

Battery Tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength, temperature, features, and accessories you use.

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below -10°C (14°F) or above 45°C (113°F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.

Contact your local recycling center for proper battery disposal.




Installing the Battery

Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories.


1. Press in the battery door, release latch and remove the battery door.




2. Follow arrows to insert battery.



3. Replace the battery door.



4. Close the battery door.




Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

To charge the battery:

1. Insert the charger into the USB connector on your phone as shown.




- 2. Plug the other end of the charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3. When your phone indicates Charge Complete, remove the charger.

Tip: You can safely leave the charger connected to your phone after charging is complete. This will **not** damage the battery.

Note: When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator in the upper right corner of the display shows how much of the charging process is complete. At least 1 segment of the battery level indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.

Turning Your Phone On

- 1. Open your phone.
- 2. Press and hold the power key for 3 seconds.
- 3. If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code (the last 4 digits of your phone number) and press the right soft key to unlock the phone.



Making a Call

- 1. Press keypad keys to dial the phone number.
- Press (to make the call.
- 3. Press to end the call and "hang up" the phone when you are finished.

-or-

4. Close the flip.

Tip: You can set the phone to answer calls when you open the flip.

To activate, press Menu > Settings > In-Call Setup > **Answer Options > Open To Answer**

Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

Press the answer key to answer a call.

-or-

• Press 👀

-or-

• Open the flip to answer the phone.



• Press to end the call and "hang up" the phone when you are finished.

-or-

Close the flip.

Adjusting Volume

Press up or down on volume keys to:


- increase or decrease earpiece volume during an active call
- temporarily silence an incoming call alert
- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the home screen is visible (flip must be open)

Tip: At the lowest volume setting, press the down volume key once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it again to switch to silent alert. Press the up volume key to cycle back to vibrate alert, then ring alert.

Change Call Alert

Phone Flip Open


In the home screen, press the down volume key to switch to lower call alert volume, then switch to vibrate and, finally, silent alert. Press the up



volume key to cycle back from silent alert to vibrate and then to the lowest alert volume setting.

Phone Flip Closed

Press the up or down volume key, then press the smart/ speakerphone key to scroll through the alert styles: Loud, Soft, Vibrate, Vibe then **Ring**, and **Silent**. The alert



styles are shown on the external screen.

After scrolling to the desired alert style, press the up or down volume key to save the setting and return to the home screen.

Viewing Your Phone Number

To view your phone number from the home screen, press Menu > Phone Status > My Tel. Number

While you are on a call, press **Options** > My Tel. Number.

Installing and Removing the Memory Card

You can install a removable memory card in your phone. This card provides additional storage for pictures, animations, sounds, and video clips.

CAUTION: Do not bend or scratch your memory card. Avoid exposing your memory card to static electricity, water, or dirt.


Installing the Memory Card

4. Replace the battery and the battery door.







Amp'd Live™ offers a variety of ways for you to load up on entertainment. Mix and match to create your own blend of permanent and temporary ownership.

Option	Description

Album	Display an alphabetical list of the albums on your phone. Just select the album you want to hear. You can then play all songs on the album or a specific song.
Song	Display an alphabetical list of all songs on your phone. Select the songs you want to play.
My List	Display all the songs that you chose to Add2MyList from anywhere in Music.
Playlist	Display all playlists on your phone. Select a playlist, then play all songs on that playlist or only a specific song.

Using the Media Player

After you select the songs you want to play, use the Media Player to control playback.

Option	Description
Play/Pause	Press the Center Select Key • to play a song.
	While a song is playing, press $\textcircled{\bullet}$ to pause it. Press $\textcircled{\bullet}$ again to continue playing it.
Stop	Press 🚱 up to turn off the song. The next time you play the song, it will start at the beginning.
Next	Press 🚱 right to skip ahead to the next song.
Restart	Press 🚱 left to restart a song from the beginning.
Previous	Press 🚱 left <i>twice</i> to skip back to the previous song.
Fast Forward	Press and hold 🚱 right to fast-forward the song.
Rewind	Press and hold <a> left to scroll backwards in the song.
Volume	Press your phone's volume keys (on the left side of the phone) up and down to adjust volume levels.

