Audio/Video Jack Panel allows direct connections with VCRs, DVDs, or other devices, providing quality TV picture and sound playback. (Refer to Connection Guide)

Audio Volume Leveler (AVL) Control keeps the TV sound at an even level. Peaks and valleys that occur during program changes or commercial breaks are reduced, making for a more consistent, comfortable sound. (Pg. 16)

AutoChron<sup>TM</sup> sets the clock of the TV automatically or manually. For automatic selection, there will be queries for Time Zone, Day Light saving and channel to seek clock. For manual selection, you need to key in the time. (Pg. 12)

AutoLock<sup>TM</sup> allows you to block the viewing of certain channels or programs with certain ratings if you do not want your children to view inappropriate materials. (Pg. 21)

AutoPicture<sup>TM</sup> allows you to change the picture settings (color, tint, contrast, etc.) for various types of programming, such as sports, movies, multimedia (games), or weak signals with the push of one button. (Pg. 31)

**AutoSound**<sup>TM</sup> allows you to select from four factory-set controls and a personal control that you set according to your own preferences through the onscreen Sound menu. The four factory-set controls (Speech, Movie, Music, and Multimedia) enable you to tailor the TV sound so as to enhance the particular programming you are watching. (Pg. 31)

**Channel Edit** allows you to add or delete channels from the list stored in the TV's memory. Channel Edit makes it easy to limit or expand the number of channels that are available to you when you press the Channel (+) or (-) buttons on your remote control. (Pg. 11)

**Closed Captioning** allows the viewer to read TV program dialogue or voice conversations as onscreen text. (Pg. 29)

**Infrared Remote Control** works your TV and other remote-controlled devices, such as VCRs, DVD players, cable converters, and satellite receivers.

**Onscreen Menu** shows helpful messages and instructions for setting TV feature controls (can be viewed in English, French, or Spanish).

**QuadraSurf™** A remote control feature that allows you to store and view up to ten of your favorite channels per button (4 buttons -40 channels total). Can be set to hold movie, sports, news channels, etc., or add the audio/video channels for a quick source function to swap between your external accessory devices. (Pg. 32-33)

**Sleep Timer** automatically turns the TV OFF after a set amount of time that you choose. (Pg. 30)

**Timer** allows you to set your TV to turn itself ON and OFF once or daily like an alarm clock. (Pg. 18)

### **DESCRIPTION OF REMOTE CONTROL BUTTONS**

**DVD/ACC Mode Switch** - Press to control TV functions, DVD to control DVD and ACC for Cable Converter, DBS, VCR, etc., functions. Once the mode is selected, you must press a button within 60 seconds for the remote to remain in the selected mode or it will default back to the TV mode.

SMILEY Button - Press to add channels to the "QuadraSurf" lists. Works with all colored buttons. In DVD/ACC mode, press this button to rewind.

Format Button - Press to select the picture format. In DVD/ACC mode, press this button to forward.

**OK Button** - Press to activate selection when programming remote control.

ANALOGUE/DIGITAL Button - Press to select Analogue or Digital mode. Note: This button will not function in PIP mode.

AUTO SOUND Button - Press to choose from different factory pre-defined sound settings. Choose from Personal (how you set the Sound Menu options), Theatre (used when watching movies), Music (for musical type programs such as concerts) or Voice (for programming with speaking only).

Cursor Buttons (Left <, Right >, Up  $\land$ , Down  $\lor$ ) - Press these buttons to highlight, select and adjust items on the TV's onscreen menu. Also press the Up or Down cursor to adjust the picture format for 16:9 and 16:9 Zoom.

**VOL(ume) + or - Buttons** - Press to increase or decrease the TV's sound level.

**MUTE Button** - Press the mute button to eliminate the sound from the TV. "MUTE" will be displayed on the TV's screen. Press again to restore the TV's volume.

Program Guide Button - In digital mode, press to display the current program information. Press the > button to access the program information on the next time slot. The quality and accuracy of the infomation on the program guide and the information banner are transmitted from the broadcasters. You may see a difference in broadcast time if the broadcaster is from a different time zone area.

**CC Button** - Press to activate the Closed Captioning options. Repeatedly pressing the CC button will scroll the available options on the TV screen.

Alternate Channel Button - Toggle between the last viewed channel and the current.



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**SWAP Button** - Press to swap the program on the TV with the program in the PIP window.

