Battery Tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.

 It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.

Installing the Battery

Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories.

Note: The battery door unsnaps more easily if you push it to the left as you remove it.

1. Step one: Release latch and remove back door.



2. Step two: Follow arrows to insert battery.



3. Step three: Replace the back door.



Note: The battery door unsnaps more easily if you push it to the left as you remove it.

Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

To charge the battery:


1. Plug the charger into the bottom of your phone with the release tab facing up.



- 2. Plug the other end of the charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3. When your phone's interior display shows Charge Complete, remove the charger.


Tip: You can safely leave the charger connected to your phone after charging is complete. This will not damage the battery.

Note: When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator in the upper right corner of the display shows how much of the charging process is complete. At least 1 segment of the battery level indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.



Turning Your Phone On

- 1. Open your phone.
- 2. Press and hold the power key for 3 seconds.



3. If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code (the last 4 digits of your phone number) and press the right soft key to unlock the phone

Making a Call

- 1. Press keypad keys to dial the phone number.
- 2. Press 💽 to make the call.
- 3. Press 🗊 to end the call and "hang up" the phone when you are finished.

-or-

4. Close the flip.

Tip: You can set the phone to answer calls when you open the flip.

To activate, press $\forall T >$ Settings > In-Call Setup > Answer Options > Open To Answer.

Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

• Press the right soft key to answer a call.

-or-

• Press 💽 .

• Press s to end the call and "hang up" the phone when you are finished.

-or-

• Close the flip.

Adjusting Volume

Press up or down on volume keys to:

• increase or decrease earpiece volume during an active call



- temporarily silence an incoming call alert
- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the home screen is visible (flip must be open)

Tip: At the lowest volume setting, press the down volume key once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it again to switch to silent alert. Press the up volume key to cycle back to vibrate alert, then ring alert.

Changing the Call Alert

In the home screen, press the down volume key to switch to lower call alert volume, then switch to vibrate and, finally, silent alert. Press the up volume key to cycle back from



silent alert to vibrate and then to the lowest volume alert volume setting.

Viewing Your Phone Number

To view your phone number from the home screen, press $\[ensuremath{\mathbb{T}}\]$.

While you are on a call, press $\forall T > My Tel. Numbers$.



Installing and Removing the Memory Card

You can install a removable memory card in your phone. This card provides additional storage for pictures, animations, sounds, and video clips.

CAUTION: Do not bend or scratch your memory card. Avoid exposing your memory card to static electricity, water, or dirt.

Installing the Memory Card


CAUTION: When you are not actively inserting or removing a memory card, keep the cover closed on the card slot to prevent damage.

With your phone powered off:

1. Lift the cover at the top of your phone to expose the memory card slot.



2. With the pins on the card facing inward, toward the front of the phone, insert the card as shown. Push down until it clicks into place.



Removing the Memory Card

CAUTION: Do not remove the memory card while reading or writing files. Otherwise, it could be damaged.

CAUTION: When you are not actively inserting or removing a memory card, keep the cover closed on the card slot to prevent damage.

With your phone powered off:

1. Lift the cover at the top of your phone to expose the memory card slot.



2. Press the memory card down. When you release it, it pops up.





Browsing

Searching

If you know exactly what you want to find, use **Search**:

- 3. Select the type of item you want to find (for example, wallpaper or Music).
- 4. If you see a **Select Category** box, choose the category where you would expect to find the item you want.
- 5. Enter a description of the item.
- 6. Press Search.

If you don't find what you want the first time, don't give up. Try again, using a different item description or category.

Tip: To find items that are similar to other items, go to **MyStuff**, select the item that is like what you want to find, press **Menu**, then select **Get More**.

Making Purchases

Try Before You Buy

- 3. Select **Previewed** to check out the item. If you pick a bundle, you can preview each item in the bundle.

If you don't want to purchase the item, or if you want to check out some other choices before you decide, press **Back** and continue looking.

Buy Stuff

Amp'd Live[™] offers a variety of ways for you to load up on entertainment. Mix and match to create your own blend of permanent and temporary ownership.

- Own It (Download) puts a copy of the item on your phone so you can view or play it whenever you want, forever. Copy protection laws still apply, so you may not be able to share the item with your friends.
- **Buy Access (Subscription)** gives you unlimited access to the item during your subscription period. Subscriptions are billed monthly and are great for sampling a variety of items. Just remember that the subscription items change all the time (like an e-fine or a premium TV channel), so you find something you *must* have, you should buy that item and download it permanently.

Enjoy Your Music

After you download a song or start a music subscription, use the Media Player to play your music.

Pick Songs

Option	Description
Shuffle	Play all songs on your phone in random sequence.
Artist	Display an alphabetical list of artists whose songs are on your phone. You can select the artist you want to hear. After you select the artist, you can play all songs by that artist, a specific album, or a single song.
Album	Display an alphabetical list of the albums on your phone. Just select the album you want to hear. You can then play all songs on the album or a specific song.
Song	Display an alphabetical list of all songs on your phone. Select the songs you want to play.
Genre	Display a list of music genres for the songs on your phone. Select a genre, then play all songs in that genres or only a specific song.
Playlist	Display all playlists on your phone. Select a playlist, then play all songs on that playlist or only a specific song.