Organize Your Music

My Stuff includes a built-in playlist called MyList. You can change MyList by adding, deleting, or moving songs on your phone. You can create and manage additional playlists on your computer and then copy them to your phone.

To add a song to **MyList**:

- 1. Go to **My Stuff**.
- Select Music.
- 3. Find the song you want to add.
- 4. Select Menu.
- 5. Select Add2MyList.

To delete or move a song in **MyList**:

- 1. Go to My Stuff.
- Select Music.
- 3. Select Playlist.
- 4. Select MyList.
- Select Menu.
- 6. Select the appropriate command to make your changes.

Move Up moves the current song up one slot in MyList.

Move Down moves the current song down one slot in MyList.

Delete removes the current song from **MyList**.

Play Videos

Use the Media Player to play downloaded videos.

- 1. Go to **My Stuff**.
- Select Video.

- 3. Select the category where you expect to find the video you want to play.
- 4. Select the title you want to play.
- 5. Press the **Center Select Key** to play the video. Use the Media Player to control video playback.

Plav Games

When you're ready to play a downloaded or subscription game, you'll find it in My Stuff.

- 1. Go to My Stuff.
- 2. Select Games and Applications.
- 3. Select the title or subscription you want to play.
- 4. Press the **Center Select Key** to start the game.

Run Applications

To run an application you have installed, downloaded, or subscribed to:



Taking and Sending a Photo

From the home screen, press the camera key @ to activate your phone's camera.

The active viewfinder image appears on your phone's display.



- 1 Displays when you activate the camera. Press 📀 left or right to zoom in or out on an image. Press (up or down to change settings for lighting conditions, style, and zoom. Then press 📀 left or right to change levels.
- Press **Options** to view the Options menu.
- 3 Press **Exit** to return to previous screen.

Press the **Center Select Key** • to take a photo. Point the camera lens at the photo subject, then:

- 1. Press the camera key 🖭 to take a photo.
 - -or-

Press the Center Select Key (.).

2. Press Options to view storage options: Store Only, Apply as Wallpaper, Apply as Screensaver or Apply as Phonebook Entry.

If you choose to store the photo, continue to step 3.

Press the key to delete the photo and return to the active viewfinder.

3. Press **Send** to Send in Message.

Taking a Self Portrait

- 1. Press **◎**♥, then close the flip.
 - -or-

With the flip closed, press and hold the camera key (below volume keys) on the side of the phone.

- 2. Hold the camera with the lens aimed at yourself. Use the external display as a viewfinder.
- 3. Press the **key** below volume keys on the side of the phone to capture the photo.

Pictures Menu Options


When the camera is active, press **Options** to open the **Pictures Menu**. The menu can include the following options:

Option	Description
Go To Pictures	View pictures and photos stored on your phone.
Switch Storage Device	Save the photo on optional memory card (TRANS-T-Flash), if installed, or on phone memory (Phone).
Auto-Timed Capture	Set a timer for the camera to take a photo.
Capture Title	Assign a name to a captured photo.
Camera Setup	Open the setup menu to adjust picture settings (Resolution, Quality).
View Free Space	See how much memory remains for storing photos.

Recording and Playing Video Clips

From the home screen, press and hold the camera key to activate your phone's video camera. You can navigate between picture and video mode when you press and hold the camera key.

The active viewfinder image appears on your phone's display.



- 1 Displays when you press 📀 to change video settings.
- Press **Options** to view the **Videos Menu**.

Return to previous screen.

Point the camera lens at the video subject, then:

Press and hold the Camera key to activate the Video Camera.

