To ensure that you get the maximum benefit from the engineering that has gone into your machine, we recommend that you read this manual carefully before attempting to assemble and use the T240–T260. Save these instructions and refer to this manual if you are unfamiliar with operation of the T240–T260.

WARNING – Before attempting to use any of this equipment you should read this instruction manual carefully. Use of this equipment by persons with heart or other medical problems may result in serious injury. You should consult with a physician prior to using this equipment. It is recommended to periodically consult your physician as you continue to use this equipment. Immediately cease exercise if you feel dizzy, faint or short of breath. Use of this equipment in a manner other than as prescribed by the instructions herewith may result in serious injury.

For Your Personal Safety

Do not place towels or clothing on any part of the treadmill.

Do not place liquids near the computer console, electrical power plug, ON/OFF switch or any part of the treadmill.

Before attempting to disconnect the power, exit the program screen, then turn power OFF. To reduce any risks of electrical shock, do not pull the power cord from the cable. Gently remove the power cable by the head from the wall outlet.

Do not operate the treadmill if the power cord is damaged or if the treadmill is not working correctly. If the power cord is damaged, please contact your distributor or manufacturer to get it replaced. The rating of the new power cord must be 15 amps (125 volts AC).

For the International version of the T240–T260, note that the power cord to be used for replacement must be rated 10 Amps (250 Volts AC) and must be 2.5 meters (or 8 feet) long minimum.

Keep the power cord away from all moving parts of the treadmill, such as the elevation arm assembly and front transport wheels.

Do not use an extension cord that is not properly grounded. Keep all extension cords clear of all moving parts of the treadmill.

Place the equipment in a way that the power can be easily interrupted by pulling the power cord.

Do not allow children near the treadmill when in operation. Do not allow children unsupervised near the treadmill and keep the safety key in a safe place away from children.

Wear proper exercise footwear when using the treadmill. Do not use the treadmill in bare feet or in socks. It is normal for the treadmill belt to discharge soil or rocks that are on the sole of your shoes. It is always good practice to clean the soles of your shoes before using the treadmill.

Never use the treadmill with more than one person on the belt.

Never try accelerate or decelerate the speed of the running belt by pushing on or trying to stop it, with power or not.

Always face towards the computer display and do not run backwards on the belt.

The treadmill should not be boxed in with other furniture or obstacles. Keep the rear and side of the treadmill clear of any obstructions.

Electrical Information

CAUTION – This equipment is intended to be electrically grounded. The three-wire grounding plug (polarized) will fit only a grounded AC outlet. Do not use an extension cord or outlet if it does not accept three-wire grounding plugs. Contact a licensed electrician to replace the outlet with a properly grounded outlet.

WARNING – To prevent the risk of fire or electrical shock, do not expose this machine to rain or moisture. Do not place machine outdoors. Do not place machine near swimming pools, sauna rooms or high humidity environments. Refer servicing to qualified Bodyguard[®] Service personnel only.

The T240-T260 are warranted for a period of:

- Lifetime on main frame and motor
- 10 years on parts
- 3 years on belt/deck/rollers (wear)
- 3 years on labor

In a residential (home) application only.

This warranty is non-transferable and applies to the original owner of the unit only.

Responsibility of the User

The following items are not included in the Warranty since they are not considered manufacturing defects.

- 1. Damage resulting from any accidental use, disaster, misuse and abuse.
- 2. Service and parts required due to improper fusing or wiring.
- 3. Service and parts required as a result of improper servicing or from an unauthorized dealer.
- 4. Service and parts required as a result of flood, fire, vandalism or acts of Gods.
- 5. Labor to correct installation of the unit or instructing owners on how to use and install the unit.
- 6. Wear items such as handle bar foam coverings, drive belts and paint finish corrosion or discoloration resulting from improper cleaning of the unit.
- 7. Do not put any lubricant product of any type (except the Bodyguard® Fitness lubricant) on the running belt. Using a lubricant not approved by Bodyguard® will void the belt/deck warranty.

This Warranty is in addition to any statutory warranty. This Warranty supersedes all other written or expressed warranties.

In the event your T240–T260 treadmill should require service, you must contact the Authorized Bodyguard[®] Dealer where you purchased your machine or the nearest Authorized Bodyguard[®] Dealer.

Operating your T240 – T260

Each T240–T260 treadmill contains a L.E.D. (light emitting diode) computer display monitor. The control functions, unique programs and features have been designed with you in mind, to offer the best possible exercise by displaying important and clear information regarding your excercise progress.

Please familiarize yourself with the functions of the computer display monitor and each program to allow you to have the best possible exercise.

The T240-T260 comes with a magnetic security key. The key's magnet must be inserted in the appropriate slot in the console for the treadmill to be functional. For security purposes, make sure to attach the key's clip to your clothes prior to starting an exercise.

1.1 Getting to know the T240-T260 Computer display Monitor

The computer display monitor consists of a main viewing screen, a central informational window and two additional informational windows.



Each exercise program starts from the left part of the screen and terminates when it reaches the right part of the screen. A flashing dot will indicate your progression in the program.

As the speed and elevation increase, the corresponding profile will move towards the top of the viewing screen. At the top of the screen, a scrolling message center displays all your exercise parameters from the start of the program.

The two informational windows will display SPEED, DISTANCE, CALORIES, ELAPSED TIME, PACE and ELEVATION.

- SPEED indicates the treadmill belt speed in miles per hour or kilometers per hour, ranging from 0.50 to 10.00 mph or 0.80 to 16.00 km/h.
- DISTANCE displays the total distance in miles or kilometers from the start of the exercise, ranging from 0.00 to 99.00 miles or 0.00 to 99.00 km.
- **CALORIES** will indicate total of your caloric expenditure from the start of the exercise.
- ELAPSED TIME indicates the amount of time accumulated from the start of any program. The time will range from 0 to a maximum of 99 minutes.
- **PACE** indicates how long it will take to complete one mile or one kilometer at that current speed. Pace per mile or kilometer is shown in minutes and seconds.
- **ELEVATION** will display the slope of the running belt in terms of percentage. As an example, one percent (1%) slope is equal to one foot (or one meter) climbed for each 100 feet (or 100 meters) covered. The maximum elevation is 12% on the T240 model and 15% on the T260 model.

NOTE – The parameter like calories displays an evaluation of the real values of your exercise parameters. The evaluations are based on formal information, tests and are supported by specialists and physicians.

Keys

During an exercise, you can change the value shown on each informational window by pressing the adjacent round select key once. If you wish to have the information displayed in a scanning mode, simply hold down the round select key for three seconds and release it. You can also activate any window to scan by repeating the above sequence. To remove the scan, just press the round select key once again.

