INITIAL SETUP

Create or log in to your Google™ account to get access to all of your Google services, like Gmail™, Google+, Google Play™ Store, and more. Registration is secure and only takes a few minutes. Your Gmail contacts are synced to the phone when you log in to your Google account.

To set up additional personal email accounts or a corporate email account, follow the on-screen instructions.

WI-FI CONNECT

If you want to use a Wi-Fi network for even faster Internet access, touch the status bar at the top of the home screen and drag it down. Touch the **Wi-Fi networks available** notification to select a preferred network

You can also touch Menu > System settings, then drag the Wi-Fi power OFF switch to the right to turn it on. There's more in "WI-FI NETWORKS" on page 41.


CONTROL

a few essentials

TOUCH TIPS

It's all in the touch:

- Touch: Choose an icon or option.
- Touch & Hold: Select an item and open an action bar.
- Drag: Move items in the home screen, or scroll slowly through lists.
- Flick: Scroll guickly between views or through lists.
- Pinch or double-touch: Zoom in and out on websites, photos, and maps.



UNLOCK & LOCK TOUCHSCREEN

To unlock the screen, press the Power key, then touch and flick to

To lock the screen, press the Power key, or let the screen time out (don't press anything).



TOUCHSCREEN ON/OFF

Your touchscreen is on when you need it and off when you don't.

- When you hold the phone to your ear during calls, your touchscreen sleeps to prevent accidental touches.
- To make your touchscreen sleep or wake up, just press the Power key.
- To change how long your phone waits before the screen goes to sleep automatically, touch Menu = > System settings > Display > Sleep.
- To make the screen lock when it goes to sleep, see "SCREEN LOCK" on page 53. To unlock the screen, press the Power key, then touch and flick to a.

Note: Your touchscreen might stay dark if the sensor just above it is covered.

Don't use covers or



screen protectors (even clear ones) that cover this sensor.

ROTATE THE SCREEN

When you turn your phone, the touchscreen can rotate to stay right-side up:

Find it: Menu => System settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen

SCREEN CAPTURE


Sometimes a picture speaks louder than words. Share a screen capture of your favorite playlist, or your new high score. Forward a screen capture of a friend's contact information. If you can see it on your phone, you can share it with your friends.

To capture the screen image on your phone, press the Power key and down volume key. The screen image is stored in **Gallery** (see "**VIEW PHOTOS & VIDEOS**" on page 31).

KEY TIPS

MENU, HOME, BACK, & SEARCH

Touch Home (a) to close a menu or app and return to the home screen. In the home screen, touch and hold Home (a) to see a list of recent apps, then touch an app to open it.



Tip: To remove an item

from the recent apps list, flick it left or right.

Touch Menu (≡) to open options for the current app or screen.

Touch Back (⇒) to go back.

Touch Search and enter text for text search or say Google to voice search.

PHONE OPTIONS MENU

Press and hold the Power key to open a phone options menu where you can turn off your phone (**Power off**), turn **Airplane mode** on and off, or change the sound setting.

ADJUST VOLUME

Press the volume keys to change ring volume (in the home screen) or earpiece volume (during a call).

When playing music or videos, press the volume keys to adjust media volume.



SEARCH

Search your apps, contacts, files, places, and the web. Touch Search \bigcirc , or flick your home screen right and, touch Google for a text search, or \P for voice search.

 Use the touchscreen keyboard to enter search text. Google™ shows suggestions as you type. Touch a

- suggestion to search for it, or touch \mathbf{Q} to search for the text you entered.
- To perform a voice search from the search window, just say "Google," then say what you want to search for.
- To become a super searcher, visit www.google.com/insidesearch.

GOOGLE NOW™

Google Now shows you what's around you, relevant to the moment: current traffic, weather, your appointments, and more. It all happens automatically.

To get started, touch Search , then Menu > Settings > Google Now.



VOICE TIPS

VOICE ACTIONS

Voice actions let you perform many tasks just by speaking to your phone: call or text your friends, get directions, set an alarm, and more.

