



#### **Battery Installation**

Before using the remote control, the battery (supplied) must be fitted. When fitting or replacing the battery in the remote control, refer to the diagram to the right.

- 1. Press the catch across
- 2. While holding the catch across, open the battery door
- 3. Fit the battery observing polarity as shown. When replacing the battery, use only the same CR2025 type specified.







Turning the unit on or off

Press STANDBY to turn the unit on or off (standby mode).

#### Using the menus


The display window shows the playback screen, browse screen, settings screen, messages etc.

What appears on the window varies depending on the function you are using.


#### To navigate in the menus

Use the navigation controls to make choices and input information

- ▲ moves up
- ▼ moves down
- ▶►I moves forward
- I◀◀ moves back
- · SELECT confirms selected option
- · MENU goes back to the previous screen

#### To input characters

 Some menus require character input (e.g password)



- When inputting characters, press ▲ or ▼
  to select the alpha-numeric characters listed
  on the screen. Press SELECT/ENTER to
  conform the selections.
- To erase a mistake, select BKSP on the screen and then press SELECT/ENTER.
- When finished inputting, select OK on the screen and then press SELECT/ENTER.
- When cancel inputting, select CANCEL on the screen and then press SELECT/ENTER.

#### **Audio Controls**

- Press VOLUME + or on the main unit or on the remote control to adjust sound level during playback. The current volume shows on the display temporarily before returning to the previous display.
- Enter 'Equaliser' option on the System settings to select an eugalizer mode (Normal, Flat, Jazz, Rock, Movie, Classic, Pop, News, My EQ).
- Press MUTE to cut the sound output temporarily. When sound is cut, "t\" shows on the display. To restore the sound output, press MUTE again or adjust the volume.




#### Introduction

You must connect to the Internet in order to use the Internet Radio. Before you can use the Internet part of the unit you must have:

A wireless (Wi-Fi) access point (AP).



An Ethernet connection with an RJ45 plug.



- · If your wireless network is already in use, it might have Wired Equivalent Privacy (WEP) or Wi-Fi Protected Access (WPA) data encryption. You will need to enter the WEP or WPA key word into the unit so that it can communicate with the router.
- · The 'access point' in a wireless network has a name known as the 'SSID'. You will need to 'tell' the unit the SSID when setting it up for the first time.

- · Usually the SSID starts out as the brand and model of the router, although it is a good idea to change it if there are other networks, so identification of the correct network (SSID) is easier. Legally speaking, you should not connect to the Internet through someone
- · else's network. Apart from the legal aspect, sharing a wireless link will make audio from the Internet more prone to interference.
- Wireless router range is usually enough for domestic use but can be adversely affected by some building materials and interference sources such as other nearby wireless networks.

If your Internet connection is still not working after settings, always try disconnecting mains power to all the devices in the network. Then switch things back on in this order:

- 1. Modem. Wait a minute for the indicator lights to settle down
- 2. Router (if separate). Again, wait a minute for the indicator lights to settle down
- 3. Computer(s) re-start
- 4. Restart this unit



#### Internet Connections

To connect to the internet via internal unit wizard:

- 1. Press STANDBY to turn on the unit
- Press MENU on the main unit or on the remote control and press the ▲ or ▼ to select "Main Menu" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "System Settings"

  and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press the ▲ or ▼ to select "Network" then press SELECT/ENTER
- 5. Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Manual Settings" then press **SELECT/ENTER**
- According to your connection settings, press
   ▲ or ▼ to select "Wired" or "Wireless" and then press SELECT/ENTER




 Press ▲ or ▼ to select "DHCP enable" or "DHCP disable" and then press SELECT/ENTER



DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol) helps you obtaining various parameters necessary for the client to operate in an Internet Protocol (IP) network with minimum or no manual configurations. Check with your service provider if your network is equipped with such device. If you have selected Wired in step 6, you will be connected to the Internet

- Enter your network name (SSID), refer to instructions on page 7 for more information on inputting characters.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Open", "Pre-Shared Key", "WPA", "WPA2" according to your security settings and the press SELECT/ENTER



 If your network is password-protected, enter the password now with reference to instructions on page 9. You will then be connected to the internet





#### **PC Setup**

#### Internet Connections

The unit can access to a shared folder/media on your PC and play back music files stored in it.

To do so, you can either setup a shared folder on your PC or via media sharing by the UPnP (Universal Plug and Play) feature of your PC.

