



The Shropshire Boots, Bikes and Boats Challenge Badge

This challenge is open to all members of Girlguiding from Rainbows to Trefoil Guild and we hope you enjoy the challenges on your Guiding journey.

There is a lovely badge to gain if you complete the required challenge for each section. As you move to another level of Guiding you can be challenged again to extend the fun and experiences available to you.

To gain a badge you must complete the following challenges.

Rainbows = 2 challenges from each section.

Brownies = 3 challenges from each section.

Guides = 4 challenges from each section.

Senior Section & Adults = 4 challenges from each section.

Badges can be obtained from the County Badge Secretary at a cost of £1...... a portion of which will go towards supporting the County Outdoor Centre at Lyneal

In the following sections you will find suggestions for challenges together with suggestions about which sections might find them suitable. You are free to adapt this for your own girls and to use your own challenge ideas.

Decorate your own wellie boots	All sections	Use permanent paint or pens
Make a lantern and take a candle walk outside your meeting place or turn off the light inside	All Sections	You might prefer to take a battery candle on a walk!
Beat the Bounds of your Parish	GSA	This means find out where the edges of the parish are and plan a walk using footpaths as close as possible to the edges
Take a seasonal walk with challenges and compare the seasons	All sections	Look for what changes. This can be in a park or a local area. Perhaps photograph the same place each season.
Follow a photographic trail	All sections	Someone will need to walk the route first and take photos, so that the girls can try to spot the sites. For older girls, take the pictures from strange angles.
Play a game to help learn the Countryside code	All sections	Google "The Countryside code" and set challenges.
Work out how many of your paces you will need to walk 100m	All sections	This is a skill useful for judging distances. If you are still growing, check it again next year.
Use a treadmill	GSA	Visit your local fitness centre and see if you can try one. There may be a minimum age limit.

CHALLENGE	SUITABLE FOR	HELP
Try canal art and decorate a coaster or trinket box	BGSA	
Make a model propeller boat	RBGSA	There are instructions in GFI With a Splash – currently out of print, so borrow from your local Guide Unit
Make a miniature raft and sail with a lighted tea light	RBGSA	You can use lolly sticks and rubber bands and sail it in a paddling pool, or go out and collect twigs, use lashings and sail in a stream
Go on one of these boats - Narrow boat - Sailing dinghy - Kayak - Canoe	RBGSA	
Make a raft for your patrol or six and sail on it	BGSA	An activity centre is the best options for all of these clauses. Try: www.pgl.co.uk

Try a scavenger hunt from a canoe or boat	BGSA	
Play pooh sticks	All sections	You may need to read Winnie the Pooh to younger girls, so they know all about Pooh sticks
Visit a maritime museum and/or a historic ship and/or a marina	All sections	For museums and ships you may need to plan a trip to London, Bristol or Plymouth. Locally, however, there are narrow boat marinas, particularly to the north of the County on the Shropshire Union Canal
Have a duck race and do some fundraising fun	All sections	You could just borrow or buy ducks (Toys r us) or you could use a company e.g. www.pdkfundraising.co.uk
Try a rowing boat	BGSA	There are boats to hire on Ellesmere, and in Ludlow (The Linney). You may know of others local to you
Go paddling in your wellies	All sections	You may want to sail a toy boat as well
Walk across an aqueduct	BGSA	There are famous ones - Pontcysyllte and Chirk Aqueducts (just out of Shropshire) and others on the Shropshire Union Canal
Do the Rospa water wise quiz	RBG	You can find it at www.rospa.com under water safety for children and young people