**FROWNIE Button** - Allows you to delete channels from the "Quadra Surf" lists for the colored buttons. Works with all colored buttons.

**FREEZE Button** - Press to freeze the picture on the TV screen. Press again to resume normal viewing. The signal received during the time the picture is frozen will be lost. When the picture is resumed, the video will return to real time broadcast.

▶, ■,  $\triangleleft$ , and ▶▶, Buttons - These buttons is used with a VCR when the ACC mode is selected. Press Stop ■, Play ▶, Record ● or Pause ■.

**MENU Button** - Press to display the main menu. Can be used to back out of the on-screen menu until it disappears from the TV's screen.

**AUTO PICTURE Button** - Press repeatedly to choose from 5 different factory predefined picture settings. Choose from Personal (how you set the Picture Menu Adjustment controls), Movies (for movies), Sports (for any sporting event), Weak Signal (used when the signal being received is not great), or Multimedia (for video games).

**CH(annel) + or CH(annel)- Buttons** - Press to select channels in ascending or descending order.

**AV Button** - Press to select the different signal sources connected to the AV inputs on the TV.

**INFO BUTTON** - In analogue mode, press the INFO button to display information such as channel number, sound mode, time and status of the sleeptimer. In digital mode, press the INFO button to display channel number, channel name, sound mode, cc and rating. The quality and accuracy of information on the program guide and the information banner are transmitted from the broadcasters. You may see a difference in broadcast time if the broadcaster is from a different time zone area.

**NUMBERED (0-9) Buttons** - Press to select TV channels or values within the on-screen menu. For single channel entries, press the numbered button for the channel you desire. The TV will pause for a second or two before changing to the chosen channel.

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## **PROGRAMMING PART 1 - HOW TO USE THE TUNER MODE CONTROL**

he TUNER MODE control allows you to change *I* the TV's input signal to ANTENNA or CABLE, mode. It's important for the TV to know which type of signal to look for (Cable TV or Antenna)

> Press the MENU button on the remote control to show the onscreen menu.

> **Press the CURSOR UP ∧ or DOWN ∨ buttons** to scroll though the onscreen menu until the word Install is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button to display the Install menu features.

**Press the CURSOR UP ∧ or DOWN ∨ buttons** to scroll through the Install features until the word Tuner Mode is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button to select Antenna or Cable.

When finished, press the MENU button twice to remove the menu from the TV's screen.

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## WEAK DIGITAL SIGNAL

### This menu is present only for digital mode.

Weak Digital Signal feature makes it easy for you to ADD or DELETE channels with weak digital signal from the list of channels stored in the TV's memory.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote control to show the onscreen menu.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN V** buttons to scroll though the onscreen menu until the word **Install** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display the **Install** menu features.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN ∨ buttons** to scroll through the Install features until the word **Weak Dig Sig** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display the Weak Digital Signal options.

Using the CURSOR UP  $\land$  or DOWN  $\lor$  button, to scroll the menu to highlight the channel you wish to add or skip.

Now use the CURSOR RIGHT > button to toggle between Added or Skipped. If Skipped is selected the channels is skipped when scrolling channels with the CH+ or CH- buttons. If Added is selected the channel is not skipped when scrolling channels with the CH+ or CH- buttons.

When finished, press the MENU button three times to remove the menu from the TV's screen.



## **INFORMATION BANNER - CHANNEL BANNER SIZE**

This menu is present only for digital mode. **PRESS** the **INFO** button to display channel number, channel name, sound mode, CC and rating. The quality and accuracy of info on the banner are transmitted from the broadcaster. You may see a difference in broadcast time if the broadcaster is from a different time zone area.

Channel Banner Size feature allows you to select a small or large information banner.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote control to show the onscreen menu.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN V button** to scroll through the onscreen menu until the word **Install** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display the **Install** menu features.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN V button** to scroll through the Install features until the word **CH Banner Size** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to select Small or Large.

**Press twice** to exit menu.





### **EMERGENCY ALERT**

This menu is present only for digital mode.

Emergency Alert allows you to display or discard Eemergency alert for Low or Medium priority.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote control to show the onscreen menu.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN V button** to scroll through the onscreen menu until the word **Install** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display the **Install** menu features.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN V button** to scroll through the Install features until the word **Emerg Alert** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display the Emergency Alert options.