The INCREASE and DECREASE Speed keys allow you to modify the speed of the running belt during an exercise. These keys also allow you to select the programs and parameters prior to each exercise. During any exercise program, you can modify the speed of the belt by pressing or holding either the INCREASE or DECREASE Speed key. If you continuously hold down a Speed key, the speed display will change by a tenth of a mile (or kilometer) per hour (0.1 mph or 0.1 km/h). Release the Speed key when you have selected your desired exercise speed.

You notice that the treadmill belt will slowly change to your desired speed. The desired SPEED L.E.D. will be displayed flashing on the display window on the left, while the actual belt speed slowly ramps up to your target speed. Once the speed has been attained the SPEED L.E.D. will stop flashing.

The CLEAR/STOP key allows you to cancel a program selection or temporarily pause an exercise for any reason.

NOTE – Use the CLEAR/STOP key to stop the running belt should you encounter difficulty or need to stop quickly during an exercise.

Scanning Feature

During an exercise you will be able to view nine scanning exercise parameters on the central informational window along with the exercise program. The parameters that will be displayed are:

- DISTANCE is shown in miles or kilometers for the entire exercise.
- CALORIES indicates the caloric expenditure based on your actual exercise.
- PACE is shown in minutes and seconds.
- ELEVATION is shown % elevation.
- HEART RATE displays your actual heart rate if the optional chest strap is used. The display is shown in beats per minute.



• TREM (time remaning) indicates the amount of time left once a program has started.

or DIST. REM (distance remaining) if you chose distance in your settings

or CAL. REM (calories remaining) if you chose calories in your settings.

- CAL./HOUR (calories per hour) indicates the hourly caloric expenditure based on your actual exercise.
- SPEED displays the actual speed in miles per hour or kilometers per hour.

All these parameters scroll on the central informational window.

NOTE - The T240 will not scan the following parameters: PACE, ELEVATION, TREM AND CAL/HOUR.

1.2 Pausing During an Exercise

You can pause any exercise by pressing the CLEAR/STOP key. When this key is pressed during an exercise, the motor will stop and the running belt will slow down to 0 mph (0 km/h) within a few seconds. The stop is gradual, allowing the user to come safely to a complete stop. The elevation will remain at the level just prior to the pause.

To pause an exercise:

- 1. Press the CLEAR/STOP key whenever you feel the need to stop the exercise or if you need to momentarily pause the exercise. A message will appear on the screen indicating the amount of time remaining in the pause. The pause countdown will only start once the running belt has come to a complete stop.
- 2. If you wish to continue the exercise, simply press the JustGo®/ENTER key to start the running belt.
- 3. If you wish to cancel the exercise during the pause, simply press the CLEAR/STOP key. The exercise will be terminated and a summary of your exercise parameters plus the option to save the exercise will be displayed. If your pause is over the duration of the pause time, the exercise will terminate automatically.

1.3 Saving an Exercise (custom programs)

Once any program has finished or is prematurely terminated, the user has the option to save 15 elevations and speed levels and recall it at a later date. This feature is very useful when a particular exercise is interesting and motivational. With the T240–T260, you have the ability to create or modify an existing program and save it with the ability to recall it including the heart rate control program. The T240–T260 has the unique feature of saving a heart rate control program and being able to recall this exercise and do it without the chest strap.

Saving an exercise program allows the computer to store 15 speed and elevation changes made during your exercise. The speed and elevation levels saved are the ones before it moves to the next segment. With the T240–T260, you have the ability to create or modify an existing program (personalize) and save it with the ability to recall it.

When any program has finished or is prematurely terminated, the exercise parameters will first appear and then a menu will be displayed in which you have the option to save the exercise. The option will be displayed as "TO SAVE THIS EXERCISE PRESS ENTER IF NOT PRESS STOP".

If you wish to save the exercise at the end of program: (The T240 treadmill has two custom program slots and the T260 has four.)

1. Press the JustGo[®]/ENTER key while your parameters are scrolling.

2. The T240–T260 will indicate to you under which CUSTOM number it has been saved.

NOTE – If the memory is full press the INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the CUSTOM program you would like to overwrite. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

If you do not wish to save the exercise, press the CLEAR/STOP key to return to the welcome screen.





1.4 Viewing Exercise Parameters

At the end of each exercise program, the computer will display four exercise parameters. These parameters will be TOTAL DISTANCE, CALORIES BURNED, TOTAL EXERCISE TIME, and AVERAGE SPEED.

- TOTAL DISTANCE displays the distance travelled for the entire exercise.
- CALORIES BURNED displays the approximated caloric expenditure for the entire exercise.
- TOTAL EXERCISE TIME displays the length of the exercise in minutes and seconds.
- AVERAGE SPEED displays the average speed value for the entire exercise.

The total exercise parameters on the T240–T260 will loop for 2 minutes, showing your exercise parameters until you press CLEAR/STOP to exit back to the welcome screen. If you do not wish to view the exercise parameters, press the CLEAR/STOP key to return to the welcome screen.

Setting Up the Computer to Your Environment

The T240–T260 treadmills offer unique features that allow the user to tailor the treadmill to its current environment. The treadmill computer can also display a series of diagnostic features and calibration features.

T240-T260 treadmills allow you to select and modify the following settings :

- Language (English, French, Spanish)
 Weight Unit (Pounds or Kilograms)
- Heart Rate Control Options
- Heart Rate Access Options

- User ID
- Distance Unit (Miles or Kilometers)
- Time, Distance or Calories
- Warm Up (On or Off)
- Cool Down (On or Off)

- Beeper (On or Off)
- Speed Limits
- Big Number Option
- Learn Program (T260 only)
- Heart Rate Recovery (T260 only)

2.1 Access to "Settings Menu"

To view the above settings, you must enter into the "SETTINGS MENU" as followed:

- 1. Turn power ON.
- 2. While the introduction screens are displayed, simultaneously hold down the elevation INCREASE and the SELECT TOP keys.
- 3. Release the ELEVATION INCREASE and the SELECT TOP keys once entered into the Settings menu.

2.2 Language Feature

You can display all the instructions and information on the computer display screen in a choice of three languages.

To select a language: Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.

- 1. Select the LANGUAGE option, and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 2. Select the language you wish to be displayed on the screen. Choose from English, French and Spanish. Press the INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the language.
- 3. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

From now on, all text will be displayed in the language you selected.

2.3 Weight Unit Feature

The weight unit can be selected to display in pounds or kilograms.

To select a weight unit: Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.

- 1. Select the WEIGHT UNIT option, and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 2. Select the weight unit you wish to be displayed on the screen. Choose from POUNDS or KILOGRAMS. Press the INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select.
- 3. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

From now on, weight values entered will be in the selected units.

2.4 User Identification Feature

The User Identification feature allows the treadmill to recognize individuals and automatically enter their weight along with additional information. The T240 will recognize two and the T260 will recognize four.