#### Using a shared folder on the PC

To setup a shared folder on your PC:

- Configure Domain/Workgroup on your PC
   In order to setup the unit to play back music stored on a shared network folder, the username, password and domain settings must first be configured. This is only required if you have set a password on your shared folders. The domain configuration can be found on a Windows XP machine as below:
  - 1.1 From the start menu, select Control > System and then select the Computer Name tab. The Domain or Workgroup that your Computer is a member of is displayed in this tab.



1.2 If your PC is not a member of any Domain or Workgroup then one must be joined. To do so, click on the Change button on the Computer Name tab and enter the name of the domain (default on Windows XP is MSHOME).



1.3 A restart of the PC may be necessary if the Domain or Workgroup has been changed.

#### 2. Setup a new user account

The unit requires a user account to be set up on each PC that you wish to browse. By default most PCs have at least one user account associated with it. The username and password (optional) needs to be the same on each PC as the unit can only store 15. one username and password. For Windows XP machine this can be set up as below:

2.1 From the Start menu, select Control Panel > User accounts.







2.2 Click Create a New Account and then enter the new username and the Domain/Workgroup setting as noted in step 1. Select the type of user (restricted) and then click Finish.



2.3 Select the user just created, then select Create a new password.



2.4 Note the username and password.

Note for Windows Vista users: you have to turn on the Guest account via Manage User Account in the Control Panel. Then add access to either "Everyone" or "Guest" on the shared drive. You can also create a new account for sharing with the unit, with a password, if you are concerned about security. The Guest account has no password by default and the unit will connect to it from its factory default settings.

#### 3. Configure a shared folder

- 3.1 From the Start menu, select My Computer and navigate to the folder you wish to share.
- 3.2 Right-click on the folder and select Sharing and Security.



3.3 Select Share this folder. Create the folder a name in the Share name field. By default it will have the name of the folder already listed and then click Permissions.



3.4 Click Add



3.5 Enter the username in the dialog box. This is the username you have created in step 2.
Click OK when finished.



3.6 Check the appropriate permissions for your share. We recommend giving Read access to the shared folder. Click OK when finished.



#### 4. Connect with your PC.

- Before the radio can stream music from your PC, you need to enter the username and password for the shared folder you have created (as instructed above).
- If your shared file form PC has set, you will enable your unit to connect to the PC with correct 'Username' and 'Password'. Refer to Page 11 for more information on connecting the Internet.
- The PC is now ready to stream music to the unit.
- Refer to Media Player on page 20 for more information on streaming music from your PC in this unit.


#### Clock

#### To set the time and date manually:

 Press MENU on the main unit or on the remote control and the press ▲ or ▼ to select "Main menu" and then press

#### SELECT/ENTER

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "System settings" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Clock menu" and then press SELECT/ENTER



- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Time/Date" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Set Time/Date" and then press SELECT/ENTER




- Press ▲ or ▼ to to set the Month, then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to to set the Year, then press SELECT/ENTER
- 8. Press ▲ or ▼ to to set the Hour, then press **SELECT/ENTER**
- Press ▲ or ▼ to to set the Hour, then press SELECT/ENTER
- 10. Press ▲ or ▼ to to set the Minute, then press **SELECT/ENTER**

The time and date can auto update by DAB, FM or Network

- In 'Time/Date' step, press ▲ or ▼ to select 'Auto update' and then press SELECT
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Update from DAB", "Update from FM", "Update from Network" or "No update" and then press



#### To set hour format

- In 'Time/Date' step, press ▲ or ▼ to select 'Set format' and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "12" hour format or "24" hour format and then press

If the time is update from Network, you will set the 'time zone' and 'daylight saving' for your like.

- In 'Time/Date' step, press ▲ or ▼ to select 'Set timezone' and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select desired time zone and then press SELECT/ENTER

#### Clock

#### To set summer time

Daylight saving time (or summer time as it is called in many countries) is a way of getting more light out of the day by advancing clocks by one hour during the summer.

- In 'Time/Date' step, press ▲ or ▼ to select 'Daylight saving' and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select 'ON' option, then press SELECT/ENTER

#### **Alarm**

You can set two completely separate alarm times (ALARM 1 and ALARM 2) and activate either or both of them to wake you with a buzzer, radio, or music from a docked iPod. You can also pre-set the station preset and volume settings that the alarms will wake you with. The alarms are set from the remote control or from within the settings menu.