Using the CURSOR UP  $\land$  or DOWN  $\lor$  button, to scroll the menu to highlight the Low or Medium priority

Now use the CURSOR RIGHT > button to toggle between Present or Discard. If Present is selected, the TV will display the alert of that priority. If Discard is selected, the TV will not display the alert of that priority.

When finished, press the MENU button three times to remove the menu from the TV's screen.

## FACTORY CHANNEL RESET

This menu is present only for digital mode.

Factory Channel Reset feature allows you to erase the contents of the master, user and favorite channel lists. This restores the TV to the initial state prior to the first Auto Program operation.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote control to show the onscreen menu.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN ∨ button** to scroll through the onscreen menu until the word **Install** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display the **Install** menu features.

Press the CURSOR DOWN ∨ button to scroll through the Install features until the word Fact CH Reset is highlighted.

**CURSOR RIGHT > button to follow the instruction in the menu** to reset the TV.

When finished, press the MENU button three times to remove the menu from the TV's screen.

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## HOW TO CORRECT A TILTED IMAGE

Rotation Options for analogue mode of models: 26PW9100D, 32PT9100D and 32PW9100D

In rare cases the video supplied to the TV screen might show slightly tilted one way or another. The Tilt Adjust control will allow you to correct the problem by adjusting the screen in a clockwise or counterclockwise direction.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote control to show the onscreen menu in the analog mode.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN V buttons** until Features is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display feature menu.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN V buttons** repeatedly until the Rotation control is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT > or CURSOR LEFT < buttons to rotate the picture on the screen clockwise or counter clockwise. Please note that the amount of rotation will be very minimal.

**Press the MENU button** twice to remove the menu from the screen.

Use the A/D button on the remote control to switch between Digital and Analog channels).



## How to Use the Freeze Controls

Have you ever wished you could freeze the picture on the television broadcast to write down a special telephone number or to capture a needed address? Your television will allow you to do just that with the press of just one button on the remote control.



With a signal on the television screen, simply **press the FREEZE button** on the remote control to stop the picture at any given moment.

**Press the FREEZE button** on the remote control again to resume normal viewing.

### HELPFUL HINT

After freezing a picture on the screen, when the FREEZE control is turned OFF, the normal signal programming will be shown at it's present time. The signal that was being shown while the picture was frozen will not be viewable.

Channel: Use the NUMBERED buttons or the CH + or CH- buttons to enter the desired startup channel. Activate: Set the timer to turn itself On or Off Once or Daily. Press the CURSOR RIGHT > or CURSOR LEFT < buttons to select Once, Daily, or Off. Display: Press the CURSOR RIGHT > or CURSOR LEFT < buttons to toggle entries. between On or Off. If On is selected, the time will be displayed all the time when the TV is on. When Off is selected, the time will only appear when the **INFO button** is pressed. Press the MENU button three times to remove

the onscreen menu from the TV screen.

The TV's clock settings may be lost when the TV is unplugged or when AC power to the set is interrupted.





## ACTIVE CONTROL<sup>TM</sup> OPTIONS

T he Active Control uses a sensor to adjust the picture brightness according to the condition of the lightings in the room.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote to show the onscreen menu.

Press the CURSOR UP  $\land$  or DOWN  $\lor$  buttons to scroll through the onscreen menu until the word **Features** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to dis - play the **Features** menu.

Press the CURSOR UP  $\land$  or DOWN  $\lor$  buttons to repeatedly until Active Control is highlighted.

Press the CURSOR RIGHT > or CURSOR LEFT < buttons to toggle the Active Control to On, or Off.

When finished, press the MENU button twice to remove the onscreen menu from the TV's screen.



## Helpful Hints

When the lighting in the room is dim, the brightness of the picture will be decreased. When the lightning in the room is bright, the brightness of the picture will increased.

## HOW TO USE THE PIP (PICTURE-IN-PICTURE) CONTROLS

**P**icture-In-Picture (PIP) is the showing of two pictures on the TV screen at the same time. (One main screen picture and one small inset picture or PIP picture.) With only a cable or antenna signal connected, the PIP feature can display one channel (an analogue channel) on the main screen while showing another channel (a digital channel) in the PIP window.

The Double Window PIP feature divides the screen in half displaying the main picture and PIP window into equal size windows (left side showing the main pictureand right side showing the PIP picture).

