Precautions

Safety Instruction

- Do not store the camera in intense heat or cold for long periods of time, as this may result in permanent damage to the camera.
- Do not use or store the product in dusty, dirty, or sandy areas, as its components may be damaged.
- Do not drop, puncture or disassemble the camera. High-voltage internal components create the risk of electric shock when exposed.
- Use the camera with care. Rough handling may damage the internal components.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents or strong detergents to clean the product. Clean only with a slightly damp soft cloth.
- Do not ignite the flash close to eyes, or closer than prescribed minimum distances as this may result in damage to vision. When using the flash, the camera should be at least one meter from the eyes of the subject.
- Do not open the battery cover while an image is being recorded. Doing so will not only make storage of the current image impossible, it can also corrupt other image data already stored in file.
- Test for proper operation before using the camera

Operating Environment Conditions

- This camera is designed for use in temperatures ranging from 5°C to 35°C (41°F to 95°F).
- Do not use or keep the camera in the following areas:
 - In areas subject to direct sunlight
 - In areas subject to high humidity or dust
 - Near air conditioners, heaters, or other areas subject to temperature extremes
 - Inside of a closed vehicle, especially one parked in the sun.
 - In areas subject to strong vibration

Battery Usage and Power Supply

- Use only the type of battery that came with your camera. Do not use batteries of different specifications. Doing so may lead to the potential for serious damage.
- Insert the battery according to the instructions. Inserting the battery incorrectly can cause damage to the product and possibly start a fire.
- Remove the battery to avoid the fluid leakage if the camera is not going to be used for an extended time.
- If the battery is crushed or damaged, remove it immediately to avoid battery fluid leakage and abnormal expansion.
- The camera may feel warm after long periods of continuous use which is normal and not a malfunction. Battery will be in high temperature after long time using (about 1hr), Please be careful while taking out the battery.
- Please be careful if you may need to take out the battery by finger nail.

SOME DOS AND DON'TS ON THE SAFE USE OF EQUIPMENT

This equipment has been designed and manufactured to meet international safety standards but, like any electrical equipment, care must be taken if you are to obtain the best results and safety is to be assured.

DO read the operating instructions before you attempt to use the equipment.

Getting to Know Your Camera

Overview

The camera with 5 Mega Pixel sensor can take H.264 videos. By way of using H.264 technology, more videos can be taken within certain amount of memory. High quality images with up to 16 mega-pixels can also be delivered smoothly. With a colour LCD monitor, users can compose images and examine them easily.

The camera features 3" (16:9) LCD touch panel which is an ideal platform for you to operate your camera. The menu options are accessible with your finger. With the touch panel, you can select the options directly and quickly.

The camera also features video recording at HD resolution of 1920x1080. You can also connect it to an HDTV via an HDMI cable, and easily playback the recorded high-definition videos on the wide screen HDTV.

Moreover, the camera has an advanced uploading feature. With the exclusive built-in **Internet Direct** application, you can upload the videos captured by the camera to the web site more effortlessly .

ISO sensitivity and colour balance can either be adjusted automatically or changed manually. A 120x digital zoom helps you to control over the videos and photos you take.

The varied effect options, such as Time Lapse and Slow Motion, make recording more fun.

The built-in memory allows you to take photos and to record videos without a memory card. The memory card slot allows users to increase the storage capacity.


Rear View




Section 2 Getting Started

Loading the Battery

Before using the camera, you must load the supplied Lithium-ion rechargeable battery.

1. Insert the battery according to the correct polarity marks (+ or -).
2. Close the battery cover firmly.



Charge your battery

You must use the supplied AC charger or the USB cable.

The camera must be turned OFF; blinking light confirms charging, and the light becomes constant when the charging has been completed.



In AC charging Mode, the light will turn itself off automatically after 3~5 minutes. The full charge time is about 4 to 5 hours. (Actual charging time may vary. It depends on the battery conditions.)

The full charge battery usage for continuous Full HD (1080p 30) video recording is about 1.5~2 hours.



Note


- After the battery is fully charged by the AC adapter, please remove the adapter, and then you can turn on the camera.



Inserting and Removing an SD Card (Optional)


The camera comes with an internal memory which allows you to store photos and videos. You can expand the memory capacity by using an optional SD memory card.

1. Insert the memory card into the slot. Please refer to the figure on the right side.
2. To remove an installed SD card, press the card inwards to release it.
3. When the card pops out, gently remove it from its slot.
4. Recommended memory capacity: 1GB or above.



Note

- When a memory card is fitted, videos/photos are saved on the card rather than on the built-in memory.
- *Protecting Data on an SD Card: SD Card is read-only when it is locked. No photos or videos can be recorded when the SD card is locked. Make sure the lock is on the writeable position before recording any media.*




Turning the Camera On

- To turn on the camera:
 - Flip out the LCD panel; the camera will turn on automatically.
 - Or press [Power Button] for one second to turn it on.


Configuring the Initial Date and Time Setup

- The time setting screen appears to allow you to setup date and time:

Getting Started

- To record video: Press [Video Button] to record video. To stop recording, press it again.
- To pause recording: Press [Pause Button] to pause recording. To continue the recording, press it again.
- To take a photo during video recording: When recording video, press [Photo Button] to capture the image. The Dual record icon () appears on the LCD monitor.
- To take a photo: Press [Photo Button] halfway down until the focusing frame turns from white to green. Then, press it fully down to take photo.

- To view stored videos and photos: Press [Playback Button] or touch  on the screen to switch to the Playback mode.