To perform a voice action:

- 1 Touch Search <a>
 □, then <a>
 ■ to open voice search.
- 2 Speak the voice action you want to perform.

Tip: You can also access voice search by touching \P in the GoogleTM Search widget.

If voice search doesn't understand what you said, it presents a list of search terms and actions you can touch to choose.

Some actions, like "send email" and "note to self," open a page that prompts you to complete the action by speaking or typing more information.

self"	Example: "Note to self: remember the milk."
"Set alarm"	"Time" or "for" & time (such as "10:45 a.m." or "20 minutes from now"), "Label" & name of alarm. Example: "Set alarm for 7:45 p.m., label, switch the laundry."

HOME SCREEN

quick access to the things you need most

QUICK START: HOME SCREEN

The home screen gives you all your latest information in one place. It's what you see when you turn on your phone or touch Home from a menu. It's basically like this:



Note: Your home screen might look a little different.

USE & CHANGE YOUR HOME SCREEN

On your home screen, *shortcuts* are icons that open your favorite apps, web bookmarks, contacts, mail labels, playlists, and more. *Widgets* are live apps or tools that provide news, weather, messages, and other updates.

 To open something, touch it. Touch Home a or Back to return to the home screen.

Tip: When you open a widget, touch Menu to see any options or settings. You can choose accounts for some widgets, like **Calendar**, **Email**, **Facebook**, and **Gmail**

- To add shortcuts to the home screen, touch Apps (iii), touch and hold an app, then drag it to a spot on the home screen pages.
 - To create a **shortcut folder**, drag one shortcut onto another to put them both in a folder. To add other shortcuts, drag them onto the folder icon. To name the folder, touch it and enter a name at the bottom.
- To add widgets, touch Apps (iii), touch Widgets at the top, then touch and hold a widget (or flick left to see more widgets).
- To move widgets or shortcuts, touch and hold them, then drag to a new location.

- To remove shortcuts or widgets from the home screen, touch and hold them, then drag to Remove at the top.
- To change wallpaper, touch and hold a blank spot on the home screen.

Shortcuts in the *favorites tray* at the bottom of the home screen always appear in all home screen views. You can drag shortcuts or folders in or out of the favorites tray (except the Apps (##) button) for instant access from any home screen.

PHONE STATUS & NOTIFICATIONS

Icons at the top right of the screen show status information like signal strength, battery level, and time.

Icons at the top left show messages and app notifications. To see your notifications, touch the status bar and drag it down. Touch a notification to select it



Tip: To remove a notification from the list, flick it left or right. To clear all notifications, touch X.

Tip: Blue connection icons (network, data, Wi-Fi) appear when your phone is connected to your GoogleTM

account. White connection icons mean your phone is not communicating with the Google servers.

Note: Apps you download from Google PlayTM Store may show other icons in the status bar to alert you to specific events.

QUICK START: APPS & UPDATES

Touch Apps ::: in any home screen page, then flick left or right to see all your apps.

In the apps screen, touch **All apps** to view or create app groups.



To add a shortcut to the home screen for an app group view, touch **All apps** > **Add group to home**.

To close the apps screen, touch Home (or Back).

BROWSE & INSTALL APPS

One of the great things about a phone is the apps. Whatever you're into, whatever you want to do, there's probably an app that can help you. So, go to the place that has it all, Google Play™ Store.

Find it: Apps (:::) > Play Store

Scroll to and touch the app you want to install. Then, touch **Install** (if app is free) or **Buv**.

New apps that you install are added to the apps screen.

Tip: Choose your apps and updates carefully, from trusted sites like Play Store, as some may impact your phone's performance—see "CHOOSE CAREFULLY" on page 14.

Note: When installing an app, make sure you read the alerts that tell you what information the app will access. If you don't want the app to have access to this information, cancel the installation.

CREATE SHORTCUT FOLDERS

You can use home screen folders to logically group and store your app shortcuts in a single location.

To create a shortcut folder in the home screen, drag one shortcut onto another to put them both in a folder. To add other shortcuts, drag them onto the folder icon. To name the folder, touch it and enter a name at the bottom.