The SWAP PIP feature interchanges the picture on the main screen and the PIP window and vice-versa.

*The CH+ or – selects all the available channels on the PIP window.* 

*NOTE:* The numbered buttons will not change channels in the PIP window. They are for use with the main screen picture only.

The signal from an external accessory device can also be used to generate a PIP picture. VCRs, DVD players, or similar devices can be used to create the signal. The PIP window can display signals coming from the RF inputs, the AV1, AV2, CVI, S-Video or Front Jacks.

For basic connection instructions, please refer to the Audio/Video Input Jack section in the Connection Guide.

### **ON/OFF PIP:**

Turn the TV and the external accessory device (if using one) ON. Choose a digital program (from TV, HDMI or HD CV1 mode). Choose an analog program (from TV, AV1, AV2, CV1, Front). Press the AV button to select the external sources (eg. AV1, AV2, etc).

**Press the PIP button** on the remote control. The PIP window will appear in one of the screen's four corners.

**Press the PIP button a second time** to display the Double Window PIP.

**Press the PIP button a third time** to switch off the PIP feature.

### Swap PIP:

**Press the SWAP button** to interchange the the picture on the main screen with that on the PIP window.

**Press the SWAP button again** to return the pictures to their original positions.

### Select PIP Channels:

**Press the CH + or – button** to select all available channels in the PIP window.

**Press the numbered buttons** to select available channels on the main screen.

Use the A/D button on the Remote Control to switch between Digital and Analog channels.

## UNDERSTANDING AUTOLOCK<sup>TM</sup> CONTROLS

The AutoLock<sup>™</sup> feature is an integrated circuit that receives and processes data sent by broadcasters, or other program providers, that contain program content advisories. When programmed by the viewer, a TV with AutoLock<sup>™</sup> can respond to the content advisories and block program content that may be found objectionable (such as offensive language, violence, sexual situations, etc.). This is a great feature to cen-

sor the type of viewing children may watch.

AutoLock<sup>TM</sup> offers various BLOCKING controls from which to choose:

Access Code - An Access Code must be set to prevent children from unblocking questionable or censored programming set by their parents.

**Channel Block -** After an access code has been programmed, you cannot block individual channels including the A/V inputs.

**Clear All -** Allows you clear all channels being blocked from your viewing set with the Channel Block Control.

Block All - Allows you to block ALL channels except A/V inputs.

**Movie Ratings -** Certain blocking options exist which will block programming based on ratings patterned by the Motion Pictures Association of America.

**TV Ratings -** Just like the Movie Ratings, programs can be blocked from viewing using standard TV ratings set by TV broadcasters.

### MOVIE RATINGS

**G:** General Audience - All ages admitted. Most parents would find this program suitable for all ages.

**PG: Parental Guidance Suggested -** This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for younger children.

**PG-13: Parents Strongly Cautioned -** This programming contains material that parents may find unsuitable for children under the age of 13.

### **MOVIE RATINGS Continued**

**R: Restricted -** This is programming is specifically designed for adults. Anyone under the age of 17 should only view this programming with an accompanying parent or adult guardian.

NC-17: No one under the age of 17 will be admitted. - This type of programming should be viewed by adults only.

X: Adults Only - This type of programming contains one or more of the following: very graphic violence, very graphic and explicit or indecent sexual acts, very coarse and intensely suggestive language.

### TV RATINGS

**TV-Y** -- Designed for a very young audience, including children ages 2-6.

**TV-Y7** -- It may be appropriate for children age 7 and above who have acquired the development skills needed to distinguish between make-believe and reality.

**TV-G** -- Suitable for most audiences, this type of programming contains little or no violence, no strong language, and little or no sexual dialogue or situations.

TV-PG -- This program contains material that parents may find

unsuitable for younger children. Could contain Moderate violence (V), some sexual situations (S), infrequent coarse language (L), or some suggestive dialogue (D).

**TV-14** -- This program contains some material that many parents would find unsuitable for children under 14 years of age. This type of programming contains one or more of the following: intense violence (V), intense sexual situations (S), strong coarse language (L), or intensely suggestive dialogue (D).

**TV-MA** -- This program is specifically designed to be viewed by adults and therefore may be unsuitable for children under 17. This type of programming contains one or more of the following: graphic violence (V), explicit sexual situations (S), or crude indecent language (L).