Recording Video Clips

Press the **Center Select Key** • to start recording. Point the camera lens at the video subject, then:

- 1. Press and hold the Camera key to activate the Video Camera.
 - -or-

Press Menu > Camera & Pics > Video Camera

- 2. Press the **Center Select Key** (a) to begin recording. -or-
 - Press Options to open the Videos Menu to select other options as described in the table below.
- 3. Press the **Stop** key to stop recording, or press the **Center Select Key** • while recording to stop.
- 4. Press the Options key or the Center Select Key to save the captured video clip or press the **Send** key to add a message attachment.

When the Video Camera is active, press **Options** to open the **Videos Menu**. The menu can include the following options:

Playing Video Clips

- 1. Press Menu > Camera & Pics > Videos > Video Clip

- 3. Press left or right to rewind or fast forward though the video clip.
- 4. Press Options to open Videos Menu.

Note: Videos are preset to a default recording length. This length can be extended in the **Videos Menu**.

You can send and receive video clips in multimedia messages.

To play a video clip stored on your phone:

Multimedia Message

A *Multimedia Messaging Service* (MMS) message contains one or more slides with text and media objects (including photos, pictures, animations, sounds, voice records, and/or video clips). You can send the multimedia message to other wireless phone users, and to email addresses.

Creating and Sending a Multimedia Message

- Press Menu > Messaging > Create Message
 New MMS Message
- 2. Press keypad keys to enter text.
- 3. Press Options to open the MMS Menu.
- 4. Press 🚱 to select **Insert**. This will display a list of items you can insert in the message.
- 5. Press 📀 to scroll to a type of object to insert.

- 6. Press **Select** key to select the object type.
- 7. Press 🚱 highlight the object you want.
- 8. Press **Center Select** key to insert the object.
 To add another object to the message, continue.
 To send the message, go to step 12.
- 9. Press **Options** to open the **MMS Menu** to insert a new object.
- 10. Press (to Select Insert. This will display a list of items you can insert in the message.
- 11. Press the **Insert** key to insert a new object after the current object
 Repeat steps 3 to 10 to enter contents for the new object.
- 12. Press the **Send To** key to send the message. You can select a contact from the **Contact** list or add a new

number and/or email address.

-or-

Press **Options** to delete the page, preview, set page timing, save as a template, view message details, save to drafts, change entry mode, change entry setup or cancel message.

Receiving a Multimedia Message

When you receive a multimedia message or letter, your phone displays the

☐ (message waiting) indicator and a **New Message** notification, and sounds an alert.

Press **Read** key to open the message.

Multimedia messages that you receive can contain different media objects:

- Photos, pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file, or video clip begins playing when its slide is displayed. Use the volume keys to adjust the volume as the sound file or video clip plays.
 - Note: In a multimedia letter, you may have to highlight an indicator in the text to play a sound file or video clip.
- Attached files are added to the end of the message. To open the attachment, highlight the file indicator/ filename and press the View key (image file type), **Play** key (sound file or video clip), or **Open** key (object such as **Contacts** or datebook entry, or unknown file type).

Note: File names for stored multimedia objects cannot exceed 36 characters.

Bluetooth® Connections

Your phone supports Bluetooth® connections. You can connect your phone to a Bluetooth® headset or car kit, or connect to another device to exchange and synchronize files.

Your phone currently supports the following Bluetooth profiles:

- headset (optional Motorola Original[™] accessory)
- Handsfree Car Kit (optional Motorola Original accessory)

For more information about Bluetooth® wireless connections supported by this device, go to FAQs www.motorola.com/bluetooth.

Note: All multimedia (video player, audio player, shutter tones) will play from the speakerphone when your phone is connected to another Bluetooth device.

Turn Bluetooth® Power On or Off

Press Menu > Settings > Connection > Bluetooth Link > Setup > Power > On

Note: To extend battery life, use the above procedure and set Bluetooth® power to Off when not in use. If you turn Bluetooth® power Off, your phone will not connect to accessories until you turn Bluetooth® power **On** and reconnect to the accessories.