RECENT APPS

Your phone remembers the apps that you used most recently. From the home screen, touch and hold Home (a) to see the most recent apps used.

Tip: To remove an item from the recent apps list, flick it left or right.

MANAGE & RESTORE APPS

From the home screen, touch Menu \equiv > Manage apps.

Touch an app to see its file size, access permissions, and other details, then touch **Disable**, **Force stop**, **Uninstall** (for apps you downloaded), **Clear cache**, or other options.

To reinstall apps from Google PlayTM Store, touch Apps $\textcircled{\scriptsize \textcircled{\tiny 12}}$ > $\textcircled{\scriptsize \textcircled{\tiny Play}}$ Play Store, then touch Menu $\textcircled{\scriptsize \textcircled{\tiny 22}}$ > My apps. Apps that you have previously purchased from Google PlayTM Store are listed and available for download.

CHOOSE CAREFULLY

Apps are great. There's something for everyone. Play, communicate, work, or have fun. But remember, choose your apps carefully. Here are a few tips:

- To help prevent spyware, phishing, or viruses from affecting your phone or privacy, use apps from trusted sites, like play Store.
- In Play Store, check an app's ratings and comments before installing.
- If you doubt the safety of an app, don't install it.
- Like all apps, downloaded apps will use up memory, data, battery, and processing power—some more than others. For example, a simple battery level widget will use less than a streaming music player app. After installing an app, if you're not happy with how much memory, data, battery or processing power it's using, uninstall it. You can always install it again later.
- Just like web browsing, you may want to monitor children's access to apps to help prevent exposure to inappropriate content.
- Certain apps may not provide completely accurate information. Take care, especially when it comes to personal health.

UPDATE MY PHONE

You can check, download, and install phone software updates using your phone, or using your computer:

• Using your phone:

You may get an automatic notification of an available update on your phone. Simply follow the instructions to download and install.

To manually check for updates, touch Menu = > System settings > About phone > System updates.

Your phone downloads any updates over your mobile network. Remember, these updates can be quite large (25MB or more) and may not be available in all countries. If you don't have an unlimited data plan, or mobile network updates are not available in your country, you can update using a computer.




CALLS

it's good to talk

QUICK START: CALLS

Find it: Apps ::: > III Phone





You can touch Home a or Back to leave the active call display. To reopen it, touch Home > ## Phone.

Tip: Search for contacts right from the dialpad. For example, to find **Jeff** in your contacts list, touch **5-3-3-3**. Matching contacts appear above the number field.

Note: Using a mobile device or accessory while driving may cause distraction and may be illegal. Always obey the laws and drive safely.

MAKE & ANSWER CALLS

To **make** a call, touch **Phone**, enter a number, then touch **.**


Tip: When the screen is locked, touch **and** flick to to make a call.

Tip: When you hold your phone to your ear, the display goes dark to prevent accidental touches. When you move the phone away from your ear, the display lights up again.

To answer a call, touch (and flick to ().

To ignore an incoming call, touch
and flick to ...

Tip: To silence an incoming call alert, press the Power key or the volume keys.



RECENT CALLS

Find it: I Phone > Recent

- To call a number, touch (next to the entry.
- · To see call details, touch the entry.
- To send a text message, create a contact, view a contact, or other options, touch and hold the entry.
- To search the recent calls list, touch Q.
- To clear the list, touch Menu (≡) > Clear list.

FAVORITES

Find it: Apps ::: > 1 People > Favorites

- To call, text, email, or view contact information, touch the contact.
- To edit, share, delete, or set a ringtone for a contact, touch the contact, then touch Menu (=).

MULTIPLE CALLS & CONFERENCE CALLS

During a call, you can start another call, switch between them, or join them in a conference call.

To start a multiple/conference call, call the first number. After the call connects, touch \mathfrak{A}_+ . Dial the next number, or select it from contacts or favorites. When the next number answers, touch \blacktriangleright .