Search for a Song

If you're looking for a specific song, you can use **Search** to find it instead of browsing through the music menu categories.

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select Music.
- 3. Select Menu, then Search Catalog.

- 4. Select **Music** from the list of items you can find.
- 5. To search for a song title, select **Song**.

To search for songs by a specific performer, select **Artist**.

- 6. Enter a description of the song or artist you want to find.
- 7. Select Search.

Using the Media Player

After you select the songs you want to play, use the Media Player to control playback.

If you don't find it the first time, don't give up. Try again with a different description, or look in a different category.

Option	Description
Play/Pause	Press 🔿 to play a song.
	While a song is playing, press • to pause it. Press • again to continue playing it.
Stop	Press \bigcirc up to turn off the song. The next time you play the song, it will start at the beginning.
Next	Press O right to skip ahead to the next song.
Restart	Press O left to restart a song from the beginning.
Previous	Press O left <i>twice</i> to skip back to the previous song.
Fast Forward	Press and hold O right to fast-forward the song.
Rewind	Press and hold O left to scroll backwards in the song.
Volume	Press your phone's volume keys (on the left side of the phone) up and down to adjust volume levels.

Note: When your phone is streaming a song, the Play/Pause, Stop, and Volume controls are available.

Organize Your Music

MyStuff includes a built-in playlist called **MyList**. You can change **MyList** by adding, deleting, or moving songs on your phone. You can create and manage additional playlists on your computer and then copy them to your phone.

To add a song to MyList:

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select Music.
- 3. Find the song you want to add.
- 4. Select Menu.
- 5. Select Add2MyList.

To delete or move a song in MyList:

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select Music.
- 3. Select Playlist.
- 4. Select MyList.
- 5. Select Menu.
- 6. Select the appropriate command to make your changes.

Move Up moves the current song up one slot in MyList.

Move Down moves the current song down one slot in **MyList**.

Delete removes the current song from MyList.

Play Videos

Use the Media Player to play both your subscription and downloaded videos.

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select Video.

- 3. Select the category where you expect to find the video you want to play.
- 4. Select the title or subscription you want to play.
- 5. Press the Amp'd button ⊕ to play the video. Use the Media Player to control video playback.

Play Games

When you're ready to play a downloaded or subscription game, you'll find it in **MyStuff**.

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select Games and Applications.
- 3. Select the category where you expect to find the game you want to play.
- 4. Select the title or subscription you want to play.
- 5. Press the Amp'd button to start the game.

Run Applications

To run an application you have installed, downloaded, or subscribed to:

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select Games and Applications.
- 3. Select the category where you expect to find the application you want to run.
- 4. Select the title or subscription you want to run.
- 5. Press the Amp'd button to run the application.

Change PhoneStuff

PhoneStuff is where you personalize your phone by setting its ringtone, wallpaper, and screen saver:

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select PhoneStuff.
- 3. Select the type of item you want to change.
- 4. Select the item you want to use.
- Press the Amp'd button ⊕ to preview the item. Tip: To stop a preview before it completes, press OK/ Back.
 - -or-

Press Assign to use the selected item.

Access Your Subscriptions

To view or play something to which you've subscribed:

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select Subscription.
- 3. Select the subscription you want to view or play.
- 4. Select the item you want to use.
- 5. Press the Amp'd button ⊕ to launch the selected item.

Cancel a Subscription

You can cancel a subscription directly from your phone or by going to www.ampd.com. To cancel from your phone:

- 1. Go to MyStuff.
- 2. Select Subscription.
- 3. Select the subscription you want to cancel.
- 4. Select Menu.
- 5. Select Unsubscribe.
- 6. Press to confirm the cancellation.



Taking and Sending a Photo

From the home screen, press the camera key 💽 to activate your phone's camera.

The active viewfinder image appears on your phone's display.





Sending a Multimedia Message

A *Multimedia Messaging Service* (MMS) message contains one or more slides with text and media objects (including photos, pictures, animations, sounds, voice memos, and/or video clips). You can send the multimedia message to other wireless phone users, and to email addresses.

Press \T > Messaging > Create Message > New PIX Message

Contacts key, **O**, then **Add** key and **Done** key to open **Contacts**, then scroll to and select 1 or more existing **Contacts** entries.

- 5. Press **Select** key to display a list of items you can insert.
- 6. Press () to scroll to a type of object to insert.
- 7. Press Select key to select the object type.
- 8. Press 🔿 highlight the object you want.
- 9. Press **Select** key to insert the object. To add another slide to the message, continue. To send the message, go to step 19.
- 10. Press T to open the **PIX Menu** to insert a new slide.
- 11. Press **Select** key to display a list of items you can insert.
- 12. Press 🔿 to scroll to Insert New Page.

- 13. Press **Select** key to insert a new slide after the current slide. Repeat steps 2 through 9 to enter contents for the new slide.
- 14. Press 🛞 key to store the message.
- 15. Press 🔿 to scroll to Subject.
- 16. Press Change key to select Subject.
- 17. Press keypad keys to enter the subject. -or-

Press Quick Text key, then O and Select key to open the Quick Text list, then scroll to and select a Quick Text as a subject.

- 18. Press 🛞 to store the subject.
- 19. Press SEND key to send the message. -or-

Press T to send the message later, view message details, save the message in the drafts folder, or cancel the message.