Pairing with a Headset, Handsfree Device, or PC

Before you try to connect to another Bluetooth device, make sure your phone's Bluetooth® power is On and the device is in *pairing mode* (see the user guide for the device). You cannot perform pairing while your phone is connected to another device.

To pair your phone to a headset accessory, handsfree car kit, or PC that supports Bluetooth® wireless connections:



Using the Display

The home screen displays when you are not on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number.




- Date
- Left Soft Key Label
- Clock
- 4 Right Soft Key Label

Note: Because you can customize the soft key settings, your home screen soft key labels may be different than the ones shown above.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left or right soft key to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.

Your phone will display digital clock in the home screen.

The following status indicators can display:



- **Roam Indicator** Shows when your phone is seeking or using another network outside your home network.
- **Signal Strength Indicator** Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the Υ (no signal) indicator or \(\gamma \otimes \) (no transmit) indicator displays.
- 3 Data Coverage Indicator Shows the type of data signal your phone is using:
- 1X = shows when your phone is in a 1x-RTT coverage area, access to files under 200K
- **EU** = shows when your phone is in a 1x-EVDO coverage area. Broadband speeds full access to Amp'd Live™

Message Indicator Displays when you receive a new message. Indicators can include:

• voicemail and text message	

When you enter a text or picture message using the messaging feature, a number in the message entry area shows the number of characters remaining on the current page (text message) or the message size (multimedia message or letter).

- 5 **Battery Level Indicator** Vertical bars show the battery charge level. Recharge the battery when **Low Battery** displays and you hear an audible battery alert.
- **Ring Alert Indicator** Shows alert style setting:



Using the 5-Way Navigation Key

Use the **5-Way Navigation Key** (to scroll up, down, left, or right through the menu system, highlight menu items, change feature settings, and play games. Press the **Center Select Key** (to select a highlighted menu item.

Using Menus

From the home screen, press **Menu** to enter the main menu.



- 1 **Left Soft Key** Perform functions identified by left display prompt.
- **Center Select Key** From home screen, press to open main menu.
- Right Soft Key Perform functions identified by right display prompt.


To select a menu feature, starting from the home screen:

Press Menu > Recent Calls > Dialed

This example shows that from the home screen, you must press **Menu**, scroll to and select **Recent Calls** from the main menu, then scroll to and select **Dialed**. Press to scroll, and the left/right soft keys to select the functions displayed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

Selecting a Feature Option

Some features require you to select an option from a list:



- 1 Press **Options** to open the submenu.
- 2 Highlighted option.
- 3 Press the **Back** key to return to the previous screen.

Press the **Center Select Key ()** to view details of highlighted option.

Press to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.

In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.

In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.

When an option has a list of possible values, press left or right to scroll through and select a value.

When an option has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.



Choosing a Text Entry Method

Multiple text entry methods make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The method you select remains active until you select another mode.

Press # in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry methods:

Primary	The primary text entry method (see below to set).
Numeric	Enter numbers only (see page 32).
Symbol	Enter symbols only (see page 32).

Alternatively, you can select a text entry method (Primary, Secondary, Numeric or Symbol) in any text entry screen by pressing **Options** > **Entry Mode**.

Setting Up a Text Entry Method

Press **Options** > **Entry Setup** from any text entry screen. Select **Primary or Secondary Setup**, then choose:




- Press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through its characters.
- Press 🚱 left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized. If necessary, press 🕏 down to force the character to lowercase before the cursor moves to the next position.

• If you enter or edit information and do not want to save the changes, press to exit without saving.

Using iTAP[™] Method

iTAP software provides a predictive text entry method that lets you enter a word using 1 key press per letter. This can be faster than Tap method, because your phone combines the key presses into common words.

For example, if you press 7 7 6 4, letter combinations that match your keypresses display:



- Press **Select** to lock highlighted combination.
- 2 Press **Delete** to delete the last letter.
- 3 Press 📀 up to accept **Program**.
- 4 Press 🕏 right to highlight another combination. Press * to enter **Prog** and a space.

