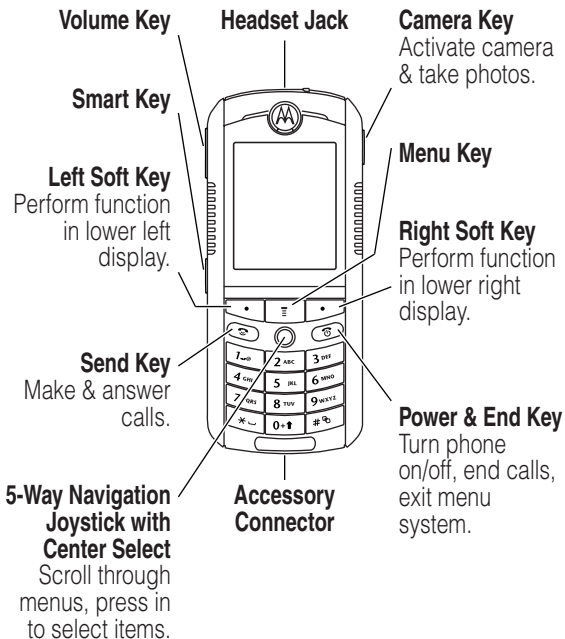

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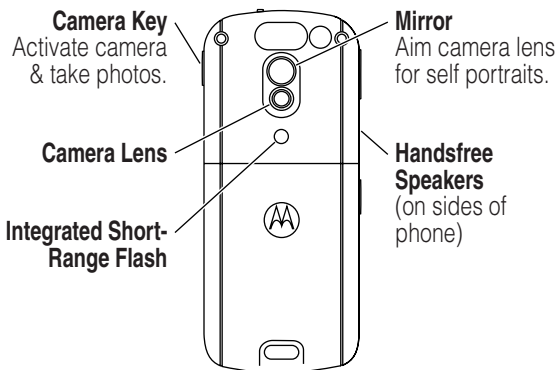

## Installing the SIM Card

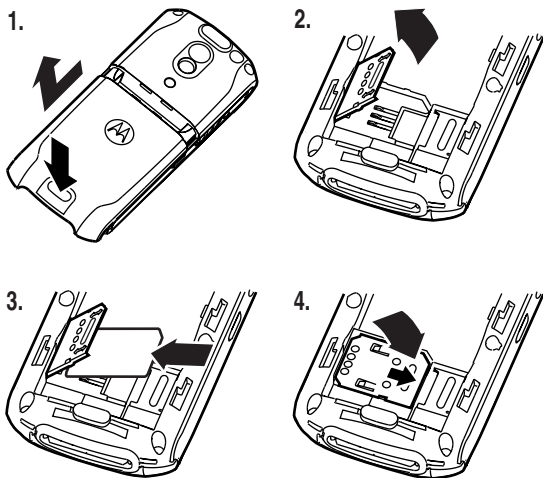
Your SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message memory.



**Caution:** Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Avoid exposing your SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt.



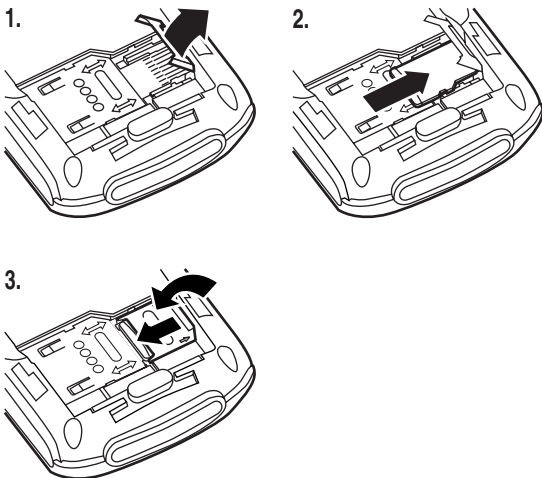

## Installing a Memory Card

You can install a removable memory card in your phone. You can store additional multimedia objects (such as photos and sounds) on the memory card.

**Caution:** Do not bend or scratch your memory card. Avoid exposing your memory card to static electricity, water, or dirt.



## Battery Use

Battery performance depends on many factors, including your wireless carrier's network configuration; signal strength; the temperature at which you operate your phone; the features and/or settings you select and use;

items attached to the phone's accessory connector port; and your voice, data, and other application usage patterns.



**Caution:** To prevent injuries or burns, do not allow metal objects to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

To maximize your battery's performance:

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The phone warranty does not cover damage caused from using non-Motorola batteries and/or battery chargers.
- New batteries or batteries that have been stored for a long time may require a longer charge time.
- Maintain the battery at or near room temperature when charging.
- Do not expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- When you do not intend to use a battery for a while, store it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Batteries gradually wear down and require longer charging times. This is normal. If you charge your battery regularly and notice a decrease in talk time or an increase in charging time, then it is probably time to purchase a new battery.