Receiving a Multimedia Message

When you receive a multimedia message or letter, your phone displays the 🖂 (message waiting) indicator and a **New Message** notification, and sounds an alert.

Press **READ** key to open the message.

Multimedia messages that you receive can contain different media objects:

- Photos, pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file, or video clip begins playing when its slide is displayed. Use the volume keys to adjust the volume as the sound file or video clip plays.

Note: In a multimedia letter, you may have to highlight an indicator in the text to play a sound file or video clip.

 Attached files are added to the end of the message. To open the attachment, highlight the file indicator/ filename and press the View key (image file type), Play key (sound file or video clip), or Open key (object such as Contacts or datebook entry, or unknown file type).

Note: File names for stored multimedia objects can not exceed 36 characters.

Bluetooth® Connections

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Your phone supports Bluetooth[®] connections. You can connect your phone to a Bluetooth[®] headset or car kit, or connect to another device to exchange and synchronize files.

Your phone currently supports the following Bluetooth profiles:

- headset (optional Motorola Original[™] accessory)
- Handsfree Car Kit (optional Motorola Original accessory)

For more information about Bluetooth[®] wireless connections supported by this device, go to FAQs **www.motorola.com/bluetooth.**

Note: The phone does not support Bluetooth (OBEX) profiles or dial-up networking.

Note: All multimedia (video player, audio player, shutter tones) will play from the speakerphone when your phone is connected to another Bluetooth device.

Turn Bluetooth® Power On or Off

Press v > Settings > Connection > Bluetooth Link > Setup > Power > On

Note: To extend battery life, use the above procedure and set Bluetooth[®] power to **Off** when not in use. If you turn Bluetooth[®] power **Off**, your phone will not connect to accessories until you turn Bluetooth[®] power **On** and reconnect to the accessories.

Pairing with a Headset, Handsfree Device, or PC

Before you try to connect to another Bluetooth

device, make sure your phone's Bluetooth[®] power is **On** and the device is in *pairing mode* (see the user guide for the device). You cannot perform pairing while your phone is connected to another device.

To pair your phone to a headset accessory, handsfree car kit, or PC that supports Bluetooth[®] wireless connections:

Press _ > Settings > Connection > Bluetooth Link > Handsfree > [Look For Devices]



Using the Display

1

The *home screen* displays when you are *not* on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number.




Note: Because you can customize the soft key settings, your home screen soft key labels may be different than the ones shown above.

The Ξ (menu) indicator indicates that you can press the menu key $(\sqrt{1})$ to enter the main menu. Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left or right soft key to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.

Your phone can display an analog or digital clock in the home screen.

The following status indicators can display:



- Roam Indicator Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network.
- Bluetooth[®] Indicator Indicates an active Bluetooth connection.
- **3** Data Coverage Indicator Shows the type of data signal your phone is using:

 \mathbf{IX} = shows when your phone is in a 1x-RTT coverage area, access to files under 200K

ED = shows when your phone is in a 1x-EVDO coverage area. Broadband speeds full access to Amp'd Live™

Signal Strength Indicator Vertical bars show the 4 strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the Υ (no signal) indicator or $\mathbb{T}^{\mathcal{O}}$ (no transmit) indicator displays.





This example shows that from the home screen, you must press $\[\] ,$ scroll to and select **Recent Calls** from the main menu, then scroll to and select **Dialed**. Press \bigcirc to scroll, and the left/right soft keys to select the functions displayed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

Selecting a Feature Option

Some features require you to select an option from a list:





Choosing a Text Entry Method

Multiple text entry methods make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The method you select remains active until you select another mode.

Press \mathcal{I} in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry methods:

Primary	The primary text entry method (see below to set).
Numeric	Enter numbers only (see page 33).
Symbol	Enter symbols only (see page 33).

Alternatively, you can select a text entry method in any text entry screen by pressing $\Box >$ **Entry Mode**.

Setting Up a Text Entry Method





- Press left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized. If necessary, press O down to force the character to lowercase before the cursor moves to the next position.

• If you enter or edit information and do not want to save the changes, press ☐ to exit without saving.

Using iTAP[™] Method

iTAP software provides a predictive text entry method that lets you enter a word using 1 key press per letter. This can be faster than Tap method, because your phone combines the key presses into common words.

For example, if you press Tem Tem (and , letter combinations that match your keypresses display:



- 1 Press **CLR** \bigcirc to delete the last letter.
- 2 Press **Select** \bigcirc to lock highlighted combination.
- ³ Press **O** to accept **Program**.
- 4 Press O right to highlight another combination.
 Press C to enter Prog and a space.

If you want a different word (such as Progress), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

Entering Words

In a text entry screen, you can press *i* to switch entry methods. An indicator shows which method is active (see page 30).

- 1. Press keypad keys (1 press per letter) to show possible letter combinations at the bottom of the display.
- 2. Press left or right to highlight the combination you want.
- 3. Press **Select** key to lock a highlighted combination. You can press keypad keys to add more letters to the end of the combination.

-or-

Press $\mathbf{k}_{\mathbf{k}}$ to enter the highlighted combination when it spells a word.

A space is automatically inserted after the word.

If you enter a word your phone does not recognize, the phone stores it to use as one of your word options. When you fill memory space for unrecognized words, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new words.

