "Inbox" instead of "New Message" and following the same commands. Also, once you type your message, before sending it, you can scroll up or down and select other commands such as "Save", "Insert Number", "Insert Template", etc.

Receiving/Reply to a Message

When you receive a new text message, your phone will display an envelope icon and "New Message" notification.

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key twice to read the message.
- 2. Press the eleft soft key again to see a list of available commands such as "Reply", "Delete", etc.

Letters and Numbers Input

Text Message Letters

English letters are set on number key from "2" to "9". You can input numbers, upper or lower case letters and punctuation symbols. Pressing the #1 hash key while typing lets you switch between the different types of input modes.

Each number key is set for three or four letters. Press the number key one time to display the first letter, two times to display the second letter, etc.

Text Message Punctuation

The punctuation available includes: $\langle - \langle - \rangle \pm \rangle \pm \rangle Ø @$ ¤ {}?. paragraph return, and space.

To enter punctuation:

- 1. Press the star key to display the list of punctuation symbols
- 2. Use the up or down keys and the star and hash key to scroll through the list.
- 3. Press the **Constant** left soft key to select.

Text Message Numbers

To enter a number instead of a letter.

- 1. Press the **#** hash key to switch input mode from letter to numerical and then use number key from 1 to 0 to enter numbers.
- 2. Press # hash again to switch back to letter input mode

To enter a space, press the "0" key when in letter mode.

9. Accessing Your Voicemail

Your voice mail access number has to be provided by your network carrier using your SIM card

To dial your voice mailbox, press and hold "1" on the key pad.

If pressing the "1" button on your phone will not take you to your voicemail, we suggest you call your carrier and ask for your voicemail number which you can store as a speed dial on your keypad afterwards.

Camera

1. Use the up shortcut key to directly access the "Camera" menu.

FM Radio

Listen to the radio on the speaker phone or connect the headset into the headset jack.

Turning on the FM Radio

Slide the "FM" switch up to turn the radio on (or slide it down to switch it off).

Scanning for a Station

To scan for stations, press the 4 and 6 keys. Use the Options menu to save presets and to perform Auto search

Adjusting the Volume

To adjust volume, press the volume button the left side of the phone.

Turing the Radio Off

To turn the radio off, slide the Radio switch down or press the down key.

*The quality of radio sound depends on signal quality at your location.

The headphones act as an aerial so you will get better reception when they are plugged in.

<u>Calendar</u>

To view the calendar:

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to access the menu.
- 2. Press the down key until "Organiser" appears.
- 3. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 4. Press down key until "Calendar" appears.

Here you can use the options menu to add/edit or delete events.

Setting an Alarm

You can set up to five alarms. Options include:

- Alarm tone
- Snooze duration (off, 1, 3, 5, 10 minutes)
- Alarm repeat settings (off, yearly, monthly, weekly, daily).
- 1. Press the end left soft key to access the menu.
- 2. Press the 🗢 up or down key until "Organiser" appears.
- 3. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 4. Press down key until "Alarm" appears.
- 5. Press the E left soft key. The Alarm time 00:00 appears

- Press EDIT the **End** left soft key. 6.
- 7. Press the "+" sign on left side of phone to turn on the alarm
- Press the down key. "Time" appears. 8.
- 9 Enter the time in 24 hour clock format
- Press the left soft key to save.

Set another alarm or press the **E** right soft key four times to exit all the menus

Turning off the Alarm

When the alarm sounds.

- Press the left soft key to shut off the alarm
- Press the sight soft key to snooze.

Phone Lock

The phone lock can prevent your mobile phone from illegal use. You can set the phone lock as On or Off and change the phone password.

Select Phone lock to enable the protection and then you need to enter the password when you switch on the phone;

Phone lock can be found in the menu Settings/Security settings/Phone security/Phone Lock

Press the E left soft key to access the Phone lock and input the password again to disable phone lock.

Note: The default phone lock password is 0000. Please change into your own private password as soon as possible.

Auto Keypad Lock

Turn this function on or off it by setting the waiting time of keypad lock. After setting, the keypad will lock automatically if the mobile phone hasn't been used in the specified time.

- 1. Press the end left soft key to access the menu.
- 2. Press the pup or down key until "Settings" appears.
- 3. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 4. Press down key until "Security Settings" appears.
- 5. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 6. Press down key until "Screen auto lock" appears.
- 7. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 8. Choose either Off, 15 Sec, 30sec, 1min or 5min.

Restore to factory Settings

Press password 0000 to restore the default setting.

Call Logs

The Call History menu stores a record of all Missed, Dialed, and Received calls. Viewing any call list, you will have the option to return the call, see greater detail about the call, send the caller a SMS text message, add the caller to your Phonebook, or delete the call from the call record.

This option stores recently dialled calls, received calls and missed calls. Your phone can store up to 20 records for each function.

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to access the menu.
- 2. Press the 📮 up or down key to find "Call Center".
- 3. Select the option "Call History" by pressing the **Call** left soft key.
- 4. Press the up or down key to scroll through available functions (missed calls, dialled calls, received calls, all calls, clear logs).
- 5. Press the **Const** left soft key to select the desired function.
- 6. Press the end left soft key twice to call the number.

Flashlight

Use the switch indicated by the light bulb icons on the right side of the phone to turn the flashlight on or off. To turn the light on: push the slider up. To turn the light off: push the slider down.



Calculator

Your phone can provide basic calculator functions: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to access the menu.
- 2. Press the 🔵 up or down key until "Organiser" appears.
- 3. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 4. Press down key until "Calculator" appears.
- 5. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 6. Enter number key to enter values.
- Press the #2 hash key for decimals.
- Use the up or down key or the lateral key to select the math operation: +, -, X, and ÷.
- Press the **soft** key to clear the last digit or to exit the calculation operation.
- 7. Press the **Constant** left soft key to complete the calculation.

Profiles

You can use profiles to set and customize the ring tones, message alert tones, and other tones for different events.

- 1. Press the **Constant** left soft key to access the menu.
- 2. Press the cup or down key until "Settings" appears.
- 3. Press the **Const** left soft key.
- 4. Press the up or down key to find "Profiles".
- 5. Press the **Constant** left soft key.
- 6. Press the up or down key to select from the following profiles:
- General
- Silent
- Meeting
- Outdoor
- My Style
- 7. Press the **Constant** left soft key to enter the editing mode. Here you can activate or customise each profile according to the items in the table "Customise Menu".
- 8. Press the **Constant** left soft key to save.

14. Radio Frequency (RF) Exposure and SAR

This device meets international guidelines for exposure to radio waves. Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) radiation recommended by international guidelines (ICNIRP). These limits are part of the comprehensive guidelines and establish the permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies.

The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station, the lower the power output of the device.

SAR values may vary depending on national reporting and testing requirements and the network band. Use of device accessories and enhancements may result in different SAR values.

The SAR limit for mobile devices used by the public is 2.0 w/kg (watts per kilogram) averaged over 10 grams of body tissue. The guidelines incorporate a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements. The highest SAR Value - 0.519w/kg.
