

battery

Note: For battery use and battery safety information, see your *User's Guide*.

install the battery

While pressing down on the battery cover, slide it toward the top of the phone, then lift it from the phone.



With the gold contacts facing down and toward the lower end of the battery, insert the battery, lower end first.



Fit the battery cover back onto the phone and slide it forward into place.




charge the battery

New batteries are not fully charged. Before you can use your phone, install and charge the battery. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

Using the charger:

- Insert the charger into your phone's micro USB connector. Plug the other end of the charger into an electrical outlet.
- When you see Charge Complete, unplug the charger.





Charging from your computer:

Note: Optional accessories required. You can charge the battery by connecting a cable from your phone's micro USB port to a high-power USB connector on a computer (not a low-power one, such as the USB connector on your keyboard or bus-powered USB hub). Typically, USB high-power connectors are located directly on your computer.

Both your phone and your computer must be turned on, and you must have correct software drivers installed on your computer. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original[™] data kits, sold separately.

memory card

Note: Optional accessory required.

install & remove memory card

- Remove the battery door from your phone (see page 7). If necessary, remove the battery.
- With the gold contacts down, place the memory card into the card opening, then slide the card into the slot.



3 Replace the battery and battery door.

Caution: Don't remove your memory card while your phone is using it or writing files to it.

To remove the memory card, press down on the plastic tab at the end of the memory card, then slide the memory card out of the slot.



format memory card

Caution: Formatting the memory card erases any data stored on the card

Find it: Main Menu > Settings > Storage Device

- **1** Select **Memory Card** and press **■**.
- 2 Select Format Memory Card and press =.

turn it on & off

To turn on your phone, press and hold the power key in for a few seconds, or until the display turns on. If prompted, enter your four-digit unlock code




To turn off your phone, press and hold 1.

make & answer calls

To make a call, enter a phone number and press the send key $\hat{\parallel}$.

To answer a call, when your phone rings and/or vibrates, just press **()**.

To hang up, press [].



using menus

Press the *left soft key* to open the

Main Menu.



Press the navigation key up, down, right, or left, to highlight a menu option.





store a phone number

To store a phone number in Contacts:

- 1 Enter a phone number in the home screen.
- 2 Press Save.
- **③** With Create New Contact highlighted, press ■.
- Select the number type (Mobile 1, Mobile 2, Home, Work, or Fax) and press = .
- 6 Press Save to store the entry.

call a stored number

- From the home screen, scroll to Contacts and press =.
- 2 Scroll to Contact List and press =.
- 3 Scroll to the entry you want to call.

Shortcut: In your **Contact List**, use the keypad to enter the first letters of an entry you want.

4 Press | to call the entry.

view your phone number

Find it: Main Menu > Settings > Phone Info > My Number


You can also view your number by pressing [MX], then [#].

Tip: Want to see your phone number while you're on a call? Press Options > Phone Info > My Number.

home screen shortcuts

You see the *home* screen when your phone is powered on and idle.

The icons on this screen give you a quick and easy way to stay in touch or enjoy your phone's multimedia features.



Note: This is the standard home screen layout. Your phone's home screen may show different shortcuts.

You can change the shortcut icons on the home screen. See your *User's Guide* for more information.

To select a home screen shortcut:

- Press the *navigation key* up, down, right, or left, to highlight a feature.
- 2 Press the center key = to select the feature:

contacts

From the home screen, scroll to **()** Contacts and press =.

For more information on using **Contacts**, see page 14 in this guide, and see your *User's Guide*.

messaging

From the home screen, scroll to \bigcirc Messaging and press \blacksquare .

Select Messaging to send and receive text and multimedia messages, participate in Conversations and select many other messaging options. For more information, see your User's Guide

email

Note: Network/subscription feature.

To check your personal email account (such as Gmail or AOL):

- From the home screen, scroll to mail and press =.
- 2 Scroll to and select an email account.

See your User's Guide for more information about email.

browser

Note: Network/subscription feature. Use your phone's browser to surf your favorite Web sites, upload videos to a video blog, and download files and applications to your phone. Log onto your internet-based email account to check your email.

To access the browser, from the home screen, scroll to Browser and press =.

To use the browser, you must configure it with the appropriate settings for Internet access, and you need to have data service activated for your account with your service provider (additional fees may apply for this service)

Note: Not all service provider settings may be available yet through this Web site.

multimedia

Multimedia gives you quick access to a variety of multimedia fun. You can enjoy your favorite tunes on the music player; take, view, and share photos and video clips; and record and play sounds.

For more information on using the music player, see page 25 in this guide. For information on other multimedia options, see your *User's Guide*.

Brew

Note: Network/subscription feature. You can access a variety of Brew applications and purchase additional ones online.

From the home screen, scroll to Brew and press =.

ringtones

To set ringtones for incoming calls and for other events (such as new messages):

Set Master Volume to High, Med High, Medium, Low Med, Low, or 1 Beep. Then select and assign ringtones.

set master volume

From the home screen, press the volume keys up or down to select a **Master Volume** setting:



High, Med High, Medium, Low Med,

Low—Phone rings for incoming calls and other events, depending on the detail settings.