Using Numeric Method

In a text entry screen, press *I* to switch entry methods until the **123** (numeric) indicator displays.

Press keypad keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press *i* to switch to another entry method.

Using Symbol Method

In a text entry screen, press *i* to switch entry methods until the @(symbol) indicator displays.

1. Press keypad keys (1 press per symbol) to show possible symbol combinations at the bottom of the display.

- 2. Press left or right to highlight the combination you want.
- Press Select key to lock a highlighted combination. You can press keypad keys to add more symbols to the end of the combination.
 -or-

Press Ecenter the highlighted combination.

Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, then:

- 1. Press the $\overline{}$ key to delete 1 letter at a time.
- 2. Hold the $rac{}_{\alpha}$ key to delete all the text.

Using the External Display

When the flip is closed, you can use the external display for the following:

- View time, date, and phone status information.
- Read messages that notify you of incoming calls and other events.
- Use the external display as a viewfinder when you take a self portrait with the phone's camera.
- When you use a Bluetooth[®] headset for speech recognition, view speech-activated dialing commands and other status information.

Using a Removable Memory Card

Note: See page 8 for instructions on inserting and removing a memory card.

Note: You should format a memory card before you can use it.

You can use an optional removable memory card with your phone to store additional multimedia objects such as photos, video clips, and sounds.

Memory Card Tips

- File names for multimedia objects must be less than 12 characters.
- Do not remove the memory card while reading or writing files. Otherwise, the card may be damaged.

- The memory card is recognized as removable memory when connected to a personal computer.
- When you disconnect the phone with the memory card from a personal computer, remove the USB storage equipment on your personal computer. Otherwise, files stored on the memory card could be damaged.

Managing a Memory Card

To manage an inserted memory card:

Press > Phone Info > Storage Devices.

- 1. Press to scroll to the memory card. Note: Phone memory is always listed last.
- 2. Press **Details** key to view memory card information.

-or-

Press T to open the Storage Device menu to perform other procedures (see the table below)

The Storage Device menu can include the following options:

Option Description

Format Format the memory card.

Formatting the Memory Card

It is recommended that you format the memory card before you attempt to store any multimedia objects on it.

Note: Formatting the memory card will erase any data already on the card.

- 1. With the phone powered off, insert the memory card into the phone (see page 8).
- 2. Turn on the phone.



- When the phone is completely powered on, press ↓.
- 4. Scroll to Phone Info and press the Select key.
- 5. Scroll to Storage Devices and press the Select key.
- 6. Scroll to Trans T-Flash and press the *key*.
- 7. Scroll to **Format** and press the **Select** key. The phone displays Formatting will erase all data.
- 8. Press the **Yes** key to begin formatting the memory card.

-or-

Press the **No** key to exit without formatting the card.

Storing Multimedia Objects

When a memory card is inserted into your phone, you must select the card before you can store objects to or access objects on it. Use the Switch Storage Device option in the Pictures Menu, Videos Menu, or Sounds Menu.

Viewing Memory Card Contents

To view the contents of an inserted memory card:

Press T > Media Gallery.

- 1. Scroll to and select the desired multimedia object time (Pictures, Sounds, or Videos).
- 2. Press T to open the menu for the selected multimedia object.
- 3. Scroll to and select Switch Storage Devices.
- 4. Scroll to and select TRANS-T-Flash.

Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's built-in handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press the right soft key to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call. A soft audio alert confirms activation/deactivation.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays **Speaker On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press the speakerphone key again or turn the phone off.

Note: The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.

Turning On Airplane Mode

Note: Consult airline staff about the use of Airplane Mode in flight. Turn off your phone whenever instructed to do so by airline staff.

Airplane Mode allows you to disable your phone's radio frequency functions and still use other applications (such as the calculator or datebook functions). This may enable you to use these applications while on an airplane.

Press T > Settings > Airplane Mode.

Changing a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has not reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

To change a code or password:

Press \overline{y} > Settings > Security > New Passwords.

Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you must unlock it to answer**.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked.

Locking Your Phone Manually

Press T > Settings > Security > Phone Lock > Lock Now.

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter your unlock code.
- 2. Press 💮 key to lock the phone.

Unlocking Your Phone

Your phone's unlock code is originally set to 1234. Your service provider may reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number.

At the Enter Unlock Code prompt:

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter your unlock code.
- 2. Press 🛞 key to unlock your phone.

Setting Your Phone to Lock Automatically

You can set your phone to lock every time you turn it off:

Press T > Settings > Security > Phone Lock > Automatic Lock > On.

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter your unlock code.
- 2. Press 🛞 key to activate automatic lock.

If You Forget a Code or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number before you receive your phone.

If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last 4 digits of your phone number. If that does not work, contact your service provider.

If you forget your security code or call barring password, contact your service provider.



5 | SETTING UP YOUR PHONE

Storing Your Name and Phone Number

To store or edit your name information on your phone, press (1) from the home screen.

To view your phone number from the home screen or during a call, see page 7.

Setting an Alert Style

Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call or other event. This ring or vibration is called an *alert*.

You can select 1 of 5 different alert styles: **Loud**, **Soft**, **Vibrate**, **Vibe then Ring**, **Silent**. The alert style indicator in the display shows the current alert style.