If you want a different word (such as Progress), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

Entering Words

In a text entry screen, you can press ★ to switch entry methods. An indicator shows which method is active (see page 29).

- 1. Press keypad keys (1 press per letter) to show possible letter combinations at the bottom of the display.
- 2. Press 🚱 left or right to highlight the combination you want.
- 3. Press **Select** key to lock a highlighted combination. You can press keypad keys to add more letters to the end of the combination.

-or-

Press # to enter the highlighted combination when it spells a word.

A space is automatically inserted after the word.

If you enter a word your phone does not recognize, the phone stores it to use as one of your word options. When you fill memory space for unrecognized words, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new words.

Using Numeric Method

In a text entry screen, press
to switch entry methods until the 123 (numeric) indicator displays.

Press keypad keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press **★** to switch to another entry method.

Using Symbol Method

In a text entry screen, press
to switch entry methods until the @(symbol) indicator displays.

1. Press keypad keys (1 press per symbol) to show possible symbol combinations at the bottom of the display.

- 2. Press 📀 left or right to highlight the combination you want.
- 3. Press **Select** key to lock a highlighted combination. You can press keypad keys to add more symbols to the end of the combination.

-or-

Press # enter the highlighted combination.

Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, then:

- 1. Press the key to delete 1 letter at a time.
- 2. Hold the 🖼 key to delete all the text, 1 word at a time.

Using the External Display

When the flip is closed, you can use the external display for the following:

- View time, date, and phone status information.
- Read messages that notify you of incoming calls and other events.
- Use the external display as a viewfinder when you take a self portrait with the phone's camera.
- When you use a Bluetooth® headset for speech recognition, view speech-activated dialing commands and other status information.

Using a Removable Memory Card

Note: See page 8 for instructions on inserting and removing a memory card.

Note: You should format a memory card before you can use it.

You can use an optional removable memory card with your phone to store additional multimedia objects such as photos, video clips, and graphics.

Memory Card Tips

- File names for multimedia objects must be less than 12 characters.
- Do not remove the memory card while reading or writing files. Otherwise, the card may be damaged.

- The memory card is recognized as removable memory when connected to a personal computer.
- When you disconnect the phone with the memory card from a personal computer, remove the USB storage equipment on your personal computer. Otherwise, files stored on the memory card could be damaged.

Managing a Memory Card

To manage an inserted memory card:

Press Menu > Phone Status > Storage Devices

- 1. Press 📀 to scroll to the memory card. Note: Phone memory is always listed last.
- 2. Press Center Select key to view memory card information.

-or-

Press **Menu** to open the Storage Device menu to perform other procedures (see the table below).

The Storage Device menu can include the following options:

Option	Description
Format	Format the memory card.

Formatting the Memory Card

It is recommended that you format the memory card before you attempt to store any multimedia objects on it.

Note: Formatting the memory card will erase any data already on the card.

- 1. With the phone powered off, insert the memory card into the phone (see page 8).
- 2. Turn on the phone.



- 3. When the phone is completely powered on, press Menu.
- 4. Scroll to Phone Status and press the Select key.
- 5. Scroll to **Storage Devices** and press the **Select** key.
- 6. Scroll to Trans T-Flash and press the Options key.
- 7. Scroll to Format and press the Select key. The phone displays Formatting will erase all data.
- 8. Press the **Yes** key to begin formatting the memory card.

-or-

Press the **No** key to exit without formatting the card.

Storing Multimedia Objects

When a memory card is inserted into your phone, you must select the card before you can store objects to or access objects on it. Use the Switch Storage Device option in the Pictures Menu, Videos Menu, or Tones & Graphics Menu.

Viewing Memory Card Contents

To view the contents of an inserted memory card:

Press Menu > Tools > Sounds

-or-

Press Menu > Camera & Pics

- 1. Scroll to and select the desired multimedia object (Pictures, Sounds, or Videos).
- 2. Press **Options** to open the menu for the selected multimedia object.
- 3. Scroll to and select **Switch Storage Devices**.
- Scroll to and select TRANS-T-Flash.

Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's built-in handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press the upper left smart key to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call. A soft audio alert confirms activation/deactivation.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays **Spkrphone On** in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press the speakerphone key again or turn the phone off.

Note: The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.

Turning On Airplane Mode

Note: Consult airline staff about the use of Airplane Mode in flight. Turn off your phone whenever instructed to do so by airline staff.

Airplane Mode allows you to disable your phone's radio frequency functions and still use other applications (such as the calculator or datebook functions). This may enable you to use these applications while on an airplane.

Press Menu > Tools > Airplane Mode

Changing a Code, PIN, or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has not reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock



code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.

To change a code or password:

Press Menu > Settings > Security > New Passwords

Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, but you must unlock it to answer.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked.

Locking Your Phone Manually

Press Menu > Settings > Security > Phone Lock > Lock Now

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter your unlock code.
- 2. Press the Center Select Key (to lock the phone.

Unlocking Your Phone

Your phone's unlock code is originally set to 1234. Your service provider may reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number.

At the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter your unlock code.
- 2. Press the Center Select Key 🕟 to unlock your phone.

Setting Your Phone to Lock Automatically

You can set your phone to lock every time you turn it off:

Press Menu > Settings > Security > Phone Lock > Automatic Lock > On

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter your unlock code.
- 2. Press the **Center Select Key** (•) to activate automatic lock.

If You Forget a Code or Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset the unlock code to the last 4 digits of your phone number before you receive your phone.

If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last 4 digits of your phone number. If that does not work, contact your service provider.

If you forget your security code or call barring password, contact your service provider.

Storing Your Name and Phone Number

To view your phone number, go to **Menu** > Phone Status > My Tel. Number -or-

from the home screen press **CLR** then #.

Setting an Alert Style

Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call or other event. This ring or vibration is called an alert.

You can select 1 of 5 different alert styles: **Loud**, **Soft**, Vibrate, Vibe then Ring, Silent. The alert style indicator in the display shows the current alert style.

To set an alert style:

Press Menu > Settings > Ring Styles

- 1. Press 🚱 to scroll to **Style.**
- Press Change key to access the list of alert styles.
- Press 🕏 to scroll to the desired alert style.
- 4. Press **Select** key to select the alert style.

Each alert style contains settings for specific event alerts, ringer ID, and ringer and keypad volume. To change these settings, press **Menu** > **Settings**

> Ring Styles >style Detail

Note: When your phone is connected to a charger or other accessory, the call ringer defaults to **Loud** and uses the current **Loud Detail** setting.

Setting Answer Options

You can use additional methods for answering calls:

Press Menu > Settings > In-Call Setup > Answer Options

Option	Description
Multi-key	answer by pressing any key
Open to Answer	answer by opening the flip

Setting a Wallpaper Image

You can set the same photo, picture, or animation as a wallpaper (background) image on your phone's home screen and external display.

Press Menu > Settings > Personalize > Wallpaper

- *Press* (•) to scroll to **Picture**.
- 2. Press **Change** key to open the picture viewer.
- 3. Press 🕏 up or down to scroll to a picture, animation, or photo. Scroll to (None) to turn off the wallpaper image. -or-

Press Options > Switch Storage Device, then **()** up or down to open the **Storage Devices** menu, scroll to and select TRANS-T-Flash (the removable memory card), then scroll to a picture, animation, or photo.

- 4. Press Center Select key to select the image.
- 5. Press 📀 to scroll to Layout.
- 6. Press Change key to adjust the image layout.
- 7. Press 📀 to scroll to **Center**, **Tile**, or **Fit-to-screen**.
- 8. Press **Select** key to confirm the layout setting.



9. Press **Back** key to save wallpaper settings.

Tip: Set the resolution to the **Low** setting on your camera when taking pictures to be applied as wallpaper. Low resolution photos display best when applied as Fitto-Screen as wallpaper.

Setting a Screen Saver Image

Set a photo, picture, or animation as a screen saver image.