The rechargeable batteries that power this phone must be disposed of properly and may need to be recycled. Refer to your battery's label

for battery type. Contact your local recycling center for proper disposal methods.

**Warning:** Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.



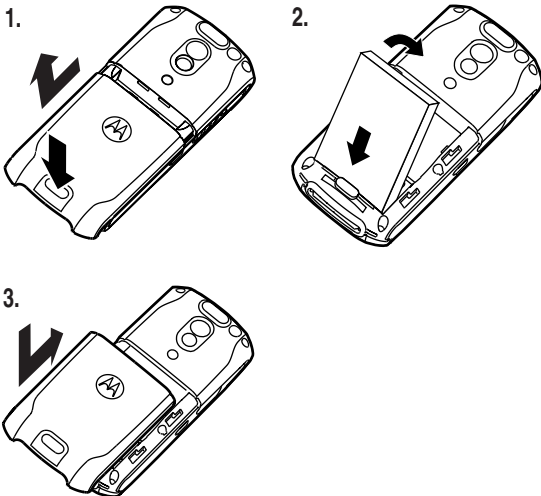
## Installing the Battery



Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories. We recommend that you store batteries in their protective cases when not in use.

**Note:** Your phone is shipped with a clear protective liner covering the battery door latch. Remove the liner to ensure that the battery door attaches and closes properly.

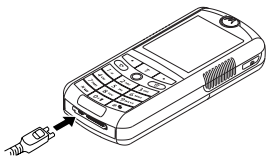
# Charging the Battery



New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

## Action

- 1 Insert the travel charger plug into your phone with the release tab facing up. Make sure that both of the plug's connector hooks engage to lock the plug in place.




**Note:** It may take up to 10 seconds for your phone to provide a visible or audible indication that the battery is charging.

- 2 Plug the other end of the travel charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3 When your phone indicates **Charge Complete**, press the release tab and remove the travel charger.

**Tip:** You can safely leave the travel charger connected to the phone after charging is complete. This will **not** damage the battery.


# Turning Your Phone On

## Action


- 1 Press and hold  (power key) for 2 seconds to turn the phone on.



**Note:** It may take up to 4 seconds for the display to illuminate after you turn the phone on.



- 2 If necessary, enter your SIM card PIN code and press **OK** () to unlock the SIM card.

**Caution:** If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your SIM card is disabled and your phone displays **SIM Blocked**.

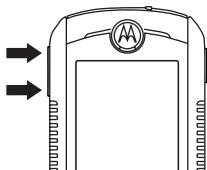
- 3 If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code and press **OK** () to unlock the phone.

**Note:** At startup, you are given the option to personalize your phone. Select **YES** () to set personal phone options, or **NO** () to go to the idle display. For more information about personalizing your phone, see page 81.

## Adjusting Volume

Press the volume key up or down to:

- increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call









- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the home screen is visible

**Tip:** At the lowest volume setting, press the volume key down once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it down again to switch to silent alert. Press the volume key up to cycle back to vibrate alert, then ring alert.

- turn off an incoming call alert




## Making a Call

	Press	To
1	keypad keys	dial the phone number
2		make the call
3		end the call and “hang up” the phone when you are finished



## Answering a Call


When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

2		end the call and “hang up” the phone when you are finished



## Viewing Your Phone Number



To view your phone number from the home screen, press  .


While you are on a call, press  > **My Tel. Numbers**.

**Note:** Your phone number must be stored on your SIM card to use this feature. To store your phone number on the SIM card, see page 52. If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.

## Locking and Unlocking the Keypad

You can lock your phone keypad to prevent accidental keypresses (for example, when carrying your phone in a purse or pocket).

Press	To
 	lock or unlock your keypad

Select  > **Settings** > **Security** > **Lock Keypad** to view instructions on how to lock/unlock the keypad.

**Note:** Incoming calls and messages unlock the keypad.

## Taking and Sending a Photo

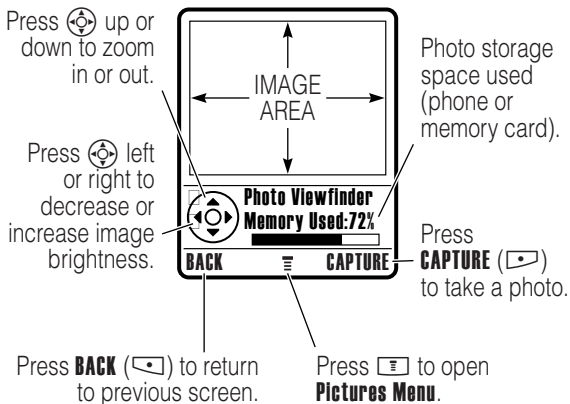
**Shortcut:** Press the camera key to activate the camera. Press the camera key again to take a photo.