## **BLOCK CHANNELS PART 1 - SETTING UP AN ACCESS CODE**

Over the next few panels you'll learn how to block channels and get a better understanding of the rating terms for certain programming.

*First, let's start by learning how to set a personal access code:* 

**Press the MENU button** on the remote to display the onscreen menu.

**Press the CURSOR UP A or DOWN V buttons** until the word **Features** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display the Features menu options.

**Press the CURSOR UP**  $\land$  **or DOWN**  $\lor$  **buttons** until the words Auto Lock<sup>TM</sup> are highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button.** The screen will read, "Access Code - - - . ."

Using the NUMBERED buttons, enter 0, 7, 1, 1. "XXXX" appears on the Access Code screen as you press the numbered buttons.

"Incorrect Code" will appear on the screen, and you will need to enter 0, 7, 1, 1 again.

For analogue mode: The screen will ask you to enter a "New Code."
Enter a "new" 4 digit code using the NUM-BERED buttons. The screen will then ask you to

CONFIRM the code you just entered. Enter your to new code again. "XXXX" will appear when you enter your new code and then display the AutoLock<sup>™</sup> menu options.

Use the A/D button on the remote control to switch between Digital and Analog channels.

Press the CURSOR UP ∧ or DOWN ∨
buttons to highlight any of the TV Rating options. When highlighted, all these options can be turned On (which will allow blocking) or Off (which will allow viewing).

**NOTE:** Some TV RATING options also have sub-ratings. The ratings of TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14, TV-MA can be customized to block V (violence), FV (fantasy violence), S (sexual situations), L (coarse language), or D (suggestive dialogue).



### For digital mode:

**Press the OK button** on the remote to turn the rating On or Off. The sub-ratings TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14 or TV-MA can remain On when these ratings are Off.

For analogue mode:

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** on the remote to turn the TV-Y or TV-G rating On or Off. **Or, press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to enter the sub-menus for the TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14 or TV-MA ratings.

If the TV-Y7, TV-PG, TV-14 or TV-MA sub-menu is accessed, **press the CURSOR A or DOWN** V buttons to select one of the options (Block All, V, S, L, D, or FV).

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** on the remote to turn the option ON or OFF.

**Unrated:** ALL unrated programs based on the Movie Ratings or Parental (TV) Guidelines can be blocked if this feature is set to On and the Blocking feature is set to OFF.

**No Rating:** ALL programming with NO content advisory data can be blocked if set to On and the Blocking feature is set to OFF.

### For digital mode:

Press the OK button to turn On or Off the desired feature. For analogue mode: Press the CURSOR UP ∧ or DOWN ∨ buttons to highlight the desired feature. When highlighted, each feature can be turned On or Off using the CURSOR RIGHT > or CURSOR LEFT < button on the remote.

## **CLOSE CAPTIONING**

Closed Captioning (CC) allows you to read the voice content of television programs on the TV screen. Designed to help the hearing impaired, this feature uses onscreen "text boxes" to show dialogue and conversations while the TV program is in progress.

**Press the CC button** on the remote to display the current Closed Caption setting.

### For digital mode:

**Press the CC button repeatedly** to choose from the 12 Closed Caption options (Off, CC Mute, CS1 to 6 and CC1 to CC4).

For analogue mode:

**Press the CC button repeatedly** to choose from the four Closed Caption options (CC Off, CC1, CC2, CC Mute).

When finished, press the MENU button to remove the menu from the TV's screen.

## **CLOSE CAPTIONING SERVICES-DIGITAL**

When in digital mode, you can assign display options to your closed captioning options.

**Press the MENU button** on the remote to display the onscreen menu.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN** V **button** until the word **Features** is highlighted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to display the Features menu options.

**Press the CURSOR DOWN ∨ button** until the words Close Caption are highlighted and **press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to enter Closed caption services-Digital menu options.

Press the CURSOR DOWN  $\lor$  button to highlight the display options that you want – Off, Always on or On when muted.

**Press the CURSOR RIGHT > button** to highlight the service you want to assign the dis play option that you selected in step 5 and **press OK button** to comfirm.

## AUTO PICTURE<sup>TM</sup>

Whether you're watching a movie or a sporting event, your TV has automatic video control settings matched for your current program source or content.



**Press the AUTO PICTURE button** on the remote control. The current Auto Picture setting will be displayed on the screen.