#### To set the Alarm


- Press MENU on the main unit or on the remote control and the press ▲ or ▼ to or to select "Main menu" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to to select "System settings" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to to select "Clock menu" and then press SELECT/ENTER



 Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Alarms" and then SELECT/ENTER

Noted: you may also press ALARM to enter the Alarms menu directly.

 Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Alarm 1" or "Alarm 2" and the press SELECT/ENTER to enter Alarm settings menu




- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Enable" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to set the alarm frequency. Alarm frequency: Daily, Once, Weekends, Weekdays
- Press ▲ or ▼ to to select "Time" and then press SELECT/ENTER to set the time for Alarm.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to to set the Hour of alarm, then press SELECT/ENTER



#### Clock, alarm and sleep function

#### Alarm - continued

- Press ▲ or ▼ to set the Minute of alarm, then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Mode" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to set Wake-up mode and then press SELECT/ENTER
   Alarm mode: Buzzer, Internet radio, DAB FM, iPod.



Noted: you will select a preset station for radio alarm modes

 Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Volume" and then press SELECT/ENTER

- Press ▲ or ▼ to set desired volume level for Alarm
- 15. If you have finished Alarm settings, press or to select "Save" and then press SELECT/ENTER to save the settings. "Alarm saved" will show on the display.

#### Turning off the alarm

To stop the alarm when it sounds: Press MENU or ALARM to turn off the alarm.

To silence the alarm temporarily (Snooze): Press SNOOZE/DIMMER. The alarm will sound again when the snooze period (9 min) is over.

To deactivate the alarm completely:


At STANDBY mode, press ALARM repeatedly until the alarm icon disappear from the display

#### Sleep function

The unit includes a programmable sleep function to play the unit for a set length of time before turning off automatically.

#### To use the sleep function:

- Press MENU on the main unit or on the remote control and the press ▲ or ▼ to select "Main menu" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "System settings" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Clock menu" and then press SELECT/ENTER



- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Sleep" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ▲ or ▼ repeatedly to select a desirable length of time (15, 30, 45, 60, 75, 90 and OFF) before the unit turns off automatically.

Note: you may also press SLEEP repeatedly to select the desirable length of time.

- Select "Sleep OFF" if you want to cancel using this function.
- The display will return to the previous display after a few seconds. The sleep function is now set. A small clock icon ( Z60) will show at the lower right corner of the display with the remaining length of time next to it.

#### Internet radio

#### Listening to Internet Radio

With Internet Radio, you can listen to music or Podcasts in other countries or from your hometown. It offers the most music selections from around the world and most stations are free.


#### To access the Internet radio mode

Press FUNCTION repeatedly on the main unit until Internet radio mode is selected.

#### To browse and listen to an Internet radio station

Press FUNCTION repeatedly on the main unit until Internet radio mode is selected.

- 1. In Internet radio mode, press MENU
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Station list" and then press SELECT/ENTER



Note: If the unit did not connect any Internet, "SSID" menu will appear automatically. You should select your available Internet network. Refer to page 8 for more information for Internet setup.


- If the Internet was connected before, the unit 3 will enter station list to select your favorite station.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Stations" and then 4 press SELECT/ENTER



- Internet radio station are categorized 5. according to Location (e.g. Africa, Asia), Genre (e.g. Big Band, Blues). Press ▲ or ▼ to select a category or sub-category and then press **SELECT/ENTER**
- While a station is selected, press 6. **SELECT/ENTER** to start listening.

#### To browse and listen to a Podcast:

- In Internet radio mode, press MENU
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Station list" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Podcasts" and then press SELECT/ENTER



- Podcasts are categorized according to 4. Location (e.g., Germany, USA), Genre (e.g., Health, History). Press ▲ or ▼ to select a category or sub-category and then press **SELECT/ENTER**
- While a Podcast is selected, press **SELECT/ENTER** to start listening.

#### To search for an Internet radio station

- 1. In Internet radio mode, press MENU.
- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Station list" and then press SELECT/ENTER





Make sure you have already setup your PC for media sharing. Read page 11-12 for details.



#### DRC

DRC is Dynamic Range Compression. Enabling DRC may improve the sound of DAB radio when listening in a noisy room.

#### Station order

Station order enables the sequence of list the stations with 'Alphanumeric', 'Ensemble', 'Valid' way.

#### **Accessing FM**

#### To access the FM Tuner mode:

Press FUNCTION repeatedly on the main unit until FM mode is selected.

#### To perform a station search

- Press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the frequency. Use this
  method to tune to weak or distant stations
  that are not strong enough to be recognized
  by the automatic search.
- Press and hold ▲ or ▼ until the frequency on the display begins to change and then release the button to automatically search for the next available station.