To activate your phone's camera using the menu system:

**Find the Feature**       > **Multimedia** > **Camera**

**Tip:** When you want to take photos in low-light settings, press  > **Flash** > **On** to activate the built-in flash.

The active viewfinder image appears on your display.



Point the camera lens at the photo subject, then:

Press	To
1 <b>CAPTURE</b> (📷)	take a photo
2 <b>STORE</b> (📷)	view storage options
or	
<b>DISCARD</b> (📷)	delete the photo and return to active viewfinder
	If you choose to store the photo, continue to step 4.
3 (📶)	scroll to <b>Send in Message</b> , <b>Store Only</b> , <b>Send as iMessage</b> , <b>Apply as Wallpaper</b> , <b>Apply as Screen Saver</b> , or <b>Apply as Phonebook Entry</b>
4 <b>SELECT</b> (📷)	perform the storage option of your choice

Press (📷) to open the **Pictures Menu** when the camera is active. The **Pictures Menu** can include the following options:

Option	Description
<b>Go To Pictures</b>	View pictures and photos stored on your phone.
<b>Auto-Timed Capture</b>	Set a timer for the camera to take a photo.
<b>Delete All</b>	Delete all pictures.
<b>Pictures Setup</b>	Open the setup menu to adjust picture settings.

<b>Switch Storage Device</b>	Save the photo in phone memory or on the memory card.
<b>View Free Space</b>	See how much memory remains for storing pictures.
<b>Flash</b>	Activate the flash for photos taken in low-light settings.












A *Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS)* multimedia message contains one or more slides with text and embedded media objects (including photos, pictures, animations, sounds, voice records, and/or video clips). You can send the multimedia message to other wireless phone users, and to email addresses.

The **Storage Device** menu can include the following options:

When a memory card is installed on your phone, the phone prompts you to select a storage device when you download or store a multimedia object.

To view the contents of a memory card, go to the multimedia menu for a specific object type (such as **Pictures** or **Sounds**), then press  > **Switch Storage Device** > *device name*.

## Creating a Music Playlist

You can download and play a variety of different types of ring tones and sound files on your phone. You can store these sound files in phone memory, or on a memory card.








**Tip:** To see the sound files stored on a memory card, go to the **Sounds** menu, then press  > **Switch Storage Device** > *device name*.

You can create a playlist of selected sound files that play in the order you specify. Playlists that you create are stored in the **Sounds** menu.

## Playing Video Clips

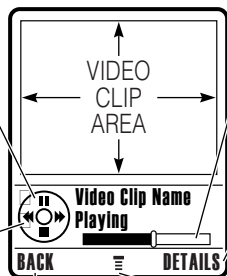

The video clip displays in the video clip playback screen:


Press  up or down to pause or play video clip.

Press  left or right to skip to previous or next video clip.



Timer indicates % played.

Press **DETAILS** () to view video clip information.

Press **BACK** () to return to previous screen.

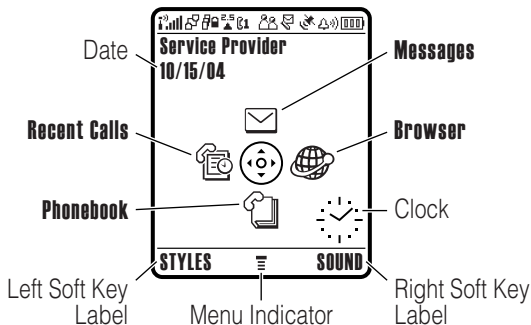

## Using the Display



The *home screen* is displayed when you are **not** on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number.



Press the 5-way navigation joystick (⬇️) up, down, left, or right to select a menu feature icon. If you select a menu icon by mistake, press (⬅️) to return to the home screen.

The ☰ (menu) indicator shows that you can press the menu key (⬅️) to enter the main menu.



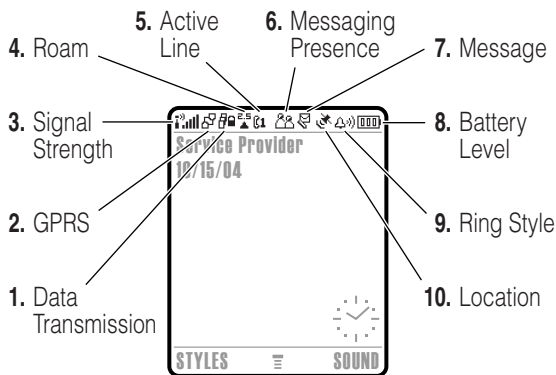
Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key () or right soft key () to perform the indicated function.

