Listening for a Lifetime

Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. VocoPro and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to a higher volume of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

To establish a safe level:

- · Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

- Set the dial and leave it there.
- Pay attention to the different levels in various recordings.

Taking a minute to do this now will help to prevent hearing damage or loss in the future. After all, we want you listening for a lifetime.

Used wisely, your new sound equipment will provide a lifetime of fun and enjoyment. Since hearing damage from loud noise is often undetectable until it is too late, this manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group recommend you avoid prolonged exposure to excessive noise. This list of sound levels is included for your protection.

Some common decibel ranges:

Mounting the DVX-890K

Mounting

Use the included mounting brackets to mount the DVX-890K into a 19" rack case. The DVX-890K requires 2 RUs of available rackspace.

Installing the Mounting Brackets onto the DVX-890K


Position the mounting brackets on the DVX-890K with the tabs facing away from the player. Line up the two holes on the mounting bracket with two holes on the sides of the DVX-890K. Use the included screws to secure the brackets on each side of the DVX-890K.


Mounting the DVX-890K


To mount, carefully place the DVX-890K in the rack space of your case. The DVX-890K takes 4 screws to mount. Make sure holes are aligned evenly. Use an alternating "X" rotation when screwing to ensure even tension and alignment.


















Getting Connected

Setting the correct video mode

Depending on which video connection you are using, you may need to change the **DVX-890K's** video output settings by pressing the **V-MODE** button on the remote control.


The **V-MODE** button toggles between the following modes:

P-Scan: Standard video mode.

SCART: When using the SCART output

S-Video: When using the S-Video output

YUV: When using the Component outputs



Connect up to two microphones to the DVX-890K, by connecting a $\frac{1}{4}$ " cable to the MIC 1 and 2 inputs on the DVX-890K.

NOTE: Microphone vocals are only output from the MIC and MUSIC OUT on the rear panel of the DVX-890K. You will not hear the vocals if you are not outputting from these outputs.

| CD-E |

- 1. POWER button This button turns the unit ON/OFF.
- 2. **NUMBER PAD** Press to select a track or file for direct playback.
- 3. **DISC TRAY** Insert discs here using the OPEN/CLOSE ▲ button on the player or the EJECT button on the remote control.
- 4. PLAY/PAUSE | button PLAYS a disc while it is stopped or paused and PAUSES a disc that is playing.
- 5. **OPEN/CLOSE** ▲ button Opens and closes the disc tray.
- 6. MIC VOLUME 1 and 2 Individual volume control for each mic.
- 7. **ECHO LEVEL** Controls level of ECHO effect on both mics.
- 8. **MIC 1** and **MIC 2** inputs Connect 1/4" MIC cables (or line cables for wireless systems) here. NOTE: Microphone vocals are only output from the MIC and MUSIC OUT on the rear panel of the DVX-890K. You will not hear the vocals if you are not outputting from these outputs.
- 9. AUDIO button Switch between AC-3 5.1-channel and AC-3 2-channel audio output.
- 10. DISPLAY WINDOW Shows disc tray status and time display.
- 11. L/R Switch between four playback modes for multiplex CD+Gs:


LEFT-MONO: Left channel only (no vocals) **RIGHT-MONO**: Right channel only (no music)

MIX-MONO: Virtual stereo

STEREO: Left and Right true stereo

- 12. USB PORT Connect USB thumb drive here.
- 13. SD CARD PORT Connect SD card here.
- 14. PREV / NEXT buttons Press these buttons to advance to the NEXT or reverse to the PREVIOUS track.
- 15. **DIGITAL KEY CONTROL** buttons UP raises the key and DOWN lowers the key. Natural returns the key to normal.
- 16. STOP button STOPS a disc that is playing.

