



VS-211H Quick Start Guide

Step 1: Check what's in the box








Save the original box and packaging in case your VS-211H needs to be returned to the factory for service.

Step 2: Install the VS-211H

Attach the rubber feet and place on a table or mount the machine in a rack (using an optional RK-3T rack mount).

Step 3: Connect the inputs and outputs

Always switch off the power on each device before connecting it to your VS-211H.



Always use Kramer high-performance cables for connecting AV equipment to the VS-211H.

Step 4: Connect the power

Connect the 5V DC power adapter to the VS-211H and plug the adapter into the mains electricity.



Step 5: Operate the VS-211H

Set the default input using the DEFAULT IN switch. Control via the REMOTE terminal block:

To activate INPUT 1, attach PIN IN 1 to PIN G



To activate INPUT 2, attach PIN IN 2 to PIN G

2.1 Achieving the Best Performance

To achieve the best performance:

- Use only good quality connection cables (we recommend Kramer highperformance, high-resolution cables) to avoid interference, deterioration in signal quality due to poor matching, and elevated noise levels (often associated with low quality cables)
- Do not secure the cables in tight bundles or roll the slack into tight coils
- Avoid interference from neighboring electrical appliances that may adversely influence signal quality
- Position your Kramer VS-211H away from moisture, excessive sunlight and dust



This equipment is to be used only inside a building. It may only be connected to other equipment that is installed inside a building.

3 Overview


The **VS-211H** is a high-performance automatic standby switcher for HDMI video signals. The **VS-211H** automatically switches to the secondary input whenever the primary video signal is interrupted. If the primary signal reappears, the unit automatically switches back to the primary input.

In addition, the VS-211H features:

- A maximum data rate of up to 2.25Gbps
- HDTV compatibility
- HDCP and HDMI compliance
- 3D pass through
- EDID PassThru that passes EDID signals from source to display
- A DEFAULT INPUT switch for selecting the default HDMI master source signal
- Contact closure remote control for forced operation
- Active switching

3.1 Defining the VS-211H Automatic HDMI Standby Switcher

This section defines the VS-211H.






Figure 1: VS-211H Automatic HDMI Standby Switcher

#	Feature	Function
1	ACTIVE INPUT 1,2 LEDs	Illuminate when input is active
2	ONLED	Illuminates when receiving power
3	OUT HDMI Connector	Connects to the HDMI output acceptor
4	IN 1 HDMI Connector	Connects to the HDMI input source 1
5	IN 2 HDMI Connector	Connects to the HDMI input source 2
6	DEFAULT INPUT Switch	Switches to select the default input (IN 1 or IN 2)
7	REMOTE IN 1 and IN 2 Terminal Block Connectors	Connect to a contact closure switch
8	5V DC	+5V DC connector for powering the unit

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4 Using the VS-211H

This section describes how to:

- Connect the VS-211H (see Section 4.1)
- Select the default master source signal (see <u>Section 4.2</u>)
- Connect the REMOTE connector (see Section 4.3)

4.1 Connecting the VS-211H



Always switch off the power to each device before connecting it to your **VS-211H**. After connecting your **VS-211H**, connect its power and then switch on the power to each device.




Figure 2: VS-211H Connections

To connect the VS-211H, as illustrated in the example in Figure 2, do the following:

- Connect the IN 1 HDMI connector to the HDMI input source 1 (for example, DVD player 1).
- Connect HDMI input source 2 (for example, DVD player 2) to the IN 2 HDMI connector.
- Connect HDMI acceptor (for example, an LCD display) to the OUT HDMI connector.
- 4. Set the DEFAULT INPUT switch to whichever input is the master input, as described in Section 4.2.
- If needed, connect the remote switches to the REMOTE IN 1 and IN 2 terminal block connectors, as described in <u>Section 4.3</u>.
- 6. Connect the 5V DC power adapter to the power socket and connect the adapter to the mains electricity.

4.2 Selecting the Default Master Source Signal

When active input sources are connected to IN 1 and IN 2, the DEFAULT INPUT switch setting determines the default master input source.

If the master input signal is not detected, the **VS-211H** automatically activates the standby input:

- If IN 1 is the default input and it fails, IN 2 activates
- If IN 2 is the default input and it fails, IN 1 activates

If the master input reactivates while the standby input is active, the unit automatically switches back to the master input:

- If IN 2 is active while IN 1 is the default input, when IN 1 reactivates, it is switched to the output
- If IN 1 is active while IN 2 is the default input, when IN 2 reactivates, it is switched to the output

4.3 Connecting the REMOTE Terminal Block Connector

Regardless of the default input switch setting, you can force the switching of the active input by remote control. To do this, connect the appropriate REMOTE input terminal block connector pins to a contact closure switch (see Figure 3).

Note that the connection should be permanent, since the VS-211H reverts to an automatic switcher when the connection is removed.

- To force IN 1: connect REMOTE IN1 to PIN G (ground)
- To force IN 2: connect REMOTE IN2 to PIN G (ground)



Do not connect both the REMOTE IN1 and the REMOTE IN2 to PIN G simultaneously

Attach PIN IN1 to PIN G to activate INPUT 1

Attach PIN IN2 to PIN G to activate INPUT 2

Note: The contact closure setting remains in effect until an event occurs such as changing the default input switch or connecting or attaching an HDMI device.