### Notes:


- Your home screen may appear different than shown. For example, your service provider may hide the menu feature icons to allow a better view of the wallpaper image. You can still select the menu icons when they are hidden from view. To show or hide menu icons, see page 82.
- Your phone can display an analog or digital clock in the home screen (see page 82).
- Your phone's display normally is visible only when the display backlight is on, or when the display is viewed in direct sunlight. To extend battery life, the backlight turns off automatically when no activity is detected for a period of time. The backlight turns back on when you press any key. To set the time that the backlight stays on, see page 59.
- To extend battery life, you can set the display to turn off after a period of inactivity. The display turns back on when you press any key. To set the time that the display stays on, see page 59.




**1. Data Transmission Indicator** Shows connection and data transmission status. Indicators can include:


 = secure packet data transfer


 = unsecure packet data transfer

 = secure application connection

 = unsecure application connection

 = secure *Circuit Switch Data* (CSD) call

 = unsecure CSD call

 = Bluetooth® connection





**2. GPRS Indicator** Shows that your phone is using a high-speed *General Packet Radio Service* (GPRS) network connection. GPRS allows faster data transfer speeds. Other indicators can include:

= GPRS PDP context active

= GPRS packet data available

**3. Signal Strength Indicator** Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the (no signal) indicator or (no transmit) indicator is displayed.



**4. Roam Indicator** Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network. Indicators can include:

= 2.5G home

= 2.5G roam

= 2G home

= 2G roam



**5. Active Line Indicator** Shows or to indicate the current active phone line. Other indicators can include:

= line 1 active, call forward on

= line 2 active, call forward on

= alarm activated



**6. Messaging Presence Indicator** Shows when instant messaging is active. Indicators can include:

= IM active

= available for IM

= busy

= invisible to IM

= available for phone calls

= offline

When a Java™ application is active, a (Java midlet) indicator can display in this location.



**7. Message Indicator** Displays when you receive a new message. Indicators can include:

= text message

= voicemail message

= voicemail and text message

= answering machine

= IM message


= active chat session


When you enter a message, a number in this location shows the number of characters left on the current page (text message), or the message size in bytes/kilobytes (multimedia message or letter).

**8. Battery Level Indicator** Vertical bars show the battery charge level. Recharge the battery when **Low Battery** displays and the battery alert sounds.




## 9. Ring Style Indicator Shows the ring style setting.

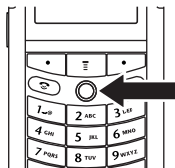
**10. Location Indicator** Your phone may be able to send location information to the network during an emergency call. Indicators show when your phone is sending location information:



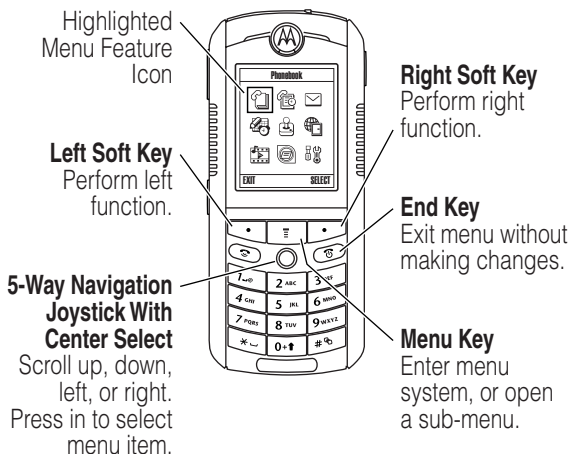
## Using the 5-Way Navigation Joystick


Press the 5-way navigation joystick () up, down, left, or right to scroll through the menu system, highlight menu items, change feature settings, and play games. Press in the 5-way navigation joystick () to select a highlighted menu item.

## Selecting a Menu Feature

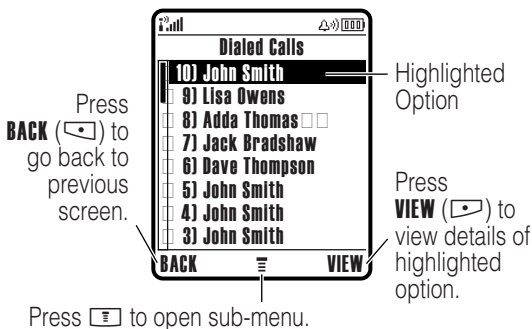
### Find the Feature

> **Recent Calls** > **Dialed Calls**

This example shows that from the home screen, you must press , scroll to and select **Recent Calls** from the main menu, then scroll to and select **Dialed Calls**. Press to scroll. Press in to select the highlighted item. Press the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

## Selecting a Feature Option

Some features require you to select an option from a list:

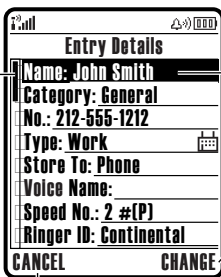


- Press to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.
- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.
- When an option has a list of possible values, press left or right to scroll through and select a value.
- When an option has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.