REAR PANEL



- HDMI OUTPUT jack This jack is for connecting to HDMI compatible devices.
 NOTE: Microphone vocals are only output from the MIC and MUSIC OUT on the rear panel of the DVX-890K.
- 2. **COMPONENT VIDEO OUT (Y/Pb/Pr)** jacks These jacks output VIDEO to a TV or monitor via COMPONENT VIDEO cables. COMPONENT VIDEO outputs the different color signals (Pr/Pb) and luminance signal (Y) separately in order to achieve high fidelity in reproducing colors. The description of the component video output connectors may differ depending on the TV set or monitor (e.g. Pr/Pb Y, Cr/Cb/Y, R-Y/B-Y/Y, etc.). Please refer to the operating instructions of the TV set or monitor for details.
- 3. **5.1 CH. AUDIO OUTPUT** jacks These jacks are for connecting to 5.1 channel ready amplifiers/receivers. NOTE: Microphone vocals are only output from the MIC and MUSIC OUT on the rear panel of the DVX-890K.
- 4. MIC and MUSIC OUT jacks These audio output jacks provide analog AUDIO connections to external devices (A/V receivers, TVs, VCRs etc.). Vocals and music are simultaneously output from these connections. NOTE: Microphone vocals are only output from the MIC and MUSIC OUT on the rear panel of the DVX-890K. You will not hear the vocals if you are not outputting from these outputs.
- 5. **DIGITAL COAXIAL AUDIO OUT** jack This digital output is for connecting devices with a COAXIAL cable. NOTE: Microphone vocals are only output from the MIC and MUSIC OUT on the rear panel of the DVX-890K.
- 6. VIDEO OUT (RCA) jack This jack outputs VIDEO to TVs, TFTs and monitors.
- 7. **S-VIDEO** jack This jack outputs VIDEO to a display device (TV, TFT, etc.) via an S-VIDEO cable. S-VIDEO provides better color separation and better resolution by separating the color and picture signals of a composite video signal.
- 8. **DIGITAL OPTICAL AUDIO OUT** jack This digital out is for connecting devices with an OPTICAL cable. Please make sure to remove the protective cover from this jack prior to connecting an OPTICAL cable. When not using this input, keep the protective cover on to protect it from dust and foreign material.

 NOTE: Microphone vocals are only output from the MIC and MUSIC OUT on the rear panel of the DVX-890K.
- 9. **SCART OUT** Use this jack for connecting to European TV systems.
- 10. AC IN terminal Grounded AC power cable connects here.

REMOTE CONTROL

- 1. **EJECT** button Press to **OPEN** and **CLOSE** the disc tray.
- PROGRAM button Press to access the PROGRAM selection window.
- DISPLAY button To access OSD playback display menu. The different OSD display modes available depend on the type of disc being played.
- 4. L/R Switch between four playback modes for multiplex CD+Gs: LEFT-MONO: Left channel only (no vocals)
 RIGHT-MONO: Right channel only (no music)


MIX-MONO: Virtual stereo

STEREO - Left and Right true stereo

- N/P Press to toggle between NTSC and PAL video settings. Select NTSC for North American based video systems and PAL for European based video systems.
- 6. SUBTITLE Press to access the SUBTITLE selection window.
- ANGLE For use only with multi-angle coded discs, for example some recorded performances such as sports events, concerts or theatrical programs. Pressing the button will select various angles of view.
- 8. **USB/SD** Press to switch between the disc player, USB or SD card media device for playback.
- 9. SETUP Press to access the main setup MENU.
- 10. **DIRECTION keys** Use these buttons to navigate through the various menu selections.
- ZOOM Increases the size of the lyrics display during TRACK playback, or the SCENE view on a DVD.
- B-SCAN / F-SCAN buttons These buttons are used to SCAN either BACKWARD or FORWARD through tracks on a disc during playback.


NOTE: Using the **B-SCAN** and **F-SCAN** buttons during the play-back of a **CD+G** disc while performing Karaoke is not recommended, as it will cause the onscreen lyrics to scramble.

- 13. **REPEAT** Switches between the different repeat modes. The available repeat modes differ depending on what type of disc you are using (i.e. CD+G, Mp3, DivX, etc.).
- PLAY / PAUSE button Press to initiate disc PLAYBACK or PAUSE disc playback.
- 15. A-B button Allows you to loop a certain section of a disc, causing it to repeat continuously.
- 16. **PREV / NEXT** buttons Press these buttons to advance to the **NEXT** or reverse to the **PREVIOUS** track.
- SLOW Press to execute a SLOW motion playback of a DVD or Video CD.



REMOTE CONTROL CONT.