To set an alert style:

Press **T** > **Settings** > **Ring Styles**.

- 1. Press to scroll to Style.
- 2. Press Change key to access the list of alert styles.
- 3. Press scroll to the desired alert style.
- 4. Press Select key to select the alert style.

Each alert style contains settings for specific event alerts, ringer ID, and ringer and keypad volume. To change these settings, press T > Settings > Ring Styles >style Detail.

Note: When your phone is connected to a charger or other accessory, the call ringer defaults to **Loud** and uses the current **Loud Detail** setting.

Setting Answer Options

You can use additional methods for answering calls:

Option	Description
Multi-key	answer by pressing any key
Open to Answer	answer by opening the flip

Setting a Wallpaper Image

You can set the same photo, picture, or animation as a wallpaper (background) image on your phone's home screen and external display.

Press **Settings** > **Personalize** > **Wallpaper**.

- 1. Press **O** to scroll to **Picture**.
- 2. Press Change key to open the picture viewer.
- Press O up or down to scroll to a picture, animation, or photo.
 Scroll to (None) to turn off the wallpaper image.
 -or-

Press ∑ > Switch Storage Device, then **○** up or down to open the Storage Devices menu, scroll to and select TRANS-T-Flash (the removable memory card), then scroll to a picture, animation, or photo.

- 4. Press Select key to select the image.
- 5. Press to scroll to Layout.
- 6. Press Change key to adjust the image layout.
- 7. Press O to scroll to Center, Tile, or Fit-to-screen.

- 8. Press Select key to confirm the layout setting.
- 9. Press Back key to save wallpaper settings.

Tip: Set the resolution to the **Low** setting on your camera when taking pictures to be applied as wallpaper. Low resolution photos display best when applied as **Fit-to-Screen** as wallpaper.

Setting a Screen Saver Image

Set a photo, picture, or animation as a screen saver image.

The screen saver image displays when the phone is on and no activity is detected for a specified time. An animation repeats for 1 minute, then the first frame of the animation displays.

Tip: Turn off the screen saver to extend battery life.

Press **Settings** > **Personalize** > **Screen Saver**.

- 1. Press O to scroll to Picture.
- 2. Press Change key to open the picture viewer.
- Press O up or down to scroll to a picture, animation, or photo. Scroll to (None) to turn off the screen saver image.

-or

Press J > Switch Storage Device, then O up or down to open the Storage Devices menu, scroll to and select TRANS-T-Flash (the removable memory card), then scroll to a picture, animation, or photo.

- 4. Press Select key to select the image.
- Press Scroll to Delay. Note: Setting Delay to Off disables the screen saver feature.
- 6. Press Change key to set the delay interval.

- 7. Press to scroll to the inactivity interval that triggers the screen saver.
- 8. Press Select key to confirm the delay setting.
- 9. Press Back key to save the screen saver settings.

Setting Display Contrast

Press **T** > **Settings** > **Initial Setup** > **Contrast**.

Setting Display Brightness

Press > Settings > Initial Setup > Brightness.

Adjusting the Backlight

Set the amount of time that the display and keypad backlights remain on.

Press > Settings > Initial Setup > Backlight.

Conserving Battery Power

Some networks and phones include a battery save setting to extend battery life. When this feature is activated, your phone automatically turns off the keypad backlight when it detects that enough ambient light is available.

Press > Settings > Initial Setup > Battery Save.

Changing the Active Line

Change the active phone line to make and receive calls from your other phone number.

Press $\sqrt{1}$ > Phone Info > Active Line.

Redialing a Number

- 1. Press 💽 to view the Recent Calls list.
- 2. Press to scroll to the entry you want to call.
- 3. Press 💽 to redial the number.

Using Automatic Redial

When you receive a busy signal, your phone displays **Call Failed, Number Busy**.

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number for 4 minutes. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates1 time, displays **Redial Successful**, and then connects the call.

You must turn on automatic redial to use the feature. To turn automatic redial on or off:

Press $\forall T >$ Settings > Initial Setup > Auto Redial.

When automatic redial is turned off, you can manually activate the feature to redial a phone number. When you hear a fast busy signal and see **Call Failed**:

Press 💽 or **RETRY** key to activate automatic redial.

Turning Off a Call Alert

You can turn off your phone's incoming call alert before answering the call.

Press either volume key to turn off the alert for a current incoming call.

Calling an Emergency Number

Your service provider programs 1 or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked.

Note: Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

- 1. Press keypad keys to dial the emergency number.
- 2. Press 💽 call the emergency number.

Viewing Recent Calls

Your phone keeps lists of the calls you recently received and dialed, even if the calls did not connect. Lists are sorted from newest to oldest entries. Oldest entries are deleted as new entries are added.

Press T > Recent Calls.

Shortcut: Press \fbox from the home screen to view the recent calls list.

- 1. Press to scroll to Received Calls or Dialed Calls.
- Press Select key to select the list.
 means the call connected.

3. Press 💽 to call the entry's number.

Press 💽 to send the number as DTMF tones during a call.

-or-

Press View key to view entry details.

-or-

Press T to open the **Last Calls Menu** to perform various operations on the entry.