#### Accessing FM - continued

 Press ▲ or ▼ to select "YES" or "NO" and then press SELECT/ENTER. Setting to "YES" will exclude weaker stations resulting in a quicker scan. If you set to "NO" the scan will stop at every station detected, even if the signal is weak.



#### To turn on or off the stereo sound

- Press ▲ or ▼ to select "Audio setting" and then press SELECT/ENTER
- Press ➤►I or I◄◄ to select "YES" or "NO" and then press SELECT/ENTER. This option enables you to set the radio to receive FM in Auto mode (Mono/Stereo) or in Mono only. This may be useful if the signal is weak and the broadcast is noisy.





#### iPod/iPhone

#### **Navigation and Playback**

In this mode, you can navigate and playback music on your iPod/iPhone connected to the unit.

#### To connect your iPod/iPhone to the unit

- Switch off your iPod/iPhone or pause its music playback.
- Place your iPod/iPhone on the iPod/iPhone dock and select the iPod/iPhone mode (read below).

#### To access the iPod/iPhone mode

Press FUNCTION repeatedly on the main unit until iPod mode is selected.

## To navigate and play back audio files on your iPod/iPhone

The unit works with all models of iPhone, iPod Touch, iPod Nano, iPod Video and iPod Classic up to 160GB.

 Press ▶►I SCAN to toggle between Play and Pause mode at any time.

- Press I◄◄/INFO or ►►I/PRESET to select the next or previous track on your iPod/iPhone. Press MENU to move up through the iPod menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to scroll up and down options displayed on iPod menu. Press SELECT/ ENTER to select menu items.
- 4. Press REPEAT to select repeat play mode.

#### To charge your iPod/iPhone

Your iPod/iPhone is charged whenever it is docked to the main unit


#### To disconnect your iPod/iPhone

Stop the iPod playback and disconnect it from the dock.

#### **Auxiliary input**

The unit includes an AUX IN jack to let you connect external audio equipment (e.g. mp3 player, audio outputs from DVD or VCR, cassette player) and listen to the sound from the external equipment through the speakers of this unit.

To connect an external audio equipment: Connect the audio output jack or headphone jack of the external audio equipment to the AUX jack at the back of this unit. You may permanently connect the external audio equipment to the unit. It is not necessary to disconnect the equipment in order to listen to other sound sources in this unit.



#### To access the AUX mode

Press FUNCTION repeatedly on the main unit until AUX mode is selected.

#### To listen to the external audio equipment

- In AUX mode, turn on your external audio equipment and start playback from it.
- Adjust the volume of your external audio equipment to mid-range and adjust the master volume on this unit.

Do not turn the volume of the external audio equipment too high as this may affect the sound quality.

For other playback operations, control them on your external audio equipment.



#### **Troubleshooting tips**

#### General

#### No power

 DC connection is not complete. Check all cords and cables.

#### Unit does not respond to key presses

 The built-in microprocessor may malfunction due to external electrical interference. Unplug the AC power cord and then plug it back in.

#### Unable to operate the unit from the remote control

 Make sure there is no obstacle between the unit and the remote control. Move closer to the unit. The batteries are exhausted. Replace the batteries.

#### No sound is heard

Volume is too low. Increase the volume

#### Internet radio

#### Cannot connect to unit to Internet

- Check if your access point is turned on
- · Check if all connections are properly made
- Make sure a firewall is not blocking any outgoing ports
- Make sure you have entered the correct password. Password is case sensitive
- Your wireless Internet connection may exceed the maximum range for reception. Relocate the unit closer to the wireless access point
- The network settings of the unit may be incorrect. Check the network settings again
- The unit connects to the Internet but is unable to play a particular station • Check if the station is still broadcasting

- The station may have reached the maximum number of simultaneous listeners
- The link to the radio station may be out of date
- · The Internet connection between the radio
- · station server and the unit may be too slow

#### Intermittent audio

- The bandwidth of your wireless /LAN may be too low. Move the radio closer to the access point and make sure that there are no obstacles between them.
- The actual transmission speed of digital radio broadcast depends on the service provider (i.e. the Internet radio station).

#### Radio

#### Poor radio reception

- The FM antenna is not properly extended and positioned. Extend completely and try another position.
- Turn off nearby electrical appliances, such as hair dryer, vacuum cleaner, microwave and fluorescent lights.