Whenever the User Identification feature is used, the weight will be automatically entered at each exercise program. Therefore, user weight will not be asked during the program set up. Also, the user's age will be automatically entered during the Heart Rate Control program to calculate the maximum heart rate.

The User ID feature gives access to the following options:

- ACTIVATE USER ID
- CREATE USER ID
- VIEW STATISTICS
- EDIT USER ID
- RESET STATISTICS
- DELETE USER ID

Activate User

To activate the User Identification feature: Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.

- 1. Select the USER ID option and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 2. Select the ACTIVATE USER ID option and press JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 3. Press INCREASE or DECREASE key to choose ON or OFF to activate or deactivate it and then press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

Now that the User ID feature is activated; you will be prompted, at the beginning of each program, to select a User Identification.

Create User

To create a User ID's:

- 1. Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.
- 2. Select the USER ID option and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 3. Select the CREATE USER option and press JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 4. You will immediately be sent to the lowest empty location, if the MEMORY is full you will have to go to the DELETE USER option.
- 5. A total of six alpha-numeric characters can be used to name the USER ID. Use the INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select any letter from A to Z or number from 0 to 9 as the first character. If you wish to leave a space between characters, simply



select SPACE (blank character) between the 9 and the A characters. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept this character. Now the second character must be selected. Repeat this procedure until you have selected a USER ID name.

If you wish to modify a character before all six spaces are accepted, press the CLEAR/STOP key to backspace.

- 6. Now you have to enter your age. Simply use the INCREASE or DECREASE key to select your age. Press the JustGo®/ ENTER key to accept your age.
- 7. Enter your weight, press the INCREASE or DECREASE key to select your weight from 50 to 400 pounds (23 to 182 kilograms) and then press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept it.
- 8. Then press the CLEAR/STOP key to go back to the USER ID main menu.

Edit User

To edit the different User ID's: Select the USER ID option and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

- 1. Select the user you want to edit by using the INCREASE or DECREASE key and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept it.
- 2. Enter your weight, press the INCREASE or DECREASE key to select your weight from 50 to 400 pounds (23 to 182 kg) and then press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept it.
- 3. Now you have to enter your age. Simply use the INCREASE or DECREASE key to select your age. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept your age.
- 4. Press the CLEAR/STOP key to go back to the USER ID main menu.

View Statistics

To view the statistics of a User Identification: Select the VIEW STATISTICS option and press JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

Select the User Identification for which you wish to see the statistics. These parameters represent the accumulated values of all the exercises of a user while the User Identification feature was activated.

- TOTAL DISTANCE displays the distance traveled in miles (or in kilometers depending on your settings).
- TOTAL CALORIES displays the accumulated calories expended.
- TOTAL TIME displays the total exercise time.

Reset Statistics

To reset the statistics of a User Identification: Select the RESET STATISTICS option and press JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

Select the User Identification for which you wish to reset the statistics. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to reset the statistics of this User Identification.

If you do not wish to reset the statistics of this User Identification, press the CLEAR/STOP key. The Reset Statistics feature can help to monitor your progress week after week or between seasons.

Delete User

To delete a User Identification: Select the DELETE USER option and press JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

Select the User Identification you wish to delete. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to delete this User Identification.

If you do not wish to delete this User Identification, press the CLEAR/STOP key.

NOTE - If you choose to delete a user, you will clear all saved parameters under that user's name.

2.5 Distance Unit Feature

The distance unit can be selected to display in miles or kilometers.

To select a distance unit: Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.

- 1. Select the DISTANCE UNIT option, and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 2. Select the distance unit you wish to be displayed on the screen. Choose from MILES or KILOMETERS. Press the INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the distance unit.
- 3. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

From now on, distance and speed values entered will be in the selected units.

2.6 Time, Distance or Calories Feature

The TIME, DISTANCE or CALORIES feature allows you to select either time, distance or calories as your exercise target.

To access TIME, DISTANCE or CALORIES: Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.

- 1. Select the TIME, DISTANCE or CALORIES menu with the INCREASE or DECREASE keys and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to enter it.
- 2. Make your choice between time, distance or calories with the INCREASE or DECREASE keys and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept it.

From now on, the new value of your exercise will be in the selected value.

Table of minimum and maximum values

Here's a table of the minimum and the maximum values that you can choose as a duration depending on your Settings choice.

TIME		DISTANCE	CALORIES
MIN	5 minutes	1 mile or 1 km	25 calories
МАХ	99 minutes	99 miles or 99 km	2000 calories

2.7 Warm Up and Cool Down Feature

Doing a warm up period before an exercise and a cool down period after an exercise is strongly recommended for your safety. In your T240-T260, you have a feature that will allow you to warm up and cool down on your treadmill.

If the warm up or cool down option is activated, a warm up screen will be displayed prior to each exercise as well as a cool down screen after each exercise. Be aware that the warm up and cool down screens are not available for the JustGo[®] program in which you need to establish your own warm up and cool down periods.

The warm up has an adjustable duration of one to four minutes and that period is divided in 3 parts.

Warm up:

Part 1: Is 40% in intensity of the first segment exercise.

Part 2: Is 60% in intensity of the first segment exercise.

Part 3: Is 80% in intensity of the first segment exercise.

The cool down has an adjustable duration of one to four minutes and has only one part.

Cool down:

Part 1: Is a half in intensity of the last segment exercise with a maximum of 3.5 mph (5.6 km/h).

The calories, time and the distance are not accumulated in the "WARM UP OR COOL DOWN" modes.

The warm up or cool down option can be activated or deactivated separately.

To activate or deactivate the warm up or cool down option: Enter into the Settings menu, See Section 2.1.

1. Select the WARM UP OR COOL DOWN option, and press the JustGo[™]/ENTER key to accept.

2. Choose from ON or OFF. Press the speed INCREASE or DECREASE to choose and press the JustGo® /ENTER key to accept.

3. To adjust the duration of the warm up or cool down, use the speed keys.

From now on, the warm up or cool down option will be in the selected mode.

NOTE – If you wish to cancel the warm up or cool down while you perform it, simply press the CLEAR/STOP key to interrupt the feature.

2.8 Heart Rate Control Options Feature

The heart rate control feature lets you choose from three different operating modes. The first mode is "SPEED AND ELEVATION MODE". In this mode, the machine will bring you to your target heart rate by doing changes in speed and elevation, but you can make your own changes at anytime. The second mode is "SPEED MODE". In this mode, the machine will bring you to your target heart rate by changing the speed but it will let you do any change manually at any time. The computer will adjust the speed to keep you in your target heart rate. The third mode is "ELEVATION MODE". In this mode, the machine will bring you to your target heart rate by changing the elevation but it will let you do any change manually at any time. The machine will bring you to your target heart rate by changing the elevation but it will let you do any change manually at any time. The computer will adjust the elevation to keep you in your target heart rate. Note that the default mode is "SPEED AND ELEVATION MODE".