1 Beep—Phone beeps once to indicate an incoming call.

Vibrate Only-Phone vibrates to indicate an incoming call.

Alarm Only—Phone plays an audible alarm to alert you to events. You can't change detail settings for events.

All sounds off—Phone does not alert you to incoming calls and events.

set ringtones

To set ringtones for calls:

Find it: Main Menu > Settings > Sounds > Call Ringtone

- Press = to acknowledge the Shuffle Multiple message.
- Select Single Tone to assign a single ringtone to incoming calls, then scroll to the ringtone you want and press =.

Note: Your phone plays each ringtone you highlight.

Select Shuffle Multiple to select downloaded ringtones to play randomly for incoming calls. Scroll to each downloaded ringtone you want and press . When you finish selecting ringtones, press Done.

Note: Contacts entries with assigned Ringer IDs will not be affected. Shuffle Multiple works only with downloaded ringtones and depletes your battery's charge more quickly than Single Tone.

3 Press [] to return to the home screen.

To set ringtones for incoming text, multimedia, or voicemail messages:

Find it: Main Menu > Settings > Sounds

- Select Message Ringtone or Voicemail Ringtone.

Note: Your phone plays each ringtone you highlight.

3 Press [] to return to the home screen.

buy ringtones

Find it: Main Menu > Settings > Sounds

- Select Call Ringtone and then Single Tone, or select Message Ringtone or Voicemail Ringtone.
- 2 Select Buy Ringtone.

Your phone connects to the ringtone collections Web site. Follow the prompts to browse ringtone lists and to buy and download a ringtone.

Note: Normal airtime and/or carrier usage charges apply.

wallpaper

Set a photo, picture, or animation as a wallpaper (background) image in your home screen.

Find it: Main Menu > ***** Settings > Display > Wallpaper

- To assign a single picture as a wallpaper, select Single and press , then scroll to the desired picture and press .

To select downloaded or captured pictures to be shown randomly as wallpapers, select **Shuffle Multiple** and press . Then scroll to each downloaded or captured picture you want and press . When you finish selecting pictures, press **Done**.

3 Press [] to return to the home screen.

get music

Note: You'll need an optional microSD memory card installed in your phone to use the music player.

Just load your favorite music onto your computer. Then, transfer the music from the computer to your phone. You'll need:

- the Windows XP™ operating system
- Windows Media Player, version 11 or later
 To download Windows Media Player, go to http://www.microsoft.com/windowsmedia
- a USB data cable (sold separately)

load music onto your computer

You can **purchase Microsoft® Windows® Media DRM-protected music files** from supported on-line music stores (such as Urge and Napster).

You can also **load song files from a music CD** onto your computer:

- 1 Insert the music CD in your computer's CD drive.
- 2 Launch Windows Media Player 11.
- **3** Copy the music CD to the media player library (also called *ripping* the CD).

If your computer is connected to the Internet, the media player may retrieve information such as song titles, album name, artist name, and album artwork. This information will display in your phone's music player after you transfer the music to your phone.

transfer music

Before you copy files to your phone, make sure the files are in a format that the phone recognizes. Your phone's music player can play the following types of audio files: AAC, AAC+, MP3, WAV, WMA, Real Audio G2/8/10.

Before you transfer music to your phone:

- Insert a memory card into your phone (see page 10).
- Set your phone to Mass Storage mode by pressing Main Menu > Storage Settings > USB > Mass Storage.
- Attach a Motorola Original USB cable to the micro USB port on your phone and to an available USB port on your computer. A Motorola Original USB cable and supporting software may be included with your phone. These tools are also sold separately.

transfer with Windows Media Player

You can Windows Media Player 11 to transfer music from the computer to your phone.

Note: Windows Media Player 11 requires Windows XP™ or later to run. If you are using an earlier version of Windows OS, you'll need to manually transfer music to your phone.

- Run Windows Media Player 11.
 - Your phone appears in the upper right corner of the Windows Media Player 11 screen. Music files stored on the phone's memory card are listed on the left side of the screen.
- 2 Select the "Sync" tab in Windows Media Player 11.
- Orag and drop songs or playlists onto the "Sync List" on the right side of the Windows Media Player 11 screen.
- Click "Start Sync" to copy the songs onto the phone's memory card.
- When you finish, disconnect your phone from the computer.

transfer manually

- On your computer, double-click on the "My Computer" icon to locate the "Removable Disk" icons for your phone and memory card.
- 2 Double-click the "Removable Disk" icon for your phone or memory card.
- In the "Removable Disk" window, create the "my_music" folder (if one does not already exist).

Note: The music player checks for songs only in this folder.

