



# **VMobile para iPad, iPhone y iPod Touch**

## **Manual del usuario (Versión: 1.0.1)**

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## Capítulo 1. Información general

VSMobile es una aplicación de supervisión de vídeo móvil suministrada por QNAP para monitorización remota e inalámbrica de cámaras IP y reproducción de vídeo al conectar el NVR VioStor a través del iPad, iPhone o iPod Touch. Si tiene acceso a la red, se puede conectar y administrar el sistema de supervisión de vídeo en cualquier momento, desde cualquier parte.

<p><b>Nota:</b> VMobile es aplicable al NVR VioStor de QNAP con el firmware versión 3.3.0 o posterior.</p>
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## Capítulo 2. Instalación de VMobile

Para instalar la aplicación VMobile, siga estos pasos:

1. Descargue VMobile desde la tienda de aplicaciones.
2. Después de la instalación, VMobile aparecerá en la pantalla.



## Capítulo 3. Empiece a usar VMobile

Después de instalar VMobile y conectar su iPad, iPhone, o iPod Touch a la red, podrá usar las aplicaciones para conectar el NVR VioStor.

### 3.1 Conexión al NVR VioStor

Siga los pasos expuestos más adelante para usar VMobile en el iPad, iPhone o iPod Touch. Tenga en cuenta que debe tener acceso a Internet en el dispositivo.


1. Abra VMobile en el dispositivo.



2. Introduzca la dirección IP o el nombre del dominio del NVR. Introduzca el número del puerto correcto, nombre de usuario para iniciar sesión y la contraseña.

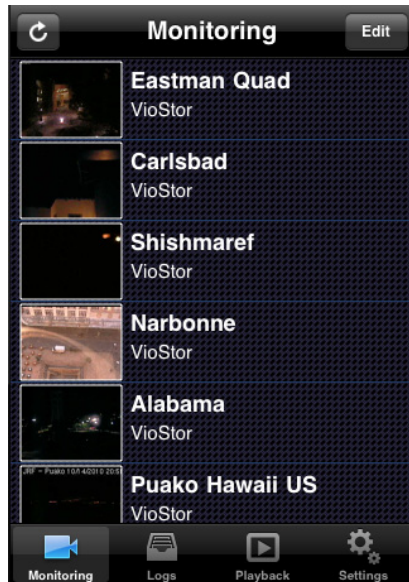

\* Si se está conectando a VS-201/VS-101/NVR-104, el nombre de usuario predeterminado es "administrator" y la contraseña es "admin".









## 3.2 Monitorización

Después de iniciar sesión exitosamente, se mostrará la pantalla de monitorización.

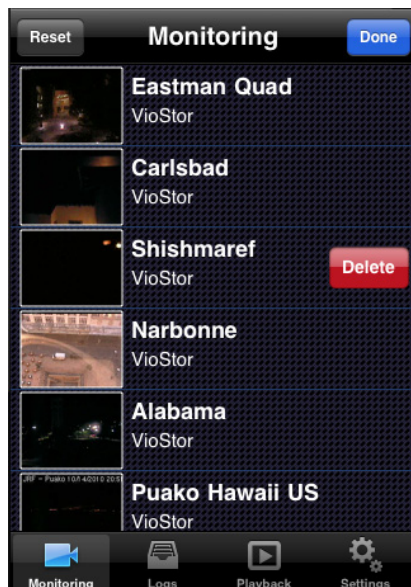



Los botones de la pantalla se describen a continuación:

	Edita los canales de la cámara
	Para entrar a la pantalla de monitorización en vivo
	Para entrar a la pantalla de registros
	Para entrar a la pantalla de reproducción
	Para entrar a la pantalla de configuración

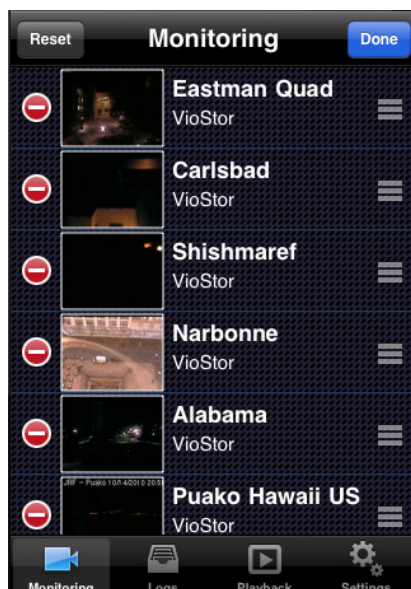


Para eliminar un canal, deslice sobre un canal y presione "Eliminar".