# Entering Text

Some features require you to enter information.



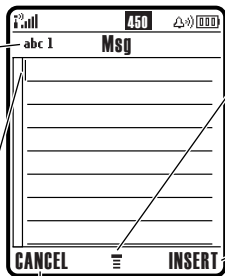
Press to scroll down to other options.

Highlighted Option

Press **CHANGE** () to enter or edit information.

Press **CANCEL** () to exit without making changes. **DONE** () displays when you enter or edit information.

The message center lets you compose and send text messages.



For indicator descriptions, see following section.

*Flashing cursor indicates insertion point.*


Press to open sub-menu.

Press **INSERT** () to insert a quick note, picture, or sound.


Press **CANCEL** () to exit without making changes.

## Choosing a Text Entry Method


Multiple text entry methods make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The method you select remains active until you select another method.

Press  in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry methods:

<b>Primary</b>	The primary text entry method (see below to set).
<b>Numeric</b>	Enter numbers only (see page 44).
<b>Symbol</b>	Enter symbols only (see page 44).
<b>Secondary</b>	The secondary text entry method (see below to set).

Alternatively, you can select a text entry method in any text entry screen by pressing  > **Entry Mode**.


## Setting Up a Text Entry Method

Press  > **Entry Setup** from any text entry screen. Select **Primary Setup** or **Secondary Setup**, and choose:

<b>iTAP</b>	Use iTAP® method to let the phone predict each word as you press keys (see page 42).
<b>Tap</b>	Enter letters and numbers by pressing a key one or more times.
<b>Tap Extended</b>	Enter letters, numbers, and symbols by pressing a key one or more times.
<b>None</b>	Hide the <b>Secondary</b> setting (only available for <b>Secondary Setup</b> ).



## Using Capitalization

Press  in any text entry screen to change text case. The following indicators show capitalization status:

abc = no capital letters







Abc = capitalize next

ABC = all capital letters

letter only

## Text Entry Method Indicators

When you select the **Primary** or **Secondary** text entry method, the following indicators identify the text entry setting:

1	2	Tap, no capital letters

## Using Tap Method

This is the standard method for entering text on your phone.

Regular **Tap** method cycles through the letters and number of the key you press. **Tap Extended** method also cycles through additional symbols as shown in the “Character Chart” on page 41.

Press	To
1 A keypad key one or more times	select a letter, number, or symbol
2 Keypad keys	enter remaining characters <b>Tip:</b> Press  right to accept a word completion, or  to insert a space.
3 <b>OK</b> (  )	store the text

In a text entry screen, you can press  to switch entry methods. An indicator shows which method is active (see page 38). If **Tap** or **Tap Extended** is not available as the **Primary** or **Secondary** entry method, see page 37.

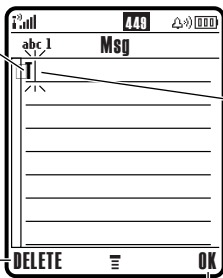




When you enter text with **Tap** or **Tap Extended** method, the soft key functions change.

Character displays at insertion point.

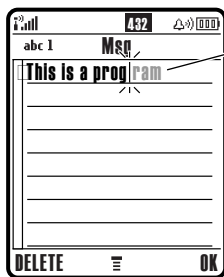
Press **DELETE** (⏮) to delete character to left of insertion point.



After 2 seconds, character is accepted and cursor moves to next position.

Press **OK** (⏭) to accept and store text.

When you enter 3 or more characters in a row, your phone may guess the rest of the word. For example, if you enter **prog** you might see:
















Press ⏭ right to accept **program**, or press ⏮ to reject it and enter a space after **prog**.

If you want a different word (such as **progress**), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

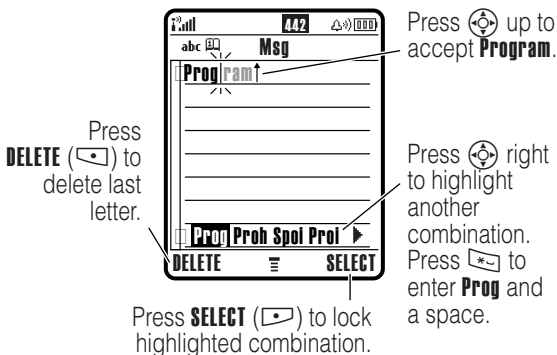


- Press  left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized. If necessary, press  down to force the character to lowercase before the cursor moves to the next position.
- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save the changes, press  to exit without saving.