- 18. STOP button Press this button once to PAUSE playback and enter AUTO STOP MODE. Press twice to completely STOP playback. While in AUTO STOP MODE, playback pauses and the VocoPro splash screen appears. Pressing PLAY will resume playback and exit AUTO STOP MODE.
- 19. STEP Press this button to enter STEP mode playback. In STEP mode, playback is paused and the track/scene advances one frame each time STEP is pressed. To exit STEP mode, hit the PLAY button.
- MUTE button Press to SILENCE audio playback. Video playback is not affected while using the menu feature.
- 21. **DIGITAL KEY CONTROL** buttons These buttons direct the **DIGITAL** KEY CONTROLLER
 - # Raises the musical key a half step each time it is pressed.
 - 🧖 Resets the musical key to it's original key.
 - **b** Lowers the musical key a half-step each time it is pressed.
- 22. POWER button Press to turn machine ON/OFF.
- 23. CLEAR Cancels PROGRAM function.
- V-MODE To select video signal output selections for RGB, S-Video and YUV.
- 25. **AUDIO** button Switch between **AC-3** 5.1-channel and **AC-3** 2-channel audio output.
- NUMBER pad Press to select a track or file for direct playback.
- 27. **VIEW** When using **VCDs**, this button will give you 4 options: **INTRO**, **DISC**, **TRACK** and **EXIT**. The 3 menus will show up to 9 **TRACKS** or sections to view.
- 28. **TIME** Press this button to view the current disc or track position or to manually input a time to start playback from.
- 29. **RETURN** For use with **VCDs**, this button will return to previous menu or page.
- 30. ENTER To make menu selections or play selected tracks.
- 31. TITLE Press to access the TITLE MENU of a DVD, VCD or media disc. Press again to return back to disc playback. If the TITLE MENU button is pressed during disc playback, playback is paused. Upon exiting the TITLE MENU, playback is resumed.
- 32. **MENU** Press to access the menu of a **DVD**, **VCD** or media disc. Press again to return back to disc playback. If the **MENU** button is pressed during disc playback, playback is paused. Upon exiting the **MENU** window, playback is resumed.
- 33. **VOLUME** -/+ keys Press this button to RAISE or LOWER the master music VOLUME.



Basic Operations

Before powering on the DVX-890K

- Make sure the power cord is connected to the machine and a power outlet.
- If you are using a power strip/surge protector, make sure that it is switched on.
- Make sure all components (TV, mixer, sound system etc.) are already connected.

Turning on the Power

Press the **POWER** button on the **DVX-890K** or on its remote control.

Inserting a disc

- 1. Open the disc tray by pressing the **OPEN/CLOSE** button on the player or the **EJECT** button on the remote.
- 2. Insert the disc label side up.
- 3. Close the disc tray by pressing the OPEN/CLOSE button on the player or the EJECT button on the remote.

CD/CD+G disc - The disc will automatically begin playing.

DVD/VCD disc - The movie menu will show up on the screen.

Mp3/DivX disc - The Mp3/DivX menu will appear on the screen.

Playing a disc

NOTE: Discs will automatically begin playing when they are loaded into the disc tray.

To play a stopped disc, press the PLAY/PAUSE button on the player or on the remote control.

Skipping tracks on a disc

Skip forwards and backwards to tracks using the **PREV**. and **NEXT** (\bowtie and \bowtie) buttons on the player or on the remote.

PREV () skips backwards to the previous track.

NEXT () skips forwards to the next track.

Inserting a USB flash drive or SD card

USB:

- 1. Connect the USB drive to the USB port on the front panel.
- 2. If there is a disc in the tray or an SD card connected, you may have to press the USB/SD button on the remote control.
- 3. The Mp3/DivX menu will appear on the screen.

SD card:

- 1. Connect the SD card to the SD port on the front panel. Be sure to insert it correctly, with the metal contacts facing downward.
- 2. If there is a disc in the tray or a USB drive connected, you may have to press the USB/SD button on the remote control.
- 3. The Mp3/DivX menu will appear on the screen.

Basic Operations

Scanning Through Tracks on a Disc

Scan forwards and backwards through tracks using the \blacktriangleleft and \blacktriangleright buttons on the remote control.

- Rewinds through a track

- Fast-forwards through a track

Using the Direct Track Access feature

Jump directly to tracks by using the number pad on the player or on the remote control.

To jump to track 1 press "O", "1" and then ENTER

To jump to track 22 press "2", "2" and then ENTER

Using the Repeat function

Switch between repeat functions by pressing the **REPEAT** button on the player or on the remote control.