**Press the AUTO PICTURE button repeatedly** to select either Personal, Movies, Sports, Weak Signal, or MULTIMEDIA picture settings.

**NOTE:** The way you choose to set the Picture Menu Controls will become your Personal setting.



## AUTO SOUND<sup>TM</sup>

T he Auto Sound feature allows the listener to select between four different factory set sound options.



**Press the AUTO SOUND button** on the remote control. The current Auto Sound setting will appear in the middle of the screen.

**Press the AUTO SOUND button repeatedly** to toggle between the four settings. (Personal, Theatre, Music, or Voice)

**NOTE:** The way you choose to set the Sound Menu Controls will become your Personal setting.



## **QUADRASURF**<sup>TM</sup>

 $\mathbf{T}$ he QuadraSurf<sup>TM</sup> control allows you set up I four different personal channel Surf lists using the colored buttons (on the remote control), each holding up to ten channels in its quick viewing"list."

- Press the CHANNEL (+) or (-) buttons (or the NUMBER buttons) to select a channel to add to one of the SURF lists.
- Press the SMILEY <sup>(2)</sup> button on the remote control to ADD the channel to one of the SURF lists.
- Press the corresponding COLORED (Red, Green, Yellow or Blue) button to add the channel to that button's Surf list. (Up to ten channels per button can be stored.)

Repeat steps 1 through 3 to add additional channels (up to 10) to each of the the SURF lists.

To remove a channel from one of the SURF lists;

Press the COLORED Quadra Surf button until the desired channel appears. The screen will display the channel number with a colored "Smiley" face to indicate the Colored button it relates to.

While the "Smiley" face channel indicator is displayed, press the FROWNIE 🙁 button. The screen will read, "Remove item? -Press (2)."

Press the FROWNIE ② button again to con firm your decision to remove the channel from the Surf list.

Repeat steps 4-6 to remove other channels from Surf lists.



## **QUADRASURF**<sup>TM</sup>

The Quadra Surf buttons on your remote control allow you to store up to 10 channels per button (40 total). You can even program the A/V Input channels for each button making them a "source" button.

Assuming channels have now been added to the four Quadra Surf lists (the four colored buttons, see the previous page), let's review how the feature works.

Press one of the pre-programmed COLORED buttons on the remote (Red, Green, Yellow or Blue). The screen will display a smiley face with the first programmed channel for that surf list.

While the colored "smiley" face still appears on the screen, press the same COLORED button on the remote to tune the second channel programmed for that specific surf list.

**Repeatedly pressing the same COLORED but ton** while the "smiley" face appears will tune all the programmed channels. Pressing the COLORED button again will return you to the first channel in the list.

If the "smiley" face disappears from the screen and the same COLORED button is pressed, the surf channels will be displayed starting with the FIRST programmed channel again.



Repeat steps 1-3 for the other three COLORED buttons (Surf lists) if desired.

Any time the "smiley" face appears with the channel number, **pressing the "frownie" face button** will allow you to remove it from the list (see the previous page for more details).





## **ALTERNATE CHANNEL**

Your remote also has an A/CH (Alternate Channel) button. Pressing this button will toggle between the Current and one previously selected channel.

If your remote control will not operate your accessory devices, look up the four-digit code listed by your brand on panels 33-35.

Please read through steps 1-5 before beginning.

Place the DVD/ACC Mode Switch in the proper position.

**Press the VCR • RECORD button** on the remote control and release.

**Press the AUTO SOUND button** on the remote with in 30 seconds, then release.

Enter the FOUR-DIGIT REMOTE CODE NUMBER for your desired device. The remote is now ready to send commands to the unit.

Point the remote at the Device. Press the POWERbutton on the remote to turn the unit ON.

If this doesn't work the first time, repeat the steps using another remote code number.

If programming a VCR or DVD type product that has a **STOP** play command, place a VCR Tape or DVD disc into the device. **Press the PLAY button**.

Place the TV/VCR/ACC Mode Switch in the proper position. VCR for programming Video Cassette Recorders or ACC for all other accessory devices.

Press the VCR • RECORD and the AUTO SOUND buttons simultaneously and hold them down. As you continue to hold down buttons, the remote will run through its programmed code list with a command for the VCR or DVD to STOP play. Or, for Cable Boxes and Satellite Receivers the command will be to CHANGE CHANNELS.

