
#### **GETTING STARTED**

#### PRODUCT BRIEFING

The MP-300 series printer is a mobile thermal printer particularly designed to cope with the operation of a Posiflex mobile terminal MT-2000 series. It uses thermal sensitive paper in form of a roll at a width of 58 mm. It communicates with the host MT-2000 system through BlueTooth technology. An option carry bag and an option battery charge power adaptor are available for use with this printer.

#### UNPACKING

Followings are items you may find when you carefully unpack the carton that delivers the mobile printer. If there is any discrepancy or problem, contact your dealer immediately. Be sure to save the packing materials in case the printer needs to be shipped at some point in the future.

- 1). The printer itself
- 2). Thermal paper test roll 58 mm wide
- 3). One piece of spacer plate
- 4). Leather carry bag
- 5). This User's Manual



## **QUICK START-UP**

#### THE PAPER

#### **Load Paper Roll**




- 1. Open the dark transparent cover of the printer at the lift recesses on both sides and pull the cover up to open.
- 2. Drop the thermal paper roll into its compartment in the orientation as shown in **Pix. 1**.
- 3. Pull the leading end of paper roll to come out from the exit when closing the cover back as in **Pix. 2**.
- 4. Tear off excessive paper by pulling the leading end of paper to the front of the printer.

## **Adjust Spacer Plate**

The standard thermal paper roll for this printer is of width 58 mm. When the width of the actual paper roll used is narrower, the location of spacer plate can be adjusted to cope with the situation when the software application program also adapts to the selected paper width.

- 1. Pull up the spacer plate from the paper roll compartment.
- 2. Notice that there are 3 umbones on the spacer plate and there are 3 rows

of indentations in the paper roll compartment. Match the umbones of spacer plate to appropriate set of indentations as in **Pix. 3** and push down the spacer plate to click in.

#### THE BATTERY

#### Remove / Install Battery

Please power off the printer before removing the battery. Please refer to the bottom picture of the printer in the previous pages. Pull down the battery lock to remove the battery. The screw on battery has nothing to do with this operation. The battery used to power the mobile printer is identical to the one for its host system – mobile terminal MT-2000 series and the screw on battery is used for application in MT-2000 series only.

To install the battery, you have to insert the other end of the battery first then push the battery till it clicks in the battery lock. The printer is then ready for operation in option carry bag or any other appropriate carrier.

#### **Battery Charge by Power Adaptor**

Please refer to the right side picture of the printer in the previous pages. Use the small charger (DC 12V 15W) delivered with the MT-2000 series or purchase an additional option one (P/N: 21972012120 for US market). Check the information on the option power adaptor that if it matches the domestic power supply specifications. Connect the power adaptor to a power outlet and connect its output to the battery charge connector on MP-300. Please note that prior to this charging operation the printer should be powered off and please **do not operate the printer during charging!** 

#### **Battery Charge by Dock Station**

Since the battery used for MP-300 is identical to the one for MT-2000 series, it is most convenient to use the option dock station (cradle, DS-100) with its large power adaptor for MT-2000 series to charge the battery if this option is purchased.

## When to Replace / Recharge Battery

- 1. For a new battery, it must be completely recharged before first use. It is delivered with little reserved power for better battery life.
- 2. When the voltage measurement in self-test (described later in APPLICATION GUIDE) reports to be near 7.2 V or lower.
- 3. When the printer gives occasional beep and "ERROR" indication.


#### THE CARRY BAG

Please refer to these pictures for lettered items noted by parentheses in descriptions below.

Insert the mobile printer into the leather carry bag so that the buttons & indicators of the printer appear in the transparent window of the


bag (g). When the printer goes fully in, press the printer against the bag so that the Velcro loop patch on printer bottom (a) fastens with

Velcro hook patch inside the bag (c). Fold the cover of bag over the paper roll end of the printer and fasten the Velcro loop patches in the flaps (b) to the Velcro hook patches on both sides of the bag (d). Make sure the paper to come out of the bag from the opening (h) without any obstruction. Adjust length of shoulder strap (e) to carry the printer over shoulder or release the shoulder strap from the bag by releasing the shoulder strap locking hooks (f) and use belt straps (i) to carry the printer on a belt.

#### **SELF TEST**



#### **PAIRING WITH MT-2000 SERIES**

A "Pairing" between a mobile printer MP-300 and a mobile terminal MT-2000 series has to be established before the MP-300 can start service for the specific terminal. The MP-300 supports the "Pairing mode" in the first 40 seconds from being powered up. In the "Pairing mode", the MP-300 can respond to the BlueTooth Scan command from MT-2000 series. The MP-300 responds only to the WakeUp command or normal operation commands from an already paired MT-2000 series mobile terminal after this period. An established "Pairing" relationship remains effective even after MP-300 power recycle (turn off and then turn on again) and termination and re-engagement of application program in MT-2000 series. In other words, MT-2000 series needs only to "WakeUp" the relationship instead of re-doing the "Scan" in such circumstances. However, for a MP-300 to serve for another new MT-2000 series, the new "Pairing" relationship must be established with the new terminal. In other words, the MP-300 must be set in "Pairing mode" again and do "Scan" from the new MT-2000 series

#### POWER SAVING CONCERNS

The mobile printer is built-in with power saving features to provide the user the longest possible service session for each battery change. Therefore, the printer will automatically turn itself out when it has been idle for quite a while (say, about half an hour) to preserve battery power. To put the printer back to original application of the MT-2000 series, please press the power button of the printer to resume power ON status of the printer and perform a "Wake up" operation on MT-2000 series to resume the original BlueTooth communication before the automatic power off.

#### **TEST APPLICATION IN MT-2000 SERIES**

The operation details rely on the application program loaded in the host MT-2000 series. However, there is a test application program in MT-2000 series if not removed by system integrator. Please refer to the user's manual of MT-2000 series for details of the test program.

#### **TECHNICAL ISSUES**

#### SERVICE PORT

Please note that this service port is designed for service operation only and is **not for end users**. A conversion cable (P/N: 21863157600) is required to connect this port to a RS-232 port to communicate with the host under protocol 9600 bps, none parity check, 8 data bits, 1 stop bit for that purpose. **Improper use of this port may jeopardize the printer!** 

#### **DIP SWITCHES**

A set of DIP switches can be found at bottom of MP-300 when the battery is removed as in below picture. Please note that these DIP switches are mainly designed for service operation only and is **not for end users**. For normal operation of MP-300, all switches must be set to "OFF". **Improper** 

settings of these switches may jeopardize the printer!



The only adjustable switch for the user could be the switch position 1. When this switch is set to "OFF", the printer prints under normal printing mode. When this switch is set to "ON", the printer prints under high power printing mode with following cautions. The high power printing mode helps darken the **low duty ratio graphs/logos**. However, if the high power printing mode is applied on a high duty ration graph/logo, the battery life will be greatly reduced.

## **BAR CODE PRINTING**

For adequate readability of printed bar code, it is advisable to set the bar code width to 3 (default value) or above.

For ladder type bar code printing, the bar code height is limited to 54 dots.

## **BATTERY POWER**

The length of each service session of a fully recharged battery depends greatly on printer power loading and battery condition. For reference, an average brand new fully charged battery has been tested to support continuous printing under BlueTooth interface for about 7 and half hours with printed paper roll length of 420 meters.