The screen saver image displays when the phone is on and no activity is detected for a specified time. An animation repeats for 1 minute, then the first frame of the animation displays.

Tip: Turn off the screen saver to extend battery life.

Press Menu > Settings > Personalize > Screen Saver

- 1. Press 📀 to scroll to **Picture**.
- 2. Press **Change** key to open the picture viewer.
- 3. Press 🕏 up or down to scroll to a picture, animation, or photo. Scroll to (None) to turn off the screen saver image.

-or

Press Options > Switch Storage Device, then �� up or down to open the **Storage Devices** menu, scroll to and select TRANS-T-Flash (the removable memory card), then scroll to a picture, animation, or photo.

- 4. Press **Select** key to select the image.
- 5. Press 📀 scroll to **Delay**. Note: Setting **Delay** to **Off** disables the screen saver feature.
- 6. Press **Change** key to set the delay interval.
- 7. Press 📀 to scroll to the inactivity interval that triggers the screen saver.

- 8. Press **Select** key to confirm the delay setting.
- 9. Press **Back** key to save the screen saver settings.

Setting Display Brightness

Press Menu > Settings > Initial Setup > Brightness

Adjusting the Backlight

Set the amount of time that the display and keypad backlights remain on.

Press Menu > Settings > Initial Setup > Backlight

Conserving Battery Power

Some networks and phones include a battery save setting to extend battery life. When this feature is activated, your phone automatically turns off the keypad backlight when it detects that enough ambient light is available.

Press Menu > Settings > Initial Setup > Battery Save

Changing the Active Line

Change the active phone line to make and receive calls from your other phone number.

Press Menu > Phone Status > Active Line

Redialing a Number

- 1. Press (to view the Recent Calls list.
- 2. Press 📀 to scroll to the entry you want to call.
- 3. Press (c) to redial the number.

Using Automatic Redial

When you receive a busy signal, your phone displays Call Failed, Number Busy.

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number for 4 minutes. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates 1 time, displays **Redial Successful**, and then connects the call.

You must turn on automatic redial to use the feature. To turn automatic redial on or off:

Press Menu > Settings > Initial Setup > Auto Redial

When automatic redial is turned off, you can manually activate the feature to redial a phone number. When you hear a fast busy signal and see **Call Failed**:

Press or **RETRY** key to activate automatic redial.

Turning Off a Call Alert

You can turn off your phone's incoming call alert before answering the call.

Press either volume key to turn off the alert for a current incoming call.

Calling an Emergency Number

Your service provider programs 1 or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked.

Note: Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

- 1. Press keypad keys to dial the emergency number.
- 2. Press © call the emergency number.

Viewing Recent Calls

Your phone keeps lists of the calls you recently received and dialed, even if the calls did not connect. Lists are sorted from newest to oldest entries. Oldest entries are deleted as new entries are added.

Press Menu > Recent Calls

Shortcut: Press from the home screen to view the recent calls list.

- 1. Press 📀 to scroll to **Received** calls or Dialed calls.
- 2. Press **Select** key to select the list. ✓ means the call connected.



3. Press (to call the entry's number. Press to send the number as DTMF tones during a call.

Press Center Select key to view entry details.

-or-

Press Options to open the Last Calls Menu to perform various operations on the entry.

Returning an Unanswered Call

Your phone keeps a record of your unanswered calls, and displays:

- the (missed call) indicator
- X Missed Calls, where X is the number of missed calls
- 1. Press **Select** key to see the received calls list.
- 2. Press 🚱 **to** select a call to return.
- 3. Press (to make the call.

Using the Notepad

The most recent set of digits entered on the keypad are stored in your phone's notepad memory. This can be a phone number that you called, or a number that you entered but did not call. To retrieve the number stored in the notepad:

Press Menu > Recent Calls > Notepad

1. Press (to call the number.

Press Options to open the Dialing Menu to attach a number or insert a special character.