TRACK repeat - Repeats the same track again
ALL repeat - Repeats an entire disc again, after it has finished

Using the slow-motion feature

Press the SLOW button on the remote to toggle between the 8 different slow-forward and slow-rewind options:

|> 1/2 - Plays forwards at 1/2 the normal speed

|>1/4 - Plays forwards at 1/4 the normal speed

|> 1/8 - Plays forwards at 1/8 the normal speed

|>1/16 - Plays forwards at 1/16 the normal speed

<|1/2 - Rewinds at 1/2 the normal speed

< 1/4 - Rewinds at 1/4 the normal speed

<|1/8 - Rewinds at 1/8 the normal speed

<|1/16 - Rewinds at 1/16 the normal speed

Advanced Operations

Jumping to a specific time in a track or chapter

Press the **TIME** button on the remote twice to access the time menu. Use the number pad to enter the exact time to skip to.

For example:

To jump to :30 seconds in a track while it is playing


- 1. Press **TIME** twice
- 2. Press "0", "0", "0", "3", "0"

To jump to 2:50 in a track while it is playing

- 1. Press **TIME** twice
- 2. Press **"0**", **"0**", **"1**", **"5**", **"0**"

Programming tracks/Chapters

Program Menu



You can program up to 20 tracks on a CD or chapters in a movie to play in a different order than which they appear on the disc.

- 1. Press the **PROGRAM** button on the remote to access the program menu.
- 2. In each slot, enter the track number that you want to play at that order.

NOTE: For numbers 1 - 9, you must press "0" and then the track number. For example, track 2 would be "0" and then "2".

Advanced Operations

Using the STEP feature

The STEP feature lets you skip through frames, one frame at a time.

Press the STEP button on your remote to advance frames. Press the | (play) button on the remote to exit step mode.

Looping portions of music or video using the A-B feature

- 1. Press the A-B button on the remote control once at the starting-point of the loop.
- 2. Press the A-B button again at the ending-point of the loop. The loop will automatically begin playing.
- 3. Press the A-B button a third time to cancel the loop.

Karaoke Operations

Digital Key Control

Digital Key Control allows you to raise and lower the key of the music to fit any singer's vocal range.

Change the key by using the **UP** and **DOWN** buttons on the player or the "b", (b) and "b" buttons on the remote.

- Raises the musical key a half-step each time it is pressed.

4 - Resets the musical key to it's original key.

b - Lowers the musical key a half-step each time it is pressed.

Removing the vocal track from Mulitplex CD+G discs.

NOTE: Vocals can only be removed on Multiplex format **CD+G** discs.

Remove vocals by pressing the \mathbf{L}/\mathbf{R} button on the player or on the remote.

This switches between four settings:

LEFT-MONO: Left channel only (no vocals) **RIGHT-MONO**: Right channel only (no music)

MIX-MONO: Virtual stereo

STEREO: Left and Right true stereo

Multiplex discs have music on one channel and vocals on the other. Choosing the music channel only will eliminate the vocals. Use stereo [L/R] for regular discs.

DVD Operations

Accessing the DVD menu

Press the **MENU** button on the remote while the **DVD** is playing.

Use the arrow buttons on the remote to navigate through the menu and use the ENTER button to make selections.

Turning on Subtitles

Press the SUBTITLE button on the remote control to access subtitles on DVDs with subtitle available.

NOTE: Not all DVDs have subtitles available.

Changing the screen angle

Press the ANGLE button on the remote control to switch between a DVD's different viewing angles.

NOTE: Not all DVDs have multiple viewing angles

Zooming in and out


Press the **ZOOM** button on the remote control to toggle between the different zoom options:

- 2X Zooms in 2x the original size
- 3X Zooms in 3x the original size
- $\ensuremath{\textbf{4X}}$ Zooms in $\ensuremath{\textbf{4x}}$ the original size
- 1/2 Zooms out 1/2 the original size
- 1/3 Zooms out 1/3 the original size
- 1/4 Zooms out 1/4 the original size

Mp3 Operations

The Mp3 Menu will appear when an Mp3 disc, USB flash drive or SD card is loaded into the DVX-890K. If there is more than one music source loaded, (ex: a disc, and an SD card), press the USB/SD button on the remote to toggle between the loaded sources. Use the arrow keys on the remote control to navigate through the menu and use the ENTER button to open files and select songs.

Mp3 Repeat options



Use the **REPEAT** button on the remote to toggle between the 6 repeat options:

FOLDER:

Plays the whole folder once.