- Orag and drop the music files you want onto the "my_music" folder.
- When you finish, right-click the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon in the system tray at the bottom of your computer screen, then select "USB Mass Storage Device." Disconnect the USB cable.

transfer music from a V9m or Z6m phone

Note: Optional accessories required. You can remove a microSD memory card from a MOTORAZR™ V9m or a MOTOROKR™ Z6m mobile phone and install it in your Motorola hint™ QA30 phone. Before you can play any music files that are already stored on the memory card, you'll need to move them to a different folder on the card:

- Remove the memory card from the MOTORAZR V9m or MOTOROKR Z6m (see the instructions for the phone).
- 2 Insert the memory card into your Motorola **hint** QA30 phone (see page 10), then turn on the phone.
- Scroll to Mass Storage and press ••.

Attach a USB cable (sold separately) to the micro USB port on your phone and to an available USB port on your computer.

You may see a message that files on the memory card are not available.


- On your computer, click on the "My Computer" icon to locate the "Removable Disk" icon for your memory card, then double-click the "Removable Disk" icon for your memory card.
- O Double-click the "music" folder.
- Orag and drop the music files from the "music" folder to the "my_music" folder.
- When you finish, right-click the "Safely Remove Hardware" icon in the system tray at the bottom of your computer screen, then select "USB Mass Storage Device." Disconnect the USB cable.

You can now select and play the music files with your phone's music player (see the following sections).

play music

To activate your phone's music player, press the music player key .

Your phone shows the Music Player menu:



To scroll through a menu or list, press pup or down.


To select a highlighted option, press ==.

The Music Player menu includes:

option	
All Songs	Select and play a song.
	Note: All songs are listed here. Some songs do not have Artist , Album , or Genre information.
Playlists	Create or play a playlist.
Artists	Play music by an artist.
Albums	Play music from an album.
Genres	Play music by genre (type of music) such as rock or jazz.

Note: If you can't find artist, album, or genre information for a song in **Artists**, **Albums**, or **Genres**, the information may not be available. All songs, with or without this information, are listed in **All Songs**.

While a song is playing on the music player, your phone's screen will look similar to the following:



During a song, the music player shows the song title, artist, album, and artwork, if available.

Note: If you receive a call during a song, the music player pauses the song until the call is over.

Use these keys to control music playback:

controls with slider open		
pause/play	Press ■.	
fast forward	Press & hold 🔲 right.	
next song	Press 🗀 right.	
rewind	Press & hold 🔲 left.	
previous song	Press 🔲 left.	
turn off music player	Press the power key [].	

playlists

Personalize your music collection by creating your own playlists.

When you name a playlist:

- The name must be fewer than 32 characters.
- The name cannot include these characters: /\: *? <> | "!

Note: Your music player includes a special playlist named ringtones. You can't rename this playlist. Songs added to this playlist are not visible in other categories (for example, Genres) in the music player. The ringtones playlist initially contains ringtones that are preloaded on your phone. You can still edit this playlist, just like any other playlist, to add or remove new ringtones that you purchase.

create a playlist

- Press the music player key ...
- 2 Press Options and select Create Playlist.
- 3 Enter a name for the playlist and press Done.
- - Repeat this step to add more songs.
- **5** Press when you finish adding songs.

add song to playlist

- Press the music player key
 In the second second
- Scroll to Playlists and press = .
- 3 Scroll to the playlist and press Options.
- Scroll to Add a Song and press ■.
- Scroll to the song you want to add and press =.

Tip: Add a song to a playlist while the song is playing.

Just press Settings and select Add to Playlist.

remove song from playlist

- Press the music player key •.
- 2 Scroll to Playlists and press =.
- Scroll to the song you want to remove and press =.

delete a playlist

- Press the music player key ...
- Scroll to Playlists and press = .
- **3** Scroll to the playlist and press **Options**.
- Scroll to Delete Playlist and press =, then scroll to Yes and press =.

wake up music player

While the music player is active, your phone may conserve battery power by turning off the display and keypad backlights.

To turn display and backlights back on, press any key.

settings

From the home screen, press the music player key $\ensuremath{\mbox{\ensuremath{\mbox{o}}}}$, then select Settings.

While a song is playing, press Settings.

options	
Audio Effects	Customize music playback by selecting Club, Full Bass, or Dance. Select None to use the player's default playback settings.
Visual Effects	Select custom visual effects for the music playback screen.

options	
Repeat	Replay a song (when you select a single song for play—does not replay a playlist or album).
Shuffle	Play songs in random order.
Add to Playlist	Add the song that is currently playing to a playlist.
	Note: This option is available only while a song is playing.
Background Play	Continue music playback while returning to home screen to complete other activities.
	Note: This option is available only while a song is playing.
Help	See help information for the music player.
	Note: This option does not appear while a song is playing.

music player tips

- If you are navigating music player menus while a song is playing and don't press a key for more than five seconds, the player returns to the current song list screen.
- Note: Optional accessory required. Turn off the player before connecting the phone to a computer. If you connect the phone to a computer while the player is turned on, the phone automatically turns off the player.
- Note: Optional accessory required. If you use a headset with the phone, music plays through the headset. Music plays through the phone speaker when the headset is disconnected.