NOTE - The T240 has only one mode and it is speed only.

To select the mode you want to choose: Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.

- 1. Select HEART RATE CONTROL option and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 2. Press the INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the mode you want to choose and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept. The computer will indicate you the mode you just chosen and will be active from that moment.

2.9 Heart Rate Access Options Feature

The Heart Rate Access Options feature lets you choose from two different operating modes. The first mode is "SPEED MODE". In this mode, the machine will bring you to your target heart rate by changing the speed but it will let you do any change manually at any time. The computer will adjust the speed to keep you in your target heart rate. The second mode is "ELEVATION MODE". In this mode, the machine will bring you to your target heart rate by changing the elevation but it will let you do any change manually at any time. The computer will adjust the speed to keep you in your target heart rate. The second mode is "ELEVATION MODE". In this mode, the machine will bring you to your target heart rate by changing the elevation but it will let you do any change manually at any time. The computer will adjust the elevation to keep you in your target heart rate. Note that the default mode is "SPEED MODE".

NOTE - The T240 has only one mode and it is speed only.

To select the mode you want to choose: Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.

- 1. Select HEART RATE ACCESS OPTIONS and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 2. Press the INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the mode you want to choose and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept. The computer will indicate you the mode you have just chosen and will be active from that moment.

2.10 Beeper Feature

The beeper can be activated or deactivated.

To activate or deactivate the beeper:

- 1. Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.
- 2. Select the BEEPER option, and press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 3. Select the mode in which you wish the beeper to be. Choose ON or OFF with the SPEED keys and press JustGo®/ENTER to accept.

From now on, the beeper will be in the selected mode.

2.11 Speed Limits

The MINIMUM and MAXIMUM speeds can be set into the treadmill.

To select this option: Enter into the Settings menu, see Section 2.1.

- 1. Select the SPEED LIMITS option, and press the JustGo/ENTER key to accept.
- 2. Select the MINIMUM OR MAXIMUM value with the ELEVATION INCREASE AND ELEVATION DECREASE keys. To modify the value, use the SPEED INCREASE OR DECREASE keys. Press the JustGo/Enter key to accept (the values will not be considered if you don't press the ENTER key to accept).

Please refer to the following values to know the possible range of values.

2.12 Big Number Option

The big number option can be to selected to display on the main screen a choice of 7 options.

To select a big number option: Enter into the Setting menu, see section 2.1.

- 1. Select the BIG NUMBER OPTION, and press the JustGo/ENTER key to accept.
- 2. Select the option you wish to be displayed on the screen. Choose from, NONE, All, Speed, Distance, Calories, Time or Heart Rate. Press the INCREASE or DECREASE key to select the option.
- 3. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

From now on, all the information will be displayed on screen as the option you selected.

NOTE - The T240 does not allow to choose NONE since it will never display the speed or elevation profiles.

2.13 Learn Program (T260)

Bodyguard machines have the incredible ability to learn (pre-program) profiles. This is especially useful if you would like to build a workout profile in advance. You now have the ability to build a program without actually doing it. This is great if you are customizing a program for a client for example.

To use learn program: Enter into the Settings menu, see section 2.1.

- 1. You will be prompted to a screen that will ask you to increase or decrease either Speed and Elevation. Adjust both parameters and see on the side select windows where you are going.
- 2. Once you are satisfied press ENTER to lock it and move to the next SEGMENT.
- 3. Repeat this procedure until the whole profile has been filled in.
 - You can learn 4 programs in the T260. This option is not available in the T240.
 - To use a LEARN program, choose LEARN from the program selection window.

Minimum:	0.5 MPH (0.8 KM/H)
Maximum:	10 MPH (16.0 KM/H)
Default:	0.5 to 10 MPH(0.8 to 16 KM/H)

2.14 Heart Rate Recovery (T260 only)

Your T260 is pre programmed with a unique and useful program that is used to help determine your fitness level. After a program (workout) the T260 can be used to countdown towards your predetermined resting heart rate.

In order to use this program you will need to turn ON Heart Rate Recovery in the settings menu. Default this option is turned off. You would need to enter in you resting heart rate.

Fit Levels

Although it is difficult to assess each individual based on a generic chart. It is agreed that a quicker time from an exercise level heart rate to a resting (predetermined) heart rate is beneficial to cardio fitness. The best way to use this program is to use it today.

Using Recovery

It will only work while using the optional chest strap. After your exercise is complete, stay on the machine with your chest strap facing the console. Try not to move. It is best to keep your arms to your side as to not interfere with the signal. Stay in this position until the computer has finished reading the heart rate signal. Depending on your fitness level this could be a few minutes or longer.

NOTE – Using Heart Rate Recovery with Cool/Down. Note that the Heart Rate Recovery will start counting only after the Cool/Down has ended. If you are using Warm/Up and Cool/Down your Heart Rate Recovery will only start at the end. In order to benefit from Heart Rate Recovery we recemmend that Cool/Down not be activated.

- Five Program Levels
- One JustGo® Program
- One Manual Program
- One Hill Climb Program (T260 only)
- One Speed Run Program (T260 only)
- One Track Program (T260 only)

- One Heart Rate Control Program
- One Weight Loss Program
- One Cardiovascular Program
- Four Memory Programs for T260 / Two for T240
- One Walk Program
- Heart Rate Access Feature
- Four Learn Programs for T260

A program is a pre-set hill pattern. You will get the same profile (hills and valleys) every time you select the same specific exercise program. By increasing the levels you can change the predetermined hill profiles. The programs allow you to monitor your progress and they add fun and interest to your exercise.

Each segment time is equal to the selected exercise time divided by 15 segments. Therefore, a 45 minute exercise results in a 3 minute segment time.

NOTE - The T240 will never show the speed and elevation profiles since it displays only big numbers.

WARNING

BEFORE SELECTING ANY EXERCISE PROGRAM, FIRST STRADDLE YOUR FEET ON THE FOOT RESTS. NEVER START ANY EXERCISE PROGRAM WITH ONE OR BOTH FEET ON THE RUNNING BELT.

Program Levels

The Speed Run and Hill Climb programs have 5 individual exercise levels. LEVEL 1 is the easiest and LEVEL 5 is the most difficult. This feature allows you to alter the intensity of your workout. Levels can be changed at anytime during your workout by pressing the Elevation or Speed INCREASE and DECREASE keys.



JustGo[®] Program

The JustGo[®] program allows you to start a manual exercise with the push of one key. Since the JustGo[®] program is the initial program, it will always be displayed first for easy selection. You have total control of the speed and elevation of the belt at all times during this program. Use the JustGo[®] program if you like to walk or run at fairly constant speeds with little or no changes during the exercise.