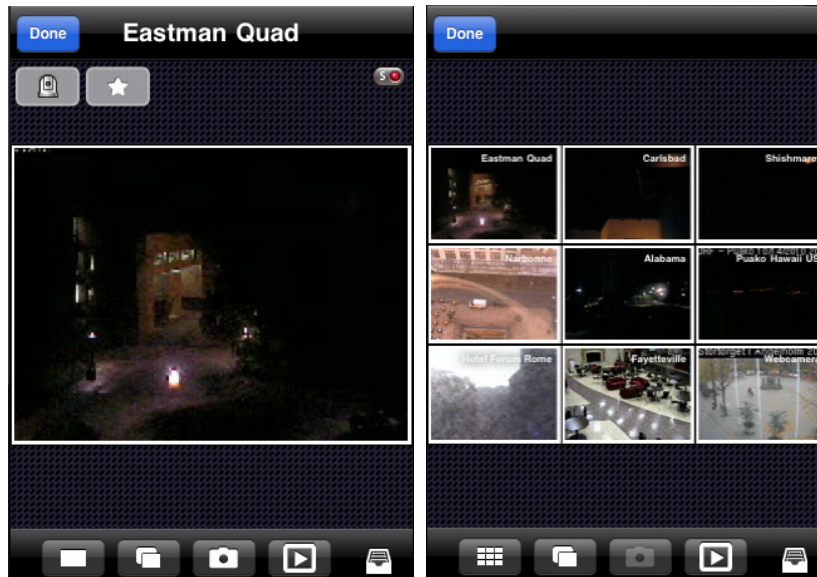
Presione el botón "Editar" para editar un canal. Presione  para eliminarlo o

presione  para arrastrar y soltar el canal para volverlo a ordenar. Presione "Listo" para guardar la configuración. Para restablecer el orden de monitorización, presione "Restablecer".



### 3.2.1 Vista en vivo

Si ha configurado el NVR VioStor y las cámaras de red por medio de la interfaz de administración basada en la web o por la pantalla local, puede monitorizar los canales de la cámara desde el NVR a través de VMobile.




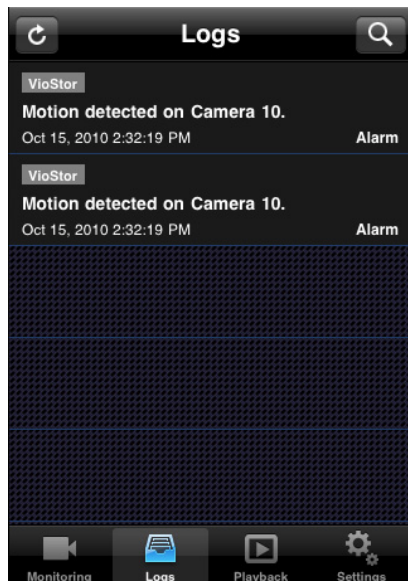
Los botones de la pantalla se describen a continuación:

Botón	Descripción
	Cambiar el modo de visualización. Las opciones son 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8 y 9 canales.
	Modo de visualización secuencial.
	Instantánea. Solamente disponible en pantallas de un solo canal.
	Para entrar a la página de reproducción.
	Para entrar a la página de registros de eventos.

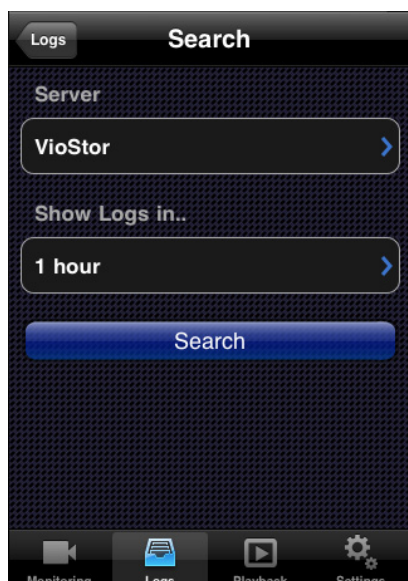
### 3.2.2 Notificación de eventos

Cuando la grabación de alarmas está activa y se presenta un evento, aparecerá un

icono  que muestra el número de eventos nuevos en la última hora (forma predeterminada). Presione este icono para ingresar a la pantalla de registros.



Presione un evento para reproducir la grabación de la alarma. Puede presionar “Buscar” para buscar los registros por el servidor e intervalo de tiempo.









### 3.2.3 Control PTZ

Si su cámara de red admite las funciones de vista panorámica, inclinación y zoom (PTZ), puede usar la función PTZ con la monitorización de un solo canal.