SHUFFLE

Plays all the songs in a folder, in random order without repeating the same song twice. Playback is stopped when all of the songs in a folder have been played once.

BANDOM

Plays all the songs in a folder, in random order and will repeat songs more than once. Playback is continuous.

SINGLE:

Repeats the same song continuously.

REPEAT ALL:

Repeats the whole disc.

REPEAT FOLDER:

Repeats the folder continuously.

General

TV Display: Normal/Ps-Normal/Lb-Wide

Normal/PS: Select to view the standard 4:3 picture or the cut standard 4:3 picture. Normal/LB: Select to view 4:3 standard with letterbox for a full wide-screen mode.

Wide: Select to view widescreen picture with a widescreen capable TV.

Angle Mark: On-Off

On: The angle mark will appear on screen when multiple angles are available for viewing (DVD Only).

Off: The angle mark will not appear.

OSD Lang: English-French-German-Spanish-Italian

Selects the language for the OSD menu.

Captions: On-Off

On: Subtitles will appear onscreen when DVD subtitles are available and selected.

Off: Subtitles will not be displayed.

Screen Saver: On-Off

On: The screen saver will appear after 1 minute of screen/function inactivity.

Off: The screen saver is off, and will not appear.

Last Memory: On-Off

On: The unit will remember the position of the disc (if still in tray), and start playback from that point when the unit is turned back on.

Off: Last memory function disabled.

Audio

Speaker Setup:

Downmix: lt/rt-stereo-5.1ch

LT/RT: Select when connecting to a Dolby Digital amplifier.

Stereo: Select when connecting to a 2-channel stereo amplifier/mixer. 5.1 CH: Select when using the 5.1 channel outputs on the rear panel.

Front speaker: Large-Small

Large/Small: Select the size that matches your front speakers. (If set to small, low frequency audio will be

routed to a subwoofer, if connected.)

Center speaker: Large-Small-Off

Large/Small: Select the size that matches your center speaker.

Off: Select if you do have a center speaker connected. (If set to off, center channel audio will be routed to the

front speakers.)

Rear speaker: Large-Small-Off

Large/Small: Select the size that matches your rear speakers.

Off: Select if you do have rear speakers connected.

Subwoofer: on-off

On/Off: Select On if you have a subwoofer connected.

Test tone: on-off

On: When set to on, the unit will generate a test tone to all 5.1 channels for speaker connectivity trouble-

shootina.

Off: Disables the test tone.

Post drc: on-off-auto

On: Boosts the compressed audio signal, to a nominal level.

Off: Does not boost the compressed audio signal.

Auto: Will boost the compressed audio only when low-level signal is detected.

Spdif Setup:

Spdif output: spdif off-spdif/raw-spdif/pcm

SPDIF Off: Select to disable SPDIF output.

SPDIF/Raw: Select when connecting to a 5.1 channel digital amplifier (DTS/Dolby Movie.)

SPDIF/PCD: Select when connecting to a 2-channel digital amplifier (Audio CD.)

Lpcm out: 48K, 96K, 192K

Select the sampling rate that matches your disc media and amplifier.

Channel Delay:

Use the arrow keys to set the delay for each speaker channel. Press Enter to accept the changes.

Equalizer:

EQ type: off-rock-pop-live-dance-techno-classic-soft

Select the EQ preset that best suits your disc media.

Bass boost: On-Off

Enables or disables a moderate boost in low frequency audio output.

Super bass: On-Off

Enables or disables a significant boost in low frequency audio output.

Treble boost: On-Off

Enables or disables a moderate boost in high frequency audio output.

Audio continued

3d Processing:

Pro Logic II:

Pro logic II: off-on-auto

Off: Select when NOT playing Pro-Logic II disc media. On: Select when playing Pro-Logic II disc media.

Auto: Select to have the unit auto-detect and enable Pro-Logic II when disc media is Pro-Logic II encoded.

Mode: music-movie-pro logic-auto

Music: Select for use with music-based disc media.

Movie Pro-Logic: Select for use with movie-based disc media. Auto: Select to have the unit auto-detect for best sound.

Panorama: On-Off

On/Off: Enables or disables 3D-like sound effect in the center audio signal.

Dimension: Size-3—Size+3

-3: Select for minimal presence of Panorama effect in the sound stage. +3: Select for maximum presence of Panorama effect in the sound stage.