During the exercise, the speed and elevation that you select will remain for the entire exercise until the next change you make. Your progression in the exercise is shown by one flashing dot.

To start exercising in the JustGo® program:

1. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key when the JustGo® program is displayed on the screen. The running belt will slowly start at 0.5 mph or 0.8 km/h and at 0% elevation with the exercise duration automatically set to the maximum.

The JustGo® program does not allow the user to predetermine the exercise duration or enter a weight amount. Therefore, the caloric expenditure and calories per hour values will be based on a user of 150 pounds or 68 kilograms. The calorie values should therefore be used only as references when in the JustGo® program.

- 2. Change the speed and elevation at all times by pressing the respective Speed and Elevation INCREASE and DECREASE keys.
- 3. You can pause, resume, end the program and save the program at anytime. It is not necessary to exercise the full duration to save the program.

Manual Program

The Manual program allows you to create your own exercise as you progress in the program. The speed and elevation are completely controlled by the user at all times. At a glance, the JustGo® and Manual programs seem very similar due to the fact that the user controls both the speed and elevation at all times. The difference is that in the Manual program, you can select your exercise duration and weight for a more accurate display of the calories.

During the exercise, the speed and elevation that you select will remain for the entire exercise until the next change you make. Your progression in the exercise is shown by one flashing dot.

Hill Climb Program (T260 only)

The Hill Climb program provides both a programmed hill and speed profiles. The programmed hill profile will cause the running belt to elevate and descend at various points during your exercise. The programmed speed profile will cause the speed to change. You can change the speed and elevation during the exercise if you find it too easy or hard.

The speed and elevation will change as you progress into the program. Changing the speed manually will cause only that segment to change. Changing the elevation manually will cause the entire elevation profile to change.

The following table shows the different elevations for each level.

1	0 to 3
2	1 to 4
3	2 to 6

Speed Run Program (T260 only)

The Speed Run like the Hill Climb controls a certain parameter. Speed Run is speed changes. Selecting a higher level will default a higher speed profile. Elevation changes are user controlled.

The speed will change as you progress into the program. Changing the speed or elevation manually will cause the rest of the program to change.

To select the Speed Run program:

- 1. Press the DECREASE key to select Speed RUN. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept the Speed Run program.
- 2. Select your weight. Press the speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the appropriate weight. The weight will vary from 50 to 400 pounds (23 to 182 kilograms). Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 3. Select the exercise duration. Press the speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the appropriate exercise duration. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 4. Select the exercise level by pressing the speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys. The higher the level, the greater the speed will be during the program. The speed changes that are made during each level are shown on Figure 17. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept and start the exercise.

Track Program (T260 only)

The Track program is one that enables you to choose from 1-99 laps of a 400 Meter (or about a 1/4 mile) Olympic track. Each Track program allows the user to completely control their speed from the start of the exercise until the end since there is no automatic speed control during the Track program.

The Track program will display an oval track screen that will show your progression on the track. The central information window will show you how many laps have been done in your workout. Elevation although not usually found on any track can be used on the T240–T260.



To select the Track program :

- 1. Press the DECREASE key to select TRACK. Press the JustGo®/ ENTER key to accept the Track program.
- 2. Select your weight. Press the speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the appropriate weight. The weight will vary from 50 to 400 pounds (23 to 182 kilograms). Press the JustGo[®]/ ENTER key to accept.
- 3. Select the number of laps. Press the speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the appropriate number of laps. Press the JustGo®/ ENTER key to accept.
- 4. To commence the exercise, press the JustGo[®]/ENTER key. A three second countdown will appear on the screen before the running belt starts moving. Remember, that at the start of this exercise, the speed will always start at 0.5 mph (0.8 km/h). You must press the Speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys if you wish to change the speed during the exercise.

Heart Rate Control Program (HRC) and Weight Loss Program

The Heart Rate Control and Weight Loss Program allows you to exercise at a predetermined heart rate level. By selecting the desired heart rate level (Weight Loss in Weight Loss program), the running belt and elevation will automatically adjust to decrease or increase the exercise intensity.

By selecting your age, plus the intensity level that you want to work your heart at (Only HRC), a target heart rate level is calculated by the computer.

NOTE – This program can only be used with the optional heart rate chest strap available from your Authorized Bodyguard[®] Dealer. Use of the heart rate chest strap will allow the treadmill belt to change speed along with a change in elevation. To achieve optimal results, it is recommended to place the chest strap directly over the skin. The strap should be very snug since any significant amount of shock or impact due to fast running may temporarily produce wrong heart rate signals. You should not be more than arm's length from the front handle bar to achieve the best signal. If at anytime the heart rate receiver does not detect a signal from the chest strap for more that a few seconds, the following message will appear "UNSTABLE HR SIGNAL PLEASE CHECK CHEST STRAP".

WARNING – Before attempting to use any of this equipment, you should read the instruction manual carefully. Use of this equipment by persons with heart or other medical problems may result in serious injury. You should consult with a physician prior to using this equipment. It is recommended to periodically consult your physician as you continue to use this equipment. Immediately cease exercise if you feel dizzy, faint or short of breath. Use of this equipment in a manner other than as prescribed by these instructions herewith may result in serious injury.

To select the Heart Rate Control program or Weight Loss program:

- 1. Press the Speed DECREASE key to select HEART RATE or WEIGHT LOSS. Press the JustoGo®/Enter key to accept the Heart Rate Control program or Weight Loss program.
- 2. Select the exercise duration. Press the Speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the appropriate exercise duration. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 3. Select your weight. Press the Speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the appropriate weight. The weight will vary from 50 to 400 pounds (23 to 182 kilograms). Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 4. Select your age to allow the computer to indicate your maximum allowable heart rate level. Press the Speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select your age. The age will vary from 10 to 100 years. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.
- 5. Select an exercise intensity based on your preferred level of exercise. The 60% level is a good guide for those interested in training in the fat loss range. The 70% level is suitable for those interested in training in the cardiovascular range. The 80% level requires the most effort and is suitable for persons with a higher level of fitness. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept the intensity (60% is a default in Weight Loss Program).
- 6. You can modify the heart rate level suggested by the computer or press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept it and start the exercise.
- 7. To start the exercise, press the JustGo®/ENTER key.

During the Heart Rate Control or Weight Loss program, you can change the speed or elevation by pressing the Speed or Elevation INCREASE or DECREASE keys. Keep in mind that the computer will then gradually readjust the speed and/or elevation to compensate for the change in speed or elevation you made by gradually bringing your ACTUAL heart rate near the TARGET heart rate level.