## Using iTAP<sup>®</sup> Method


iTAP software provides a predictive text entry method that lets you enter a word using one keypress per letter. This can be faster than **Tap** method, because your phone combines the keypresses into common words.




For example, if you press    , letter combinations that match your keypresses display:



If you want a different word (such as **Progress**), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

## Entering Words

In a text entry screen, you can press  to switch entry methods. An indicator tells you which method is active (see page 38). If **ITAP** method is not available as the **Primary** or **Secondary** entry method, see page 37.

Press	To

If you enter a word your phone does not recognize, the phone stores it to use as one of your word options. When




you fill memory space for unrecognized words, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new words.



## Using Numeric Method

In a text entry screen, press  to switch entry methods until the 123 (numeric) indicator displays.

Press keypad keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press  to switch to another entry method.

## Using Symbol Method

In a text entry screen, press  to switch entry methods until the @ (symbol) indicator displays.

Press	To
1 Keypad keys (one press per symbol)	show possible symbol combinations at the bottom of the display
2  left or right	highlight the combination you want
3 <b>SELECT</b> (  )	lock a highlighted combination

You can press keypad keys to add more symbols to the end of the combination.












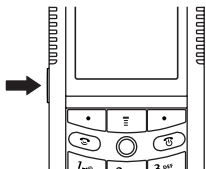
## Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, and then:

Action
Press <b>DELETE</b> (  ) to delete one letter at a time.
Hold <b>DELETE</b> (  ) to delete the entire message.



## Using the Smart Key



The *smart key* gives you another way to perform many basic phone functions. It anticipates the next action you are likely to perform. For example, when you highlight a menu item, you can press the smart key to select it. You can use the smart key to make and end calls, turn features on and off, and open your phonebook. The smart key usually performs the same function as pushing in the 5-way navigation joystick (⬇️).

## Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's integrated handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press **SPEAKER** (🔊) to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays **Speaker On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press **SPEAKER** (🔊) again or turn the phone off.

**Note:** The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.

## Changing a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has **not** reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

You can also reset your SIM card PIN code, PIN2 code, and/or call barring password if necessary.

To change a code or password:

### Find the Feature

 > Settings > Security  
> New Passwords

## Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you must unlock it to answer.**

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 64).

If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last 4 digits of your phone number. If that does not work, do the following at the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

If you forget your security code, SIM card PIN code, PIN2 code, or call barring password, contact your service provider.

## Storing a Phone Number

Enter a phone number in the home screen, then press **STORE** (☐) to create a phonebook entry with that number. Fill in the other fields to complete the entry.

Select **MORE** to store another number (for example, a work number) under the same **Name**.

## Recording a Voice Name

When creating a phonebook entry, scroll to **Voice Name** and press **RECORD** (☐) to begin. When prompted, press **RECORD** (☐) and say the entry's name (within 2 seconds). When prompted, press **RECORD** (☐) and repeat the name. Press **DONE** (☐) to store the voice name.

**Note:** This option is not available for entries stored on the SIM card.

## Dialing a Number

Press ☐ > **Phonebook**, highlight the phonebook entry, press ☐ to call.

## Voice Dialing a Number



From the home screen, press and hold ☐ for 2 seconds, release, then say the entry's name (within 2 seconds).

## Sorting Phonebook Entries

Press ☐ > **Phonebook**, press ☐ > **Setup** > **Sort by**, then select whether you want to sort the phonebook list by **Name**, **Speed No.**, **Voice Name**, or **Email**.



When sorting by name, you can view **All** numbers or just the **Primary** number for each name. To set the primary number for a name, see page 81.

## ***Setting a Picture ID for a Phonebook Entry***



Press  > **Phonebook** > *entry*, press  > **Edit** > **Picture** > *picture name*.

Also see pages 2 and 18.

## ***Setting Picture ID View***

Press  > **Phonebook**, press  > **Setup** > **View by** > **Picture**.

## ***Viewing Entries By Category***

Press  > **Phonebook**, press  > **Categories**, then select whether you want to view **All** entries, entries in a predefined category (**Business**, **Personal**, **General**, **VIPs**), or entries in a category you created.

To set the category for a phonebook entry, see page 80.

## Setting a Ring Style

Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call or other event. This ring or vibration is called an *alert*.






You can select one of 5 different ring styles. The ring style indicator in the display shows the current ring style (see page 32).

Each ring style contains settings for specific event alerts, ringer ID, and ringer and keypad volume. To change these settings, press  > **Settings** > **Ring Styles** > *Style Detail*.