The **Last Calls Menu** can include the following options:

Option	Description
Store	Create a Contacts entry with the phone number in the No. field.
Delete	Delete the entry.
Delete All	Delete all entries in the list.
Send Message	Open a new text message with the number in the To field.
Add Digits	Add digits after the number.
Attach Number	Attach a number from Contacts or the Recent Calls lists.

Returning an Unanswered Call

Your phone keeps a record of your unanswered calls, and displays:

- the T+ (missed call) indicator
- X Missed Calls, where X is the number of missed calls
- 1. Press Select key to see the received calls list.
- 2. Press **O** to select a call to return.
- 3. Press 💽 to make the call.

Using the Notepad

The most recent set of digits entered on the keypad are stored in your phone's notepad memory. This can be a phone number that you called, or a number that you entered but did not call. To retrieve the number stored in the notepad:

Press **T** > **Recent Calls** > **Notepad**.

1. Press 💽 to call the number.

-or-

Press T to open the **Dialing Menu** to attach a number or insert a special character.

-or-

Press **Store** key to create a **Contacts** entry with the number in the **No.** field.

Attaching a Number

While dialing (with digits visible in the display):

Press $(\mathbf{T}) >$ **Attach Number** to attach a number from the **Contacts** or **Recent Calls** lists.

Calling with Speed Dial

Each entry you store in **Contacts** is assigned a unique speed dial number.

You can change an entry's speed dial number.

To see an entry's speed dial number, press To **Contacts**, scroll to the entry, and press the **View** key.

To speed dial a **Contacts** entry:

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter the speed dial number for the entry you want to call.
- 2. Press 🔊 to submit the number.
- 3. Press 💽 to call the entry.

Calling with 1-Touch Dial

To call **Contacts** entries 1 through 9, press and hold the single-digit speed dial number for 1 second.

Using Voicemail

Voicemail messages that you receive are stored on the network. To listen to your messages, you must call your voicemail phone number.

Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

Listening to Voicemail Messages

Press **T** > **Messaging** > **Voicemail** > **CALL**.

The phone calls your voicemail phone number. If no voicemail number is stored, your phone prompts you to store a number.

Receiving a Voicemail Message

When you receive a voicemail message, your phone displays the 🔄 (voicemail message) indicator and a **New Voicemail** notification.

Press CALL key to listen to the message.

The phone calls your voicemail phone number. If no voicemail number is stored, your phone prompts you to store a number.

Muting a Call

1. Press MUTE key.

Using DTMF Tones

You can send numbers to the network as dual tone multi-frequency (DTMF) tones during a call. Use DTMF tones to communicate with automated systems that require you to submit a PIN code, password, or credit card number.

To set DTMF tones to be long, short, or off:

Press > Settings > Initial Setup.

- 1. Press to scroll to DTMF.
- 2. Press Change key to access the list of DTMF options.
- 3. Press to scroll to the desired options.
- 4. Press Select key to select the DTMF option.

Short sends a short, fixed-duration tone for each key you press. **Long** sends each tone for as long as you press the key. Some systems (such as home answering machines) may require long tones for proper activation.

Sending DTMF Tones During a Call

Using the Keypad

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter a number to send.
- 2. Press T to open the Call Menu.
- 3. Press O to scroll to Send Tones.
- 4. Press **Select** key to send the number to the network as DTMF tones.

Sending a Stored Number

During a call, highlight a number in **Contacts** or the **Recent Calls** lists, then:

Press 💽 to make the call.

7 | PUSH-TO-TALK (PTT) CALLS

Push-to-Talk (PTT) lets you talk weakly-talkie style with other Push to Talk subscribers.

PTT and the other features indicated are network and subscription dependent features that are not available in all areas. PTT connectivity requires PTT compatible phones.

PTT Basics

Once you are connected, just push and hold the PTT key (III) to communicate.

Phone Position

When using PTT, hold the phone in a vertical position, one to two inches (2.5 to 5 cm) from your mouth.

Call Sound

PTT calls come through the handsfree speaker by default.

If you are on a call and use Call Waiting to accept any type of incoming call, you hear the sound from the incoming call the same way as the sound from the call you are on. For example, if you are using the phone earpiece for a standard wireless call and then accept an incoming PTT call, you hear the sound from the PTT call through the phone earpiece.

If you connect a headset (sold separately) to the phone, you hear PTT call sound through the headset speaker, and you speak through the headset microphone. You must press the PTT key (IIII) to gain floor control of a PTT call and speak to other parties.

Adjusting Volume

Your phone displays **Speaker On** in the home screen to indicate that the handsfree speaker is on. Press **Speaker** \bigcirc to turn it off.

To adjust handsfree speaker volume during a call, press the volume key (on the left side of the phone) up or down.

To hear a PTT call through the phone earpiece during a call, press **Speaker** \bigcirc . Press **Speaker** \bigcirc again to switch back to the phone earpiece.

PTT Call Types

You can make two types of PTT calls.

The first type of call, a *PTT call*, automatically connects to the other party. The other party is not able to ignore the call. The call can be one of two types:

- a private call to a single PTT user
 - -or-
- a group PTT call to more than one PTT user

The second type of call, a *Call me alert*, sends the receiving party a text message and a message alert beep to indicate that someone wants to speak with him/her.

The receiving party can answer or ignore the call. Call me alerts are *private* calls only.