Press **Store** key to create a **Contacts** entry with the number in the No. field.

Attaching a Number

While dialing (with digits visible in the display):

Press **Options** > **Attach Number** to attach a number from the **Contacts** or **Recent Calls** lists.

Calling with Speed Dial

Each entry you store in **Contacts** is assigned a unique speed dial number.

You can change an entry's speed dial number.

To see an entry's speed dial number, press **Menu** > Contacts, scroll to the entry, and press the Center Select kev.

To speed dial a **Contacts** entry:

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter the speed dial number for the entry you want to call.
- 2. Press # to submit the number.
- 3. Press (to call the entry.

Calling with 1-Touch Dial

To call **Contacts** entries 1 through 9, press and hold the single-digit speed dial number for 1 second.

Using Voicemail

Voicemail messages that you receive are stored on the network. To listen to your messages, you must call your voicemail phone number.

Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

Listening to Voicemail Messages

Press Menu > Messaging > Voicemail

The phone calls your voicemail phone number. If no voicemail number is stored, your phone prompts you to store a number.

Receiving a Voicemail Message

When you receive a voicemail message, your phone displays the (voicemail message) indicator and a New Voicemail notification.

Press **Call** key to listen to the message.

The phone calls your voicemail phone number. If no voicemail number is stored, your phone prompts you to store a number.

Muting a Call

1. Press Mute key.

Using DTMF Tones

You can send numbers to the network as dual tone multi-frequency (DTMF) tones during a call. Use DTMF tones to communicate with automated systems that require you to submit a PIN code, password, or credit card number.

To set DTMF tones to be long, short, or off:

Press Menu > Settings > Initial Setup

- 1. Press 📀 to scroll to **DTMF**.
- 2. Press **Change** key to access the list of DTMF options.
- 3. Press 📀 to scroll to the desired options.
- 4. Press **Select** key to select the DTMF option.

Short sends a short, fixed-duration tone for each key you press. **Long** sends each tone for as long as you press the key. Some systems (such as home answering machines) may require long tones for proper activation.

Sending DTMF Tones During a Call

Using the Keypad

- 1. Press keypad keys to enter a number to send.
- 2. Press Options to open the Call Menu.
- 3. Press 🚱 to scroll to Send Tones.
- 4. Press **Select** key to send the number to the network as DTMF tones.

Sending a Stored Number

During a call, highlight a number in **Contacts** or the Recent Calls lists, then:

Press (c) to make the call.

Use the **Call** command to place a call in 2 different ways:

- Dial a **Contacts** entry by speaking the name of the entry.
- Dial any number by speaking the digits in the number.
- 1. Press and release the voice button on the right side of the phone. You phone displays **Say a command**, followed by a list of speech commands.
- 2. Say "Call," then say the name of the **Contacts** entry, or speak the digits of the phone number.
 - For example, to call the mobile number for a Contacts entry named Bill Smith, you would say "Call Bill Smith mobile." (If the entry included only 1 number for Bill Smith, you would simply state "Call Bill Smith.")
 - Similarly, to call the phone number 312-555-1212, you would say "Call 312-555-1212." If the phone recognizes the name or number, it places the call.
 - If the phone asks you to repeat a name or number, say it again. If the name or number is not valid or is not recognized, the phone does not place the call.
 - If the phone does not recognize the name or number, it displays a list of up to 3 names or numbers, asks, "Did you say ...," and highlights that first item in the list.
 - If the name or number is correct, say "Yes" to place the call.
 - If the name or number is not correct, say "No" to go to the next item on the list.
 - To select the name or number manually, scroll to the name or number on the list and press the Center Select
 - To exit the list, say "Cancel."
 - If you reach the end of the list without confirming a number, the phone says, "Sorry, no match found." To try to place the call again, press the **Repeat** key, say "Call," and clearly speak the name or number.

Tip: Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, pronouncing each digit distinctly. Avoid pausing between digits.

9 | SPECIFIC ABSORBTION RATE DATA

The model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg. ¹ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure.
