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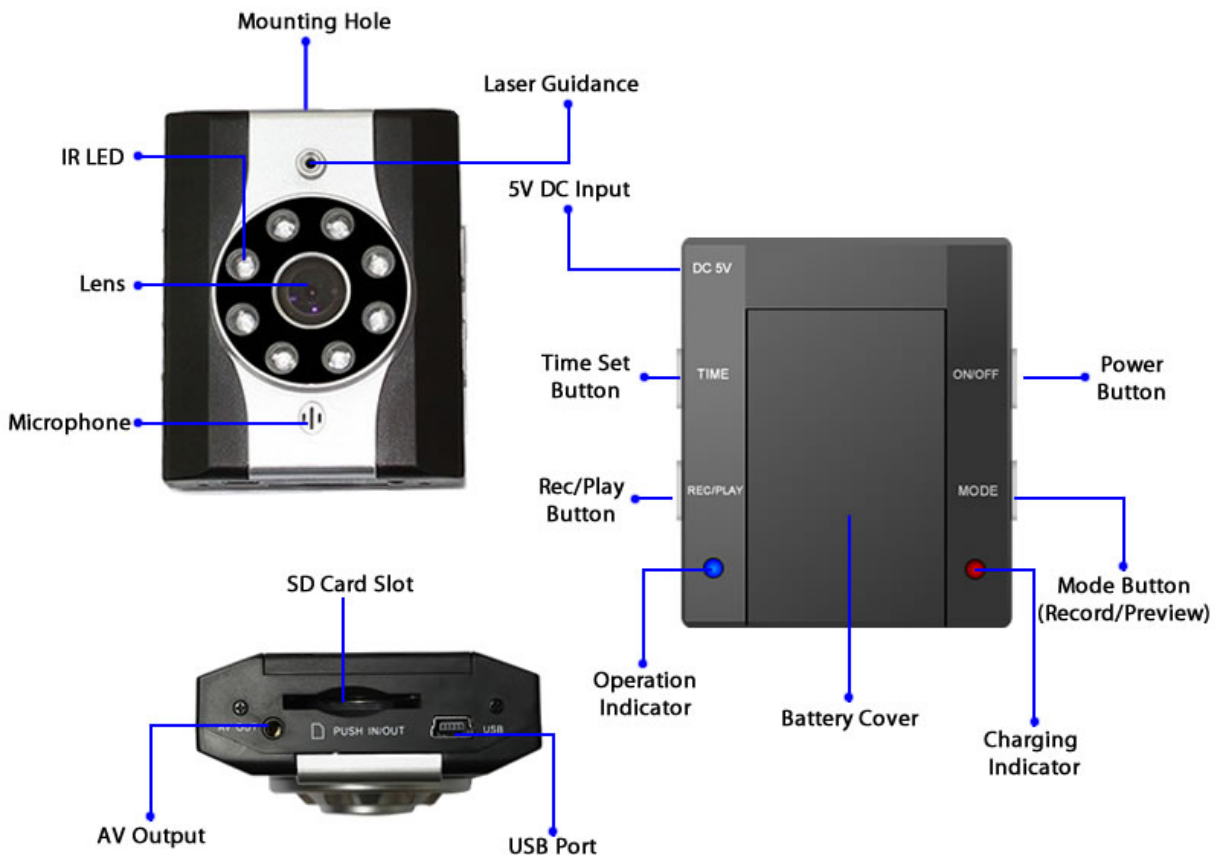
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The Zetronix Dashboard Camera Recording System

This dash cam recording system can be mounted anywhere on the car and connected to the included suction cup. The suction cup can be placed in the front, side or rear window(s) to record the road in front of you for your protection, the road behind you or to the side of you. The unit can be swiveled to point in any direction to record the road, scenery or passengers. The camera comes with a built in battery to record with no power from the car for up to 4 hours and has IR Night Vision for night time recording.

In the Box

In the box you will find the zDrive-I dashboard camera, a battery, cigarette lighter charging cable, a suction cup mount and an AV Cable to play from your TV and to set the time on the unit.



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Getting Started

The first step in using your device is charging it. Connect the device to a USB port on your PC or plug it into Car power with the included adapter. While charging, the RED LED indicator will glow red and will turn off when the battery is full. Before first use, we suggest charging the device for 12 hours for the first three times. To maximize battery life we suggest using the product for the first three times until the battery has completely run out then recharging it again for 12 hours

If you plan on viewing your files on your computer, we suggest using VLC Player. The most recent version can be downloaded at no cost from <http://www.videolan.org>.