Making a Private PTT Call

1. From the home screen, press (IIII) to open the Push to Talk menu, scroll to a contact or group, then press (IIII).

-or-

Press T > Amp'd PTT, scroll to a PTT contact, then press TIME

 To speak during a PTT call, wait for the **Ready to** Speak tone, then press and hold (IIII) and begin speaking. Release (IIIII) to let the other party speak.

(Only one person can speak at a time.) If nobody speaks for 20 seconds, the call ends.

3. Press is to end the call. If the other party ends the call, you do not have to do anything.

Release (IIII) let the other party speak. (Only one person can speak at a time.)

Tip: If you originate a call to someone who is actively engaged in a standard wireless call or a PTT call, you hear the **Ready to Speak** tone and your voice message is stored. The other party can either answer or ignore your call. It the party answers your call, you will both hear the **Floor Free** tone (a single high pitched beep).

Making a Group PTT Call

You must create and save a group before you can call it (see page 46).

Press 💷.

€₩

- 1. Scroll to the group you want to call.
- 2. Press and hold III.

When the audio path is ready and the group is available, you hear the **Ready to Speak** tone.

- 3. While continuing to hold (I), speak your message. Release (I) to let the group members speak.
- 4. Press 🗊 to end the call.

Sending a Call Me Alert

You can send an alert only to a contact saved in your **PTT Contacts** list. The recipient can ignore the alert or accept it and begin a PTT call with you.

From the home screen:

- 1. Press (IIII).
- 2. Scroll to the PTT contact you want to call.
- 3. Press Options .
- 4. Select Call Me alert.

The receiving party's phone beeps and displays a message. The message remains until the other party accepts or ignores it.

- 5. When you hear the recipient's voice (which indicates that he/she has accepted the alert), press (II-II) and wait for the **Ready to Speak** tone.
- 6. While continuing to hold (Im), speak your message. Release (Im) to let the other party speak.
- Press s to end the call.
 If the other party ends the call, you do not have to do anything.

Receiving a PTT Call

When your phone receives a private or group PTT call, you hear the caller through the handsfree speaker, and your phone plays the **Open Floor** tone.

In a *private call*, your phone displays **PTT Call** along with the caller's contact name or phone number.

In a group call, your phone displays **PTT Group Call** along with the name of the group.

- 1. Press and hold (IIII).
- When you hear the Ready to Speak tone, continue to hold (III) and begin speaking. Release (IIII) to let the other party speak.
- 3. Press ☐ to end the call. If the other party ends the call, you do not have to do anything.

Receiving a Call Me Alert

When it receives a Call me alert, your phone beeps and displays the name or phone number of the caller along with this message: *name/number* requests a PTT call. Press (II-III).

To ignore the alert, press **Cancel** \bigcirc .

To accept the alert and call the person, press (IIII).

Adding a PTT Contact

You can add new PTT contacts and view them in the **PTT Contacts** list using the main PTT menu.

Note: When you attempt to enter a contact, the potential contact is notified. The potential contact must give permission before you can save his/her phone number as a contact.

Press (IIII).

€

- 1. Press Options 🕑.
- 2. Press 💮 to select Add Contact.
- 3. Enter the PTT contact number and press **Next** \bigcirc .

If the PTT contact number is valid and the other party accepts your request to be added, you see **Invite Status - (name) - Accepted**.

If the other party refuses your request, **you see Invite Status - (name) - Declined**. Press **OK** (1) to return to the PTT menu.

Note: The other party cannot receive or respond to your request if his/her phone is turned off or if he/ she is outside your service area.

Erasing a PTT Contact

Press (IIII).

- 1. Scroll to the PTT contact name you want to erase.
- 2. Select Options 🗁.
- 3. Press 🔿 down to select **Delete**.
- 4. Press Yes 🖸 or No ⊡.
- 5. To erase additional contacts, press up or down to select contact names, then repeat steps 3 and 4.

Check Contact Availability

In the Recent Calls lists and the PTT menus, your phone displays icons next to PTT contact and group names to indicate availability to participate in a call.

Availability Indicators

lcon	Description
8 (green)	Contact Available —The contact (or one member of the group) can accept calls.
8 (red)	Do Not Disturb —PTT calls cannot be made to the contact (or any member of the group).
8 (dim)	Contact Unavailable —The handset is turned off or the contact is not registered with the voice network.

Setting Your Availability

Note: You can make PTT calls regardless of how you set availability.

- 1. Press (IIII).
- 2. Select Availability \bigcirc .

3. Press 💮 to select **Do Not Disturb** or **Available**.

Available allows you to make and receive PTT calls.Do Not Disturb ensures that you will not receive

PTT calls.

Saving, Editing, and Erasing PTT Groups

You can create up to 30 PTT groups. A group can include up to 30 members.

However, the total number of contacts you can save in your phone (including PTT and non-PTT contacts and groups) cannot exceed 99.

Creating a PTT Group

You can create a PTT group from a list of contacts in another group, or you can create a group from scratch by adding new contacts.

Notes:

- You can establish a group only if your phone is provisioned by your service provider.
- A PTT contact must be provisioned from the handset or a Web interface before you can add it to a group.

Press (IIII).