Center Width: Level O - Level 7

Selects the level to which the center signal is spread to left and right channels for panoramic effect.

Reverb mode: off-concert-living-room-hall-bathroom-cave-arena-church Select the reverb mode that best suits your listening environment.

Dolby:

Dual Mono: Stereo-L/mono-R/mono-mix/mono Stereo: Select for standard L/R audio output.

L/Mono: Select for mono audio output with the left channel on both sides. R/Mono: Select for mono audio output with the right channel on both sides.

Mix/mono: Select for mono audio output to both sides.

Dymanic: off-full

Select level of dynamic range compression to be used (Off for no compression; Full for maximum compression.)

Video Setup

Component: S-video-YUV-RGB

Set to S-VIDEO if you will be connecting to a TV via the S-VIDEO output. Select either YUV or RGB if you will be connecting to a TV via the YPbPr (Component) outputs. See your TV user's manual to determin which setting to use.

Resolution: 480i-1080p

Use this setting to change the resolution of the HDMI output. See your TV user's manual to determine which setting to use. If you will be using the RCA video output, set this setting to AUTO.

Quality:

Sharpness: high-medium-low

Set the sharpness of the image with this setting.

Brightness: -20-20

Set the brightness of the image with this setting. A negative value will make the image darker.

Contrast: -20-20

Set the contrast of the image with this setting. A higher value will make the light colors lighter and the dark colors darker. A negative value will make the light and dark colors less vibrant.

Gamma: none-low-medium-high

Set the gamma correction with this setting. Gamma correction is similar to brightness.

Hue: -9—9

Set the hue or color of the image with this setting.

Saturation: -9-9

Set the Saturation of the image with this setting. Saturation makes the colors in an image more intense.

Luma Delay: UI-11

Set the luma delay of the video signal with this setting. Use this setting only if the image color is fuzzy or shifted to the

HDMI Setup:

HDMI: on-off

This setting enables or disables the HDMI output.

Audio source: auto-pcm

This setting switches the HDMI audio output between auto and PCM.

Preferences

Tv type: ntsc-pal-auto

This setting switches between NTSC, PAL and AUTO. Set to NTSC for the United States and Asia, and PAL for Europe. If you are uncertain what TV type you have, set to AUTO.

Pbc: on-off

Enables the playback control menu for VCDs.

Audio: English-French-German-Italian-Spanish

Switches the language of the audio of a DVD. Note that not all DVD's have all languages available.

Subtitle: English-French-German-Italian-Spanish-off

Switches the language of the subtitles of a DVD. Note that not all DVD's have all languages available.

Disc menu: English-French-German-Italian-Spanish

Switches the language of the menu of a DVD. Note that not all DVD's have all languages available.

Parental: 1—8

Set the parental rating for DVDs.

Password: on-off

Makes the password necessary in order to change the parental settings.

The factory default password is: 136900

To change the password, enter the old password, enter the new password, and confirm the new password, and then press enter.

Default: reset

Restores all of the default factory presets.

Troubleshooting

There is no power

- Make sure the power cord is firmly connected to the back of the DVX-890K and to the power outlet.
- If using a power strip/surge-protector, make sure that it is plugged in and switched on.

There is no sound

- Make sure everything is connected firmly and properly.
- Make sure there are no defective cables.
- Make sure all of your components are turned on.
- Make sure all of the components (amp, mixer, TV, etc.) are set to the proper inputs.

No picture

- Make sure everything is connected firmly and properly.
- Make sure there are no defective cables.
- Make sure all of your components are turned on.
- Make sure all of the components (amp, mixer, TV, etc.) are set to the proper inputs.
- Make sure the TV or monitor is working correctly.
- Make sure the DVX-890K is set to the correct video output mode using the V-MODE button on the remote control.

The disc does not play

- Make sure the disc is inserted correctly (label-side up).
- Make sure the disc is clean and not scratched.
- If using a CD/DVD R/RW, try using a different brand as some brands might not be compatible.
- Clean the CD lens using a CD lens cleaner.

Remote control does not work

- Make sure the batteries are inserted, inserted correctly, and not out of power.
- Point the remote control directly at the remote sensor on the machine.
- Move closer to the machine.


The picture is unclear

- Make sure the disc is not dirty or damaged.
- Make sure that the TV TYPE (N/P button on the remote) is set correctly:

NTSC: In North America, Japan and many other Asian countries

PAL: In Europe