WARNING – If you feel that the running belt is moving too fast for your fitness level and you cannot keep up, press the CLEAR/STOP key and terminate the exercise program. You can try the program again, but at a lower INTENSITY level (60%). If this is still too fast for you, do not use the Heart Rate Control program until your fitness level allows you to safely exercise at your TARGET heart rate level.





During the exercise, the main computer screen will show a speed or elevation profile like the other programs, but will display your ACTUAL heart rate and your TARGET heart rate on the message center. Once the exercise has started, your ACTUAL heart rate should be lower than the TARGET heart rate. The computer then will gradually regulate the speed and elevation simultaneously to increase your exercise intensity level, resulting in a higher ACTUAL heart rate.

Your heart rate will be displayed on the message center as ACTUAL heart rate and TARGET heart rate (T). For example: HRATE 110/115T.

NOTE – You can change your target heart rate while in the program by pressing the JustGo®/ENTER key and modify it by using the Speed DECREASE or INCREASE keys and by pressing the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept it.

Cardiovascular Program

The Cardiovascular program has been designed to allow you to train at moderate intensity levels with short duration, high intensity periods followed by a quick recovery period. The Cardiovascular program has predetermined speed and elevation profiles according to the selected exercise levels. You can change the speed and elevation during the exercise if you find it too easy or hard.

The speed profile has a set of high intensity segments to greater work your heart muscles. Changing the speed manually will cause only that segment to change. Changing the elevation manually will cause the entire profile to change.

The following table shows the different speeds and elevation for each level.

1	1.0 to 4	1.6 to 6.4	0.0 to 2.0
2	3.0 to 6	4.0 to 9.6	0.0 to 3.0

5	6.0 to 9	9.7 to 14.5	0.0 to 6.0

Memory & Learn Programs

These programs allow you to recall previously completed or edited exercises. After each exercise has finished, you are prompted if you wish to save the current exercise or not. All programs, except the Track Program can be saved as Memory Programs. The Learn Programs are the ones that were previously edited in the Settings menu under Learn Programs.

To select an exercise:

Press the Speed DECREASE key to select Memory or Learn Programs. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept the program.

An edited program will appear on the screen. You can select a particular saved or edited exercise by pressing the Speed INCREASE and DECREASE keys until the desired name is displayed.

NOTE – By selecting a saved or a Learn Program in memory, you cannot enter an exercise level.

Select the exercise duration. Press the Speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the appropriate exercise duration. Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept.

Select your weight. Press the Speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the appropriate weight. The weight will vary from 50 to 400 pounds (23 to 182 kilograms). Press the JustGo®/ENTER key to accept and start the exercise.

Walk Program

The Walk program allows you to create your own exercise as you progress in the program. The speed and elevation are completely controlled by the user at all times. At a glance, Manual and Walk programs seem very similar due to the fact that the user controls both the speed and elevation at all times. The difference is that in the Walk program, you can't go over 4.0 MPH (6.4 KM/H) and 6% of elevation.

During the exercise, the speed and elevation that you select will remain for the entire exercise until the next change you make. Your progression in the exercise is shown by the flashing dot.

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Heart Rate Access Feature

The Heart Rate Access feature allows you to selectively enter into a Heart Rate Control program without quitting your exercise. It will allow you to choose, when you are ready, to change your current workout to a Heart Rate Control. You will need to be wearing the optional wireless chest strap when choosing to use this feature.

The Heart Rate Access feature allows the user to change any program at any time during the selected workout to Heart Rate Control. On screen, you will see the program remaining change to a flat-line as it would look like in a normal Heart Rate Control program. The part of the program that you just did though would remain unchanged.

How to Use Heart Rate Access™

While in a program you would press the JustGo[®]/ENTER key. On screen you would see the message "Heart Rate Control Activated" followed by a screen showing your target Heart Rate. Once your Heart Rate has been confirmed, the remainder of the selected workout time would be in the form of a normal Heart Rate Control. If you pressed the button and were not wearing a chest strap, the unit will disregard the button push and continue in the normal selected program.

- 1. JustGo®, Manual, Walk and Cardiovascular programs
 - These programs would change SPEED only or ELEVATION only, depending on your selected SETTINGS in Heart Rate Access options.

NOTE - On the T240, it will make speed changes only.

- 2. Speed Run and Track programs
 - These programs will make SPEED changes only.
- 3. Hill Climb program
 - This program will make ELEVATION changes only.
- 4. Memory programs
 - These programs will make changes according to the type of changes that were done in the program that has been recalled from memory. For example, if you did a Speed Run program and you press the JustGo®/ENTER key, you would get SPEED changes only.

NOTE – On the T240, il will make speed changes only.

- 5. Override
 - In all programs, you can make SPEED and ELEVATION changes manually.
- 6. Saving
 - You will also be able to save any program at the end except the TRACK program.
- 7. Profile
 - You will also be able to see the profile and where the unit made a change to Heart Rate Access.

NOTE – This is not available on the T240.

Changing Your Target Heart Rate in a Program

The normal Heart Rate Control program allows you to make Target Heart Rate changes at anytime while in a program by pressing the JustGo[®]/ENTER key. The difference is now that by pressing the JustGo[®]/ENTER key, it will bring you into Heart Rate Access; by pressing the JustGo[®]/ENTER key again, you will be asked to make a new Target Heart Rate change.



O Using a Heart Rate Receiver

The Bodyguard® Heart Rate receiver inside each T240–T260 treadmill is specifically designed to work in conjunction with the optional Heart Rate chest strap. The Heart Rate chest strap allows the computer to monitor your heart rate, or pulses per minute. This value is shown on the computer screen and should only be used as a guide in helping you achieve your personal fitness goals.

If no Heart Rate chest strap is used, no heart rate value (0) will be displayed on the computer screen. Before using any Heart Rate chest strap on any exercise equipment, it is important to consult with a physician prior to commencing any exercise program.

WARNING – Before attempting to use any of this equipment, you should read the instruction manual carefully. Use of this equipment by persons with heart or other medical problems may result in serious injury. You should consult with a physician prior to using this equipment. It is recommended to periodically consult your physician as you continue to use this equipment. Immediately cease exercise if you feel dizzy, faint or short of breath. Use of this equipment in a manner other than as prescribed by these instructions herewith may result in serious injury.

As a guide to effective exercising, to determine your recommended heart rate training zone, find your age on the heart rate chart (refer to page 5) and read the heart rate target zone based on various intensity levels. These levels include fat burning zone, cardiovascular zone and aerobic zone.

Tip – Sometimes you will need to moisten the back of the heart rate chest strap to obtain a signal. Use a few drops of water to moisten the chest strap, then place directly over the skin. The chest strap does not work properly when placed over clothing.