When the STOP command happens release the two buttons. Or for Cable Boxes and Satellite Receivers, as soon as the channel changes <u>ONCE</u>, IMMEDI-ATELY release the two buttons.

## **TROUBLESHOOTING TIPS**

### No Power

- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert the plug into the outlet and push the POWER button again.
- Check that the outlet is not on a wall switch.
- Be sure the fuse is not blown on the AC power strip, if one is being used.

### **No Picture**

- Check antenna connections. Are they properly secured to the TV's ANT 75 $\Omega$  plug?
- Check the TUNER MODE control for the correct tuner setting.
- Try running the Auto Program feature to find all available channels.
- Press the AV button on the remote to make sure the correct signal source is selected (FRONT, AV1, AV2, Current Channel, etc.).

### No Sound

- Check the VOLUME buttons.
- Check the MUTE button on the remote control.
- If you're attempting to hook up auxiliary equipment, check the audio jack connections located on the front of the TV.

### **Remote Does Not Work**

• Check the batteries. If necessary, replace them with AA Heavy Duty (Zinc Chloride) or Alkaline batteries.

### **Remote Does Not Work Continued**

- Clean the remote control and the remote control sensor window on the TV.
- Check the TV power cord. Unplug the TV, wait 10 seconds, then reinsert the plug into the outlet and push the POWER button again.
- Be sure the fuse is not blown on the AC power strip, if one is being used.
- Check to be sure the TV outlet is not on a wall switch.
- TV Displays Wrong Channel or No Channels Above 13
- Repeat channel selection.
- Add the desired channel numbers (using the CHANNEL EDIT control) into the TV's memory.
- Check to be sure the TUNER MODES are set to the CABLE option and run the Auto Program feature to find all available channels.

# TV Displays white lines in letterbox when viewing a DVD disc

• Some DVD Discs are encoded with as much as 30% more video information to give the best possible picture quality. With the DVD Player in the 16:9 picture format, the playback of this type of disc with extra video information, can produce a number of small white lines in the upper portion of the black letterbox area. With some of these discs, this situation is unavoidable and it does not require a service call.

### **CLEANING AND CARE**

### WARNING Concerning Stationary Images on the TV Screen:

### Do not leave stationary or letterbox images on screen for extended periods of time. This can cause uneven picture-tube aging.

Normal use of the TV should involve the showing of pictures that contain constantly moving and changing images that fill the screen. Be careful not to leave nonmoving images on screen for extended periods of time, or to display the same images on screen too frequently, because subtle ghost images can be left on the picture tubes. Sources of stationary images may be DVD disks, laser disks, video games, CD-i disks, videotapes, digital television boxes, broadcast channels, cable channels, satellite channels, and others. **Here are some examples of stationary images (this is not an all-inclusive list; you may encounter others in your viewing):** 

- DVD menus—listings of DVD disk content
- Letterbox black bars—shown at the top and bottom of the TV screen when a wide screen (16:9) movie is viewed on a TV with standard (4:3) aspect ratio.
- Video-game images and scoreboards
- **Television station logos**—present a problem if they are bright and stationary; moving or low-contrast graphics are less likely to cause uneven aging of the picture tube
- Stock-market tickers—presented at the bottom of the TV screen
- Shopping channel logos and pricing displays—bright and shown constantly or repeatedly in the same location on the TV screen.

### Placement of the TV

- To avoid cabinet warping, cabinet color changes, and increased chance of set failure, do not place the TV where temperatures can become excessively hot; for example, in direct sunlight or near a heating appliance.
- Be sure to allow a free flow of air to and from the perforated back cover of the set.

### Cleaning

- To avoid possible shock hazard, be sure the TV is unplugged from the electrical outlet before cleaning.
- Regularly dust the TV with a dry, nonscratching duster to keep the TV clean.
- When cleaning the TV, take care not to scratch or damage the screen surface. Avoid wearing jewelry or using anything abrasive. Do not use household cleaners. Wipe the front screen with a clean cloth dampened with water. Use even, easy, vertical strokes when cleaning.
- Gently wipe the cabinet surfaces with a clean cloth or sponge dampened in a solution of cool, clear water and a mild soap or detergent. Use a clean, dry cloth to dry the wiped surfaces.
- Occasionally vacuum the ventilation holes or slots in the back cover of the set.
- Never use thinners, insecticide sprays, or other chemicals on or near the cabinet, as they might cause permanent marring of the cabinet finish.