Turning the Camera Off

- To turn off the camera: You can either press [Power Button] for one second, or you can place the LCD panel back to its original position.



- In AC charging mode, you can turn on the camera and it will become DC power mode. In DC power mode, the camera is charged by less electric current.
- The camera does not power off automatically in DC power mode.

Video Recording

- Press [Video Button] to start recording. When a video is being recorded, a time indicator will display on the LCD monitor ( 00:00:25). To stop recording, press it again.
- To pause recording: Press [Pause Button] to pause recording ( 00:00:36). To continue the recording, press it again.
- Dual record: press [Photo Button] to capture the image. The Dual record icon () appears on the LCD monitor.
- Press [Playback Button] or touch  on the screen to view the recorded video.
- Four resolution settings are available:

 **Note**

- The image resolution captured during video recording is the same as the video resolution.
- The flash can not be used when capturing image during movies recording.
- As you record one video clip up to about 4GB, the file system of the camera will split it up into several files, but the recording time and playback time on the camera do not be split.

Photo Capturing

- Press [Photo Button] halfway down until the focusing frame turns from white to green. Then, press it fully down to take photo.
- Press [Playback Button] or touch  on the screen to view the photos.
- Three resolution settings are available:

Using Zoom Function

- The zoom magnifies images when recording video or taking photo.
 - To zoom in/out, press the Tele/Wide Button.
 - It can be set from 1X~2700X (23X Optical zoom and 120X Digital zoom)

Using Digital Light Function

- The setting allows you to extend the brightness of the objects that are dark or in the shadow. It can extend the dynamic range for backlight and high contrast sense, so that the objects will be brighter and clearer.
- To use the Digital Light function:
 - Press [Digital Light Button] in Record Mode. The Digital Light icon() appears on the LCD monitor.
 - Press [Video Button] to start recording or press [Photo button] to take photo.



Note

- To avoid the persistence of image on the screen, please turn off the Digital Light function after you used it in the dark situation.

Using Stabilization Function

- To record with an effect of reducing camera shake to result in more stable video.
- To use the Stabilization function:
 - Press [Stabilization Button] in Record Mode. The Stabilization icon() appears on the LCD monitor.
 - Press [Video Button] to start recording.

Showing Information on the screen

- Touch the on-screen button to show or not to show the indicators on the LCD screen.

- **HD (720p 30)**: Record videos at 1280x720p 30 fps resolution.
- **VGA (640x480)**: Record videos at 640x480p 30 fps resolution.

Pre-record

The Pre-record function ensures that you will not miss any critical recording opportunities. The videos are recorded 3 seconds more before the [Video Button] is pressed.

Motion Detection

Record videos automatically when the camera detects a movement.

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> In the Video menu, touch the [Motion Detect] icon on the screen. Touch to select [On] or [Off] (<input checked="" type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/>). Touch the Exit icon () to exit. Camera will start to record video automatically if it detects a movement. Stop recording if it does not detect a movement. 	



Note

The motion detection function will be disabled when the battery power is empty ().

Slow Motion

Record videos with slow motion effect. When the video is played, the playback time will be longer than the actual recording time.

- Pause function can not be used when Slow Motion function is activated.

Time Lapse

Record still images at specific intervals you can set and play them as one video file.

- **Off:** Disable Time Lapse.
- **1 Second.:** Record one frame per second.
- **3 Seconds:** Record one frame every 3 seconds.
- **5 Seconds:** Record one frame every 5 seconds.




Photo Resolution

Three resolution settings are available.


- **16MP:**Shoot photo at 4608 x 3456, 16MP quality.
- **5MP:**Shoot photo at 2592 x 1944, 5MP quality.
- **3MP:**Shoot photo at 2048 x 1536, 3MP quality.

Flash

This camera has three flash settings.

- **Flash Auto:**The flash fires automatically according to light conditions. Use this mode for general photography.
- **Red Eye Reduct.** (Red Eye Reduction) :The pre-flash will fire to reduce the red-eye effect.
- **Flash Off:** The flash will not fire under any circumstances. Use this mode when taking photo in a place where flash photography is prohibited, or when the subject is distant (beyond the range of the flash).

- The flash will be disabled automatically when the battery power is low ().
- **The flash will be disabled when the battery is charging.**

ISO

The camera adjusts the ISO sensitivity of its images automatically. Four manual ISO sensitivity settings are available. (800/1600/3200/6400).

The larger the number is, the higher the ISO sensitivity is set to. Select a small number to shoot a smoother image. Select a large number to shoot an image in a dark location or to shoot a subject moving at high speed.



Self-Timer

The self-timer allows you to take photos with a ten-second time delay. The self-timer light on the front of the camera will also blink. The speed of blinking will increase just before the photo is taken.



Scene

You can select the mode according to the scene condition.

- **Auto:** Shoot without any special effect on the image.
- **Skin:** Shoot with an effect that makes skin tones more natural.
- **Night:** Use Night Mode for night scenes or low light conditions.
- **Backlight:** You can take shots when the bright light is behind the subject.
- **Black/White:** The image is converted to black-and-white.
- **Classic:** The image is converted to a sepia look.
- **Negative:** The image is converted as the negative of the normal.



To avoid blurry photos, place the camera on a flat, steady surface, or use a tripod when taking shots in the Night Mode.

White Balance

The camera adjusts the colour balance of images automatically. Three manual white balance settings are available:

- **Auto:** The colour automatically adjusts white balance.
- **Daylight:** Under outdoor condition.
- **Fluorescent:** Under fluorescent light condition.
- **Tungsten:** Under tungsten light condition.