## Setting Answer Options

You can use additional, alternative methods to answer an incoming call.

## Activating Vibe Sync

Some ring tones include vibrations. You can turn these vibrations on or off.

This setting does not affect game vibrations.

**Note:** You might feel your phone vibrate a little when you bump or move it. This is natural movement from the vibration unit, and does not affect phone performance or durability.

## Activating Rhythm Lights

Rhythm lights make your phone's display and keys flash in synchronization with music or sounds around you.

### Find the Feature

 > **Settings** > **Personalize**  
> **Rhythm Lights**

You can adjust the following options:

Option	Description
<b>Pattern</b>	Choose a light pattern to activate rhythm lights, or turn the lights <b>Off</b> .
<b>Timer</b>	Set the number of minutes rhythm lights stay active (up to 10 minutes).

Option	Description
<b>Sensitivity</b>	Set how loud the music has to be before rhythm lights respond. Values range from 1 (least sensitive) to 7 (most sensitive).

### Notes:

- Rhythm lights work only when your phone is idle and your battery is not low. Rhythm lights pause if you press a key or receive a call or message.
- Your phone can also flash for incoming calls and messages (see page 80). Some games might make your phone flash and vibrate.

## Setting Ring Lights

Set up your phone to display a light pattern when you receive an incoming call. To select a light pattern:

 > **Ring Lights**  
 > *light pattern*

The same light pattern displays for all incoming calls. You can use the light ID feature to display a distinctive light pattern when you receive calls from entries in a phonebook category. To set a light ID for a phonebook category, see page 80.





## Setting Event Lights

When event lights are activated, your phone displays a light pattern to notify you of the following events: incoming calls from phonebook categories, incoming text and voicemail messages, alarms, power up, power down, battery charging, Bluetooth<sup>®</sup> connect, Bluetooth activity, and Bluetooth disconnect.


To turn event lights on or off:

### Find the Feature

> **Event Lights** > **On** or **Off**




## Setting a Wallpaper Image

Set a photo, picture, or animation as a wallpaper (background) image in your phone's home screen. The wallpaper image appears as a faint watermark in text and menu displays.



**Note:** The display turns back on when you press any key.



# Setting Up a Bluetooth® Wireless Connection

Your phone supports Bluetooth wireless connections. You can set up a wireless link with a Bluetooth-enabled headset accessory, speakerphone, or handsfree car kit, or connect to a computer or hand-held device to exchange and synchronize data.


To connect your phone to a headset accessory or handsfree device:

> **Handsfree**  
> **[Look For Devices]**



Your phone displays a list of device(s) located within range of the phone. If your phone is already connected to a device, your phone lists the connected device and identifies it with a ✓ (in use) indicator.

To connect to a device, highlight the device name and press **SELECT** ()

The device may request permission to bond with your phone. Select **YES** () and enter the correct PIN code to create a secure connection with the device. When the connection is made, the  (Bluetooth) indicator or a **Bluetooth Connected** message displays in the home screen.

## Using Caller ID

### Incoming Calls



*Calling line identification* (caller ID) displays the phone number for incoming calls in your phone's external and internal displays.

The phone displays the caller's name (and picture ID, if available) when the name is stored in your phonebook, or **Incoming Call** when caller ID information is not available.

You can also set your phone to play a distinctive ringer ID for specific entries stored in your phonebook. For more information, see page 78.

## Outgoing Calls



You can show or hide your phone number as an ID for the calls that you make.

> **My Caller ID**

You can override the default caller ID setting when you make a call. While dialing (with digits visible in the display):

## Canceling an Incoming Call


## Calling an Emergency Number

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911 or 112, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked or the SIM card is not inserted.

**Note:** Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

## Dialing International Numbers

Press and hold  to insert the local international access code (+) for the country from which you are calling.



# Viewing Recent Calls

Your phone keeps lists of the calls you recently received and dialed, even if the calls did not connect. The lists are sorted from newest to oldest entries. The oldest entries are deleted as new entries are added.

If necessary, use the following procedure to store your voicemail phone number on your phone. Usually, your service provider has already done this for you.

## ***Exposure To Radio Frequency (RF) Energy***

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

Your Motorola phone is designed to comply with local regulatory requirements in your country concerning exposure of human beings to RF energy.

## ***Operational Precautions***

To assure optimal phone performance and make sure human exposure to RF energy is within the guidelines set forth in the relevant standards, always adhere to the following procedures.

### ***External Antenna Care***

Use only the supplied or Motorola-approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the phone.