YOUR PHONE NUMBER

Find it: Menu (=) > System settings > About phone > Status > My Phone number

TTY MODE

Your phone can use an optional teletypewriter (TTY) device, for people who are hard of hearing or have a speech impairment.

- 1 Plug the TTY device into the phone's headset jack.
- 2 Touch Phone > Menu > Settings > TTY mode, and choose a TTY setting.

EMERGENCY CALLS

Note: Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked. Emergency numbers vary by country. Your pre-programmed emergency number(s) may not work in

all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

- 1 Touch Emergency Call).
- 2 Enter the emergency number.
- 3 Touch 📞 to call the emergency number.

Note: Your phone can use location based services (GPS and AGPS) to help emergency services find you. See "LOCATION" on page 39.

COOL DOWN

In very limited circumstances, such as where your phone has been exposed to extreme heat, you may see "Cool Down" messages. To avoid possible damage to your battery and phone, you should follow these instructions until the phone is within its recommended temperature range. When your phone is in "Cool Down" mode, only emergency calls can be made.

MORE CALLING FEATURES

voice dial	Touch ♥, then say the contact name, business name, or phone number you want to call.

international calls	If your phone service includes international dialing, press and hold 0 to insert your local international access code (indicated by +). Then enter the country code and phone number.

Find it: Apps ::: > 1 People



TRANSFER CONTACTS

Get all your contacts, all in one place. Here are a few helpful hints:

Use Gmail™

When you first set up your phone and sign in to your GoogleTM account, all your Gmail contacts are synced automatically with your People app. After that, your contacts stay in sync whether you make changes on your phone, from another device, or from a web browser. Most contact applications for mobile phones and email accounts allow you to export your contacts as a "csv" file. You can then use Gmail to import the file. For more details, go to www.motorola.com/transfercontacts or log in to your

Gmail account on your computer and select "Help".

LINK CONTACTS

You might have two or more contacts for the same person, maybe a Gmail contact who is also stored on your phone, or one friend with two email addresses. To combine these contacts:

Touch a contact to open it, touch Menu \equiv > **Edit** > Menu \equiv > **Join**, then touch the second contact.

CALL OR EMAIL CONTACTS

Find it: Apps :: > 1 People

- To call a contact, touch the contact's name, then touch the number you want to call. To send a text message, touch next to the number.
- To email a contact, touch the contact's name, then touch the contact's email address.

VIEW & USE CONTACTS

When you log in to a social networking account (see "SOCIAL NETWORKING" on page 24), you'll know what everybody's up to and when. Every time you pick up a call, check a message, or look up a friend's contact info, you'll see their name and number, but you can see their social network status and smiling face, too.

Find it: Apps ::: > 1 People

 To find a contact, touch Q and type the contact name.

Touch a contact to open its details. While viewing details, you can start a call or message by touching the phone number, $\[\]$, or email address.

- To change which group of contacts is shown (like All contacts or contacts from your Gmail account) touch Menu => Contacts to display.
- To change how you view the list of contacts, touch Menu => Settings > Display options.

CREATE CONTACTS

Touch a text box to type the name and details. When you're finished, touch \checkmark **SAVE** at the top.

Where are contacts stored? Your phone can store contacts in its memory or your Google™ account: To choose where contacts are stored, touch Apps ⊕

> People > Menu > Settings > Contact storage > Contact storage account. If you don't see your Google account listed, make sure you're syncing contacts with it: Touch Menu > System settings > ACCOUNTS, touch the account, and check Sync Contacts. Contacts are not stored on your SIM card.

FAVORITES

To add a contact to your favorites list, touch the contact to open it, then touch Add to Favorites.

To see your favorites list:

Find it: Apps (:::) > People > FAVORITES

EDIT OR DELETE CONTACTS

Find it: Apps ::: > 1 People > touch the contact to open it, then touch Menu = > Edit or Delete

PERSONALIZE CONTACTS

Find it: Apps (iii) > 1 People

Add a photo: Touch the contact to open it, touch > Menu = > Edit, then touch 1 and choose Take photo or Select existing photo.