- 1. Section **Options** \bigcirc .
- 2. Scroll to Add Group and press .
- 3. Enter the group name and select Next \bigcirc .
- 4. If no PTT contact names appear, go to step 5. -or-

Scroll to the name of the PTT contact you want to add to your new group and press \bigoplus . (If the desired contact is not on the list, go to step 5.) A check mark appears beside the contact name. Go to step 9 when finished adding PTT contacts to the newly created group.

5. Enter the number of a PTT contact you want to add to the group.

- 6. Enter the name of the PTT contact you want to add to the group.
- 7. If you wish to add another contact, select Add New ○.
- 8. Press Save 🗁 to save the newly created group.

When you are finished creating a new group and adding members to it, invitations are sent to the members asking for their permission to join your newly created group. The invitation includes your name or number and the group name but does not list all members invited. After accepting an invitation, a new member can select the group name and view the list of members.

Adding a Member to a PTT Group

Press (IIII).

- 1. Highlight the group and select **Options** \bigcirc .
- 2. Press the center key 💮 to go to the Add Member screen.
- Scroll to the name of the member you want to add to the group. Note: If no PTT contact names, or if the desired contact is not on the list, then complete steps 4 through 7 of "Saving, Editing, and Erasing PTT Groups" on page 46.
- 4. Press 💮 to choose Select. A check mark appears beside the contact name
- Press right to select Save, then press ⊕. Your phone sends an invitation to the members you have added to the group.



Editing a PTT Group Name

You can edit the names only of groups you have created.

Press (IIII).

- 1. Scroll to the PTT group name you wish to change.
- 2. Press Options 🗁.
- 3. Scroll down to Edit.
- 4. Edit the group name using your phone's keypad.
- Press Next .
 All members in your group are notified and updated.

Erasing a PTT Group

You can erase only groups you have created.

Press (IIII).

- 1. Scroll to the PTT group name you wish to erase.
- 2. Press Options 🕑.
- 3. Scroll down to **Delete** and press **Select** ... Your phone displays **Erase Group**?.
- Press Yes <...
 Note: Individual members of a PTT group remain in the PTT contacts list after the group is erased.

Erasing a PTT Group Member

You can erase only groups you have created.

Press (IIII).

€

- 1. Scroll to the PTT group name you wish to edit.
- 2. Press Options 🕑.

- *3.* Scroll down to **Delete Members** and press **Select** *⊡*.
- 4. Scroll to the contact you wish to erase and press ⊕.
 A check mark appears beside the contact name.
 To erase additional members, scroll to their names and press ⊕ at each name you select.
- 5. Press Delete 🗁.
- 6. Select **Yes** to erase the member name(s). -or-

To erase additional members, scroll to their names and press 💮 at each name you select.

Removing Yourself from a PTT Group

You can remove yourself from a PTT group that you did not create.

Press (IIII).

- 1. Scroll to the PTT group name you wish to leave.
- 2. Press Options 🕑.
- 3. Scroll down to Leave Group.
- 4. Press 💮.
- 6. Select **Yes** to leave the group. Your phone sends a message to your service provider to request that you be removed from the group.

-or-

Select **No** to discontinue and return to the previous screen.

Managing Multiple Calls

Your phone can handle two calls at the same time. While you are on a standard wireless or PTT call, you can receive or place another standard wireless or PTT call at the same time.

Erasing PTT Call History

PTT calls are including in the recent calls lists along with standard wireless calls. You can erase them just as you can erase other calls.

Personalizing Features

Using Speech Commands

You can place calls and perform other tasks by speaking commands to your phone.

- 1. Press and release the voice button on the right side of the phone. Your phone displays and speaks **Say a command**, followed by a list of speech commands.
- 2. Say 1 of the commands listed in the table below. Your phone performs the corresponding action.

The following are speech commands and the actions they perform:

Use the Call command to place a call in 2 different ways:

- Dial a **Contacts** entry by speaking the name of the entry.
- Dial any number by speaking the digits in the number.
- 1. Press and release the voice button on the right side of the phone. You phone displays **Say a command**, followed by a list of speech commands.
- 2. Say "Call," then say the name of the Contacts entry, or speak the digits of the phone number.
 - For example, to call the mobile number for a **Contacts** entry named Bill Smith, you would say "Call Bill Smith mobile." (If the entry included only 1 number for Bill Smith, you would simply state "Call Bill Smith.")
 - Similarly, to call the phone number 312-555-1212, you would say "Call 312-555-1212." If the phone recognizes the name or number, it places the call.
 - If the phone asks you to repeat a name or number, say it again. If the name or number is not valid or is not recognized, the phone does not place the call.
 - If the phone does not recognize the name or number, it displays a list of up to 3 names or numbers, asks, "Did you say ...," and highlights that first item in the list.
 - If the name or number is correct, say "Yes" to place the call.
 - If the name or number is not correct, say "No" to go to the next item on the list.
 - To select the name or number manually, scroll to the name or number on the list and press the **Select** key.
 - To exit the list, say "Cancel."
 - If you reach the end of the list without confirming a number, the phone says, "Sorry, no match found." To try to place the call again, press the **Repeat** key, say "Call," and clearly speak the name or number.

Tip: Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, pronouncing each digit distinctly. Avoid pausing between digits.

10 | SPECIFIC ABSORBTION RATE DATA

The model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg.¹ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