Do NOT hold the external antenna when the phone is IN USE. Holding the external antenna affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than needed. - ALWAYS keep the phone more than 6 inches (15 centimeters) from your pacemaker when the phone is turned ON.
- NOT carry the phone in the breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.
- Turn OFF the phone immediately if you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.

### **Hearing Aids**

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

### **Other Medical Devices**

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

## ***Use While Driving***

Check the laws and regulations on the use of phones in the area where you drive. Always obey them.

When using your phone while driving, please:

- Give full attention to driving and to the road.
- Use hands-free operation, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.

## ***Operational Warnings***

### ***For Vehicles With an Air Bag***

Do not place a phone in the area over an air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Air bags inflate with great force. If a phone is placed in the air bag deployment area and the air bag inflates, the phone may be propelled with great force and cause serious injury to occupants of the vehicle.

### ***Potentially Explosive Atmospheres***

Turn off your phone prior to entering any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Do not remove, install, or charge batteries in such areas. Sparks in a potentially explosive atmosphere can cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

**Note:** The areas with potentially explosive atmospheres referred to above include fueling areas such as below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders. Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres are often but not always posted.






### ***Blasting Caps and Areas***

To avoid possible interference with blasting operations, turn OFF your phone when you are near electrical blasting caps, in a blasting area, or in areas posted “Turn off electronic devices.” Obey all signs and instructions.

## Batteries

Batteries can cause property damage and/or bodily injury such as burns if a conductive material such as jewelry, keys, or beaded chains touch exposed terminals. The conductive material may complete an electrical circuit (short circuit) and become quite hot. Exercise care in handling any charged battery, particularly when placing it inside a pocket, purse, or other container with metal objects. **Use only Motorola original batteries and chargers.**

Your battery or phone may contain symbols, defined as follows:

Symbol	Definition
	Important safety information will follow.
	Your battery or phone should not be disposed of in a fire.
	Your battery or phone may require recycling in accordance with local laws. Contact your local regulatory authorities for more information.
	Your battery or phone should not be thrown in the trash.
	Your phone contains an internal lithium ion battery.

## Seizures/Blackouts

Some people may be susceptible to epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, such as when watching television or playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout.

If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult with your doctor before playing video games on your phone or enabling a flashing-lights feature on your phone. (The flashing-light feature is not available on all products.)

Parents should monitor their children's use of video game or other features that incorporate flashing lights on the phones. All persons should discontinue use and consult a doctor if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements, or disorientation.

To limit the likelihood of such symptoms, please take the following safety precautions:

- Do not play or use a flashing-lights feature if you are tired or need sleep.
- Take a minimum of a 15-minute break hourly.
- Play in a room in which all lights are on.
- Play at the farthest distance possible from the screen.

## ***Repetitive Motion Injuries***

When you play games on your phone, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. Follow these instructions to avoid problems such as tendonitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, or other musculoskeletal disorders:

- Take a minimum 15-minute break every hour of game playing.
- If your hands, wrists, or arms become tired or sore while playing, stop and rest for several hours before playing again.
- If you continue to have sore hands, wrists, or arms during or after play, stop playing and see a doctor.

# ***Wireless Phone Safety Tips***

*“Safety is your most important call!”*

**Your Motorola wireless telephone gives you the powerful ability to communicate by voice—almost anywhere, anytime, wherever wireless phone service is available and safe conditions allow. But an important responsibility accompanies the benefits of wireless phones, one that every user must uphold.**

**When driving a car, driving is your first responsibility. If you find it necessary to use your wireless phone while behind the wheel of a car, practice good common sense and remember the following tips:**

- 1 Get to know your Motorola wireless phone and its features such as speed dial and redial.** If available, these features help you to place your call without taking your attention off the road.
- 2 When available, use a handsfree device.** If possible, add an additional layer of convenience to your wireless

phone with one of the many Motorola Original™ handsfree accessories available today.



- 3 Position your wireless phone within easy reach.** Be able to access your wireless phone without removing your eyes from the road. If you receive an incoming call at an inconvenient time, if possible, let your voice mail answer it for you.
- 4 Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.** Rain, sleet, snow, ice, and even heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- 5 If you receive an incoming call at an inconvenient time do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.** Jotting down a “to do” list or going through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility—driving safely.
- 6 Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic.** Try to plan calls when your car will be stationary. If you need to make a call while moving, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- 7 Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting.** Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations which have the potential to divert your attention away from the road.
- 8 Use your wireless phone to call for help.** Dial 9-1-1 or other local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident or medical emergencies.\*



- 9 Use your wireless phone to help others in emergencies.** If you see an auto accident, crime in progress or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call 9-1-1 or other local emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.\*
- 10 Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless assistance number when necessary.** If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or other special non-emergency wireless number.\*

\* Wherever wireless phone service is available.

**Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless telephones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.**