Set a ringtone: Touch the contact to open it, then touch Menu (=) > **Set ringtone**.

GROUPS

Find it: Apps ::: > People > GROUPS > group name

You can put your contacts into groups (like "Friends" or "Family") to make it easier to find them.

To create a new group, touch Apps $\textcircled{=} > \blacksquare$ **People** > GROUPS > #.

MESSAGES

READ & REPLY TO MESSAGES

Find it: Apps 🔠 > 📴 Text

Tip: From the phone unlock screen, touch $\ensuremath{\mathscr{O}}$ and flick to $\ensuremath{^{\ensuremath{\square}}}$.

- To open a text message and all of its replies, touch it.
- To respond to a text message, open it and enter your response in the text box at the bottom.
- To delete a message, touch and hold to select it, then drag it to the trash can iii in the upper right corner.

CREATE MESSAGES

Find it: Apps ፡ > 📮 Text > 🛨

Enter the recipient and message. Touch Menu (==) to Insert smiley or Add subject.

To add an attachment, touch \infty in the upper right corner.

SEND & RECEIVE MESSAGE ATTACHMENTS

To send a file in a message, open a new message and touch \bigcirc in the upper right corner.

When you receive a message with an attachment, open the message and touch the file name to download it. Touch the name again to open it. Some file types can be converted to HTML for faster viewing, and your phone will show **Get HTML version**.

While viewing the attachment, touch it to save it, share it, and more.

Tip: To send and receive large attachments faster, use a Wi-Fi connection (see "**wi-Fi NETWORKS**" on page 41).

GMAIL

The first time you turned on your phone, you probably set up or logged in to your Google™ Gmail™ account.

If not, you can set up a Gmail account by touching Menu $\boxed{\equiv}$ > System settings > + Add account > Google.

To read and reply to messages on your Gmail account, touch Apps $(iii) > \bigcap$ Gmail.

EMAIL

You can set up multiple email accounts on your phone.

Touch Menu ≡ > System settings > + Add account then:

 Select Corporate for Microsoft™ Exchange server work email accounts. Enter details from your IT administrator. **Tip:** You might need to enter your domain name and user name (like *domain/username*).

 Select Email for your personal email accounts. For account details, contact the account provider.

To read and reply to messages on your email accounts, touch Apps (::) > [Email.

INSTANT MESSAGES

To send and receive instant messages, you can use Google Talk $^{\text{TM}}$.

Find it: Apps (::) > | Talk

Alternatively, you can download an instant messaging app from Google Play™ Store.

VOICEMAIL

When you have a new voicemail, an appears at the top of the screen. Drag down the status bar and touch the **New voicemail** notification to listen to your voicemail message.


If you need to change your voicemail number, in the home screen touch **Phone** > Menu **Settings** > **Voicemail**.

TEXT ENTRY

keys when you need them

TOUCHSCREEN KEYPAD

You can open a keypad on your screen by touching a text box.



Tip: To close the keypad without saving any text (for example, to select a different text box), touch Back \bigcirc .

INPUT METHODS

To select a text input method, touch and hold Space to open the **Select input method** menu, then touch the method you want.

ANDROID KEYBOARD

Enter text a letter at a time. As you type, your phone suggests words from your dictionary and chosen language. The phone also automatically enters apostrophes in some words, like "dont."

To add a word to your dictionary, touch the word, then select **+ add to dictionary**.

SWYPE™

Enter words with one continuous motion. Just drag your finger over the letters in the word.



To enter a word, just trace a path through the letters. To capitalize, go above the keypad. For double letters, circle the letter.

Tips:

- To enter apostrophes in common words (like "I'll"), drag through the n as though it was an apostrophe.
- To enter other punctuation, numbers, or symbols, touch Symbols (+!=).
- To correct a word, double-touch it (touch twice, quickly). Swype shows a small menu of other word

- options. Swype might also show a menu if it can't guess your word.
- If Swype doesn't know a word, you can still touch the letter keys to enter it. Swype remembers, so next time you can just drag over the letters.