Set Time & Date

Before recording video or using the product in your car we suggest setting up the time and date on the unit, so the video will have an overlay of the correct time and date in the video on when it was recorded. To set up time and date 1st plug the unit to your TVs or Monitors Video Input using the supplied AV Cables.



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Once the unit is plugged into your TV turn it on, if it starts recording automatically press the REC/PLAY button to stop recording first. Make sure there is an SD card in the memory slot (not included) and the battery is charged. Perform the following instructions:

1. Press the time button you should a time/date menu on the TV or display device



2. When The YYYY/ MM / DD is highlighted in green as above use the mode button to change the format in which you want the time and date displayed E.G. (DD / MM / YYYY, MM / DD / YYYY)
3. Press TIME button highlight the adjustable date below.



4. Press MODE to change the number smaller and REC/PLAY change the numbers higher, once its correct press TIME again to adjust the next field.
5. When selecting your time please note that the camera is in military time which is suggested by courts and for evidence in case of accident so the time is on a 24 hour base.

6. To set and finalize the time press the time button again and the time menu should disappear.

Recording Video

When the zDrive-I unit is turned on or plugged into your cigarette lighter or any power source it will start recording automatically for your safety. When the unit is recording you will notice the Blue LED blinking slowly. To stop recording press the REC/PLAY button and the blue LED will glow solid. (Make sure the SD Card is in the unit flush when recording, the label for the SD card should be facing the back of the camera)

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Reviewing Files on a Computer

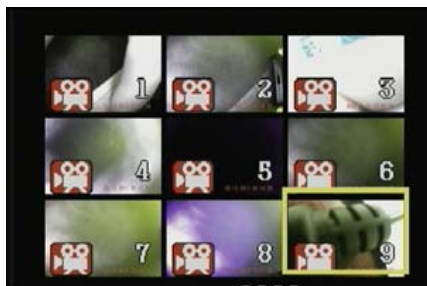
To view your files on a computer, simply connect the device via the supplied USB cord or by inserting one end of the cable into the devices 2.5" USB Port and the other end directly into a USB port, to connect the device as an external drive to watch and copy recorded video make sure the devices is off when connection to your computer. You can also take remove the SD card from the unit and inserted into your Computer's SD Card slot if you have one. The camera will connect as a removable drive, and depending on the settings on your PC, it may automatically notify you that new hardware has been detected. If so, select Open Folder to View Files.

If it is not automatically detected, click Start on your desktop. Select My Computer if you are using Windows, or Computer if using Windows Vista or Windows 7 or 8. The device should be listed as a Removable Disk under the Devices with Removable Storage section. Open that drive, there should be a subfolder called DCIM double click on it, in there should be another subfolder called 100DSCIM all the files will be stored in that subfolder. As mentioned earlier, we suggest using VLC Player to play back video files.

On a Mac OS X System open the finder icon, the pen will be listed under devices in the left hand side on the bottom of the finder menu with an eject button next to it. As mentioned earlier, we suggest using VLC Player to play back video files in Mac.

Reviewing Files on TV/Monitor with AV Cables

Plug the device to your TV/Monitor with the supplied AV Cables in TVs AV input. Yellow is the video and white is the audio. Turn the device on with the AV Cables and press the REC button so the unit stops recording. (Once the unit is on it automatically starts recording for your safety) Press the MODE button to enter into preview mode, you should see a matrix of recorded videos.



Press the REC/PLAY button to select the highlighted video you wish to play, you will see the yellow heighted frame move around when pressing REC/PLAY, select the video you want to play. Once the video you want to play is highlighted with a yellow frame press the TIME button to select it.



When the video you want to play is selected press the REC/PLAY button to play the video. To exit and go back to the video display screen press the MODE button.

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Troubleshooting

Problem: I plugged the unit to my TV but I do not see a picture or anything

Solution: Make sure you plug the unit to an RCA Composite input that usually consist of (Yellow, White and Red) if there are more colors like green and purple that means it's a component HD input and will not work. Also to change your TVs Input to whichever you connected the cables to, you can select it on the TV or Remote by pressing the INPUT button.

Problem: When playing back my video, I can hear audio, but have no video.

Solution: This most often occurs if your computer's media player is having trouble with your files. Try using VLC player, which can be downloaded for free at <http://www.videolan.org>.

Problem: My video playback is "choppy" or "stuttering."

Solution: If this is occurring, try copying the video files to your PC. This happens when the file is too large to be played back using your USB connection Copy the files to your computer first then play them again.