Troubleshooting Check List Table 1

Possible Chest Strap Heart Rate Problems

All Bodyguard[®] machines are compatible with the Polar wireless heart rate system. This includes a chest strap and a receiver. The receiver is an integral part of the machine and it is hidden inside. The chest strap is an option on all machines and can be purchased from Bodyguard[®] Polar. If you are having some problems with the reception, please use the following troubleshooting check list

The above table should help properly diagnose the problem. There is also misconceptions that the signal is immediate. The chest strap electrodes need to be moistened in order to send a strong signal. Radio and neon light interferences can also reduce the strength of the signal.

O Computer Diagnostics

Access to "Diagnostics" menu

To determine the condition of the various electrical and mechanical components, you will need to enter into the DIAGNOSTICS menu as follows:

- 1. Turn power OFF.
- 2. Simultaneously hold down the speed INCREASE and DECREASE keys and turn power ON.
- 3. Release the speed INCREASE and DECREASE keys once entered into the Diagnostics menu.
- 4. Press JustGo®/ENTER to access Diagnostic items.

When you access the Diagnostics menu, you will notice the following message: "TXXX VERSION"

The message above indicates the version of the computer software installed in your computer display monitor. This information is helpful in diagnosing certain computer related conditions. Keep in mind that the version number may change depending on the model number of your T240–T260 treadmill.

The T240-T260 treadmill allows you to perform the following tests:

- NVRAM TEST
 ELEVATION CALIBRATION
- EPROM TEST
- KEYPAD TEST
- DISPLAY TEST
- BEEPER TEST

CURRENT TEST

SAFETY KEY TEST

SPEED SENSOR TEST

STATISTICS

ERROR LOG

HEART RATE TESTBELT ALIGNMENT

MAINTENANCE

MOTOR CHECK

To perform any one of the above procedures, press the Speed INCREASE or DECREASE keys to select the one you want and press the JustGo[®]/ENTER key to accept.

NVRAM Test

The NVRAM (Non-Volatile Random Access Memory) test will not erase all stored information such as user identification, and all saved programs. The NVRAM is a computer chip that saves information even when the treadmill has been turned off.

- 1. In the Diagnostics menu, select the "NVRAM TEST" and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ ENTER key.
- 2. Press the JustGo[™]/ENTER key to start the NVRAM test. The NVRAM test will perform automatically.

EPROM test

The EPROM test allows you to determine if the program stored in the EPROM chip is intact.

- 1. In the Diagnostics menu, select the "EPROM TEST" and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ ENTER key. The EPROM TEST will perform automatically.
 - The display will show "EPROM IS OK" if the EPROM is intact and will display the result.
 - The display will show "EPROM IS NOT OK". This means the EPROM might be damaged.
- 2. Press the CLEAR/STOP key to terminate the test.

Keypad Test

The keypad test allows you to verify that each key is responding when pressed.

- 1. Press each key one at a time and verify the confirmed response on the screen. Example, pressing the Elevation INCREASE key will cause the screen to display "ELEVATION INCREASE" indicating that the key press was recognized.
- 2. Press the CLEAR/STOP and JustGo®/ENTER keys simultaneously to terminate the keypad test.

Display Test

The display test allows you to verify that each display light is properly working. If you notice that one or more areas on the screen do not light up during an exercise, you should perform this test.

- 1. In the Diagnostics menu, select the "DISPLAY TEST" and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ ENTER key.
- 2. Now the display will illuminate a certain way. To proceed to the next display patterns, press any key. Press Stop to terminate.



Beeper test

The beeper test will cause the beeper to sound.

- 1. Enter into Diagnostics menu, see Section 5.1.
- 2. Select the "BEEPER TEST" and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ENTER key.

Listen for a series of "beeps". The beeper test will stop automatically when you press the CLEAR/STOP key.

Heart Rate System Test

The heart rate system test allows you to determine if the optional heart rate system is working properly and that the computer is displaying your heart rate signal during a program.

- 1. In the Diagnostics menu, select the "HEART RATE TEST" and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ ENTER key.
- 2. The top left display will show the signal received from the chest strap and the bottom window will show the hand grip signal (option). Attach your heart rate chest strap. You do not need to step on the treadmill for this test, but simply stand near the computer. Within a few seconds, your actual heart rate signal will be displayed on the screen. Do the same for the hand grip system; put your hands on the two metal plates and wait for 5 to 8 seconds (T260).
- 3. Press the CLEAR/STOP key to terminate the test.

Belt Alignment

Should you need to adjust the tracking of the running belt, you must make all adjustments during the BELT ALIGNMENT procedure. To determine if the belt is not aligned along the center of the deck, measure the visible deck surface on both left and right sides of the belt. If these values are nearly equal, do not adjust the belt. If one side of the belt is closer to the foot rests than the other side, then you will need to adjust the belt to track to the opposite side.

To adjust running belt alignment.

1. You will need the 5/32" hex key to turn the bolts located inside the rear roller end caps.

WARNING – Do not stand on the belt during this procedure. Keep loose clothing and long hair away from the belt and rollers when performing belt alignment.

2. Allow the belt to reach 2.0 mph or 3.2 km/h (speed will be displayed on the computer screen). Looking from the rear of the treadmill, notice the gap between left and right sides of the belt and the foot rests.

If the running belt is tracking to the left of the deck surface:

- turn the left bolt in a clockwise direction to allow the belt to track to the right and ultimately in the center, or;
- turn the right bolt in a counter-clockwise direction to allow the belt to track to the right and ultimately in the center.

If the running belt is tracking to the right of the deck surface:

- turn the left bolt in a counter-clockwise direction to allow the belt to track to the left and ultimately in the center, or;
- turn the right bolt in a clockwise direction to allow the belt to track to the left and ultimately in the center.

NOTE – During any belt alignment procedure, do not turn each bolt by more than 1 to 1-1/2 revolutions. Exceeding this may cause a high amount of tension on the running belt and result in premature wear of the belt and rollers. It is best to adjust only one alignment bolt, since this will prevent the belt from excessive stretching resulting from adjustment of both alignment bolts.







3. To verify that the belt is properly aligned, slowly increase the speed to a maximum of 6.0 mph or 9.6 km/h, and let the belt turn for at least one minute. Carefully observe that the belt does not track to the left or right side. If the belt continues to track to one side, or you hear a rubbing noise, immediately press the CLEAR/STOP key to stop the belt. You will need to verify the alignment again.

Motor Check

Motor check should only be performed if your computer needs to be changed or repaired, or if you feel that the speed is not working properly. The motor check procedure is automatic and does not require any tools.

WARNING - Do not stand on the belt during this procedure.

Wait while the treadmill performs the motor check. That operation should take less than a 30 seconds. Once completed, the message "MOTOR OK" will be displayed.

WARNING – If the motor check procedure is canceled prematurely, do not use the treadmill. It is important to fully complete the motor check procedure prior to using the treadmill.