Touch Menu \equiv > System settings > Bluetooth, turn Bluetooth power on, then touch Menu \equiv > Rename phone. Enter a name and touch **OK**.

Print email, documents, pictures, and contacts directly to shared printers on a Wi-Fi network—no printer drivers necessary. MOTOPRINT automatically discovers networked printers for you. You can even save your favorite printers and geo-tag their location for future use.

PRINT A DOCUMENT OR FILE

To print something from the **Email**, **Quickoffice**, or **Gallery** apps, open it and touch Menu \equiv > **Print** or \odot > **Print**.

ADD A PRINTER

Open the document or file you want to print, then touch Menu = > **Print** > **Find printers** (home) or select an advanced search option (work).

CALENDAR

Managing your schedule has never been easier. The calendar automatically shows calendar events from your web-based GoogleTM account, and syncs events that you enter from your phone or web browser.

Find it: Apps ::: > 31 Calendar

You can view your calendar in different ways: Touch the date, then touch **Day**, **Week**, **Month**, or **Agenda**. When you highlight an event, more details appear.



Tip: To add a calendar widget to your home screen, touch Apps :: > **Widgets**, touch and hold **Calendar**, then drag it to a spot on the home screen.

ADD CALENDAR EVENTS

From any view, touch Menu \equiv > **New event**. Enter the event start time and other details. You can even set a

reminder so you don't forget about the event. (When you set the reminder time to **0 minutes**, it plays at the event start time.)

Tip: Reminders will play only if you've selected a notification ringtone (see "RINGTONES" on page 38).

When you finish entering event details, touch Save.

VOICE RECOGNITION

Use your voice—just touch and speak.

Of course if you don't want to type at all, then use your voice—touch $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Psi}$ on the touchscreen keypad.

TTY

You can use your phone in TTY mode with standard teletype machines. Touch Menu > System settings > Call settings > TTY mode and select the mode you need:

- TTY Full: Type and read text on your TTY device.
- TTY HCO: Hearing-Carry-Over—type text on your TTY device and listen to voice replies on your phone's speaker.

 TTY VCO: Voice-Carry-Over—speak into your phone and read text replies on your TTY device.

MEMORY CARD & FILE MANAGEMENT

Your photos, videos, and other files are automatically stored in your phone's internal memory. You can set individual applications (camera, camcorder, etc.) to store files on a microSD card. To install a microSD card, go to "ASSEMBLE & CHARGE" on page 3.

Tip: To move media from internal memory to a microSD card, touch Menu \equiv > **System settings** > **Storage** > **Manage internal storage**.

DELETE OR SHARE FILES ON YOUR PHONE

Find it: Apps ::: > = Files > Device storage or SD card
Touch a file or folder to open, then touch and hold a file
to Delete or Share.

REMOVE OR ERASE A MICROSD CARD

Note: Do not remove a microSD card while your phone is using it or writing files on it.

Before you remove or erase a microSD card you need to unmount it. Touch Menu = > System settings > Storage > Unmount SD card.

To erase a microSD card, touch Menu = > System settings > Storage > Erase SD card.

Warning: All data on the microSD card will be deleted.

IISB CONNECTION

You can connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable

Note: The first time you use a USB connection, your computer may indicate that drivers are being installed. Follow any prompts you see to complete the installation. This may take a few minutes.

Add an account by touching it. Enter your user name and password, then follow the prompts to set up the account

To edit an account, touch account name > Account settings.

To delete an account, touch account name > Menu = > Remove account



Note: You can't delete the Google™ account you used or created when you set up your phone.

SMARTACTIONS™

Wish your phone could automatically reply to texts when you're driving, silence your ringer during meetings, and conserve your battery when it runs low? It can. Smart actions can automate actions you take on vour phone.

Smart actions suggests actions to automate, based on how you use your phone. When you see a

suggestion \equiv in the status bar, flick the bar down to accept or delete it.

To open actions, touch Apps :::> > E SmartActions.