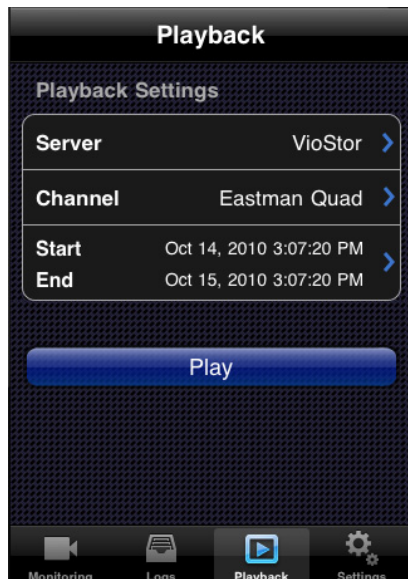


Los botones de la pantalla se describen a continuación:

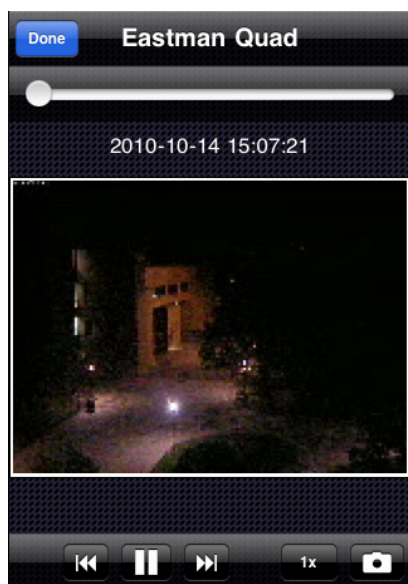
Botones	Descripción
	Presione este icono para deshabilitar el control PTZ de la cámara de red. Cuando se habilita el control PTZ, aparecerán otros botones para que pueda controlar la cámara PTZ.
Flechas de dirección	Presione las flechas de dirección de la pantalla para ajustar el ángulo de visualización de la cámara.
	Presione + para zoom para acercar o el signo – para zoom para alejar.
	Presione  para enfocar de cerca o  para enfocar de lejos.
	Presione este icono y seleccione para mover la cámara PTZ a un punto de visualización predefinido. Esta función solamente se puede usar si ha configurado los puntos predefinidos de la cámara.

### 3.3 Reproducir






Puede ingresar a la pantalla de reproducción para buscar y reproducir grabaciones de vídeo de un NVR.



Seleccione el servidor NVR, canal, hora de inicio y de finalización para las grabaciones de vídeo del NVR. Luego empiece a reproducir los vídeos que aparezcan.

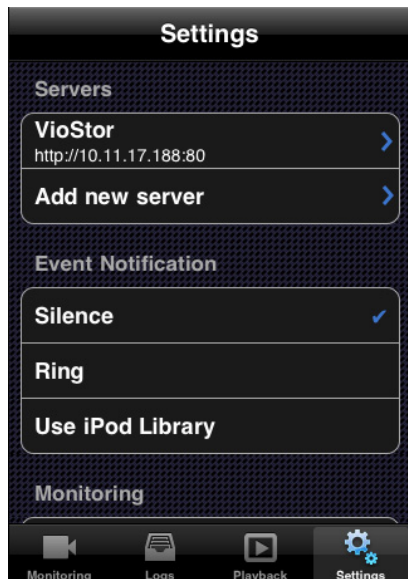

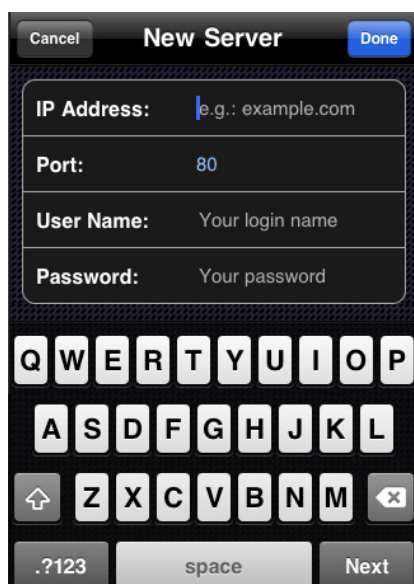
<b>Botón</b>	<b>Descripción</b>

	Ajusta la velocidad de reproducción
	Toma una instantánea

### 3.4 Configuración

Puede administrar y configurar los servidores NVR, notificaciones de eventos y configuración de monitorización en la pantalla "Configuración".

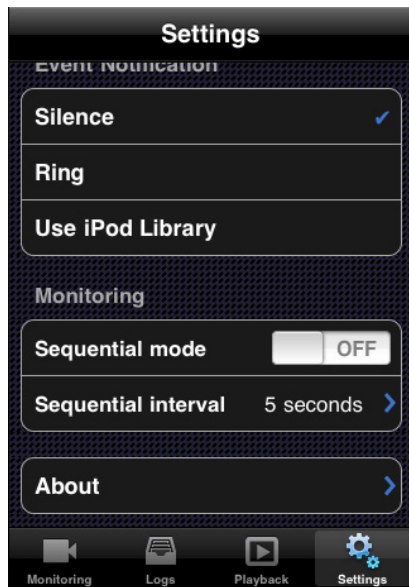


Presione "Agregar nuevo servidor" para conectarse al NVR VioStor para monitorizar y reproducir.





En "Notificación de eventos", seleccione el tipo de alarma (silencio o timbre) para los eventos que se presenten en el NVR. También puede habilitar/deshabilitar el modo de visualización secuencial y especificar el intervalo de visualización de las cámaras de red en "Monitorización".
