## OPERATION OF REMOTE CONTROL

### DESCRIPTION OF REMOTE CONTROL KEYS



#### BATTERY INSTALLATION OF REMOTE CONTROL UNIT

- 1.Remove the battery compartment cover. 2.Insert the two "AAA" (pencil size)1.5V
- Insert the two "AAA" (pencil size)1.5V batteries. Make sure the polarity(+or-) of the batteries matches the polarity marks inside the unit.

3.Close the battery compartment door. Note:

Replace with new batteries when the TV set begins to show the following symptoms. Operation is unsteady or the TV set does not function properly with the remote control unit.

#### 1. POWER(STAND-BY) BUTTON

Firstly, the power supply of the unit must be switched on, When it is in standby status, press standby button, after several seconds, the unit is on. Press the button once again to turn the unit off (standby status).

Also the unit can be switch on by pressing 'P+/P-' button on the TV set when it is in standby status. The unit has the function of no signal muting and no signal auto switching off. If there is no signal for 15 minutes, it can be turned to standby status automatically.

### 2. SCREEN DISPLAY BUTTON

Press the DISP button to display the current information of the TV.i.e. Channel, Picture Mode, Sound Mode(optional), Clock.

### **3. CHANNEL BUTTON**

1) When the channel number has one figure, press  $0^{2}$  button directly.

Intermittent poor contrast and colour fading on all channels	Check aerial positioning	
Some channels have poor reception and colour fading	Readjusting fine tuning with great care (refer to section on: 'FINE TUNE').	
Dotted lines or stripes appear on screen	There may be Interference from another electrical product. Move appliance if it persists.	
Snow on screen	Check aerial for broken circuit, loose connection or any visible damage.	
Double images or 'ghosting'	Check aerial location and direction - strong winds may cause it to move. Also check whether mountains or tall buildings may be the problem. Minor adjustment of the direction of your antenna should keep the ghosting to a minimum.