- To create an action, touch Custom.
- To turn an action off or on, open it and touch or or at the top.
- To stop smart actions suggestions, touch Menu = > Settings and uncheck Suggestion notifications.
- For help in SMARTACTIONS, touch Menu => Help.




DATA USAGE

You can track the amount of data uploaded and downloaded by your phone, and set a limit on your monthly data usage to avoid overage charges from your service provider.

Note: Usage information is provided to help you manage your phone. This may not match the amounts charged by your service provider, as they're not measured in the same way.

Find it: Menu = > System settings > Data usage



The data usage screen shows information and settings for data transferred over your service provider's mobile network.

Tip: You can also track Wi-Fi and ethernet data usage in separate tabs, by touching Menu (■) > **System settings** > **Data usage** > Menu (■) > **Show Wi-Fi usage**.

SET A DATA USAGE WARNING

Touch Menu (=) > System settings > Data usage, then drag the right side of the orange bar up/down to set the data warning level. You'll receive a notification when your data usage reaches the specified level.

SET A DATA USAGE LIMIT

Touch Menu > System settings > Data usage > Set mobile data limit, then drag the right side of the red bar up/down to set the data usage limit.

When you reach your data usage limit, mobile data is turned off automatically and many of your phone's features won't work correctly. You'll receive a notification when mobile data is turned off.

RESTRICT BACKGROUND DATA USAGE BY APP

Some apps transfer data in the background, when you're not using them. You can restrict background data usage for individual apps to help reduce your overall data usage.

Touch Menu (=) > System settings > Data usage, and scroll down to see which apps are transferring data over the mobile network. Touch an app, then touch **Restrict background data**.

RESTRICT ALL BACKGROUND DATA

You can restrict background data for all apps across all available networks (mobile or Wi-Fi).

Find it: $\underline{\text{Menu}} \equiv > \text{System settings} > \text{Data usage}$

> Menu \equiv > Restrict background data.

Caution: Restricting all background data can cause some features to stop working altogether.

WIRELESS MANAGER

Find it: Menu \equiv > System settings, then go to the

WIRELESS & NETWORKS section

Manage all your wireless connections: Wi-Fi, Bluetooth $^{\text{TM}}$, mobile data, airplane mode, and mobile hotspot.

AIRPLANE MODE

Use airplane mode to turn all your wireless connections off—useful when flying. Press and hold the Power key > Airplane mode.

Note: When you select airplane mode, all wireless services are disabled. You can then turn Wi-Fi and/or Bluetooth back on, if permitted by your airline. Other wireless voice and data services (such as calls and text messages) remain off in airplane mode. Emergency calls to your region's emergency number can still be made.

NETWORK

You should not need to change any network settings. Contact your service provider for help.



QUICK START: SECURITY

Find it: Menu > System settings > Security & Screen Lock



SCREEN LOCK

To prevent accidental touches, you can make the touchscreen lock when it goes to sleep. Touch Menu => System settings > Security & Screen lock > Screen lock, then select the lock type:

- None—turn off the screen lock.
- Slide—flick to the right to unlock.
- Face Unlock—look at your phone to unlock it.
- Pattern—draw a pattern to unlock.
- PIN—enter a numeric PIN to unlock.
- Password—enter a password to unlock.

Note: You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see "EMERGENCY CALLS" on page 17). A locked phone still rings, but you need to unlock it to answer.

FACE UNLOCK

Use face recognition software to unlock your phone.

Note: This feature is less secure than a pattern, PIN, or password.

To get started, touch Menu => System settings > Security > Security & Screen lock > Face Unlock > Set it up.

Follow the instructions and look toward the front camera lens. When face capture is complete, you'll be prompted

to choose a pattern or PIN as a backup security measure you can use when the phone can't see your face clearly. To unlock the phone, flick 🕜 to the right and look toward



the front camera lens.

To set the lock pattern, touch Menu > System settings > Security > Security & Screen lock > Pattern

Follow the instructions to draw your lock pattern.

When prompted, draw the pattern to unlock the phone.



PIN LOCK

To set a PIN, touch Menu

- $> {\bf System\ settings} > {\bf Security} > {\bf Security\ \&\ Screen\ lock}$
- > PIN.