Elevation Calibration

Elevation calibration should only be performed if your computer, your motor drive or your elevation motor need to be changed or repaired, or if you feel that the elevation is not working properly. The elevation calibration procedure is automatic and does not require any tools.

WARNING – Do not stand on the belt during this procedure. The treadmill will elevate to a maximum of 15% incline (12% for the T240).

Allow the treadmill to raise and lower automatically. The procedure will take approximately one minute to complete. If for any reason you must stop the test, press the CLEAR/STOP key to terminate the test.

WARNING – If the elevation calibration procedure is canceled prematurely, do not use the treadmill. It is important to fully complete elevation calibration procedure prior to using the treadmill.

Statistics

The statistics allow you to view different parameters related to the use of your treadmill such as time and distance.

- 1. Enter into the Diagnostics menu, see Section 5.1.
- 2. Select the "STATISTICS" option and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ENTER key.
 - The TOTAL TIME displayed indicates the amount of time the treadmill has been used during all exercise programs.
 - The TOTAL DISTANCE displayed indicates the total distance traveled with the treadmill during all exercise programs.
- 3. Press the CLEAR/STOP key to terminate the test.

Safety Key test

The safety key test verifies that the safety key works properly.

- 1. Enter into Diagnostics menu, see Section 5.1.
- 2. Select the "Safety key test" and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ENTER key.

Check the screen. If the safety key is properly inserted, a closed contact will be dislayed on the LED SCREEN. Otherwise, if no safety key is inserted, an open contact will be displayed.

Error log

The Error log allows you to see the number of times that a speed error is produced.

- 1. In the Diagnostics menu, select the Error log and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ENTER key.
- 2. You can see all the errors and the number of times that they occurred.
- 3. Press the CLEAR/STOP key to exit this test or press the JustGo®/ENTER to clear all errors.

NOTE - The table of errors can be viewed at the end of this document.

Speed sensor test

The Speed sensor test allows you to see whether your speed sensor circuit is functional or not.

- 1. In the Diagnostics menu, select the Speed Sensor test and accept it by pressing the JustGo®/ENTER key.
- 2. Allow the belt to reach 2.0 mph or 3.2 km/h.
- 3. It will be displayed if the circuit is good or bad on the central information window:
 - Check if your speed sensor is connected.
 - Check if your optical disc is clean and that there is no dirt blocking the speed sensor.
- 4. Press the CLEAR/STOP key to terminate the test.

Current test

The current test allows you to see the voltage and amperage in the motor.

- 1. In the diagnostics menu , select current test. The motor will start and will reach 2.0 mph (or 3.2 km/h).
- 2. Walk on the treadmill for a couple of minutes and the value of the current and voltage at the motor will appear on the central information window.
- 3. Vary the speed to ensure that you get good readings for different speeds.
- 4. Press stop to terminate the current test.

NOTE – During this test, the amperage and the tension will be shown on the central information window in the following format: 3.1 A, 20V.

Here 3.1 A stands for 3.1 Amps and 20 V stands for 20 Volts DC.

The value of the amperage must never exceed 15 amps (10 amps for international version).



Maintenance

The maintenance menu allows you to see the average value of the current drawn by the motor. It also allows you to reset this counter.

A first threshold has been set to make sure that the normal high limit of current drawn by the motor will not be exceeded. When that level is reached, the user will get the message DECK MAINTENANCE IS REQUIRED and a diamond sign will be displayed on the main screen. The message and sign will be displayed between each new exercise. After the maintenance has been done and reset in the diagnostics menu, the notice will go away until there is a new rise of current.

If the maintenance is not done on the deck surface when required, a second threshold will trigger not too high above the first one. Another notice with a square sign on the main display will come up. At that point the machine will not start again until the deck maintenance is done and the maintenance has been reset in the diagnostics menu.

- 1. To access the Maintenance menu, you have to enter into diagnostics and choose MAINTENANCE and press ENTER. There is two sub menu items: AVERAGE and RESET.
- 2. If you want to see the average current drawn by the motor simply go into the AVERAGE menu that will display the average current in the motor from the last time it has been reset. To get out of that menu simply press STOP.
- 3. If you have done the maintenance, you need to reset the maintenance counter by accessing the RESET MAINTENANCE menu and enter that menu and confirm that it has been done. You will then get a message that the "MAINTENANCE COUNTER HAS BEEN RESET". You can now restart the treadmill.

O Maintenance Information

General Care

Your T240-T260 has been designed and built to give you trouble free use. For maximum safety however, you should periodically check your unit for signs of wear.

Here's a quick check list followed by reference Table 2:

- After each workout, you should wipe down your T240–T260 using a mild, non-abrasive liquid cleanser applied on a soft cotton cloth. Do not spray cleansers directly on the unit or use an excessively damp cloth. Do not clean the unit with the power ON, be sure that it is OFF.
- Be sure that the treadmill is on a level surface and that it is not rocking. Excessive rocking may cause the running belt to track to one side of the deck resulting in accelerated wear of the running belt.
- Keep liquids including excessive sweat away from the computer console.
- The running belt and deck surface should be kept clean. Dirt and other debris can cause slipping when exercising.
- Check that each handle bar is secure on the frame.
- Do not put any lubricating product other than the Bodyguard[®] lubricant.
- Place a carpet or rubber mat under the treadmill to avoid any build up of debris from your exercise shoes. Under
 extreme conditions, some debris may collect on the floor just behind the rear roller. It is also recommended to periodically
 remove any dust that may have accumulated under the treadmill. Excessive amounts of dust may enter into the motor
 assembly and cause the motor to overheat.
- It is very important to periodically remove any dust that may have accumulated under the motor cover. Use compressed air to blow out the accumulated dust in the motor and board area.

WARNING – To prevent electrical shock or risk of fire, always turn the power OFF and disconnect the power cord whenever you are inspecting and repairing your T240–T260.

Belt and Running Deck

Running Belt

The running belt supplied with each treadmill is of the highest quality, offering superior traction and low noise under extreme conditions. It is therefore important to maintain each running belt periodically by observing that no cuts have appeared over time, and that the running belt has not shifted to one side of the deck surface. If the running belt constantly tracks (or moves) to one side of the deck, you must adjust the alignment bolts placed at the rear of the running belt.

See Belt Alignment for complete procedure.

Deck Surface

The running deck needs to remain free of any loose items that may become trapped between the running belt and the rollers. Avoid dropping liquids on the deck as this may cause the impregnated wax to gum up and collect at the rollers.

Under extreme conditions resulting in heavy wear and tear on the deck surface, it may be necessary to remove the deck and turn it over, or turn it back-to-front to expose a fresh coat of wax. The deck is specially designed to offer four reversible sides that have new or reduced wax surface wear.

Please contact your Bodyguard® Dealer for servicing the deck.

Make certain to have the power off before doing any maintenance.