Enter a numeric PIN, then confirm it.

When prompted, enter the PIN to unlock the phone.

PASSWORD LOCK

To set the password, touch Menu => System settings > Security > Security & Screen lock > Password.

Enter a password (up to eight characters), then confirm it.

When prompted, enter the password to unlock the phone.

PERSONALIZE YOUR LOCK SCREEN

To change your timeout, touch Menu = > System settings > Display > Sleep. If you don't touch the screen or press any keys for the amount of time you select, the screen locks automatically.

LOCK & UNLOCK

To lock your phone screen, do any one of these:

- Press the Power key.
- Let the screen time out (don't press anything).
- Switch off the power.

To unlock your phone screen, press the Power key to wake the touchscreen display, then perform the unlock procedure required by the lock screen (slide, face unlock, pattern, PIN, or password).

CAN'T UNLOCK YOUR PHONE?

Face unlock: If your phone doesn't recognize your face, you'll be prompted to enter your backup pattern or PIN code to unlock it.

Pattern, PIN, or password: If you forget your pattern, PIN, or password, contact your service provider.

RESET

To reset your phone to factory settings and erase all the data on your phone, touch Menu => System settings > Privacy > Factory data reset > Reset phone.

Warning: All data on your phone will be deleted. (Nothing on the microSD memory card is deleted.)

REMOTE WIPE A LOST OR STOLEN PHONE

Don't you just hate it when your life is on your phone and it all goes wrong? Lost, or even worse—stolen! If necessary, you can use your email account on a Microsoft™ Exchange ActiveSync 2007 server to clear the personal data from your phone and an installed microSD memory card.

You need to be assigned permissions before you can remote wipe data from your phone and microSD card. Contact your IT system administrator for the information and permissions you need to perform the remote wipe procedure.

Warning: All downloaded apps and user data on your phone and microSD card will be deleted.



Repetitive Motion

When you repetitively perform actions such as pressing keys or entering finger-written characters, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. If you continue to have discomfort during or after such use, stop use and see a physician.

Children

Keep your mobile device and its accessories away from small children. These products are not toys and may be hazardous to small children. For example:

- A choking hazard may exist for small, detachable parts.
- Improper use could result in loud sounds, possibly causing hearing injury.

 Improperly handled batteries could overheat and cause a burn.

Supervise access for older children. Similar to a computer, if an older child does use your mobile device, you may want to monitor their access to help prevent:

Glass Parts

Some parts of your mobile device may be made of glass. This glass could break if the product receives a substantial impact. If glass breaks, do not touch or attempt to remove. Stop using your mobile device until the glass is replaced by a qualified service center.

Operational Warnings

Obey all posted signs when using mobile devices in public areas.

Potentially Explosive Areas

Potentially explosive areas are often, but not always, posted and can include blasting areas, fueling stations, fueling areas (such as below decks on boats), fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, or areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain dust, or metal bowders.

Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Exposure to RF Energy

Your mobile device contains a transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your mobile device, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your mobile device transmits.

Your mobile device is designed to comply with local regulatory requirements in your country concerning exposure of human beings to RF energy.

RF Energy Operational Precautions

For optimal mobile device performance, and to be sure that human exposure to RF energy does not exceed the guidelines set forth in the relevant standards, always follow these instructions and precautions:

- When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your mobile device just like you would a landline phone.
- If you wear the mobile device on your body, ensure that the device is positioned at least 2.5 cm (1 inch) away from the body, and if you use an accessory case or holder, ensure it is free of any metal.

RF Energy Interference/Compatibility

Nearly every electronic device is subject to RF energy interference from external sources if inadequately shielded, designed, or otherwise configured for RF energy compatibility. In some circumstances, your mobile device may cause interference with other devices.

Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems

Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so, such as hospitals or health care facilities.

In an aircraft, turn off your mobile device whenever instructed to do so by airline staff. If your mobile device offers an airplane mode or similar feature, consult airline staff about using it in flight.

Medical Devices
